JACKETS, CAVALIERS RENEW ONE OF ACC'S MOST EVEN RIVALRIES

Georgia Tech, which rolled up 712 yards of offense and posted its largest margin of victory in Paul Johnson's era last Saturday, will welcome undefeated Virginia to Bobby Dodd Stadium Saturday in a meeting of Coastal Division foes.

Kickoff is set for 3:30 p.m. ET, and the 650th all-time game at Bobby Dodd Stadium, is live on ESPNU.

The teams are meeting for the 35th time, and the series narrowly favors Virginia, 17-16-1 to mark the third-closest active ACC series. The teams have split the last two matchups and the series is deadlocked over the last six tilts.

The Yellow Jackets are 3-1 in ACC home openers under Coach Johnson.

Tech, which opened its 2012 season with a 20-17 overtime loss at then-No. 16/20 Virginia Tech -- a game in which the Jackets led 17-14 with 44 seconds remaining -- is looking to avoid its first 0-2 ACC start since 2007.

At halftime of Saturday's game, Tech will honor the 60th anniversary of the 1952 National Championship team, which finished 12-0 and beat Ole Miss in the Sugar Bowl.

BOBBY DODD STADIUM'S 650th GAME

Bobby Dodd Stadium at Historic Grant Field is the nation's oldest and winningest college football venue. Saturday's game marks the 650th Tech game played at the venerable site, which has seen 444 Jacket victories.

The Jackets are 444-184-21 all-time at Bobby Dodd Stadium, a winning percentage of 70 percent.

First hosting Tech games in 1913, Bobby Dodd Stadium is the oldest stadium FBS stadium and third-oldest in all of college football. Only Penn's Franklin Field (1895) and Harvard's Harvard Stadium (1903) are older.

TECH-VIRGINIA SERIES NOTES

- Virginia leads the all-time series, 17-16-1.
- Georgia Tech has won two of the last three meetings, but Virginia beat Tech 24-21 last season in Charlottesville, knocking the Yellow Jackets from the ranks of the unbeaten.
- Virginia has won six of the last nine meetings.
- Tech holds a 13-7 series advantage in Atlanta.

#7 B.J. Bostic

After missing all of last season with an injury he suffered in Training Camp, redshirt sophomore A-Back B.J. Bostic has been a welcome addition back for the Jackets.

In his eight offensive touches this season -- six carries, one catch, one incomplete pass attempt -- Bostic has totalled 69 all-purpose yards (9.86 yards/play) and converted five first downs.

The speedster played 13 games as a true freshman and averaged 9.8 yards on 13 carries.

lanta, in 2010, Georgia Tech won 33-21. The previous meeting in Bobby Dodd Stadium, in 2008, the Al Groh-coached Cavaliers spoiled Tech's Homecoming, 24-17.

- The two teams have met every season since 1982.
- One of Tech's all-time greatest victories was a 41-38 win over Virginia in Charlottesville in 1990 when the Cavaliers were ranked No. 1 nationally. The Jackets went on to win a share of the national championship.
- The two teams first met on the gridiron in 1965. Georgia Tech won the first six meetings.
- Georgia Tech head coach Paul Johnson is 2-2 all-time vs. Virginia.

TECH-VIRGINIA CONNECTIONS

- Tech defensive coordinator Al Groh was head coach of the Cavaliers from 2001-09. Groh, a 1967 UVA graduate, was a Wahoo assistant coach from 1970-72.

- Tech offensive line coach Mike Sewak is a 1981 Virginia grad and played three years for the Cavaliers.

- Georgia Tech has just one player on its roster from the Commonwealth of Virginia -- Tim Seager (Blacksburg).

- Virginia has five players on its roster from Georgia -- Miles Gooch (Decatur), D.J. Hill (Covington), Sam Jowers (Atlanta), Greyson Lambert (Jesup) and C.J. Moore (Buford).

- Yellow Jacket LB Nick Menocal and Cavalier DB Pablo Alvarez were teammates at Belen Jesuit Prep in Florida.

- Tech's Louis Young and Roderick Chungong, and UVA's Vincent Croce and E.J. Scott, all previously attended Good Counsel HS.

- Yellow Jacket DB Domonique Noble and Cavalier RB Kevin Parks both graduated from West Rowan (N.C.) High School.

- Cavaliers LB coach Vincent Brown is an Atlanta native. He played in the 1990s with the New England Patriots, whose defensive coordinator was Al Groh. Brown was a graduate assistant under Groh at UVA in 2007.

- UVA offensive coordinator Bill Lazor started his NFL coaching career with the Atlanta Falcons in 2003 as offensive quality control coach for Dan Reeves.

- Virginia tight ends coach Shawn Moore was the Cavaliers' quarterback in 1990 when No. 1-ranked UVA lost to Georgia Tech in one of the Yellow Jackets' all-time biggest wins.

- Georgia Tech assistant sports information director Mike DeGeorge previously worked at Richmond where he worked closely with London as the football SID.

HONORING BURNETT

Georgia Tech will pay tribute to former linebacker Julian Burnett this season by rotating Burnett's jersey No. 40 among senior players each game this season.

Burnett was star linebacker for the Jackets, a leader on and off the field, before suffering a career-ending injury last season.

Senior DT T.J. Barnes, normally No. 90, wore No. 40 during the season opener, while senior CB Rod Sweeting wore 40 versus Presbyterian.

A SILVER LINING?

Prior to the season-opening 20-17 loss in overtime at Virginia Tech, the last time Georgia Tech lost a season opener came in 2006, a year the Yellow Jackets opened with a loss to Notre Dame, then went on to win the ACC Coastal Division title.

The last time Tech opened a season with a five-day turnaround -- 2009 -- was also a year in which the Jackets won the ACC Coastal crown.

TECH IN THE POLLS

Georgia Tech remains in the "others receiving votes" in this week's release of both the Associated Press and the USA Today Coaches polls. Tech is officially 35th in both the Coaches and the AP polls.

In Sports Illustrated's college football preview issue, the Yellow Jackets were picked 20th in its preseason poll, and Tech was receiving votes in both the USA Today Coaches and AP preseason polls.

STREAKS CONTINUE

- Georgia Tech has played 186 consecutive games without being shut out. The last shutout was Oct. 18, 1997 vs. Florida State, 38-0.

- It's been 172 consecutive games that the Yellow Jackets have played without returning a kickoff for a touchdown. The last was a 100-yarder by Dez White on Oct. 31, 1998 versus Maryland in Baltimore.

RARE EARLY-SEASON SETBACK

The 20-17 overtime loss at Virginia Tech was the first season-opening loss for head coach Paul Johnson since 2005 when his Navy squad lost 23-20 against Maryland.

Georgia Tech is now 13-5 in August/September games under Johnson.

THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT THE PRESBYTERIAN GAME

- The 56-point margin of victory was the largest in the Paul Johnson era at Tech.
- Eight different Yellow Jackets scored touchdowns – the most since Sept. 8, 2001 vs. Navy.
- Two different Tech quarterbacks threw touchdown passes (Tevin Washington and Vad Lee) for the first time since Dec. 31, 2007 vs. Fresno State in the Humanitarian Bowl.
- The three points scored by Presbyterian were the fewest allowed by a Tech team since blanking Duke on Oct. 4, 2008.
- Tech held an opponent to zero touchdowns – something it did not do at all in 2010 or 2011.
- Presbyterian's 10 first downs were the fewest by a Tech opponent since North Carolina had nine first downs on Sept. 26, 2009.
- The Blue Hose averaged just 2.8 yards per pass attempt – the lowest average by a Tech opponent since 2005.
- Presbyterian's nine punts were the most by a Tech opponent since Oct. 11, 2008 vs. Gardner-Webb.

BELIEVE IT OR NOT...

Tevin Washington's eight-yard pass to Jeremy Moore early in the second quarter versus Presbyterian was the first career reception for ANY wide receiver on Tech's roster. Moore finished the game with three grabs for 64 yards, while Jeff Greene reeled in three passes for 94 yards and a touchdown. The Jackets have thrown for three TDs this season, after recording just one TD pass in the final eight games of 2011.

60TH ANNIVERSARY OF 1952 NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Georgia Tech will honor the 1951 and 1952 Yellow Jacket football teams at half-time of Tech's game against Virginia. This marks the 60th anniversary of Tech's 1952 national championship.

The two teams combined for a 23-0-1 record under legendary head coach Bobby Dodd. Both teams won SEC titles and won their bowl games. The 1951 team defeated ninth-ranked Baylor 17-14 in the Orange Bowl. The 1952 team defeated seventh-ranked Ole Miss 24-7 in the Sugar Bowl to win a share of the national championship. The win over the Rebels gave Tech its third national title.

THREE SCORE SCHOLARSHIPS

Georgia Tech head coach Paul Johnson awarded scholarships in August to three players who came to the Flats as walk-ons: junior kicker David Scully, senior A-Back Jamal Paige and sophomore defensive back Coray Carlson.

Scully is listed first on the depth chart at kicker. Paige is an unselfish senior in his fifth-year in the program. Carlson saw action last season as a true freshman.

JACKETS EARN DEGREES

Senior QB Tevin Washington and OL Nick McRae are playing as graduate students, after earning their degrees during Tech's August graduation ceremony. Senior OL Omoregie Uzzi is also playing as a graduate after earning his degree last December.

TALL HOMECOMING TASK

Georgia Tech's Oct. 27 Homecoming Game vs. BYU will be a tough test for the Yellow Jackets. BYU finished ranked 25th in the final 2011 USA Today Coaches Poll, and was the top vote-getter among teams receiving votes in the AP poll.

Tech has won 15 of its last 16 Homecoming games, with the only loss coming in 2008 to Al Groh's Virginia team.

BIG PLAY CJ MADE EARLY IMPACT

Former Yellow Jacket WR Calvin Johnson is one of just eight Yellow Jackets since 1996 to start a season-opener as a true freshman. In his debut against Samford on Sept. 4, 2004 -- a 28-7 Tech win at Bobby Dodd Stadium -- Johnson caught two balls for 45 yards, including one for 29 yards.

He finished that year with 837 yards, and would go on to set Tech's all-time receiving record with 2,927 yards.

MODEL OF CONSISTENCY

• Tech played in a bowl game in 2011 for the 15th consecutive season. That ranks as the fourth-longest active streak among FBS schools.

• Tech has finished .500 or better in league play for an ACC-record 17 consecutive seasons. That's the longest current streak in the nation. Florida's streak of 24 straight seasons came to an end last season.

PAUL JOHNSON: IMPRESSIVE NUMBERS

• Paul Johnson led the Jackets to 33 wins in his first four years -- more than any other Tech coach in his first four years.

• Between 1967 and Johnson's arrival in 2008, Georgia Tech went 2-29-1 at home vs. teams ranked in the top 10. Johnson is 2-1 at home against top-10 teams.

• Johnson is 6-2 at home against top 25 opponents.

• Since Bobby Dodd retired after the 1966 season, only one Georgia Tech coach -- George O'Leary (.612) -- won 60 percent of his games. Johnson's win percentage is .630.

• For his head coaching career, Paul Johnson averages 9.4 wins per year. That ranks ninth among all active FBS coaches.

• Johnson is the first Tech coach to win eight or more games in three of his first four seasons. He has at least eight wins in 13 of his 15 seasons as a head coach.

• Johnson is just the fourth ACC coach to defeat all 11 conference opponents, joining Bobby Bowden, Frank Beamer and Tom O'Brien.

• He is 12-5 at Tech in games decided by five points or less.

• Johnson's Tech teams are 23-1 when scoring more than 30 points.

• He is the first coach in ACC history to be named Coach of the Year in each of his first two seasons.

• Only four coaches in ACC history won more games in their first four seasons than Johnson.

• Tech has scored at least one rushing touchdown in 50 of 55 games under Johnson.

• In 12 of the Jackets' 34 wins under Johnson, Tech trailed by seven points or more.

DODD STATUE UNVEILED SATURDAY

Georgia Tech, in conjunction with Dodd's Boys, will unveil a statue of legendary head coach Bobby Dodd on Friday, Sept. 14.

BIG PLAY GT

The Yellow Jackets racked up 712 yards of total offense in last week's 59-3 thumping of Presbyterian at Bobby Dodd Stadium. It was the second-highest total offense figure in history, behind last year's 768 versus Kansas (a 66-24 win).

Big plays have become a staple of Paul Johnson's spread option offense, and Tech gouged Presbyterian with plays of 45 yards or more, including four for touchdowns -- the most in Johnson's tenure at Tech.

THE GOON SQUAD

The self-named "Goon Squad" is Tech's offensive line, which returns four starters, seven letterwinners from a unit that helped Tech rank second nationally in rushing offense.

Although still young -- only All-American guard Omoregie Uzzi is a senior -- the Goon Squad has combined for 84 career starts, led by Uzzi's 26 and Will Jackson's 23.

ORWIN SMITH: MR. VERSATILITY

Senior A-Back Orwin Smith was highly productive last fall as a runner, receiver and kick returner:

- Smith and Duke's Desmond Scott are the only two active players in the ACC with 1,000+ rushing yards, 500+ receiving yards and 1,000+ kickoff return yards.

- Smith averaged 10.1 yards per rushing attempt.
- He scored a TD every 5.55 carries -- 11 TDs, 61 carries.
- Smith averages 25.5 yards per reception.
- His 12 touchdowns (11 rushing, 1 receiving) ranked tied for fourth in the ACC.

- Smith rushed for three touchdowns at NC State.
- Smith has more than 1,100 career rushing yards, 1,300 kickoff return yards and 3,000 all-purpose yards.

- He had more than 1,200 all-purpose yards in 2011.
- Smith's 95-yard run on Tech's first play of the game against Kansas was the longest run from scrimmage in Georgia Tech history.

- Against Kansas, Smith rushed for 157 yards and a touchdown, and had 108 yards receiving and a TD. He became the first player in Tech history to have more than 100 rushing and receiving yards in the same game.

- He was the first ACC player to have 100 or more yards in rushing and receiving in the same game since Mikell Simpson of Virginia vs. Maryland on Oct. 20, 2007.

- He was the first ACC player with 100-plus yards and a touchdown in both receiving and rushing in the same game since Thomas Jones of Virginia vs. Buffalo on Nov. 13, 1999.

NOTING THE DEFENSE

GROH-ING CONFIDENCE

The Yellow Jackets have shown steady defensive improvement each season under fourth-year year coordinator Al Groh, and the early returns in 2012 are positive:

- Tech ranks in the top 25 nationally in passing defense, total defense, pass efficiency defense, red zone defense and scoring defense.

- Tech has not allowed a rushing touchdown this season.
- Tech has not allowed a point in the second or third quarters this season.

- Tech opponents have been denied a touchdown on two of their three first-and-goal opportunities (one field goal, one turnover on downs), and the Jackets have stopped opponents on five of six plays at the 1-yard line.

- Tech came five seconds from a shutout of Presbyterian, after limiting the Blue Hose to 243 yards of total offense.

- The three points scored by Presbyterian were the fewest allowed by a Tech team since blanking Duke on Oct. 4, 2008.

- Tech held an opponent to zero touchdowns – something it did not do at all in 2010 or 2011.

- Presbyterian's 10 first downs were the fewest by a Tech opponent since North Carolina had nine first downs on Sept. 26, 2009.

- The Blue Hose averaged just 2.8 yards per pass attempt – the lowest average by a Tech opponent since 2005.

- Presbyterian's nine punts were the most by a Tech opponent since Oct. 11, 2008 vs. Gardner-Webb.

UNDERMANNED, NOT OUT-MATCHED

With two new starters (T.J. Barnes and Emmanuel Dieke) on the front line and down three other starters for the opener -- S Fred Holton, CB Louis Young, LB Daniel Drummond -- the Yellow Jackets turned in a gutsy effort in the season-opener at Virginia Tech on a night when the offense scored just 17 points.

Tech limited the hosts to just 96 yards rushing (VT racked up 267 yards in last year's meeting), and kept the Hokies out of the Red Zone on eight consecutive possessions after their first quarter touchdown.

Playing in his first career game, redshirt freshman LB Jabari Hunt-Days was Tech's second-leading tackler (nine) and recorded a TFL. Monday night also marked first career starts for DE Emmanuel Dieke and DB Jamal Golden. CB Rod Sweeting turned in a solid all-around effort with six tackles, a career-best 2.5 TFL and a pair of pass breakups.

STEADY IMPROVEMENT

- Defensively last season, Tech improved its national ranking, compared to the previous year, in every statistical category.

- Georgia Tech had six more interceptions last season (14) than it did during the 2010 season (8).

- Oct. 29 against sixth-ranked Clemson, Tech held the Tigers to 95 yards rushing, three first-half points and forced four turnovers.

- At Miami (Oct. 22), Tech held the Hurricanes to just three second-half points. Miami scored 24 points in the game, but seven of those came on a fumble recovery in the end zone.

- At Virginia, the Jackets held their opponent scoreless in the second half for the second time last season (also vs.

Western Carolina). In 2010, Tech did not hold any opponent scoreless in any half.

- Maryland entered the fourth quarter with just three points against Tech.

- Tech allowed just 44 third-quarter points.

THE CLOSER: JEMEA THOMAS

Junior CB Jemea Thomas had the first three interceptions of his career over a three-week period beginning in late October last season, but more importantly, he almost single-handedly secured victories over Clemson and Duke.

- Nov. 19 at Duke, the Blue Devils were driving late in the fourth quarter for a potential game-tying touchdown when Thomas intercepted a Sean Renfree pass.

- Oct. 29 in the win over sixth-ranked Clemson, Thomas recorded two fourth-quarter interceptions.

- His performance vs. Clemson -- his first career start -- earned him ACC Defensive Back of the Week honors.

- Thomas was the first Yellow Jacket with two interceptions in a game since Jerrard Tarrant had two picks against Middle Tennessee State on Oct. 16, 2010.

- He took over at punt returner in last October and finished the season with three returns for an average of 10.3 yards.

ATTAOCHU FITS THE MOLD

On the heels of an All-ACC season as a sophomore, the expectations are high for junior LB Jeremiah Attaochu. Considered one of the ACC's top pass rushers, Attaochu fits the mold of an outside linebacker in Al Groh's 3-4 scheme.

He racked up a team-leading six sacks last season (ranked fifth in the ACC and 54th nationally) and was sixth in the ACC in tackles for loss (11.5).

He received a wealth of preseason All-ACC recognition, including a first-team nod from Blue Ribbon.

Born in Nigeria, Attaochu and his family moved to Washington when he was young and he didn't begin playing football until high school.

NOTING THE SPECIAL TEAMS

JOHNSON ADDS FIRST SPECIAL TEAMS COORDINATOR

Georgia Tech's special teams were understandably scrutinized last season. Two Tech field goals were blocked (one returned for a touchdown), a fumbled punt return resulted in a Miami TD, there were two punts of less than 20 yards and three missed field goals against Utah.

In the off-season, head coach Paul Johnson added special teams coach Dave Walkosky to the staff -- Tech's first special teams-only coach in Johnson's tenure.

Walkosky had previously worked as a head coach and assistant coach on the collegiate level, and most recently as an assistant in the Canadian Football League.

SCULLY WINS KICKING JOB

Junior David Scully, entering the season in a battle with returning starter Jeremy Moore, won the job in preseason camp and hasn't disappointed.

Scully made his first career field goal at Virginia Tech (from 34 yards to give Tech a 10-7 lead in the fourth quarter), was good on both of his extra-point tries and averaged 64.2 yards on his four kickoffs. Two kickoffs went for touchbacks.

Against Presbyterian, Scully made good on a 32-yard field goal try, converted all eight extra points and registered five more touchbacks.

With seven touchbacks this season, Tech is one shy of matching the number from the entire 2011 season.

TECH AMONG FBS LEADERS IN PUNT COVERAGE

Junior P Sean Poole and the Jackets punt coverage unit ranks tied for fifth in the FBS, allowing a -2.0 yards per return average. Presbyterian was limited to minus-six yards on two returns, while Virginia Tech got nothing on its one return versus Tech.

Poole is averaging 42.1 yards on his 10 punts this season, with a long of 55 yards and landing two inside the 20.

KING ENTERS 48th SEASON

Dr. Aaron King, the team dentist for Georgia Tech football and men's basketball, is in his 48th season working with the Yellow Jackets. King actually began his association with Yellow Jacket football in 1960 when he made a mouthpiece – they were not required equipment back then – for one player. Five years later King became Tech's official team dentist.

SEPARATED AT BIRTH

Georgia Tech's Francis Kallon and Pat Gamble are both true freshmen, both defensive ends and both highly-touted prospects from Georgia. Both are 6-foot-5, both attended a "Central" high school – Gamble went to Central Carroll, Kallon attended Central Gwinnett. By chance, they ended up rooming together this summer. Oh, and they were born on the very same day – February 2nd, 1994.

GROH-ING LIST

With the induction of Curtis Martin, defensive coordinator Al Groh can add another Pro Football Hall of Famer to the list of legends he's been associated with in his four-decade career. The former New England Patriots and New York Jets running back, Martin was on both clubs during Groh's tenures as linebackers coach. Martin extended an invitation for Groh to attend the Pro Football Hall of Fame induction in Canton, Ohio, which he accepted.

ALL IN THE FAMILY

Sophomore QB/AB Synjyn Days is joined on the Yellow Jacket team by his brother, redshirt freshman linebacker Jabari Hunt-Days. But perhaps the most interesting story concerning the Days family is that Synjyn's mother, Paula, was an assistant coach on his middle school team. Paula coached the offensive and defensive lines.

IMPROBABLE DETOUR

Following Hurricane Katrina, Louisiana native Tony Zenon and his family fled his home state. The Zenons packed up everything they could, got in the car and began driving with no destination in mind. They stumbled upon Albany, Ga., settled there and Tony began playing at Deerfield Windsor Academy, where he put up remarkable numbers in high school.

LIGHTS, CAMERA, ACTION

The Georgia Tech campus, set in the heart of midtown Atlanta, has become a trendy choice for a movie sets recently, with two films this past year filmed here.

Parts of "Trouble with the Curve", starring Clint Eastwood, Amy Adams and Justin Timberlake, were filmed at Tech -- mostly at Russ Chandler Stadium, the Yellow Jackets' baseball venue. That movie is set for debut in late September.

Another movie, "The Internship," starring Vince Vaughn and Owen Wilson, was just filmed late this summer at Tech, using a number of campus scenes and academic buildings. That movie is scheduled to be released in 2013.

MEGATRON ON MADDEN

Former Georgia Tech superstar Calvin Johnson will grace the cover of **Madden13**, released in August. "Megatron" has emerged as one of the top players in the NFL.

The Detroit Lions wide receiver enters the 2012 season with 366 receptions for 5,872 yards and 49 career touchdowns.

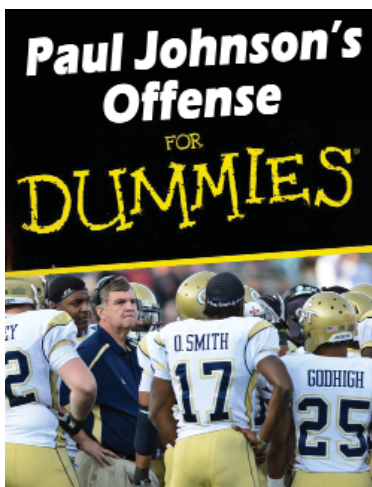

Georgia Tech's offense is called the **spread option**. It is not the "triple option". The triple option is just one play, or a series of plays, within the offense. Tech runs the triple option roughly 20 percent of the time.

- There are two A-Backs, or slot-backs, that line up outside and behind the tackles (there is no tight end). The A-Back is a hybrid position, part runner and part receiver.

- Many people call the B-Back the fullback because he lines up directly behind the quarterback.

- There are two wide receivers, who usually receive single coverage.

- The quarterback is very rarely in the shotgun, but otherwise there are more similarities with the popular spread offenses than most people think.

HEAD COACH PAUL JOHNSON

Western Carolina (1979) • 34-20 in 5th Season at Georgia Tech • 141-59 in 16th Season Overall

Paul Johnson, a two-time Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year and the mastermind behind Georgia Tech's high-production offense, enters his fifth season as head coach of the Yellow Jackets.

Under Johnson, Georgia Tech was one of college football's biggest surprise stories in 2008 and played in the ACC championship in 2009. The ACC Coach of the Year in 2008 and 2009, Johnson's teams have appeared in a bowl game every year since he arrived on the Flats.

In four seasons at Tech, Johnson has compiled a record of 33-19, including a 21-11 mark in ACC play. No coach in Tech history won more games than Johnson in their first four seasons. Over the last four seasons combined, only Virginia Tech has won more ACC games than Johnson's Jackets.

In 15 seasons overall as a head coach, Johnson owns a career record of 140-58. His career winning percentage (.707) ranks in the top 10 among active BCS head coaches. Johnson enjoyed success as the head coach at Georgia Southern (1997-2001) and Navy (2002-2007) before being named Georgia Tech's 12th head coach on Dec. 12, 2007.

What Johnson has accomplished at Georgia Tech has been remarkable:

- In his first two seasons at Tech, Johnson was named the ACC Coach of the Year. He is the first coach to win the award in his first two years in the league.

- In 2008, he was named National Coach of the Year by CBS Sports.

- In 2009, the Yellow Jackets played in the ACC title game against Clemson (Tech won the game, but later vacated).

- Tech played in a BCS bowl game for the first time in 2009.

- Under Johnson, Tech has averaged nearly nine wins per season.

- In each of his four seasons at Tech, the Yellow Jackets have ranked in the top five nationally in rushing offense. Tech led the nation in rushing in 2010 and finished second in 2011.

- Over the last four seasons combined, Tech has averaged more rushing yards per game (301) than any other team.

- In 29 of Johnson's 53 games at Georgia Tech, the Yellow Jackets produced more than 400 yards of total offense.

- In Johnson's first three seasons, Tech produced four 1,000-yard rushers -- Jonathan Dwyer in 2008, Dwyer and Joshua Nesbitt in 2009, and Anthony Allen in 2010.

- Over the last four years combined, the Yellow Jackets have produced 13 first team All-ACC selections.

- Tech has produced two first team All-Americans under Johnson -- Michael Johnson in 2008 and Derrick Morgan in 2009.

- Since Johnson's arrival, a Tech player has been named ACC Offensive Player of the Year (Dwyer in 2008) and ACC Defensive Player of the Year (Morgan in 2009).

- Entering 2012, Johnson is 12-4 at Tech in games decided by five points or less, 7-5 at Tech against nationally-ranked opponents, 13-9 in road games, 31-8 when scoring at least 20 points, and 22-1 when scoring more than 30 points.

- In 2009, Tech won in Tallahassee (Fla.) for the first time in school history, beat a top-five ranked team at home (Virginia Tech) for the first time since 1962 and won on the road

in Charlottesville (Va.) for the first time since 1990.

- Also in 2009, Tech earned its highest national ranking (7th) since 1999.

- In 2008, the Jackets broke a seven-year losing skid to rival Georgia, beating the 13th-ranked Bulldogs, 45-42, in Athens (Ga.).

- Under Johnson, Tech's Academic Progress Report (APR) scores have risen each of the last four years.

In 2011, Georgia Tech exceeded all expectations. After being picked to finish fourth in the ACC Coastal Division, the Yellow Jackets went 8-5, 5-3 in the ACC, and played in a bowl game for the 15th consecutive season.

With just 10 scholarship seniors on the roster, Tech bolted to a 6-0 start, setting school, ACC and NCAA records for offense along the way, and rising to as high as 13th in the national polls. In October, the Jackets handed sixth-ranked and eventual ACC champion Clemson a 31-17 loss in Bobby Dodd Stadium, a win that eventually helped Tech earn a bid to the Hyundai Sun Bowl.
