VIRGINIA IN THE NCAA BASEBALL CHAMPIONSHIP

- Competing in its 17th NCAA tournament, Virginia is 53-36 in NCAA play.
- UVA owns six regional championships (2009, '10, '11, '13, '14, '15).
- UVA is 41-20 in the NCAA tournament since 2009, the second-most NCAA wins in that span (Vanderbilt, 46).
- Under Brian O'Connor (since 2004), UVA is 47-30 in the NCAA tournament and 32-21 in regional play.
- UVA advanced to the College World Series in 2009, 2011, 2014 and 2015, taking runner-up honors to Vanderbilt in the 2014 CWS Finals before winning the program's first national championship in 2015 in a rematch with Vandy.

VIRGINIA ONE OF FOUR SCHOOLS IN LAST 14 NCAA TOURNAMENTS

- Virginia is one of four Division I baseball programs to reach the NCAA tournament each of the last 14 seasons (including 2017).
- Top current NCAA tournament streaks: Florida State (40), Cal State Fullerton (26), Rice (23) and Virginia (14).
- The UVA streak is tied for the 12th longest in Division I Baseball history.

ON THE ROAD IN NCAA PLAY

- Virginia is 27-19 away from home all-time in NCAA tournament play (23-15 neutral, 4-4 road).
- UVA has not played a true road game in the NCAA tournament since the 2009 Oxford Super Regional when the Cavaliers took two of three at Ole Miss to advance to their first College World Series.

A LONE STAR WELCOME

- Virginia is playing its first games in program history in the state of Texas.
- UVA has never played Dallas Baptist, and its lone game against TCU came in the 2014 College World Series, a 3-2 Cavalier win in 15 innings.
- UVA played a three-game home series against Central Connecticut in 2004 in Brian O'Connor's first year at Virginia, with the Cavaliers sweeping the series.

IT'S THE POSTSEASON ALREADY? A QUICK RECAP ...

- Virginia eclipsed the 40-win mark in the regular season for the first time since 2014 and already has its 11th 40-win season in the last 14 years.
- After dropping three of its first four ACC series, Virginia won its last six series and (most consecutive series wins since nine straight in 2014).
- Since the start of April, UVA has gone 22-7, including 14-6 in ACC play.
- UVA leads the ACC in batting (.324) and hit a league-best .311 in ACC games.
- UVA finished second in the ACC Coastal Division (4-seed in ACC tournament).
- Adam Haseley was the regular-season ACC batting champion (.400) and also leads the league in runs (66) and on-base percentage (.496).
- Haseley and Pavin Smith are two of the 25 semifinalists for the Golden Spikes Award.

THINGS TO KNOW

- The Fort Worth Regional features three of the nation's winningest teams of the 2010s: No. 1 UVA (373), No. 7 TCU (356) and No. 22 DBU (311).
- Virginia recorded its most regular-season wins since 2014 and has its 11th 40-win season in the last 14 years.
- UVA ranks fifth nationally in batting (.324) and has five players among the ACC's top 20 in batting.
- Pavin Smith owns a UVA-record 72 RBI this year and ranks second in career RBI with 173.
- In 10 games since moving back to the 2-hole, Jake McCarthy is batting a team-high .444 (20-45) with 8 XBH.
- Adam Haseley has reached base safely in 54 of 55 games, including a current streak of 37 straight (most at UVA since Dan Grovatt - 43 in 2009).
- UVA has hit 60 home runs - second most in the O'Connor era and tied for fourth most in school history.

POSTSEASON EXPERIENCE

- Virginia boasts a wealth of postseason experience, particularly with its position players, who have played in 76 NCAA tournament games.
- Robbie Coman (18 GP/16 GS) and Ernie Clement, Adam Haseley and Pavin Smith (15/15 each) have combined for 63 games of postseason experience.
- Coman is the lone position player remaining from the Cavaliers' 2014 CWS team (he did not play vs. TCU).
- On the pitching side, Alec Bettinger has made five appearances, including two starts, while Tommy Doyle has made four relief appearances.

SIX CAVALIERS EARN ALL-ACC HONORS, MURDOCK ALL-FRESHMAN TEAM

- Adam Haseley (OF) and Pavin Smith (1B) each earned first-team honors, while Cameron Simmons (OF) nabbed second-team laurels.
- Robbie Coman (C), Ernie Clement (SS) and Tommy Doyle (RP) notched third-team honors.
- Smith was a second-team honoree in 2016, while Clement was a second-team honoree at second base last year. Coman, Doyle, Haseley and Simmons each were first-time honorees.
- Noah Murdock (P) was an All-Freshman Team honoree.

HASELEY, SMITH NAMED GOLDEN SPIKES AWARD SEMIFINALISTS

- Virginia juniors Adam Haseley and Pavin Smith were named two of the 25 semifinalists for the Golden Spikes Award on Wednesday.
- UVA joins Louisville and Oregon State as the only schools to have two players as semifinalists.
- The Atlantic Coast Conference led all conference with six semifinalists.
- The finalists will be announced June 14.

HASELEY HAVING HISTORIC SEASON

- Adam Haseley is just the third player to bat .400 in the regular season under Brian O'Connor, joining Keith Werman (.446 in 2010) and Mike Papi (.408 in 2013).
- Haseley is putting up team highs in batting (.399), extra-base hits (30) and on base percentage (.496) while hitting in the 3-hole.
- He leads the ACC in batting (.399), runs (66) and OBP (.496), ranks third in slugging (.676) fourth in hits (85), sixth in walks (41), seventh in home runs (14) and ninth in RBI (54)

MORE ON HASELEY

- Adam Haseley has reached base safely in 54 of his 55 games, including 37 straight (longest at UVA since Dan Grovatt reached in 43 straight in 2009).
- He is on the John Olerud Two-Way Player Award and Golden Spikes Award watch lists and is a semifinalist for the Dick Howser Trophy.
- Haseley owns a team-high 14 home runs – seven of which have gone to the opposite field. He is tied for sixth in UVA single-season history in homers.
- He also is 7-1 with a 3.58 ERA in 65 1/3 innings on the mound.

CAVALIERS LEAD ACC, AMONG NATION'S LEADERS IN BATTING

- Virginia leads the ACC in batting at .324, 16 points ahead of Wake Forest (.308).
- UVA is in line to lead the conference in batting for the first time since 2013.
- UVA also won ACC batting crowns in 2009 and 2010.
- This is UVA's team batting average since 2010 and sixth best in program history.
- In ranking ninth nationally in scoring at 7.9 runs per game, UVA is fifth among all Division I teams in batting and 14th in hits (614).

OFFENSE MAKES ITS MARK IN UVA RECORD BOOKS

- Virginia's offense is one of the most potent in program history.
- UVA has seven regulars hitting .320 or better with five among the ACC's top 20 in batting, including the conference's leading hitter, Adam Haseley, at .399.

AGGRESSIVE CAVALIERS PUT BALL IN PLAY

- UVA batters have struck out an ACC-low 212 times in 56 games (3.7 per game).
- That total by far the fewest among all power-conference teams. Oregon State has the second fewest at 316. (Louisville is second fewest in ACC with 355).
- Six ACC teams have struck out twice as many times as Virginia.
- UVA is the only ACC team to walk more than it has struck out (243 BB).
- The Cavaliers have struck out five or fewer times in 48 of 56 games.
- Ernie Clement (1st), Pavin Smith (2nd) and Robbie Coman (24th) all rank among the top 25 nationally in toughest to strike out and are the three toughest to whiff in the ACC.

SIMMONS CONTINUES HOT STREAK

- After a hot April, Cameron Simmons has continued his solid work at the plate since the finals break.
- The second-team All-ACC honoree currently is batting .373 (fourth in the ACC).
- He batted .374 in ACC games, tops among UVA players and third in the ACC (best in league games by UVA player since Mike Papi hit .412 in conference games in 2013).
- He is seventh in the ACC in OBP (.448) and RBI (56).
- Simmons has recorded multiple-hit games in eight of his last 12 contests and had a streak of eight straight multi-hit games earlier this year.

MCCARTHY THRIVES IN 2-HOLE

- Jake McCarthy batted a solid .291 in his first 25 games, but is hitting .380 in the last 31 contests (third on team in that span).
- After batting in the 9-hole for 19 games, McCarthy moved back into the 2-slot eight games ago and is batting .444 (20-45) with a pair of triples and three home runs in that time.
- McCarthy is 27-for-29 in stolen bases this year, the third-most steals in one season at UVA and most since 2008. It ranks ninth nationally this year.

NOTING THE ACC TOURNAMENT

- Fourth-seeded Virginia split its two games in pool play at the ACC tournament, falling in the opener to No. 9 Duke, 4-3, before rebounding to trounce No. 5 Clemson, 10-2.
- UVA scored eight runs on nine hits in the first inning to run out to a huge lead against Clemson.
- The Cavaliers were limited to eight hits against Duke.
- Caleb Knight was 3-for-6 in the tournament, while Ernie Clement was 4-for-9. Cameron Simmons had a team-high four RBI, including a three-run homer against Clemson.

SMITH & HASELEY LEAD D1BASEBALL'S

TOP HITTERS LIST

- Pavin Smith and Adam Haseley were listed as the top two college hitters recently by D1Baseball.com.
- The list was compiled after polling scouts and coaches from across the nation.
- According to D1Baseball, the "list is geared toward ranking the college hitters with the best pure "hit tool" on the scouting scale MLB scouts use to analyze these players for the upcoming draft."

CAVALIERS MASHING

- UVA has hit 60 home runs, second most in the Brian O'Connor era and tied for fourth most in program history.
- The Cavaliers are one off the top home run season under O'Connor, which occurred in 2010 and came with the old bats.
- This ties the 2002 team for fourth in school history.
- The Cavaliers hit 42 home runs in 2016 (60 games).
- Twelve Cavaliers have gone deep this year.
- Adam Haseley is eighth in the ACC with 14 home runs, while Pavin Smith is 14th with a dozen.
- UVA had a streak of 10 straight games with at least one home run snapped on April 19 (longest since 11-game stretch from Feb. 28-March 15, 1998).

RECENT PROGRAM NOTES

- Virginia owns the most wins in the nation this decade (373).
- UVA has won 638 games since 2004 – an average of more than 45 victories per season.
- UVA has four 50-win seasons: 2010 (51), 2011 (56), 2013 (50) and 2014 (53).
- UVA has recorded at least 38 wins each of the last 14 years, including 11 40-win seasons.
- Every UVA recruiting class since 2005-06 that has completed its eligibility has played in at least one College World Series.

THE TOURNAMENT STREAK

- Virginia has qualified for 14 straight NCAA tournaments, including six regional championships, four CWS trips and UVA's first national championship in 2015.
- UVA is one of four programs nationally to play in each tournament since 2004 and one of three to play in six of the last eight NCAA Super Regionals.
- Virginia's streak is tied for the 12th longest in NCAA Division I history.

NCAA TOURNAMENT SUCCESS

- UVA has won 41 NCAA tournament games since 2009 – second most in the nation in that span.
- Twelve of the 41 tournament wins since 2009 have come in the College World Series.
- Virginia has earned four national seeds in the NCAA Tournament, including the No. 1 overall seed in 2011.

BRINGING HOME THE HARDWARE

- Virginia has made four College World Series appearances, including two trips to the CWS Finals.
- UVA has won six NCAA Regional and four Super Regional championships since 2009.
- UVA earned the 2010 and 2011 ACC Coastal Division Championships (regular season).
- UVA has made four appearances in the ACC Championship game, including titles in 2009 and '11.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION

- UVA reached the No. 1 national ranking in the polls in 2010, 2011, 2014 and 2015.
- Twenty-four Cavaliers have earned All-America selections in the last 13 seasons.
- Brian O'Connor has been named National Coach of the Year on three occasions.

SUCCESS AT NEXT LEVEL

- Sixty-nine Cavaliers have been selected in the MLB Draft in the last 13 years, including three in 2016.
- UVA has had at least one first-round draft pick in each of the last three seasons.
- Under the current coaching staff, 14 former Cavaliers have reached the big leagues.
- Eleven former Cavaliers played in Major League Baseball in 2016.
- Sean Doolittle (Oakland) and Ryan Zimmerman (Washington) each have been named MLB All-Stars.

RUN, RUN AND RUN SOME MORE

- Virginia has stolen 75 bases this year (in 89 attempts), its most since swiping 90 in 2011 (68 games). UVA ranks third in the ACC in stolen bases.
- Four Cavaliers have at least nine stolen bases. UVA's leader in 2016 was Ernie Clement with six.
- Jake McCarthy has an ACC-best 27 steals in 29 tries. He ranks ninth nationally.
- It marks the third-most steals in a season for a UVA player and the most since Greg Miclat had 30 in 2008.
- UVA stole 27 bases in 60 games last year, its fewest stolen bases during the Brian O'Connor era.

PAVIN SMITH: NOT YOUR NORMAL POWER HITTER

- Pavin Smith has put up some big numbers this season, hitting for power as well as contact.
- Smith has more home runs (12) than strikeouts (9).
- He ranks as the second toughest to strike out of any player in Division I, with nine strikeouts in 217 official at bats (261 plate appearances).

DOYLE NAMED TO STOPPER OF YEAR WATCH LIST

- Junior right-hander Tommy Doyle was named to the midseason Stopper of the Year Watch List.
- Doyle is 3-1 with 13 saves in 22 outings this year.
- He is second in the ACC and 15th nationally in saves. Eight of his saves came in ACC play.
- He has struck out 36 and walked nine over 32 2/3 innings out of the bullpen.

BETTINGER HAVING BIG YEAR OUT OF PEN

- Senior right-hander Alec Bettinger has worn many hats during his career, working as a starter, reliever and closer.
- This year he primarily has worked as a long reliever. In 13 of his 19 appearances, he has pitched more than two innings, including in nine of his last 10 outings.
- He is tied for second in the league with eight wins (8-0 record) and owns a 2.54 ERA in 56 2/3 innings while limiting opponents to a .176 batting average.
- He is now 22-10 in his career (tied for fourth in wins in school history).
- Bettinger has appeared in 80 career games (seventh in school history).

TIME TO ... GO TO WORK!

- Pavin Smith and Adam Haseley are the first UVA teammates to each record at least 10 homers in a season since Phil Gosselin (11), Jarrett Parker (10) and Steven Proscia (10) in 2010.
- Haseley (14) is seventh in the ACC in home runs, while Smith has 12. Cameron Simmons is not far off with nine.
- With 27 career homers, Smith is tied with Ryan Gilleland (1995-98) for eighth in program history. He is second in career RBI at UVA with 173 (needs 10 to pass Steven Proscia for record).

WHATEVER IT TAKES

- A key part of Virginia's scoring numbers has come from execution.
- UVA is second nationally in sacrifice flies with 38 and 19th in sacrifice bunts with 49.
- UVA also has been hit by 60 pitches, which is fifth most in the conference.

CAVALIERS IN MLB (as of May 31)

- Seven former Virginia baseball players are currently on Major League Baseball 25-man rosters.
- Nine former Cavaliers have seen time on MLB rosters this season.
- Virginia had seven alums on Opening Day rosters, most among ACC schools and tied for fifth most nationally.
- A program-record 11 Virginia alumni played in MLB at some point during the 2016 season, matching the UVA record, set in 2015.
- 14-year veteran LHP Javier Lopez retired on Feb. 8 after seven years with the San Francisco Giants. He won four World Series championships (three with SF, one with Boston).
- Seven former Cavaliers are currently in triple-A: Stephen Bruno (Chicago Cubs), Kyle Crockett (Cleveland), Derek Fisher (Houston), Phil Gosselin (Pittsburgh), Mike Papi (Cleveland), Will Roberts (Cleveland) and Tyler Wilson (Baltimore).

BIG INNINGS PLAGUE CAVALIERS

- Virginia has given up 20 innings of four or more runs this year, including 14 in ACC play.
- In eight of UVA's 12 ACC defeats, the Cavaliers surrendered at least one inning of four-plus runs.
- UVA allowed 12 innings of four or more runs in 2016 and 16 in 2015.

O'CONNOR REACHES 600 WINS

- Brian O'Connor won his 600th career game on Feb. 21 against VMI. He was the 10th coach in ACC history to reach the 600-win plateau and, in 825 games, the second-fastest in league history to hit 600 wins (Mike Martin, 802 games).
- Now with 638 career wins, O'Connor ranks ninth in league history.
- The winningest coach in program history, O'Connor also holds the UVA record for career ACC wins (262) and NCAA tournament wins (47).

RECORDS WATCH

- Having pitched in 80 career games, RHP **Alec Bettinger** has appeared in the seventh-most contests in school history.
- Bettinger has won 22 career games – tied for fourth in UVA history.
- **Adam Haseley** stands fifth in school history with 183 runs scored and needs one to pass Matt Street (2002-05) and three to eclipse Tyler Cannon (2007-10) for fourth.
- Haseley is ninth in program history with 10 triples and will move into a fifth-place tie with his next triple.
- **Pavin Smith** (27 HR) is eighth in career HR at UVA and with 173 RBI is second in program history.
- Smith has a program-record 72 RBI this season.
- With 16 career saves, **Tommy Doyle** is tied for seventh in school history (would move to sixth with next save). He has 13 saves this year (seventh in UVA single-season history).
- **Jake McCarthy** (27 SB) is third in single-season stolen bases and needs three to reach the No. 2 slot (Greg Miclat, 2008). The record is 32, set by Miclat in 2007.

O'CONNOR RANKS THIRD IN ACTIVE WIN PCT., 18TH ALL-TIME

- Virginia head coach Brian O'Connor is 638-237-2 (.729) in his 14th season as UVA's head coach.
- O'Connor surpassed Dennis Womack (594 wins, 1981-2003) as the winningest coach in program history on May 28, 2016, against Louisville.
- O'Connor's 72.7 percent winning percentage entering the season ranked No. 3 among active Division I head coaches.
- O'Connor also ranks 18th all-time in career winning percentage among all coaches with at least 10 years of head coaching experience.
- Virginia won at least 38 games in each of O'Connor's 14 seasons, including 11 40-win seasons and four 50-win campaigns.

LONGEVITY, STABILITY IN COACHING STAFF

- Virginia's coaching trio of Brian O'Connor, Kevin McMullan and Karl Kuhn are in their 14th year together.
- No current coaching staff in Division I college baseball has been together longer.
- The staff has combined for 638 wins, an average of over 45 wins per season, and has reached the NCAA tournament in each of their first 14 seasons.

DEFENSE TOPS ACC UNDER CURRENT STAFF

- Virginia has posted the ACC's best fielding percentage since the current coaching staff arrived in 2004.
- UVA has accrued a .973 fielding percentage over the last 13 seasons.
- UVA owns a .974 fielding percentage this year (sixth in ACC).

CAVALIERS TOP ACC IN BATTING SINCE 2009

- Virginia owns the ACC's top offense over the past eight years (combined .303 average) and is tops again this season (.324).
- The Cavaliers led the conference in batting in 2009, 2010 and 2013 and were second in 2011, 2012 and 2014.
- UVA was third in the ACC in batting last year at .304.

UVA SECOND NATIONALLY IN ERA SINCE 2005

- Entering the season, Virginia owned the second-best ERA among all NCAA Division I teams over the past 12 seasons with a 3.17 team ERA since 2005.
- UVA finished second nationally in ERA (2.23) in 2014 and has ranked among the NCAA top 20 in nine of the 13 years under the current coaching staff.
- Virginia led the nation in ERA in 2011 (2.24) and posted No. 3 marks in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009.

- Davenport Field is scheduled to undergo a \$12-18 million expansion following the 2017 season, with renovations slated to be complete in time for the start of the 2018 campaign.
- Among the planned renovations to improve the game-day experience:
 - A new grand entry in right field.
 - An expanded concourse down the right-field line that extends around the right-field pole toward right centerfield.
 - A field-level club area (seating for approximately 140 fans).
 - Chairback seats along the first baseline.
 - Moving the UVA bullpen to left field to make room for chairback seats along the third baseline.
 - New concessions, merchandise, and restroom facilities.
 - Areas for player training and development, including an indoor pitching development center.
 - New offices for the baseball coaches.
