VIRGINIA-VIRGINIA TECH SERIES

- Virginia holds an 83-76 advantage in the all-time series with Virginia Tech.
- The Hokies took two of three from Virginia last season in Blacksburg, breaking a UVA win streak of 12 straight in the series, dating to April 16, 2003.
- In Virginia Tech's last visit to Charlottesville in 2008, the Cavaliers swept a three-game series (10-1, 9-2, 2-1).

VIRGINIA STRONG IN RECENT YEARS VS. IN-STATE FOES

- UVA is 5-1 this year vs. in-state opponents.
- Virginia went 8-2 last year against teams from the Commonwealth of Virginia, including 7-0 against non-conference foes.
- Under the current coaching staff (since 2004), the Cavaliers have a 61-9 record against in-state opponents.

RANKED FOES BECOME THE NORM

- With three games this weekend with No. 20 Virginia Tech, Virginia will up its number of games this year against ranked opponents to 16 – UVA is 8-5 thus far in those contests.
- Entering the weekend, Virginia is tied with Florida State for the most games vs. ranked opponents this year among ACC teams.
- Virginia has won all four of its series against ranked foes, including ACC series wins over Top-10 opponents Florida State, Clemson and Georgia Tech.
- UVA's strength of schedule is No. 11 nationally according to WarrenNolan.com.

BRUNO STRETCHES STREAK TO 15

- Stephen Bruno has hits in each of his last 15 games (since March 21) – the longest current hit streak in the ACC.
- He is batting .418 (23-for-55) during that stretch.
- It is the longest hit streak for a UVA freshman since Brandon Guyer recorded hits in 15 straight games in 2005. It is the second-longest current streak nationally for a freshman (D.J. Long, Delaware - 25 games).
- Bruno has batted in the third spot in the order in six straight games.

- Entering the week, Virginia ranked second nationally in triples (21) and ninth in fielding percentage (.979).
- Dan Grovatt is nearing the 200-hit plateau at Virginia (197).
- UVA is 8-5 vs. ranked teams this year.
- Tyler Cannon is a .500 career hitter vs. VT (18-for-36).

HULTZEN LOOKS TO CONTINUE DOMINANCE

- Danny Hultzen has been sensational in his Friday starts this season, posting a 5-1 record with a 2.04 ERA, which ranks third in the ACC.
- In 53 innings, he has struck out an ACC-best 66 and walked just 10. Batters are hitting .169 against him – lowest in the ACC.
- Last week vs. Georgia Tech he struck out 11 in seven innings in a win over the then-No. 2 Yellow Jackets.

CAVALIERS RANKED NO. 5 IN FIRST RPI

- Virginia is ranked No. 5 in the first RPI report, which was announced Tuesday by the NCAA.

- Arizona State, Arkansas, UCLA and Florida rank one through four.
- Virginia has seven wins against the RPI top 20 this year.
- Virginia Tech is ranked No. 46 in the initial RPI.

VIRGINIA RANKS 23RD NATIONALLY IN ATTENDANCE

- With a season average of 2,584 spectators per game, Virginia ranks 23rd nationally in attendance.
- Virginia's average attendance has nearly doubled from the same point last season – through 23 home games last year, UVa averaged 1,380 fans per game.

- On April 6 vs. James Madison, UVa had its largest mid-week attendance ever, as 2,521 came out to watch the Cavaliers' win.
- UVa ranks fourth in attendance this season among ACC schools, behind Florida State, Clemson and Miami.
- UVa is on pace to obliterate the single-season attendance average record of 1,774, set in 2007.

UVa SHATTERS ATTENDANCE RECORDS

- Virginia shattered its attendance records last week-end, drawing 12,579 fans for the three-game series with Georgia Tech (the previous mark was 9,642, set in March vs. Boston College).
- UVa also broke the single-game record with a sellout crowd of 4,219 on Saturday (the previous mark was 3,540).
- A total of 56,864 fans have come out to Davenport Field this year – the school record is 65,661 in 2007 (37 dates), a mark which likely will go down this weekend.
- Virginia has added 979 general admission bleacher seats down the right-field line this season, pushing the capacity to 4,219.

NO STRANGERS TO BIG CROWDS

- Virginia has gotten used to playing in front of large crowds at home and on the road this season.
- UVa already has played in front of six road crowds and five home crowds of more than 3,500.
- In midweek action, the Cavaliers have been welcomed by sellout, school-record crowds at William and Mary, James Madison and VMI.

VIRGINIA PITCHING LIMITS HITS

- Entering the week Virginia's pitchers had given up an average of 7.8 hits per nine innings – tops in the ACC and sixth fewest in the nation.
- UVa ranked third nationally last year in fewest hits allowed per nine innings (7.97).
- UVa has given up more than nine hits just five times in the last 20 games.

ARICO NAMED TO STOPPER OF YEAR WATCH LIST

- Kevin Arico has been named to the midseason watch list for the Stopper of the Year Award, presented by the NCBWA.
- The award is annually presented to the top relief pitcher in NCAA Division I baseball.
- Arico currently leads all Division I pitchers in saves with 11 this season (in 12 attempts) and boasts 22 career saves – second in Virginia history.
- He recently passed Tim LaVigne (1997-2000) for second in the UVa annals. Former Cavalier Casey Lambert (2004-07) is the ACC's all-time leader with 43 saves.

LEGGING OUT THE EXTRA BAGGERS

- Virginia has sprayed the ball all over the field this year and ranks among the nation's leaders in triples and doubles (ACC leader in triples, third in doubles).
- UVa is second nationally with 21 triples.
- The Cavaliers are 15th in doubles with 86.
- The extra-base hits are coming from everyone – no Cavalier ranks higher than 35th nationally in either category.

GOSSELIN HAS BIG SUCCESS AT TOP OF ORDER

- Phil Gosselin moved into the Cavaliers' leadoff slot this year and has been solid, with a .393 batting average, .483 on base percentage and 10 stolen bases.
- He leads the ACC in hits with 55 and ranks sixth in batting and ninth in on base percentage.
- Gosselin has reached base to lead off 17 games.
- He had his career-best 14-game hitting streak snapped last Friday vs. Georgia Tech.

NO SLOUCHES IN THE NINE-HOLE

- Virginia has gotten big production out of its nine-hole hitters this season.
- The No. 9 hitters in the Virginia lineup have combined to go 54-for-119 (.454) this season with 28 RBI and 44 runs scored.
- Outside of the top two spots in the lineup, UVa has gotten its most hits out of the ninth spot in the order.
- Keith Werman, out of the nine-hole, has gone 18-for-32 with 12 runs scored and seven RBI this year.
- Stephen Bruno is 18-for-41 with two homers, 12 RBI and 15 runs scored in the ninth spot.

DEFENSE REMAINS AMONG NATION'S BEST

- Through 36 games, Virginia has committed 28 errors – good for an impressive .979 fielding percentage, which is second in the ACC and sixth in the nation.
- The Cavaliers recorded a .972 fielding mark last year.
- In the last eight games, UVa has committed one error (.997 fielding percentage).
- The school record for fielding percentage is .975, set in 2005.

NOTES FROM THE GEORGIA TECH SERIES

- UVa handed reigning All-American and ACC Pitcher of the Year Deck McGuire a loss in the opener; UVa pitchers combined to strike out 17 in the win – most by any team in an ACC game this season.
- Virginia held Georgia Tech to 14 runs and 24 hits in the series – the Yellow Jackets were averaging 10.8 runs and 12.5 hits per game entering the weekend.
- Tyler Cannon went 5-for-10 in the series, while Jarrett Parker was 4-for-10. Stephen Bruno had a team-best six RBI in the series.
- UVa scored 23 runs in the series; Georgia Tech's pitching staff entered with an ACC-low 3.15 ERA.

OFFENSE REVS UP IN SECOND

- Virginia has outscored its opponents 26-21 in the first inning this year, but the Cavaliers have exploded from there.
- UVa has outscored its opponents 42-10 in the second inning this year and 189-80 from the second through the sixth innings.
- Overall, Virginia is outscoring its opponents 288-146 this season.

BALANCE THROUGHOUT LINEUP

- UVa has gotten production from its entire lineup, with 10 players boasting at least 20 hits and 15 runs.
- In 16 games at least eight of the nine Virginia starters have recorded at least one hit.
- On four occasions all nine UVa starters posted at least one hit.
- The Cavaliers are hitting an ACC-best .341 as a team through 35 games. Nine regular starters are batting .300 or better.

FRESHMEN PRODUCE WHILE WAITING TURN

- UVa's freshman infielders have made the most of their opportunities thus far. At the plate, Stephen Bruno, Reed Gragnani and Chris Taylor have combined to go 51-for-127 (.402).
- Bruno is riding a 15-game hit streak and has started the last 11 games.
- Gragnani is 8-for-18 with six RBI in four starts at DH.
- Taylor hit a big run-scoring triple in the ninth inning in UVa's win at East Carolina Feb. 21.

CANNON CLIMBS VIRGINIA CHARTS

- Tyler Cannon stands in sixth place in career games at UVa with 217 and will move into fourth place with two more games (Adam Robinson, Matt Street, 219).
- Tyler Cannon also comes into the weekend with 811 career at bats, which is fifth in UVa history.
- Cannon has 57 career doubles and has broken the UVa career doubles record, previously set by Brandon Guyer (53, 2005-07).
- He also is third in triples (12), sixth in total bases (346), tied for sixth in hits (250), seventh in runs scored (162), 10th in walks (97) and 11th in HBP (19).

CANNON HIT STREAK COMES TO END

- Tyler Cannon's career-best 16-game hit streak came to an end March 30 vs. Towson. It was the longest active streak in the ACC.
- In the streak, he hit .439 (29-for-66) and had at least two hits in 10 of the games, including four on March 23 vs. Marshall.
- He also had six doubles and three triples during this stretch.
- It also was UVa's best hit streak of the season.

VETERAN-LADEN CAVALIERS

- Virginia has one of its most experienced teams ever.
- The Cavaliers' returning position players have combined for 1,216 career starts, led by senior shortstop Tyler Cannon, who has started 211 games.
- Ten players have started at least 50 career games apiece for UVa. Cannon, Dan Grovatt (149), Jarrett Parker (142) and Phil Gosselin (135) and Franco Valdes (102) each have made at least 100 career starts.

WAHOOS NOTCH FIRST SERIES WIN VS. FLORIDA STATE

- Virginia scored its first-ever series win against Florida State March 12-14, taking two of three games in Tallahassee.
- UVa was 0-for-14 in its previous three-game series with the Seminoles.
- It also marked the highest-ranked opponent that UVa has won a series against since March 17-18, 2007 at then-No. 1 North Carolina.

CAVALIERS EARN FIRST-EVER NO. 1 NATIONAL RANKING

- Virginia earned a No. 1 ranking from Baseball America and Rivals.com for six-consecutive weeks this season – this came to an end in the polls this week.
- It marks the first No. 1 ranking in school history for Virginia Baseball.
- The baseball team becomes the 10th athletics program at Virginia to garner a No. 1 national ranking, joining men's basketball, women's basketball, field hockey, football, men's lacrosse, women's lacrosse, men's soccer, women's soccer and men's tennis.
- Virginia currently has four teams ranked No. 1 – baseball, men's lacrosse, women's rowing and men's tennis – while five have held their sport's top spot this season (men's soccer).

UVA LEADS NATION IN ERA LAST FIVE YEARS

- Virginia led all NCAA Division I teams in ERA over the past five seasons, boasting a 3.13 team ERA.
- UVa ranked in the top 15 in the country in ERA each of the last six seasons, including No. 3 marks in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009.
- North Carolina is the only other team to rank among the top 15 nationally in ERA for the last six years.
- Virginia is the only team in Division I to rank among

2009 IN REVIEW

- Virginia finished 49-15-1 (16-11-1 ACC) and advanced to the College World Series for the first time in program history.
- UVa won the NCAA Irvine Regional and Oxford Super Regional – the program's first NCAA regional and super regional championships.
- UVa defeated Clemson, UNC, Duke and Florida State to win the ACC Baseball Championship – the third ACC crown in school history. Dan Grovatt (8-for-15, .533) was named the tournament MVP.
- As the sixth seed, UVa became the lowest seed ever to win the ACC Baseball Championship.

STRONG CORE OF PITCHERS BACK, BUT HOLES REMAIN

- UVa has to fill the holes of six pitchers who logged 226.0 innings and made 30 starts last season. Nine pitchers return.
- Danny Hultzen (9-1, 2.17) and Robert Morey (3-0, 3.33) each had strong 2009 seasons and will anchor the rotation.
- UVa had a 3.23 ERA last year (third nationally) and has the best ERA in the nation (3.13) over the last five seasons.

VERSATILITY KEY FOR CAVALIERS

- Much of the UVa's depth comes because of its versatility – several players could see action at a variety of positions.
- John Hicks and Kenny Swab each are athletic players who primarily are catchers but both will shift to first base and the outfield at times.
- Danny Hultzen will pitch and also is a strong first baseman and will DH as well, while Phil Gosselin could play at second or left field.
- Corey Hunt (INF) and Shane Halley (OF) each will pitch, but are great defensive players in the field as well.

STARTING LINEUP BACK IN TACT

- Virtually the entire offense returns from 2009, including everyone from the starting lineup.
- Almost all of the offensive production is back – 99 percent of the RBI-production returns, with 98.4 percent of the hit-producers (755 of 767) coming back.
- Virginia hit .327 last season – the Cavaliers' best mark since 1985 – and swatted 59 home runs – UVa's most since 2002.
- Dan Grovatt (.356), Jarrett Parker (.355) and Tyler Cannon (.351) led UVa in batting last year. UVa has nine regular starters back who hit at least .292 last year.

WHO'S GONE?

- Virginia will need to replace 229.0 innings lost from the 2009 squad.
- The top loss comes from starter Andrew Carraway, who tossed 91.0 innings last year.
- Matt Packer pitched 61 innings – second-most out of the bullpen.

SCHEDULE WILL CHALLENGE

- Virginia's schedule is not for the faint of heart – 11 teams from the 2009 NCAA Tournament line the schedule.
- Thirty-six games will come against teams that won at least 30 games last year.
- UVa opened with a three-game set at East Carolina, a 2009 Super Regional qualifier.
- The ACC slate features six NCAA teams from last season – North Carolina (CWS), Clemson and Florida State (Super Regionals) and Boston College, Georgia Tech and Miami (Regionals).
- The Cavaliers also have non-conference matchups with 2009 NCAA Tournament foes Coastal Carolina, Dartmouth, George Mason and Wright State.
