OPENING KICK

COMMONWEALTH CUP UP FOR GRABS SATURDAY

- Virginia and Virginia Tech will play a nationally-televised game on Saturday afternoon on ESPN2.
- The winner of this game claims the Commonwealth Cup for the next year.
- The award was started for the 1996 game between the two state foes, with the Hokies receiving the trophy for the first time with a 26-9 win.
- The Cup is made of marble and cherry wood, stands four feet high and weighs more than 100 pounds.
- The scores of all 97 games in the rivalry are engraved on the sides of the trophy.

FIVE TOP STORYLINES

- ILB **Micah Kiser** has recorded 237 tackles in his 23 career starts, giving the junior 10.3 tackles per game over his 23 starts. Kiser's 237 tackles since the start of the 2015 are the second-most in the nation and the most among "Power 5" players. Kiser has 252 career tackles in 35 games.
- P **Nicholas Conte** is No. 1 in the ACC and No. 14 in the nation with a 44.6 punting average. Of Conte's 32 punts inside the 20, 14 punts are inside the 10, seven of those punts are inside the five and five of those punts have been downed at the one-yard line. Conte's 32 punts inside the 20 leads the nation.
- TB **Taquan Mizzell** needs 38 more rushing yards to become the 19th Cavalier to rush for 2,000 yards in his career.
- **Mizzell** needs six receptions to become the second player in UVA program history to record 200 career catches. His 194 receptions are the most all-time in the ACC by a running back, while ranking No. 19 all-time in the ACC in receptions.
- WR **Keeon Johnson** needs eight receptions to become the 21st Cavalier with 100 career catches.



TB Taquan Mizzell is the first player in ACC history with at least 1,500 career rushing and 1,500 career receiving yards.

The school that accumulates 11.5 points or more will be crowned the winner and take home the Virginia529 Commonwealth Clash trophy. - There is one point at stake Saturday in the Virginia529 Commonwealth Clash, one point for the football game. There is also a half point for the women's volleyball game in Charlottesville on Friday. Virginia leads the Commonwealth Clash, 2.5-2. UVA has won the Commonwealth Clash both years it has been contested.

PLAYER INTERVIEWS

Players are available for interviews each Monday, depending on class schedules. If media have specific player interview requests, they should be directed to Vincent Briedis in the UVA Athletics Media Relations office by noon Sunday.

Requested defensive players and defensive coaches will be available for telephone interviews Tuesday, while offensive players and offensive coaches will be available Wednesday.

No player or coach interviews will be arranged after Wednesday during game week.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Coach Mendenhall will hold his postgame press conference in the media room, while requested players will be brought to the media room to meet with media representatives after Mendenhall. UVA athletics media relations personnel will take player requests during the fourth quarter of each game.

Virginia's locker room is closed to media following games, both at home and on the road.

No other announcements regarding player injuries will be made until the end of practice on Thursday or two days prior to the next football game (Tuesday for Thursday game, Thursday for Saturday). On that day, within 90 minutes of the end of practice, injured players' playing status for the next game will be announced in one of five categories:

- Definitely will play
- Probable
- Questionable
- Doubtful
- Out

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

The first documented Cavalier on horseback was Francis Bell, a Virginia student from Dublin, Va., in 1947. Bell rode onto the field dressed as Cavaliers for Virginia's home football game with Harvard on the afternoon of October 11.

The Cavalier on horseback returned as the University's mascot in 1963. The UVA Polo Club provided both the horse and rider. However, the mounted Cavalier and his horse parted company in 1974 with the inception of AstroTurf at Scott Stadium.

The mounted Cavalier made its return in the Florida Citrus Bowl at the end of the 1989 football season. Due to its instant popularity, the Cavalier on horseback returned the following season on a regular basis and continues to lead the Virginia football team onto the field at the beginning of all home games.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

Last Meeting

Joey Slye kicked a 41-yard field goal with 1:38 left and Virginia Tech beat Virginia 23-20 the last time these two programs met.

After Slye's kick, Chuck Clark sealed the outcome with an interception with 59 seconds remaining.

On the Hokies' winning drive, Michael Brewer hit Isaiah Ford for 21 yards. Then he gained 2 yards on a third-and-1 quarterback sneak near midfield and the Hokies gained 28 yards on five tries by Travon McMillian.

The game was a punting contest with a few field goals sprinkled in until the third quarter when Albert Reid cut through the left side of the line and went 57 yards untouched for a touchdown and 13-6 lead for Virginia.

On the next play, Brewer hit tight end Ryan Malleck over the middle, where he shed a tackle by safety Quin Blanding and went 71 yards to the four. Two plays later, Brewer hit Sam Rogers for three yards and the touchdown.

The Cavaliers responded by driving 90 yards in 12 plays, with Matt Johns hitting Canaan Severin for 27 yards and the touchdown. The play was initially ruled an incompletion, but the call was overturned after an official review.

The Hokies needed six plays to pull even again. Brewer hit Isaiah Ford for 38 yards early in the drive, and then hit him again for 32 yards and the touchdown on a third-and-15 play.

Before halftime, the Hokies pulled even at 6-6. Facing fourth-and-16 from their 34, UVA faked a punt, and punter Nicholas Conte was pulled down 2 yards shy of midfield. A pass interference call against Kelvin Rainey negated Quin Blanding's interception, and Slye hit from 44.

Virginia took a 6-3 lead with a 67-yard drive in the second quarter. Johns looked to have hit Olamide Zaccheaus in stride in the end zone, but Zaccheaus couldn't hang on and Ian Frye booted his second 42-yard field goal.

FOURTH-QUARTER TURNOVERS HURTING CAVALIERS

- Virginia has turned the ball over 23 times in 2016 with 11 of those coming in the fourth quarter.
- UVA has eight fourth-quarter turnovers in the last four games that has resulted in 38 points for Cavalier opponents.

RED-ZONE OFFENSE

- UVA has scored on 32 of its last 38 trips inside the red-zone, with 28 touchdowns and four field goals.
- UVA ranks 14th in the nation in red-zone chances that ended with a touchdown (73.7 percent).
- After Taquan Mizzell fumbled on the five-yard line against Richmond in the season-opening game, UVA scored on 29-of-31 trips inside the red-zone. Both times UVA failed during those 29 trips inside the red-zone was because of missed field goals. Alex Furbank's 20-yard field goal attempt as time expired at UConn on Sept. 17 was the first, followed by Sam Hayward's 30-yard attempt against then-No. 5 Louisville on Oct. 29.
- UVA's last two trips to the red-zone against Miami the Cavaliers turned the ball over on downs and fumbled its last possession of the Miami game.
- Against Georgia Tech UVA scored two touchdowns, one field goal and missed a field goal.

GOAL-TO-GOAL OFFENSE

- UVA has scored on 21 of its 22 goal-to-goal offensive situations with 19 touchdowns.
- UVA's lone goal-to-goal opportunity it failed on was the end of the UConn game when the Cavaliers' field goal attempt was wide as time expired as they tried to force overtime.
- Ten of UVA's touchdowns in goal-to-goal situations have been via the pass and nine via the rush.

OLAMIDE ZACCHEAUS A FAVORITE TARGET IN THE UVA PASSING GAME

- Olamide Zaccheaus is No. 2 on UVA with 535 receiving yards and leads UVA with six touchdowns. His 49 receptions are also No. 2 on the team.
- Zaccheaus had a career day against Central Michigan when he made eight catches for 141 yards and two touchdowns.
- His 82-yard touchdown reception from Kurt Benkert is the 13th longest touchdown reception in UVA program history.
- Along with a 74-yard scoring catch against Pitt, Zaccheaus is tied for No. 5 in the nation with the most receptions of 70+ yards.
- Zaccheaus came to UVA as a running back, but switched to wide receiver as a true freshman to fill a need in 2015.
- The versatile Zaccheaus also ran back kicks in 2015 and is on the preseason watch list for the Paul Hornung Award, the national honor given to the most versatile player.
- Olamide is Nigerian for "the blessing has come."

BLANDING AND KISER TOP THE ACC IN TACKLES

- Micah Kiser (10.9) is leading the ACC in tackles per game and Quin Blanding (9.8) is No. 2 in the ACC in tackles per game.
- Kiser and Blanding are one two defensive duos from the same school to rank outright No. 1 and No. 2 in tackles for their respective conferences.
- TCU's Travin Howard (10.80) ranks No. 1 in the Big 12, while teammate Ty Summers (9.10) is No. 2.
- This is old hat for Kiser and Blanding, as they were the only defensive duo from the same school in 2015 to rank No. 1 and No. 2 in their respective conferences in tackles.
- Kiser ranks No. 4 nationally in tackles, while Blanding ranks No. 12 nationally.
- Blanding finished 2014 and 2015 No. 2 in the ACC in tackles.

BLANDING AND KISER ARE THE TOP TACKLING DUO IN THE NATION

KISER DOUBLES UP THE TACKLES

- Micah Kiser owns 14 double-digit tackle games during his 23 career starts.
- Kiser enters the Virginia Tech game with 252 career tackles during 35 career games.
- Kiser has recorded 237 tackles during his 23 career starts, which is every game since the start of the 2015 season.
- Kiser played in all 12 games a redshirt freshman, mostly on special teams when he shared the UVA team lead with nine special teams tackles.
- Kiser also has six pass breakups, which is No. 4 among the nation's linebackers. Arizona State's Laiu Moeakiola leads the nation's linebackers with nine MTSU's D.J. Sanders has eight and Air Force's Haji Dunn is No. 3 with seven. Kiser batted down two additional passes this year the quarterback caught off the carom, otherwise he would be No. 2 in the nation with eight, tied with Sanders.
- Kiser intercepted his first pass of his career against Miami.

NICHOLAS CONTE ONE OF NATION'S BEST PUNTERS

- Nicholas Conte is No. 1 in the ACC and No. 14 in the nation with a 44.6 punting average.
- Conte owns a 44.6 yards per punt average for his career.
- Currently Conte's 44.6 yards per punt average ranks No. 1 in the UVA annals, topping Russ Henderson's 43.3 yards per punt mark.
- His 44.6 yards per punt average ranks No. 8 among all active FBS players.

HAMM HAS IMPROVED UVA'S PUNT RETURN GAME IN 2016

- TB Daniel Hamm has returned 22 punts for 216 yards in 2016. The 216 return yards are the most by a Cavalier in a season since 2007 when Vic Hall had 230 return yards.
- Hamm's 9.8 yards per return is also the best by a Cavalier since Hall posted 10 yards per return in that same 2007 season for players with at least 10 returns in a season.

JOE REED IS A THREAT FOR UVA ON KICK RETURN

- WR Joe Reed is one of UVA's nine true freshmen that have played in 2016. He is seeing most of his time on kick return and has been big-play threat for the Cavaliers.
- Reed currently ranks No. 4 in the ACC and No. 24 in the nation with a 25 yards per kick return average.
- Reed's kick return average of 25 yards is the second highest by a Cavalier over the last 10 seasons. Only Darius Jennings as a senior in 2014 had a better return rate at 27.1 yards per return.
- Reed's kick return average of 25.7 yards is vastly higher than the last two true freshmen UVA utilized as kick returners. Olamide Zaccheaus managed just a 19.3 yards per return rate in 2015 and Jennings averaged 20 yards per return in 2011.
- Reed ranks No. 5 in the nation among freshmen and No. 3 among true freshmen with his 25 yards per return average.

SOCCER NATIONAL CHAMPION JOINS TEAM AS A PLACEKICKER

- Former UVA men's soccer player Sam Hayward joined the football team as a walk-on placekicker on Sept. 19.
- Hayward made his college football debut at Duke on Oct. 1, connecting on all four PATs he attempted.
- Hayward attempted his first career field goal in the fourth quarter against Pitt, making the 36-yard kick. It was only UVA's third field goal attempt of 2016
- Hayward was a member of UVA's men's soccer program in 2014 and 2015 after spending the 2013 season at Penn.
- Hayward was part of UVA's 2014 NCAA title team. He finished the second penalty kick in the shootout of the NCAA championship match against UCLA. He also converted on one of UVA's PKs in the quarterfinal win over Georgetown and tied the game late in the first half of the second round NCAA match with UNC Wilmington.
- Hayward played football as a kicker and wide receiver in the 8th, 9th and 10th grade.

REID IS UVA'S OTHER 1,000-YARD RUSHER

- With 1,962 rushing yards, UVA's Taquan Mizzell is No. 19 all-time at UVA in career rushing, but he isn't the only Cavalier with at least 1,000 career rushing yards at the college level.
- TB Albert Reid reached 1,000 career yards at the college level in Week 3 at UConn.
- Reid currently has 1,287 rushing yards with 12 career scores.
- He rushed 122 times for 447 yards and three scores at Maryland from 2012-14.
- Reid has rushed 164 times for 840 yards and nine touchdowns in 22 career games at UVA.

BENKERT MOST PASSING YARDS BY A CAVALIER IN FIRST TEN CAREER STARTS

- QB Kurt Benkert has passed for 2,430 yards over his first 10 UVA starts. That is the most all-time among UVA quarterbacks.
- Benkert also has the most passing yards by a UVA quarterback through his first four (1,119), five (1,455), six (1,733), seven (1,859), eight (2,097) and nine (2,287) career starts.
- Benkert's 1,119 passing yards through his first four starts made him the first Cavalier to amass over 1,000 passing yards through his first four career starts. Likewise, his 2,097 passing yards through his first eight career starts makes him the only Cavalier to amass over 2,000 passing yards through his first eight career starts.

JOHNSON IS A BIG TARGET FOR THE UVA OFFENSE

- Senior WR Keeon Johnson has 46 receptions for 459 yards and three touchdowns. His 46 receptions are the fourth-most on the team, trailing only Taquan Mizzell (51), Olamide Zaccheaus (49) and Doni Dowling (47).
- His 26 receptions through UVA's first five games of 2016 equaled his 2014 and 2015 output combined. Johnson only recorded 13 receptions each of those seasons after grabbing 20 catches as a freshman in eight games.
- Johnson's two touchdown catches through the first two games of 2016 equaled his career total entering 2016. He now has five career touchdowns.
- Johnson's 402 receiving yards are more than the combined 311 receiving yards the senior had in 2014 and 2015. Johnson had 138 receiving yards in 2014 and his 2015 total came to 173 yards.
- Fifteen of his receptions have given UVA a first down on third or fourth down, including a crucial 4th and 10 at UConn that went for 34 yards.

BENKERT BREAKS UVA PASSING RECORD FOR A GAME

- Virginia quarterback Kurt Benkert broke Marc Verica's record for passing yards in a game. Benkert threw for 421 passing yards on Sept. 24 against Central Michigan, snapping Verica's 2010 record of 417 passing yards in a game that came at Duke.
- Benkert threw five touchdowns, making him the fifth Cavalier to throw five touchdowns in a game and the first since Matt Schaub in 2002 against Akron. The five touchdowns are tied for second-most by a UVA quarterback in a game.

NINE TRUE FRESHMEN HAVE PLAYED SO FAR IN 2016

- Overall, 27 Cavaliers have made their collegiate debut in 2016, including nine true freshmen.

SCOTT STADIUM, HOME OF THE CAVALIERS

The Carl Smith Center, home of David A. Harrison III Field at Scott Stadium, with its unique architectural design, scenic setting on the University's Grounds and exceptional sight lines, is one of the nation's finest college football settings.

Opened in 1931, Scott Stadium might be one of the oldest campus college football stadiums in the nation, but you could never tell from its appearance. Numerous upgrades and expansions make it a modern home for the Cavaliers and their fans.

Scott Stadium was the gift of Frederic William Scott and Elisabeth Strother Scott, and was dedicated to the memory of his parents, Frederic Robert Scott and Frances Branch Scott.

Virginia played its dedication game at Scott Stadium on Oct. 15, 1931 against the Virginia Military Institute before a then-capacity crowd of 22,000. Prior to that season, the Cavaliers staged their home games at the University's Lambeth Field.

Virginia has played 454 games in the historic venue. UVA's all-time record at Scott Stadium stands at 256-189-12.

Bronco Mendenhall Head Coach • First Season

Bronco Mendenhall was named Virginia's head football coach on Dec. 4, 2015. He served as the head football coach at Brigham Young University for 11 years before joining the Cavalier program. Mendenhall, Virginia's 40th head football coach, has compiled an overall record of 99-43 in his 11 seasons as head coach at BYU to rank 12th in total wins among all FBS teams during that time. Mendenhall also ranks 13th in winning percentage (.697) among all active coaches with at least five years of FBS experience, and he ranks 10th among active coaches with at least 10 years of experience.

In the three seasons prior to Mendenhall becoming the head coach at BYU, the Cougars compiled an overall record of 14-21. Over the last 11 years, the Cougars are one of only 11 programs to advance to a bowl game each season (includes the 2015 season). BYU is joined by Alabama, Boise State, Clemson, Florida State, Georgia, LSU, Oklahoma, Oregon, Virginia Tech and Wisconsin on that list.

Among those 11 teams, only Florida State has achieved more bowl wins (seven) than BYU's six bowl game victories.

BYU football student-athletes have earned freshman All-America recognition in eight of the past 10 seasons. More than 60 BYU players have signed with NFL teams since Mendenhall arrived in Provo, including defensive end Ezekiel Ansah, the No. 5 overall pick in the 2013 NFL Draft and Kyle Van Noy, the No. 40 overall pick in the 2014 NFL Draft.

Under Mendenhall, the Cougars tied for seventh among all FBS programs for the most Academic All-America citations over the last decade and BYU tops all FBS programs with the most selections (39) to the National Football Foundation Hampshire Honor Society (recognizing starters and significant contributors finishing their eligibility with a 3.2 GPA or better over their college career) since the program began in 2007.

The success of Mendenhall's leadership approach in running the BYU football program has been highlighted in a management book, *Running Into the Wind: Bronco Mendenhall -- 5 Strategies for Building a Successful Team*, written by Alyson Von Feldt and Paul Gustavson, a leading management consultant specializing in leadership development and organizational design.

Mendenhall was elected in 2013 to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees as the District 8 Representative and also serves on the AFCA Ethics Committee.

In his first year in 2005 after taking over a program coming off three losing seasons, Mendenhall led BYU to a 6-5 regular-season record and earned an invitation to the Maaco Bowl Las Vegas -- the team's first postseason bowl appearance in three seasons. The Cougars finished tied for second in the MWC with a 5-3 league ledger.

Following the 2006 season, Mendenhall was named the American Football Coaches Association Region IV Coach of the Year. In addition, the Football Writers Association of America named Mendenhall one of nine finalists for the prestigious Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.

A dominant defense led BYU to its seventh winning season in as many years as the BYU football team finished the 2012 season with eight wins, a program-best fourth consecutive bowl victory and the No. 3 defense in the nation. With an 8-5 record, BYU claimed its sixth season with at least eight wins under Mendenhall's eight-year head coaching tenure. Incredibly consistent all year long, BYU finished the year ranked No. 3 in total defense, allowing just 266.1 yards per game. The Cougars ended the season ranked in the top four in five major defensive categories.

Mendenhall has served as the BYU's defensive coordinator for much of his tenure as the head coach. He returned to a full-time role with the defense again in 2015.

During his tenure in Provo, the Cougars have consistently fielded one of the nation's strongest defenses. Mendenhall's defense excels at keeping opponents out of the end zone. Entering the 2015 season, they averaged a No. 20 national ranking in scoring defense while he oversees the defense, including three top-10 ratings.

FUN FACTS

UVA'S EARLY FOOTBALL HISTORY AT LAMBETH FIELD

- The colonnades at Lambeth Field turn 103 in 2016. The playing surface at Lambeth Field hosted Virginia football from 1902 until Scott Stadium opened up in the midst of the 1931 season on Oct. 15, 1931.
- Lambeth Field is the location where the American game of football that we know today, played from youth league all the way up to the NFL, was first played.
- It all started in 1909 with the death of UVA's Archer Christian.
- Christian died in 1909 as a result of injuries sustained in a football game at Georgetown on Nov. 13, 1909. Christian's death highlighted 29 football related deaths during the 1909 season. Papers from all over the country carried the front-page headline of Christian's death.
- Former UVA President Edwin A. Alderman and the father of UV athletics, William Lambeth, went to New York City to meet with other presidents and administrators from other big time universities to discuss how they could make the game of football safer.
- At the time there was legislation happening in Washington to make it illegal to play the game of football in America.
- A new rules committee that was appointed from that meeting in New York City included Lambeth and the father of American football, Walter Camp.
- Lambeth noted to the committee, which met almost on a monthly basis, that the two deaths he had seen personally were due to exhaustion. At the time there were no substitutions, if you came out you could no longer return. The original game had a lot of pulling and pushing. Players were not considered down until they really couldn't move under the pile. Lambeth suggested that the game be split into four quarters, totaling 15 minutes a piece and that players could substitute back in. Walter Camp's notes from the committee meetings credit Lambeth, in the margins, with these changes.
- The committee asked Lambeth to take the new rules back to the University of Virginia and experiment with them during the spring of 1910.
- On the Grounds of the University of Virginia, under the watchful eye of William Lambeth, a new version of American football, divided into four quarters was played for the first time in history.
- Other notable rules that were played for the first time that spring at Lambeth Field were: seven men required on the line at the time of the snap, players could no longer push or pull the ball carrier and the forward pass could now be made across the line of scrimmage.
- Virginia football returned to its roots at Lambeth Field during camp in 2013, 2014, 2015 and 2016, taking part in various scrimmages and practices on the hallowed ground.

UVA ATHLETIC TRAINER FOR FOOTBALL IS ONE OF A FEW

- Virginia's Kelli Pugh is one of 10 women at the FBS level that is their school's sports medicine department's primary care provider for football.
- Pugh is only one of four women at the FBS level that works with a Power-Five level program. Ariko Iso, who was with the Pittsburgh Steelers for years, is with Oregon State. Sally Nogle works with Michigan State and Kammy Powell took over football in 2016 at Minnesota.

• UVA junior Quin Blanding was named by his mother Cory Lee after the movie titled "The Mighty Quinn," starring Denzel Washington and Mimi Rogers. It was the first movie she saw following a checkup during her seventh month of pregnancy and the moment held significant meaning to her. At that checkup the doctor's told her they thought they saw a hole in Quin's head and that it appeared to them his cerebrum wasn't connected. Quin was born completely healthy. Cory named him Quin with one "n" instead of two in recognition of that moment during pregnancy. She knew he will be all right and that he will be the mighty one.

• Blanding's father, Kevin, played football at NCAA Division II Glenville State (W.Va.) for current Arizona football head coach Rich Rodriguez.

• When offensive coordinator Robert Anae finished playing football, he returned home to Hawaii and served as the body model for the towering statue of the father of surfing, Duke Kahanamoku, a five-time Olympian.

The statue, created by artist Jan Fisher, is right next to the famous Waikiki Beach. Anae was a graduate assistant at Hawaii at the time and the artist needed a model, a surfer that was tall, and he went looking for the tallest surfer on the North Shore.

• UVA's oldest living football alum, Dr. John Risher, turned 106 years old this year; he also works in the press box on the UVA stats crew on game day.

• Matt Johns made his collegiate debut as the UVA holder in 2013. The first time Johns made it into a college game he had to hold in the rain on Ian Frye's 53-yard field goal in the 2013 season-opening win over BYU and now current UVA head coach Bronco Mendenhall. Frye's kick sailed through as time expired in the first half, tying the third-longest field goal in UVA history.

• Senior SS Kelvin Rainey has two brothers that have played FBS football. His older brother Johnathan played at New Mexico (2008-11), while his other older brother Derrick played at Arizona (2010-13).

- Johns has thrown at least one touchdown pass in 15 of his 16 career starts.
- With 220 passing yards, Johns became the 10th Cavalier to amass 4,000 career passing yards.
- With 220 passing yards, Johns goes over 200-yards passing for the 11th time in his career. He now shares fifth place with Marques Hagans and Michael Rocco for most 200-yard passing games in UVA history.
- TB Taquan Mizzell rushed for a career-high 131 yards, topping his 2015 total at North Carolina. It is the third 100-yard rushing yard game of his career and second of the season (North Carolina).
- With six receptions, Mizzell has at least one reception in 44 straight games. He entered the day with third-longest active streak.
- With 131 rushing yards, Mizzell moved past Gary Helman (1,832) and Kent Merritt (1,905) into 19th place in the UVA record books for career rushing yards. Mizzell now has 1,962 career rushing yards.
- With 45 receiving yards, Mizzell now has 1,562 for his career and ranks No. 10 all-time in the UVA record book.
- TB Daniel Hamm rushed for his first touchdown of 2016 in second quarter. It was his fifth career rushing touchdown and first since the 2015 Georgia Tech game. A redshirt junior, Hamm now has at least one rushing touchdown in four straight seasons (2013-16).
- WR Ryan Santoro's fourth quarter receiving touchdown was the first of his career.
- WR Doni Dowling had a career-high nine receptions. His previous high was eight at Wake Forest this season.
