## Noting ACC Football

### ACC Has Four Teams in AP Top 25 Clemson, FSU in Top 10

Undefeated **Clemson** (6th) and **Florida State** (9th) are in the Associated Press's Top 10 this week and they are joined in the rankings by **Duke** (23) and **Pitt** (25) to give the ACC four Top 25 teams.

### ACC Has Two Teams in Amway Coaches' Poll Top 10: Duke Moves Up to No. 21

Both **Clemson** (6th) and **Florida State** (9th) are in the Top 10 of the Amway Coaches poll again this week. **Duke** moved up to No. 21 with **Pitt** (28th) and **North Carolina** (29th) among others receiving votes.

### Five ACC Tight Ends Named to the John Mackey Award Midseason Watch List

Five ACC tight ends were named to the John Mackey Award Midseason Watch list last week: **Jordan Leggett** of **Clemson**, **Micky Crum** of **Louisville**, **J.P. Holtz**, of **Pitt**, **Bucky Hodges** of **Virginia Tech** and **Cam Serigne** of **Wake Forest**.

### Cutcliffe, Swinney Named to Bobby Dodd Award Midseason Watch List

Duke's **David Cutcliffe** and **Clemson's Dabo Swinney** have been named to the 20-person Midseason Watch List for the Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year Award. Both **Cutcliffe** (2013) and **Swinney** (2011) are former winners of the Award that honors the former **Georgia Tech** coaching legend.

### Three of the Top Four Defenses Nationally Reside in the ACC

The ACC has three of the top four teams ranked nationally in total defense. **Boston College** continues to lead the nation in total defense (196.1), with **NC State** (237.8) and **Duke** (252.8) ranked third and fourth behind Michigan. The ACC has five in the Top 20 with **Clemson** (10th) and **Pitt** (17th) also ranked.

## Four ACC Teams in AP Top 25; Two in Top 10 in AP, Coaches Miami Hosts No. 6 Clemson; No. 23 Duke to Virginia Tech; No. 24 Pitt to Syracuse; No. 9 FSU Takes 28-Game ACC Streak to Georgia Tech

The Atlantic Coast Conference has four teams in this week's Associated Press Top 25 in **Clemson** (6th), **Florida State** (9th), **Duke** (23rd) and **Pitt** (25th). The league also continues to have three teams in the Top 25 of the Amway Coaches poll with **Clemson** (6th) and **Florida State** (9th), followed by **Duke** at No. 21. Week Eight of the 2015 ACC season has all 14 ACC teams in action in seven league games, with all four nationally ranked teams facing tough road tests. In the Atlantic Division, **Florida State**, 4-0 in ACC play, takes its 28-game ACC win streak to **Georgia Tech** looking to tie an ACC record it set originally against the Yellow Jackets in 1995, while **Clemson**, 3-0 in league play, heads to **Miami**. In the Coastal Division, **Pitt**, also 3-0 in the ACC, faces long-time rival **Syracuse** in the Carrier Dome and **Duke** (2-0) heads to Blacksburg, Va., to face **Virginia Tech**. Three interdivisional rivalry games are featured on the schedule with the Coastal Division holding a 4-2 advantage this season, but the Atlantic holds a 97-91 lead since the beginning of divisional play in 2005. Two of the oldest and most-played rivalries in league history will occur this weekend as **North Carolina** and **Virginia** meet for the 120th

time, in a rivalry which began in 1892 and has been played continuously since 1919. **UNC** is one of five league teams to have unblemished conference records. In Winston-Salem, N.C., **Wake Forest** hosts **NC State** at BB&T Field, in a game which will mark the 109th meeting between the two teams in a series which began in 1895 and has been played every year since 1910. Entering the weekend, **Florida State** holds a half-game lead over **Clemson** in the Atlantic, with **Syracuse** also having just one loss. In the Coastal Division, **Pitt**, which is off to a 5-1 start for the first time since 2009, is a half-game (3-0) ahead of **Duke** and **North Carolina**. **Miami** and **Virginia** each also have just one loss in conference play.

### Top QBs Watson, Kaaya on Display as Miami Hosts Fifth-Ranked Clemson

Two of the top quarterbacks in the nation will be on display Saturday, when **Miami**, coached by **Al Golden**, hosts fifth-ranked **Clemson**, coached by **Dabo Swinney**, at Sun Life Stadium (Noon, ABC national). The Hurricanes are led by sophomore QB **Brad Kaaya**, who leads the ACC in passing yards (299.2)

## The ACC On Sirius/XM Satellite Radio

The first intercollegiate athletics conference to reach agreement to have its sports broadcast on satellite radio, the Atlantic Coast Conference begins its 12th season in its partnership with Sirius/XM Radio. Since 2004, the ACC has had its football and men's basketball games broadcast over XM or Sirius Satellite Radio. In addition to the ACC Football Championship Game, Sirius/XM also broadcasts the ACC Men's and Women's Basketball Tournaments and the ACC Baseball Tournament.

and total offense (291.5), while Clemson QB **Deshaun Watson**, the ACC Preseason Player of the Year, is second in the league in total offense (274.0) and third in pass efficiency (156.8) after piling up 452 total yards and 4 TDR against the nation's top defense in a win over **Boston College**...The Tigers feature a defense ranked 10th nationally, while the Hurricanes lead the nation in turnover margin (+2.17)...Saturday's game will mark **Clemson's** first trip to South Florida since 2009, and both of the Tigers' last visits to **Miami** have resulted in overtime victories for the Orange and White in 2004 and 2009...The average margin of victory in the teams' four ACC meetings since 2004 is 6.3 points, with three of the four games decided in overtime.

### No. 25 Pitt, Syracuse Meet for 71st Time

Coastal Division leader and 25th-ranked **Pitt**, coached by **Pat Narduzzi** and led by QB **Nate Peterman**, travels to **Syracuse** to face the Orange, coached by **Scott Shafer**, in an interdivisional matchup at the Carrier Dome (Noon, ESPN2)...**Narduzzi** has guided the Panthers to a 3-0 record in his first season as a head coach, something only three other coaches have accomplished in ACC history...**Syracuse** is led by true freshman QB **Eric Dungey**, who leads the ACC in pass efficiency and is ranked 10th nationally (167.1)...**Dungey** is the only freshman in the NCAA's Top 25 of pass efficiency...**Pitt** is ranked 11th nationally in pass efficiency defense.

### 109th Meeting Between Atlantic Rivals Wake Forest and NC State

When **Wake Forest** hosts **NC State** this Saturday at BB&T Field in Winston-Salem, N.C. ( Noon, RSN) it will mark the 109th meeting between the two schools in football...The Wolfpack, coached by **Dave Doeren** and led by QB **Jacoby Brissett**, are coming off a bye week, while the Demon Deacons, coached by **Dave Clawson** and led by LB **Brandon Chubb**, are coming off a loss to **North Carolina**...**Brissett** ranks eighth nationally in completion percentage (.689) and the Wolfpack features a defensive unit which is third nationally in total defense (247.8), eighth in passing yards allowed (147.7) and 12th in rushing defense (100.2)...The Deacons are sixth nationally in net punting (42.07) behind senior **P Alex Kinal**...**Wake Forest** has won the last six meetings between the teams in Winston-Salem, with State's last triumph there coming in 2001.

### A Battle of True Freshmen QBs Headlines BC-Louisville

When Atlantic Division rivals **Louisville** and **Boston College** face each other this Saturday at Papa John's Cardinal Stadium in Louisville (12:30 p.m., ACC Network), both teams will be depending on salty defenses and true freshman QBs...**Louisville**, coached by **Bobby Petrino** and led by freshman QB **Lamar Jackson**, will be fac-

ing the nation's No.1 defense, led by DE **Harold Landry**, and an offense dependent on freshman QB **Jeff Smith**...**Boston College**, coached by **Steve Addazio**, leads the nation in total and rushing defense and rushing yards per play...**Jackson** ranks fifth among all freshmen nationally in rushing yards per game (77.8).

### Coastal Rivals Duke, Virginia Tech Battle in Blacksburg

**Duke**, coached by **David Cutcliffe** and led by S **Jeremy Cash** and QB **Thomas Sirk**, is looking to keep its conference record unblemished with the Blue Devils face Virginia Tech (3:30 p.m., ESPN2) at Lane Stadium...The Hokies are coached by **Frank Beamer** and led by QBs **Michael Brewer** and **Brenden Motley**...**Cash** is ranked fifth nationally in tackles for loss and is tied for the lead among active players with nine career forced fumbles...**Tech**, which has two league losses, is looking to remain in the Coastal Division race with the return to action of **Brewer**, who has missed most or all of **Tech's** last five games with a broken collarbone.

### UVA, UNC Renew One of South's Oldest Rivalries

A lot more is at stake this Saturday than the re-ignition of one of the South's oldest football rivalries when **North Carolina**, coached by **Larry Fedora** and led by QB **Marquise Williams**, hosts **Virginia**, coached by **Mike London** and led by QB **Matt Johns**, in Kenan Stadium in Chapel Hill (3:30 p.m., RSN)... **UNC**, winner of its first two league games, is looking to keep pace with **Duke** and **Pitt** in the Coastal race, while **Virginia**, which is coming off a dramatic triple-overtime win over **Syracuse**, has just one conference loss...Behind **Williams** and **TB Elijah Hood**, the Tar Heels are fourth nationally in third-down conversion percentage and 10th in scoring offense.

### Georgia Tech Hosts Unbeaten and 9th-Ranked Florida State

Unbeaten and 9th-ranked **Florida State**, coached by **Jimbo Fisher** and led by RB **Dalvin Cook** and QB **Everett Golson**, heads to Atlanta to face interdivisional rival **Georgia Tech** (7 p.m., ESPN2) at Bobby Dodd Stadium...**Tech**, coached by **Paul Johnson**, and led by QB **Justin Thomas**, is looking to snap a five-game losing streak behind a spread option attack that is ranked 8th nationally in rushing offense (286.6)...**Cook**, who ranks nationally in rushing offense (159.2) and is 45 yards away from topping 1,000 rushing yards for a season, and **Golson**, who has thrown 11 TD passes without an interception, will test a **Tech** defense that ranks 84th against the run...**Yellow Jackets'** freshman B-Back **Marcus Marshall** is averaging 10.7 yards per carry...A win by the Seminoles would be their 29th straight, tying the ACC record that **FSU** set from 1992 through 1995 with the 29th win coming against **Tech** on Oct. 21, 1995 in Tallahassee.

# ACC Football By The Numbers

**1.72** - The average number of rushing yards per play **Boston College** is allowing this year. The Eagles lead the nation in rushing yards per carry, rushing yards per game (51.7) and total defense (196.2), and are fifth nationally in team pass efficiency defense (94.41), fourth in scoring defense (11.0) and fifth in passing yards allowed (144.6)

**2.67** - Having made 16 of 19 field goals (.842) this season through six games, Miami **PK Michael Badgley** now leads the nation in field goals per game, averaging 2.67 a contest.

**1.4** - One of the leaders of Boston College's No. 1-rated defense is Eagles' **DE Harold Landry**, who is averaging 1.4 tackles for loss per game and who was named this week to the Watch List for the Bednarik National Defensive Player of the Year Award.

**3** - The number of TD pass receptions for Louisville **WR James Quick** against 11th-ranked Florida State. Quick had five catches for 130 yards, including TD catches of 18, 19 and 39 yards....Also the number of TD receptions for North Carolina **WR Mack Hollins**, who had scoring catches of 57, 42 and 4 yards against Wake Forest.

**5** - Duke **S Jeremy Cash** is ranked fifth nationally in tackles for loss, averaging 1.92 per game with 11.5 in six games. Cash, who leads the ACC in TFLs, is the only defensive back listed among the Top 50 players nationally in tackles for loss.

**6** - **Virginia's** 44-38 triple overtime win over Syracuse marked just the sixth triple overtime game in ACC history. The league has never had to go to four overtimes in 67 extra session contests.

**9** - **Clemson** has now won nine straight games, and that ties for the fifth-longest current winning streak in the nation and the longest for the Tigers since 1988-89.

**8.68** - Florida State sophomore **TB Dalvin Cook** ranks second nationally in rushing yards per carry (8.68) among those runners who have averaged a minimum of 10 carries per game. Cook is also second nationally in rushing yards per game (159.2).

**10** - The number of pass receptions for Clemson **WR Artavis Scott** against Boston

College. Scott had 162 receiving yards, including a 51-yard TD pass play.

**10.7** - The average yards per carry for Georgia Tech true freshman B-Back **Marcus Marshall**. Marshall has rushed for 439 yards on just 41 carries and four TDs. Marshall would lead the nation but does not have enough carries to qualify.

**12** - Since its 17-16 loss at NC State in 2012, **Florida State**, coached by Jimbo Fisher, has won 12 consecutive games decided by eight or fewer points. Fisher is 16-5 (.727) overall as a head coach in games decided by eight or fewer points.

**15** - Duke **PK Ross Martin** has made 15 consecutive field goals dating back to a fourth-quarter miss against Virginia Tech in 2014. That ties for the 11th-longest streak in ACC history with Duke's Sims Lenhardt (1998-99) and Georgia Tech's Travis Bell (2004).

**18** - The number of pass receptions for Florida State **WR Kermit Whitfield** in his last two games against Miami and Louisville. Prior to these two games, Whitfield had made only 27 catches in 32 career games.

**24** - With six regular-season games remaining, Duke head coach **David Cutcliffe** has already led Duke to 24 wins over the past three seasons. The school record is 25, set originally by the 1936-38 teams of Wallace Wade, which posted a 25-4-1 record, and tied by Cutcliffe's 2012-14 teams (25-15).

**28** - **Florida State** has won 28 consecutive games against Atlantic Coast Conference teams since a 17-16 loss at NC State on Oct. 6, 2012. The Seminoles would tie their ACC record with a win at Georgia Tech. That 29-game skein began when FSU entered the ACC in 1992 and ended at Virginia in 1995. The Noles' current streak is the longest by any team within any conference since Boise State won 31 straight Western Athletic Conference games from 2001-2005. Oklahoma holds the record by winning 44 straight Big 8 games from 1952-59. Boise State (WAC, 2001-05) and Oklahoma (Big 8, 1984-88) are tied for second at 31 consecutive wins. FSU's streak from 1992 to 1995 is fourth and its current run is fifth-longest.

**28.86** - **Georgia Tech** leads the nation in fewest penalties (3.00) and least amount of pe-

nalized yardage (28.86) assessed per game.

**56** - The distance on Pitt **PK Chris Blewitt's** school-record and game-winning field goal against Georgia Tech. The distance tied for the longest game-winning field goal in ACC history and for the sixth-longest field goal in league history.

**73** - North Carolina senior **QB Marquise Williams** has totalled 73 career TDR (Touchdown Responsibility), which ties for the 14th-highest total in ACC history. Williams has thrown for 46 touchdowns and run for 27 more.

**109** - When **Wake Forest** hosts **NC State** this Saturday, the game will be the 109th meeting between the two teams in football in a series which is the ACC's oldest continuous series. The Wolfpack and Demon Deacons have played each other every year since 1910.

**120** - When **North Carolina** hosts **Virginia** this Saturday in Chapel Hill, the game will be the 120th meeting between the two teams in football in a rivalry which began in 1892 and has been played continuously since 1919. The UNC-UVA series is the ACC's most-played rivalry.

**167.1** - Syracuse freshman **QB Eric Dungey** is the only freshman ranked among the Top 25 in the nation in pass efficiency. Dungey is 10th nationally and leads the ACC with a 167.1 rating.

**177** - Florida State **QB Everett Golson** has thrown 177 passes this season without an interception.

**204** - The number of career pass receptions for Pitt **WR Tyler Boyd**. Despite playing in just his third season and missing the first game of this year due to a suspension, Boyd is now Pitt's all-time leading pass receiver and ranks 12th on the ACC career list.

**420** - The number of passing yards for Clemson **QB Deshaun Watson** in the Tigers' win over Boston College. The Eagles entered the game as the nation's No. 1 defense in passing yards allowed, having only allowed a total of 592 yards in their previous six games. Watson totalled 452 total yards, 224 more yards than BC had allowed any team this season.

Led by Florida State's **Jimbo Fisher**, who has averaged 11.6 wins during his first five seasons as a head coach, four ACC coaches rank among the nation's top 14 coaches in wins per season with a minimum of five seasons as a head coach.



Louisville's **Bobby Petrino** is ninth on the list averaging 9.2 wins per season with Georgia Tech's **Paul Johnson** right behind, averaging 9.17 wins a year. Clemson's **Dabo Swinney** is 15th, averaging 8.71 wins during his seven-year stay at Clemson, which includes a partial seven-game campaign in 2008. Virginia Tech's

**Frank Beamer**, the winningest active FBS head coach, ranks 24th overall, averaging 8.03 wins for his 34-year career.

Five ACC head coaches rank among the Top 20 coaches nationally in active career winning percentage, led by Florida State's **Jimbo Fisher**, who ranks first overall with an .853 mark just ahead of Ohio State's Urban Meyer .851. Joining Fisher are **Dabo Swinney** of Clemson at 10th, **Bobby Petrino** of Louisville at 11th, **Paul Johnson** of Georgia Tech at 17th and **Frank Beamer** of Virginia Tech at 21st.

## Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer Is NCAA FBS Active Career Leader in Wins

Virginia Tech's **Frank Beamer** is now the leading active head coach in the NCAA's FBS in career victories with a total of 276 triumphs in his 35-year coaching career. Georgia Tech head coach **Paul Johnson** ranks ninth on the active FBS list with 167 career wins. Beamer is sixth on the all-time list and Amos Alonzo Stagg is next on the list with 314 wins at Springfield, Chicago and Pacific. Former Florida State head coach **Bobby Bowden**, who retired after the 2009 season, is second in the NCAA's FBS with 377 career victories only to Penn State's Joe Paterno. Glenn "Pop" Warner, who ranks third on the all-time list with 336 wins, coached at seven different schools including a nine-year stint at Pitt (2015-23).

## Clemson's Swinney, Georgia Tech's Johnson In Good Company As ACC Head Coaches

After their first seven seasons at Clemson and Georgia Tech, head coaches **Dabo Swinney** and **Paul Johnson** have recorded excellent numbers. Only four other coaches in league history have had a better winning percentage after seven years than Swinney (.701) and only two have won more games. Only four other coaches in league history have won more games (58) than has Johnson after his first seven seasons in the league and he ranks 10th in winning percentage.

## Home Sweet Home for Noles' Fisher, Tigers' Swinney

Florida State head coach **Jimbo Fisher** and Clemson head coach **Dabo Swinney** have both enjoyed coaching in the cozy and imposing confines of the Seminoles' Doak Campbell Stadium and the Tigers' Memorial Stadium, also known as Death Valley. Now, after five seasons as head coach of the Seminoles, Fisher's teams have won 20 of 22 ACC games at home, a winning percentage of .909, the best by any ACC coach with a minimum of five seasons on the job. Swinney is right behind as his teams have won 25 of his first 28 home ACC games, a winning percentage of .893. They are both just ahead of legendary FSU coach Bobby Bowden, who also won more ACC home games than any other coach, with 62 triumphs in his 18 years in the league.



## Cutcliffe Leading Duke to Unprecedented Success

Duke's **David Cutcliffe** is leading the Blue Devils to success unprecedented in the school's history. Cutcliffe has led Duke to three consecutive bowl game appearances, a first in Blue Devil history. He has also led Duke to 19 wins in 2013 and 201, the most in a two-year span since Duke began playing football in 1888. Now in his 8th season, Cutcliffe has led Duke to more wins (45) as the program experienced in the 18 years (43) before he took over the reins in Durham

## Boston College's Steve Addazio Leads Eagles to Back-to-Back Bowl Bids

In his first two seasons as the head coach at Chestnut Hill, Steve Addazio led Boston College to back-to-back bowl appearances utilizing a physical ground game and a hard-hitting defensive unit. In each of his first two years, Addazio has had a player lead the nation in rushing. In 2013, tailback Andre Williams led the nation and set an ACC single-season record with 2,177 yards. On year later, QB Tyler Murphy led all quarterbacks nationally, rushing for 1,184 yards, while setting an ACC rushing mark for signal-callers. Last year, BC was one of just three schools (Oklahoma and Toledo were the others) that ranked in the nation's Top 15 in rushing defense (2nd) and rushing offense (14th).



## North Carolina's Fedora Putting Points on the Board for the Tar Heels

Now, in its fourth season with Larry Fedora as head coach, North Carolina has topped the 40-point mark 19 times and bettered 30 points 30 times in 44 games. His Tar Heel teams have averaged 36.07 points per game. In the previous 13 seasons before Fedora came to Chapel Hill, UNC had averaged just 23.3 points per game, a 14-point difference. Also, in his first four seasons, UNC has averaged 450.9 yards per game of total offense. That compares with the previous 13 seasons when the Tar Heels averaged just 349.25 yards per game on offense. Fedora's first three Tar Heel teams bettered the previous school mark for scoring. UNC scored a school-record 487 points in 2012 and tallied 425 points in 2013 and 432 in 2014. Previously, the school had only topped 400 points once. The school put up 421 points in 1993.



## NC State's Dave Doeren: Winning the Close Ones

Now in just his third season as head coach at NC State, Dave Doeren has already made a name for himself on the national stage. After winning 23 of his first 27 career games as a head coach at Northern Illinois, he had an 8-5 mark in 2014, winning his final three games, including a 34-27 win over Central Florida in the Bitcoin St. Petersburg Bowl. Doeren's teams are 7-2 (.778) in games decided by four or fewer points That's the best winning percentage in such games by any Power 5 coach. Doeren guided State to three wins by a touchdown or less in 2014.





## ACC 2015 Football Championship Game Legends Class

*Quartet of National Champions Headline the 2015 ACC Legends Class in Pitt's Tony Dorsett, Georgia Tech's Bobby Ross, FSU's Warrick Dunn, Miami's Clinton Portis*

One of the game's most renowned Heisman Trophy winners and a trio of other major contributors to national championship teams lead the 2015 Atlantic Coast Conference Class of Football Legends announced on Sept. 29.

Pitt running back Tony Dorsett, Florida State running back Warrick Dunn, Georgia Tech coach Bobby Ross and Miami running back Clinton Portis are among the 14 all-time greats who will be honored during the weekend of the 2015 Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game, which will be played in Charlotte, N.C., on the evening of Saturday, Dec. 5.

Boston College center Dan Koppen, Clemson linebacker Anthony Simmons, Duke running back Chris Douglas, Louisville quarterback Chris Redman, North Carolina offensive lineman Ken Huff, NC State defensive back and return specialist Fred Combs, Syracuse tight end Chris Gedney, Virginia defensive end Patrick Kerney, Virginia Tech defensive end Corey Moore and Wake Forest punter Chuck Ramsey also headline this year's Legends class.

Dorsett – a member of both the College and Pro Football Halls of Fame – earned the Heisman Trophy as a senior in 1976, when he led Pitt to the national title to conclude a stellar collegiate career in which he rushed for over 6,000 yards. Dunn cemented his lasting impact on Florida State football as a freshman in 1993, when he helped key the Seminoles and head coach Bobby Bowden to their first national championship.

Ross oversaw a return to football glory at Georgia Tech, highlighted by the 1990 national title and the Yellow Jackets' first ACC football crown. Portis helped Miami claim the national championship in 2001 by rushing for 1,200 yards and 10 touchdowns on 220 carries.

Koppen made his mark as the center on Boston College's strong offensive lines before moving on to start on four Super Bowl teams with the New England Patriots. Clemson's Simmons established himself in the 1990s as one of the leading tacklers ever to take the field for an ACC team. Duke's Douglas set school rushing marks that still stand, while Louisville's Redman displayed passing skills that led to national honors, including the trophy named for ultimate Cardinal great John Unitas.

North Carolina's Huff epitomized the "Tailback U" teams of head coach Bill Dooley in the early 1970s, opening holes for 1,000-yard rushers in the patented ground game. The multi-talented Combs proved a mainstay for head coach Earle Edwards' NC State teams of the mid-1960s, including a starring role on the 1967 squad that played its way to a No. 3 national ranking.

Gedney upheld the high standard for tight ends at Syracuse, set by the legendary John Mackey, establishing school receiving records for his position and leading the Orange to four bowl games. Virginia's Kerney emerged as one of the game's top pass rushers, earning All-America honors after ranking second in the nation in quarterback sacks as a senior.

Virginia Tech's Moore was another elite defensive end, garnering both the Nagurski and Lombardi awards in his final collegiate season and piling up 35 quarterback sacks over his three years in Blacksburg. Wake Forest's Ramsey proved a valuable weapon in the battle for field position, leading the nation in punting in 1973 and claiming consensus All-America honors.

Each of the ACC's 14 football schools selected its 2015 Legend. The group will be honored at the ACC Night of Legends on Friday, Dec. 4, and on Saturday Dec. 5, during the 11th annual Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game at Bank of America Stadium. The game will be nationally televised with either a 7:45 pm (ESPN) or 8 p.m. (ABC) kickoff.

### ACC Divisional Tiebreaker

If more than one team in the same division is tied for the best winning percentage in its Conference games, the procedures listed below will be followed to determine the division's representative in the ACC Championship Game:

### Two-Team Tie:

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall win percentage. (Divisional and non-divisional) and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken from first-to-last using the league's tiebreaking procedures.
4. Overall win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined win percentage vs. all non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based on their order of finish (overall conference win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the higher ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee following the conclusion of regular season games. (If both tied teams are not ranked in the ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee, the higher ranked team in the Amway Coaches Poll (including others receiving votes).
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw. (as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.)

### Three-Team (or More) Team Tie:

(Once a team is eliminated from the tie, the tie-breaker procedures restart for the remaining teams. If the three (or more) team tie can be reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaker format will then be applied.)

1. Combined head-to-head win percentage among the tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall (divisional and non-divisional) Conference win percentage, and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken first to last, using the league's tie-breaker policies.
4. Combined win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Overall win percentage versus non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based upon their order of finish (overall win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional opponents based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee following the conclusion of regular season games, unless the second of the tied teams is ranked within five or fewer places of the highest ranked tied team. In this case, the two-team tiebreaker procedure shall be applied between the top two ranked tied teams. If none of the tied teams are ranked in the rankings of the College Football Playoff Committee, the higher ranked team in the officially released Amway Coaches poll (including others receiving votes), following the conclusion of regular season games, unless the second of the tied teams is within five or fewer places of the highest ranked team. (For the sake of clarity, the team receiving the second-most votes but not ranked in the Top 25 would be ranked 27th.) In this case the two-team tiebreaker procedure

## COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

The College Football Playoff begins its second year of operation after a highly-acclaimed first season in 2014-15. The Playoff features the top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and a national championship game played in a different city each year. Each semifinal is played during the New Year's holiday with the National Championship Game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later.

The College Football Playoff selection committee chooses the four teams for the playoff based on their performance during the regular season, including, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams will be seeded so that #1 will play #4 in one semifinal and #2 will meet #3 in the other, with the winners advancing to the national championship game. The selection committee will announce its rankings each week on Tuesdays beginning this year on Nov. 3. The final rankings will be announced on Sunday, Dec. 6.

The semifinals will rotate among six different bowls: the Chick-fil-A Peach, Goodyear Cotton, Fiesta and Capital One Orange Bowls; the Rose Bowl presented by Northwestern Mutual and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight other teams in four compelling matchups.

## ACC Bowl Quick Selection Order

(The ACC is in the second year of six-year contracts with its current bowl partners.  
The current College Football Playoff format is a 12-year agreement)

### College Football Playoff (four teams)

If the ACC Champion is not in one of the semifinal games this year, it will appear in one of the Playoff "host" bowls, either the Fiesta or Chick-fil-A Peach, since the Capital One Orange Bowl will serve as a semifinal site this year. There is no limit on how many teams the College Football Playoff may choose from a particular conference.

### Capital One Orange Bowl

The ACC champion, if not in the College Football Playoff, would normally play in the Capital One Orange Bowl against the highest-ranked and available team from Notre Dame, the SEC or the Big Ten. With the Capital One Orange Bowl serving as a Playoff semifinal this year, the CFP Selection Committee will determine the game (Chick-fil-A or Fiesta) and opponent for the ACC champion if that team is not in the Playoff.

### Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl

Only if the ACC opponent in the Capital One Orange Bowl in a non-semifinal year, is a team from the Big Ten. This will not occur in 2015 due to the fact that the Orange Bowl this year is a semifinal site for the College Football Playoff.

### Russell Athletic Bowl

Has first pick of ACC teams in 2015 after the College Football Playoff and the Host Bowls.

## The One-Win Rule Applies Only to Notre Dame

The ACC's bowl selection will no longer be bound by the rigidity of a "one-win rule" but will have a general list of criteria to emphasize regionality and quality matchups on the field. A one-win rule does apply to Notre Dame's participation in the ACC Bowl structure. Notre Dame is now eligible for ACC Bowl selection beginning with the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl and continuing through the league's bowl selections. However, Notre Dame must be within one win of the ACC available team which has the best overall record, in order to be chosen. In other words, if an ACC team was 9-3, a 7-5 Notre Dame team could not be chosen in its place. Notre Dame would have to be 8-4 to be chosen over a 9-3 league team.

## ACC Bowl Expenses And Revenue

The Atlantic Coast Conference shares all bowl revenues. Each school is provided an initial expense allotment. The Conference will share in the cost of unsold tickets for participating bowl institutions. After all bowl expense allotments and ticket reimbursements are subtracted from the total bowl revenue, the remaining revenue is distributed evenly among ACC schools.

# The ACC In Overtime

## The ACC & Overtime

When Virginia and Syracuse ended regulation tied at 24-24 on October 17, 2015, they played the 74th game featuring an ACC team that has had to go to extra sessions. Of the 74 overtime contests, a large portion of them--31--have been played in September. Games have gone into overtime for ACC teams a total of 19 times in November, while 13 have been played in October, three in August, six in December and two in January (2006 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl). Of the 74 overtime contests, 36 have been ACC games while 38 nonconference games have gone into overtime. The home team has a 41-24 advantage in the 65 games played on campus. The team which wins the toss has a 40-34 record. Fifty-four of the games were decided in the first overtime with 14 games in double overtime and six in triple overtime.
