## OPENING KICK

### RARE TRIP WEST OF THE MISSISSIPPI

- Virginia concludes its non-conference schedule on Friday at Boise State when the Cavaliers hit the road for the first time in 2017.
- This is only the 20th game played west of the Mississippi River in UVA school history. Friday is UVA's sixth game in eight seasons west of the Mississippi River.
- Virginia is 4-15 in games played west of the Mississippi.
- UVA's last venture west was a 44-26 loss at then-No. 24 Oregon in 2016; the Cavaliers' last win west of the Mississippi was a 45-40 win at BYU on Sept. 25, 1999.
- At approximately 2,400 miles from Charlottesville, this game is the fifth-longest trip in school history.
- UVA is making its second appearance at Albertsons Stadium after facing Fresno State in the 2004 MPC Computers Bowl. Fresno State won in overtime, 37-34.

### VIRGINIA VS. BOISE STATE

- Virginia and Boise State are meeting for the second time in football and the Broncos lead the series, 1-0.
- UVA and Boise State's lone meeting in 2015 at Scott Stadium is the Broncos' only game they have ever played in the Commonwealth of Virginia.
- UVA is one of three Commonwealth opponents the Broncos have faced. The Broncos hosted Liberty University in 1991 and 1994, and then played Virginia Tech at FedEx Field in Landover, Md., in 2010.
- Boise State is 3-2 all-time against current members of the ACC, facing Boston College (0-1), Louisville (1-1), Virginia (1-0) and Virginia Tech (1-0).



Micah Kiser was named the Walter Camp National Defensive Player of the Week on Sunday after recording a game-high 15 tackles (seven solo), two sacks and a fumble recovery in UVA's 38-18 win over UConn.

### FIVE TOP STORYLINES

- Virginia's game at Boise State is the first of two this season where the Cavaliers will play on a Friday. UVA hosts Virginia Tech on Nov. 24, marking the first time in program history UVA has two Friday games in the same season.
- QB **Kurt Benkert** has started 13 career games for the Cavaliers and in six of those starts he has thrown for at least three touchdowns.
- Benkert ranks No. 3 in the ACC in passing yards (976) and passing touchdowns (7). His 32 completions per game ranks No. 3 in the nation and No. 1 in the ACC.
- ILB **Micah Kiser** has registered 29 combined tackles, four sacks, one fumble recovery and one pass breakup over UVA's last two games.
- UVA's defense has limited its first three opponents to a combined 3-of-24 (.125) when it is third-and-five, or longer.

## #HoosRising: BY THE NUMBERS

- 1 FS Quin Blanding's 391 career tackles are the most among all active FBS players and ranks No. 4 all-time in the UVA record book.
- 4 Virginia is playing a game west of the Mississippi River for the fourth straight season. UVA previously went to BYU ('14), UCLA ('15) & Oregon ('16).
- 455 QB Kurt Benkert broke his own single-game school record with 455 passing yards last time out against UConn.

**PLAYER INTERVIEWS**

Players are available for interviews each Monday, depending on class schedules. If you have specific player interview requests, they should be directed to Vincent Briedis in the UVA Athletics Media Relations office by noon Sunday.

Requested defensive players and defensive coaches will be available for telephone interviews Tuesday, while offensive players and offensive coaches will be available Wednesday.

No player or coach interviews will be arranged after Wednesday during game week.

**POSTGAME INTERVIEWS**

Coach Mendenhall will hold his postgame press conference in the media room, while requested players will be brought to the media room to meet with media representatives after Mendenhall. UVA athletics media relations personnel will take player requests during the fourth quarter of each game.

Virginia's locker room is closed to media following games, both at home and on the road.

On that day, within 90 minutes of the end of practice, injured players' playing status for the next game will be announced in one of five categories:

- Definitely will play
- Probable
- Questionable
- Doubtful
- Out

## UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

## UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

## THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

The first documented Cavalier on horseback was Francis Bell, a Virginia student from Dublin, Va., in 1947. Bell rode onto the field dressed as Cavaliers for Virginia's home football game with Harvard on the afternoon of October 11.

The Cavalier on horseback returned as the University's mascot in 1963. The UVA Polo Club provided both the horse and rider. However, the mounted Cavalier and his horse parted company in 1974 with the inception of AstroTurf at Scott Stadium.

The mounted Cavalier made its return in the Florida Citrus Bowl at the end of the 1989 football season. Due to its instant popularity, the Cavalier on horseback returned the following season on a regular basis and continues to lead the Virginia football team onto the field at the beginning of all home games.

## UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

## WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

## CAVALIERS HAVE HAD A TASTE OF BOISE

- While this is the first meeting between the Broncos and Cavaliers in Boise, Virginia is no stranger to Boise State's Albertsons Stadium.
- Virginia met Fresno State on the blue FieldTurf of Albertsons Stadium in the 2004 MPC Computers Bowl.
- Current UVA wide receivers coach Marques Hagans was 18-of-30 for 162 yards and one touchdown, while rushing seven times for 85 yards and another score in the Cavaliers' 37-34 overtime loss to the Bulldogs.
- In his final collegiate game, UVA All-American tight end and former Pro Bowl Pittsburgh Steeler, Heath Miller, caught five passes for 66 yards.

## MENDENHALL IS FAMILIAR WITH BOISE STATE

- While UVA and Boise State are meeting for only the second time in program history, there is some familiarity between the two staffs.
- UVA head coach Bronco Mendenhall has faced the Broncos on four previous occasions, twice at Albertsons Stadium and twice in Provo when he was the head coach at BYU.
- Mendenhall won the home games in 2013 (37-20) and 2015 (35-24) and lost at Albertsons Stadium in 2012 (6-7) and 2014 (30-55).
- Mendenhall and Boise State head coach Bryan Harsin faced off against each other in the 2014 and 2015 meetings.
- UVA's entire coaching staff, except for wide receivers coach Marques Hagans (UVA alum), were part of those BYU staffs that faced Boise State while at BYU under Mendenhall. Of the eight coaches that followed Mendenhall from BYU, only Vic So'oto (defensive line) was not part of at least three Mendenhall staffs that faced Boise State.

## ADDITIONAL UVA VS. MOUNTAIN WEST HISTORY

- Virginia is 2-4 against current members of the Mountain West Conference.
- The 1998 San Jose State game and the 2004 MPC Computers Bowl (Boise, Idaho) against Fresno State were against teams from the WAC at the time of the game.
- UVA's 1999 and 2000 games against BYU, as well as its 2009 game against TCU were against schools that were members of the Mountain West Conference at the time, but have since moved out of the league.

**Last Meeting**

The last time these two teams met the tone was set on the first play from scrimmage for Virginia.

Matt Johns dropped back to pass, and as the pocket collapsed around him, he attempted to flip the ball over his shoulder. Three-hundred-pound defensive tackle Justin Taimatua intercepted it and lumbered 21 yards for a touchdown and a 7-0 lead after 16 seconds.

Jeremy McNichols' 47-yard run on third down set up his first touchdown, on a 2-yard run. Johns' second interception, by Darian Thompson on a deep ball, set up a four-play drive to Tyler Rausa's 51-yard field goal. The game was barely 7 minutes old and the Broncos led 17-0.

UVA got on the board when Johns, throwing off his back foot and under heavy pressure, heaved a ball in the direction of T.J. Thorpe and Thorpe came down with it in tight coverage and outran cornerback Jonathan Moxey for a 75-yard scoring play.

Making his first collegiate start, Boise State quarterback Brett Rypien, a nephew of former Washington Redskins quarterback Mark Rypien, finished 21 of 32 for 250 yards with touchdowns of 10 yards to McNichols and 30 and 64 yards to Thomas Sperbeck. This all came a week after he made his college debut by leading the Broncos to three touchdowns and a field goal in just over one quarter of action against Idaho State.

Johns finished 12 for 25 for 199 yards with two touchdowns and three interceptions. He was sacked three times and hit frequently.

## UVA ROLLS OVER 600 YARDS OF TOTAL OFFENSE AGAINST UCONN

- UVA accumulated 626 yards of total offense against UConn last time out. It was the most yards gained by the Cavaliers since 2010 when UVA gained 643 yards at Duke.
- It was UVA's first 600+-yard game of total offense since 2012 when the Cavaliers gained 625 yards of total offense against Louisiana Tech.

## RECEIVING TRIO SETS RECORD AGAINST UCONN

- For the first time in program history, UVA had three different players record at least 100 yards receiving in the same game. Doni Dowling (136), Andre Levrone (127) and Olamide Zaccheaus (122) became the first UVA trio to accomplish the milestone in UVA's 38-18 win over UConn.
- It was only the 10th time UVA had multiple Cavaliers with at least 100 yards receiving in the same game and the first time since the 2013 Georgia Tech game (Tim Smith, 151 yard & Darius Jennings, 119 yards).
- Dowling, Levrone and Zaccheaus are only the sixth ACC trio to accomplish the feat since 2000.
- Since 2000, Florida State accomplished the feat twice in 2000 and once in 2005. Miami did it in 2012 and Virginia Tech in 2016.

## BENKERT BREAKS UVA SINGLE-GAME PASSING/TOTAL OFFENSE RECORD

- QB Kurt Benkert was 30-of-40 for a career-high 455 passing yards against UConn last Saturday. He broke his own UVA single-game passing record (421) that he set last season against Central Michigan.
- UVA has had a quarterback throw for over 400 yards only three times in program history and Benkert has done it twice.
- Marc Verica was the first Cavalier to throw for at least 400 yards in a game in 2010 when he threw for 417 at Duke.
- Benkert's game against UConn thrust him up to No. 13 all-time at UVA in career passing with 3,528 yards.
- Benkert also broke Verica's record for total offense in a game with 465 yards of total offense. Verica's record was 413 at Duke in 2010.

## DOWLING AND ZACCHEAUS REACH MILESTONE TOGETHER

- WR Doni Dowling and HB Olamide Zaccheaus each passed the career 1,000-yard receiving mark in UVA's win against UConn last Saturday. Zaccheaus became the 37th Cavalier in program history in the second quarter, while Dowling became the 38th Cavalier in program history in the fourth quarter.
- Against UConn, Dowling recorded his first career 100-yard receiving game (136). Zaccheaus recorded his second career 100-yard receiving game (122). Zaccheaus had his first last season against Central Michigan, the other career game QB Kurt Benkert threw for over 400 yards.

## DOWLING HONORS TIM HARRIS

- WR Doni Dowling moved from No. 7 to No. 5 prior to the Indiana game to honor CB Tim Harris. Wearing No. 5 since his arrival on Grounds in 2013, Harris had a season-ending injury in the opener against William & Mary.
- Dowling and Harris have been lifelong friends, as well as teammates at Richmond's Varina High School.

## BLANDING AND KISER ANCHOR THE DEFENSE

- ILB Micah Kiser (12.0) and FS Quin Blanding (11) currently rank No. 1 and No. 2 in the ACC in tackles. This is nothing new for the duo as they finished No. 1 and No. 2 in the ACC in tackles in 2015 and 2016.
- Kiser ranks No. 4 in the nation in tackles in 2017, while Blanding ranks No. 9 in the nation.
- In 2016 Kiser (11.2) led the ACC in tackles and finished No. 4 nationally. Blanding (10.0) finished No. 2 in the ACC in tackles for the third year in a row and No. 9 nationally.
- Kiser (9.75) and Blanding (9.58) also finished No. 1 and No. 2, respectively, in the ACC in tackles in 2015.
- Since the ACC started tracking tackle leaders in 1990, no previous tandem of tacklers has led the league in tackles for two consecutive seasons until Kiser and Blanding.
- Blanding, who also finished No. 2 in the ACC in tackles in 2014 (10.25), is the only player in ACC history to finish second in tackles for three straight seasons.
- The only ACC player since 1990 to lead the league in tackles for three consecutive seasons is Boston College's Luke Kuechly (2009-11), now of the NFL's Carolina Panthers.

## BLANDING AND KISER GET HELP ON DEFENSE

- Despite ranking No. 1 and No. 2 in the ACC in tackles, FS Quin Blanding and ILB Micah Kiser are getting solid help on defense as UVA has four of the ACC's Top 15 tacklers.
- ILB Jordan Mack is No. 11 in the ACC with 8.0 tackles per game, while OLB Malcolm Cook is No. 15 with 7.7 stops per game.
- Cook made a career-high 13 stops against William & Mary and Mack made a career-high 16 tackles against Indiana.

## BLANDING DOUBLES UP THE TACKLES

- UVA's Quin Blanding has 20 double-digit tackle games over 39 collegiate games.
- Blanding has had six double-digit tackle games in each of his first three seasons.
- Blanding has 391 career tackles, 10.0 per game.



**EVAN BUTTS HAD A CAREER DAY AGAINST INDIANA**

- Tight end Evan Butts had a career-high six receptions for a career-high 54 yards against Indiana.
- Butts' six receptions was the most by a UVA tight end since Jake McGee made eight at Maryland in 2013.
- With eight receptions in 2017 already, Butts has more catches than he had in all of 2016 (seven).

**ZACCHEAUS GIVES BENKERT A BIG OFFENSIVE WEAPON**

- Junior Olamide Zaccheaus became the 37th Cavalier all-time with 1,000 career receiving yards after his 122-yard day against UConn.
- Zaccheaus also needs two receptions to reach 100 for his career. He would become the 21st Cavalier to reach that mark in program history.
- Zaccheaus' 12 receptions against Indiana on Sept. 9 are the sixth most in a single game in UVA history.
- Olamide is Nigerian for "the blessing has come."

**VIRGINIA FOOTBALL TO WEAR #HOOSTOGETHER PATCHES ON UNIFORMS IN 2017**

- In the aftermath of the events that took place in Charlottesville this summer, the Virginia athletics department initiated the #HoosTogether campaign on social media in an effort to unite our community in support of love, diversity and inclusion.
- During the 2017-18 academic year, all UVA sports programs will incorporate a #HoosTogether patch on their uniforms or equipment. It is UVA's hope the patches serve as a reminder of what can be accomplished when we are united behind a common goal and we hope this effort continues to help bring our community together.

**HAMM RUSHES FOR A TOUCHDOWN IN FIVE STRAIGHT SEASONS**

- After his five-yard rushing score against UConn, TB Daniel Hamm has rushed for at least one touchdown in five straight seasons.
- Hamm becomes the first Cavalier to rush for at least one touchdown in five straight seasons.
- With available records dating back to 2004, no ACC player has rushed for at least one touchdown in five straight seasons.
- Hamm played in two games as a true freshman in 2013 before being hurt at Pitt and receiving a medical hardship. In his collegiate debut, he set a UVA record for most rushing yards in a college debut with 136 against VMI. Hamm also rushed for two touchdowns against the Keydets in 2013.
- Hamm has six career rushing touchdowns.

**REINKENSMAYER STARTS OPENER AT LEFT TACKLE, SHIFTS TO CENTER**

- Dillon Reinkensmeyer was the first freshman, true or redshirt, to start a season-opening game on the offensive line for UVA since R-Fr. Will Barker started at RT in 2006 vs. Pitt.
- Reinkensmeyer is the first freshman, redshirt or true, to start a season-opening game at LT since D'Brickashaw Ferguson (true freshman) in 2002 vs. Colorado State.
- Reinkensmeyer has not appeared at left tackle since, despite receiving the highest grade on the offensive line against the Tribe.
- He played most of the second half at center against Indiana and started the UConn game at center.

**FORMER WALK-ON BEN HOGG GETS FIRST COLLEGIATE RECEPTION**

- WR Ben Hogg, a former walk-on, made his first collegiate catch in UVA's opener against William & Mary.
- The reception came on UVA's first offensive snap, in what was Hogg's first career start.
- Hogg was awarded a scholarship on the eve of the 2016 season. He went on to appear in nine games that season.
- Hogg walked-on to UVA in 2014 after earning first-team VHSL all-state honors at Brookville High School in Lynchburg, Va., where he caught 63 passes for 1,078 yards and nine scores as a senior.
- Hogg added one reception against Indiana on Sept. 9.

**THIRTEEN TRUE FRESHMEN HAVE PLAYED IN 2017**

- Thirteen UVA true freshmen have played in 2017, which ranks No. 7 in the nation entering week No. 4.
- Ten true freshmen made their collegiate debut against William & Mary on Sept. 2. Mandy Alonso (DL), Lamont Atkins (TB), Joey Blount (FS), Germane Crowell (CB), Brian Delaney (PK), Matt Gahm (LB), Terrell Jana (WR), PK Kier (TB), A.J. Mejia (PK) and Jamari Peacock (FB) all made their collegiate debuts against the Tribe.
- ILB Zane Zandier became the 11th UVA true freshman to play in 2017 after he appeared on defense against Indiana.
- OLB Elliott Brown and DL John Kirven became the 12th and 13th UVA true freshmen to play in 2017. Brown saw time on defense and Kirven played on special teams.
- The 10 true freshmen playing on the opening weekend ranked No. 8 among the nation's FBS teams.
- Six redshirt freshmen also made their collegiate debut against William & Mary. Dillon Reinkensmeyer (OT), Brenton Nelson (CB), DeVante Cross (WR), Nick Grant (CB) Nash Griffin (Holder) and Ben Knutson (OG) also made their collegiate debuts against the Tribe.
- Additionally, sophomore walk-on linebacker Reed Kellam and junior punter Lester Coleman also made their collegiate debut against William & Mary.

**NOTING FIRST CAREER STARTS IN 2017**

- Nine Cavaliers have made their first collegiate starts in 2017.
- Six Cavaliers made their first career starts against William & Mary on Sept. 2.
- First time starters on offense vs. William & Mary: Jordan Ellis (TB), Ben Hogg (WR), John Montelus (OG) and Dillon Reinkensmeyer (OT).
- First time starters on defense vs. William & Mary: Malcolm Cook (OLB) and Brenton Nelson (CB).
- Three Cavaliers made their first collegiate starts against Indiana on Sept. 9. Tanner Cowley (TE) and Richard Burney (TE) started on offense, while Juwan Moye (DE) started on the defensive line.

## SCOTT STADIUM, HOME OF THE CAVALIERS

The Carl Smith Center, home of David A. Harrison III Field at Scott Stadium, with its unique architectural design, scenic setting on the University's Grounds and exceptional sight lines, is one of the nation's finest college football settings.

Opened in 1931, Scott Stadium might be one of the oldest campus college football stadiums in the nation, but you could never tell from its appearance. Numerous upgrades and expansions make it a modern home for the Cavaliers and their fans.

Scott Stadium was the gift of Frederic William Scott and Elisabeth Strother Scott, and was dedicated to the memory of his parents, Frederic Robert Scott and Frances Branch Scott.

Virginia played its dedication game at Scott Stadium on Oct. 15, 1931 against the Virginia Military Institute before a then-capacity crowd of 22,000. Prior to that season, the Cavaliers staged their home games at the University's Lambeth Field.

Virginia has played 460 games in the historic venue. UVA's all-time record at Scott Stadium stands at 258-190-12.

**JOE REED EXCELS ON KICK RETURN**

- Wide Receiver Joe Reed returned three kicks for 91 yards in the opener against William & Mary, with a long of 44 yards.
- Reed is coming off a solid 2016 where led UVA with 678 kick return yards as a true freshman.
- Reed's 25.1 yards per kick return average was No. 3 in the ACC and No. 21 in the nation in 2016.
- Reed's 678 kick return yards are the second most in a season by a Cavalier, trailing only Khalek Shepherd's single-season program record of 929 in 2012.
- Reed's best game in 2016 was 117 return yards against Miami and his 50-yard return against North Carolina was a season best.

**BREAKING IN A NEW PLACEKICKER/PUNTER**

- Entering 2017, zero of the UVA kickers on the 2017 roster had attempted a field goal or a punt in a collegiate game. In fact, no UVA kicker or punter had appeared in a college game.
- Virginia, Arizona State and UAB were the only programs in the nation that entered 2017 with a kicker or a punter on its roster with zero collegiate experience.
- Virginia was one of six schools in the nation that had zero career collegiate field goal attempts and punts among the kickers on its roster entering 2017. Arizona State, Georgia Tech, Hawaii, Troy and UAB are the other schools.
- This was the the second year in a row UVA has entered a season without a kicker that had attempted a field goal in college.
- Punter Lester Coleman and placekicker A.J. Mejia both made debuts against William & Mary in the season-opening win.
- Mejia is 2-of-3 on field goals (22, 28) and 11-of-11 PATs. Coleman is averaging 40.9 yards per punt with four of his 14 punts landing inside the 20.

## Bronco Mendenhall Head Coach • Second Season

Bronco Mendenhall is in his second season as Virginia's head football coach after being named the program's 40th head coach on Dec. 4, 2015.

In Mendenhall's first season on Grounds he oversaw a secondary that boasted first-team All-ACC honoree and All-American, Quin Blanding. Blanding finished the season No. 2 in the ACC in tackles for the third year in a row with 120 stops. Inside linebacker Micah Kiser, an All-American and first-team All-ACC honoree, thrived to lead the ACC in tackles for the second year in a row with 134, which is tied with former Cavalier great Wali Rainer for fourth-most in a single season in program history. Kiser was also a second-team CoSIDA Academic All-American, becoming the first Cavalier since Tiki Barber in 1996 to earn both academic and athletic All-America honors in the same season.

Offensively, in Mendenhall's first season, Taquan Mizzell became the first player in ACC history to record at least 1,500 career rushing and 1,500 career receiving yards. UVA quarterback Kurt Benkert set a couple of passing marks in UVA's new offense, including a program record for passing yards in a game with 421 against Central Michigan, which was only the second time in program history a UVA quarterback surpassed 400 passing yards in a game. Benkert reached 1,000 passing yards in four games and 2,000 passing yards in eight games, setting a program record for fastest to that standard in a season.

Mendenhall came to Charlottesville after 11 years as the head coach at Brigham Young University. In his 11 seasons, from 2005-2015, Mendenhall compiled an overall record of 99-43 at BYU to rank 12th in total wins among all FBS teams during that time.

In the three seasons prior to Mendenhall becoming the head coach at BYU, the Cougars compiled an overall record of 14-21. Over the last 11 years, the Cougars are one of only 11 programs to advance to a bowl game each season (includes the 2015 season). BYU is joined by Alabama, Boise State, Clemson, Florida State, Georgia, LSU, Oklahoma, Oregon, Virginia Tech and Wisconsin on that list.

Among those 11 teams, only Florida State has achieved more bowl wins (seven) than BYU's six bowl game victories.

BYU football student-athletes have earned freshman All-America recognition in eight of the past 10 seasons. More than 60 BYU players have signed with NFL teams since Mendenhall arrived in Provo, including defensive end Ezekiel Ansah, the No. 5 overall pick in the 2013 NFL Draft and Kyle Van Noy, the No. 40 overall pick in the 2014 NFL Draft.

Under Mendenhall, the Cougars tied for seventh among all FBS programs for the most Academic All-America citations over the last decade and BYU tops all FBS programs with the most selections (39) to the National Football Foundation Hampshire Honor Society (recognizing starters and significant contributors finishing their eligibility with a 3.2 GPA or better over their college career) since the program began in 2007.

The success of Mendenhall's leadership approach in running the BYU football program has been highlighted in a management book, *Running Into the Wind: Bronco Mendenhall -- 5 Strategies for Building a Successful Team*, written by Alyson Von Feldt and Paul Gustavson, a leading management consultant specializing in leadership development and organizational design.

Mendenhall was elected in 2013 to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees as the District 8 Representative and also serves on the AFCA Ethics Committee.

Following the 2006 season, Mendenhall was named the American Football Coaches Association Region IV Coach of the Year. In addition, the Football Writers Association of America named Mendenhall one of nine finalists for the prestigious Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.

A dominant defense led BYU to its seventh winning season in as many years as the BYU football team finished the 2012 season with eight wins, a program-best fourth consecutive bowl victory and the No. 3 defense in the nation. With an 8-5 record, BYU claimed its sixth season with at least eight wins under Mendenhall's eight-year head coaching tenure. Incredibly consistent all year long, BYU finished the year ranked No. 3 in total defense, allowing just 266.1 yards per game. The Cougars ended the season ranked in the top four in five major defensive categories.

Mendenhall has served as the BYU's defensive coordinator for much of his tenure as the head coach. He returned to a full-time role with the defense again in 2015.

During his tenure in Provo, the Cougars have consistently fielded one of the nation's strongest defenses. Mendenhall's defense excels at keeping opponents out of the end zone. Entering the 2015 season, they averaged a No. 20 national ranking in scoring defense while he oversees the defense, including three top-10 ratings.

### Game Notes

- Virginia is 2-2 all-time vs. UConn in the series that dates back to 2007
- The Cavaliers' 38 points marked a series high vs. UConn (previous high was 17 in 2007)
- UVA's 24-point halftime lead was its largest at the break since a 30-point lead over Indiana in 2009
- UVA's first scoring drive of 9:46 marked its longest scoring drive by time in school history, surpassing its 9:15 scoring drive vs. NC State in 1984
- UVA's 626 yards of total offense is the sixth-most in school history and most since 643 vs. Duke in 2010
- QB Kurt Benkert passed for a school-record 455 yards, surpassing his own school record of 421 set last year vs. Central Michigan

- The last time UVA had multiple players with 100 or more receiving yards in a game was Tim Smith (151 yards) and Darius Jennings (119 yards) vs. Georgia Tech in 2013
- Dowling had a career-high 136 receiving yards and extended his reception streak to eight games
- Levrone totaled a career-high 127 receiving yards, including a career-long 73-yard TD reception
- Zaccheaus extended his reception streak to 19 games and became the 37th Cavalier to reach 1,000 career receiving yards
- Zaccheaus totaled 225 all-purpose yards, second most in his career (231 vs. Boise State in 2015)
- Daniel Hamm tallied his first rushing touchdown of the season (sixth career) and became the first UVA player in school history to record at least one rushing TD in five straight seasons
- Jordan Ellis had a career-best 95 rushing yards and tallied his third rushing touchdown (sixth career)
