## Louisville Hosts 2nd-Ranked Florida State in Key Atlantic Showdown Virginia at Georgia Tech; Pitt Hosts No. 24 Duke; UNC at Miami in Pivotal Coastal Clashes Virginia Tech Hosts Boston College; Syracuse Hosts NC State

Three ACC teams are ranked in both the Associated Press and the Coaches' Amway Top 25 national polls...In AP, **Florida State** is ranked second followed by No. 22 **Clemson** and No. 24 **Duke**...In the Coaches poll, FSU is also No. 2, with Clemson ranked 21st nationally and Duke 24th... Two others are among those receiving votes in the Coaches poll in **Georgia Tech** and **Louisville**...Five ACC teams are bowl eligible in **FSU**, **Clemson**, **Louisville**, **Duke** and **Georgia Tech**...With wins this week, **Boston College** and **Miami** could also become bowl eligible...**Florida State** and **Louisville** headline Week 10 of the ACC's Road to Charlotte as the Atlantic Division rivals square off on a Thursday night nationally televised contest at Papa John's Cardinal Stadium in Louisville (7:30 p.m., ESPN)...The No. 2-ranked Seminoles, coached by **Jimbo Fisher**, have won an ACC-record and current NCAA-best 23 consecutive games, and face the Cardinals in Louisville for the first time since the then fourth-ranked Noles dropped a 26-20 overtime decision to the Cardinals on a Thursday night ESPN game in 2002...The Seminoles are

led by sophomore **QB Jameis Winston**, who is 11th nationally in pass efficiency (160.0), and **WR Rashad Greene**, who leads the ACC in receptions per game (7.4), receiving yards per game (113.0) and average yards on punt returns (12.3)...**Louisville**, coached by **Bobby Petrino**, counters with the nation's No. 1 defense in total yards and rushing yards led by **S Gerod Holliman** and **LB Lorenzo Mauldin**, and an improving offense which has been boosted by the return to health of **WR Devante Parker**, **RB Michael Dyer** and **QB Will Gardner**...The Cardinals have an impressive record of 26-1 at home under Petrino...Florida State has what amounts to a two-game lead in the Atlantic Division...But it is a different story in the ACC's Coastal Division...24th-ranked Duke sits atop the Coastal standings with a 2-1 ACC record, but the Blue Devils are chased by no fewer than five teams with two losses, including **Georgia Tech** (3-2), **Miami** (2-2), **North Carolina** (2-2), **Pitt** (2-2) and **Virginia** (2-2)...The Blue Devils, coached by **David Cutcliffe**, will

have a chance to solidify their position this Saturday when they travel to Pittsburgh, Pa., to meet Pitt at Heinz Field (Noon, ESPNU)...**Duke** is led by **QB Anthony Boone** and **WR Jamison Crowder**...Boone has led Duke to a 16-3 record as its starting QB, 16-1 in the regular season...Crowder has 238 career receptions and needs just three to move into second-place on the ACC's career reception list...Duke has won 14 of its last 17 games, including 14 of 15 in regular season play...**Pitt**, coached by **Paul Chryst**, is led by **RB James Conner**, who leads the ACC this week and is ninth nationally in rushing yards per game (134.9) and leads the ACC in scoring (10.5) and **WR Tyler Boyd**, who is third in the ACC in receptions per game (5.6 avg.)...The Panthers are 17th nationally in total defense and 19th in rushing offense...Duke is making its first appearance in Pittsburgh since 1975...A few miles South in Miami Gardens, Fla., two of

## This Week In ACC Football

### The ACC On Sirius/XM Satellite Radio

The first intercollegiate athletics conference to reach agreement to have its sports broadcast on satellite radio, the Atlantic Coast Conference begins its 11th season in its partnership with Sirius/XM Radio. Since 2004, the ACC has had its football and men's basketball games broadcast over XM or Sirius Satellite Radio. In addition to the ACC Football Championship Game, Sirius/XM also broadcasts the ACC Men's and Women's Basketball Tournaments and the ACC Baseball Tournament.

the hotter teams in the ACC will meet head on at Sun Life Stadium (12:30 pm; split ACC Network)...The Miami Hurricanes, coached by **Al Golden**, are coming off an impressive 30-6 demolition of Virginia Tech last Thursday night, have won three of their last four games and are facing an explosive **North Carolina** team, coached **Larry Fedora**, that has won two straight games against Coastal foes Georgia Tech and Virginia...The Hurricanes are led by mercurial **RB Duke Johnson**, true freshman **QB Brad Kaaya** and **LB Denzel Perryman**...Johnson, who is averaging 7.5 yards per carry this year, is coming off a career-high 249 rushing yards against Virginia Tech...Kaaya is third in the ACC in passing yards per game (237) and pass efficiency (153.0), and is tied for conference lead in TD passes (17)...Perryman had 11 tackles and a forced fumble against the Hokies...The Tar Heels feature an offense averaging 37.4 points per game behind junior **QB Marquise Williams**, who is second in the ACC in total offense, averaging 316.5 yards per game and is UNC's leading passer and rusher (497 yds), and sophomore **WRs Ryan Switzer** and **Mack Hollins** (21.3 yds/catch)...Miami has won three of the last four in the series between the two teams, but North Carolina captured the last meeting in Miami, an 18-14 victory in 2012...The final Coastal battle of the day has **Georgia Tech**, coached by **Paul Johnson**, hosting **Virginia** at Bobby Dodd Stadium in Atlanta (3:30 pm, ESPNU)...The Jackets, who are coming off perhaps their most impressive performance of the year in a 56-28 win over Pitt, rank third nationally in rushing offense and are led by sophomore **QB Justin Thomas**, senior **WR DeAndre Smelter** and sophomore **LB Paul Davis**...Thomas keyed an offense that piled up 612 yards, including 462 yards on the ground against the Panthers and forced and recovered six Pitt fumbles on defense...Thomas ranks fourth in the ACC in rushing (717 yds) and has a pass efficiency rating of 154.96...Smelter is averaging 23.1 yards per catch on his 20 receptions while Davis had three TFLs and two forced fumbles against Pitt...The Cavaliers, coached by **Mike London**, are coming off back-to-back heartbreaking losses to Duke and North Carolina by a combined total of just eight points...Virginia is led by senior **RB Kevin Parks**, **QB Greyson Lambert** and the DE combination of junior **Eli Harold** and sophomore **Max Valles**...Parks is the ACC's leading career rusher with 3,087 yards...Lambert threw for 261 yards against UNC and Harold and Valles have combined for 12.0 sacks, while Harold leads the ACC in tackles for loss per game (1.50/gm)...Georgia Tech has won four of the last five meetings between the two schools with UVa's last win in Atlanta coming in 2008...In Syracuse, N.Y., the Orange of Coach **Scott Shafer** host Atlantic Division rival **NC State**, which is coached by **Dave Doeren**, at the Carrier

Dome (3 p.m., RSN)...The Wolfpack are led by junior **QB Jacoby Brissett**, who is third in the ACC in total offense (248.0 yds/gm) and fifth in pass efficiency (141.2), and **RB Matt Dayes**, who is fourth in the conference in all-purpose yardage (117.8 yds/gm)...Syracuse will counter with an offense that has been given a boost by a pair of true freshman in **QB AJ Long** and **WR Steve Ishmael** as well as a physical defense, led by **LB Cameron Lynch**...Lynch is fifth in the ACC in sacks (5.5) and 10th in TFLs (10.5)...There is also one interdivisional matchup which has **Boston College** of the Atlantic Division travelling to Blacksburg, Va., to face **Virginia Tech** at Lane Stadium (12:30 pm, split ACC Network)...BC, which can become bowl eligible with a win over the Hokies, is coached by **Steve Addazio**, while the Hokies, coached by **Frank Beamer**, need two more victories to reach bowl eligibility...The Eagles are led by **QB Tyler Murphy** on offense and the LB tandem of **Steve Daniels** and **Josh Keyes** on defense...Murphy is third in the ACC in rushing (105.4) and second nationally among QBs while Daniels and Keyes lead a defensive unit that is ranked eighth nationally in total defense (299.8) and sixth nationally in defense against the run (91.4 yds/gm)...Virginia Tech will counter with an offense led by **QB Michael Brewer** and **TB Marshawn Williams** and a defensive unit led by **CB Kendall Fuller** and **DE Ken Eckanem**...Brewer is fifth in the ACC in pass yards a game, while Williams is coming off his second 100-yard rushing effort...Fuller leads the ACC and is tied for fifth nationally in passes defended (1.50/gm) and Eckanem is tied for fifth in the league for sacks and seventh in tackles for loss...BC snapped a four-game Hokie winning streak with a 34-27 win in Chestnut Hill last season, but the Eagles' last win in Blacksburg occurred in 2007...Saturday's game will be the fifth interdivisional matchup of the year with the Atlantic and Coastal splitting the first four games...Since the ACC went to divisional play in 2005, the Atlantic has held an 89-82 (.520) advantage.

#### ACC Has Four Named Jim Thorpe Award Semifinalists

The ACC had four defensive backs selected among the 15 semifinalists announced this week for the 2104 Jim Thorpe Award, which is presented annually to nation's top defensive back. Named as semifinalists were **Jeremy Cash** of Duke, **P.J. Williams** of Florida State, **Gerod Hollimon** of Louisville and **Kendall Fuller** of Virginia Tech.

#### ACC Has Two Named To Butkus Award Semifinal List

Clemson senior **LB Stephone Anthony** and Miami senior **LB Denzel Perryman** are two of the 15 semifinalists named today for the 2014 Butkus Award. The Butkus Award is presented annually to the nation's top linebacker.



# The ACC By The Numbers

**.963** - The winning percentage at home for Louisville under current head coach **Bobby Petrino**. Petrino has guided the Cardinals to a 26-1 mark when playing in Louisville in his four-plus years as head coach, the only loss coming to Memphis in 2003. Under Petrino, the Cardinals have a 22-game home winning streak heading into Thursday night's prime time contest with Florida State.

**1** - **Louisville's Dee-fense** is indeed No. 1. The Cardinals stop troops lead the nation in total defense (245.8) and rushing defense (66.9) and are second for most pass interceptions (15). The Cardinals are also second in third-down conversion percentage defense (.240) and team pass efficiency defense (96.24) and are fourth in scoring defense.

**1.00** - The Cardinals' junior **S Gerod Holliman** is tied for the nation's lead in pass interceptions with eight in eight games, an average of 1.00 per contest, with Senquez Golson of Mississippi.

**1.000** - Three ACC placekickers remain perfect on their field goal attempts through the first nine weeks of the season: Florida State's **Roberto Aguayo** (14 of 14); Wake Forest's **Mike Weaver** (9 of 9); and Duke's **Ross Martin**.

**3** - **Florida State's** win over fifth-ranked Notre Dame on Oct. 18 was the third win by an ACC team over a Top 10 non-conference opponent this year. No other conference has more than one this year. Earlier this year Virginia Tech defeated eighth-ranked Ohio State and Boston College defeated ninth-ranked Southern California.

**4.5** - The number of tackles for loss by Boston College sophomore **DE Kevin Kavalec** in the Eagles' win over Wake Forest. Kavalec had 2 sacks and 10 tackles overall, accounting for 23 yards in losses. That ties for the third highest total in the nation this year.

**5** - The number of ACC teams that are currently bowl eligible. **Clemson, Duke, Florida State, Georgia Tech and Louisville** have all qualified for postseason play. With wins this weekend both **Boston College** and **Miami** could also claim bowl eligibility.

**6** - In Saturday's 56-28 win over Pitt, **Georgia Tech** forced and recovered six fumbles, the most for any team in the NCAA's FBS.

**7th** - When **Georgia Tech** rushed for 465 yards against a Pitt team which had been allowing just 112 yards a game on the ground, the Yellow Jackets recorded the 7th-best team rushing total in a game between ACC teams game in league history and 11th-highest total by an ACC team overall.

**9.8** - The average number of tackles for loss for **Clemson's defense** this year. The Tigers lead the nation in team tackles for loss after recording 12 for 42 yards in losses against Syracuse.

**11** - After rushing for 111 yards on 25 carries against North Carolina, Virginia senior **RB Kevin Parks** has now topped the 100-yard rushing mark 11 times in a game in his career, the most of any active ACC player. Parks also topped the 3,000-yard rushing mark for his career and now has 3,087 yards, more than any other active ACC player.

**21.3** - The average yards per catch for UNC sophomore **WR Mack Hollins** this year. Hollins has 26 catches for 555 yards and seven touchdowns. Hollins had just two catches against Virginia, but both were scoring plays of 57 and 63 yards, totalling 120 yards on just two catches.

**23** - **Florida State** has won 23 consecutive games, the nation's longest current winning streak. The streak is also the ACC's longest winning streak, breaking a mark set by the Seminoles during the 1999 and 2000 seasons. FSU has also won 19 consecutive ACC games, dating back to a 17-16 loss at NC State in 2012.

**Also 23** - Florida State sophomore **PK Roberto Aguayo** has been successful on his last 23 field goal attempts, dating back to the Wake Forest game of last year. The ACC record is 27, set by NC State's Marc Primanti during the 1995-96 seasons. Aguayo's current streak is the second-best in league history.

**29.0** - The number of career sacks for Clemson All-American **DE Vic Beasley**. He leads the nation among all active FBS players in career QB sacks, and, after recording one against the Louisville on Oct. 11, he is ranked seventh nationally this year, averaging 1.00 per game. Beasley is tied with Wake Forest's Calvin Pace for 8th place on the all-time ACC sack list.

**52** - The number of victories to which Florida State head coach **Jimbo Fisher** has led the Seminoles now in his fifth season as head coach in Tallahassee. His winning percentage of .839 is the best of any ACC coach with three or more seasons.

**105.4** - The per-game rushing average for Boston College **QB Tyler Murphy**. Murphy is on a pace to shatter the ACC single-season mark of rushing yardage for a quarterback set of 1,061 in 2001 by Clemson's Woodrow Dantzler. Murphy leads all quarterbacks in the FBS in total rushing yards (843).

**134.9** - The average number of rushing yards this year for Pitt running back **James Conner**. Conner has rushed for 1,079 yards in 182 carries--a 5.9 per carry average. He ranks eighth nationally in yards per game and in total rushing yards and is tied for 9th in scoring, averaging 10.5 points per game.

**154.96** - The pass efficiency rating for Georgia Tech sophomore **QB Justin Thomas**. Thomas, who has had three games in which he has had a 200 or better pass efficiency rating, would rank 3rd in the ACC and 19th nationally if he had enough pass attempts to qualify. Thomas is five pass attempts short of the NCAA minimum (15 per game).

**238** - The number of career receptions for Duke senior **WR Jamison Crowder**. Crowder moved into third on the ACC career receptions list with eight catches against Virginia, and is two behind Sammy Watkins, of Clemson (240, 2011-13), for second place.

**249** - The rushing yardage total for Miami's **Duke Johnson** on 29 carries (8.6 avg.) in the Hurricanes' 30-6 win over Virginia Tech. It is the most yards by an ACC running back this fall; the most ever by a Virginia Tech opponent; and tied for the 23rd-best total in ACC history.

**251** - **Virginia Tech** extended its streak of consecutive games without a shutout, but just barely. The Hokies scored on a fourth-down and 10, 14-yard TD pass play with just 1:30 remaining in Miami's 30-6 victory.

**3,256** - The number of career pass receiving yards for Florida State senior **WR Rashad Greene**. Greene is in sixth place on the ACC career list, 62 yards behind fifth-place Clarkston Hines of Duke.

# 2014 ACC FB Game Summaries -- Oct. 23-25

## **Miami 30, Virginia Tech 6**

RB Duke Johnson ran for 249 yards and scored two touchdowns, and the Hurricanes used three second-quarter touchdowns to take control of the game in downing the Hokies before an ESPN national television audience on Thursday night in Blacksburg, Va. Johnson recorded the best rushing performance ever by an opponent at Lane Stadium, surpassing Wake Forest's Josh Harris, who rushed for 241 yards in the Demon Deacons' 2010 loss to the Hokies. Johnson's 249 yards came on 29 carries (8.6 yards per carry). Miami (5-3, 2-2) used a field goal to take a first-quarter lead and then grabbed a 10-0 lead on a 3-yard touchdown run by RB Gus Edwards in the second quarter. Johnson's 24-yard touchdown run with 6:21 left in the first half pushed the lead to 17-0, and his 22-yard touchdown reception from QB Brad Kaaya with three seconds left in the first half gave Miami a 24-0 lead at halftime. The Hurricanes rushed for 364 yards in the game – the most ever against a Frank Beamer coached team. In addition to Johnson's performance, Edwards rushed for 115 yards. Miami finished with 456 yards of total offense. Virginia Tech (4-4, 1-3) picked up its lone score with 1:30 left in the game. On fourth-and-10 from the Miami 14, backup QB Mike Leal – inserted for the final series – threw a 14-yard touchdown pass to WR Isaiah Ford. Tech went for two points and didn't get it, but the touchdown extended the Hokies' scoring streak to 251 straight games.

## **North Carolina 28, Virginia 27**

Freshman QB Mitch Trubisky threw a 16-yard touchdown pass to WR T.J. Thorpe on his only play of the game with 4:05 remaining, and the Tar Heels (4-4, 2-2) recovered their ensuing onside kick and ran out the clock for their second straight ACC win. Trubisky came up with his big touchdown throw after entering the game for starting QB Marquise Williams, whose had to leave the game in accordance with NCAA rules after his helmet came off on the previous play. Williams finished the day with 308 yards of total offense and threw a pair of touchdown passes, both to WR Mack Hollins. The scoring plays to Hollins covered 57 and 63 yards. Williams added a 52-yard touchdown run. UNC's key defensive play came from DT Nazair Jones, whose interception and 20-yard return set up Trubisky's winning touchdown pass. RB Kevin Parks rushed for 111 yards and two touchdowns to lead Virginia (4-4, 2-2). Parks recorded his 11th career 100-yard rushing game (fourth all-time at UVa) and ranks fourth all-time on the school's rushing touchdown list with 29. QB Greysen Lambert threw a 31-yard scoring strike to WR Cannan Severin on the Cavaliers' first possession of the game, and PK Ian Frye connected on field goals of 31 and 37 yards.

## **Georgia Tech 56, Pitt 28**

Georgia Tech took advantage of Pitt turnovers on its first five possessions to build a 28-0 first-quarter lead and went on to post a key ACC Coastal Division win. The Yellow Jackets (6-2, 3-2) earned bowl eligibility and will now look to extend the nation's third longest active bowl streak to 18 consecutive postseason appearances. Georgia Tech broke the Heinz Field college scoring record for an opponent, topping the previous record of 54 points set by Rutgers in 2008. Jackets AB Broderick Snoddy set career highs for rushing yards with 82 and rushing touchdowns with three. RB Synjin Days rushed for career-high 110 yards – his career-first 100-yard rushing game. Georgia Tech's five fumble recoveries in the first 15 minutes tied an FBS record for one quarter. LB Quayshawn Nealy became the first Yellow Jacket to recover two fumbles in a game since Joe Anoai did it against Tulsa in the 2004 Humanitarian Bowl. The Panthers (4-4, 2-2) saw sophomore RB James Conner rush for 120 yards and three touchdowns on 10 carries. Conner now has 1,079 rushing yards and became the 13th player in program history to rush for over 1,000 yards in a season. Conner reached the 1,000-yard mark in his eighth game of the season, tied for the second fewest games needed to reach the milestone at Pitt.

## **Boston College 23, Wake Forest 17**

The visiting Eagles (5-3, 2-2) built a 23-3 lead midway through the fourth quarter, then held off the Demon Deacons for an ACC Atlantic Division road win in Saturday's game at BB&T Field. RB Jon Hilliman rushed for 101 yards and a pair of touchdowns. QB Tyler Murphy completed 11 of 15 passes for 165 yards and a 37-yard touchdown pass to WR Shakim Phillips. Wake Forest (2-6, 0-3) closed within 23-10 on WR E.J. Scott's 3-yard touchdown run with 8:03 to play. Demon Deacon CB Brad Watson then recovered a fumble at the Eagles' 15-yard line, setting up RB Isaiah Robinson's 1-yard touchdown run that made it a six-point game. Wake Forest got the ball back one more time with just under three minutes remaining with a chance to drive for the winning score, but Boston College FS Justin Simmons picked off a pass at the Eagles' 37-yard line with 2:06 left to seal the win. Wake Forest freshman QB John Wolford was 22-of-30 for 242 yards with the one interception. Boston College's defense had 13 tackles for lost yardage, including 4.5 by sophomore DE Kevin Kavalec. Kavalec had a career-high 10 tackles in all, including a pair of quarterback sacks.

## **#21/20 Clemson 16, Syracuse 6**

The Tigers (6-2, 5-1) remained within striking range in the ACC Atlantic Division and earned bowl eligibility with Saturday night's hard-fought win over the visiting Orange. RB Wayne Gallman finished with a career-high 28 carries for 101 yards, the most rushing yards by a Tiger this season. WR Mike Williams led the Tigers in receiving yards with 72, and WR Artavis Scott had seven receptions. The Clemson defense played strong again, keeping the Orange off the scoreboard in the second half. The Tigers had four sacks, a significant accomplishment considering Syracuse had allowed only five sacks all season entering the game. The Tigers had 12 tackles for loss and held Syracuse to 3-of-16 on third-down conversions. The defense also forced three turnovers, with interceptions by S Robert Smith and LB Stephone Anthony along with a recovered fumble by CB Mackensie Alexander. The lost fumble was the first by Syracuse in over 278 snaps, which dated back to its Sept. 20 game against Maryland. The Orange (1-3, 3-5) fell short despite forcing four turnovers and limiting the Tigers to one touchdown. RB Prince-Tyson Gulley led the Orange offensively, rushing for 80 yards on a season-high 18 carries. LB Cameron Lynch led the Orange in tackles for the sixth time this season with 10, two of which went for losses.

## Three from Miami and Clemson recognized after key division victories

Three student-athletes each from Miami and Clemson were recognized as the Atlantic Coast Conference announced its Football Players of the Week following the games of Thursday night and Saturday. Miami running back Duke Johnson earned ACC Offensive Back of the Week honors following his stellar performance in last Thursday night's 30-6 win at Virginia Tech. Hurricanes center Shane McDermott was named the ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week. On the defensive side, Jermaine Grace was recognized as ACC Co-Linebacker of the Week. Clemson's Stephone Anthony was named ACC Co-Linebacker of the Week following the Tigers' 16-6 win over Syracuse. Tigers place-kicker Ammon Lakip earned ACC Specialist of the Week honors, and freshman running back Wayne Gallman was named the ACC Rookie of the Week. North Carolina's Mack Hollins was tabbed as ACC Receiver of the Week for his play in the Tar Heels' 28-27 road victory at Virginia. Boston College defensive end Kevin Kavalec earned ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week following his performance in a 23-17 victory at Wake Forest. ACC Defensive Back of the Week honors went to Georgia Tech safety Isaiah Johnson, who made several big plays in the Yellow Jackets' 56-28 win at Pitt.

### OFFENSIVE BACK – Duke Johnson, Miami, Jr., RB, 5-9, 206, Miami, Fla.

Johnson rushed for a career-high 249 yards on 29 carries to lead the Hurricanes to a 30-6 victory over Virginia Tech on ESPN's Thursday Night Football. Johnson became the first Miami running back to surpass 200 yards rushing in a game since Willis McGahee did so against Virginia Tech in 2002, and just the fourth player in school history overall. Johnson's 249 yards rushing were the second-most ever in a single game by a Hurricane and moved him past the 1,000-yard milestone for the season. In addition, Johnson caught his first touchdown pass of the year and led the team with 37 receiving yards.

### OFFENSIVE LINEMAN – Shane McDermott, Miami, Sr., C, 6-4, 296, Lake Worth, Fla.

McDermott anchored an offensive line that allowed the Hurricanes to rush for a season-best 364 yards in the win over Virginia Tech. Miami did not allow a quarterback sack in the game. In addition, McDermott graded out at 94 percent and registered three pancake blocks.

### RECEIVER – Mack Hollins, North Carolina, So., WR, 6-3, 200, Rockville, Md.

Hollins did a bit of everything in UNC's 28-27 win over Virginia. He had a 57-yard touchdown reception in the first quarter and a 63-yard scoring catch in the second quarter to finish with a career-high 120 yards receiving. Hollins also recovered an onside kick by Nick Weiler with just over four minutes to play, moments after UNC had taken its first lead of the game. In addition, Hollins twice downed UNC punts inside the Virginia 2-yard line.

### DEFENSIVE LINEMAN – Kevin Kavalec, Boston College, So., DE, 6-2, 256, Middleburg Heights, Ohio

Kavalec led the Eagles with a career-high 10 tackles, including eight solo stops, in BC's 23-17 win over Wake Forest on Saturday. He recorded two sacks for a loss of 14 yards, becoming the only BC player this season to have two sacks in one game. Of his 10 tackles, 4.5 were for loss, totaling 23 yards. He now ranks second on the team with 7.5 tackles for loss.

### CO-LINEBACKER – Stephon Anthony, Clemson, Sr., LB, 6-2, 245, Polkton, N.C.

Anthony started Saturday night's 16-6 win over visiting Syracuse by recording a six-yard sack on the opening play, and then followed with a caused fumble and an interception. He finished with seven tackles overall. His interception and eight-yard return came after the Tigers had turned the ball over and gave the momentum back to Clemson in the close game. He also had a quarterback hurry.

### CO-LINEBACKER – Jermaine Grace, Miami, So., LB, 6-1, 210, Miami Gardens, Fla.

Grace played a key role on a defensive unit that limited Virginia Tech to 262 yards of total offense. Against the Hokies, Grace tallied four tackles (three solo) and registered a sack for the second-consecutive game. He also had a pair of fumble recoveries in the third quarter, which eliminated any chance of a Virginia Tech comeback.

### DEFENSIVE BACK – Isaiah Johnson, Georgia Tech, Sr.-r, S, 6-2, 213, Tyrone, Ga.

Johnson made a career-high 14 tackles – eight solo – and recorded both a forced fumble and fumble recovery in Georgia Tech's 56-28 road win at Pitt. Johnson was part of Tech's defense that forced six Pitt turnovers – tied for the most by an opponent in school history. It marked his sixth career fumble recovery and his third career forced fumble.

### SPECIALIST – Ammon Lakip, Clemson, Jr., PK, 5-10, 200, Johns Creek, Ga.

Lakip scored 10 of Clemson's 16 points in the 16-6 win over Syracuse. The junior made all three of his field goal tries, connecting on attempts from 38, 18 and 41 yards for a perfect showing in a game that was close throughout. His field goal from 41 yards out with 3:30 left in the third quarter gave Clemson a 9-6 lead.

### ROOKIE – Wayne Gallman, Clemson, Fr., RB, 6-1, 200, Loganville, Ga.

Gallman became the first Clemson running back this season to gain over 100 yards in a game in the Tigers' victory over Syracuse. He finished the day with 28 rushes for 101 yards and made two receptions for 12 yards. Clemson controlled the ball for the last 8:17 of the game, and Gallman carried on nine of the plays, converting once on third down and then on fourth down.

# The ACC & ESPN Thursday Night



## The ACC & ESPN Thursday Night: A Great College and ACC Tradition

When Louisville hosts Florida State this Thursday night (7:30 p.m.) at Heinz Field in Pittsburgh in an important Coastal Division battle, the game will be the 91st contest involving an ACC team on ESPN on Thursday night. It will also mark the 14th appearance for Florida State while Louisville will be making its 19th appearance and hosting its 11th game. This will be the first Thursday night meeting between the two schools as ACC members. The Cardinals' previous 18 appearances were as a member of the Big East.

Louisville has met Florida State on ESPN's Thursday Night package before, though, hosting the FSU in a 2002 contest that resulted in the Cardinals scoring an overtime upset win over the then fourth-ranked Seminoles, 26-20.

Virginia Tech has won more games (20) on ESPN Thursday Night than any other ACC team. The Hokies of Frank Beamer Have already made two appearances this year on the package, losing at Pitt two weeks ago (21-16) and last Thursday at home to Miami (30-6). The Hokies are 20-9 overall and 9-3 in away games on ESPN Thursday night.

Georgia Tech has hosted more Thursday night games than any other ACC school, a total of 19. The Yellow Jackets actually began the Conference's Thursday night tradition, which, more often than not, has featured high drama. Tech hosted Virginia on Sept. 19, 1991, at Bobby Dodd Stadium in Atlanta, utilizing a 34-yard field goal by Scott Sisson on the game's final play to record a 24-21 victory. The Yellow Jackets are 11-15 overall.

Miami has the highest winning percentage (.857) of any ACC team on ESPN Tursdays, having posted a 18-3 mark, including a 7-2 record on the road. The Hurricanes have been better at home, with an 11-1 record in the Old Orange Bowl (8-0) and at Sun Life Stadium (3-1). The only UM loss at home came in 2011, when Virginia snapped the Canes' 10-game home win streak with a 28-21 verdict.

In all, after this week's game, ACC teams will have made 159 appearances on ESPN's Thursday night package.

After the Hokies and Yellow Jackets, Miami leads in total appearances with 21, followed by Pitt (20), NC State (19), Louisville (18), Florida State (13), Boston College (12), Virginia (12), Clemson (12) and North Carolina (12).

When Maryland was a member of the ACC, the Terrapins played in 13 Thuirsday ESPN games, 10 of them at home.

There have been many other great moments in the series, including the 2007 game when 2nd-ranked Boston College rallied to beat 8th-ranked Virginia Tech, 14-10, behind a pair of touchdown passes from QB Matt Ryan in the game's final two minutes and 11 seconds. That game still stands as the only ESPN Thursday night meeting of ACC opponents that were both ranked in the Top Ten nationally.

The 2009 season featured a pair of thrillers both involving

North Carolina. The Tar Heels and Seminoles were involved in an offensive gut-wrencher, as FSU overcame a 24-6 third quarter deficit to capture a 30-27 triumph. A week later, UNC turned the tables, upsetting 14th-ranked Virginia Tech, 20-17, on the game's final play, a 22-yard field goal by UNC placekicker Casey Barth.

The 2010 match-up between Georgia Tech and Virginia Tech was also a classic; a see-saw battle which featured a dramatic 90-yard kickoff return for a touchdown by the Hokies' David Wilson with 2:23 remaining as the deciding play. Perhaps the most memorable Thursday night moment and biggest upset on the Thursday night ESPN package was 24th-ranked Virginia's dramatic upset of 2nd-ranked Florida State in 1995. That game snapped the Seminoles' 29-game Conference winning streak, which began when FSU joined the ACC in 1992. Miami still has claim to the highest-rated game on Thursday night, when it met 10th-ranked Houston in an early season showdown in 1991. The Hurricanes and Cougars drew a 6.5 national rating as Miami took a lopsided 40-10 triumph.

The highest-rated Thursday ESPN battle between two ACC teams was the 1995 Virginia-Florida State telecast, which resulted in a 6.1 rating. New ACC member Louisville recorded a pair of strong ratings while a member of the Big East in 2006, a 5.33 in downing West Virginia and a 5.03 in losing to Rutgers.

This week's game is the third of five ACC Thursday ESPN contests this year. Virginia Tech lost, 21-16, at Pitt on Oct. 16 and at home to Miami on Oct. 23, 30-6. Florida State will travel to Louisville this week; Wake Forest will host Clemson on Nov. 6; and Duke will host North Carolina on Nov. 20. The Duke-UNC matchup will be the Blue Devils first appearance on ESPN Thursday night in 18 years and their first home ESPN Thursday night contest in 20 seasons since 1994.

Two ACC games have been televised by ESPNU on Thursday night. Wake Forest hosted Vanderbilt in 2005 and Clemson and Temple met in Charlotte in 2006 and new member Louisville appeared on ESPNU as a member of the Big East in 2011.

## FSU's Fisher Joining Select Company

After just four seasons as head coach at Florida State, Jimbo Fisher joined some select company among ACC football coaches. Fisher compiled a 45-10 record (.818) during that time. His winning percentage put him in 2nd place among all ACC head coaches after four seasons, ahead of such prominent figures as NC State's Lou Holtz, Clemson's Danny Ford, Maryland's Ralph Friedgen and Georgia Tech's Bobby Ross. The best mark recorded by an ACC head coach in his first four years

in the league was by Fisher's predecessor at FSU, Bobby Bowden, who posted a 43-5-1 record (.888). Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer has the 3rd-best record at 42-11-0 (.792).

## Clemson's Swinney, Georgia Tech's Johnson In Good Company As ACC Head Coaches

After their first six seasons at Clemson and Georgia Tech, head coaches Dabo Swinney and Paul Johnson have recorded excellent numbers. Only five other coaches in league history have had a better winning percentage after six seasons than Swinney (.689) and only three have won more games. Only seven other coaches in league history have won more games (47) than has Johnson after his first six seasons in the league and he ranks 14th in winning percentage.



## Home Sweet Home for Tigers' Swinney, Noles' Fisher

Clemson head coach Dabo Swinney and Florida State head coach Jimbo Fisher have both enjoyed coaching in the cozy and imposing confines of the Tigers' home field, also known as Death Valley, and the Seminoles' home turf, Doak Campbell Stadium. Now, beginning his seventh season as head coach of the Tigers, Swinney's teams won 22 of the first 25 home ACC games, a winning percentage of .880, third-best among ACC coaches who have coached a minimum of four seasons. He is only behind former Tiger coach Ken Hatfield, who posted a 12-1-1 mark in four seasons (.893) and Fisher, who is 16-2 (.889) against league foes. They are both just ahead of legendary FSU coach Bobby Bowden, who also won more ACC home games than any other coach, with 62 triumphs in his 18 years in the league.

## Program Builder Clawson Begins New Era at Wake Forest

Wake Forest new head coach Dave Clawson is in his first year as the Demon Deacons' head coach, but he is no rookie leading a program. Clawson, now in his 15th season as a head coach, has already re-built three football programs. He ranks fourth in years of experience among head coaches in the ACC, behind only Frank Beamer (34) and Paul Johnson (18). His overall, 92-84-1 (.523) record is more impressive when you take into account that he had to rebuild programs at Fordham, Richmond and Bowling Green, where his combined mark in his final three seasons (nine years total) at each stop was 75-37, a .670 winning percentage.

# Noting the ACC--The Coaches

## Duke Experiencing Success Under National and ACC Coach of the Year David Cutcliffe

David Cutcliffe, the ACC's 2012 and 2013 Coach of the Year, has led the Blue Devils to 35 victories since coming to Durham in 2008. That may not sound like a great record, except when you consider that it is more wins than the Blue Devils totalled in the 15 seasons before Cutcliffe came to Durham.

■ Duke's 2014 team is 6-1, and will be going to its third straight bowl game for the first time in school history.

■ Duke's 2013 team had 10 wins, the most in school history. Duke was Coastal Division champions for the first time since the ACC went to Divisional play in 2005 and the Blue Devils went to back-to-back bowl games for the first time in school history, dropping a last-second contest (52-48) to Texas A&M in the Chick-fil-A Bowl.

■ Duke made its first appearance in the BCS Standings on Nov. 25, 2013, getting ranked 24th.

■ In the five-plus years that Cutcliffe has been in Durham, he has already mentored a pair of quarterbacks who finished their careers ranked in the ACC's top seven of career passing yardage. **Thaddeus Lewis** (2006-09) threw for 10,065 yards, the second-highest total in league history and **Sean Renfree** (2009-12), threw for 9,465 career yards, the 7th-best total by an ACC player.

■ Also, under his guidance, Duke **WR Conner Vernon** became the all-time leading pass receiver in ACC history setting conference career marks for pass receptions (283) and pass reception yardage (3,749) with senior **Jamison Crowder** set to challenge those marks.

■ Cutcliffe was honored in 2013 by being named National Coach of the Year by five different outlets--the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA), The Maxwell Football Club, The Bobby Dodd Foundation, the Walter Camp Foundation and The Sporting News (Co-Coach of the Year).

## Under Steve Addazio Boston College Becomes One of the Top Five Most Improved Teams

Under head coach **Steve Addazio**, Boston College in 2013 became on the nation's most improved football teams. Inheriting a program which had posted a 6-18 record over the past two seasons, including a 2-10 mark in 2012, Addazio led the Eagles to a 7-6 record and into the Independence Bowl in his first season on The Heights.

Addazio's physical style of football and a veteran offensive line allowed TB Andre Williams to set ACC single-game, multi game and single-season rushing records and to win the Doak Walker Award as the nation's top running back. Williams became the first running back in ACC history to top 2,000 rushing yards in a season (2,177).

The four-and-a-half win improvement from 2012 was the fifth-best turnaround in the FBS last year, bettered only by Auburn (8), Missouri (6) and Michigan State and UNLV (5 each).

## UNC Has An Offensive and Special Teams Mindset Under Larry Fedora

North Carolina Head Coach **Larry Fedora**'s fast-paced offense had his team scoring at a school-record pace in his first year in Chapel Hill. UNC ranked 8th nationally in scoring offense in 2012, averaging 40.6 points a game while also ranked 14th nationally in total offense,



■ Now in his third season as head coach at UNC, North Carolina has topped the 40-point mark 13 times and bettered 30 points 22 times. His Tar Heel teams have averaged 36.7 points per game. In the previous 13 seasons before Fedora came to Chapel Hill, UNC had averaged just 23.3 points per game, a 14-point difference.

■ Also, in his first two-plus seasons, UNC has averaged 451.7 yards per game of total offense. That compares with the previous 13 seasons when the Tar Heels averaged just 349.25 yards per game of offense.

■ Fedora's first two Tar Heel teams both bettered the previous school mark for scoring. UNC scored a school-record 487 points in 2012 and tallied 425 points in 2013. Previously, the school had only topped 400 points once (1993) in its history when it scored 421 points.

■ Fedora's 2013 team set a school record for most touchdowns by returns with eight, including five by punt return, two by kickoff return and one interception runback.

■ Now in his third season in Chapel Hill, Fedora's teams have had 15 returns for touchdowns including eight by punt return and three by kickoff return.

■ In 2012 and 2013 UNC returned 65 punts, averaging 16.0 per return. As a freshman in 2013, Ryan Switzer tied an NCAA FBS single-season record and set an ACC standard when he returned five punts for scores last year.

■ Now in his third season at Chapel Hill, UNC has scored 60 or more points three times, including an 80-point outburst against Old Dominion.

■ By posting records of 8-4 and 7-6 in his two years in Chapel Hill, he becomes the first UNC coach since Ray Wolf in 1936-37 to post winning records in each of his first two seasons.

## Florida State Has Nation's Longest Current Win Streak

Florida State has the nation's longest current winning streak of 23 games which began in the 2012 ACC Championship. This streak is the longest in ACC history surpassing FSU's previous mark of 17 set during the 1999-2000 seasons. The Seminoles still need two more victories to reach the NCAA all-time Top 20, which has five teams tied for 19th with 25 consecutive

### Panther Soph Is 9th Nationally in Rushing



Pitt sophomore RB James Conner is enjoying quite a "run" as the Panthers starting running back. Including last year's Little Caesar's Pizza Bowl, over his last nine games, the Erie, Pa., native has run for 1,309 yards in 208 carries (6.3 avg.) and 15 TDs, averaging 145.4 yards per game. This season alone he ranks ninth nationally in rushing yards per game (134.9) and seventh in total rushing yards (1,079), and leads the ACC in scoring (10.5 pts/gm). He is currently on pace to have one of the best rushing seasons in ACC history.

## UM's Johnson 7th in Career Rushing Average

Miami junior RB Duke Johnson (Miami, Fla.) would be in the ACC's career Top 10



List for best career per-carry average with a minimum of 1,000 career yards if he maintains his current pace. Johnson currently has 2,903 career yards on just 423 carries, a 6.86 per-play average. That norm would be the 7th-best career average by an ACC player.

## BC's Tyler Murphy On The Run

*Eagle QB on Pace to Break ACC Rushing Mark for Quarterbacks*

Boston College QB **Tyler Murphy** (Wethersfield, Conn.) is enjoying a successful season as the signal-caller for the Eagles. After rushing for 77 yards on 14 carries against Wake Forest, the graduate student has now accumulated 843 yards in just eight games, a per-game average of 105.4 yards per contest. If maintained throughout the season, that would be an ACC single-season record. Clemson's Woodrow Dantzler currently holds that mark, having rushed for 1,061 yards in 2001 (81.6 avg.). Murphy has already topped the 100-yard mark in rushing yardage three times in a game this season, including a 191-yard effort against 9th-ranked Southern California that was the second-highest single-game effort by the quarterback in ACC history.

## Georgia Tech's Justin Thomas Climbing QB Rushing Ladder

Georgia Tech sophomore QB **Justin Thomas** (Prattville, Ala.) has shown his ability to excel in the run game--he is fourth in the ACC this week in rushing yardage, averaging 89.6 yards a game.

Thomas is second nationally among quarterbacks nationally in yards per game, averaging 89.3. Among QBs, he ranks fourth nationally in yards-per-carry and his total of 717 yards through just eight games is already the 11th-best single-season in ACC history for a quarterback. His pass efficiency rating against Pitt was an impressive 206.48, his third 200-plus pass efficiency rating of the year. His season mark of 154.96 would rank 18th nationally if he had enough pass attempts to qualify.

## ACC 2014 Football Championship Game Legends Class

*Legendary Virginia Coach George Welsh; National Football Foundation College Hall of Famers Derrick Brooks, Hugh Green and Art Monk Headline 2014 Class*

Led by three members of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame, two members of the Pro Football Hall of Fame and one of the most successful coaches in Atlantic Coast Conference history, the ACC announced the 2014 Class of Legends for its 10th Annual Dr Pepper Football Championship Game, which will be played in Charlotte, N.C. on December 6. Leading this year's class are former Virginia and Navy head coach George Welsh (Coaldale Pa.), Florida State's two-time consensus All-American linebacker Derrick Brooks (Pensacola, Fla.), four-time Pitt All-American defensive end Hugh Green (Natchez, Miss.), and Syracuse All-American wide receiver Art Monk (White Plains, N.Y.).

Welsh finished his coaching career as the winningest coach in league history, compiling a 189-132-4 record which included reclamation projects at the U.S. Naval Academy and at Virginia. In his near two-decade stint in Charlottesville, Welsh, a 2004 inductee into the College Hall of Fame, built the Cavaliers into one of the nation's premier football programs, winning seven or more games for 13 consecutive seasons. Brooks, a 2014 inductee into the Pro Football Hall of Fame, is considered one of the greatest players in college and professional football history. The 1993 ACC Defensive Player of the Year, he was named to the NFL's Pro Bowl an astounding 11 times and led FSU to a national championship and Tampa Bay to the NFL title. Green, a 1996 inductee into the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame, is also considered by many to be one of the greatest collegiate players in history. He was a three-time consensus All-American and earned All-America honors in all four of his collegiate seasons for the Panthers. Monk is one of the few players to earn selection to both the College Football Hall of Fame (2012) and the Pro Football Hall of Fame (2008). He ended his 15-year professional career as the first wide receiver in NFL history to top 900 receptions, finishing with 940 career catches.

The group of 14 former gridiron standouts from current ACC schools includes a former ACC Football Player of the Year, an ACC Defensive Player of the Year, 12 former All-Americans, including 10 first-team and six consensus All-American honorees, and 12 players who combined for 118 years in the National Football League.

Joining Welsh, Brooks, Green and Monk are Boston College offensive lineman Chris Snee (Montrose, Pa.), who earned second-team All-America honors (AP) as a senior at guard; Clemson cornerback Donnell Woolford (Fayetteville, N.C.), a consensus All-America and key defensive figure for the Danny Ford-coached Tiger teams in the late 1980s; Duke wide receiver Chris Castor (Cary, N.C.), the first wide receiver to earn Player of the Year honors in ACC history; Georgia Tech offensive lineman John Davis (Ellijay, Ga.), who earned first-team All-America honors as a tackle and as a center for the Yellow Jackets; and Louisville cornerback Frank Minnifield (Lexington, Ky.), who led the nation in kickoff returns and was an excellent cover cornerback for the Cardinals.

Completing the ACC Football Legends Class of 2014 are Miami's Darrin Smith (Miami, Fla.), one of one-third of the famed Hurricane linebacker trio dubbed the "Bermuda Triangle" that helped lead "the U" to a pair of national championships in 1989 and 1991; North Carolina defensive end Greg Ellis (Wendell, N.C.), a two-time All-American who earned consensus All-America honors in 1997 playing for the Mack Brown-coached Tar Heel teams of the mid-1990s; NC State safety Jesse Campbell (Vanceboro, N.C.), a three-time All-ACC and two-time All-America defensive back for Coach Dick Sheridan's teams of the 1980s and 90s; Virginia Tech center Jake Grove (Forest, Va.), a unanimous first-team All-America in 2003 who was the winner of the Rimington Trophy, given annually to the nation's top pivotman; and Wake Forest running back Alan White (Elm City, N.C.), the runner-up for 1961 ACC Player of the Year who led the conference in rushing that year and went on to an award-winning career in athletic administration as director of athletics at Elon University.

### ACC Divisional Tiebreaker

If more than one team in the same division is tied for the best winning percentage in its Conference games, the procedures listed below will be followed to determine the division's representative in the ACC Championship Game:

#### Two-Team Tie:

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall win percentage. (Divisional and non-divisional) and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken from first-to-last using the league's tiebreaking procedures.
4. Overall win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined win percentage vs. all non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based on their order of finish (overall conference win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the higher ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee following the conclusion of regular season games. (If both tied teams are not ranked in the ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee, the higher ranked team in the Amway Coaches Poll (including others receiving votes).
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw. (as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.)

#### Three-Team (or More) Team Tie

(Once a team is eliminated from the tie, the tie-breaker procedures restart for the remaining teams. If the three (or more) team tie can be reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaker format will then be applied.)

1. Combined head-to-head win percentage among the tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall (divisional and non-divisional) Conference win percentage, and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken first to last, using the league's tie-breaker policies.
4. Combined win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Overall win percentage versus non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based upon their order of finish (overall win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional opponents based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee following the conclusion of regular season games, unless the second of the tied teams is ranked within five or fewer places of the highest ranked tied team. In this case, the two-team tiebreaker procedure shall be applied between the top two ranked tied teams. If none of the tied teams are ranked in the rankings of the College Football Playoff Committee, the higher ranked team in the officially released Amway Coaches poll (including others receiving votes), following the conclusion of regular season games, unless the second of the tied teams is within five or fewer places of the highest ranked team. (For the sake of clarity, the team receiving the second-most votes but not ranked in the Top 25 would be ranked 27th.) In this case the two-team tiebreaker procedure shall be applied between the top ranked tied teams.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.



# The College Football Playoff; ACC Bowl Lineup



## COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

Beginning with the 2014-15 season, college football enters a new era when a postseason playoff will begin. The format includes the top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and a national championship game played in a different city each year. Each semifinal will be played during the New Year's holiday with the national championship game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later.

A selection committee will choose the four teams for the playoff based on their performance during the regular season, including, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams will be seeded so that #1 will play #4 in one semifinal and #2 will meet #3 in the other, with the winners advancing to the national championship game. The selection committee will announce its rankings each week on Tuesdays beginning on Oct. 28. The final rankings, though, will be announced on Sunday, Dec. 7.

The semifinals will rotate among six different bowls: the Chick-fil-A Peach, Cotton, Fiesta and Capital One Orange Bowls; the Rose Bowl presented by Northwestern Mutual and the Sugar Bowl. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight other teams in four compelling matchups.

## ACC Bowl Quick Selection Order

(The ACC is in the first year of six-year contracts with its current bowl partners. The current College Football Playoff format is a 12-year agreement)

### College Football Playoff (four teams)

If the ACC Champion is not in one of the semifinal games it will appear in the Capital One Orange Bowl, or, if the Capital One Orange Bowl is a semifinal or national championship site, one of the Playoff "host" bowls, either the Fiesta or Chick-fil-A Peach.

There is no limit on how many teams the College Football Playoff may choose from a particular conference.

### Capital One Orange

Opponent will be a team from the SEC, Big Ten or Notre Dame. If ACC Champion is in the College Football Playoff, a second ACC team will take its place in the Orange Bowl.

### Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus

Only if the ACC opponent in the Orange Bowl, in a non-semifinal year, is a team from the Big Ten, which can occur a maximum of three times in six years.

## The One-Win Rule Applies Only to Notre Dame

The ACC's bowl selection will no longer be bound by the rigidity of a "one-win rule" but will have a general list of criteria to emphasize regionality and quality matchups on the field. A one-win rule does apply to Notre Dame's participation in the ACC Bowl structure. Notre Dame is now eligible for ACC Bowl selection beginning with the Capital One Bowl and continuing through the league's bowl selections. However, Notre Dame must be within one win of the ACC available team which has the best overall record, in order to be chosen. In other words, if an ACC team was 9-3, a 7-5 Notre Dame team could not be chosen in its place. Notre Dame would have to be 8-4 to be chosen over a 9-3 league team.

## ACC Bowl Expenses And Revenue

The Atlantic Coast Conference shares all bowl revenues. Each school is provided an initial expense allotment. The Conference will share in the cost of unsold tickets for participating bowl institutions. After all bowl expense allotments and ticket reimbursements are subtracted from the total bowl revenue, the remaining revenue is distributed evenly among the ACC schools.

# The ACC In Overtime

## The ACC & Overtime

When Florida State and Clemson ended regulation tied at 17 in week 4 of the 2014 season, it marked the 67th game featuring an ACC team that has had to go to extra sessions. Of the 67 overtime contests, a large portion of them--29--have been played in the month of September. Games have gone into overtime for ACC teams a total of 16 times in November, while 12 have been played in October, three in August, five in December and two in January (2006 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl). Of the 67 overtime contests, 33 have been ACC games while 34 nonconference games have gone into overtime. The home team has a 37-22 advantage in the 59 games played on campus. The team which wins the toss has a 36-31 record. Fifty-one of the games were decided in the first overtime with 11 games in double overtime and five in triple overtime.
