VIRGINIA-NC STATE SERIES

- NC State holds a 117-65-1 edge in the all-time series against Virginia.
- UVa won two of three games against the Wolfpack last year in Charlottesville – UVa's first series win against NC State since March 23-25, 2001.

CAVALIERS SEEK FIRST SERIES WIN AT NC STATE

- Virginia has never won a three-game series at NC State.
- Since the ACC adopted the three-game series format in 1990, Virginia has lost all 10 of its series in Raleigh.
- UVa is 7-23 in Raleigh in that span.

BATTLE OF STRENGTHS

- The Virginia-NC State matchup features an interesting battle of strength versus strength.
- NC State's offense has racked up the third-most runs per game (10.6), while Virginia's pitching has allowed 3.7 runs per game, which ranks seventh-best nationally.
- Both offenses are strong, as NC State ranks first in the ACC in batting average (.349), while Virginia stands second (.345).
- UVa's pitching staff holds a 3.45 team ERA – third in the ACC.

BRUNO, SWAB PROVIDE BIG BOOST

- While much of the focus this year was on UVa's returning lineup, newcomers Stephen Bruno and Kenny Swab have become key cogs of late.
- Bruno is batting .478 with seven RBI in UVa's last 10 games, while Swab is batting .417 with three homers and six RBI during that stretch.
- Phil Gosselin (.455) is the only other Wahoo with an average over .400 during that span.

ROAD WARRIORS

- Virginia already boasts two road series wins this season, with 2-1 series wins at then-No. 11 East Carolina and then-No. 2 Florida State.

- Virginia is 6-2 on the road this year, with wins in front of soldout crowds at William and Mary and James Madison as well.

MOST MARCH WINS EVER

- Virginia is coming off one of its best months of March in program history.
- UVa won a school-record 16 games in March while going 16-3.
- It also is the third-best winning percentage for a UVa team in March (.842), behind only the 1967 (5-0) and 1971 (6-0) teams.

HULTZEN LOOKS TO CONTINUE DOMINANCE

- Danny Hultzen has been sensational in his Friday starts this season, posting a 4-1 record with a 1.58 ERA, which ranks third in the ACC.
- In 40 innings, he has struck out an ACC-best 49 and walked just four. Batters are hitting .169 against him – second lowest in the ACC.

VIRGINIA PITCHING LIMITS HITS

- Entering the week Virginia's pitchers had given up an average of 7.61 hits per nine innings – fourth fewest in the nation.
- UVa ranked third nationally last year in fewest hits al-

lowed per nine innings (7.97).

- UVa has given up more than nine hits just once in the last 11 games (10 on Tuesday vs. Towson).

GOSELIN HAS BIG SUCCESS AT TOP OF ORDER

- Phil Gosselin moved into the Cavaliers' leadoff slot this year and has been solid, with a .404 batting average and .488 on base percentage.
- He is tied with Maryland's Brandon Padula for first in the ACC in hits with 42.
- He ranks sixth in the ACC in batting and is tied with teammate Tyler Cannon and several others for the ACC lead in doubles (10).
- Gosselin has reached base to lead off 12 games.

ARICO TIED FOR NCAA LEAD IN SAVES, MOVES INTO SECOND ON VIRGINIA SAVES LIST

- With nine saves this season, Kevin Arico now has 20 career saves – second in Virginia history.
- He just passed Tim LaVigne (1997-2000) for second in the UVa annals.
- Arico currently is tied for the NCAA lead with nine saves. He has converted all of his opportunities this year.

NO SLOUCHES IN THE NINE-HOLE

- Virginia has gotten big production out of its nine-hole hitters this season.
- The No. 9 hitters in the Virginia lineup have combined to go 38-for-87 (.437) this season with 21 RBI and 33 runs scored.
- Outside of the top two spots in the lineup, UVa has gotten its most hits out of the ninth spot in the order.
- Keith Werman, out of the nine-hole, has gone 13-for-22 with eight runs scored and five RBI this year.
- Stephen Bruno is 13-for-28 with two homers, 10 RBI and 13 runs scored in the ninth spot.
- John Barr, David Coleman, Danny Hultzen, Reed Gagnani and Chris Taylor also have gotten opportunities out of the nine-hole.

OFFENSE REVS UP IN SECOND

- Virginia and its opponents each have scored 15 runs in the first inning this year, but the Cavaliers have exploded over the the next three innings.
- The Cavaliers have outscored their foes 93-24 during those three innings (35-7 in the second, 32-12 in the third and 26-5 in the fourth).
- Overall, Virginia is outscoring its opponents 222-97 this season.

BALANCE THROUGHOUT LINEUP

- UVa has gotten production from its entire lineup, with nine players boasting at least 20 hits and 12 runs.
- In 10 games, at least eight of the nine Virginia starters have recorded at least one hit.
- On four occasions, all nine UVa starters posted at least one hit.
- The Cavaliers are hitting .345 as a team through 26 games (second in the ACC). Eight regular hitters are batting .300 or better.

FRESHMEN PRODUCE WHILE WAITING TURN

- UVa's freshman infielders have made the most of their opportunities thus far. At the plate, Stephen Bruno, Reed Gragnani and Chris Taylor have combined to go 35-for-82 (.427).
- Bruno is 8-for-16 with a team-best six RBI in the last five games.
- Gragnani is 8-for-18 with six RBI in four starts at DH.
- Taylor hit a big run-scoring triple in the ninth inning in UVa's win at East Carolina Feb. 21.

CANNON HIT STREAK COMES TO END

- Tyler Cannon's career-best 16-game hit streak came to an end Tuesday. It was the longest active streak in the ACC.
- In the streak, he is batting .439 (29-for-66) and had at least two hits in 10 of the games, including four on March 23 vs. Marshall.
- He also had six doubles and three triples during this stretch.
- It also was UVa's best hit streak of the season; John Hicks had a 12-game streak to start the season.

CANNON CLIMBS VIRGINIA CHARTS

- Tyler Cannon comes into the weekend with 779 career at bats, which is fifth in UVa history.
- Cannon also is in seventh place in career games played with 209.
- Cannon has 53 career doubles, which ties the UVa career doubles record, previously set by Brandon Guyer (2005-07).
- He also is tied for second in triples (12), seventh in runs scored (156), eighth in hits (238) and 11th in HBP (19).

NOTES FROM THE CLEMSON SERIES

- Virginia pitchers surrendered just one extra-base hit in the three games against Clemson.
- Kenny Swab was UVa's top hitter, going 3-for-7 with a pair of solo homers. UVa hit five homers in the series.
- All three UVa starting pitchers tossed six innings.
- UVa won on a Stephen Bruno ninth-inning walkoff single on Friday night.
- Virginia drew a school-record 3,540 fans (sellout) for the first game of the doubleheader Saturday. A total of 6,552 turned out for the doubleheader.

NO STRANGERS TO BIG CROWDS

- Virginia has gotten used to playing in front of large crowds at home and on the road this season.
- UVa already has played in front of six road crowds of more than 3,500.
- UVa set a three-game home series record with 9,642 fans against Boston College.
- Virginia's home attendance (2,397) has more than doubled from this point last season (1,121), despite a cool February and early March.
- In midweek action, the Cavaliers have been welcomed by sellout, record-setting crowds at William and Mary and James Madison.

VIRGINIA RANKS 24TH NATIONALLY IN ATTENDANCE

- With a season average of 2,397 spectators per game, Virginia ranks 24th nationally in attendance.
- Virginia's attendance has more than doubled from the same point last season – through 16 home games last year, UVa averaged 1,191 fans per game.
- UVa ranks fourth in attendance this season among ACC schools, behind Florida State, Clemson and Miami.
- UVa averaged 1,513 fans per game last season. The UVa single-season attendance average record is 1,774, set in 2007.

DEFENSE OFF TO GOOD START

- Through 26 games, Virginia has committed just 20 errors – good for an impressive .979 fielding percentage, which is second in the ACC and eighth in the nation.
- The Cavaliers recorded a .972 fielding mark last year.
- The school record for fielding percentage is .975, set in 2005.

PARKER NEARING TOP OF TRIPLES LEDGER

- With his triple March 21 vs. Boston College, Jarrett Parker has hit 12 triples in his career, which is tied for second in UVa history.
- He needs one more three-bagger to tie Brian Buchanan (1992-94) for the Virginia record.

WAHOOS NOTCH FIRST SERIES WIN VS. FLORIDA STATE

- Virginia scored its first-ever series win against Florida State March 12-14, taking two of three games in Tallahassee.
- UVa was 0-for-14 in its previous three-game series with the Seminoles.
- It also marked the highest-ranked opponent that UVa has won a series against since March 17-18, 2007 at then-No. 1 North Carolina.

VETERAN-LADEN CAVALIERS

- Virginia has one of its most experienced teams ever.
- The Cavaliers' returning position players have combined for 1,120 career starts, led by senior shortstop Tyler Cannon, who has started 203 games.
- Ten players have started at least 50 career games apiece for UVa. Cannon, Dan Grovatt (144), Jarrett Parker (136) and Phil Gosselin (129) and Franco Valdes (100) each have made at least 100 career starts.

CAVALIERS EARN FIRST-EVER NO. 1 NATIONAL RANKING

- Virginia has earned a No. 1 ranking by Baseball America and Rivals.com for the sixth straight week.
- It marks the first No. 1 ranking in school history for Virginia Baseball.
- The baseball team becomes the 10th athletics program at Virginia to garner a No. 1 national ranking, joining men's basketball, women's basketball, field hockey, football, men's lacrosse, women's lacrosse, men's soccer, women's soccer and men's tennis.
- Virginia currently has three teams ranked No. 1 – baseball, men's lacrosse and men's tennis.

UVA LEADS NATION IN ERA LAST FIVE YEARS

- Virginia led all NCAA Division I teams in ERA over the past five seasons, boasting a 3.13 team ERA.
- UVa ranked in the top 15 in the country in ERA each of the last six seasons, including No. 3 marks in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009.
- North Carolina is the only other team to rank among the top 15 nationally in ERA for the last six years.
- Virginia is the only team in Division I to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts and fewest hits and walks allowed each of the last two years.

- UVa trails only Prairie View and Jackson State over that span.
- The Cavaliers stole 119 bases in 145 attempts last year, as five players stole at least 13 bases apiece.

2009 IN REVIEW

- Virginia finished 49-15-1 (16-11-1 ACC) and advanced to the College World Series for the first time in program history.
- UVa won the NCAA Irvine Regional and Oxford Super Regional – the program's first NCAA regional and super regional championships.
- UVa defeated Clemson, UNC, Duke and Florida State to win the ACC Baseball Championship – the third ACC crown in school history. Dan Grovatt (8-for-15, .533) was named the tournament MVP.
- As the sixth seed, UVa became the lowest seed ever to win the ACC Baseball Championship.
- The Cavaliers won a school-record 49 games, while posting a record .761 winning percentage.
- Brian O'Connor was named the NCBWA and CBI National Coach of the Year.
- UVa led the ACC in batting (.327), ERA (3.23) and stolen bases (119) – the first school since Maryland in 1954 to lead the ACC in all three categories.
- UVa ranked third nationally with a 3.23 ERA.
- The Cavaliers set 11 team school records, including hits (767), runs (507) and strikeouts (593).
- Virginia had a school-record five players picked to the All-ACC First Team – Tyler Cannon (SS), Phil Gosselin (2B), Dan Grovatt (OF), Danny Hultzen (UTL) and Jarrett Parker (OF).

STRONG CORE OF PITCHERS BACK, BUT HOLES REMAIN

- UVa has to fill the holes of six pitchers who logged 226.0 innings and made 30 starts last season. Nine pitchers return.
- Danny Hultzen (9-1, 2.17) and Robert Morey (3-0, 3.33) each had strong 2009 seasons and will anchor the rotation, but the third weekend rotation slot as well as several bullpen spots are still in limbo.
- UVa had a 3.23 ERA last year (third nationally) and has the best ERA in the nation (3.13) over the last five seasons.

VERSATILITY KEY FOR CAVALIERS

- Much of the UVa's depth comes because of its versatility – several players could see action at a variety of positions.
- John Hicks and Kenny Swab each are athletic players who primarily are catchers but both will shift to first base and the outfield at times.
- Danny Hultzen will pitch and also is a strong first baseman and will DH as well, while Phil Gosselin could play at second or left field.
- Corey Hunt (INF) and Shane Halley (OF) each will pitch, but are great defensive players in the field as well.

STARTING LINEUP BACK IN TACT

- Virtually the entire offense returns from 2009, including everyone from the starting lineup.
- Almost all of the offensive production is back – 99 percent of the RBI-production returns, with 98.4 percent of the hit-producers (755 of 767) coming back.
- Virginia hit .327 last season – the Cavaliers' best mark since 1985 – and swatted 59 home runs – UVa's most since 2002.
- Dan Grovatt (.356), Jarrett Parker (.355) and Tyler Cannon (.351) led UVa in batting last year. UVa has nine regular starters back who hit at least .292 last year.

WHO'S GONE?

- Virginia will need to replace 229.0 innings lost from the 2009 squad.
- The top loss comes from starter Andrew Carraway, who tossed 91.0 innings last year.
- Matt Packer pitched 61 innings – second-most out of the bullpen.

SCHEDULE WILL CHALLENGE

- Virginia's schedule is not for the faint of heart – 11 teams from the 2009 NCAA Tournament line the schedule.
- Thirty-six games will come against teams that won at least 30 games last year.
- UVa opened with a three-game set at East Carolina, a 2009 Super Regional qualifier.
- The ACC slate features six NCAA teams from last season – North Carolina (CWS), Clemson and Florida State (Super Regionals) and Boston College, Georgia Tech and Miami (Regionals).
- The Cavaliers also have non-conference matchups with 2009 NCAA Tournament foes Coastal Carolina, Dartmouth, George Mason and Wright State.
