FOR OPENERS

- No. 25 Virginia and Davidson meet for the first time since Jan. 21, 1991, when the Cavaliers beat the Wildcats, 71-47.
- UVa is 44-19 against nonconference opponents during the Tony Bennett era.
- Virginia is 5-10, including an 0-2 mark last season, on neutral courts during the Bennett era.
- Bennett played three seasons in the NBA for the Charlotte Hornets from 1992-95.
- Virginia's Anthony Gill and Akil Mitchell were teammates at Charlotte Christian High School in 2009-10.

VIRGINIA RANKED NO. 25 IN LATEST NATIONAL POLLS

- UVa is ranked No. 25 in the latest Associated Press and USA Today Coaches polls.
- Virginia's No. 24 preseason AP ranking marked its first since being ranked No. 11 to start the 2001-02 season.
- The Cavaliers returned to the rankings this season for the first time since Feb. 27, 2012, when they were No. 24 in the AP poll.

SERIES HISTORY

- UVa sports a 10-4 mark, including a 2-2 mark at neutral sites, against Davidson in the series that dates back to 1920-21.
- UVa has a six-game winning streak against Davidson, including a 71-47 win in the last meeting on Jan. 21, 1991.
- The Cavaliers are 1-2 against the Wildcats in Charlotte, where the teams meet for the first time since Jan. 13, 1975.

AGAINST THE SOUTHERN CONFERENCE

- Davidson is the lone Southern Conference opponent on Virginia's 2013-14 schedule.
- Virginia is 24-5 vs. current Southern Conference members (10-4 vs. Davidson, 6-0 vs. Elon, 2-0 vs. The Citadel, 2-0 vs. Wofford, 2-1 vs. Appalachian State, 1-0 vs. Furman and 1-0 vs. Samford)

LAST TIME OUT

- Virginia lost 59-56 to in-state rival VCU on Tuesday, Nov. 12.
- Treveon Graham hit the game-winning 3-pointer with 1.4 seconds remaining and led the Rams with a game-high 22 points.
- Joe Harris led Virginia with 18 points on 7-of-12 shooting and Malcolm Brogdon added 10 points.
- Mike Tobey added a career-high nine rebounds as the Cavaliers enjoyed a 41-28 advantage on the glass.
- Virginia committed 19 turnovers and shot just 39.1 percent (18-46) from the field, 12.5 percent from 3-point range (1-8) and 57.6 percent (19-33) from the charity stripe.

HARRIS AND MITCHELL LEAD CAVALIERS INTO ACTION

- Senior Joe Harris and Akil Mitchell lead the Cavaliers into action this season.
- Last season, Harris averaged a career-high 16.3 points and Mitchell added career bests with 13.1 points and 8.9 rebounds per game.
- Harris tallied a career-high 36 points against Duke and Mitchell had a team-leading 12 double-doubles.
- Harris earned All-ACC first-team honors, while Mitchell was named to the third team.
- Harris ranks 27th on UVa's all-time scoring list with 1,260 points and Mitchell has grabbed 542 career rebounds.
- In 2013-14, Harris leads UVa in scoring at 11.5 ppg, while Mitchell is tied for third at 8.0 ppg.

VIRGINIA HEAD COACH TONY BENNETT

- Head coach Tony Bennett has a 77-54 mark in five seasons at UVA and 146-87 record in eight seasons of coaching.
- Bennett guided the Cavaliers to the NCAA Tournament in 2012 and NIT in 2013.
- Bennett has increased UVA's win total in each of the last four seasons (15 in 2009-10, 16 in 2010-11, 22 in 2011-12 and 23 in 2013-13).
- UVA's 11 ACC wins in 2012-13 were its most since 11 in 2006-07.
- Bennett is one of 23 Division I head coaches who played in the NBA.

STITH, WILKINS AND SALT INK LETTERS OF INTENT WITH CAVALIERS

- Tony Bennett announced the signings of center Jack Salt (Auckland, New Zealand/Westlake Boys High School), guard B.J. Stith (Lawrenceville, Va./Oak Hill Academy) and forward Isaiah Wilkins (Lilburn, Ga./Greater Atlanta Christian School) to National Letters of Intent.
- The 6-10, 240-pound Salt tallied 14 points and 16 rebounds as the Westlake Boys High School Premier Team recently defended its New Zealand School Boys AA title.
- The 6-5, 205-pound Stith helped lead Brunswick High School to three straight Virginia High School League Division 3 State titles prior to enrolling at Oak Hill Academy for the 2013-14 season. Stith was named all-state and all-region after averaging 16 points, six rebounds and six assists per game to lead the 2013 state champion Bulldogs. Stith, who is ranked No. 48 on Rivals.com's 2014 Prospect Ranking list, is the son of former Virginia star and NBA player Bryant Stith.
- The 6-8, 205-pound Wilkins averaged 17 points and eight rebounds per game for Greater Atlanta Christian School in 2012-13. Wilkins led Greater Christian to the Georgia AA State championship and was named the AA State Player of the Year and Region 6-AA Player of the Year.

EMBRACE THE PACE

- The Cavaliers lead the ACC in five defensive categories and rank in the top 16 nationally in six defensive categories: offensive rebound percentage, offensive rebounds per game and defensive rebound percentage (6th), points per game (10th), points per possession (14th) and rebound percentage (16th).
- Virginia has held both of its opponents below 42 percent shooting from the floor and is enjoying a + 15.5 average rebound margin.
- Virginia has limited JMU (2) and VCU (3) to a combined five fast break points.

MALCOLM BACK IN THE MIDDLE OF THE ACTION

- Redshirt sophomore guard Malcolm Brogdon returned to action against JMU after missing the 2012-13 season and last four games of 2011-12 with a foot injury.
- Brogdon is averaging 9.5 points, 5.5 rebounds, 1.5 assists and 1.5 steals per game.
- Brogdon tallied nine points and matched his career high with three 3-pointers, against JMU and added 10 points in the loss to VCU.
- He averaged 6.7 points in 28 games as a freshman in 2011-12.

AG MAKES UVA DEBUT

- Redshirt sophomore transfer Anthony Gill made his long-awaited Virginia debut against JMU after sitting out last season as a transfer from South Carolina.
- Gill tallied a team-leading 13 points on 5-of-5 shooting in 20 minutes against JMU.
- He battled foul trouble and was held scoreless against VCU.
- Gill averaged 7.6 points and 4.7 rebounds per game as a freshman for South Carolina in 2011-12.
- He was a high school teammate of Akil Mitchell at Charlotte Christian High School in 2009-10.

CARRY ON DARION

- Junior forward Darion Atkins is averaging eight points and a team-leading 9.5 rebounds per game.
- Atkins matched a career high with 11 rebounds vs. JMU and has two blocked shots and two steals this season.

ANDERSON ACCOMPLISHES RARE FEAT

- Sophomore Justin Anderson was one of two players in NCAA Division I to record 20 points, five rebounds, five blocked shots and five 3-pointers in a game last season, joining South Alabama's Mychal Ammons who also accomplished the rare feat.
- Anderson tallied 24 points, six rebounds, five blocked shots and five 3-pointers in Virginia's season-ending 75-64 loss to Iowa, while Ammons had 21 points, five rebounds, five blocked shots and five 3-pointers vs. FIU.
- Anderson led Virginia in scoring during the NIT, averaging 19 points in three contests.
- He earned ACC Rookie of the Week honors on Feb. 11, 2013, after averaging 15.5 points, five rebounds and 2.5 assists and 1.5 steals in a pair of wins.

PERRANTES AND HALL HIGHLIGHT NEWCOMERS

- Freshman recruits London Perrantes and Devon Hall highlight a list of five newcomers this season.
- Perrantes is averaging two points, 3.0 rebounds and 25.5 minutes per game.
- Hall, who is redshirting this season, is the brother of Mark Hall, a member of the Virginia football team.
- Walk-ons Maleek Frazier, Jeff Jones and Rob Vozenilek round out the 16-man roster.
- Jones is the son of former UVA player and head coach and current Old Dominion head coach Jeff Jones.
- Vozenilek, who was a member of the men's basketball team in 2011-12, is the brother of UVA football kicker and punter Alec Vozenilek.

ABOUT THE 2013-14 SCHEDULE

- Six of Virginia's opponents were ranked in the preseason polls (Duke, Syracuse, North Carolina, VCU, Wisconsin and Notre Dame), while three (Tennessee, Pittsburgh and Boston College) received votes.
- Twelve opponents (JMU, VCU, Davidson, Liberty, Wisconsin, NC State, Duke, North Carolina, Pittsburgh, Notre Dame, Miami and Syracuse) earned 2013 NCAA Tournament berths, while four (Norfolk State, Tennessee, Florida State and Maryland) participated in the National Invitation Tournament and two (Northern Iowa and Green Bay) in the Collegiansider.com Tournament.

VIRGINIA PICKED 4TH IN THE ACC

- Virginia was selected fourth in the preseason poll at ACC Operation Basketball.
- The Cavaliers, who were picked seventh and finished tied for fourth last season, have finished at or higher than their predicted finish in each

VIRGINIA VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

- Virginia is 7-14 against ranked opponents, including a 1-6 mark vs. top five opponents, in the Tony Bennett era.
- Virginia is 122-310 vs. ranked opponents, including a 24-119 mark against top-5 foes, since 1953-54.
- The Cavaliers are 1-26 vs. No. 1-ranked opponents (86-73 vs. No. 1 North Carolina on Jan. 30, 1986).
- The Cavaliers are 0-1 vs. ranked opponents this season, losing 59-56 to No. 14 VCU.

HARRIS NAMED PRESEASON ALL-ACC

- Joe Harris is one of five players named Preseason All-ACC.
- Joining Harris on the preseason All-ACC team were C.J. Fair (Syracuse), Rodney Hood (Duke), Jabari Parker (Duke) and Jerian Grant (Notre Dame).
- Fair was the pick for Preseason ACC Player of the Year and Parker was named Preseason ACC Rookie of the Year.

HARRIS A ONE OF 15 ON ROBERTSON WATCH LIST

- Joe Harris is one of 15 players on the preseason Oscar Robertson Watch List, honoring the nation's NCAA Division I Player of the Year.
- Joining Harris on the Robertson watch list were Jahii Carson (Arizona State), Aaron Craft (Ohio State), C. J. Fair (Syracuse), Aaron Gordon (Arizona), Gary Harris (Michigan State), Doug McDermott (Creighton), Mitch McGary (Michigan), Shabazz Napier (Connecticut), Jabari Parker (Duke), Adreian Payne (Michigan State), Julius Randle (Kentucky), Marcus Smart (Oklahoma State), Russ Smith (Louisville) and Andrew Wiggins (Kansas).

HARRIS A WOODEN AWARD CANDIDATE

- Joe Harris is one of 50 players on the preseason John R. Wooden Award list.
- Created in 1976, the John R. Wooden Award is the most prestigious individual honor in college basketball.
- It is bestowed upon the nation's best player at an institution of higher education who has proven to his or her university that he or she is making progress toward graduation and maintaining a minimum cumulative 2.0 GPA.
- Previous winners include such notables as Larry Bird ('79), Michael Jordan ('84), Tim Duncan ('97) and Kevin Durant ('09).

TOBEY AND BENNETT STRIKE GOLD

- Mike Tobey and Tony Bennett helped Team USA to the gold medal at the 2013 FIBA U19 World Championship in Prague, Czech Republic this summer.
- Tobey averaged 4.8 points and 4.8 rebounds per game as the Americans finished a perfect 9-0 in the tournament.
- Bennett served as an assistant coach under Florida and USA head coach Billy Donovan.

HOLDING FOES UNDER 50

- Virginia is 26-1 when holding opponents under 50 points in the Tony Bennett era.
- Virginia is 1-0 this season and went 8-0 last season when holding opponents under 50 points.

THE ELECTRIC 70s

- Virginia is 35-3 when scoring at least 70 points under Tony Bennett.
- The Cavaliers are 41-51 in the Bennett era when scoring under 70 points.

INTERVIEWS

All requests for interviews with Virginia basketball coaches and players should be made through Erich Bacher in the athletics media relations office. It is requested you allow the athletics media relations staff at least one day to arrange an interview.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Virginia head coach Tony Bennett and the visiting head coach will meet with media representatives in the press room after each game at John Paul Jones Arena. Coach Bennett will be available in the press room approximately 10 minutes after the conclusion of the game and the visiting coach will be in the press room approximately 20 minutes after the game. Virginia players will be available in the team meeting room adjacent to the men's basketball locker room after Coach Bennett is done with his postgame press conference.

RADIO

Each visiting school is allowed one free radio broadcast from John Paul Jones Arena.
