

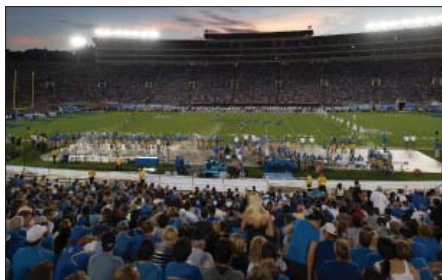

## ROSE BOWL: THE 33rd YEAR

The 2014 season marks the 33rd year that the Rose Bowl will serve as home of the Bruins. UCLA moved to Pasadena from the L.A. Coliseum in the summer of 1982 and went 6-0-1 in that first year, capping the season with a victory over Michigan in the Rose Bowl game. The 2006 season-opening win against Utah was UCLA's 100th at the Rose Bowl. The Bruins own a record of 134-59-2 since moving to Pasadena, including a 3-2 record in Rose Bowl games. UCLA is 10-3 under Coach Mora in games played in the Rose Bowl. The Bruins are 15-4 in the last 19 home contests and last posted an unbeaten home season in 2005 (6-0).

## #7 UCLA TO OPEN 2014 SEASON AT VIRGINIA

UCLA at UVa on Aug. 30; Six Home Games on the Schedule  
 Bruins Return to Rose Bowl Sept. 6 to Host Memphis - 7 p.m.



**SEASON KICKS OFF AT VIRGINIA ON AUG. 30** — UCLA (ranked #7 in both the the Associated Press and the Coaches polls) opens the 2014 football season on Saturday, Aug. 30 at Noon ET/ 9 a.m. PT in Scott Stadium (61,500-grass) at the University of Virginia. The game will be televised by ESPN with Bob Wischusen, Matt Millen and Quint Kessenich on the scene. The Bruin IMG Radio Network (Chris Roberts, Matt Stevens and Wayne Cook) will radio broadcast the contest on 570am Fox Sports Radio LA. The game will also be aired on SIRIUS (Ch. 84), XM (Ch. 84).

UCLA will open in the month of August for the third straight season and will begin on the road for the fourth time in five seasons (2010 L at Kansas State, 2011 L at Houston, 2012 W at Rice, 2013 W at home over Nevada). The Bruins captured last season's opener over Nevada by a 58-20 score in the Rose Bowl. UCLA was ranked 21st in last season's pre-season AP poll. The No. 7 AP preseason ranking is the highest for the program since it was also ranked No. 7 prior to the 1998 campaign. UCLA climbed as high as No. 7 in the 2005 regular season poll. Third-year head coach Jim Mora, who led the Bruins to victory in the Sun Bowl over Virginia Tech to match the school record for wins in a season (10-3) welcomes back 18 (8 defensive, 8 offensive, 2 specialists) returning starters. The coaching staff was kept virtually intact, with Mike Tuiaosopo (OLB/Special Teams) joining the group for Spring practice. Kennedy Polamalu (Running Backs) was added to the staff in time to coach for the Sun Bowl. Jeff Ulbrich moved up to Defensive Coordinator and will also handle the inside linebackers.

**VS. VIRGINIA / THE ACC** — This will be the first meeting between the Bruins and the Cavaliers on the gridiron. Both teams ended the 2013 season playing against Virginia Tech. UCLA bested the Hokies 42-12 in the Sun Bowl, while UVa dropped a 16-6 decision. UVa produced a 2-10 mark last year. One of the wins came in the 2013 season-opener over BYU in Charlottesville. Head Coach Mike London is entering his fifth season. Safety Anthony Harris ranked No. 1 in the nation in 2013 with eight interceptions. Running back Kevin Parks powered his way to over 1,000 yards rushing a year ago.

UCLA is 17-13 all-time vs. teams in the current Atlantic Coast Conference -- Virginia Tech (1-0), Duke (1-0), Florida State (0-1), Miami (2-1), NC State (2-0), Pitt (9-5), Syracuse (2-6).

**HOME OPENER** — UCLA's home opener will take place on Saturday, Sept. 6 at 7pm in the Rose Bowl against Memphis. Season tickets for 2014 are on sale at [uclabruins.com/tickets](http://uclabruins.com/tickets). The Bruins have six home games this season at the Rose Bowl – Sept. 6 vs. Memphis, Oct. 4 vs. Utah, Oct. 11 vs. Oregon, Nov. 1 vs. Arizona, Nov. 22 vs. USC and Nov. 28 vs. Stanford.

**IN BRIEF**

\*\*UCLA is 62-28-5 in season-opening games in 95 seasons of play  
 \*\*Redshirt senior LB Eric Kendricks led the team in tackles for the second-straight season (106-2013/ 150-2012). He is the first Bruin to put up back-to-back 100-tackle campaigns since Craig Davis in 1988-89.  
 \*\*Redshirt junior Brett Hundley became the first Bruin to throw for a score, run for a touchdown and catch a pass for a score in the same game (at Utah-2013). He finished the season with one interception in his last 158 passing attempts and none in his last 77. His completion percentage of .668 was the highest by a Bruin starter since 1983 (Rick Neuheisel - .693). Hundley was the first Bruin QB to lead the team in rushing since Larry Zeno in 1964.  
 \*\*Sophomore LB Myles Jack became the first player in Pac-12 Conference history to be selected both Freshman Offensive and Defensive Player of the Year. He was one of five finalists for the Hornung Award as the nation's most versatile player.  
 \*\*UCLA established a school record by playing 18 true freshmen in 2013. It matched the school record of seven true freshmen position players starting in a game (at Oregon, vs. Colorado).  
 \*\*UCLA set a school record for total offense in a game with 692 yards vs. New Mexico State last season.  
 \*\*A school record 26 different players caught a pass in 2013.  
 \*\*2013 was the first season UCLA has managed to be ranked in each of the year's AP polls since the 1998 campaign. The No. 16 ranking in the final AP poll was the first time UCLA has been listed in the season-ending rankings since 2005 (also 16).  
 \*\*UCLA is 15-3 under Coach Mora when scoring first, 9-0 when doing so at home; the Bruins are 17-0 under Mora when ahead at the half  
 \*\*Myles Jack's 75 tackles ranked second on the all-time true freshman tackle list behind Kenny Easley (93 in 1977). Jack's four rushing touchdowns against Washington set a true freshman record for a single-game. Five of the team's touchdowns versus the Huskies were scored by defensive players.  
 \*\*Returning defensive players who saw action on offense in 2013 include - LB Myles Jack (RB); DL Eddie Vanderdoes (H back/TE); DL Kenny Clark (H back/FB)  
 \*\*UCLA's six interceptions in the game at Utah were the most since it recorded a like number in a 1987 contest versus Stanford (school record is 10).  
 \*\*UCLA has won 23 of its last 28 games when winning the turnover battle (82%) and owns a 16-34 record in its last 50 games (32%) when losing or tying the turnover ratio  
 \*\*Sophomore receiver Thomas Duarte matched the school true freshman record with three scoring receptions in 2013 (also Raymond Burks-1973)  
 \*\*When UCLA bested USC last season, it marked the team's fourth victory in the month of November. The last time that happened was in the 1959 season.  
 \*\*Coach Jim Mora's 19 wins in his first two seasons are the most by any Bruin coach in their first two campaigns at the school. The 2013 Bruins became the eighth team in school history to have won more than nine games in a season and tied the school mark with 10 wins.  
 \*\*Four UCLA players enter 2014 with at least 20 career starts - LB Eric Kendricks-29, QB Brett Hundley-27, OL Jake Brendel-27, OL Simon Goines-20.  
 \*\*UCLA is 8-4 in true road games (4-2 in '13 and '12) under Coach Mora...In 2012, the Bruins won as many as four road games in a season for the first time since 2002.  
 \*\*In the last 21 games, UCLA has gone 15-6 with the six losses to Oregon (11-2 record in 2013), Stanford (3x/11-3 record) Arizona State (10-4) and Baylor (11-2); four of the six losses have come in games played away from the Rose Bowl.  
 \*\*Thirty-three freshmen and sophomores saw action in the final game of 2013 vs. Virginia Tech - 14 true freshmen.  
 \*\*QB Brett Hundley has thrown at least one scoring pass in 25 of his 27 career games (not at USC-2013, at Stanford-2012)...He has thrown for multiple scores in 18 contests -- Over the last 6 games, Hundley completed 102 of his 153 attempts (67%) for 10 tds, one int., 1,346 yards and rushed 73 times for 389 yards and seven scores.  
 \*\*UCLA had as many as four players selected in the first four rounds of the 2014 NFL Draft for the first time since 1996.  
 \*\*LB Eric Kendrick's blocked field goal v. Washington in '13 was 12th kick blocked by Bruins since Jim Mora became head coach  
 \*\*CB Ishmael Adams returned 10 kickoffs for 350 yards and two punts for 49 yards in the last three games of 2013  
 \*\*PK Ka'imi Fairbairn has connected on 18 straight FG attempts from 35 yards and in  
 \*\*Hundley is one shy of school record-holder Cade McNown's total of 12 300-yard total offense games after his 387 yard-effort against Va Tech in the Sun Bowl...He racked up a personal best 428 yards of total offense in 2013 vs. Cal.  
*Most Career 300-yd total offense games- Cade McNown 12, Hundley 11, Drew Olson 5, Tom Ramsey 5*  
 \*\*Safety Randall Goforth's 19 tackles at Stanford were the most since S Dennis Keyes recorded 19 v. USC '07.  
 \*\*Eddie Vanderdoes' 11 tackles at Stanford were the most by a D-lineman since 1992 (Bruce Walker-12 v. ASU)  
 \*\*Hundley topped the 400-yard passing mark for the first time at home vs. Cal in 2013. He is the first UCLA quarterback to ever throw for at least 300 yards in three straight games (305 Nebraska/320 Houston/372 Oregon St. in 2012).  
*Most 300-yd passing games in a season -- Cade McNown 6 - 1998, Tom Ramsey 4 - 1982, Hundley 4 - 2012*  
*Most Career 300-yd passing games -- McNown 11, Cory Paus 7, Hundley 5, Drew Olson 4, Tommy Maddox 4, Troy Aikman 4, Tom Ramsey 4*

**Hundley** scored a touchdown after taking his first snap as a college player at Rice in 2012. His 372 passing yards against Oregon State in 2012 marked the third straight game above the 300-yard mark, a new school record. It was the second-highest total in a single game by a UCLA freshman (Maddox, 409 vs. USC, 1990).

Hundley graduated early from Chandler HS in Chandler, AZ and joined the Bruins in Winter Quarter 2011 (January). He took part in spring practice at UCLA, but was limited early in the 2011 fall camp due to a summer injury. Hundley did not see action in the 2011 season. He participated in a second spring practice in 2012 and won the starting job in pre-season camp.

**HEAD COACH JIM MORA**

On December 10, 2011, former NFC Coach of the Year Jim Mora was named UCLA's 17th head coach in school history. In year two, Mora led the Bruins to the eighth 10-win season in school history, tying the school record for victories. In his first season in Westwood, he guided the Bruins to the 2012 South Division Championship of the Pac-12 Conference and matched the school record for wins by a first-year Bruin coach with nine. The team set numerous offensive records during that initial campaign, including rushing yards, passing yards, total offense and points scored. Eight Bruin players have been selected in the last two NFL Drafts, including a couple of first-round picks.

Mora came to UCLA after spending part of 2010 and most of 2011 as a television analyst and contributor for the NFL Network and the NFL on Fox. He brought 25 years of NFL coaching acumen with him to UCLA, including four years of NFL head coaching experience while at the helm of the Atlanta Falcons (2004-06) and the Seattle Seahawks (2009).

Mora took over for Mike Holmgren as head coach of the Seattle Seahawks in 2009. He had served as assistant head coach and defensive backs coach for Seattle in 2007 and 2008. The Seahawks went 10-6 and finished first in the NFC West in the 2007 season and won the Wild Card game. In his initial season as the head coach of the Falcons in 2004, Mora guided the team to an 11-5 record, becoming just the eighth rookie head coach in NFL history to win 11 games and the 11th to bring home a Division title. Atlanta captured the NFC South title and earned an appearance in the NFC Championship game for only the second time in franchise history. Mora was selected as the NFC Coach of the Year.

The Falcons' defense improved from a league ranking of 32nd in 2003 to No. 14 overall the next season, fueled by a league-leading and franchise record 48 quarterback sacks. Atlanta topped the NFL in rushing in all three of coach Mora's seasons as head coach. In 2006, Michael Vick became the first quarterback in NFL history to rush for at least 1,000 yards.

Mora had joined the Falcons from the San Francisco 49ers where he spent seven seasons, from 1997-2003, including the last five as the defensive coordinator. In his first year, the 49ers finished No. 1 in the NFL in total defense, No. 2 in pass defense (with 25 interceptions), takeaways (41) and run defense, as well as No. 3 in the League in sacks (with 54). The 1998 squad tied for No. 1 in the NFC, and No. 4 in the NFL, with 21 interceptions. The 1997 team advanced to the NFC Championship Game, while the 1998 and 2002 squads captured Wild Card Game wins.

Mora worked the previous five seasons (1992-1996) on the staff of his dad, Jim E. Mora, as the secondary coach with the New Orleans Saints. His defensive expertise began to take shape and the Saints boasted the No. 1 pass defense in the NFL during his first two years. In 1985, Mora broke into the NFL coaching ranks with the San Diego Chargers under head coach Don Coryell. He spent seven seasons with the Chargers, advancing from the league's first quality control coach position to defensive backs coach.

Mora began his coaching career in 1984 at the University of Washington. He joined the staff of Don James in the role of defensive assistant following a four-year playing career as a defensive back for the Huskies. While at UW, Mora had the opportunity to be a part of two Rose Bowl teams (1981-loss to Michigan and 1982-win over Iowa) as a player, in addition to helping the Huskies land a berth in the 1985 Orange Bowl (win over Oklahoma) as a graduate assistant. During his five seasons in the Husky program, Washington compiled a 48-12 record, ranked among the nation's top 10 teams on three occasions, and did not finish lower than second in the Pac-10 standings.

**LINEBACKER — Senior ERIC KENDRICKS (#6)** started all 11 games he played in last season and served as co-captain. He led the team in tackles for the second straight season and ranked third in the Pac-12 in tackles average (8.8). He posted four double-digit tackle games topped by 13-stop efforts at Utah and at Arizona.

In 2012, he started all 14 games in 2012. He led the Pac-12 in tackles with an average of 10.64, a mark which ranked 11th in the nation. He was the first Bruin to lead the conference in tackles since Spencer Havner in 2004. During 2012, Kendrick returned two fumbles for scores (23 yards Houston/40 at Washington St.), blocked a punt (USC) and made his first career interception (USC). His total of 150 tackles was the most by a Bruin player since Jerry Robinson registered a school-record 161 stops in 1978. He had a best of 17 tackles at Arizona State and was credited with 15 stops in games at Washington State and versus Stanford. He was named Pac-12 Player of the Week after the USC and Arizona wins.

He appeared in all 14 games in 2011, starting the final three games. Kendrick was second on the squad in tackles.

Kendrick's dad, Marv, played at UCLA and led the team in rushing in 1970 and 1971. Eric's brother, Mychal, played linebacker for Cal and is now starting his third season in the NFL with the Eagles.

True sophomore linebacker **MYLES JACK (#30)** became the first player in conference history to be named both Offensive and Defensive Freshman of the Year by the Pac-12 coaches. He was also a finalist for the Hornung Award as the nation's most versatile player. Jack joined the starting lineup at linebacker last year in game two at Nebraska. He had recorded eight tackles, including a tackle for loss, in the season-opener against Nevada. Jack posted 12 stops vs. Cal. He was credited with six tackles and his first interception at Utah. Jack forced a fumble and blocked a punt at Oregon. He returned an interception for a score against Virginia Tech.

He played on offense for the first time at Arizona (game 9) and ran six times for 120 yards, including a 66-yard touchdown jaunt. His total of four rushing touchdowns against Washington set a true freshman record (old mark Wendell Tyler, 1972 and DeShaun Foster, 1998 - 3). Jack made his first start at running back against Arizona State and carried 16 times for 86 yards and a touchdown.

The players with the most offensive starts (27) are redshirt juniors Jake Brendel and Brett Hundley. The players with the longest starting streak on the squad are Brendel and Hundley with 27 each.

**BRUIN FRESHMEN OVER THE YEARS** — The Bruins established a new school mark when guard Scott Quessenberry took the field at Oregon as the 18th true freshman to see action in the 2013 season. Fifteen true freshmen saw action in the 2013 opener -- LB Cameron Judge, LB Isaako Savaiinaea, LB Jayon Brown, LB Deon Hollins, LB Myles Jack, DL Kenny Clark, DL Kylie Fitts, DL Eddie Vanderdoes, S Tahaan Goodman, P/KO Sean Covington, WR Jalen Ortiz, WR Darren Andrews, Y receiver Thomas Duarte, OG Alex Redmond, OL Caleb Benenoch. A 16th true frosh, CB Priest Willis, saw action at Nebraska on special teams. Freshman cornerback Charles Dawson saw action vs. New Mexico State to become freshman No. 17 and tie the former school record set in 1977. UCLA played 12 true freshmen in 2012. One first-year player saw action in 2011. In both 2009 and 2010, UCLA played 10 true freshmen.

UCLA has started a true freshman in each of the last two season-openers along the offensive line. Last season, Alex Redmond opened at guard against Nevada. In 2012, tackle Simon Goines started the first game at Rice. The last true freshman defender to start an opener was safety Rahim Moore in 2008 vs. Tennessee.

## DID YOU KNOW...

Three Bruin coaches and 12 players, including 2014 inductee John Sciarra, 2012 inductee Jonathan Ogden, 2010 inductee Randy Cross and 2008 inductee Troy Aikman, are enshrined in the National Football Foundation Hall of Fame.

Five Bruins have been voted in to the NFL Hall of Fame-OL Johnathan Ogden-2013; QB Troy Aikman-2006; DB Jimmy Johnson-1994; WR/coach Tom Fears-1970; QB/P/PK/DB Bob Waterfield-1965.

The selection of linebacker Anthony Barr by the Minnesota Vikings in the first round of the 2014 NFL draft marked the 31st time a UCLA player has been taken in round one.

Twenty-two UCLA players have been selected to CoSIDA Academic All-America teams a total of 27 times. Offensive lineman Chris Joseph (2006, 2007) and wide receiver Cormac Carney (1981, 1982) were two-time first-team selections.

UCLA is the only school to produce six quarterbacks — Troy Aikman, Steve Bono, Billy Kilmer, Tommy Maddox, Tom Ramsey, Jay Schroeder — to have played that position on a Super Bowl team.

Quarterback Drew Olson finished eighth in the 2005 Heisman Trophy balloting. It marked the 21st time that a Bruin has finished in the top 10 of the Heisman Trophy voting.

UCLA has had at least one former player participate in 30 of the last 33 Super Bowl games.

The only three-time consensus All-Americans in Pac-10 history are Bruins (LB Jerry Robinson and S Kenny Easley).

Since 2000, UCLA has had 17 finalists / winners of National player awards --- 2013 Anthony Barr - Lott IMPACT Trophy winner, Lombardi Award finalist, Bednarik Award finalist; Myles Jack - Hornung Award finalist; 2012 Johnathan Franklin - Doak Walker Award finalist; 2009 Kai Forbath - Groza Award winner; 2005 Mercedes Lewis-Mackey Award winner; 2004 M. Lewis, Mackey finalist; 2002 Mike Seidman-Mackey finalist; 2004 Chris Kluwe-Ray Guy Award finalist; 2003 Dave Ball-Bronco Nagurski Award finalist; 2001 Robert Thomas-Dick Butkus Award finalist; 2000 Freddie Mitchell-Fred Biletnikoff Award finalist; 2003 D. Ball-Vince Lombardi Award finalist; 2006 Justin Hickman-Ted Hendricks Award finalist; 2003 D. Ball-Ted Hendricks Award finalist; 2003 D. Ball-Chevrolet National Defensive Player of the Year Award.

On May 13, 2007 UCLA became the first school in history to win 100 NCAA team championships. The Bruins currently have 111 NCAA titles to their credit (winning women's soccer and women's tennis this past year).
