VIRGINIA AT THE ACC BASEBALL CHAMPIONSHIP

- Virginia has won two ACC tournament titles (1996, 2009) – both at DBAP.
- Virginia is the tournament's No. 1 seed for the third time (1985, 2010); UVA now has played in each of the 38 ACC tournaments.
- In the last tournament at DBAP, the Cavaliers won four games in four days to claim the crown (Clemson, UNC, Duke, FSU); UVA was the lowest seed ever to win the title (No. 6).
- Virginia is 45-63 all-time at the ACC Baseball Championship.
- Under Brian O'Connor (since 2004), Virginia is 14-9 in the tournament.

CAVALIERS MOVE UP SINGLE-SEASON WINS LEDGER

- The 2011 Virginia team is tied for fourth in single-season wins in UVA history with 45.
- UVA needs two wins to match the 2006 squad for third with 47 victories.
- UVA leads all Division I teams in wins this year (Vanderbilt, 44).

CAVALIERS WIN NINE OF 10 ACC SERIES

- By winning all but one of its league series this season, Virginia joined elite company nationally.
- Among the five major baseball conferences (ACC, Big XII, C-USA, Pac-10, SEC), only four teams suffered just one series loss.
- Oregon State (Pac-10), South Carolina (SEC) and Texas (Big XII) each have absorbed one conference series loss each. No teams in the major conferences won every league series (UVA and Oregon State were the last to lose a series).

UVA JOINS SELECT FEW TO WIN NINE ACC SERIES

- Virginia won nine ACC series for the second time in program history and the second straight year.
- UVA is the first ACC team to win nine league series in back-to-back seasons.
- Since the ACC went to the 10-series format in 2005, only six teams have won nine or more ACC series in a year (UVA in 2010, Miami and UNC in 2008, FSU in 2007 and Clemson in 2006).
- UVA won four of its ACC series by sweeps.

- Virginia will face Wake Forest for the first time since March 2009 on Wednesday.

RECORD-TYING SEVEN ALL-ACC HONOREES

- Seven Virginia players earned All-ACC honors, tying a program record set in 2010.
- First team: David Coleman (OF), John Hicks (C), Danny Hultzen (SP), Branden Kline (RP), Steven Proscia (3B).
- Second team: John Barr (OF) and Tyler Wilson (SP).
- Hultzen was named the ACC Pitcher of the Year for the second straight year; he is the only Cavalier to ever win the award and the first at any school to win it twice.
- Brian O'Connor was named the ACC Coach of the Year for the second year in a row and the third time in his career (2004, 2010, 2011).

UVa BASEBALL PROGRAM HONORED FOR APR SCORES

- Virginia Baseball was one of three UVa programs to earn public recognition awards for its most recent multi-year Academic Progress Rate (APR) scores.
- The APR provides a real-time view of a team's academic success by tracking the progress of each student-athlete during the school year.
- By measuring eligibility and retention each semester or quarter, the APR provides a clear picture of the academic culture in each sport.

SEVEN CAVALIERS COMPLETE DEGREES

- Seven Virginia baseball players, including junior Will Roberts, graduated Sunday in ceremonies on the Lawn:
 - John Barr (foreign affairs)
 - Tyler Biddix (commerce)
 - David Coleman (foreign affairs)
 - Will Roberts (economics - graduated in three years)
 - Kenny Swab (foreign affairs)
 - Tyler Wilson (biology)

2011 TEAM IS FASTEST TO 40 WINS IN SCHOOL HISTORY

- With its 40-3 start, the 2011 Virginia team reached 40 wins in the fewest number of games in program history and tied for fewest in ACC history (Clemson, 1995).
- Virginia hit the 40-win plateau in game 49 last year (May 4 vs. VCU).
- This also marks the first time Virginia has reached 40 wins prior to the month of May.
- UVa has won 40 or more games in seven of the last eight seasons.

CAVALIERS RANKED NO. 2 IN LATEST RPI

- UVa was ranked No. 2 in the sixth RPI report, announced May 17 by the NCAA.
- UVa held the No. 2 spot for the first two weeks, then supplanted Florida for the No. 1 position for a week before sliding back to No. 2 behind the Gators.
- Virginia is 9-6 against the RPI top 25 and 15-8 against the top 50 this year.
- UVa has games against UNC (No. 3) and Miami (No. 18) scheduled this week.

SPREADING THE WEALTH ON OFFENSE

- Ten Virginia players have driven 20-plus runs each this season.
- This is just the fourth time this has occurred for a UVa baseball team, including the second straight year.
- UVa also had 10 players reach 20 RBI in 1988, 2007 and 2010.

VIRGINIA VS. RANKED TEAMS

- Virginia has played 16 games against five ranked teams this season (10-6 record).
- UVa won two of three against then-No. 4 Florida State (March 18-20), then-No. 8 Georgia Tech (April 8-10) and then-No. 16 Miami (May 13-15).
- The Cavaliers swept then-No. 4 Clemson on the road (March 11-13) and won 13-2 at then-No. 23 Auburn (Feb. 19).
- UVa was swept at then-No. 13 UNC last weekend.
- Virginia is 41-24-1 against ranked foes since 2009.

CAVALIERS SUCCEED AT RUNNING GAME

• The Cavaliers have been extremely successful on the basepaths of late, going 34-for-41 (82.9 percent) in stolen base attempts since April 1 (27 games).
• In the first 27 games, UVa was 41-for-62 (66.1 percent) in its stolen base tries.

ROBERTS HAS WIN STREAK SNAPPED

• Will Roberts owned the longest active win streak in the nation with 17 straight victories prior to his Saturday loss at North Carolina.
• The loss was the first in Roberts' career.
• Texas' Taylor Jungmann (14) now holds the longest streak in the country.
• UVa's Danny Hultzen had the longest active streak (17) until his April 25 loss to NC State.

VIRGINIA RANKS IN TOP 20 IN ATTENDANCE

• Entering the week (through 32 dates), UVa ranked 20th nationally in total attendance in 2011 at 95,356.
• This marks a regular season attendance record for Virginia Baseball.
• UVa also stood 20th in average attendance at 2,979 fans per game.
• UVa has played in front of 14 home crowds of 3,000-plus this season, including a midweek record of 3,128 on Wednesday, April 20 vs. Richmond.

OFFENSE LOOKS TO REV UP AGAIN

• Virginia's offense has been slow out of the gate since returning from a nine-day break for finals.
• UVa is batting just .190 in six games since finals week.
• The Cavaliers batted .314 as a team in the first 54 games, but have slipped to .302.

WILSON NAMED ACC PITCHER OF THE WEEK

• Tyler Wilson was named the ACC's Co-Pitcher of the Week May 16 following his outing on May 14 vs. Miami (he shared the honor with GT's Buck Farmer).
• Wilson allowed just two baserunners in 7.2 innings, giving up a sixth-inning hit and eighth-inning walk.
• He retired the first 17 Hurricane batters.
• This marks UVa's fourth ACC Pitcher of the Week honoree this year (Hultzen twice, Roberts once).

O'CONNOR REACHES 350 WINS IN FEWEST GAMES IN ACC HISTORY

• In his eighth season as Virginia's head coach, Brian O'Connor stands at 361 wins entering the ACC Baseball Championship (361-127-1); he reached 350 on April 15.
• He posted 350 wins in the fewest number of games in ACC history (472).
• Mike Martin of Florida State was the fastest in ACC history to reach 350 wins (while a member of the ACC). He needed 478 games (in seven seasons from 1992 to 1998) to reach the mark.
• Other current coaches of note in the ACC: Jack Leggett (Clemson) and Danny Hall (GT) each needed 487 games to reach 350 wins (350-137 each).

BIG APRIL LIFTS COLEMAN TO TOP OF ACC BATTING

- David Coleman finished the regular season third in the ACC with a .368 batting average as he propelled himself to first-team All-ACC honors.
- After a solid freshman year (.288 average in 50 games), Coleman played sparingly as sophomore and junior (68 games) before breaking out this year.
- Coleman recorded a monster April, hitting .549 (28-for-51) with a team-best 21 RBI during the month.
- He had a career-long 11-game hitting streak snapped at VCU on May 3.
- Coleman posted a pair of four-hit games in April and notched hits in 16 of the 17 games in which he played in the month (only exception was the 5-inning rain-shortened game).

PITCHING HAS BEEN LINCHPIN TO SUCCESS

- Virginia is the lone team to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts per nine innings and fewest hits and walks allowed per nine innings.
- UVa stands in the top-5 in all of those categories as of the May 16 report: ERA (3rd, 2.24), strikeouts/9 innings (2nd, 10.0), fewest hits/9 inns (3rd, 6.64), fewest walks/9 inns (4th, 2.22).
- UVa has allowed more than four earned runs just six times this year.

PITCHING, DEFENSE COMBINE FOR LETHAL COMBO

- Virginia boasts a strong tandem of pitching and defense this year.
- UVa has allowed just 2.8 runs per game, tied with Texas and UCLA for the fewest in Division I baseball.
- Virginia enters the week with a .981 fielding percentage which was third nationally behind San Francisco (.985) and Stony Brook (.983).
- UVa has committed 38 errors in 54 games.
- The Cavaliers set a school record in 2010 with a .977 fielding percentage.

WAHOOS RACK UP ACC-RECORD 14TH SHUTOUT

- Virginia has recorded 14 shutouts in its 45 wins this season, breaking the ACC record.
- The conference record of 11 shutouts was held by the 1977 Clemson and 2005 Virginia teams.
- UVa leads all Division I teams with 14 shutouts this year.
- The NCAA single-season shutout record is 24, set by the 1972 Arizona State team.
- UVa posted two shutouts in 2010 and five in 2009.

CAVALIERS STRIKE FOR BIG INNINGS

- Virginia has a tendency to score in bunches, with 59 innings of three runs or more this season.
- The Cavaliers' single-inning high is 10 runs vs. Maryland; UVa scored nine in an inning vs. Duke as well.
- UVa has scored three runs in 32 different innings.
- On the flip side, Virginia has allowed just 17 innings of three or more runs (nine 3-run innings, five 4-run innings, two 5-run innings, one 6-run inning).

PAIR OF 10-GAME WIN STREAKS

- For the first time in school history, UVa has recorded a pair of win streaks of 10 games or more in the same season.
- Virginia had a 12-game win streak which started March 22 and ended April 10 at Georgia Tech.
- The Cavaliers took 13 straight from March 1-19.
- The loss to Georgia Tech also snapped a school-record 11-game game road win streak.

VIRGINIA 42ND PROGRAM TO 2,000 WINS

- Virginia became the 42nd Division I program to reach 2,000 all-time wins on March 29 with its win over George Washington.
- The Cavaliers have won 2,020 games all time (1,617 losses, 40 ties).

HULTZEN CONTINUES TO IMPRESS

- Danny Hultzen ranks second in the nation in strikeouts this year with 131, trailing Trevor Bauer of UCLA (175).
- Hultzen has struck out at least nine batters in 10 of his 13 starts this season (13.05 per nine innings - second in nation to Bauer, 13.7).
- He has issued only 15 walks (8.7:1 strikeout to walk ratio).
- UVa is 10-3 in Hultzen's starts this year and 34-11 in his career, including 24-5 since 2010; UVa is 13-1 when Hultzen racks up 10 or more strikeouts.
- Virginia's streak of 15 straight series-opening wins with Hultzen pitching came to an end April 25 against NC State.
- With 131 strikeouts this season, Hultzen ranks third in UVa single-season history (needs 10 to reach Seth Greisinger's 1996 mark).

HULTZEN OWNS UVA STRIKEOUTS RECORD, MOVES UP ACC CHART

- Hultzen broke the Virginia career strikeouts record earlier this season. With 361 career strikeouts Hultzen has passed Seth Greisinger (1994-96), who had 290.
- By passing Greisinger, Hultzen also moved into the top 25 on the ACC's all-time strikeouts ledger. He currently is eighth in career strikeouts in ACC history.

HULTZEN CLIMBS VIRGINIA CHARTS

- Danny Hultzen continues his march up the all-time Virginia pitching charts.
- He ranks first in career wins with 29, passing Jacob Thompson (2006-08) for the most wins in program history. This also is tied for 22nd in ACC history.
- Hultzen is fourth in career winning percentage at UVa (.853; 29-5).
- His career ERA of 2.19 stands third in UVa history, while his 361 strikeouts ranks first.

- He ranks fourth in innings pitched with 292.1. With 3.2 innings, he will match Thompson (296.0) for third.

VIRGINIA CUTS DOWN ON BASES ON BALLS

- UVa pitchers have reduced their bases on balls by more than one per game this season, walking just 124 batters (2.3/9 innings). In 2010 UVa averaged 3.31 walks per nine innings.
- This has been key to UVa racking up an ACC-leading 2.33 team ERA.
- UVa easily leads the ACC in fewest walks per nine innings this year. (Clemson, 2.98/9 IP).

WILSON A FINALIST FOR SENIOR CLASS AWARD

- Tyler Wilson has been named one of 10 finalists for the 2011 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award for baseball.
- One-third of the final voting tally comes from fan votes at seniorclassaward.com.
- An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.
- A biology major, Wilson is planning to go into the medical field and become an orthopedic surgeon after his baseball career concludes.

WILSON SEAMLESSLY MOVES TO ROTATION

- After pitching out of the bullpen for most of his first three seasons, including 51 straight relief outings entering the season, Tyler Wilson has shifted to the weekend rotation in 2011.
- He is 6-0 with a 2.54 ERA in 12 starts (13 appearances) this year. In 74.1 innings he has allowed just 53 hits and 19 walks with 90 strikeouts (seventh most in ACC).
- Wilson now owns 23 career wins, which is third in Virginia history (23-7, 3.04 ERA).
- He ranks fourth in career pitching appearances at UVa with 85 (15 starts)
- Wilson has racked up 233 career strikeouts, which ranks eighth in UVa history; he needs five strikeouts to tie Andrew Carraway (2006-09) for sixth.

ROBERTS CONTINUES STRONG PITCHING

- Will Roberts currently ranks among the ACC leaders in several categories.
- Roberts stands fourth in the ACC with a 1.67 ERA, is tied for second in the league in wins (10), stands alone in second in shutouts (2) and complete games (2) and holds eighth in opponent batting average (.211).
- He is tied for fifth nationally in wins and 10th in ERA.
- Roberts has been a part of five shutouts – tied with Kent State's Justin Gill for most in the nation this year.
- He has walked nine and hit just one batter in 81.0 innings this year.

ROBERTS SCORELESS STREAK ENDS AT 26.2 INNS

- Will Roberts gave up a run-scoring single to Duke's David Perkins April 17 in the first inning, ending his scoreless innings streak at 26.2.
- That is the longest scoreless streak for a UVa pitcher since Sean Doolittle worked 29.0-consecutive scoreless innings from April 10-May 25, 2005.
- He had not allowed a run in his previous four starts (5.0 innings vs. Towson, 9.0 vs. George Washington, 7.0 vs. Radford, 5.0 vs. Georgetown).
- He last allowed a run in the sixth inning of the March 16 win over James Madison.

CAVALIERS GRIND OPPONENTS' RUNNING GAME TO A HALT

- Virginia has slowed its opponents on the basepaths, giving up just 20 stolen bases in 39 attempts (51.2 percent success rate).
- UVa has allowed the fewest stolen bases of any ACC team. FSU ranks second with 29 stolen bases allowed.
- In throwing out 48.8 percent of potential base stealers, UVa also tops the ACC. UNC is second at 42.5 percent.

KLINE EMPHATICALLY SHUTS THE DOOR

- In his first season as the Virginia closer, sophomore righty Branden Kline has been brilliant with 15 saves.
- He is tied for sixth in the NCAA in saves; the total also is the second most in a season in UVa history, behind Kevin Arico's 18 from 2010.
- Kline also is three saves shy of the ACC single-season record, which was matched by Arico last year.

- Kline has struck out 42 in 32.0 innings (team-high 25 games) with a 1.97 ERA.
- He pitched in 24 games (eight starts) as a freshman and was entrusted with big starts in the championship games of both the NCAA regional and super regional.

HICKS IN MIDST OF BIG OFFENSIVE YEAR

- John Hicks has posted a big year at the plate.
- He is batting .352, which ranks fifth in the ACC, and has 77 hits, which is tied for second in the ACC.
- Hicks has reached base in all but one game this year.
- A semifinalist for the Johnny Bench Award, Hicks ranks in the ACC's top 10 in hits (T2nd, 77), doubles (T4th, 19), total bases (T6th, 113), RBI (T8th, 48).

HICKS MOVES UP UVA CAREER CHART

- John Hicks is tied for fourth in Virginia history with 52 doubles; he needs one double to match Brandon Guyer (2005-07) for third.
- With 153 career runs scored, Hicks ranks 10th in career runs at Virginia.
- Hicks needs three runs to tie Greg Miclat (2006-08) for ninth in the UVa annals.
- He currently has 230 career hits – 10th in UVa history.

PROSCIA LEADS TEAM IN ACC PLAY

- Steven Proscia notched Virginia's best batting average in ACC play, swinging it at a .341 clip (44-for-129). That ranked ninth in the conference.
- Proscia ranked second in the ACC with 44 hits in conference games. He tied for fourth in the ACC with 25 RBI in ACC games.
- Proscia racked up two or more hits in 14 of the 30 ACC games, with at least one hit in 21 of 30.

PROSCIA ETCHES NAME IN VIRGINIA CAREER RECORDS BOOK

- Steven Proscia continues to stand out as one of Virginia's all-time top run producers, with a school-record 171 career RBI.
- He set the Virginia career RBI record April 30 at Boston College, moving past Sean Doolittle (2005-07, 167).
- Proscia now has 238 career hits, which ranks ninth in Virginia history (he needs two hits to tie for eighth).
- Proscia also owns 55 career doubles, which is second in the Virginia career annals behind Tyler Cannon (2007-10) with 62.
- Proscia ranks ninth in career at bats with 726 and also owns 25 career homers, which is tied with Bobby Rivell (1987-90), for 10th at UVa.

MOST MARCH WINS EVER ...

- UVa recorded its best month of March in program history.
- UVa won a school-record 19 games in March (19-1).
- It marks the third-best winning percentage for a UVa team in March (.950), behind only the 1967 (5-0) and 1971 (6-0) teams.

FOLLOWED BY SECOND-MOST WINS IN APRIL

- Virginia went 16-3 in April as it posted its second-most wins ever in the month.
- UVa went 18-4 in April 1996.
- It stands as UVa's second-best winning percentage ever in the month of April (.842), topped only by the 1959 team (7-1, .875).

SOUTHPAWS GIVE UVA MORE OPTIONS OUT OF 'PEN

- Virginia has added a quartet of left-handed options to its bullpen this year, with a healthy Scott Silverstein, sophomore Aaron Stull and freshmen Kyle Crockett and Ryan Ashooh.
- The lefties have combined to work 36.0 innings out of the bullpen and 43.0 innings total in 39 appearances.
- In 65 games last year, left-handers made just 25 appearances out of the bullpen for the Cavaliers.
- Silverstein did not pitch his first two seasons at UVa while recovering from shoulder surgery.

ROBERTS RECORDS FIRST PERFECT GAME IN VIRGINIA HISTORY

- Will Roberts notched the first perfect game in Virginia baseball history on March 29 in a 2-0 win over George Washington at Davenport Field.
- Roberts is the second ACC pitcher to record a perfect game and just the eighth in Division I history to post a nine-inning perfect game.
- He needed only 98 pitches to finish off the perfect game.

ROBERTS NAMED NATIONAL PLAYER OF WEEK, ACC PITCHER OF WEEK

- After his perfect game-effort against George Washington, Will Roberts was named one of Collegiate Baseball's National Players of the Week, the publication announced April 4.
- He also was named the NCBWA National Pitcher of the Week
- In addition, Roberts earned ACC Pitcher of the Week honors for the first time.

BRANDON GUYER MAKES MLB DEBUT

- Former Cavalier Brandon Guyer made his Major League Baseball debut May 6 with the Tampa Bay Rays, starting in left field against the Baltimore Orioles.
- Guyer made quite a splash, hitting a 2-run home run on a 3-1 pitch off the Orioles' Zach Britton in his first at bat.
- He became just the 109th player in MLB history and the first in Rays' history to homer in his first career at bat.
- Guyer played at UVa from 2005-07 and became the 27th former Cavalier to reach the Major League level.
- He was optioned back to triple-A Durham on May 8 as the Rays needed another pitcher on the roster.

O'CONNOR RANKS FOURTH IN WIN PERCENTAGE ENTERING 2010

- UVa head coach Brian O'Connor entered 2011 with a career record of 316-118-1 (.728) and a 126-71-1 record in ACC play.
- O'Connor's 72.8 winning percentage ranked as the fourth best mark among active NCAA Division I coaches entering the 2011 season.
- The only coaches who own a higher winning percentage are Mike Martin (Florida State), Mike Fox (North Carolina) and Gene Stephenson (Wichita State).

VIRGINIA LEADS NATION IN ERA LAST SIX YEARS

- Virginia led all NCAA Division I teams in ERA over the past six seasons, boasting a 3.26 team ERA.
- UVa is the only school to rank in the top 20 in the country in ERA each of the last six seasons, including No. 3 marks in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009.
- Virginia also is the only team in Division I to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts and fewest hits allowed each of the last three years.

NINE WAHOOS SELECTED IN 2010 MLB DRAFT

- Virginia had a school-record nine players selected in the 2010 MLB First-Year Player Draft.
- Seven of the nine signed contracts:
 - OF Jarrett Parker (2nd round, SF), 2B Phil Gosselin (5th round, ATL), RHP Robert Morey (5th round, FLA), RHP Kevin Arico (10th round, CIN), OF Dan Grovatt (11th round, PIT), INF Tyler Cannon (12th round, CLE) and Neal Davis (36th round, PHI).
 - RHP Tyler Wilson (35th round, CIN) and C/1B/OF Kenny Swab each returned for their senior seasons.
- The previous UVa high for draft picks in a year was six.

DEFENSE TOPS ACC UNDER CURRENT STAFF

- Virginia's defense has racked up the ACC's best fielding percentage since the current coaching staff arrived in 2004.
- Virginia has accumulated a .972 fielding percentage over the last seven years combined, including a school-record .977 mark last season (seventh nationally).
- Georgia Tech ranks second in the ACC over the same span with a .968 fielding mark.

VERSATILITY WILL BE KEY

- Much of the UVa's depth comes because of its versatility – several players could see action at a variety of positions.
- John Hicks and Kenny Swab each are athletic players who primarily are catchers but both will shift to first base and the outfield at times.
- Danny Hultzen will pitch and also is a strong defensive first baseman and will DH and play the outfield as well.
- Reed Gagnani and Chris Taylor each can play multiple infield positions as well as the outfield.
- Corey Hunt (INF) and Shane Halley (OF) each will pitch, but are great defensive players in the field as well.

• Virginia and Wake Forest did not meet in the regular season and have not met since the first series of the 2009 ACC season, a UVa three-game sweep in Winston-Salem.

- UVa has won five of the last seven meetings.
- The teams last played in the ACC tournament in 2008, a 7-4 Wake win in Jacksonville.
- The series is deadlocked at 6-6 in ACC tournament games.



**NO. 4 NORTH CAROLINA
2011 (UNC 3-0)**

• UVa was swept in a three-game series for the first time since the 2008 season (at Miami) as the Tar Heels won all three games last week in Chapel Hill.

• UVa struggled on offense, batting just .190 in the series.

- UNC won the opener on a 4-hit shutout from Patrick Johnson.
- In game 2, Danny Hultzen fired seven innings of shutout baseball and held a 1-0 lead into the eighth before the Tar Heels rallied for the 2-1 victory on a Colin Moran sacrifice fly.
- UNC scored three in the fifth inning of game 3 to take a 3-2 win and hand Will Roberts his first career loss (17-0 career).
- UNC scored in just four innings in the series.

ALL-TIME SERIES

- North Carolina holds a 174-100-4 edge in its all-time series with Virginia.
- UNC also owns a 9-6 edge over UVa in the ACC tournament; the teams' last tourney meeting came in 2009 when UVa run-ruled the Tar Heels, 11-1, as Danny Hultzen out-dueled Alex White.
- The teams have split the last 18 meetings over the past five seasons.
- Ten of the last 15 games have been decided by three runs or fewer, including a pair of 1-run decisions last week.

• Virginia won two of three games in its series with Miami last weekend.

• The Hurricanes parlayed a 5-run first inning into a 6-2 win in game 1 against Danny Hultzen.

- UVa rebounded for 3-2 and 5-4 victories to clinch the series.
- Pitching dominated the series – UVa had 20 hits in the series, while Miami finished with just 15.
- Tyler Wilson dominated with 7.2 innings of 1-hit, 11-strikeout baseball Saturday en route to earning ACC Pitcher of the Week honors; he had a perfect game through 5.2 innings.
- Will Roberts fired 7.0 innings of 3-hit ball in the Sunday win.

ALL-TIME SERIES

- Miami holds a 19-14 lead in the all-time series with Virginia.
- UVa has won five of the last seven meetings, including a 12-8 victory in the ACC tournament last year in Greensboro.
- The teams have met just twice previously in the ACC Baseball Championship; in addition to UVa's win in the 2010 tournament, Miami claimed an 8-4 victory in the championship game of the 2008 tournament in Jacksonville.
