ACC-olades

- Nikki Krzysik was named the 2008 ACC Defensive Player of the Year
- She is the third Cavalier to win the award (Sarah Huffman in 2004 and Becky Sauerbrunn in 2007)
- Krzysik and Sinead Farrelly repeated as first-team All-ACC picks
- Lauren Alwine, Meghan Lenczyk, and Alex Singer were named to the 2nd Team
- Alwine was also named to the All-Freshman Team

Cavaliers Offensive in ACC

- The Cavaliers scored 22 goals in conference games this season
- That total is a school record for goals in an ACC regular season, breaking the previous record of 17 goals in 2004
- That season the Cavaliers won the ACC Championship

Alwine Piling Up Assists

- Lauren Alwine already has 13 assists this season, which ranks 2nd by a Cavalier in a season
- She is only one assist shy of the school record of 14 in a season, set by Sarah Huffman in 2004

First Goal at an Opportune Time

- In each of the last two wins, the Cavaliers have gotten a game-winning goal from a player scoring her first career goal
- Colleen Flanagan scored her first career goal in overtime to give UVa a 3-2 win at Maryland
- Kika Toulouse's first career-goal broke a 1-1 tie in the 72nd minute to give Virginia a 2-1 win over Boston College

Cavaliers Set New Road Mark

- The Cavaliers set a new school record with four ACC road wins in a season, breaking the record of three set in 2005
- Virginia finished that season with a school record 8-2-0 conference record

Klöck-work at Home

- The Cavaliers had their school-record 20-game home unbeaten streak (18-0-2) broken with the loss to North Carolina on Oct. 24
- Virginia is 7-2-1 at Klöckner Stadium this season
- Since 2001, Virginia 74-12-8 at Klöckner Stadium

Offense Explodes Against Wolfpack and Tigers

- In consecutive games, UVa beat NC State 6-0 and Clemson 7-1
- The 13 goals are the most Virginia has ever scored in consecutive ACC games
- UVa's seven goals against Clemson were the most for the team since a 9-0 win over Richmond in 2005
- It was the most goals Virginia scored against an ACC opponent since an 8-0 win over Virginia Tech in the quarterfinals of the 2004 ACC Tournament
- The results are the most lopsided regular season games in the conference since a 9-3 Duke win over Virginia Tech in 2004

Lenczyk and Farrelly Score Hat Tricks

- Meghan Lenczyk and Sinead Farrelly both have hat tricks this season, marking the first time in school history that Virginia has had two different players have a hat trick in the same season
- Farrelly had a career-high three goals in the first half of the 7-1 win at Clemson
- Lenczyk had a career-high three goals in the 5-0 win over Liberty
- Lenczyk's was the first hat trick by a Cavalier since 2004 (Kelly Hammond vs. JMU)
- Farrelly's was the first hat trick in school history against an ACC opponent

- Through the first 18 games of the season, Virginia has 19 different players with a point
- Every Cavalier field player to see action this season has a point
- The number is two more than the number of point scorers last year
- That list includes 14 different goal scorers

Second Half Strong

- The Cavaliers have scored 25 of their 42 goals this season in the second half or OT
- Last year Virginia had 30 second half goals, compared to just 10 in the first half

Lenczyk Named Player of the Week

- Meghan Lenczyk was honored as the ACC Co-Player of the Week and the Soccer America National Player of the Week on Sept. 30
- She scored the game-winning goals at Florida State and Miami that week

Six Named to Teams of the Week

- Kelly Quinn was named to the Soccer America Team of the Week on Aug. 25 after scoring a career-high two goals in the season opening 4-0 win over Loyola
- Nikki Krzysik was named to the Soccer Buzz Team of the Week on Aug. 25 after having a goal in the win over Loyola
- Lauren Alwine was named to the Soccer America Team of the Week on Sept. 15 after she had a goal and two assists to be named the MVP of the Virginia Nike Soccer Classic
- Meghan Lenczyk was named to the Soccer America Team of the Week on Sept. 29 after scoring the game-winning goals at Florida State and Miami
- Alli Fries was named to the Soccer Buzz Team of the Week on Sept. 29 after helping the Cavaliers post shutouts at FSU and Miami and scoring vs. the Canes

- 11 opponents are ranked in the top 50 of the NCAA RPI (11/3)
- 12 opponents played in last year's NCAA Tournament

Hucles Golden Again

- Former Cavalier Angela Hucles (96-99) won her second Olympic gold medal with the US Women's National Team
- Hucles started all six games for the Americans and led the team with four goals at the Olympics
