**12th-Ranked FSU Hosts Boston College In Primetime Atlantic Division Battle
 Duke-Virginia Tech, North Carolina-Miami in key Coastal Contests;
 Maryland Travels to Virginia in Border War Renewal**

At the mid-point of the Atlantic Coast Conference's 60th football season, three teams remain unbeaten in conference play...But the squads without a league blemish on their slates are not the ones anyone expected...In the Coastal Division, Miami (3-0) and upstart Duke (2-0) lead the way, teams that were forecast to be 5th and 6th in their Division in the annual preseason media poll...While Maryland (1-0) sits atop the Atlantic Division, just ahead of favorites Florida State and Clemson...The Terrapins were tabbed to finish 6th in the Atlantic in the preseason...This Saturday, all three will be in action looking to continue their winning ways...Miami, coached by **Al Golden** and led by **QB Stephen Morris**, looks to get back on the winning track after a non-conference loss to 9th-ranked Notre Dame in Chicago...The Hurricanes will host Coastal Division foe North Carolina at Sun Life Stadium in a nationally televised game at Miami Gardens (2:30 p.m., ESPNU)...The Tar Heels of coach **Larry Fedora** were impressive in a 48-34 win over perennial Coastal champ Virginia Tech, behind a 262-yard rushing effort by **TB Giovanni Bernard**...UNC is not eligible for the Coastal title due to NCAA sanctions, but that

hasn't slowed down their fast-paced offense which has racked up 114 points in its last two games...Meanwhile in Blacksburg, Va., Duke, coached by **David Cutcliffe**, takes its four game-winning streak on the road to face the Hokies of coach **Frank Beamer** at Lane Stadium (12:30 p.m., ACC Network)...The Blue Devils are led by senior **WR Conner Vernon**, who became the ACC's all-time leading pass receiver last week and now has 239 career receptions...A win by Duke would make the Blue Devils bowl eligible for the first time since 1994...Since joining the ACC in 2004, Virginia Tech has won eight straight against the Blue Devils and overall has 11 straight wins in the series, with Duke's last win coming in 1981 in Durham...Duke has never won in Blacksburg...The Hokies, seeking to snap a rare two-game losing streak, are led by junior **QB Logan Thomas**...In Charlottesville, Va., Maryland, coached by **Randy Edsall**, looks to build on its 19-14 win over Wake Forest in its "border war" with Virginia at Scott Stadium (3 p.m., RSN)...The Terrapins, ranked 7th nationally in rushing and total defense, are led by **DE Joe Vellano** and **LB Demetrius Hartsfield**...

Virginia, coached by **Mike London**, counters with an offense led by senior **RB Perry Jones**, who needs just 11 receiving yards to become one of only two active players nationally with 1,000 career rushing yards and 1,000 career receiving yards...In Tallahassee, 12th-ranked Florida State, coached by **Jimbo Fisher**, is looking to get back on the winning track after a 17-16 upset loss to NC State in Raleigh...The Seminoles will host Atlantic Division foe Boston College in a nationally televised game at Doak Campbell Stadium (5:30 pm, ESPN2)...FSU is led by **QB EJ Manuel** who ranks 8th nationally in passing efficiency, and a defensive unit which ranks 4th nationally in total and 7th in scoring defense...BC, coached by **Frank Spaziani**, is led by **QB Chase Rettig**, who is 2nd in the ACC in passing yards per game (305.2) and **WR Alex Amidon**, who is 6th nationally in receiving yards per game...Four ACC teams enjoy a brief respite this weekend with open dates before finishing the season with 6 straight games in 16th-ranked Clemson, Georgia Tech, NC State and Wake Forest.

Former Miami head coach **Jimmy Johnson**, who also coached at Arkansas and went on to professional fame as head of the Super Bowl champion Dallas Cowboys, will be inducted at the annual National Football Foundation banquet, which will be held Tuesday, December 4 at the Waldorf Astoria Hotel in New York City. Johnson's induction brings the total to 16 former players or coaches who have been tabbed for induction into the College Hall of Fame from current Atlantic Coast Conference schools over the last seven years.

Johnson coached five seasons at Miami, leading the Hurricanes to record of 52-9 and a winning percentage .852. His 1987 Miami team captured the school's second National Championship and his 1986 team played for the national title, but lost to Penn State. During his years with the Hurricanes, his teams defeated 19 nationally-ranked teams, 8 teams ranked in the top five and three teams ranked No. 1. His teams played in two Fiesta Bowls, two Orange Bowls and one Sugar Bowl game. During his five years in Miami, his teams were ranked nationally on 55 occasions, including 13 times being ranked No. 1 nationally. Prior to joining the Hurricanes, he served as head coach at Oklahoma State, rebuilding that program and posting a 29-26-2 record. His overall record in college is 81-35-2. Johnson played his collegiate football at Arkansas, where he was a starter on the Razorback's 1964 national championship team. After leaving Miami he enjoyed a successful career in the National Football League as head coach of the Dallas Cowboys and Miami Dolphins. He coached the Cowboys to two Super Bowl Championships. Johnson joins 15 other former players or coaches from current ACC schools who have been

selected for the Hall of Fame since 2006 including:

2012 ACC Football By The Numbers

.615 - The winning percentage of NC State head coach **Tom O'Brien** against nationally-ranked teams in his six seasons in Raleigh. During that time O'Brien has posted an 8-5 record against ranked teams, including last week's 17-16 last-second upset of 3rd-ranked Florida State. Since the 2003 season, O'Brien's teams at Boston College and NC State have faced 24 nationally-ranked teams and have beaten 15 of them, a .625 winning percentage.

.866 - The winning percentage for Clemson head coach Dabo Swinney against ACC opponents at Clemson's Memorial Stadium. Swinney's Tiger teams have captured 13 of the 15 ACC home games at "Death Valley" during his tenure.

0 - The number of periods in Florida State QB **EJ Manuel's** name. There are no periods after the E or the J for Manuel, whose whole name is short for Erick Rodriguez Manuel, Jr., but was shortened to "EJ Manuel", without the periods, long ago.

2 - The number of **quarterbacks** who made their starting debuts in the ACC last weekend. Duke's Anthony Boone started in place of injured Duke senior Sean Renfree, while Virginia's Philip Sims started in place of Michael Rocco, against each other in the 42-17 Blue Devil victory.

4 - The number of touchdown passes for Duke sophomore QB **Anthony Boone** in his first career start for the Blue Devils. Boone, starting in place of the injured Sean Renfree, completed 18 of 31 passes for 212 yards, 4 touchdowns and no interceptions, also running for an additional 41 yards on 7 carries.

7 - **Maryland** ranks 7th nationally this week both in total and rushing defense. The Terps, led by **DE Joe Vellano** and **LB Demetrius Hartsfield**, have allowed only an average of 81 yards rushing and 257.2 yards of total offense per game, dramatic improvements from a year ago.

9 - Clemson's **DeAndre "Nuk" Hopkins** recorded the 9th 100-yard receiving game of his career against Georgia Tech, making 7 catches for 173 yards and 2 TDs. Hopkins has now recorded four 100-yard games this year alone in six games. Hopkins ranks 8th nationally in receptions per game and 5th in receiving yards per game.

10.05 - The per-carry average for Georgia Tech A-Back **Orwin Smith** throughout his career. If maintained for the rest of this season, it will be an ACC record for 1,000 or more career rushing yards. Smith, from Phenix City, Ala., has 151 carries for 1,519 yards in his career, a 10.05 average, including an 11.3 per-carry norm this year.

11 - The **ACC** has 11 of its players on the Watch List for the prestigious Biletnikoff

Award, the most of any FBS conference.

13.60 - Boston College senior **LB Nick Clancy** leads the nation in tackles made. Clancy had 15 tackles in BC's loss to Army and now has 66 for the year in 5 games, an average of 16.30 per game. Clancy's predecessor at his position, current Carolina Panther Luke Kuechly, led the nation in 2010 and 2011 in tackles.

19 - Clemson **PK Chandler Catanzaro** has made 19 consecutive field goals, a streak which began in the 2011 season. He broke the Clemson school record of 14, set by Obed Arriri, in 1980, with a 50-yarder on Sept. 22 against Florida State. The ACC record is 27 straight set by NC State's Marc Primanti during the 1995-96 seasons. Catanzaro is now 47-60 over his career, a .783 percentage and has made all 11 of his field goal attempts this year.

20 - In his four-plus seasons leading the Duke football program, **David Cutcliffe** has guided the Blue Devils to 20 victories. That's one more win than the Duke football program managed in 12 full years prior to Cutcliffe's arrival in Durham.

21 - The number of times **ACC teams** have topped the 500-yard mark in total offense this season through the first half of the year. In all of the 2011 season, conference teams only topped the 500-yard mark a total of 15 times.

31 - The number of career rushing touchdowns for Georgia Tech senior **QB Tevin Washington**. Washington is 2nd on the ACC career list in career TDs for a QB, trailing only former ACC standout Joshua Nesbitt of Georgia Tech (35).

45.8 - The punting average of Duke redshirt freshman **Will Monday**. Monday leads the ACC and ranks 10th nationally in punting. More than a third of his 33 punts have travelled 50 or more yards and 10 of his punts have pinned Duke's opponents inside of their own 20 yard lines.

48 - The number of rushing yards needed by Clemson **RB Andre Ellington** to top the 3,000-yard rushing mark for his career. Ellington, who currently leads the ACC in rushing averaging 99.5 yards per game, has 2,952 career yards.

51 - Clemson junior **QB Tahj Boyd** threw 2 TD passes against Georgia Tech Saturday, bringing his career total to 51 in a year and a half as the starting QB for the Tigers. Boyd's total is a Clemson school record and already has him 18th on the ACC career list. Boyd also has 59 career TDR.

67.1 - Florida State quarterback **EJ Manuel** is one of the most accurate passers in ACC history. Manuel, who only became a full-time starter in 2011, has completed 442 of 659 passes in his career, a completion percentage of .671. If maintained for the rest of this year, that would be the best in ACC history.

Virginia's Matt Schaub (.670) and Wake Forest's Riley Skinner (.669) are currently 1-2 on the career list.

90+ - For only the second time in ACC history a league game featured two players each with a kickoff return of 90 or more yards. North Carolina's **Sean Tapley** return a kickoff 94 yards for UNC's first score of the day and later in the game, Virginia Tech's **Demitri Knowles** returned a kickoff 93 yards for a score. That matched the efforts of Duke's Scottie Montgomery and Wake's John Stone who each had 99-yard returns for TDs on Nov. 13, 1999.

99 - Boston College junior **RB Andre Williams** set an ACC record and tied an NCAA mark when he ran 99 yards for a touchdown against Army last Saturday. Williams, who finished the game with 191 rushing yards, broke the former ACC record of Maryland's Steve Atkins (98 yds) set against Clemson in 1978. He also tied the NCAA mark, held by eight other players and set originally by Gale Sayers of Kansas in 1963 and most recently by Ronnie Hillman of San Diego State in 2011.

239 - The number of career pass receptions for Duke senior wide receiver **Conner Vernon**. Vernon became the ACC's all-time career-leading receiver Saturday against Virginia. He has shattered the old mark of 232 catches set by Clemson's Aaron Kelly during the 2005-2008 seasons. His career total of 3,230 receiving yards puts him in 4th place on the ACC career list. He needs 288 receiving yards to set a new standard, currently held by FSU's Peter Warrick (3,517).

254 - Virginia Tech head coach **Frank Beamer** has a total of 254 coaching victories in his career and now leads all active NCAA FBS head coaches. Beamer is now 8th on the NCAA's career FBS list with 7th-place Tom Osborne (Nebraska) now one win away at 255.

262 - The career-high rushing yardage total for North Carolina sophomore **TB Giovanni Bernard** in UNC's 48-34 win over Virginia Tech. Bernard's effort was the 11th-best in the 60-year history of the ACC. It was also the 5th-best mark by a UNC running back since the school began play in the conference in 1953.

387 - Florida State **PK Dustin Hopkins** has 387 career points, putting him in 2nd place on the ACC career scoring list. Hopkins now only trails Maryland's Nick Novak, who scored 393 points during the 2001-04 seasons. With 10 points against NC State, Hopkins pulled within six points of Novak. The NCAA scoring mark is 439 points set by Boise State's Kyle Brotzman during the 2007-10 seasons.

1994 - **Duke**, with a 5-1 record, is off to its best start in football since the 1994 season when the Blue Devils won their first seven games and posted an 8-4 record. That year also marked the Blue Devils' last appearance in a postseason bowl game.

2012 ACC FB Game Summaries -- Oct. 6

NC State 17, #3/4 Florida State 16

QB Mike Glennon connected with WR Bryan Underwood on 2-yard touchdown pass on fourth down with 16 seconds to play, and PK Niklas Sade added the extra point to lift the homestanding Wolfpack (4-2 overall, 1-1 ACC) to a dramatic 17-16 win over the third-ranked Seminoles (5-1, 2-1). FSU led 16-0 at the half, thanks to PK Dustin Hopkins' three field goals and QB EJ Manuel's 4-yard touchdown pass to TE Nick O'Leary. But the Wolfpack defense held the Seminoles, who had averaged 51 points in their first five games, scoreless in the second half. Sade's 27-yard field goal cut into FSU's lead in the third quarter. Then, following an interception by DB Juston Burris, Glennon led a 67-yard scoring drive that was capped by a 24-yard touchdown pass to RB Shadrach Thornton that brought the home team within 16-10 with just over 11 minutes to play. The Wolfpack's winning score was set up when DE Mike Rose blocked a punt to set up NC State at the FSU 43-yard line with 2:27 to play. The Wolfpack marched to the end zone from there in 12 plays, converting on three fourth downs including the winning TD.

Duke 42, Virginia 17

WR Conner Vernon caught two touchdown passes and set the Atlantic Coast Conference record for career receptions as the Blue Devils (5-1, 2-0) recorded their second straight ACC win and continued their fastest start to a season since 1994. QB Anthony Boone, filling in for injured Blue Devil starter Sean Renfree, threw four touchdown passes. Vernon caught seven passes and now has 239 receptions for his career, breaking the previous ACC mark of 232 set by Clemson's Aaron Kelly (2005-08). RBs Kevin Parks and Perry Jones rushed for first-half touchdowns for Virginia (2-4, 0-2).

North Carolina 48, Virginia Tech 34

RB Giovani Bernard rushed for a career-high 262 yards, and WR Sean Tapley delivered a pair of big play touchdowns to lead the homestanding Tar Heels (4-2, 1-1). Bernard's big day included a 62-yard touchdown run. Tapley raced 94 yards on a kickoff return for a game-tying touchdown after UNC had spotted the Hokies an early 7-0 lead and also scored on a 19-yard touchdown pass from QB Bryn Renner. RB A.J. Blue added a pair of rushing touchdowns for the Tar Heels. WR Demetri Knowles returned a kickoff 93 yards for a Virginia Tech touchdown. QB Logan Thomas passed for 354 yards and two touchdowns and also had a 13-yard touchdown run for the Hokies (3-3, 1-1).

#15/15 Clemson 47, Georgia Tech 31

QB Tajh Boyd threw for a career high 397 yards and two touchdowns, and WR DeAndre Hopkins had 173 yards receiving to lead No. 15 Clemson (5-1, 2-1) past the visiting Yellow Jackets (2-4, 1-3). The teams combined for nearly 1,100 yards total offense. One of Boyd's touchdown passes was a 35-yard strike to Hopkins, who had a school-record 197 receiving yards one week earlier vs. Boston College. Boyd also rushed for a touchdown and caught a 2-point conversion pass from RB Andre Ellington. QB Tevin Washington ran for 104 yards on 16 carries and completed 9 of 14 passes for 144 yards for Georgia Tech.

Maryland 19, Wake Forest 14

RB Justin Pickett's 1-yard touchdown run with 5:37 remaining lifted the Terps (3-2, 1-0) past the visiting Demon Deacons (3-3, 1-3). QB Perry Hills and WR Stefon Diggs hooked up on a 63-yard pass play to set up Pickett's winning score. Maryland PK Brad Craddock kicked field goals of 49 and 52 yards. Wake Forest QB Tanner Price threw a 73-yard touchdown pass to WR Terence Davis and a 7-yard scoring pass to FB Tommy Bohanon.

Army 34, Boston College 31

QB Trent Stillman ran for a 29-yard touchdown with 45 seconds to play, lifting Army (1-4) past the visiting Eagles (1-4). Boston College RB Andre Williams rushed for 191 yards and two touchdowns on 21 carries, including a 99-yard touchdown run in the second quarter, the longest run from scrimmage in ACC history. Eagles WR Alex Amidon had a 24-yard rushing touchdown and five receptions for 85 yards and another score.

#9/10 Notre Dame 41, Miami 3

RBs Cierre Wood and George Atkinson III combined to rush for 243 yards and two touchdowns, leading the ninth-ranked Fighting Irish (5-0) past Miami (4-2) at Chicago's Soldier Field. Notre Dame is unbeaten through five games for the first time since 2002. The loss snapped a three-game winning streak for Miami, which was held to just 285 yards after piling up 1,260 yards and 86 points in its previous two games. PK Jake Wieclaw's 28-yard field goal in the first quarter accounted for the Hurricanes' scoring.

Boston College

RB Andre Williams scored on the longest rushing play in school history, an ACC-record 99-yard run in the second quarter of last Saturday's game at Army ... The longest rushing play at BC prior to the run from Williams was a 91-yard gain from Ed Walsh against Brooklyn College on November 12, 1944 ... Williams delivered only the ninth 99-yard rushing touchdown in NCAA history ... Williams, was the first Eagle to rush for 100 yards in a game this season. He had a career-high 191 rushing yards to mark his fourth career 100-yard rushing game ... **LB Steele Divitto** recovered his second fumble of the season and the fourth of his career in the Army game ... Divitto also had 18 tackles on the day – his third game this season (fourth career) with double-digit tackles ... **DB Sean Sylvia** notched 17 tackles on the day for his third game this season (and in his career) with double-digit tackles ... **LB Nick Clancy**, the NCAA's leading tackler (13.6 per game), had his fourth double-figure tackling game of the year with 15 tackles ... Junior **PK Nate Freese** is 9-for-9 on field goal attempts this season.



Maryland

Maryland won its ACC opener for the fifth straight year by defeating Wake Forest 19-14 last Saturday ... The Terps, who rank seventh nationally in rushing and total defense, allowed just 241 total offensive yards against the Demon Deacons, the fourth time in five games they've held the opponent under 300 ... The Terps also held the opponent under 100 yards rushing for the third time this year as Wake finished with 71 rushing yards ... The Terps are allowing just 2.3 yards per rushing attempt this season, which also ranks seventh nationally ... **LB Demetrius Hartsfield** recorded double digit tackles (10) for the second time this season vs. Wake Forest (to go with his season-high 13 vs. William & Mary) ... Freshman **WR Stefan Diggs** had his second straight 100-yard receiving game by hauling in a season-high five passes for 105 yards vs. Wake ... Diggs' 63-yard reception in the fourth quarter was the longest by a Terp this year and set up the game-winning touchdown by **RB Justus Pickett** ... **PK Brad Craddock** (49- and 52-yard field goals vs. Wake) is the first Terp to hit a 50-yard field goal since Travis Baltz had a 52-yarder on Nov. 27, 2010.



Clemson

QB Tajh Boyd passed for a career-high 397 yards in last Saturday's win over Georgia Tech ... That ranks second in school history in passing yards behind Charlie Whitehurst's 420 passing yards against Duke in 2002 ... Boyd also rushed for a career-high 63 yards vs. the Yellow Jackets for 460 yards of total offense, the second-most in school history ... The record is 517 yards by Woodrow Dantzler in 2001 against NC State ... Boyd is now third in Clemson history in career passing yards with 5,905... He trails Dantzler (6,037) for second place ... **WR DeAndre Hopkins** has had at least 100 yards receiving in four of Clemson's six games this season, and a touchdown catch in five of the six ... Clemson finished the Georgia Tech game with 601 yards of total offense. That ranks eighth in school history ... Clemson and Georgia Tech combined for 1,084 yards of total offense ... That is second most in Clemson school history for total offense by both teams ... The record is 1,107 yards, set in 1981 when Clemson totaled 756 yards of offense and Wake Forest went for 351 yards.



NC State

No. 3 Florida State was the highest ranked opponent NC State has defeated since downing No. 2 Florida State, 24-7, in 1998 ... NC State has now beaten a ranked FSU team in five of the last seven meetings ... Head coach **Tom O'Brien** improved to 6-4 against ranked opponents at Carter-Finely Stadium ... Florida State came into the game having put up over 400 yards of total offense in each of its first five games. The NC State defense held the Seminoles to a season-low 343 yards ... Sophomore **WR Bryan Underwood** set a new school record with a TD catch in his sixth consecutive game when he hauled in the winning score vs. FSU with 16 seconds left ... Underwood now has seven TD catches on the season, a mark that is already seventh-most in a single season in school history ... **DE Mike Rose's** blocked punt in the fourth quarter against Florida State was the first blocked punt for the Wolfpack since the 2010 game against Boston College, when Colby Jackson recorded one ... Rose's blocked punt gave the ball back to the NC State offense for the game-winning drive at the FSU 43-yard line with 2:27 to play.



Florida State

QB EJ Manuel completed a pass to eight different receivers in last Saturday night's game at NC State. That marked the sixth straight game this season that Manuel and his fellow QBs has found eight or more receivers in a game ... It didn't take long for senior **WR Rodney Smith** to extend his consecutive games with a catch streak. On the second offensive play of the game for FSU, Smith raised his streak to 31 straight games with a reception when he hauled in a 16-yard pass from Manuel ... **RB Chris Thompson's** 141 yards rushing vs. the Wolfpack were the second-most by a Seminole in the 33-game series. Jermaine Thomas racked up 186 yards on the ground in 2009 ... Senior **PK Dustin Hopkins** seems to have relocated his groove after a somewhat slow start to the season ... The Lou Groza candidate accounted for 10 points against NC State on an extra point and three field goals, including a season-long 49-yarder ... Hopkins has now connected on six consecutive field goal attempts and is just six points shy of becoming FSU's and the ACC's all-time leading scorer.



Wake Forest

One week after recording a career-high six receptions for a career-high 100 yards, senior **WR Terence Davis** topped those marks in last Saturday's game at Maryland, finishing with seven receptions for 130 yards ... Davis' 73-yard reception for a touchdown against Maryland was the longest of his career ... Davis had his first career touchdown reception at Byrd Stadium in the Deacons' last trip to Maryland in 2010 ... **FB Tommy Bohanon** caught a 7-yard TD pass at Maryland ... It marked the third TD grab of the year and the fifth of Bohanon's career ... Bohanon's three TD catches are tied with **WR Michael Campanaro** for the most on the team this season ... **S Duran Lowe** stepped into the starting lineup for the Deacons vs. the Terps and recorded a career-high nine tackles ... His previous career-high was six as a freshman against Boston College and NC State ... Lowe also forced his first career fumble in the Maryland game ... Maryland's 53 rushing yards were the fewest Wake Forest has allowed since allowing just 22 yards on the ground to Gardner-Webb last season.



COASTAL DIVISION TEAM NOTES



Duke

With last Saturday's 42-17 win over Virginia, Duke improves to 5-1 on the year, marking the best opening to a season since the 1994 squad started 6-0 ... It also matches the third-best six-game opening to a season for Duke since the inception of the ACC in 1953 (6-0 in 1994; 5-0-1 in 1957; 5-1 in 1953, 1960, 1962, 1971, 1988 & 2012) ... Duke owns a four-game winning streak for the first time under fifth-year head coach **David Cutcliffe** ... The Blue Devils' 227 points through six weeks marks the highest six-game total to begin a season in school history, topping the 189 points scored by the 1945 squad ... **QB Anthony Boone** completed 18-of-31 passes for 212 yards and four touchdowns against Virginia, setting career highs in all three categories ... **S Walt Canty** finished the Virginia game with a season-high 14 tackles ... Canty reached double digits in the tackle column for the third time this year and the ninth time in his career and surpassed the 200 mark for career tackles ... **PK Ross Martin** was successful on 6-of-6 PATs last Saturday, bringing his season total to 27-of-27, the highest number of PATs without a miss by a Duke freshman.



North Carolina

With last Saturday's 48-34 win over Virginia Tech, coupled with a 66-0 win over Idaho on Sept. 29, the Tar Heels have scored 45 or more points in back-to-back games for the first time since 1993 ... UNC accumulated 533 yards of total offense against the Hokies, the second consecutive week with at least 500 yards. The Tar Heels gained 575 against Idaho ... Led by **RB Giovani Bernard's** 262 career-high rushing yards, UNC rushed for 339 yards vs. Virginia Tech, the first time the Tar Heels have gone over 300 rushing yards as a team since 2004 (341 vs. William & Mary) ... Bernard's 11.4 yards per carry (on 23 carries) was the highest single-game mark in school history, surpassing Kelvin Bryant's mark of 11.1 in 1981 vs. East Carolina ... **WR Sean Tapley** caught two passes for 43 yards on Saturday, including a 19-yard touchdown in the third quarter ... Tapley also returned a kickoff 94 yards for a touchdown in the first quarter. It was Tapley's first kickoff return touchdown and the first for UNC since **WR T.J. Thorpe** took a kickoff back 100 yards at Clemson in 2011 ... Tapley now has four touchdowns on the season.



Georgia Tech

Georgia Tech head coach **Paul Johnson** announced Monday that defensive coordinator **Al Groh** has been relieved of his duties with the Yellow Jacket program, effective immediately ... At the halfway point of the season, Georgia Tech is averaging 331.0 yards rushing per game ... That ranks third nationally, and if it holds up, would be the highest season average in Yellow Jacket history... Tech's total offense average (486.8) is the second-highest in school history and the highest since 1999... The Yellow Jackets are averaging 37.8 points per game, which is Tech's highest average since 1999 ... Before this year, Tech had averaged more than eight yards per play in a game just 10 times in the previous 35 years... The Jackets have averaged more than eight yards per play three times this season alone, including an 8.1 average last Saturday at Clemson ... Senior **QB Tevin Washington** needs 51 rushing yards to join Joshua Nesbitt as the only players in Georgia Tech history with 2,500 career passing yards and 2,000 rushing yards.



Virginia

QB Phillip Sims and **WR E.J. Scott** made their first career starts for the Cavaliers in Saturday's game at Duke ... Sims' first two passing attempts and completions went to Scott ... With **RB Kevin Parks'** rushing TD in the first quarter vs. the Blue Devils, UVa scored its first rushing TD since the fourth quarter of the Richmond game on Sept. 1, breaking a 16-quarter streak without a score on the ground ... With 268 yards passing, Sims threw for the second-highest total by a Virginia QB making his first career start ... Sims' 21 completions, 42 attempts and 268 passing yards were all career highs ... With four receptions against Duke, **RB Perry Jones** now has 102 career catches, becoming the 16th player in program history with 100 receptions ... Jones is now No. 15 all-time at UVa in career receptions ... Jones also rushed for 100 yards against Duke, his fourth career game with 100 rushing yards or more ... Jones needs 135 rushing yards to reach 2,000 for his career ... With 10 tackles against Duke, **LB Steve Greer** has recorded double digits in tackles 10 times in his career.



Miami

After playing four games away from home in the first six weeks of the season, Miami will open a season-long three-game homestand Saturday when it faces North Carolina ... Miami (4-2, 3-0) is the only ACC team with three conference wins thus far. The Canes are looking for their first 4-0 start in ACC play ... With 168.3 all-purpose yards per game, **RB Duke Johnson** ranks 14th nationally among FBS players (first in the ACC) and leads all freshmen in that category ... Four different Hurricanes have receptions of 50 yards or more on the season. **WR Rashawn Scott** (76 yards, 52), **WR Phillip Dorsett** (65, 62), **TE Clive Walford** (56) and Johnson (50) each have 50-yard receptions ... The Hurricanes are the only team in the nation to have two RBs that have scored at least four touchdowns in a game this season. Johnson scored four times against Bethune-Cookman on Sept. 15 and **Mike James** scored four at Georgia Tech a week later ... Miami's offensive line has allowed just one sack – Sept. 29 against NC State – in the last four games, in which the Canes have averaged 492.8 yards of total offense.



Virginia Tech

QB Logan Thomas set career highs in pass completions (26), pass attempts (49) and yards passing (354) in last Saturday's ACC road game at North Carolina ... **WR Corey Fuller** caught five passes for 143 yards vs. the Tar Heels, including a 66-yard touchdown pass from Thomas ... Fuller's yardage total and his touchdown reception yardage were career highs ... Freshman **WR Demetri Knowles** scored on a 93-yard kickoff return against UNC and also had six receptions for 83 yards ... Saturday's loss at UNC marked the first time Virginia Tech had lost a regular-season ACC game in the state of North Carolina since joining the league for the 2004 season– a string of 13 straight games ... Tech had won 23 straight road conference openers prior to the loss to UNC ... The last time the Hokies had lost a road conference opener was in 1962, a 3-0 defeat at William & Mary when the Hokies were in the Southern Conference ... Despite Saturday's loss, Virginia Tech still owns an impressive 27-6 all-time record in ACC road games.

NC State's Thomas Teal headlines honorees for performance in the Wolfpack's upset of 3rd-ranked Florida State

GREENSBORO, N.C. – NC State sophomore defensive tackle Thomas Teal headlines a list of eight players named as the Atlantic Coast Conference Football Players of the Week, announced by the conference on Monday. Teal tallied six tackles, including two loss, as the Wolfpack upset No. 3 Florida State, 17-16.

Walt Canty, a senior safety for Duke, posted a game-high 14 tackles in the 42-17 win over Virginia as the Blue Devils improved on their best start since 1994.

Clemson's DeAndre Hopkins, the Receiver of the Week, caught seven passes for 173 yards in the 47-31 win over Georgia Tech. Teammate Tyler Shatley was named the Offensive Lineman of the Week after helping the offense accumulate 601 yards of total offense.

The Offensive Back of the Week, North Carolina's Giovanni Bernard, set a career high with 262 yards rushing in the 48-34 win over Virginia Tech. Sean Tapley, the Specialist of the Week, became the first player to return a kickoff for a touchdown against the Hokies since 1993 as he scored on a 94-yard return.

Maryland's Demetrius Hartsfield, the Linebacker of the Week, finished with 10 tackles as the Terrapins won their ACC opener, 19-14, over Wake Forest. Teammate Stefon Diggs was named the Rookie of the Week for the second time this year after catching five passes for 105 yards.

OFFENSIVE BACK – Giovanni Bernard, North Carolina, Sophomore, TB, 5-10, 205, Davie, Fla.

Bernard rushed for a career-high 262 yards on 23 carries and scored a touchdown in North Carolina's 48-34 victory over Virginia Tech. The 262-yard performance is the fifth-highest single-game rushing total in North Carolina history and the most ever gained against Virginia Tech in any game. Bernard became the first Tar Heel to rush for 200 yards in a game since Ronnie McGill totaled 244 against Wake Forest in 2003. In one stretch from the second to third quarter, Bernard had eight carries for 186 yards, an average of 23.3 yards per rush. Bernard scored on a 62-yard run on 4th-and-inches on the first play of the second quarter and later added a 51-yard run. His 11.4 yards per carry is a single-game school record.

OFFENSIVE LINEMAN – Tyler Shatley, Clemson, RS Junior, OG, 6-3, 295, Icard, N.C.

Shatley played 91 of 93 snaps and helped Clemson to 601 yards of total offense in the 47-31 victory over Georgia Tech. Shatley had five knockdown blocks and graded a career-high 91 percent. He did not allow a sack and provided many key blocks in the fourth period when Clemson ran for 114 yards to put the game away.

RECEIVER – DeAndre Hopkins, Clemson, Junior, WR, 6-1, 205, Central, S.C.

Hopkins had seven receptions for 173 yards and two touchdowns in Clemson's 47-31 win over Georgia Tech. The 173 receiving yards rank as the fourth most in a game in Clemson history. He set the school record with 197 yards at Boston College last week. Hopkins had touchdown catches of 58 and 35 yards, the second of which put the Tigers up 36-31. He then threw a two-point conversion pass to quarterback Tajh Boyd to put the Tigers up 38-31.

DEFENSIVE LINEMAN – Thomas Teal, NC State, RS Sophomore, DT, 6-2, 315, Bennettsville, S.C.

Teal notched six tackles in the Wolfpack's 17-16 win over No. 3 Florida State. The redshirt sophomore tackle had two tackles for loss as the Wolfpack held the Seminoles scoreless in the second half. Teal helped the defense hold Florida State to 3-for-15 on third down conversions. NC State also recorded four sacks against the Seminoles, a team that had yielded only six sacks in its previous five games.

LINEBACKER – Demetrius Hartsfield, Maryland, Senior, LB, 6-2, 240, Raleigh, N.C.

Hartsfield led a strong defensive effort as Maryland beat Wake Forest 19-14 in its ACC opener. The Terrapins held the Demon Deacons to 241 yards of total offense, including just 45 in the second half and four in the fourth quarter. Hartsfield finished with 10 tackles, seven of them solo, one pass breakup and a sack. His sack of Wake quarterback Tanner Price on fourth-and-15 with under a minute to play essentially sealed the victory for Maryland.

DEFENSIVE BACK – Walt Canty, Duke, Senior, S, 6-1, 220, Roebuck, S.C.

Canty spearheaded Duke's defensive effort in the 42-17 win over Virginia with a game-high 14 tackles, 3.0 tackles for loss, and one quarterback pressure. With Duke nursing a 21-17 advantage early in the third period, Canty made three tackles in a four-play span that helped turn the momentum of the game. Canty helped Duke limit the Cavaliers to a combined 4-for-19 (211) on 3rd- and 4th-downs after the Cavaliers entered the week at 46.0 percent (40-of-87) as Duke become the first team in 2012 to hold Virginia scoreless in the second half.

SPECIALIST – Sean Tapley, North Carolina, Sophomore, WR, 6-1, 185, Jacksonville, Fla.

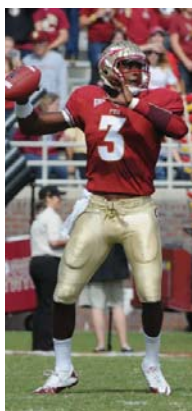
Tapley returned a kickoff 94 yards to a touchdown in the first quarter in North Carolina's 48-34 win over Virginia Tech. He finished with four kickoff returns for 152 yards. The touchdown was the first allowed by Virginia Tech on a kickoff since 1993, spanning an FBS-record 237 consecutive games. It was the first of Tapley's career and the first for North Carolina since T.J. Thorpe had a 100-yard return last year at Clemson. Tapley also caught two passes for 43 yards and a touchdown in the win.

ROOKIE – Stefon Diggs, Maryland, Freshman, WR, 6-1, 185, Gaithersburg, Md.

Diggs turned in his second straight 100-yard receiving game by hauling in five passes for 105 yards in Maryland's 19-14 win over Wake Forest. His 63-yard reception in the fourth quarter, the longest by a Terrapin this year, set up the game-winning one-yard touchdown run by Justus Pickett. On that play, Diggs caught a pass over the middle six yards beyond the line of scrimmage, and then took it 57 yards after the catch. The freshman also had 20 punt return yards and seven rushing yards, and ranks second in the ACC with 154.8 all-purpose yards per game.

Florida State's EJ Manuel Joins Heisman Winners With Game Against Clemson



Florida State senior QB EJ Manuel turned in one of the best quarterback performances in ACC history on Sept. 22 in the Seminoles' 49-37 win over 10th-ranked Clemson. Manuel completed 27 of 35 passes (77 percent) for a career-high 380 yards and 3 TDs and ran for another 102 yards on 12 carries against the Tigers. Manuel's performance fueled

a Seminole comeback that saw FSU overcome a 28-14 Clemson third-quarter lead. The effort marked:

- The first time an FSU player had rushed for 100 or more yards and thrown for 300 or more yards in the same game since Heisman Trophy winner Charlie Ward managed the feat against Maryland in 1992.

- The 482 total yards against 10th-ranked Clemson, were the third-most by an ACC player against a nationally-ranked opponent. FSU's other Heisman Trophy winner, Chris Weinke, totalled 509 yards in 2000 against then 10th-ranked Clemson in Tallahassee.

- Manuel now has completed 442 of 659 passes in his career, a completion percentage of .671, which if he maintains for the rest of the year, would be an ACC career mark.

NC State Named Tostitos Fiesta Bowl National Team of the Week



NC State stormed back from a 16-0 halftime deficit to register a 17-16 upset win over No. 3 Florida State to earn the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl National Team of the Week honors for games of the weekend of Oct. 6. The announcement came exclusively on SiriusXM Radio's "College Sports Today," hosted by Mark Packer and Eddie George.

The Wolfpack (4-2) made the most of a blocked punt with 2:27 left that gave it field position at the Florida State 43. Mike Glennon connected on two fourth-down passes in the winning drive, the second finding Bryan Underwood for a 2-yard touchdown with 16 seconds left. Niklas Sade's extra point provided the winning margin.

Third-ranked Florida State is the highest ranked opponent N.C. State has defeated since downing the No. 2 Seminoles, 24-7, in 1998.

"I kept telling (offensive coordinator Dana Bible) to get a fourth-down play ready," N.C. State head coach Tom O'Brien said. "The touchdown play was a play we practice a lot. (Underwood) did a good job of finding an open spot and (Glennon) did a good job of finding him."

NC State's Mike Glennon Clemson's Tajh Boyd Named Manning Stars of the Week

NC State senior QB Mike Glennon and Clemson junior QB Tajh Boyd were named Manning Award Stars of the Week after leading their teams to impressive victories last weekend.

Glennon, from Centreville, Va., led the Wolfpack to a 17-16 upset of 3rd-ranked Florida State. Glennon completed 30 of 55 passes for 259 yards and 2 fourth quarter TDs including what proved to be the game-winner, a two-yard toss to Bryan Underwood with 16 seconds remaining.

Boyd, from Hampton, Va., threw for a career-high 397 yards and 2 TDs and ran for an additional 63 yards and a third score in the Tigers impressive 47-31 win over Georgia Tech. In all, Boyd totalled 460 yards of offense and 3 TDR

Manning, Boyd and six other signal callers nationally--Jordan Lynch of Northern Illinois; Zach Maynard of California; Josh Nunes of Stanford; Denard Robinson of Michigan; Trent Steelman of Army and Tyler Van Tubbergen of Western Michigan--will vie for the honor of Manning QB of the Week which is determined each week by an online voting of college football fans. The winner will be announced on Thursday at Noon when the voting closes.

The Manning Award, the only major QB Award which takes into account a players bowl performance, will be recognizing its 9th winner this year.

Previous ACC nominees this year include Stephen Morris of Miami (Oct. 1); EJ Manuel of Florida State (Sept. 24); Bryn Renner of North Carolina (Sept. 17).

Current ACC Quarterbacks Are Some of the Most Accurate Passers in League History

The ACC quarterbacks who roam the ACC gridiron this fall are some of the most accurate passers in league history. Florida State's EJ Manuel has completed 67.1 percent of his passes and currently has the best career mark in league history. But North Carolina junior Bryn Renner is right behind, having completed 66.2 percent of his passes. In all, six ACC quarterbacks have completed better than 60 percent of their passes for their careers, while nine have completed 57 percent or better. Manuel ranks 7th in the NCAA among active players in career completion percentage with Renner 10th and Duke's Sean Renfree 16th.

Miami's Phillip Dorsett, Pack's Quintin Payton Added to Biletnikoff Watch List

Miami sophomore **WR Phillip Dorsett (Ft. Lauderdale, Fla.)** and NC State junior **WR Quintin Payton (Anderson, S.C.)** were two of the 11 players added last week to the Biletnikoff Watch List. The Biletnikoff Award is given annually to the nation's outstanding pass receiver by the Tallahassee Quarterback Club Foundation in honor of former FSU wide receiver Fred Biletnikoff.

Dorsett leads Miami in receiving with 29 catches for 470 yards and 3 touchdowns, 375 of those yards came in back-to-back games against Georgia Tech and NC State. Dorsett had 9 catches for 184 yards and a TD against the Yellow Jackets on Sept. 22, then followed that with 7 receptions for 191 yards and 2 TDs versus NC State on Sept. 29.

In those two games, Dorsett totalled more reception yardage than in his entire Miami career prior to Sept. 22.(371 to 240).

Payton ranks 5th in the ACC in reception yards per game (83.3) and 9th in receptions per game (4.2), and is averaging 20 yards per catch. He has topped 100 yards in receiving twice in six games this year.

Boston College's **Alex Amidon (Greenfield, Mass.)** was added to the Biletnikoff Watch list the week of Sept. 24, bring the total number of ACC receivers on the prestigious Award's Watch List to 11, the most of any conference in the nation.

ACC Biletnikoff Candidates Amidon, Dorsett, Hopkins All Top 190 Receiving Yards

For the first time in its history, the ACC had four wide receivers top the 180-yard mark in a game in receiving yardage



on the same day, with three of them over 190 yards. Boston College junior **WR Alex Amidon (Greenfield, Mass.)** had 193 yards (24.1 avg.)

on 8 catches, including TD catches of 31 and 42 yards in the Eagles' 45-31 loss to Clemson. Clemson junior **WR DeAndre "Nuk" Hopkins (Central, S.C.)** countered that for the Tigers, by piling up 197 yards on 11 catches and a 35-yard TD against the Eagles at Chestnut Hill. In Miami, sophomore **WR Phillip Dorsett (Ft. Lauderdale, Fla.)** also had a career day, carrying 7 receptions a total of 191 yards--an eye-popping average of 27.3 yards per catch, including the game-winning play, a 62-yard bomb with 19 seconds remaining in Miami's 44-47 victory. Dorsett's teammate, sophomore **WR Rashawn Scott (Melbourne, Fla.)** grabbed 6 passes for 180 yards (30.0 avg.) and TD catches of 13 and 76 yards to round out the quartet.

Duke's Vernon Breaks ACC Career Receptions Record

With 7 catches for 93 yards and 2 TDs in Duke's 42-17 win over Virginia, Blue Devils senior **WR Conner Vernon (Miami, Fla.)**

shattered the ACC career record for pass receptions held by former Clemson standout Aaron Kelly. A 2nd-team All-ACC pick last year, who became the first receiver in league history with back-to-back 70-catch seasons, Vernon now has 239 career catches and is in 4th place on the ACC career reception yardage list with 3,230 yards. He needs 288 yards to set the ACC standard for career pass receiving yardage, currently held by former Florida State great Peter Warrick (3,517). Vernon also holds the longest current streak in the NCAA for catching a pass. Vernon has caught a pass in 41 straight games--every game of his college career.

Miami's Stephen Morris Puts Up Historic Numbers in Miami Victory Over NC State

Miami junior QB Stephen Morris (Miami, Fla.) set ACC single-game records for most passing yards and most yards of total offense when he threw for 566 yards and totalled 568 yards in the Hurricane's 44-37 win over NC State on Sept. 29.



Morris, who completed 26 of 49 passes for 566 yards and 5 touchdowns with only one interception, threw for 1,002 yards and 7 TDs in Miami's back-to-back wins against Georgia Tech and NC State.

Former Wake Forest QB Rusty LaRue threw for 1,046 yards against Georgia Tech and NC State--coincidentally the same teams as Morris--in 1995.

On Sept. 22 at Georgia Tech, the Miami junior threw for a then-career high 436 yards in the Hurricanes' 42-36 win.

■ In the first quarter of the NC State game, Morris threw for 271 yards, the fourth-most by a player in the NCAA's FBS since 2004.

■ The 271 passing yards in the first quarter are more yards than Morris had thrown in any of his first three games this year.

■ Morris' 21.77 yards to completion average for the day is the 4th best in the nation this year and the highest for an ACC quarterback since 2008.

■ Morris' total of 1,635 passing yards this year exceeded his career total of passing yards (1,523) entering this season.

■ Morris now ranks 12th nationally in the NCAA's FBS in passing yards per game (306.00); 5th nationally in total passing yards (1,836) and 18th nationally in total offense per game. (313.5)

Clemson's Rodriguez Nominated for Discover Orange Bowl-FWAA Courage Award



Clemson's Daniel Rodriguez was the first weekly nominee for the 2012 Discover Orange Bowl-FWAA Courage Award, to be announced at the end of the season. Rodriguez, a redshirt freshman receiver from Stafford, Va., is playing for the Tigers after earning a Purple Heart and Bronze Star in Afghanistan.

Rodriguez, 24, was wounded Oct. 3, 2009, during a battle near Kamdesh, Afghanistan, while serving in the U.S. Army. Combat Outpost Keating, in a mountainous region near the Pakistan border, was ambushed by nearly 300 Taliban insurgents. Eight Americans were killed; 22 were injured. Rodriguez was shot and wounded in the leg, neck and shoulder.



Once recovered and discharged from the military, Rodriguez kept a promise to his friend, Pfc. Kevin Thompson, who was killed during the initial moments of the attack. Rodriguez had told Thompson if he made it home from Afghanistan, he would find a way to play college football.

After enrolling at Germanna Community College, he began training for football. He sent a video of himself catching passes, spliced with video he'd shot during combat, to four-year schools. Clemson coach Dabo Swinney offered Rodriguez a spot on the team.

Rodriguez enlisted in the Army after high school shortly after the unexpected death his father, also an Army veteran. He served

from 2006-10, spending 18 months in Iraq and a year in Afghanistan. He is attending Clemson on the GI Bill.

The 5-8, 175-pounder has played on kickoff coverage in the Tigers' first four games, and saw action at receiver against Furman and Ball State.

"You always dream of that second chance to play football again," Rodriguez said. "I'm in that position. I have that second opportunity that so many people have said, 'I wish I could get one more shot.' Well, now it is my shot. I have that opportunity."

For the seventh straight year, the Football Writers Association of America and the Discover Orange Bowl will announce a weekly nominee each Wednesday during the season. A blue-ribbon panel will determine the winner from all of the nominees. The winner of the Discover Orange Bowl-FWAA Courage Award will be announced in December and be presented with the trophy during the week of the 2013 Discover BCS National Championship Game.

Former Clemson football player Ray Ray McElrathbey was presented the award in 2006.

Florida State's Dustin Hopkins Seeks ACC Scoring Marks, Groza Honors



With 10 points on three field goals and a PAT versus NC State, Florida State senior PK Dustin Hopkins, a 2011 finalist for the Lou Groza Award and a 2010 Groza semifinalist, now has 387 career points and is just seven points shy of breaking the Florida State and ACC career marks for scoring. Hopkins has made 72 of 94 FG attempts (.766) and 171 of 176 PATs. His string of consecutive PATs without a miss ended against Savannah State at 145, the 6th longest such streak in NCAA history. His 72 career field goals places him 2nd on the ACC career list. He needs 9 more three-pointers to break former Maryland stand-out Nick Novak's ACC career mark (80). The ACC career scoring mark of 393 points, was set during the 2001-04 seasons by Novak. Florida State's school record is also 393 points, set by Derek Schmidt during the 1984-87 seasons, which predates the Seminoles' ACC membership. Hopkins is now 15th on the

NCAA career scoring by kicking list. Boise State's Kyle Brotzman is the current national record-holder with 439 points.

BC's Andre Williams Records Longest Run In ACC History

In the midst of a career-best 191-yard rushing day at Army, Boston College junior RB **Andre Williams** uncorked the longest run from scrimmage in league history. With 10:45 remaining in the second quarter, Williams, from Greenfield, Mass., broke open at the line of scrimmage and scampered 99 yards for a TD, bettering the previous mark of 98 yards set by former Maryland standout Steve Atkins on Nov. 18, 1978. The run also tied an NCAA record set originally by Gale Sayers of Kansas in 1963 and matched since by eight others including Williams. Williams also tied the record for shortest possible TD run against the Cadets that is held by many, scoring from one yard out with 5:47 remaining in the first quarter.

Florida State senior RB **Chris Thompson** (Greenville, Fla.) has been named to the Watch List for the Maxwell Award, which is presented annually to the nation's most outstanding collegiate football player. Thompson, who missed a good portion of last season with a severe back injury, ranks



2nd in the ACC in rushing yards per game this year, averaging 95.3 yards a game. Thompson is also averaging 7.7 yards per carry and has TD runs of 80 and 74 yards. The 80-yard scamper against Wake Forest is the 2nd longest scoring run from scrimmage in the ACC this year.

Tech's Tevin Washington Ranks 4th Nationally In Scoring

After scoring a total of 12 touchdowns in his last four games, Georgia Tech QB **Tevin Washington (Wetumpka, Ala.)** ranks 3rd nationally in scoring, averaging 13.3 points a game. Washington also moved into 2nd place on the ACC's career TD list for signal callers with 31 scores. With 104 rushing yards against Clemson, he is now 4th in the ACC in career rushing yards for quarterbacks with 1,949 yards.

Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer Becomes NCAA FBS Active Career Leader in Wins

Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer is now the leading active head coach in the NCAA's FBS in career victories with a total of 254 triumphs in his 32-year coaching career. Beamer is currently in 8th place on the all-time career wins list for the FBS, and trails former Nebraska head coach Tom Osborne (255) by one triumph and former BYU head coach LaVell Edwards (257) by three wins. Georgia Tech head coach Paul Johnson ranks 13th on the active FBS list with 142 career wins and NC State's Tom O'Brien is in 21st place (112). Former Florida State head coach Bobby Bowden, who retired after the 2009 season, finished his career in 2nd place on the all-time list with 389 victories, though the NCAA recognizes only 377 triumphs due to NCAA sanctions. With the NCAA sanctions levied against Penn State, Bowden is now the NCAA FBS all-time leader.

Johnson, Beamer Among Top 18 Active Coaches in Wins Per Season

The ACC has two coaches who rank among the Top 25 active football coaches in the NCAA in wins per season with five or more seasons as a head coach. Georgia Tech's **Paul Johnson** leads the way among ACC coaches, currently averaging 9.33 wins per

full season. Johnson's record puts him in 9th place nationally among active head coaches with five or more years of experience. Virginia Tech's **Frank Beamer** (21st, 8.10) also joins Johnson among the

Top 25 coaches in the nation in the NCAA's FBS. Virginia's **Mike London** has had an impressive start to his career, averaging 9 wins a season in his first four years as a head coach at FCS member Richmond and at UVa., while **Jimbo Fisher** is averaging 9.5 wins a year in his first two seasons at the helm at Florida State.

Five Current ACC Head Football Coaches Have UVa Ties

When **Al Golden** joined the ACC as Miami's head coach for the 2011 season, he became the fifth former UVa assistant or graduate assistant coach to be a current head football coach in the Atlantic Coast Conference. Golden joined Boston College's **Frank Spaziani**, NC State's **Tom O'Brien**, Virginia's **Mike London** and Wake Forest's **Jim Grobe** as current ACC head coaches who have spent time as assistants or graduate assistants for the Cavaliers. Golden spent four seasons (2001-04) at Virginia as defensive coordinator under Al Groh. The Eagles' Spaziani served as an assistant coach at Virginia under then head coach George Welsh for nine seasons (1982-90), the last five as defensive coordinator. O'Brien also served under Welsh at UVa, spending 15 seasons (1982-96) there including the last six as offensive coordinator. London served two terms at UVa under Groh, serving as defensive line coach in 2001-04 and again in 2006-07 as defensive coordinator and defensive line coach. London and Golden also served as assistants to Tom O'Brien at Boston College. Wake Forest head coach Jim Grobe, a 1975 Virginia graduate, who just completed his 11th season with the Deacons, lettered two seasons at UVa as a middle guard and linebacker and also spent one year as a graduate assistant coach (1975) under then Virginia head coach Sonny Randle.

Wake Forest head coach Jim Grobe is the fourth active ACC coach with 100 career wins. Grobe now has a record of 104-103-1

career mark for 18 seasons, the last 12 with the Deacons. NC State's Tom O'Brien has 112 wins, having accumulated 75 of them in a 10-year stay at Boston College. Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer (254), the nation's leading active coach in the FBS in wins, and Georgia Tech's Paul Johnson (142) are the other ACC coaches over the century mark in career triumphs.

NC State's Tom O'Brien Latest To Coach at Multiple ACC Schools

NC State's Tom O'Brien is the fifth coach in Atlantic Coast Conference history to have served as a head coach of two ACC schools. O'Brien coached at Boston College from 1997 through 2006, which included the school's first two seasons (2005-06) of ACC membership. Jim Tatum was the first ACC coach at two schools; he first coached at North Carolina in 1942, then at Maryland from 1947-55 before returning to UNC beginning in 1956 until his death in 1958. Others who have coached at two ACC schools include Bobby Ross (Md, GT), Al Groh (WF, UVa) and Bill Dooley (UNC, WF).



Dooley actually coached at three current ACC schools as he spent nine seasons at Virginia Tech before the Hokies joined the ACC, in between stints at UNC and Wake Forest, winning 162 games in his career. Dooley and Ross are the only coaches in ACC history to be named ACC Coach of the Year at more than one school. Others who have coached at more than one current ACC school, though not necessarily when they were in the ACC, include John Heisman, who coached at both Georgia Tech and Clemson.

Tech's Beamer Becomes 10th FBS Head Coach To Win 200 Games At One School

With a 17-10 win over East Carolina in 2011, Virginia Tech head football coach Frank Beamer accomplished yet another milestone in a career which now spans 32 years as a head coach. The win was Beamer's 200th at his alma mater making him only the 10th head coach in NCAA FBS history to have won 200 games at one school. He became only the second ACC head coach to do so, joining former Florida State head coach Bobby Bowden, Beamer's overall record, now in his 26th year at Virginia Tech is 212-101-2 (.676). He is now only the second active FBS head coach with 200 wins at one school with Nevada's Chris Ault (231).

Virginia Leads All ACC Schools In Games Played

Virginia, which is competing in its 123rd season of college football this year, leads all ACC schools in number of college football games played. The Cavaliers have played in 1,235 football games. North Carolina, which has played 122 seasons, is second with 1,221 games. Overall, Virginia ranks 6th among all NCAA Bowl Subdivision Teams and 12th overall among all schools in Division I. In just his third season as head coach at Florida State, head coach **Jimbo Fisher** has joined some select company among ACC football coaches. Fisher has compiled a 24-9 record (.727) just four games into his third season. His winning percentage ranks him 7th among all ACC head coaches in their third season, ahead of such figures as Maryland's Ralph Friedgen and Georgia Tech's Bobby Ross. The best mark recorded by an ACC head coach in his first two years in the league was by Fisher's predecessor at FSU, Bobby Bowden, who posted a 33-3-1 record. Maryland's Jim Tatum was 27-4-1 (.859) in his first three years with Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer third at 31-8-0 (.859).

Clemson's Memorial Stadium Is Home Sweet Home for Tiger's Dabo Swinney



Clemson head coach Dabo Swinney has enjoyed coaching in the cozy and imposing confines of the Tigers' home field, also known as Death Valley. In his first four seasons as head coach of the Tigers, Swinney's teams have won 13 of the first 15 home ACC games, a winning percentage of .867. That stacks up pretty well with some of the great names in ACC coaching. Swinney's winning percentage ties him with Maryland's Jerry Claiborne for 2nd among ACC head coaches. Another former Tiger coach, Ken Hatfield, has the highest percentage, posting a 12-1-1 mark in four seasons (.893). Legendary Florida State coach Bobby Bowden won more ACC home games than any other coach, with 62 triumphs in his 18 years in the league. His winning percentage of .861, is third-best. Bowden's successor at Florida State, Jimbo Fisher is on a pretty good pace himself, having won six of his first eight ACC home games. Four Clemson coaches rank in the Top 10 including Hatfield (1st), Swinney (2nd), Danny Ford (7th) and the legendary Frank Howard (tied for 9th).

ACC Divisional Tiebreaker

If more than one team in the same division is tied for the best winning percentage in its Conference games, then, in order to determine the Divisional Champions, the procedures listed below will be followed:

Two-Team Tie:

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Records of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall record. (Divisional) Conference record and preceding through the division. Multiple ties within the division broken from first-to-last.
4. Overall record versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined record vs. all non-divisional teams.
6. Record versus common non-divisional teams based on their order of finish (divisional and non-divisional) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based on their order of finish within their division.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking in the Bowl Championship Series Standings following the end of regular season game shall be the divisional representative in the ACC Championship Game.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw.

Three-Team (or More) Team Tie

(Once tie has been reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaker format is used.)

1. Combined head-to-head record among teams.
2. Records of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall (divisional or conference) record, and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken first to last.
4. Overall record for non-divisional teams.
5. Combined record versus all common non-divisional teams.
6. Record versus common non-divisional with the best overall Conference (divisional and non-divisional record) and proceeding through the other common non-divisional teams based on their order of finish within the division.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking in the BCS Standings following the conclusion of regular season games shall be the divisional representative in the ACC Championship Game, unless the second of the tied teams is ranked within five-or-fewer places of the highest ranked tied team. In this case, the head-to-head results of the top two ranked tied teams shall determine the representative in the ACC Championship Game.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw.

2012 ACC Bowl Selection

Bowl Championship Series

The winner of the Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game will be selected to play in the Bowl Championship Series. Unless the winner of the Dr Pepper ACC



Football Championship Game is ranked No. 1 or No. 2 in the final BCS Standings and plays in the BCS National Championship Game, then the ACC Champion will serve as the host team of the Discover Orange Bowl in Miami, Fla. This year's Discover BCS National Championship Game will be hosted by the Discover Orange Bowl on Jan. 7 in Miami Gardens, Fla. The BCS may also select a second ACC team, if one is eligible for selection (Won at least nine regular season games and is ranked among

the Top 14 in the final BCS Standings), and there is an At-Large berth available and the team is selected by one of the four BCS Bowl Games—Discover Orange (only if the ACC Champion is in the BCS National Championship Game), Allstate Sugar, Tostitos Fiesta and the Rose Bowl Game presented by Vizio.

After the BCS selections, then the selection order is:

1. Chick-fil-A Bowl, Atlanta
2. Russell Athletic Bowl, Orlando
3. Hyundai Sun Bowl, El Paso, Tex.
4. Belk Bowl, Charlotte, N.C.
5. Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl, Nashville, Tenn.
6. Advocare V100 Independence Bowl, Shreveport, La.
7. The Military Bowl Presented by Northrop Grumman, Washington, D.C.

Conditional Agreement*

8. Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl, San Francisco, Calif.

*If Pac-12 or Navy is unable to fill obligation and ACC has an available team

Conditions:

1. The runner-up of the ACC Championship Game, provided, is guaranteed not to fall further than the Hyundai Sun Bowl. The Sun Bowl will select the ACC Championship Game runner-up in any year that team is available to them.

2. Otherwise, if the bowl does not select the team available with the best Conference record, then it must choose a team that is within one conference win of the team (The "One-Win Rule") with the best conference record (ie. 5-3 to 6-2), The bowl may take a team that has more than a one game difference, only if the team is ranked more than five spaces above the team with the best Conference record in the final BCS Standings.

3. If, after all bowl selections have been made, and the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl has an opening due to the inability of either the Pac-12 Conference or Army to provide a team, and the ACC has an available, eligible team, then the ACC will send a team to the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl

Selection Time Frame

The Bowl Championship Series will announce its selections on the BCS ESPN Selection Show on Sunday, December 2. In conjunction with the BCS selections, each Atlantic Coast Conference affiliated bowl game will make their selections in the order specified above. The ACC, the Bowls and individual schools will announce the selections after all selections are completed on Sunday.

The ACC and The Bowl Championship Series

The Atlantic Coast Conference and the BCS

The Atlantic Coast Conference has been a member of the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) since its inception for the 1998 season. ACC Commissioner John Swofford, is the only Commissioner to twice serve as BCS Coordinator, having done so in the 2000 and 2001 seasons and again in the 2008 and 2009 campaigns, as the ACC successfully administered the BCS on two separate occasions. Swofford is also the last Commissioner to serve as BCS Coordinator. In 2009, the BCS group named longtime college administrator Bill Hancock to serve as the first Executive Director of the Bowl Championship Series. Hancock has since assumed most of the duties previously handled by the coordinator. Prior to being named Executive Director, Hancock served four years as the Administrator for the BCS.

Heading into its 15th year of determining the National Championship in college football, the **Bowl Championship Series (BCS)** is a five-game arrangement that is designed to match the two top-rated teams and to create competitive match ups among eight other highly regarded teams in four other games.

The bowl games participating are the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl, the Discover Orange Bowl, the Rose Bowl Game presented by Vizio and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. In addition, the BCS National Championship Game is played at one of the bowl sites, this year at Sun Life Stadium in Miami Gardens Fla., on January 7, 2013.

The term "BCS conference" frequently is used incorrectly. Actually, all 11 NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) conferences are "BCS conferences" because the BCS arrangement is managed by the commissioners of the 11 NCAA FBS conferences and the director of athletics at the University of Notre Dame. The conferences are Atlantic Coast, Big East, Big Ten, Big 12, Conference USA, Mid-American, Mountain West, Sun Belt, Pacific-12, the Southeastern and the Western Athletic.

The conference commissioners and the Notre Dame athletics director make decisions regarding all BCS issues, in consultation with an athletics directors advisory group and subject to the approval of a presidential oversight committee whose members represent all 120 NCAA FBS programs.

The BCS games are operated by community-based organizations in each of the host cities. In addition, there are 30 other post-season bowls, which are managed independently by entities in 27 cities around the nation. All bowl games provide meaningful season-ending opportunities for student-athletes.

The BCS is remarkably successful. It maintains and enhances the importance of the regular season and preserves the unique bowl tradition to the benefit of the student-athletes. And it matches the top two teams. Before the creation of the BCS and its predecessors, the Bowl Coalition and Bowl Alliance, the top two teams had met in a bowl game only eight times in the previous 56 seasons. They have met in each of the last 14 seasons by BCS standards, and 11 of the last 14 seasons according to the Associated Press poll. The 2012 regular season

BCS Standings

The BCS Standings are composed of three elements that are weighted equally: the USA Today Coaches poll, 2) the Harris poll, and 3) the average of six computer poll rankings. The highest and lowest computer ranking is discarded each week with the computer average based on the remaining four rankings. The BCS Standings are compiled and released by the National Football Foundation eight times during the season, beginning this year on Sunday, October 16 and ending on BCS Selection Sunday, December 4.

(2013 bowl games) is the third year of the current four-year television agreement with ESPN, which will televise all five BCS games.

Six conferences (ACC, Big East, Big 12, Big Ten, SEC and Pac-12) have earned annual automatic qualification for the 2010-13 seasons by virtue of contracts to host the bowl games, and/or by having met a four-year metric based on competitive results (The ACC champion plays in the Discover Orange Bowl, the Big Ten and Pac-12 champs in the Rose Bowl presented by Vizio, Big 12 in the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl and SEC in the Allstate Sugar Bowl). Additionally, the highest-ranked champion of Conference USA, Mid-American, Mountain West, Sun Belt or Western Athletic conferences will be guaranteed a slot in a BCS game if that team is

Playoff Coming In 2014-15

On June 26, 2012, the BCS Presidential Oversight Committee agreed to launch a four-team playoff beginning with the 2014-15 season. The new format will continue at least 12 years, through the 2025-26 season. The semifinals will be rotated among six bowl games and will be played either New Year's Eve or New Year's Day. The championship game, to be managed by the 11 conferences and rotated among neutral sites every year, will be on a Monday at least six days after the last semifinal game. A selection committee will rank the teams for the playoff.

ranked 12th or higher in the final BCS standings, 16th or higher if its ranking is higher than that of a champion from one of the six conferences with automatic qualification. Other teams are eligible to be selected at large by a bowl game if they finish among the top 14.

The champions of the Big Ten and the Pac-12 will play in the Rose Bowl if they do not qualify for the National Championship Game. Other "regional consideration" tie-ins include the SEC champion in the Sugar Bowl, the ACC champion in the Orange Bowl and the Big 12 champion in the Fiesta Bowl if those teams are not ranked No. 1 or No. 2 in the final BCS Standings.

Bill Hancock, Executive Director

Longtime athletics administrator Bill Hancock was named the first Executive Director of the Bowl Championship Series on November 17, 2009 and, in doing so, achieved a unique double-double at the upper echelon of intercollegiate athletics. He was the first full-time director of the NCAA Final Four and is now the first executive director of the BCS. Hancock served for 13 years as director of the NCAA's Division I Men's Basketball Championship--the three-week March Madness event that culminates at the Final Four. After a family tragedy, he retired in 2002 and for three years was the tournament's media coordinator on a consulting basis before being named BCS administrator in October of 2005. He is a 1972 journalism graduate of the University of Oklahoma and worked in sports information at his alma mater and also on the staff of the Big Eight Conference before being named director of the Final Four in 1989.

ACC Overtime Games

The ACC & Overtime

When Georgia Tech and Miami ended regulation tied at 36-36, it marked the 60th game featuring an ACC team that has had to go to extra sessions. Of the 60 overtime contests, a large portion of them--26--have been played in the month of September. Games have gone into overtime for ACC teams a total of 13 times in November, while 12 have been played in October, three in August, four in December and two in January (2006 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl). Of the 60 overtime contests, 30 have been ACC games while 30 nonconference games have gone into overtime. The home team has a 34-19 advantage in the 53 games played on campus. The team which wins the toss has a 32-28 record. Forty-seven of the games were decided in the first overtime with nine games in double overtime and four in triple overtime.
