• UVa improved to 15-1 in its last 16 season openers with its 61-41 win over James Madison on Nov. 8.

• Virginia is opening the season against James Madison and VCU for the first time since 1978-79.

VIRGINIA RANKED NO. 25 IN LATEST NATIONAL POLLS

• UVa is ranked No. 25 in the latest Associated Press and USA Today Coaches polls.

- Virginia's No. 24 preseason AP ranking was its first since being ranked No. 11 to start the 2001-02 season.
- The Cavaliers returned to the rankings this season for the first time since Feb. 27, 2012, when they were No. 24 in the AP poll.

SERIES HISTORY

UVa sports a 10-1 all-time mark, including a 5-0 mark in Charlottesville, against VCU in the series that dates back to 1976-77.
Virginia owns a four-game winning streak against VCU and hasn't lost to the Rams since a 75-66 setback on Dec. 19, 1987.
The Cavaliers host VCU for the first time at John Paul Jones Arena.

AGAINST THE ATLANTIC 10

• VCU is the lone Atlantic 10 Conference opponent on Virginia's 2013-14 schedule.

• Virginia is 101-74 all-time against current Atlantic 10 members (2-0 vs. Dayton, 0-3 vs. Fordham, 7-1 vs. George Mason, 25-23 vs. George Washington, 0-2 vs. LaSalle, 2-0 vs. UMass, 1-1 vs. Rhode Island, 52-36 vs. Richmond, 2-6 vs. Saint Joseph's, 0-1 vs. Saint Louis and 10-1 vs. VCU).

AGAINST THE COMMONWEALTH

• Since the 1999-2000 season, Virginia has a 46-12 record against teams from the Commonwealth of Virginia.

• UVa is 12-3 in its last 15 games vs. in-state opponents.

• The Cavaliers went 3-2 against in-state teams last season, defeating Virginia Tech twice (74-58 & 73-55) and Norfolk State (67-56) and losing to George Mason (63-59) and Old Dominion (63-61).

2013-14 UNIVERSITY OF VIRGINIA MEN'S BASKETBALL NOTES

• The Cavaliers were 2-1 vs. ranked opponents last season, defeating No. 19 NC State (1/29/13) and No. 3 Duke (2/28/13) and losing at No. 2 Miami (2/19/13).

LAST TIME OUT

- Virginia posted its 17th straight home-opening win with a 61-41 win over JMU.
- Anthony Gill led UVa with 13 points on 5-of-5 shooting, while Darion Atkins matched a career high with 11 rebounds.
- Virginia outrebounded JMU, 45-27, and limited the Dukes to 31.3 percent (15-of-48) shooting from the field.
- UVa's 2012-13 leading scorers Joe Harris and Akil Mitchell were limited to five and seven points, respectively.
- London Perrantes, Maleek Frazier and Jeff Jones made their collegiate debuts.

VIRGINIA HEAD COACH TONY BENNETT

- Head coach Tony Bennett has a 77-53 mark in five seasons at UVa and 146-86 record in eight seasons of coaching.
- Bennett guided the Cavaliers to the NCAA Tournament in 2012 and NIT in 2013.
- Bennett has increased UVa's win total in each of the last four seasons (15 in 2009-10, 16 in 2010-11, 22 in 2011-12 and 23 in 2013-13).
- UVa's 11 ACC wins in 2012-13 were its most since 11 in 2006-07.
- Bennett is one of 23 Division I head coaches who played in the NBA.

HARRIS AND MITCHELL LEAD CAVALIERS INTO ACTION

- Senior Joe Harris and Akil Mitchell lead the Cavaliers into action this season.
- Last season, Harris averaged a career-high 16.3 points and Mitchell added career bests with 13.1 points and 8.9 rebounds per game.
- Harris tallied a career-high 36 points against Duke and Mitchell had a team-leading 12 double-doubles.
- Harris earned All-ACC first-team honors, while Mitchell was named to the third team.
- Harris ranks 27th on UVa's all-time scoring list with 1,260 points and Mitchell has grabbed 542 career rebounds.

MALCOLM BACK IN THE MIDDLE OF THE ACTION

• Redshirt sophomore guard Malcolm Brogdon returned to action against JMU after missing the 2012-13 season and last four games of 2011-12 with a foot injury.

THE AG SHOW NOW PLAYING IN CHARLOTTESVILLE

• Redshirt sophomore transfer Anthony Gill made his long-awaited Virginia debut against JMU after sitting out last season as a transfer from South Carolina.

- Gill tallied a team-leading 13 points on 5-of-5 shooting in 20 minutes against JMU.
 Gill averaged 7.6 points and 4.7 rebounds per game as a freshman for South
- Carolina in 2011-12.

He was a high school teammate of Akil Mitchell at Charlotte Christian High School in 2009-10.

ABOUT THE 2013-14 SCHEDULE

• Six of Virginia's opponents were ranked in the preseason polls (Duke, Syracuse, North Carolina, VCU, Wisconsin and Notre Dame), while three (Tennessee, Pittsburgh and Boston College) received votes.

• Twelve opponents (JMU, VCU, Davidson, Liberty, Wisconsin, NC State, Duke, North Carolina, Pittsburgh, Notre Dame, Miami and Syracuse) earned 2013 NCAA Tournament berths, while four (Norfolk State, Tennessee, Florida State and Maryland) participated in the National Invitation Tournament and two (Northern Iowa and Green Bay) in the CollegeInsider.com Tournament.

VIRGINIA PICKED 4TH IN THE ACC

• Virginia was selected fourth in the preseason poll at ACC Operation Basketball.

• The Cavaliers, who were picked seventh and finished tied for fourth last season, have finished at or higher than their predicted finish in each of the last four seasons.

• Duke is the preseason favorite, followed by Syracuse, North Carolina, UVa, Notre Dame, Pitt, Maryland, Boston College, Florida State, NC State, Georgia Tech, Miami, Wake Forest, Clemson and Virginia Tech.

EMBRACE THE PACE

• In 2012-13, the Cavaliers ranked in the top 16 nationally in six defensive categories: points per game (5th), assists per game (7th), points per possession (12th), possessions per 40 minutes (15th), fouls per game (15th) and field goal percentage (16th).

• The Cavaliers held 26 of their 35 opponents under 60 points.

• UVa held its ACC opponents under 60 points in 14 of 18 games.

UVa held eight opponents under 50 points last season.

- UVa held four opponents (Tennessee, Mississippi Valley State, Wofford and Florida State) under 40 points.
- UVa held its opponent under 43 percent shooting from the field in 22 of 35 games.

ANDERSON ACCOMPLISHES RARE FEAT

• Sophomore Justin Anderson was one of two players in NCAA Divison I to record 20 points, five rebounds, five blocked shots and five 3-pointers in a game last season, joining South Alabama's Mychal Ammons who also accomplished the rare feat.

• Anderson tallied 24 points, six rebounds, five blocked shots and five 3-pointers in Virginia's season-ending 75-64 loss to lowa, while Ammons had 21 points, five rebounds, five blocked shots and five 3-pointers vs. FIU.

Anderson led Virginia in scoring during the NIT, averaging 19 points in three contests.

• He earned ACC Rookie of the Week honors on Feb. 11, 2013, after averaging 15.5 points, five rebounds and 2.5 assists and 1.5 steals in a pair of wins.

2012-13 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

• Virginia finished the season with a 23-12 record and 11-7 fourth-place mark in the ACC.

• UVa made its 13th NIT appearance, advancing to the NIT quarterfinals for the first time since 1992.

• Virginia posted back-to-back 20-win seasons for the first time since 1991-92 and 1992-93.

• Virginia won 22 or more games in back-to-back seasons for the first time since winning 30 in 1981-82 and 29 in 1982-83. The Cavaliers' 11 ACC wins were their most since 11 in 2006-07.

 Virginia is one of seven Division I teams to improve its win total in each of the last four years (Colorado State, Indiana, North Carolina Central, Oregon, Southeast Missouri State and Southern Miss).

• UVa is the only ACC team to improve its conference record in each of the last four seasons (5 wins in 2009-10, 7 wins in 2010-11, 9 wins in 2011-12 and 11 wins in 2012-13). UVa had four ACC wins in 2008-09.

• Joe Harris needs nine 3-pointers to pass Sammy Zeglinski (2008-12) for fifth place on UVa's all-time list.

We would like to receive credential requests no later than seven (7) days prior to the game. Credentials that can't be mailed will be held for pickup at the will call window at John Paul Jones Arena. You must have a press pass to be admitted to the media area and the press room.

PHOTO CREDENTIALS

All photographers and camera operators must wear a visible credential issued by the Virginia athletics media relations office. Photographers work from the baselines at both ends of the court at John Paul Jones Arena. Live television is given top priority for courtside space.

PRESS PARKING

Press parking passes are provided upon request on a limited basis. If you need a parking pass, please be sure to inform the UVa athletics media relations office when making your press or photo credential request.

INTERVIEWS

All requests for interviews with Virginia basketball coaches and players should be made through Erich Bacher in the athletics media relations office. It is requested you allow the athletics media relations staff at least one day to arrange an interview.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Virginia head coach Tony Bennett and the visiting head coach will meet with media representatives in the press room after each game at John Paul Jones Arena. Coach Bennett will be available in the press room approximately 10 minutes after the conclusion of the game and the visiting coach will be in the press room approximately 20 minutes after the game. Virginia players will be available in the team meeting room adjacent to the men's basketball locker room after Coach Bennett is done with his postgame press conference.

<u>RADIO</u>

Each visiting school is allowed one free radio broadcast from John Paul Jones Arena. The Virginia athletics media relations office provides two ISDN lines and three business touchtone lines for use by the visiting broadcast crew. Radio network crews work from a courtside location at the scorer's table. Three seats are available at the table and one seat behind the visitor's broadcast location.
