#### **THIS WEEK:**

- Virginia makes its second consecutive appearance in the Women's College Cup and third appearance overall (1991, 2013, 2014)
- The Cavaliers are looking to advance to the College Cup final for the first time

#### NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY:

- Virginia is participating in its 21st consecutive NCAA Tournament and 27th NCAA Tournament overall
- Only UNC and Notre Dame have longer active consecutive NCAA streaks
- Virginia has a 35-23-5 all-time NCAA Tournament record
- Under Steve Swanson, the UVa has a 32-12-4 NCAA Tournament record

#### **COLLEGE CUP HISTORY:**

- Virginia is making its third appearance in the NCAA Women's College Cup
- In 1991, the Cavaliers made their debut, falling to top-seeded North Carolina 5-1 in a semifinal in Chapel Hill, N.C.
- Last year, the Cavaliers were the top overall seed and tied UCLA 1-1 in a semifinal in Cary, N.C., falling in penalty kicks (4-2)

#### **HIGH SCORING HOOS:**

- The Cavaliers lead the nation in scoring at 3.54 goals per game
- Virginia led the nation in scoring in 2013 at 3.00 goals per game
- UVa has 16 different goal scorers this season, including 12 players with multiple goals and eight players with at least four goals
- Virginia has scored at least two goals in 22 of 24 games this season
- The Cavaliers' 85 goals this season are a school record and the most nationally since North Carolina scored 89 goals in 2008

• Since this year's senior class arrived at Virginia in 2011, the Cavaliers have led the nation in goals

• Virginia has scored 288 goals over the past

four seasons, including leading the nation with 78 goals last season and 85 goals this season

#### **SCORING FROM THE BACK:**

• Virginia has 16 goals from defenders this season (Cox-4, McNabb-4, Sonnett-4, lordanou-3, Reid), breaking the school record of nine set last year

#### **BENCH PRODUCTION:**

- Virginia has recorded 19 goals and 14 assists this season from substitutes
- The Cavaliers have gotten a goal off the bench in 14 of 24 games this year
- The UVa bench has scored more goals this season than 73 Division I teams
- · Against High Point, UVa had four goals from substitutes, most since five in a 9-1 win over Liberty in 2011

#### HIGH SCORING IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT:

- Virginia has scored 20 goals over the first four rounds of the NCAA Tournament, the most of any school this season
- The Cavaliers' 20 goals are most by a team en route to the College Cup since UCLA scored 21 goals, over the first four rounds of the 2005 tournament

#### **PAIR OF DOUBLE-DOUBLES:**

- Makenzy Doniak (19G, 11A) and Morgan Brian (10G, 13A) are two of just 12 players nationally to post double-digit goals and assists this season
- Virginia is the only team to have two of those 12 players
- Brian reached double-digit goals and assists for the second straight season, while Doniak became the third Cavalier to do it (Andrea Rubio - 1990, Morgan Brian - 2013 & 2014)

#### THREE FOR 30, FIVE FOR 20:

- Virginia is the only team in the nation to have three 30-point scorers (Doniak-49, Brian-33, Colaprico-30)
- UVa is the first ACC school to have three 30-point scorers since UNC in 2006
- Virginia is one of two teams in the nation to have five 20-point scorers this season (Doniak-49, Brian-33, Colaprico-30, Ratcliffe-26, Reuther-20)
- The five 20-point scorers is a school record (previous: four in 2013)

#### WHILE YOU WERE DISTRACTED BY ALL THE GOALS:

- The Cavalier defense has allowed 14 goals this season, posting 12 shutouts
- Virginia's 0.58 goals against average is tied for the second-lowest in school history (tied with 2004, behind the 0.40 GAA in 2007)
- The UVa defense has allowed multiple goals just once this season, in a 6-3 victory over Boston College on Oct. 9
- Virginia has allowed just one goal in this year's NCAA Tournament



#### TRIO OF HERMANN SEMIFINALISTS:

- Morgan Brian, Danielle Colaprico and Makenzy Doniak were named semifinalists for the 2014 MAC Hermann Trophy
- Virginia is the first team since 2008 to have three semifinalists
- Brian won the 2013 MAC Hermann Trophy
- Doniak is a semifinalist for the second consecutive year
- Of Virginia's 85 goals this season, 64 have been scored or assisted by Brian, Colaprico or Doniak

#### **ACC-OLADES:**

- Virginia led all schools with three first-team All-ACC selections (Morgan Brian, Danielle Colaprico and Makenzy Doniak)
- Brian becomes the fourth Cavalier to be a four-time 1st Team selection (Amanda Cromwell, Angela Hucles, Sinead Farrelly)
- Emily Sonnett (2nd Team) and Brittany Ratcliffe (3rd Team) were also honored
- Colaprico was the inaugural recipient of the ACC Midfielder of the Year award

#### **BRIAN TIES NCAA TOURNAMENT ASSIST RECORD**

- Morgan Brian tied the NCAA Tournament single-game assist record with five in the 8-0 win over High Point (playing just 33 minutes)
- It tied the record set by Kacey White of UNC in a 6-0 win over Pepperdine in 2005

#### AND SOME VIRGINIA RECORDS FROM THE HIGH POINT GAME

- Most goals by Virginia in an NCAA Tournament game (8)
- Tied most first-half goals by Virginia in any game (7)
- Tied most single-game goals by a Cavalier (Morgan Reuther 3)
- Most single-game assists by a Cavalier (Morgan Brian 5)
- Fastest two goals by the same Cavalier (Morgan Reuther 0:40)

#### **RECORD SETTING NIGHT VS. KENTUCKY:**

- Virginia set many milestones in the 7-0 win over No. 14 Kentucky in the NCAA Round of 16
- It was Virginia's most lopsided win over a ranked opponent
- Most lopsided NCAA R16 game since UNC defeated Purdue 7-0 in 2003
- Makenzy Doniak set the UVa single-game (8) and season (48) point records
- Danielle Colaprico set the UVa career records for assists and games played
- Morgan Brian joined the career 40-40 club
- · Virginia set a single-season record with 83 goals on the year
- UVa's sixth and seventh goals of the night were 30 seconds apart, the quickest two goals in Virginia postseason history (3rd fastest overall)
- Morgan Stearns won her 20th game of the year in goal, setting a UVa singleseason record

#### **COLAPRICO SETS ASSIST RECORDS**

- Danielle Colaprico leads the ACC with 18 assists this season, setting a school record for assists in a season
- Her assist vs. Kentucky was her 43rd career assist, setting the UVa career record
- She has an assist in 14 of 23 games this season
- Her 18 assists are most by an ACC player since 2007 (FSU's Mami Yamaguchi)

#### **COLAPRICO SHARP IN THE CLASSROOM TOO:**

- Danielle Colaprico was named a second-team Capital One Academic All-American
- She is UVa's first Academic All-American since Gillian Hatch in 2004
- Colaprico, the ACC Midfielder of the Year, has a 3.45 GPA in Psychology

#### **DONIAK RISING UP THE UVA RECORD BOOK:**

- Makenzy Doniak, only a junior, has entered several UVa career top five lists
- She ranks 2nd in goals (49), 3rd in points (123) and T-5th in GWG (13)
- She became the first Cavalier to post two 40-point seasons (47pts in 2013 and 49pts in 2014)

#### **BRIAN JOINS 40-40 CLUB:**

- Morgan Brian became the first Cavalier and 45th player in NCAA history to join the 40-40 club, currently having 41 goals and 42 assists in her career
- She is the first ACC player to join the club since North Carolina's Heather O'Reilly in 2003-06

#### **BRIAN HELPS UNITED STATES SECURE WORLD CUP BERTH:**

- Morgan Brian has returned to UVa after missing eight games this season due to international duty with the United States Women's National Team, including missing five games for CONCACAF World Cup Qualifying
- Brian made her first appearance in qualifying on Oct. 20, entering as a substitute in the 63rd minute and scoring a goal in the 82nd minute in the 6-0 win over Haiti at RFK Stadium in Washington
- She played 23 minutes as a substitute on Oct. 24 in the 3-0 semifinal win over Mexico in Philadelphia as the team clinched a Women's World Cup berth
- She started the championship game, a 6-0 win over Costa Rica, playing 50 minutes and assisting on Abby Wambach's goal in the fourth minute
- Brian has 16 appearances for the USWNT and three international goals since her debut in June 2013
- She was the only collegian on the 20-player USWNT qualifying roster

#### SWANSON ASSISTING USWNT:

- Head Coach Steve Swanson also assisted the United States Women's National Team as it competed in CONCACAF World Cup Qualifying
- He worked with both teams this fall, but his schedule minimized the number of Virginia games he missed (only one: Old Dominion)

#### **BRIAN AND DONIAK BOTH REACH THE 120 MARK**

- Morgan Brian and Makenzy Doniak became the second and third players to reach 120 career points in the win over Kentucky on Nov. 23
- Virginia is the first team to have two active players with at least 120 points since Stanford in 2009 when it had future USWNT players Christen Press and Kelley O'Hara

#### **BRIAN AND DONIAK SHINE IN NCAA TOURNAMENT**

#### **HEAD COACH STEVE SWANSON**

It is no coincidence that success has followed University of Virginia head coach Steve Swanson throughout his career. In his 25th season as a head coach, his 15th at Virginia, he has established himself as one of the elite coaches in collegiate soccer, and certainly one of the most respected. Swanson has led his teams to six conference championships, 20 NCAA Tournament appearances, and 24 consecutive winning seasons during his 25-year career.

During his tenure as head coach of at Virginia, Swanson has had a dramatic impact on the program since he replaced former United States National Team Head Coach April Heinrichs in the spring of 2000. Over the past 15 years, the Cavaliers are 234-74-35 (.733) under his direction, as Swanson is the winningest coach in program history. His Cavalier squads have advanced to the NCAA Round of 16 in 13 of his 15 seasons, including five quarterfinal appearances.

This season Swanson has led Virginia to its second consecutive NCAA College Cup. The Cavaliers lead the nation in scoring, averaging 3.54 goals per game, as they have posted the second 20-win season in school history.

Swanson led the Cavaliers to the best season in school history in 2013. The team set a school record with 24 wins and advanced to its first College Cup in 22 years. The Cavaliers went undefeated through the regular season (19-0 overall, 13-0 ACC) as Swanson earned NSCAA National Coach of the Year honors. On Sept. 19, 2013, Swanson became the 16th Division I coach to join the 300-win club, and the 11th to accululate 300 wins at the Division I level. Virginia was ranked No. 1 nationally in all major polls for a majority of the season.

Swanson's track record of success is not only on the collegiate level, but also at the international level. He is currently the head coach of the United States U-23 Women's National Team and assisted the full U.S. Women's National Team during this fall's CONCACAF World Cup Qualifying. In 2012, he guided the United States to the FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup Championship in Japan and was one of 10 coaches named to the shortlist for FIFA Women's World Coach of the Year.

Swanson came to Virginia after two highly successful stops at Stanford and Dartmouth. At Dartmouth, Swanson guided the Big Green to national prominence. He did an equally impressive job at Stanford, helping maintain the program's standing as one of the premier teams in the country while leading the Cardinal to two Pac-10 titles in four seasons. In 2004, he led Virginia to the first ACC Championship in school history, making him the only coach in Division I history to win titles in three different conferences. He has since become the only coach in history to win multiple conference championships in three difference conferences. Swanson also enjoyed success as a player in college and as a professional.

During his four seasons at Stanford, Swanson guided the Cardinal to an overall record of 48-27-4, two Pac-10 championships and three NCAA Tournament appearances. His 1999 squad finished with an impressive 14-4-1 record, captured a Pac-10 title and advanced to the third round of the NCAA Tournament. Three of Swanson's players were named to the 1998 All-Pac-10 team and four earned Pac-10 All-Academic recognition. Swanson also coached the 1998 Pac-10 Co-Player of the Year. In 1999, he was honored as the Pac-10 Coach of the Year.

Prior to serving as Stanford's head coach, Swanson served as both the head women's soccer coach and assistant director of athletics at Dartmouth College from 1990-1995. During his years at Dartmouth, he transformed the Big Green into a national powerhouse with an overall record of 55-35-7 (.603). Under his guidance, Dartmouth made its first two NCAA Tournament appearances in school history (1993 and 1994) and won its first two lvy League Championships in school history (1991 and 1993). During his last three years at the helm, the Big Green was ranked in the year-end top 20. Named New England Coach of the Year in 1992, Swanson led his team to an undefeated conference season the following year en route to winning the lvy League title for the second time in three years. His 1993 Dartmouth squad not only went through league play undefeated, but also was unscored upon in the conference.

Swanson has coached 24 All-Americans, one national player of the year, nine conference players of the year, and 79 all-conference selections. Of his former players at Dartmouth, Stanford and Virginia, 28 have played professionally in the WUSA, WPS or NWSL. In 2002, Swanson became the third coach to win at least 40 games with three different NCAA Division I women's soccer programs.

Swanson has been heavily involved with the United States youth National Teams. In addition to currently serving at the head coach of the U-23 National Team, he was the head coach of the U-16 National Team and head coach of the U-18 National Team from 2000-02 and the head coach of the U-20 Women's National Team from 2011-12. In addition, Swanson has been an assistant coach with the U-17, U-18, U-19, U-20 and full Women's National Teams in recent years.

A graduate of Michigan State in 1984, Swanson played professionally in the United States and Canada for four years before returning to school to obtain his master's degree at Iowa. He played more than 150 consecutive games in tours of duty with the Milwaukee Wave and the Chicago Shoccers of the American Indoor Soccer Association, and with AC Roma and the Windsor Wheels in the National Soccer League of Canada (NSLC). While at Michigan State, Swanson was a four-year letterwinner in soccer. He was the team's leading scorer, captain and a regional All-American his senior year.

Swanson and his wife Julie have three children: daughters Alexis and Kelsey, and son Sam.
