Syracuse Hosts Louisville in ESPN Friday Night Football

Unbeaten Georgia Tech Hosts Coastal Rival Miami; Clemson, NC State in Atlantic Battle

Week Six of the 2014 season focuses on six Divisional matchups as the ACC heads into Conference play in a big way...With Boston College and Duke both off this week there are three Atlantic Division matchups and three Coastal Division contests...The weekend begins early as Friday night **Syracuse**, coached by **Scott Shafer** and led by **QB Terel Hunt** hosts **Louisville** in a nationally-televised (ESPN, 7 pm) game in the Carrier Dome...Syracuse becomes the final ACC team to enter Conference play, while the Cardinals, coached by **Bobby Petrino**, are seeking to stay in step with Division leader Florida State...The status of Louisville starting **QB Will Gardner** is up in the air...The Cardinals started true freshman **Reggie Bonnafon** in Saturday's win over Wake Forest and if Gardner is not ready to go, Bonnafon would start...Bonnafon becomes the fourth true freshman to start for an ACC school this year...Louisville, led by **DE Lorenzo Mauldin** and **S Gerod Hollimon**, is

ranked third nationally in total defense this week, allowing just 225 total yards a game and leads the nation in defense against the run, allowing just 58.2 yards per game...Unbeaten **Florida State**, ranked No. 1 in the Associated Press poll but No. 2 in the Amway Coaches poll, despite having a significant advantage in No. 1 votes in both polls, seeks to increase its advantage in the Atlantic Division, hosting **Wake Forest** in a 3:30 p.m. contest (ABC Regional, ESPN3) at Doak Campbell Stadium...The Seminoles, coached by **Jimbo Fisher**, have a leg up in the Division after defeating Clemson and NC State in back-to-back weeks...Led by **QB Jameis Winston**, who sits atop the ACC in total offense (333.0 yds/gm) and passing yards per game (330.3), FSU has won 20 straight games, including 17 consecutive ACC contests...A win Saturday would give Fisher his 50th victory as a head coach in less than five

seasons...Fisher has put together a 49-10 record since taking over as head coach for the 2010 season...The Seminoles' high-powered offense also features **WR Rashad Greene**, who topped 3,000 career receiving yards, and **RB Karlos Williams**, who ran for 126 yards on 21 carries with 3 touchdowns against the Wolfpack...**Wake Forest**, coached by **Dave Clawson** and led by true freshman **QB John Wolford**, is coming off a close loss at Louisville...The Deacons' three defeats have come by an average of just 9.3 points per game...Wake's defensive unit is ranked 30th nationally...**Clemson**, coached by **Dabo Swinney**, will host **NC State** this Saturday at Memorial Stadium in a 3:30 p.m. nationally televised game (ESPNU)...The Tigers are led by true freshman **QB Deshaun Watson**, who had one of the most im-

pressive inaugural starting performances in ACC history last week against North Carolina...Watson tied the ACC single-game record with six touchdown passes, the most ever by a first-time starter...His 435 passing yards were just nine yards shy of the ACC mark for a first-time starter and he ranks second nationally this week and leads the ACC in pass efficiency (212.7)...Defensively, the Tigers are led by **DE Vic Beasley** who ranks second nationally in QB sacks, averaging 1.50 per game... The Wolfpack, coached by **Dave Doeren**, are led by junior **QB Jacoby Brissett**, who is second in the ACC in total offense (304 yds/gm) and passing yards per game (272.8)... Brissett is coming off his own impressive performance against Florida State in which he threw for 359 yards and 3 TDs...Brissett and true freshman **WR Bo Hines** are becoming a prolific passing combination...In Atlanta, Ga., **Georgia Tech** puts its unbeaten record on the line, hosting Miami, in a key Coastal Division matchup at Bobby Dodd Stadium (7:30 pm, ESPN2)... The Yellow Jackets are coached by **Paul Johnson** and are led by sophomore **QB Justin Thomas**, who has been an effective force in Tech's spread option offense... Thomas is rushing for 118 yards per game on the ground and is also ranked fourth in the ACC in pass efficiency (160.5)...Tech **WR DeAndre Smelter** is averaging 24.2 yards per catch with four TD catches in just four games...Miami, coached by **Al Golden**, has won five straight games in the series between the two teams with Tech's last win coming in Atlanta in 2008, Johnson's first year on the Flats...The Hurricanes are led by a true freshman QB in **Brad Kaaya** and all-purpose **RB Duke Johnson**...Among true freshmen nationally, only Clemson's Watson has a higher pass efficiency rating than does Kaaya (149.5), who has also thrown for 12 touchdowns and 1,275 yards...Johnson ranks fourth in the ACC in rushing (105.0 yds/gm.) and is coming off an 155-yard effort against Duke...In Charlottesville, Va., the Cavaliers will host Pitt in another important Coastal Division clash at Scott Stadium (RSN, 7:30 pm)...UVa and **Pitt** are two of the three teams without a loss in the Coastal Division...Coached by **Mike London** and also face an uncertain quarterback situation with **QB Greyson Lambert** nursing an injury...But sophomore **QB Matt Johns** has played well in Lambert's absence, including starting last Saturday's 45-13 win over Kent State...Defensively, the Cavaliers rank 10th nationally in defense against the run, allowing just 86.6 yards per game behind the play of **LB Henry Coley** and **DEs Eli Harold** and **Max Valles**...They will be facing one of the top runners in the nation in Pitt sophomore

RB James Conner, who is third nationally in yards per game (158.2) and is second nationally in rushing touchdowns (9)... Coached by **Paul Chryst**, the Panthers are also stingy on defense, where they are ranked 8th nationally allowing just 265.2 yards per game...Pitt will be looking to rebound from a 21-10 loss last week to Akron...In Chapel Hill, N.C., **North Carolina** will host Coastal Division rival **Virginia Tech** at Kenan Stadium (12:30 pm, ACC Network)...Coached by **Larry Fedora**, the Tar Heels feature plenty of offense led by **QB Marquise Williams**, who threw four TD passes last week against Clemson, and **WR Ryan Switzer**...UNC is averaging an ACC-best 40.8 points per game, but is yielding an ACC-worst 44.0 points per game as well...The Hokies, coached by **Frank Beamer**, are led by **QB Michael Brewer**, who has thrown for 1,223 yards and nine scores...Defensively, Tech is led by **CB Kendall Fuller**, who is 3rd nationally in passes defended...Since joining the ACC, Tech has taken eight of the past 10 meetings, but one of those losses occurred in Tech's last visit to Chapel Hill in 2012.

Clemson's Watson Named National Freshman of the Week

Clemson true freshman **QB Deshaun Watson**, who tied an ACC single-game record with six touchdown passes and who threw for 435 yards, completing 26 of 37 passes in a 50-35 win over North Carolina, was named the Athlon Sports National Freshman of the Week.

Four True ACC Freshmen Start On Same Day For First Time

For the first time in ACC history four true freshmen QBs--Clemson's Deshaun Watson, Louisville's Reggie Bonnafon, Miami's Brad Kaaya and Wake Forest's John Wolford--started for their teams at QB on the same day.

Louisville Leads Nation in Rushing Defense

The Louisville Cardinals lead the nation in defense against the run this week in the national statistics, allowing just 58.2 yards per game. The Cardinals are third nationally in total defense, allowing just 225.2 yards per game.

Seven ACC Schools Rank in Top 30 of NCAA Total Defense

In this week's NCAA Statistics, seven ACC schools ranks among the nation's Top 30 in Total Defense. Louisville leads the way at No. 3 (225.2), followed by Pitt at No. 8 (265.2), No. 14 Miami (299.8), No. 15 Boston College (304.4), No. 26 Clemson (324.5); Nov. 27. Virginia Tech (325.6); Nov. 30 Wake Forest (330.8).



The ACC By The Numbers

.966 - The career field goal percentage for Florida State's All-American sophomore placekicker **Roberto Aguayo**. Aguayo, who captured the 2013 Lou Groza Award as the nation's top kicker as a redshirt freshman, has made 28 of the first 29 field goal attempts of his career, including a 50-yarder against Clemson on Sept. 20.

1 - Louisville **S Gerod Holiman** leads the nation in pass interceptions with six picks in just five games, an average of 1.2 interceptions per game.

2 - A pair of ACC players have been named to the Allstate American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Good Works team. Named to the 11-man team from the Football Bowl Subdivision were Louisville long-snapper **Sam Rodgers** and Duke offensive guard **Laken Tomlinson**.

3 - When Wake Forest junior **NT Tylor Harris** recovered three fumbles in the Deacons' 20-10 loss to Louisville, it was the the most fumble recoveries by an FBS player in a game since at least the 2000 season.

4 - When Clemson started **Deshaun Watson** and Louisville started **Reggie Bonnanon** at quarterback, it marked the first time that four true freshmen QBs started for ACC teams on the same weekend. Watson and Bonnanon were joined by Miami's **Brad Kaaya** and Wake Forest's **John Wolford** as true freshmen who started at QB for their teams on Sept. 27. The only other time in ACC history four true freshmen QBs started at least one game was in 2010 when Boston College's Chase Rettig, Duke's Brandon Connette, Miami's Stephen Morris and Wake Forest's Tanner Price all started for their teams, though not all four on the same day.

5 - The **ACC** has only one team in both the Associated Press and Amway Coaches poll this week--Florida State remains No. 1 in AP, but falls to No. 2 in the Coaches, but has five schools receiving votes in both polls. In AP, Clemson, Georgia Tech, Louisville, North Carolina and Virginia received votes, while in the Coaches' poll, Clemson, Georgia Tech, Louisville, and Duke received votes.

6 - The number of touchdown passes for Clemson true freshman **QB Deshaun Watson** in his first collegiate start. That tied an ACC record for most TD passes in a game and is

the most in ACC history for a first-time starter and for a freshman.

8 - It took just eight seconds for **Virginia Tech** to score on Western Michigan in its 35-17 win over the Broncos. That's the fastest Tech has ever scored under head coach Frank Beamer. Tech's Ronny Van Dyke forced a fumble on the opening kickoff and Hokies' freshman Andrew Motuapuaka recovered the fumble in the end zone to give Tech a 6-0 lead.

9 - When FSU's **Jameis Winston** threw for 365 yards and 4 TDs in the Seminoles' 56-41 win over NC State, it marked the 9th time in 17 games the redshirt sophomore has topped 300 passing yards in a game. Winston has topped the 350-yard mark five times in his career.

10 - Virginia Tech sophomore **CB Kendall Fuller** has recorded 10 passes deflected--all pass deflections--in the Hokies first five games. Fuller is tied for third nationally in passes deflected, averaging 2.0 per game.

15 - When Clemson true freshman **QB Deshaun Watson** was honored by Athlon Sports as their National Freshman of the Week for his play against North Carolina, it marked the 15th time this fall that an ACC player has been honored for their play by one of the major national awards or publications. Watson is the second straight ACC player to be so honored by Athlon Sports, as Duke freshman RB Shaun Wilson earned National Freshman of the Week honors for his play on Sept. 20.

16 - Florida State sophomore **PK Roberto Aguayo** has been successful on his last 16 field goal attempts, dating back to the Wake Forest game of last year. The ACC record is 27, set by NC State's Marc Primanti during the 1995-96 seasons. Aguayo's current streak already ties for 9th-best in league history.

20 - **Florida State** has won 20 consecutive games, the nation's longest current winning streak. The streak is also the ACC's longest winning streak, breaking a mark set by the Seminoles during the 1999 and 2000 seasons. FSU has also won 17 consecutive ACC games, dating back to a 17-16 loss at NC State in 2012.

27.0 - The number of career sacks for Clemson All-American **DE Vic Beasley**. He leads the nation among all active FBS players in

career QB sacks, after recording two against the North Carolina, and is second nationally this year, averaging 1.50 per game.

49 - The number of victories to which Florida State head coach **Jimbo Fisher** has led the Seminoles in just over four seasons as head coach in Tallahassee. His winning percentage of .831 is the best of any ACC coach with three or more seasons.

156 - NC State junior **QB Jacoby Brissett**, who leads the ACC in touchdown passes with 13, has thrown 156 consecutive passes without an interception. That ties for 11th longest streak in league history (Stephen Morris, Miami, 2012-13).

158.2 - The average number of rushing yards this year for Pitt running back **James Conner**. Conner has rushed for 791 yards in 135 carries--a 5.9 per carry average. He ranks third nationally in yards per game, second in total rushing yards and second in rushing touchdowns (9).

225.2 - **Louisville** ranks third nationally this week in total defense. The Cardinals are allowing just 225.2 yards per game.

227 - The number of career receptions for Duke senior **WR Jamison Crowder**. Crowder moved into fifth on the ACC career receptions list with seven catches against Tulane, and is two behind Michael Campanaro, also of Wake Forest (229, 2010-13), for fourth place.

269 - Virginia Tech head coach **Frank Beamer**, is the leader among active FBS coaches with 269 career victories and ranks 6th all-time. He is the NCAA's FBS active leader in career wins. He is 29 wins behind 5th-place Joe Paterno.

3,008 - The number of career receiving yards for Florida State **WR Rashad Greene**. Greene became only the third wide receiver in FSU history (Ron Sellers, Peter Warrick) to top 3,000 receiving yards in the career with an 11-catch, 125-yard effort against NC State. He ranks fourth nationally in receiving yards per game this year (135.8).

ACC 2014 Football Championship Game Legends Class

Legendary Virginia Coach George Welsh; National Football Foundation College Hall of Famers Derrick Brooks, Hugh Green and Art Monk Headline 2014 Class

Led by three members of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame, two members of the Pro Football Hall of Fame and one of the most successful coaches in Atlantic Coast Conference history, the ACC announced the 2014 Class of Legends for its 10th Annual Dr Pepper Football Championship Game, which will be played in Charlotte, N.C. on December 6. Leading this year's class are former Virginia and Navy head coach George Welsh (Coaldale Pa.), Florida State's two-time consensus All-American linebacker Derrick Brooks (Pensacola, Fla.), four-time Pitt All-American defensive end Hugh Green (Natchez, Miss.), and Syracuse All-American wide receiver Art Monk (White Plains, N.Y.).

Welsh finished his coaching career as the winningest coach in league history, compiling a 189-132-4 record which included reclamation projects at the U.S. Naval Academy and at Virginia. In his near two-decade stint in Charlottesville, Welsh, a 2004 inductee into the College Hall of Fame, built the Cavaliers into one of the nation's premier football programs, winning seven or more games for 13 consecutive seasons. Brooks, a 2014 inductee into the Pro Football Hall of Fame, is considered one of the greatest players in college and professional football history. The 1993 ACC Defensive Player of the Year, he was named to the NFL's Pro Bowl an astounding 11 times and led FSU to a national championship and Tampa Bay to the NFL title. Green, a 1996 inductee into the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame, is also considered by many to be one of the greatest collegiate players in history. He was a three-time consensus All-American and earned All-America honors in all four of his collegiate seasons for the Panthers. Monk is one of the few players to earn selection to both the College Football Hall of Fame (2012) and the Pro Football Hall of Fame (2008). He ended his 15-year professional career as the first wide receiver in NFL history to top 900 receptions, finishing with 940 career catches.

The group of 14 former gridiron standouts from current ACC schools includes a former ACC Football Player of the Year, an ACC Defensive Player of the Year, 12 former All-Americans, including 10 first-team and six consensus All-American honorees, and 12 players who combined for 118 years in the National Football League.

Joining Welsh, Brooks, Green and Monk are Boston College offensive lineman Chris Snee (Montrose, Pa.), who earned second-team All-America honors (AP) as a senior at guard; Clemson cornerback Donnell Woolford (Fayetteville, N.C.), a consensus All-America and key defensive figure for the Danny Ford-coached Tiger teams in the late 1980s; Duke wide receiver Chris Castor (Cary, N.C.), the first wide receiver to earn Player of the Year honors in ACC history; Georgia Tech offensive lineman John Davis (Ellijay, Ga.), who earned first-team All-America honors as a tackle and as a center for the Yellow Jackets; and Louisville cornerback Frank Minnifield (Lexington, Ky.), who led the nation in kickoff returns and was an excellent cover cornerback for the Cardinals.

Completing the ACC Football Legends Class of 2014 are Miami's Darrin Smith (Miami, Fla.), one of one-third of the famed Hurricane linebacker trio dubbed the "Bermuda Triangle" that helped lead "the U" to a pair of national championships in 1989 and 1991; North Carolina defensive end Greg Ellis (Wendell, N.C.), a two-time All-American who earned consensus All-America honors in 1997 playing for the Mack Brown-coached Tar Heel teams of the mid-1990s; NC State safety Jesse Campbell (Vanceboro, N.C.), a three-time All-ACC and two-time All-America defensive back for Coach Dick Sheridan's teams of the 1980s and 90s; Virginia Tech center Jake Grove (Forest, Va.), a unanimous first-team All-America in 2003 who was the winner of the Rimington Trophy, given annually to the nation's top pivotman; and Wake Forest running back Alan White (Elm City, N.C.), the runner-up for 1961 ACC Player of the Year who led the conference in rushing that year and went on to an award-winning career in athletic administration as director of athletics at Elon University.

2014 ACC FB Game Summaries -- Sept. 27

#1/1 Florida State 56, NC State 41

The top-ranked Seminoles (4-0, 2-0) overcame a 24-7 first-quarter deficit to improve their ACC- and school-record winning streak to 20 consecutive games. FSU QB Jameis Winston completed 26 of 38 attempts for 365 yards and four touchdowns. Homestanding NC State hung the first 24-point first quarter on the Seminoles in the 769-game history of the program in building the early lead. The Wolfpack (4-1, 0-1) converted four Florida State turnovers into 20 points and amassed 520 total yards; the first 500-yard game by an FSU opponent since Florida in 2009 (545). NC State QB Jacoby Brissett passed for 359 yards and three touchdowns, completing 32 of 48 attempts while leading his team to double-digit leads on three separate occasions. While Winston eclipsed 300 passing yards for the ninth time in 17 starts, it was his 20-yard scramble to convert third-and-11 with 3:16 remaining and the Seminoles clinging to a 49-41 lead, which essentially sealed the game. RB Karlos Williams made sure of it with runs of 28, 3 and finally, 12 yards for a touchdown.

Clemson 50, North Carolina 35

In his first career start, quarterback Deshaun Watson threw for 435 yards and an ACC record-tying six touchdowns, as the Tigers (2-2, 1-1) defeated visiting North Carolina (2-2, 0-1) to earn their first ACC victory of the season. Watson has now thrown for 914 yards and 10 touchdowns, both bests in Clemson history for a first-year freshman, surpassing Willie Jordan's previous records of 750 passing yards and five touchdowns in 1975. Sophomore WR Germone Hopper led Clemson receivers with a career-high 139 receiving yards and two touchdowns, with WR Mike Williams close behind with his own career-high of 122 receiving yards and two touchdowns. Clemson finished the night with 528 total yards of offense. QB Marquise Williams completed 24 of 38 passes for 345 yards and four touchdowns to lead the Tar Heels.

Miami 22, Duke 10

RB Duke Johnson carried 25 times for 155 yards and a touchdown to lead the Hurricanes (3-2, 1-1), who snapped the visiting Blue Devils' 12-game regular season winning streak. Miami freshmen QB Brad Kaaya completed 20 of 34 passes for 223 yards and a pair of touchdowns, and LB Denzel Perryman keyed a Hurricane defense that limited Duke to 264 total yards. Johnson became the third Miami player to reach 4,000 all-purpose yards and passed Graig Cooper for the No. 5 spot on the Hurricanes' all-time rushing list. RB Shaquille Powell ran for 58 yards and a touchdown for Duke (4-1, 0-1).

Louisville 20, Wake Forest 10

Wake Forest led 10-7 heading into the fourth quarter, but Louisville reeled off 13 straight points to turn back the visiting Demon Deacons. RB Brandon Radcliff rushed for 129 yards and two touchdowns for Louisville (4-1, 2-1), and PK John Wallace kicked fourth-quarter field goals of 31 and 34 yards to help seal the win. The Cardinals intercepted three Wake Forest passes, including S Gerod Holliman's nation-leading sixth of the season and his third in five games. DE Tylor Harris led a strong defensive effort and set a new FBS record by recovering three fumbles for Wake Forest (2-3, 0-10). No FBS player has totaled three fumble recoveries since it became an official stat in 1992, and Harris is now one away from Wake Forest's season record of five. Harris forced one of the fumbles in the third quarter with a quarterback sack, and recovered it in the end zone for Wake Forest's lone touchdown.

Virginia 45, Kent State 13

QB Matt Johns threw for two touchdowns and ran for another to lead the Cavaliers (3-2), who surpassed their 2013 victory total with Saturday's win at Scott Stadium. CB Cornerback Maurice Canady returned one of three Virginia interceptions 69 yards for a touchdown. RBs Kevin Parks and Taquan Mizzell added rushing touchdowns for the Cavaliers, who handed Kent State its fourth loss in as many starts.

Virginia Tech 35, Western Michigan 17

Marshawn Williams rushed for 119 yards and Virginia Tech's offense ran for a season-high 308 yards, as the Hokies knocked off Western Michigan to earn a Homecoming victory. The win marked the first for the Hokies (3-2) since their upset victory over then-No. 8 Ohio State in Columbus on Sept. 6. Virginia Tech QB Michael Brewer threw two touchdown passes, and the Hokies jumped out of the blocks early, scoring 8 seconds into the game when backup LB Andrew Motuapuaka returned a fumble by Western Michigan's Donald Celiscar on the opening kickoff 11 yards for a touchdown. That marked the fastest that a team has scored under veteran head coach Frank Beamer.

No. 8/8 Notre Dame 31, Syracuse 15

The Orange defense forced five turnovers, but it wasn't enough to upset No. 8 Notre Dame in Saturday night's nationally televised game at MetLife Stadium. Syracuse (2-2) had three take-aways via fumble recovery and another two by way of interception, including Durell Eskridge's 29-yard return for touchdown in the fourth quarter. Orange QB Terrel Hunt was 22-of-38 passing for 294 yards and one interception. He added 26 yards rushing and a touchdown. Notre Dame QB Everett Golson was 32-of-39 for 362 yards, four touchdowns and two interceptions. He completed 25 consecutive passes at one point, one shy of the FBS record.

Colorado State 24, Boston College 21

The Eagles (3-2) held a 21-14 lead going into the fourth quarter, but the Rams (3-1) put up 10 unanswered points to take the victory. The last time the Eagles led after three quarters and lost on Sept. 17, 2011 when BC led Duke, 19-14, heading to the final frame and lost, 20-19. The BC offense was led by freshman running back Jon Hilliman who rushed for a career-high 128 yards on a team season-high 24 carries. He scored two rushing TDs for the third straight game, tying with graduate quarterback Tyler Murphy for the team lead with seven rushing touchdowns. The Eagles have had a 100-yard rusher in four of five games this season.

Akron 21, Pitt 10

RB Conor Hundley rushed for 148 yards on 19 carries as Akron (2-2) defeated Pitt (3-2) at Heinz Field. Akron outgained the Panthers 382-349 and kept Pitt sophomore RB James Conner in check. Conner entered the game with 699 yards but was held to 92 yards on 25 carries. Panthers QB Chad Voytik completed 20 of 34 passes for 220 yards with a touchdown and an interception.

ACC Players of the Week

Clemson, Florida State, NC State Lead Players Of Week, Each With Two Players Selected

Clemson, Florida State and NC State each saw two student-athletes recognized as Atlantic Coast Conference Football Players of the Week following their performances in Saturday's league games. Clemson quarterback Deshaun Watson was named the ACC Co-Offensive Back of the Week and the ACC Rookie of the Week for after leading Saturday night's 50-35 win over North Carolina. Tiger punter Bradley Pinion was tabbed as the ACC Co-Specialist of the Week. FSU's Rashad Greene was recognized as the ACC Receiver of the Week for the third time this season, and Seminole offensive guard Tre' Jackson was named the ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week following Saturday's come-from-behind, 56-41 Atlantic Division victory at NC State. NC State quarterback Jacoby Brissett joined Watson as the ACC Co-Offensive Back of the Week, and the Wolfpack's Jerod Fernandez earned ACC Linebacker of the Week recognition. Wake Forest junior Tylor Harris picked up ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week honors. Syracuse's Durell Eskridge and Duke's Jeremy Cash were named ACC Co-Defensive Backs of the Week, and Miami punter Justin Vogel was named ACC Co-Specialist of the Week. FSU's Greene was honored as ACC Receiver of the Week for the second week in a row. Clemson's Watson, who was also recognized as the National Freshman of the Week by Athlon Sports, has been named the ACC Rookie of the Week each of the past two weeks.

CO-OFFENSIVE BACK, ROOKIE - Deshaun Watson, Clemson, Fr., QB, 6-3, 200, Gainesville, Ga.

Watson completed 27 of 36 passes for 435 yards and six touchdowns in Clemson's 50-35 win over North Carolina. Watson set a program record and tied an ACC mark for touchdown passes in a game. His 435 passing yards were just 21 short of the Clemson single game record, the most by a Clemson freshman and the second most by an ACC quarterback in his first career start. Watson also rushed for 28 yards, giving him 463 yards of total offense, the fourth highest total in Clemson history. Only Woody Dantzler and Tajh Boyd have recorded more total offensive yards in a single game in Clemson history.

CO-OFFENSIVE BACK - Jacoby Brissett, NC State, Jr.-r., QB, 6-4, 236, West Palm Beach, Fla.

Brissett threw for 359 yards and three touchdowns in NC State's 56-41 loss to No. 1 Florida State and also ran for another 38 yards. Brissett's second touchdown pass came after he eluded what appeared to be two certain sacks and earned "Top 10 play" status on ESPN's SportsCenter. Brissett has now thrown 156 passes without an interception and leads the ACC with 13 touchdown passes.

OFFENSIVE LINEMAN - Tre' Jackson, Sr., Florida State, OG, 6-4, 330, Jesup, Ga.

Jackson graded out to the highest mark by a Seminole lineman this season (92 percent) in Saturday's 56-41 victory at NC State. Jackson paved the way for an FSU offense that set season highs in total offense (531) and touchdowns (8) and had its first 100-yard rusher of the season (Karlos Williams, 126 yards).

RECEIVER - Rashad Greene, Florida State, Sr., WR, 6-0, 180, Albany, Ga.

Greene led Florida State to a 56-41 victory at NC State by grabbing 11 receptions for 125 yards and the go-ahead touchdown in the third quarter. Greene helped the Seminoles erase a 17-point first quarter deficit and remains the ACC's leader in receptions (35), receiving yards (543) and yards per game (135.8).

DEFENSIVE LINEMAN - Tylor Harris, Wake Forest, Jr. NT, 6-4, 285, Baton Rouge, La.

Harris recovered three fumbles, including one for a touchdown in Wake Forest's 20-10 loss at Louisville. Harris' three fumble recoveries are the most by an FBS player in a single game since at least 2000. His second fumble recovery came in the first quarter and set up a field goal that gave Wake Forest a 3-0 lead. Midway through the third quarter, Harris broke through the line, stripped QB Reggie Bonnafon of the ball and then recovered it himself in the end zone for a touchdown. The score put the Deacons in front 10-7.

LINEBACKER - Jerod Fernandez, NC State, Fr.-r, MLB, 6-1, 231, Lake Mary, Fla.

Fernandez intercepted two passes in Saturday's game against top-ranked Florida State, leading to 10 Wolfpack points. Fernandez also broke up a third pass and had a half-tackle for loss. He finished the day with four tackles on 53 snaps.

CO-DEFENSIVE BACK - Durell Eskridge, Syracuse, Jr., FS, 6-3, 203, Miami, Fla.

Eskridge posted a season-high nine tackles and contributed two takeaways, including a 29-yard interception return for a touchdown, against eighth-ranked Notre Dame. With Syracuse trailing 21-3 in the third quarter and the Irish at the Orange 32-yard line, Eskridge pounced on a fumble to thwart the potential scoring drive. Two possessions later, Eskridge intercepted on the Irish 29 and returned the pick back for Syracuse's second touchdown in the 31-15 loss. It marked the first interception return for a touchdown by a Syracuse defender since the 2012 regular-season finale at Temple.

CO-DEFENSIVE BACK - Jeremy Cash, Duke, Jr.-r, S, 6-2, 205, Miami, Fla.

Cash posted a game-high 10 tackles, including one tackle for loss, while creating two turnovers on forced fumbles in Saturday night's 22-10 loss at Miami. Cash also applied two quarterback pressures and broke up a pass.

CO-SPECIALIST - Justin Vogel, Miami, So., P, 6-4, 210, Tampa, Fla.

Vogel had eight punts for 347 yards for an average of 43.4 yards per punt in Saturday night's 22-10 win over Duke. Vogel dropped three punts inside the 20-yard line and tied a season best with a 56-yard boot.

CO-SPECIALIST - Bradley Pinion, Clemson, Jr., P, 6-6, 230, Concord, N.C.

Pinion had five punts for an average of 46.6 yards and placed three punts inside the 20 to help the Tigers to a 50-35 win over North Carolina. Pinion also handled nine kickoffs and had four touchbacks on those attempts. North Carolina's average start after a kickoff was its own 23.

FSU's Fisher Joining Select Company

After just four seasons as head coach at Florida State, Jimbo Fisher joined some select company among ACC football coaches. Fisher compiled a 45-10 record (.818) during that time. His winning percentage put him in 2nd place among all ACC head coaches after four seasons, ahead of such prominent figures as NC State's Lou Holtz, Clemson's Danny Ford, Maryland's Ralph Friedgen and Georgia Tech's Bobby Ross. The best mark recorded by an ACC head coach in his first four years in the league was by Fisher's predecessor at FSU, Bobby Bowden, who posted a 43-5-1 record (.888). Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer has the 3rd-best record at 42-11-0 (.792).

Clemson's Swinney, Georgia Tech's Johnson In Good Company As ACC Head Coaches

After their first six seasons at Clemson and Georgia Tech, head coaches Dabo Swinney and **Paul Johnson** have recorded excellent numbers. Only five other coaches in league history have had a better winning percentage after six seasons than Swinney (.689) and only three have won more games. Only seven other coaches in league history have won more games (47) than has Johnson after his first six seasons in the league and he ranks 14th in winning percentage.



Home Sweet Home for Tigers' Swinney, Noles' Fisher



Clemson head coach **Dabo Swinney** and Florida State head coach **Jimbo Fisher** have both enjoyed coaching in the cozy and imposing confines of the Tigers' home field, also known as Death Valley, and the Seminoles' home turf, Doak Campbell Stadium. Now, beginning his seventh season as head coach of the Tigers, Swinney's teams won 19 of the first 22 home ACC games, a winning percentage of .864, third-best among ACC coaches who have coached a minimum of four seasons. He is only behind former Tiger coach Ken Hatfield, who posted a 12-1-1 mark in four seasons (.893) and Fisher, who is 15-2 (.875) against league foes. They are both just ahead of legendary FSU coach Bobby Bowden, who also won more ACC home games than any other coach, with 62 triumphs in his 18 years in the league.

Program Builder Clawson Begins New Era at Wake Forest

Wake Forest new head coach Dave Clawson is in his first year as the Demon Deacons' head coach, but he is no rookie leading a program. Clawson, now in his 15th season as a head coach, has already re-built three football programs. He ranks fourth in years of experience among head coaches in the ACC, behind only Frank Beamer (34) and Paul Johnson (18). His overall, 92-83 (.526) record is more impressive when you take into account that he had to rebuild programs at Fordham, Richmond and Bowling Green, where his combined mark in his final three seasons (nine years total) at each stop was 75-37, a .670 winning percentage.

Duke Experiencing Success Under National and ACC Coach of the Year David Cutcliffe

David Cutcliffe, the ACC's 2012 and 2013 Coach of the Year, has led the Blue Devils to 35 victories since coming to Durham in 2008. That may not sound like a great record, except when you consider that it is more wins than the Blue Devils totalled in the 15 seasons before Cutcliffe came to Durham.

■ Duke's 2013 team had 10 wins, the most in school history. Duke was Coastal Division champions for the first time since the ACC went to Divisional play in 2005 and the Blue Devils went to back-to-back bowl games for the first time in school history, dropping a last-second contest (52-48) to Texas A&M in the Chick-fil-A Bowl.

■ Duke made its first appearance in the BCS Standings on Nov. 25, 2013, getting ranked 24th.

■ In the five-plus years that Cutcliffe has been in Durham, he has already mentored a pair of quarterbacks who finished their careers ranked in the ACC's top seven of career passing yardage. **Thaddeus Lewis** (2006-09) threw for 10,065 yards, the second-highest total in league history and **Sean Renfree** (2009-12), threw for 9,465 career yards, the 7th-best total by an ACC player.

■ Also, under his guidance, Duke **WR Conner Vernon** became the all-time leading pass receiver in ACC history setting conference career marks for pass receptions (283) and pass reception yardage (3,749) with senior **Jamison Crowder** set to challenge those marks.

■ Cutcliffe was honored in 2013 by being named National Coach of the Year by five different outlets--the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA), The Maxwell Football Club, The Bobby Dodd Foundation, the Walter Camp Foundation and The Sporting News (Co-Coach of the Year).

Under Steve Addazio Boston College Becomes One of the Top Five Most Improved Teams in the FBS

Under head coach **Steve Addazio**, Boston College in 2013 became on the nation's most improved football teams. Inheriting a program which had posted a 6-18 record over the past two seasons, including a 2-10 mark in 2012, Addazio led the Eagles to a 7-6 record and into the Independence Bowl in his first season on The Heights.

Addazio's physical style of football and a veteran offensive line allowed TB Andre Williams to set ACC single-game, multi game and single-season rushing records and to win the Doak Walker Award as the nation's top running back. Williams became the first running back in ACC history to top 2,000 rushing yards in a season (2,177).

The four-and-a-half win improvement from 2012 was the fifth-best turnaround in the FBS last year, bettered only by Auburn (8), Missouri (6) and Michigan State and UNLV (5 each).

UNC Has An Offensive and Special Teams Mindset Under Larry Fedora

North Carolina Head Coach **Larry Fedora's** fast-paced offense had his team scoring at a school-record pace in his first year in Chapel Hill. UNC ranked 8th nationally in scoring offense in 2012, averaging 40.6 points a game while also ranked 14th nationally in total offense,



■ Now in his third season as head coach at UNC, North Carolina has topped the 40-point mark 11 times and bettered 30 points 20 times. His Tar Heel teams have averaged 37.1 points per game. In the previous 13 seasons before Fedora came to Chapel Hill, UNC had averaged just 23.3 points per game, a 14-point difference.

■ Also, in his first two seasons, UNC has 454 yards per game of total offense. That compares with the previous 13 seasons when the Tar Heels averaged just 349.25 yards per game of offense.

■ Fedora's first two Tar Heel teams both bettered the previous school mark for scoring. UNC scored a school-record 487 points in 2012 and tallied 425 points in 2013. Previously, the school had only topped 400 points once (1993) in its history when it scored 421 points.

■ Fedora's 2013 team set a school record for most touchdowns by returns with eight, including five by punt return, two by kickoff return and one interception runback.

■ Now in his third season in Chapel Hill, Fedora's teams have had 14 returns for touchdowns including eight by punt return and three by kickoff return.

■ In 2012 and 2013 UNC returned 65 punts, averaging 16.0 per return. As a freshman in 2013, Ryan Switzer tied an NCAA FBS single-season record and set an ACC standard when he returned five punts for scores last year.

■ Now in his third season at Chapel Hill, UNC has scored 60 or more points three times, including an 80-point outburst against Old Dominion.

■ By posting records of 8-4 and 7-6 in his two years in Chapel Hill, he becomes the first UNC coach since Ray Wolf in 1936-37 to post winning records in each of his first two seasons.

Florida State Has Nation's Longest Current Win Streak

Florida State has the nation's longest current winning streak of 20 games which began in the 2012 ACC Championship. This streak is the longest in ACC history surpassing FSU's previous mark of 17 set during the 1999-2000 seasons. The Seminoles, though, have a ways to go to reach the NCAA all-time Top 20, which has five teams tied for 19th with 25 consecutive victories.

Virginia's Ian Frye Nominated For Orange Bowl-FWAA Courage Award

DALLAS (FWAA) – Virginia kicker Ian Frye is the second weekly nominee for the 2014 Orange Bowl-FWAA Courage Award and the second straight from the ACC following Deon Hill of Georgia Tech.

Frye, a 6-6, 200-pound junior from Bristol, Va., made a 46-yard field goal and two PAT attempts in the second half of the Cavalier's 46-33 loss to BYU in Provo, Utah, after learning that his father had suffered a heart attack during the first half.

At halftime, just outside the Virginia locker room, Ian found his father Mark sitting down with paramedics surrounding him. After staying with his father during the half-time, Frye was told by his father to stay and play the second half. He did. Frye went 4-for-4 on his field goals (23, 41, 22 and 46) and 3-of-3 on PATs, then left for the hospital where his father was recovering.

Frye found out that the stents that they put in his father, who had suffered a heart attack prior to the 2013 fall camp, had clogged up and caused the second heart attack. The first heart attack occurred during a family retreat when Ian had to carry his father down a hill to be driven to the hospital.

"He really wasn't talking," Ian was quoted in the Newport News Daily Press. "He was in so much pain and overheating and out of breath. It was disturbing to see my dad like that (at halftime)."

The Courage Award was first presented by the FWAA in 2002. A select group of writers from the FWAA vote on the winner each year. The requirements for nomination include displaying courage on or off the field, including overcoming an injury or physical handicap, preventing a disaster or living through hardship. The winner of the award will be included in festivities during Orange Bowl week and receive his trophy at an on-field presentation.

Previous winners of the FWAA's Courage Award are San José State defensive lineman Anthony Larceval (2013), Clemson wide receiver Daniel Rodriguez (2012), Michigan State offensive lineman Arthur Ray Jr. (2011), Rutgers defensive tackle Eric LeGrand (2010), the University of Connecticut football team (2009), Tulsa's Wilson Holloway (2008), Navy's Zerbini Singleton (2007), Clemson's Ray Ray McElrathbey (2006), the Tulane football team (2005), Memphis' Haracio Colen (2004), San José State's Neil Parry (2003) and Toledo's William Bratton (2002).

Georgia Tech's Orwin Smith, who completed his career in 2012, holds the record, averaging 9.28 with 1,839 career yards. In Johnson's last 14 games (1,624 yards), he is averaging 116.0 yards per contest. In just 25 career games, he is averaging 95.7 yards a game.

BC's Tyler Murphy On The Run

Eagle QB on Pace to Break ACC Rushing Mark for Quarterbacks

Boston College **QB Tyler Murphy (Wethersfield, Conn.)** is off to a fast start as the signal-caller for the Eagles. After rushing for 79 yards on 16 carries against Colorado State, the graduate student has now accumulated 579 yards in just five games, a per-game average of 115.8 yards per contest. If maintained throughout the season, that would be an ACC single-season record. Clemson's Woodrow Dantzler currently holds that mark, having rushed for 1,061 yards in 2001 (81.6 avg.). Murphy has already topped the 100-yard mark in rushing yardage twice in a game this season, including a 191-yard effort against 9th-ranked Southern California that was the second-highest single-game effort by the quarterback in ACC history.

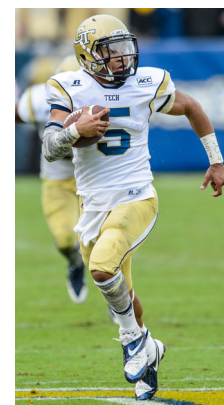

Georgia Tech sophomore **QB Justin Thomas (Prattville, Ala.)** has shown his ability to excel in the run game--he is third in the ACC this week in rushing yardage, averaging 110.8 yards a game--as well as in the passing game, where he ranks fourth in the ACC in pass efficiency, recording a 160.5 rating.



Thomas is the only player in the nation ranked in the Top 30 nationally in both rushing yards per game (29th) and pass efficiency (25th).

He is 17th nationally in yards per carry, averaging 6.82 on every rushing attempt. Among QBs, he ranks third nationally behind only Nebraska's Tommy Armstrong and Boston College's Tyler Murphy.

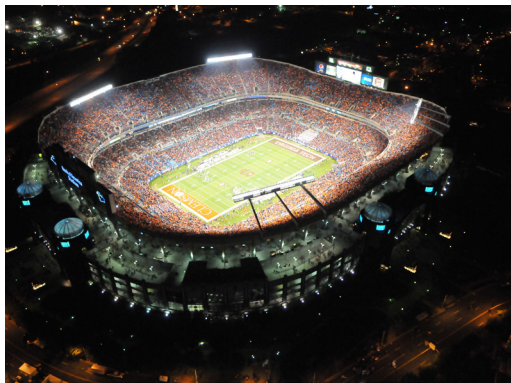

ACC Divisional Tiebreaker

If more than one team in the same division is tied for the best winning percentage in its Conference games, the procedures listed below will be followed to determine the division's representative in the ACC Championship Game:

Two-Team Tie:

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall win percentage. (Divisional and non-divisional) and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken from first-to-last using the league's tiebreaking procedures.
4. Overall win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined win percentage vs. all non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based on their order of finish (overall conference win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the higher ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee following the conclusion of regular season games. (If both tied teams are not ranked in the ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee, the higher ranked team in the Amway Coaches Poll (including others receiving votes).
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw. (as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.)

Three-Team (or More) Team Tie

(Once a team is eliminated from the tie, the tie-breaker procedures restart for the remaining teams. If the three (or more) team tie can be reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaker format will then be applied.)

1. Combined head-to-head win percentage among the tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall (divisional and non-divisional) Conference win percentage, and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken first to last, using the league's tie-breaker policies.
4. Combined win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Overall win percentage versus non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based upon their order of finish (overall win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional opponents based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee following the conclusion of regular season games, unless the second of the tied teams is ranked within five or fewer places of the highest ranked tied team. In this case, the two-team tiebreaker procedure shall be applied between the top two ranked tied teams. If none of the tied teams are ranked in the rankings of the College Football Playoff Committee, the higher ranked team in the officially released Amway Coaches poll (including others receiving votes), following the conclusion of regular season games, unless the second of the tied teams is within five or fewer places of the highest ranked team. (For the sake of clarity, the team receiving the second-most votes but not ranked in the Top 25 would be ranked 27th.) In this case the two-team tiebreaker procedure shall be applied between the top ranked tied teams.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

Beginning with the 2014-15 season, college football enters a new era when a postseason playoff will begin. The format includes the top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and a national championship game played in a different city each year. Each semifinal will be played during the New Year's holiday with the national championship game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later.

A selection committee will choose the four teams for the playoff based on their performance during the regular season, including, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams will be seeded so that #1 will play #4 in one semifinal and #2 will meet #3 in the other, with the winners advancing to the national championship game. The selection committee will announce its rankings each week on Tuesdays beginning on Oct. 28. The final rankings, though, will be announced on Sunday, Dec. 7.

The semifinals will rotate among six different bowls: the Chick-fil-A Peach, Cotton, Fiesta and Capital One Orange Bowls; the Rose Bowl presented by Northwestern Mutual and the Sugar Bowl. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight other teams in four compelling matchups.

ACC Bowl Quick Selection Order

(The ACC is in the first year of six-year contracts with its current bowl partners. The current College Football Playoff format is a 12-year agreement)

College Football Playoff (four teams)

If the ACC Champion is not in one of the semifinal games it will appear in the Capital One Orange Bowl, or, if the Capital One Orange Bowl is a semifinal or national championship site, one of the Playoff "host" bowls, either the Fiesta or Chick-fil-A Peach.

There is no limit on how many teams the College Football Playoff may choose from a particular conference.

Capital One Orange

Opponent will be a team from the SEC, Big Ten or Notre Dame. If ACC Champion is in the College Football Playoff, a second ACC team will take its place in the Orange Bowl.

Orlando

The One-Win Rule Applies Only to Notre Dame

The ACC's bowl selection will no longer be bound by the rigidity of a "one-win rule" but will have a general list of criteria to emphasize regionality and quality matchups on the field. A one-win rule does apply to Notre Dame's participation in the ACC Bowl structure. Notre Dame is now eligible for ACC Bowl selection beginning with the Capital One Bowl and continuing through the league's bowl selections. However, Notre Dame must be within one win of the ACC available team which has the best overall record, in order to be chosen. In other words, if an ACC team was 9-3, a 7-5 Notre Dame team could not be chosen in its place. Notre Dame would have to be 8-4 to be chosen over a 9-3 league team.

ACC Bowl Expenses And Revenue

The Atlantic Coast Conference shares all bowl revenues. Each school is provided an initial expense allotment. The Conference will share in the cost of unsold tickets for participating bowl institutions. After all bowl expense allotments and ticket reimbursements are subtracted from the total bowl revenue, the remaining revenue is distributed evenly among the ACC schools.

The ACC In Overtime

The ACC & Overtime

When Florida State and Clemson ended regulation tied at 17 in week 4 of the 2014 season, it marked the 67th game featuring an ACC team that has had to go to extra sessions. Of the 67 overtime contests, a large portion of them--29--have been played in the month of September. Games have gone into overtime for ACC teams a total of 16 times in November, while 12 have been played in October, three in August, five in December and two in January (2006 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl). Of the 67 overtime contests, 33 have been ACC games while 34 nonconference games have gone into overtime. The home team has a 37-22 advantage in the 59 games played on campus. The team which wins the toss has a 36-31 record. Fifty-one of the games were decided in the first overtime with 11 games in double overtime and five in triple overtime.
