VIRGINIA IN THE NCAA BASEBALL CHAMPIONSHIP

- Counting this year, Virginia has competed in each of the last 10 NCAA tournaments and 13 overall.
- UVa is 30-27 all-time in the NCAA tournament, although the Cavaliers are 18-11 over the last four seasons.
- Under Brian O'Connor (since 2004), UVa is 24-21 in the NCAAs.
- Seeded sixth in the 2013 field, Virginia has earned a national seed for the third time. UVa was the No. 5 seed in 2010 and the top seed in 2011.
- UVa owns three regional championships (2009, 2010, 2011) and advanced to the College World Series in 2009 and 2011.

VIRGINIA ONE OF EIGHT SCHOOLS IN LAST 10 NCAA TOURNAMENTS

- Virginia is one of eight Division I baseball programs to reach the NCAA tournament each of the last 10 seasons (including 2013).
- The Cavaliers are one of four teams in the ACC to hold that distinction, joining Florida State, Miami and North Carolina.
- The other programs: Arkansas, Cal State Fullerton, Rice and South Carolina.

VIRGINIA AGAINST THE 2013 NCAA FIELD

- Virginia faced 10 teams this year that advanced to the NCAA tournament (Clemson, Florida State, Georgia Tech, Liberty, North Carolina, NC State, Miami, Towson, Virginia Tech and William and Mary).
- Twenty-eight of Virginia's 57 games were against NCAA qualifiers – UVa went 20-8 against those teams.

VIRGINIA PLAYS HOST TO FOURTH STRAIGHT REGIONAL

- This is UVa's seventh regional at Davenport Field and its fourth straight (2004, 2006, 2007, 2010-2013); UVa won home regionals in 2010 and 2011.
- Virginia joins South Carolina and UCLA as the only schools to host regionals each of the last four years.
- UVa is 12-9 in its six previous home regionals.

CAVALIERS BOAST FOURTH-MOST WINS IN PROGRAM HISTORY

- Virginia has 47 victories this season, matching the 2006 team for the fourth-most wins in a season in UVa baseball history.
- The only UVa seasons with more wins: 2011 (56), 2010 (51) and 2009 (49).
- Virginia earned 45 regular-season wins, tying the 2006 and 2011 teams for the most in program history.

ODDS AND ENDS

- UVa is the only team nationally to win three series against top-10 RPI teams.
- The Cavaliers rank 11th nationally in batting and third in scoring.
- UVa is first in the ACC in batting (.314), third in ERA (3.14) and seventh in fielding (.969).
- Mike Papi leads the nation in on base percentage (.536).
- UVa pitchers rank fifth nationally in fewest walks per nine innings (2.37/9 IP).
- UVa owns 21 come-from-behind wins this season.

CAVALIERS HIT 40 WINS FOR EIGHTH TIME IN 10 YEARS

- Virginia recorded its 40th win of the year May 10 against Duke, reaching the 40-win plateau for the eighth time in the last 10 seasons.
- UVa had one season of 40 wins or more prior to 2004 (1996).
- UVa has recorded 39 wins or more in all 10 years under the current coaching staff (39 wins in 2008, 2012).

SIX CAVALIERS NAMED ALL-ACC

- Virginia boasted a conference-high six players on the 2013 All-ACC Team.
- UVa had four players on the All-ACC First Team: Kyle Crockett (relief pitcher), Reed Gragnani (second base), Nick Howard (utility) and Mike Papi (outfield).
- Joe McCarthy was named to the second team at outfield, while Branden Cogswell was a second-team honoree at shortstop.
- Gragnani also was named to the ACC All-Tournament Team.
- McCarthy was named the ACC Freshman of the Year, while Brian O'Connor was tabbed the league's Coach of the Year for the fourth time (2004, 2010, 2011).

VIRGINIA AIMS TO CONTINUE SUCCESS AT HOME

- Virginia has played some of its best baseball this season on its home turf at Davenport Field.
- The Cavaliers posted a 32-3 record at home, including a 13-2 mark in conference play.
- Following a 9-8 loss on April 10 to Radford, Virginia won its final 10 home games, including ACC series sweeps of Florida State and Duke.
- UVa is 156-31 (.834) at home since 2009.

POTENT LINEUP FROM TOP TO BOTTOM

- There is not an easy out in the Virginia lineup, as all nine Virginia starters are batting at least .279, while six are batting over .300.
- Five Cavaliers have at least 44 RBI apiece, including Reed Gragnani, who owns 48 RBI while typically batting in the 7- or 8-hole.
- Nine of UVa's 10 regulars in the lineup own on base percentages of .367 or better, while four are over .400.

VIRGINIA FINISHES THIRD IN RPI

- Virginia finished No. 3 in the NCAA's RPI report.
- Vanderbilt and North Carolina held the top two spots.
- UVa is 9-1 against the RPI top 10, 16-8 against the top 25 and 19-9 against the top 50.
- UVa is the only team nationally to win three series against RPI top-10 foes (NCSU, FSU, UNC).

CAVALIERS FINISH OFF DEGREES

- Seven members of the Virginia baseball program earned degrees from the University of Virginia on May 19.
- Rob Amaro (sociology), Reed Gragnani (history), Colin Harrington (chemistry), Whit Mayberry (commerce) and manager Taylor Myers (psychology) all earned their bachelor's degrees.
- Jared King (kinesiology) and Scott Silverstein (education) earned their master's degrees.
- King and Silverstein have been on five UVa teams that have combined for 242 wins, while the fourth-year class has been a part of 193 victories.

OFFENSE PUTS UP BIG INNINGS REGULARLY

- Virginia has scored three or more runs in an inning 68 times this year.
- UVa has recorded three runs in an inning on 31 occasions this year.
- UVa has been particularly potent later in the game and has outscored foes 227-75 in the fifth through eighth innings: 43-18 in fifth, 54-25 in sixth, 53-16 in seventh and 77-16 in eighth.
- UVa averages 8.1 runs per game, outscoring its opponents 463-225.

HOT WAHOO BATS

- Virginia has hit .345 as a team in the 10 games since coming back from its exam break, while recording at least seven hits in each contest.
- UVa has scored at least five runs in nine of the 10 games, totaling 93 runs in that stretch.
- Forty of the Cavaliers' 129 hits have gone for extra bases (25 2B, 6 3B, 9 HR).
- In a four-game stretch from May 11-16, UVa recorded four consecutive double-figure scoring outputs for the first time since racking up five straight from April 28-May 4, 2010.

PAPI CONTINUES TO RAKE

- Mike Papi leads the nation with a .536 on-base percentage and ranks seventh in batting (.400) and 24th in slugging (.645).
- The ACC leader in batting, Papi has been hot at the plate of late, going 18-for-42 (.429) with 14 runs and 16 RBI in 10 games since UVa returned from its finals break (all in leadoff spot in batting order).
- Papi was named the ACC Player of the Week each of the last two weeks of the regular season and owns hits in 13 of his last 15 games.
- Since being inserted into the Cavaliers' lineup as a pinch hitter March 15 at Clemson, Papi is batting .425 (57-for-134) with 49 runs and 49 RBI (41 games).

NOTING THE ACC TOURNAMENT

- Virginia went 2-1 in pool play at the ACC tournament. The third-seeded Cavaliers bounced back from a 10-1 loss to No. 6 seed Virginia Tech to win two games.
- UVa knocked off No. 7 Georgia Tech, 8-2, before winning the finale against No. 2 Florida State, 7-4 in 12 innings, on Kenny Towns' walkoff three-run homer.
- UVa hit five solo homers in the tournament.
- Towns homered twice while going 4-for-12 with six RBI in the tournament. Reed Gragnani also was 4-for-12 and was named to the all-tournament team.
- UVa pitchers did not allow a run after the sixth inning during the tournament.

GRAGNANI A TOUGH OUT

- Despite batting in the bottom third of Virginia's batting order, Reed Gragnani has been a tough out for opposing pitchers.
- Nationally, he is the fourth toughest to strike out, with just nine strikeouts in 196 at bats (one per 21.8 AB).
- He also has been one of UVa's top run producers with 48 RBI, which is fourth on the team and tied for 14th in the ACC.

LATE-INNING THUNDER

- Virginia has been strong in the late innings, outscoring its foes 166-54 from the seventh inning on this year.
- UVa did not allow a run after the sixth inning in the ACC tournament.
- UVa owns three ninth-inning rallies from two runs or more down – 5-2 in ninth at Clemson, won 6-5 in 11; 6-2 at Wake Forest, won 7-6; 5-3 vs. Duke, won 6-5.
- The Cavaliers also rallied from five runs down in the sixth inning on April 17 against Old Dominion to win 10-9 in 10 innings.

COMEBACK KIDS

- Virginia scored its 21st comeback win of the season last Saturday against Florida State.
- UVa has rallied from three runs or more behind to win on eight occasions this year, with six coming in the sixth inning or later:

CROCKETT ANCHORS BULLPEN

- Junior lefty Kyle Crockett has closed out games this season and been sensational. He owns 10 saves, which ranks second in the ACC.
- Crockett was named to the NCBWA Stopper of the Year Watch List (one of 51 players nationally).
- Crockett has made 26 appearances this year, allowing just 10 earned runs while opponents have hit .197 against him. He appeared in 19 of UVa's 30 ACC games (most of any conference pitcher).
- He has made 85 career appearances – most on the staff and fifth most in program history.

VIRGINIA SLOWS THE RUNNING GAME

- Virginia has shown the propensity to shut down its opponents' running games this year.
- Virginia has allowed just 31 stolen base attempts in 57 games, with 18 successful steals (58% success rate).
- The Cavaliers also have picked off 11 baserunners.
- UVa has given up just six stolen bases in nine attempts in the last 25 contests.
- Against the ACC's top three running teams, Clemson, NC State and Maryland, UVa allowed a combined three stolen bases - zero to Clemson and NCSU and three to Maryland.

FRESHMEN PLAYING KEY ROLES

- Virginia has leaned heavily on its first-year players early this season, particularly on the mound.
- Twelve true freshmen have seen playing time.
- Seven true freshmen have accounted for 45 percent of the innings pitched this year (229 of 512 2/3 total).
- Joe McCarthy has started 55 of 57 contests in the batting order and currently is UVa's 3-hole hitter.

VIRGINIA AMONG NATIONAL LEADERS IN RUNS

- Virginia ranks third nationally in runs and scoring.
- The Cavaliers have scored 463 runs (8.1 per game) in 57 games.
- The Cavaliers rank among the nation's top 20 in 11 statistical categories on offense.

FOUR CAVALIERS NAMED TO AWARD WATCH LISTS

- Four Virginia players have been named to watch lists for various national awards.
- Branden Cogswell is one of 25 players to be named to the watch list for the Wallace Award, presented to the nation's top shortstop.
- Kyle Crockett is one of 51 players on the NCBWA's watch list for the Stopper of the Year Award, which is given to the premier relief pitcher in NCAA baseball. He also is on the Golden Spikes Award watch list.
- Nick Howard stands as one of 25 players on the John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Year Award Watch List. UVa's Danny Hultzen won this award in 2011.
- Nate Irving was named to the watch list for the Johnny Bench Award for the nation's best catcher.

COGSWELL OUT WITH FRACTURED FINGER

- Branden Cogswell suffered a fractured finger in practice on May 4, breaking the middle finger on his right hand.
- He had surgery to repair the break and will be reevaluated prior to the NCAA regional.
- Cogswell was having a sensational year, batting .346 (10th in ACC) with a .464 on base percentage (seventh).
- Prior to his injury, Cogswell was the lone Cavalier to play in every game in 2013 and had reached base safely in 43 of 47 games this year.

MCCARTHY NAMED ACC FRESHMAN OF YEAR

- Virginia freshman Joe McCarthy has put together an impressive rookie campaign and was named the ACC's Freshman of the Year last week.
- He currently ranks third among all ACC freshmen in batting with a .329 average (17th overall).
- He is second among ACC rookies in walks with 46 (fifth overall) and on base percentage at .455 (ninth overall).
- McCarthy is the second UVa player to earn ACC Freshman of the Year honors, joining Danny Hultzen (2009).

MCCARTHY A REGULAR ON BASEPATHS

- Joe McCarthy was the only ACC player to reach base safely in every game this year until April 14 when he went 0-for-3 in the rain-shortened game at Georgia Tech.
- He has reached base safely in 51 of his 55 games.
- The rookie reached base safely in the first 36 games this year, the longest streak by a UVa player since Dan Grovatt reached base in 43 straight games in 2009.
- He owns a .455 on base percentage, which is third on the team and ninth in the ACC.
- He has the third-best OBP of any freshman in Division I this year.

DOWNES AN EXTRA-BASE HIT MACHINE

- In his first year as the Cavaliers' cleanup hitter, Brandon Downes has been solid and is batting .318 with 35 extra-base hits.
- Downes tops the team in home runs (9), triples (7), doubles (19), runs (62), RBI (57) and total bases (134).
- Downes is first in the ACC in triples, fifth in doubles and sixth in home runs.
- Downes ranks first on the team in hits (74) and runs and second in slugging (.575).

NO FREE PASSES ...

- Virginia pitchers make opposing batters earn their way on base. The UVa pitching staff has issued just 135 walks in 57 games, by far the fewest walks allowed in the ACC this year. Miami is second with 171.
- UVa allows just 2.37 walks per nine innings, which is fifth fewest nationally and has a 3.38 strikeout-to-walk ratio, which ranks second nationally behind Cal State Fullerton.
- The Cavaliers also have hit only 25 batters this year (third fewest nationally).

... BUT PLENTY OF FREEBIES FOR UVA BATTERS

- While the Cavaliers' pitchers have thrived on not issuing walks, Virginia batters have found plenty of ways to get on base.
- Virginia batters rank sixth nationally with 293 walks (third in ACC).
- UVa batters also have been hit by 67 pitches, which is third among ACC squads.
- The Cavaliers rank fifth nationally with a .412 on base percentage.

NOTING THE UNC SERIES

- Virginia won a series in Chapel Hill (May 14-16) for the first time since March 17-18, 2007.
- UNC was the highest-ranked opponent the Cavaliers have defeated in a road series since UVa won two of three at then-No. 1 UNC in 2007.
- Virginia hit .318 as a team in the series and racked up 11 extra-base hits.
- UVa's loss in Game 2 was its first this season when leading after seven innings (UVa is 39-1 when leading after seven innings).
- UVa scored first in all three games and trailed in just four innings in the series.

VIRGINIA TOPS 100,000 IN ATTENDANCE AGAIN

- Despite the chilly temperatures and poor weather earlier this year, Virginia ranks 13th nationally in total attendance (102,410) and 17th in average attendance (3,012) this year (third in ACC).
- More than 100,000 fans have attended Cavalier games each of the past four seasons. UVa has ranked among the top 20 programs nationally in attendance each of the last four years.
- UVa ranked 15th nationally in total attendance (112,281) and 19th in average attendance (3,208) last year.
- Davenport Field seats 4,980 per game, slightly down this year after the addition of more chairback seats in place of the bleacher seats in the grandstand.
- The entire reserved section in the grandstand sold out once again this year.

UVA BREAKS SERIES ATTENDANCE RECORD

- Virginia broke the program's three-game series attendance record April 20-21 by drawing 13,890 fans for its series with Florida State.
- The program's three-game series record was 13,625, set April 13-15, 2012, against North Carolina.
- The final two games at Davenport Field each drew capacity crowds of 4,980.

UVA 12TH NATIONALLY IN SHUTOUTS

- Virginia has racked up eight shutouts, which is tied for 12th in the country.
- UVa is three off the lead, which is held by Oregon State and Rice.
- The total is already tied with the 2007 squad for fourth most in a season at Virginia.
- UVa finished with just two shutouts in 2012.

PAPI MAKES A GRAND STATEMENT

- Mike Papi has had a flair for the dramatic this year.
- Two of his homers have been clutch, late-inning grand slams.
- Papi hit a seventh-inning grand slam to tie the game against Old Dominion.
- He hit a two-out grand slam on an 0-2 pitch in the ninth inning April 6 to rally UVa to a 7-6 win at Wake.
- Papi also blasted an 11th-inning homer to win the Clemson game on March 15, just two innings after he hit a two-out RBI single to tie the game in the ninth inning.

WADDELL ANCHORS ROTATION AS ROOKIE

- Southpaw Brandon Waddell has been a standout while serving as UVa's Friday starter as a freshman.
- He owns a team-high 73 strikeouts in 78 1/3 innings this year; he ranks fourth among all freshmen nationally in strikeouts.
- He was named one of Collegiate Baseball's six National Players of the Week on Feb. 25 following a dominating outing vs. Toledo.
- In six innings, he struck out 15 batters, most by a UVa freshman hurler since Seth Greisinger fanned 15 against UNC in 1994. He allowed just six hits and one walk.
- On Feb. 15 at ECU, Waddell became the first UVa freshman to make the opening-game start since Dave Sammons on Feb. 26, 1986, at William and Mary.

CAVALIERS OWN MOST WINS IN NATION SINCE 2009

- Virginia has posted 242 wins since the start of the 2009 season – most in Division I baseball.
- South Carolina has 237 victories in that span, while North Carolina has 235.
- UVa set a school record with 49 wins in 2009, topped it in 2010 with 51 victories, then upped it again in 2011 with a national-best 56 wins. The Cavaliers are nearing those numbers and have 47 wins in 2013.
- Jared King and Scott Silverstein are in their fifth years at UVa and have been part of this entire stretch.

FIFTH-YEARS PROVIDE LEADERSHIP

- Virginia has a pair of veteran fifth-year seniors guiding the young 2013 team: Jared King and Scott Silverstein.
- King has played 197 career games, with 178 career starts. His streak of 90 straight starts, dating to 2011, was snapped March 2 in the first game of the DH.
- King could become just the ninth Virginia baseball player to play in 200 career games.
- Silverstein has been the Cavaliers' Saturday starter for most of last two seasons since battling back from a pair of shoulder surgeries.
- The two have been part of two ACC championship teams, three regional championship squads and two College World Series teams.

CHANGES AT DAVENPORT FIELD

- Davenport Field underwent several changes during the offseason.
- A new sand-based playing surface has been installed. After removing the previous surface, crews put in a new irrigation and field drainage system (previous field had no drainage system).
- The \$1 million project also included the installation of a new synthetic warning track that runs in foul territory between the foul poles as well as new dugout flooring surfaces and a new FieldTurf collar behind home plate.
- Home plate was moved in about five feet, creating more foul territory down the lines as well as new field dimensions: 332-370-404-370-332.
- In separate projects, new chairback seats were added to replace the grandstand bleachers and a new video board was erected.

O'CONNOR NAMED BASEBALL AMERICA'S COACH OF THE FIRST HALF

- Virginia head coach Brian O'Connor was tabbed the National Coach of the First Half by Baseball America on April 4.
- The Cavaliers racked up a 27-3 record (9-3 ACC) at that point despite featuring a lineup of primarily sophomores and freshmen as well as a freshman-laden pitching staff.

O'CONNOR FOURTH AMONG ACTIVE COACHES IN WIN PERCENTAGE

- Virginia head coach Brian O'Connor is 458-159-2 (.741) in 10 seasons at the helm of the Cavaliers.
- O'Connor's 73.4 percent winning percentage entering the season ranked fourth among active Division I head coaches behind only UNC's Mike Fox (.744), Florida State's Mike Martin (.743) and Wichita State's Gene Stephenson (.735).

VIRGINIA LEADS NATION IN ERA FROM 2005-12

- Virginia led all NCAA Division I teams in ERA over the past eight seasons, boasting a 3.14 team ERA from 2005-12.
- UVa was the only school to rank in the top 20 in the country in ERA from 2005-11 seasons; UVa was 57th with a 3.48 ERA last year.
- Virginia led the nation in ERA in 2012 (2.24) and posted No. 3 marks in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009.
- Virginia also was the only team in Division I to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts and fewest hits allowed each season from 2008-11.
