Virginia Tech-Tennessee Set for the "Battle at Bristol" Pitt Resumes With Penn State; Virginia Travels to No. 24 Oregon Louisville-Syracuse, Wake-Duke Battle in Early ACC Play

Four ACC teams are ranked this week in the AP Poll, including by **Clemson (2)**, **Florida State (3)**, **Louisville (15)** and **Miami (25)**...Three teams are ranked in the Coaches Amway Poll including **Clemson (2)**, **Florida State (3)** and **Louisville (13)**.The Pilot Flying J Battle of Bristol, featuring **Virginia Tech** and 17th-ranked Tennessee (8 pm, ABC) at the Bristol (Tenn.) Motor Speedway, and a resumption of the Keystone State rivalry between **Pitt** and Penn State (Noon, ESPN) at Heinz Field in Pittsburgh, headline a weekend of 10 non-conference and two conference games. The weekend begins with a Friday night nationally televised ACC battle with **Syracuse** hosting **No. 15 Louisville** at the Carrier Dome (8 pm, ESPN2).

The Pilot Fly J Battle of Bristol

The Hokies, coached by **Justin Fuente** and led by **QB Jerod Evans**, will be facing a Volunteer

team, coached by Butch Jones, that is expected to contend for the SEC title. Both teams won their openers with Evans throwing 4 TD passes in Fuente's debut as head coach at Tech. Aside from a 2009 Tech win in the Chick-fil-A Bowl, the two teams have not met since 1938.

Pitt Hosts Penn State In Resumption of Intrastate Rivalry

For the first time since 2000, Pitt and Penn State will meet on the gridiron resuming a rivalry which has endured a 16-year hiatus. Pitt, coached by **Pat Narduzzi** and led by RB **James Conner**, will be facing a Penn State squad coached by James Franklin.

FSU's Aguayo Ties NCAA Mark

FSU freshman **Ricky Aguayo's** six field goals in his first college game tied an ACC record for most field goals in a game and tied an NCAA record for most field goals by a freshman.

Record College Football Crowd Expected for Saturday's

Virginia Tech-UT Battle of Bristol
 An NCAA record crowd of approximately 150,000 fans is expected this Saturday when the Bristol Motor Speedway hosts Virginia Tech and 17th-ranked Tennessee. The official record, since 1948, is 115,109 at Michigan for its 2013 game with Notre Dame, though crowds at Soldier Field in Chicago in 1927 and 1928 for Notre Dame games with USC and Navy were estimated to be 120,000.

Two ACC Teams Hit 70 Points

Louisville and Miami both scored 70 points in their season-opening wins, marking only the second time in league history two teams had topped the 70 point mark on the same weekend. UNC and FSU reached the 80-point mark on Nov 23, 2013.

Duke-Wake Meet in Early Season ACC Contest

Duke, coached by **David Cutcliffe**, will host Wake Forest, coached by **Dave Clawson**, this Saturday (3:30 pm, ESPNU) at Brooks Field at Wallace Wade Stadium in Durham in the ACC opener for both teams and only the third conference game of the 2016 season. Eight times in the past 10 seasons the winner of this game has gone on to play in a bowl game, with Duke prevailing the last four years (2012-2015) and Wake making the post-season trip from 2006-2009. The Blue Devils are led by redshirt freshman **QB Daniel Jones**, while the Deacons feature the QB tandem of junior **John Wolford** and sophomore **Kendall Hinton**.

No. 15 Louisville Travels to Syracuse in Friday Night Battle of Hot Sophomore Quarterbacks

This Friday night 15th-ranked **Louisville** faces **Syracuse** at the Carrier Dome (8 pm, ESPN) in what promises to be a match-up of two promising young ACC quarterbacks. The Cardinals, coached by **Bobby Petrino**, feature sophomore **Lamar Jackson**, who had 405 yards of total offense and set an ACC record by accounting for eight touchdowns in the first half of Louisville's season-opening 70-14 win over Charlotte. The Orange, coached by **Dino Babers** in his first season, will answer with sophomore **Eric Dungey**, who completed 34 of 40 passes for 355 yards and two TDs in Syracuse's season-opening 33-7 win over Colgate. The Atlantic Division battle is the ACC opener for both teams... Jackson and Dungey combined for 785 yards of total offense and 10 TDR in their season-openers.

Four ACC Teams Face Formidable Foes on the Road

Boston College, **North Carolina**, **NC State** and **Virginia** all hit the road this weekend to face stiff non-conference tests. **Boston College**, coached by **Steve Addazio** and fresh from a trip to Ireland, hit the road again, facing in-state foe Massachusetts at Gillette Stadium in Foxborough, Mass. (Noon, NESN, ESPN3). The Eagles are led by **QB Patrick Towles**, while UMass is coached by former Miami assistant Mark Whipple...BC Defensive coordinator **Jim Reid** served as head coach at UMass for six years (1986-91)...The Tar Heels of coach **Larry Fedora**, led by the RB tandem of **Elijah Hood** and **T.J. Logan**, will face Big Ten foe Illinois, this Saturday at Memorial Stadium in Champaign-Urbana,

Ill. (7:30 pm, Big Ten Network). The Illini are coached by veteran NFL coach Lovie Smith, who is in his first season at Illinois... **NC State** travels 85 miles to Greenville, N.C., where the Wolfpack will face in-state rival East Carolina of the American Athletic Conference at Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium (Noon, ESPNU). NC State is coached by **Dave Doeren**, in his fourth season with the Wolfpack, and is led by **RB Matthew Dayes**. East Carolina is coached by former Duke player and assistant coach Scottie Montgomery, who is in his first season as the head of the Pirates' program...**Virginia**, coached by **Bronco Mendenhall**, in his first season with the Cavaliers and led by **QB Kurt Benkert**, will travel to Autzen Stadium in Eugene, Ore. (10:30 pm; ESPN) to face the 24th-ranked Oregon Ducks, who are coached by Mark Helfrich.

Georgia Tech Revisits History in Hosting Mercer

Georgia Tech, coached by **Paul Johnson** and led by **QB Justin Thomas**, will face the first school the Institute played in football, some 124 years ago when it hosts Mercer at Bobby Dodd Stadium Saturday (3 pm, ACC Network Extra). Mercer, coached now by Bobby Lamb, was the first team Tech played in football in Central City Park in Macon, Ga., on Nov. 5, 1892. The Bears won that game 12-6, their only win in the series. Saturday's game will be the first between the two teams since 1938, as Mercer dropped football after the 1941 season and only restarted the program in 2013. As a QB in 1983, Lamb led Furman to a 17-14 upset of Tech.

No. 2 Clemson, No. 4 Florida State and No. 25 Miami at Home

Second-ranked **Clemson**, coached by **Dabo Swinney** and led by junior **QB Deshaun Watson**, will host Troy of the Sun Belt Conference Saturday at Memorial Stadium in Clemson (ACC Network, 12:30 pm)...The Tigers defeated Auburn to open the season, their first win against a current SEC team on the road in a season-opener since 1903...Third-ranked **Florida State**, coached by **Jimbo Fisher**, will host FCS member Charleston Southern this Saturday at Doak S. Campbell Stadium in Tallahassee, Fla. (RSN, 12:30 pm)...The Noles are led by redshirt freshman **QB Deondre Francois**, who totalled 478 yards of offense in a come-from-behind win over 11th-ranked Ole Miss...Charleston Southern, coached by Jamey Chadwell, is ranked 6th nationally this week in the FCS...No. 25 Miami, coached by **Mark Richt** and led by junior **QB Brad Kaaya**, hosts Conference USA foe Florida Atlantic at Hard Rock Stadium in Miami Gardens, Fla. (6 pm, ACC Network Extra)...Kaaya tossed 4 TD passes in just 18 attempts in Miami's 70-3 win over Florida A&M...FAU is coached by Charlie Partridge and its offensive coordinator, Travis Trickett, is the son of Florida State offensive line coach Rick Trickett.



The ACC By The Numbers

.857 - Since the start of the 2011 season, **Clemson** under **Dabo Swinney** has posted a 12-2 record in games decided by seven or fewer points. That's an .857 winning percentage.

.8696 - In their first game under new head coach **Dino Babers**, Syracuse quarterbacks **Eric Dungey** (34-40) and **Zack Mahoney** (6-6) completed 40 of 46 passes, a completion percentage of .8696, which is the highest by an ACC team with a minimum of 40 attempts this century.

3 - When North Carolina senior **RB T.J. Logan** returned a kickoff 95 yards for a score against 18th-ranked Georgia, it marked the third score on a kickoff return for Logan in his career.

4 - The number of touchdown passes in the major college debut for Virginia Tech junior college transfer **QB Jerod Evans**. Evans completed 20 of 32 passes for 221 yards in the Hokies' win over Liberty. It was also the number of field goals for Syracuse junior **PK Cole Murphy** in the Orange's win over Colgate. Murphy made all four of his attempts from 32, 32, 33 and 41 yards.

4.5 - The number of quarterback sacks for Florida State senior **DE DeMarcus Walker** in the Seminoles' win over 11th-ranked Ole Miss. Walker had six total tackles and a forced fumble in the Noles win.

5 - Is the ACC record for most consecutive games with 100 or more yards of pass reception yardage, held by two former NC State players, **Korey Robinson** in 2000 and **Tory Holt** in 1998. Virginia Tech **WR Isaiah Ford**, who had 11 catches for 117 yards in the Hokies' win over Liberty, he has had four consecutive games of 100 or more receiving yardage having also topped the century mark against North Carolina (155), Virginia (121) and Tulsa (227) last year.

6 - The number of field goals for Florida State true freshman **PK Ricky Aguayo**. Aguayo tied the NCAA record for most field goals in a single game by a freshman and tied the ACC overall record for field goals in a game.

8 - Louisville sophomore **QB Lamar Jackson** tied the ACC single-game record for touchdown responsibility with eight in the Cardinals' 70-14 win over Charlotte. More

impressively, Jackson recorded six TD passes and two rushing touchdowns before halftime. Clemson's **Tajh Boyd** originally set the record with 8 TDR against NC State in 2012. Boyd recorded his total in the first three quarters of play. Jackson's total is now an ACC record for a half of play.

8 - Also the number of career returns for touchdowns by Duke's **CB DeVon Edwards**. Edwards has returned six kickoffs for scores, one shy of the ACC and NCAA record, and also has two interception returns for TDs in his career. Edwards leads all ACC active players in returns for TDs.

13 - This year, **ACC teams** will play 13 games against non-conference opponents ranked in the AP Preseason Top 25, including a pair games this weekend Virginia Tech takes on No. 10 Tennessee at the Bristol Motor Speedway in Bristol, Tennessee, and Virginia travels to No. 24 Oregon in Eugene, Oregon.

The Final 35 - Georgia Tech's 17-14 win over Boston College in Dublin, Ireland on Saturday was the Yellow Jackets' fifth victory in the past two calendar years in which they scored the winning points in the final 35 seconds of regulation or in overtime. In that time, Paul Johnson's Jackets scored the game winner against Georgia Southern with 13 seconds left; kicked a game-winning field goal against Virginia Tech as time expired; garnered an OT win over Georgia; returned a blocked field goal against FSU as time expired; and scored the game-winner versus BC with 35 seconds remaining.

38 - The number of career touchdowns for Pitt **TB James Conner**. Conner, who battled through a knee injury and Hodgkin's lymphoma in the off-season, scored once on the ground and had his first career TD reception in the Panthers' season-opening win over Villanova. That gives him 38 touchdowns in his career, including 37 rushing. The ACC record for scores is 52 by Virginia's **Wali Lundy** and 49 for rushing touchdowns held by NC State's **Ted Brown**.

50 - **Clemson** celebrates the 50th anniversary of Howard's Rock at Memorial Stadium this year. Howard's Rock was first placed on a pedestal at the top of the hill at the east end of the stadium for the UVa game on Sept. 24, 1966.

100 - Three Miami Hurricanes ran for 100 or more yards in Saturday's 70-3 victory over

Florida A&M in **Mark Walton** (116), **Gus Edwards** (106) and **Joe Yearby** (105). The achievement is the eighth of its kind in ACC history, accomplished most recently by the Duke trio of **Thomas Sirk**, **Shaun Wilson** and **Jela Duncan** in the Blue Devils' overtime bowl triumph over Indiana last year.

169 - The number of career wins for Georgia Tech's **Paul Johnson** in his 18-year head coaching career at Georgia Southern, Navy and Georgia Tech. Johnson now ranks fifth among all active FBS head coaches in career victories. Five ACC coaches begin 2016 ranked in the Top 25, including Miami's **Mark Richt** (10th), Louisville's **Bobby Petrino** (21st), Virginia's **Bronco Mendenhall** (23rd) and Wake Forest's **Dave Clawson** (24th).

174 - The number of receiving yards for Clemson **WR Mike Williams** in the Tigers' 19-13 win over Auburn. Williams, who missed virtually the entire 2015 season, recorded a career night in his return last week. Williams had nine catches for 174 yards.

210 - The number of receiving yards for Syracuse senior **WR Amba Etta-Tawo** in the Orange's 33-7 win over Colgate. Etta-Tawo had the most receiving yards of any player in the FBS in the first week of the season. His 12 catches were also the third-highest total for any FBS receiver in the first weekend of play.

264.45 - The pass efficiency rating for Louisville sophomore **QB Lamar Jackson** in the Cardinals' 70-14 win over Charlotte. Jackson, who completed 17 of 23 passes for 286 yards and 6 scores in the first half alone, had the highest pass efficiency rating among all FBS QBs on the first weekend of the season.

478 - The number of yards in total offense for Florida State redshirt freshman **QB Deondre Francois** in the Seminoles' win over 11th-ranked Ole Miss. In his first college game, Francois threw for 419 yards and ran for another 59.

1892 - **Georgia Tech** will play the first two football opponents in its history this year in back-to-back games, when the Yellow Jackets host Mercer and Vanderbilt. Tech played its very first football game at Mercer on Nov. 5, 1892, and then hosted Vanderbilt in Piedmont Park two weeks later on Nov. 19, 1892. Tech hosts the Bears this week and entertains the Commodores next week on Sept. 17.

An ACC record 331 Olympic sporting events will be streamed live this fall by ACC Network Extra, a dedicated digital channel for ACC sports that made its debut on August 19. The coverage marks the initial phase

Clemson, Florida State Make ACC AP Poll History

Tigers, Seminoles Become First Pair of ACC Teams Ranked in Top Five of the AP Preseason Poll

When Clemson was ranked second and Florida State was ranked fourth in the 2016 Associated Press College Football rankings that were released on Aug. 21, it marked the first time the ACC has had two teams ranked in the Top Five (or Top Four) of the AP Preseason poll. The Conference came close in 2004, when Florida State was ranked fifth nationally and Miami was rated sixth, but the league previously has never had a pair

of Top Five teams in the AP's first poll of the college football season. The league has had a pair of Top 10 teams in the AP Preseason Poll on six occasions, beginning with its first year of existence in 1953 when Maryland was ranked ninth and Duke 10th. The ACC also had two top 10 teams in 1991 (Georgia Tech (8) and Clemson (9)), 1997 (Florida State (3), North Carolina (7)), 2001 (Florida State (6), Georgia Tech (10)), 2004 and 2005 (Virginia Tech (8), Miami (9))

Collaborative Instant Replay

NCAA Football Rules require that all instant replay equipment and personnel be located in the stadium. For the 2016 season, the Football Rules Committee has approved a one-year experimental exception which allows conferences to use a “collaborative” process for instant replay. Under this exception, personnel in a location away from the stadium may assist the replay official at the stadium in making replay decisions.

The ACC has approved the implementation and use of a collaborative replay system for the 2016 season. Under this system, replay officials located in the Conference’s Game Day Operations Center (GDOC) in Greensboro will have the ability to view exactly what the in-stadium replay officials are viewing in real time. The replay officials in the GDOC will also be able to participate in the communication between the referee and the in-stadium replay official.

In order to implement this process, technology enhancements and upgrades are taking place this summer, both at the ACC GDOC and at all of the ACC’s stadiums. This will allow the replay officials in the GDOC and the in-stadium replay officials to simultaneously view the same camera angles of a play under review, and to communicate with one another, and with the referee.

The expected benefits of this collaborative process are greater consistency and accuracy in replay decisions

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

WHO WILL BE THE REPLAY OFFICIALS LOCATED IN THE GDOC?

ANSWER: They will be experienced replay officials who have consistently performed at a high level as in-stadium replay officials.

Q: HOW MANY REPLAY OFFICIALS WILL BE IN THE GDOC ON GAME DAYS?

A: There will be from one to three officials, depending on the number of games.

Q: WHAT WILL BE THEIR ROLE IN THE REPLAY PROCESS?

A: Their role will be to assist the in-stadium replay officials in the replay decision-making process, to ensure that the decisions being made are in accordance with the replay rules and are consistent with the replay philosophies established nationwide.

Q: TO WHAT VIDEO WILL THE OFFICIALS IN THE GDOC HAVE ACCESS?

A: They will have access to the same video that the in-stadium replay officials are provided, at the same time.

Q: WILL THE OFFICIALS IN THE GDOC BE ABLE TO COMMUNICATE WITH THE IN-STADIUM REPLAY OFFICIALS?

A: Yes, they will be able to speak with the in-stadium replay officials, and they will also have the capability to be involved in the communication with the referee during the replay process.

Q: DO THE ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE IN-STADIUM REPLAY OFFICIALS CHANGE AS A RESULT OF THIS NEW PROCESS?

A: No, the in-stadium replay officials will operate exactly as they have done in past seasons.

Q: DOES THIS NEW PROCESS CHANGE THE TYPES OF PLAYS THAT ARE REVIEWABLE?

A: No, having this new system neither adds to nor deletes from the list of reviewable plays.

Q: DOES THIS NEW PROCESS CHANGE THE REPLAY STANDARD OF REVIEW?

A: No, in order to reverse an on-field ruling, there still must be indisputable video evidence that the ruling on the field was incorrect.

Q: IN WHAT GAMES WILL THIS NEW SYSTEM BE USED?

A: The collaborative replay system will be used in all games played at ACC stadiums and at Notre Dame.

Atlantic Coast Conference Announces Football Players of the Week

Four from Florida State lead honorees following come-from-behind win over Ole Miss

GREENSBORO, N.C. (theACC.com) – Four student-athletes who played key roles in No. 4 Florida State's come-from-behind win over No. 11 Ole Miss highlight the first group of Atlantic Coast Conference Players of the Week of the 2016 football season. Seminole redshirt freshman quarterback Deondre Francois was voted both ACC Offensive Player of the Week and Rookie of the Week, while senior defensive end DeMarcus Walker earned ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week recognition. Derwin James claimed Defensive Back of the Week honors, and freshman placekicker Ricky Aguayo received the nod as the Specialist of the Week. The four helped Florida State wipe out a 22-point first-half deficit and stage the biggest comeback victory in school history in Monday night's 45-34 victory over the Rebels. Other honorees include Clemson's Taylor Hearn as Offensive Lineman of the Week and Kendall Joseph as Linebacker of the Week. Syracuse's Amba Etta-Tawo was voted the ACC Receiver of the Week. ACC Football Player of the Week selections are determined by a vote of a 14-member media panel.

OFFENSIVE BACK & ROOKIE – Deondre Francois, Florida State, Fr.-R, QB, 6-2, 205, Orlando, Fla. Francois led Florida State's record comeback by passing for 419 yards and two touchdowns versus No. 11 Ole Miss. Francois finished 33-of-52 on passing attempts in his collegiate debut at the Camping World Classic in his hometown of Orlando. The Seminoles trailed 28-6 in the second quarter, but Francois spearheaded 33 consecutive points as FSU defeated the Rebels, 45-34. Francois added 59 rushing yards to finish with 478 yards of total offense in the season opener. His 419 passing yards were the 15th most in school history and the most ever by a Seminole in his collegiate debut.

OFFENSIVE LINEMAN – Taylor Hearn, Clemson, So.-R, G, 6-5, 325, Williston, S.C. Hearn was No. 2 Clemson's top blocker for the first time in his young career with a 90 percent overall grade and a 98 percent score in pass blocking in Saturday night's 19-13 road win at Auburn. The sophomore had four knockdown blocks, played all 81 offensive snaps and did not allow a sack. He also threw a key block on Wayne Gallman's touchdown run and was a big reason the Tigers outgained Auburn in total yardage, 399-262.

RECEIVER – Amba Etta-Tawo, Syracuse, Sr.-R, WR, 6-2, 202, Powder Springs, Ga. Etta-Tawo caught a career-best 12 passes for 210 yards and one touchdown in his Syracuse debut to help the Orange defeat Colgate, 33-7, on Friday night. It was Etta-Tawo's third career 100-yard receiving game, and the sixth 200-yard receiving game in Syracuse history. His 210 yards rank fifth on the Orange single-game receiving yardage ledger. Etta-Tawo averaged 17.5 yards per catch, including a 43-yard TD reception on a pass from Eric Dungey in the first quarter for Syracuse's first touchdown of the 2016 campaign. Etta-Tawo was one of two Orange receivers to post double-digit catches against the Raiders, the first time in team history two players caught 10 or more passes in the same game.

DEFENSIVE LINEMAN – DeMarcus Walker, Florida State, Sr., DE, 6-4, 280, Jacksonville, Fla. Walker finished with six tackles against No. 11 Ole Miss on Monday night, including 4.5 quarterback sacks for minus-37 yards. In addition to setting career highs for sacks and tackles for loss in a game, Walker forced the sixth fumble of his career that led to the go-ahead touchdown in FSU's 45-34, come-from-behind victory over the Rebels. Walker, the ACC's forced fumble leader from last season, entered the 2016 season as the conference's returning tackles for loss leader and ranks second on the active sacks list. His 4.5 sacks – all of which came in the second half – are the most in a game for a Seminole under head coach Jimbo Fisher and were just a half-sack fewer than the school record. Monday night's sack total was the highest in college football for the 2016 opening weekend.

LINEBACKER – Kendall Joseph, Clemson, So.-R, LB, 6-0, 230, Belton, S.C. Joseph led Clemson in total tackles with 10 and tackles for loss with three in Saturday night's win at Auburn. The sophomore, who grew up just 30 miles from Clemson, had one sack and a quarterback pressure among his 66 plays on defense. He was the only player for either team in the defensive struggle to record three tackles for loss. Joseph was a big reason Clemson held Auburn to 87 yards rushing, 262 yards total of offense and just one touchdown.

DEFENSIVE BACK – Derwin James, Florida State, So., FS, 6-3, 211, Haines City, Fla. The preseason All-American led the Seminoles on Monday night with eight tackles (six solo) and the first interception of his career. With Ole Miss driving to extend a 7-0 lead in the first quarter, James intercepted the Rebels' Chad Kelly – the first interception of James' career and the first of three interceptions by the Seminoles defense on Monday night. James was a huge part of the Florida State defense that limited the Ole Miss offense to just six points and 75 total yards in the second half of the Seminoles' 45-34, come-from-behind win.

SPECIALIST – Ricky Aguayo, Florida State, Fr., PK, 6-2, 196, Mascotte, Fla. Playing his first game as a true freshman, Aguayo scored 22 points while connecting on all six of his field goals and going 4-for-4 on extra points in Monday night's comeback win over Ole Miss. His field goals in the first half kept the Rebels from extending a sizable lead, while his second-half field goals helped the Seminoles claw back and later extend the lead in a 45-34 win. His six made field goals set a school record and tied an ACC overall and national freshman record. Aguayo hit the first of six field goals in the first quarter to trim the Ole Miss lead to four points. He connected on at least one field goal in each quarter. His six field goals came from distances of 25, 21, 40, 40, 44, and 30 yards.

Four ACC Coaches In Top 15 in Wins Per Season



With the addition of **Mark Richt** and **Bronco Mendenhall** to the ACC, the league now features five of the top 11 coaches nationally in wins per season. Led by Florida State's **Jimbo Fisher**, who has averaged 11.33 wins during his first six seasons as a head coach, four other ACC coaches rank among the nation's top 11 coaches in wins per season with a minimum of five seasons as a head coach.



Miami's **Richt** is fifth (9.67), followed by Clemson's **Dabo Swinney** (7th), Louisville's **Bobby Petrino** (10th) and Virginia's **Bronco Mendenhall** is 11th.

Georgia Tech's **Paul Johnson** is not far behind, averaging 8.84 wins a year, which puts him in 14th place. **Beamer**, the winningest active FBS head coach, retired after the Camping World Independence Bowl.

Preseason Predictions; All-ACC

ACC Football Kickoff Media Tabs Clemson to Repeat For ACC Football Title

GREENSBORO, N.C.—Clemson is the preseason favorite to repeat as Atlantic Coast Conference football champion, according to a poll of 191 media members in attendance at the 2016 ACC Football Kickoff in Charlotte.

The Tigers, who posted a 14-1 overall record last season and reached the College Football Playoff national title game, are also picked to again capture the Atlantic Division, while North Carolina is favored to repeat as the Coastal Division winner.

Clemson junior quarterback Deshaun Watson was the overwhelming choice to repeat as ACC Player of the Year after his record-setting 2015 campaign. Watson was also the media's preseason selection as conference player of the year last season.

The Tigers were picked the likely 2016 ACC champions on 144 ballots, followed by Florida State with 39 votes and North Carolina with seven. One voter chose Louisville.

In the Atlantic Division preseason voting, Clemson received 148 first-place votes and finished with 1,293 total points. Florida State received 42 first-place votes and placed second with 1,176 points, while Louisville had one first-place vote and was third in the voting with 961 points.

NC State (704 total points) was tabbed for a fourth-place Atlantic Division finish, followed by Boston College (441), Syracuse (426) and Wake Forest (347).

North Carolina was selected the likely Coastal winner by 121 voters and finished with 1,238 total points, followed by Miami with 50 first-place votes and 1,108 points. Pitt received 14 first-place votes and was third in the balloting with 859 points.

Virginia Tech (three first-place votes) placed fourth with 697 points, followed by Duke (597), Georgia Tech (588) and Virginia (261). Two voters chose Duke to claim the Coastal Division, while one gave Georgia Tech the nod.

Preseason Favorite Clemson Has 10 Selected to the 2016 All-ACC Preseason Football Team

GREENSBORO, N.C.—Defending league champion Clemson leads all schools with 10 selections to the 2016 All-Atlantic Coast Conference Preseason Football Team announced on Wednesday. The team was selected by a vote of 191 media members who were credentialed for the 2016 ACC Football Kickoff in Charlotte.

Clemson junior quarterback Deshaun Watson, who was voted to repeat as ACC Preseason Player of the Year by the Kickoff media, is joined on the All-ACC offensive preseason team by Tiger wide receiver Artavis Scott, tight end Jordan Leggett, offensive tackle Mitch Hyatt, offensive guard Tyrone Crowder, center Jay Guillermo and placekicker Greg Huegel. Defensive tackle Carlos Watkins, linebacker Ben Boulware and cornerback Cordrea Tankersley are Clemson's defensive selections.

Florida State placed five student-athletes on the 2016 All-ACC preseason team, while Louisville and North Carolina each had three selected.

Watson, who in 2015 became the first player in FBS history to pass for 4,000 yards and rush for 1,000 more, is joined in the preseason All-ACC backfield by Florida State junior Dalvin Cook and North Carolina junior Elijah Hood.

FSU's Cook was the 2015 recipient of the Jim Brown Award – given to the nation's top running back by the Touchdown Club of Columbus – after setting school single-season records for rushing yards (1,691) and all-purpose yards (1,935). UNC's Hood rushed for 1,463 yards and 17 touchdowns as a sophomore last season. His single-season rushing total was the second-highest ever by a Tar Heel.

Clemson's Scott is joined on the preseason All-ACC wide receiving corps by fellow juniors Isaiah Ford of Virginia Tech and Travis Rudolph of Florida State. The trio combined for 227 catches, 2,981 yards and 24 touchdowns in 2015.

Preseason All-ACC tight end recognition goes to Clemson's Leggett, who was a John Mackey Award finalist last season with 40 catches for 525 yards and eight

touchdowns. He is joined on the offensive line by Florida State's Roderick Johnson and Clemson teammate Hyatt at tackle. Clemson's Tyrone Crowder and Pitt's Dorian Johnson man the offensive guard spots, while the Tigers' Guillermo was selected at the center position.

Florida State senior DeMarcus Walker and Pitt red-shirt senior Ejuan Price were the choices at defensive end, while Clemson's Watkins and Louisville's DeAngelo Brown received nods at defensive tackle. Price led the ACC and ranked eighth nationally with 0.88 quarterback sacks per game (11.5 total) last season.

Clemson's Boulware and the Louisville senior duo of Keith Kelsey and Devonte Fields fill the linebacker slots. Fields led the NCAA last season in tackles for loss per game (1.73), and Kelsey ranked among the ACC leaders in total tackles with 107.

The secondary features a pair of senior cornerbacks in Clemson's Tankersley and North Carolina Des Lawrence. Florida State safety Derwin James is joined at safety by Virginia junior Quin Blanding, the 2014 ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year. Tankersley's five interceptions last season tied for second in the conference, and Blanding ranked second in tackles per game with 9.6.

The special teams include Clemson's Huegel, a red-shirt sophomore. Miami senior Justin Vogel earned the spot at punter, while North Carolina senior Ryan Switzer is a repeat choice as return specialist. Switzer enters his final season with an ACC-record seven punt returns for touchdowns and is one shy of the NCAA mark.

Watson led the overall voting, being chosen by 188 of the 191 media members casting ballots. Florida State's Cook was named by 184 voters, and the Seminoles' Johnson was named on 153 ballots.

Watson, Scott, Roderick Johnson, Blanding and Switzer are repeat selections from the 2015 All-ACC preseason team.

If more than one team in the same division is tied for the best winning percentage in its Conference games, the procedures listed below will be followed to determine the division's representative in the ACC Championship Game:

Two-Team Tie:

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall win percentage. (Divisional and non-divisional) and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken from first-to-last using the league's tiebreaking procedures.
4. Overall win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined win percentage vs. all non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based on their order of finish (overall conference win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the higher ranking by the Team Rating Score metric provided by SportSource Analytics following the conclusion of regular season games.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw.(as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.)

Three-Team (or More) Team Tie:

(Once a team is eliminated from the tie, the tie-breaker procedures restart for the remaining teams. If the three (or more) team tie can be reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaker format will then be applied.)

1. Combined head-to-head win percentage among the tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall (divisional and non-divisional) Conference win percentage, and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken first to last, using the league's tie-breaker policies.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

The College Football Playoff begins its third year of operation after two highly-acclaimed years of operation season. The Playoff features the top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and a national championship game played in a different city each year. Each semifinal is played during the New Year's holiday with the National Championship Game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later.

The College Football Playoff selection committee chooses the four teams for the playoff based on their performance during the regular season, including, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams are seeded so that #1 will play #4 in one semifinal and #2 will meet #3 in the other, with the winners advancing to the national championship game. The selection committee announces its rankings each week on Tuesdays beginning this year on Nov. 1. The final rankings will be announced on Sunday, Dec. 4.

The semifinals rotate among six different bowls: the Chick-fil-A Peach, Goodyear Cotton, Fiesta and Capital One Orange Bowls; the Rose Bowl presented by Northwestern Mutual and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight other teams in four compelling matchups.

ACC Bowl Quick Selection Order

(The ACC is in the third year of six-year contracts with its current bowl partners. The current College Football Playoff format is a 12-year agreement)

College Football Playoff (four teams)

If the ACC Champion is not in one of the semifinal games this year, it will appear the Capital One Orange Bowl. There is no limit on how many teams the College Football Playoff may choose from a particular conference. There is also a possibility an ACC team could be chosen for a berth in one of the New Year's Six Bowls if it is ranked high enough. This year only one at-large spot is open in a New Year's Six Bowl, that would be in the Goodyear Cotton Bowl.

Capital One Orange Bowl

The ACC champion, if not in the College Football Playoff, will appear this year in the Capital One Orange Bowl. The opponent will be the highest-ranked available team from the SEC, Big Ten or Notre Dame. If the ACC champion is selected for the College Football Playoff, then the next highest ranked ACC team will serve as the host team in the Capital One Orange Bowl.

Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl

In a year in which the Capital One Orange Bowl will not host the national semifinals, and the ACC opponent in the Orange Bowl is a team from the Big Ten, then the ACC will have a team selected to the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl prior to the selection for the Russell Athletic Bowl.

Russell Athletic Bowl

Has first pick of ACC teams in 2016 after the College Football Playoff, the Capital One Orange Bowl, the Host Bowls (if applicable) and the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl (only should the ACC Orange Bowl opponent be a team from the Big Ten).

The One-Win Rule Applies Only to Notre Dame

The ACC's bowl selection will no longer be bound by the rigidity of a "one-win rule" but will have a general list of criteria to emphasize regionality and quality matchups on the field. A one-win rule does apply to Notre Dame's participation in the ACC Bowl structure. Notre Dame is eligible for ACC Bowl selection beginning with the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl and continuing through the league's bowl selections. However, Notre Dame must be within one win of the ACC available team which has the best overall record, in order to be chosen. In other words, if an ACC team was 9-3, a 7-5 Notre Dame team could not be chosen in its place. Notre Dame would have to be 8-4 to be chosen over a 9-3 league team.

ACC Bowl Expenses And Revenue

The Atlantic Coast Conference shares all bowl revenues. Each school is provided an initial expense allotment. The Conference will share in the cost of unsold tickets for participating bowl institutions. After all bowl expense allotments and ticket reimbursements are subtracted from the total bowl revenue, the remaining revenue is distributed evenly among ACC schools.

The ACC In Overtime

The ACC & Overtime

When Duke ended regulation tied with Indiana at 41-41 in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl on December 26, 2015, they played the 77th game featuring an ACC team that has had to go to extra sessions. Of the 77 overtime contests, a large portion of them--31--have been played in September. Games have gone into overtime for ACC teams a total of 20 times in November, while 14 have been played in October, three in August, seven in December and two in January (2006 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl). Of the 77 overtime contests, 38 have been ACC games while 39 nonconference games have gone into overtime. The home team has a 41-26 advantage in the 67 games played on campus. The team which wins the toss has a 41-36 record. Fifty-six of the games were decided in the first overtime with 14 games in double overtime, six in triple overtime and one in four overtimes.
