FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

- UVa is playing at PPL Park for the second time in program history. The Cavaliers first played at the stadium in Chester during the 2012 NCAA quarterfinal round, falling to Notre Dame, 12-10. The game served as the final college game for former UVa All-Americans Steele Stanwick, Chris Bocklet and Colin Briggs.
- Saturday is the 78th all-time meeting between UVa and UNC in a series that began in 1938.
- A UVa win over UNC would give Virginia 50 all-time victories over the Tar Heels, the most over any opponent in school history. UVa also has 49 all-time wins over Duke.
- UVa averages 42.0 ground balls per game in its wins and only 28.2 ground balls in its five losses this season.
- Mark Cockerton's 119 career goals ranks No. 9 all-time at UVa (tied with Danny Glading) and is currently No. 8 in the nation among active players.

GAME OVERVIEW

Virginia returns to action Saturday for a non-conference tilt with the North Carolina Tar Heels in the ACC Championship Inaugural Showcase Game at PPL Park, located in Chester, Pa. Faceoff is set for 7:30 p.m.

UVa is ranked No. 8 in the USILA coaches poll and No. 10 in the Warrior/Inside Lacrosse media poll. North Carolina is ranked No. 6 in both the coaches and media polls.

THE SERIES VS. THE TAR HEELS

Saturday marks the 78th all-time meeting between the Cavaliers and the Tar Heels, a series the Cavaliers own a 49-28 advantage in since 1938. Facing the Tar Heels every year since 1964, UVa has now faced UNC at least twice in a season for three years straight. After winning 19-of-21 meetings dating back to 1997, UVa has now dropped four straight against UNC since its 15-10 win at Fetzer Field during the 2012 regular season. UNC's four-game winning streak is the longest in the series for the Tar Heels since winning four straight during the 1990-92 seasons.

North Carolina head coach Joe Breschi is in his sixth season at North Carolina and returns 32 letterwinners from last year's 13-4 NCAA quarterfinal squad.

Widely regarded as one of the best teachers, motivators and tacticians in the game, Dom Starsia is in his 22nd season at the helm of the Virginia men's lacrosse program.

Under Starsia's guidance, his Cavalier squads have won four

NCAA titles and reached the final four 13 times. He has won more games than any coach in Atlantic Coast Conference and Virginia history, sporting a 256-89 (.742) record since coming to Charlottesville in 1993. In 22 seasons with Virginia, Starsia has coached 345 games, fittingly his 300th game at Virginia was the 2011 NCAA title game against Maryland at Baltimore's M&T Bank Stadium.

HALL OF FAMER STARSIA TOPS NCAA DI WINS LIST

- Virginia head coach Dom Starsia is one of the most accomplished coaches in the history of the college game coaching at Brown (1983-92) and Virginia (1993-present)
- He passed Jack Emmer for most career wins by a head coach while coaching at a NCAA Division I school with UVa's quarterfinal win over Cornell in 2011
- He becomes the second UVA head coach to hold the record as Jim Adams retired with 284 career victories after the 1992 season, giving way to Starsia to take the Cavalier program over in 1993 - Adams retired as the record holder
- He was inducted into the Lacrosse Hall of Fame in November 2008
- He has led UVa to four national championships ('99, '03, '06, '11)
- His teams have made 24 NCAA Tournament appearances, the most by any Division I coach in history
- His Cavalier squads have advanced to the final four 13 times
- One of four coaches in college lacrosse history to win 100+ games at two schools (along with Jack Emmer, Dave Urlick and John Danowski who joined the group in 2013)
- Only Division I coach to win 200+ games at one Division I school while winning 100+ at another Division I institution
- He is a three-time national coach of the year ('85, '91, '11)
- ACC Coach of the Year a record eight times

COVERING THE CAVALIERS

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVa's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

CREDENTIALS

Admission to the press box is by official credential only and is strictly limited to members of the working press, radio and television personnel. Please allow ample time for the mailing of credentials or they will be left at the Will Call window at Klöckner Stadium.

Special requests should be made in advance. Parking is always available on an unreserved basis at University Hall. Normal pregame and postgame information is supplied.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Requests for photo passes must be made in advance through the Athletics Media Relations Office. Photographers must observe the field markings for lacrosse. No tri-pod equipment may be used on the field level, for the safety of the players and photographers.

RADIO

Broadcasts are made from the radio broadcast facilities in Klöckner Stadium. There is one courtesy line available for use by visiting radio crews. Adequate space is available for the visiting team needs. Arrangement for broadcasts must be validated in advance through the UVA Athletics Media Relations Office.

INTERVIEWS

All requests for interviews with coaches and players should be made through Vincent Briedis in the Athletics Media Relations Office. Postgame interviews are conducted at field level following the postgame handshake. Locker rooms are closed.

THE SERIES VS. THE TAR HEELS

- Virginia leads the all-time series with North Carolina by a 49-28 margin.
- The Cavaliers' 49 wins place the Tar Heels in a tie for No. 1 on UVa's list of most beaten opponents (UVa has defeated Duke 49 times).
- Overall Virginia has won 19 of the last 25 games dating back to 1997, but North Carolina has won the last four meetings -- including in the semifinal round of the 2012 ACC Championship and the 2013 ACC Finals.
- Three of the Tar Heels' wins in this span were all by two goals (7-5 in 2001, 11-9 in 2004 and again in 2012).
- UNC scored back-to-back goals with 2:33 and 2:38 left in the game to escape with an 11-10 win at Fetzer Field in Chapel Hill.
- UNC won two of the last three games by three goals, 10-7 in Charlottesville during last season's regular season meeting, and 16-13 in the 2013 ACC Championship game at UNC's Kenan Stadium.
- North Carolina's previous five wins over UVa before the 2013 meetings had been by either one or two goals; until last season the Tar Heels had not won by more than two goals since a 15-7 win in the 1994 ACC Tournament.
- Virginia owned a 10-game winning streak over the Tar Heels, the longest winning streak in the series since winning six in a row from 1997-2000, but UNC snapped it in the ACC Tournament in 2012.
- UVa is 23-9 against North Carolina in the Dom Starsia era (est. 1993), Starsia went 0-2 against the Tar Heels while the head coach at Brown, for a 23-10 all-time career record against UNC.

SHUTOUT OF THE ACC CHAMPIONSHIP

- For the first time since the ACC Men's Lacrosse Tournament began in 1989 the Cavaliers will not compete in the annual event.
- The inaugural ACC "Showcase" Game is a rematch of the 2013 ACC Championship Game that UNC won, 16-13.
- UVa has won six ACC Tournament Championships, the most recent coming in 2010 when current UVa fifth-years Chris LaPierre and Blake Riley were first-years.

END OF AN ERA AT UVA

- Pat Glading took part in his final regular season game at Klöckner Stadium against Bellarmine on April 19. Glading is closing out a 12-year era for his family with the UVA men's lacrosse program.
- Pat, along with his older brothers Billy (2000-03) and Danny (2006-09), each played four years for Virginia under head coach Dom Starsia.
- There has been one Glading on each of the last three UVA NCAA title teams (2003, 2006, 2011).

GROUND BALLS KEY IN UVA VICTORIES

- In UVA's nine wins the Cavaliers are averaging 42.0 ground balls per game.
- In UVA's three losses the Cavaliers are averaging 29.2 ground balls per game.

INVINCIBLE UNDER THE KLÖCKNER LIGHTS

- Virginia has lost only six night games at Klöckner Stadium.
- Overall UVA is 33-6 when playing under the lights at Klöckner Stadium.
- Overall the Cavaliers had 21-consecutive night wins since moving to Klöckner in 1993.
- UVA fell to Duke in 2008, the first night loss - a game that started at 6 p.m. in April daylight shadows.
- Virginia dropped its second overall game under the Klöckner Stadium lights ironically also to Duke on April 17, 2010.
- UVA dropped back-to-back night games at Klöckner Stadium for the first time with losses to Duke on April 13, 2012 and North Carolina in the ACC Tournament a week later on April 20, 2012.
- Originally scheduled for 1 p.m. on March 9, 2013, the fifth loss came to Cornell after field conditions due to snow in the Charlottesville area pushed game back to an evening start.
- UVA snapped the losing streak at two games with a 14-13 overtime win against No. 12 Loyola to open the 2014 season.
- UVA dropped its sixth game to Duke in 2014. Duke owns four of the six night wins over UVA at Klöckner Stadium.

VIRGINIA ON THE GREEN GRASS OF KLÖCKNER

- Virginia owns a 118-24 (.8309) all-time record at Klöckner Stadium, including a 6-1 mark in 2014. UVA also is 11-1 all-time at Klöckner Stadium in the NCAA Tournament.
- Klöckner Stadium first hosted lacrosse in 1993, the first season Dom Starsia was the head coach of the Cavaliers.
- This year's senior class is 23-8 (.742) all-time inside Klöckner Stadium.
- UVA fifth-years Chris LaPierre and Blake Riley are 29-9 (.763) all-time inside Klöckner Stadium.

UVA HITS 11,000 ALL-TIME GOALS

- Ryan Tucker's first quarter goal in UVA's 9-6 loss to Maryland on March 30 was the program's 11,000 goal in recorded school history.
- While UVA first started playing lacrosse in 1904, it wasn't until 1925 that game results were kept.
- UVA fielded a lacrosse team in 1904, 1905, 1906 and 1907 before going dormant until the 1925 season.

UVA SHINES AGAINST VMI

- UVA played its starting offense for the first quarter and outscored the Keydets on March 24 by a score of 9-0 after one period. James Pannell had a hat trick in the first quarter.
- VMI managed its only shot of the period with one second remaining, resulting in the only save of the game for goalie Matt Barrett who gave way to Rhody Heller early in the second period with an 11-0 lead.
- UVA had 12 different players register at least one point in the 23-3 win. Nine different Cavaliers scored a goal.
- Zach Wood (3), Ryan Lukacovic (4) and Joe French (4) joined Pannell with hat tricks.

UVA REACHES 600TH WIN IN PROGRAM HISTORY

- UVA's 11-10 overtime win against Johns Hopkins not only snapped a three-game losing streak to the Blue Jays and return the Doyle Smith Cup to Charlottesville. The win also was the 600th win in Virginia men's lacrosse recorded history.
- Virginia became only the eighth NCAA DI program to amass over 600 wins at the DI level.

SCORING AT THE END OF PERIODS

- UVa has scored 16 goals in the final 32 seconds of 56 regulation periods. That means 8.8 percent of UVa's 181 goals have come in the final 32 seconds of a period.
- Ryan Tucker has scored goals with one-tenth and five-tenths of a second left in a period this season.
- 2014 is a stark contrast to 2013 when the UVa defense allowed 17 goals in the final 30 seconds of a period, including 11 scores in the final 10 seconds of a period.

COCKERTON REACHES 100 CAREER GOALS

- Senior attackman Mark Cockerton scored four goals against Syracuse to bring the Canadian to 100 career goals on the nose.
- Cockerton is the 15th Cavalier in program history to reach this milestone. 12 of those 15 Cavaliers played under current Hall of Fame head coach Dom Starsia.
- Cockerton's 119 career goals place him No. 9 all-time at UVa, tied with Danny Glading.

LAPIERRE APPROACHES 70 CAREER GAMES

- Senior Chris LaPierre has played in 68 career games at UVa. He needs two games to become the fourth player in program history to play in at least 70 career games.
- LaPierre would join Bray Malphrus (71), Brian Carroll (70) and Ken Clausen (70) on the 70+ career games played list.
- All four Cavaliers were members of the 2010 UVa team.

PANNEL PUTS SEVEN GOALS ON SYRACUSE

- James Pannell scored a career-high seven goals against Syracuse in a 17-12 UVa win.
- Pannell was the first opponent to score seven goals in a game against the Orange since Joe Boulukos of Cornell did it in the Big Red's 16-14 victory at the Carrier Dome in 2005.
- Since Boulukos' day against the Orange, only two opposing players (Johns Hopkins' Paul Rabil in the 2008 national title game and Hobart's Alex Love last year) had scored six goals against the Orange.
- Pannell's seven goals aren't even the most a Cavalier has scored against Syracuse. Doug Knight scored eight goals in the 1996 meeting between UVa and Syracuse.

MICK PARKS AT THE FACEOFF X

- Mick Parks won 24 faceoffs against then-No. 8 Syracuse, which ties for the most in the nation this year for a game and ranks No. 2 all-time at UVa in a contest.
- Parks has 368 career faceoff wins, which ranks No. 5 all-time in the UVa annals. Brad Wood (1984-87) sits at No. 4 with 423 wins.

STARSIA GETS HIS 250TH CAREER WIN AT VIRGINIA

- UVa head coach Dom Starsia earned his 250th win as the head coach at Virginia, courtesy of an 11-10 win at Drexel on Feb. 16.
- Starsia happened to win his 200th career win at UVa at Drexel on Feb. 20, 2010, an 11-8 triumph.
- Starsia's 256 career victories at UVa is an ACC record.

CAVALIERS FACING NCAA CHAMPIONS

- Besides Virginia, eight other NCAA DI men's lacrosse programs have won NCAA titles in men's lacrosse.
- If you count facing Princeton at historic Kezar Stadium in San Francisco for an October scrimmage, UVa will meet all eight programs on the lacrosse field during the 2013-14 academic year.
- On UVa's 2014 schedule are seven other NCAA champions: Cornell (L), Duke (L), Johns Hopkins (W), Loyola (W), Maryland (L), North Carolina (L) and Syracuse (W).

VIRGINIA IS A GROUND BALL MACHINE

- According to UVa head coach Dom Starsia - "If there's any single statistic that speaks to your effort overall, then it's that one (ground balls)."
- UVa has the led nation in ground balls two of the last four years.
- Since the NCAA started including ground balls per game in their national rankings in 2009, UVa has never finished a season lower than No. 3 in ground balls per game
- UVa is the only school in the nation to finish in the Top-5 nationally in ground balls per game over the last five seasons
- Five other schools can only boast finishing in the Top-5 twice during the same span (Duke, Georgetown, Jacksonville, North Carolina, Robert Morris)
- Below is how UVa has fared over the last five seasons in ground balls:

CAN'T SCORE UNLESS YOU CLEAR THE BALL

- Virginia registered a .918 percent success rate on clears in 2013, giving the Cavaliers four seasons in a row clearing the ball above .900 percent
- No other team in the nation boasts such a streak
- UVa cleared at a .907 rate in 2012, a .900 rate in 2011 and a .922 rate in 2010
- During that time UVa twice ranked No. 3 in the nation in scoring offense, scoring 13.44 goals per game in 2010 and 12.56 goals per game in 2011. UVa ranked No. 11 in 2012 with 11.5 goals per game.
- According to research in collaboration with all NCAA DI men's lacrosse SIDs, only 13 teams have cleared at over .900 in a season, four times its been done by UVa, dating back to 1971 - the first year lacrosse was an NCAA Championship sport
- UVa records on clearing date back to 1971 - some schools like Syracuse (1983), only go back to a certain year in regards to clearing stats. Below is the current list of all-time .900+ clearing schools in a season:

CLEARING - THE CHRIS LAPIERRE FACTOR - DEBATE

- While no team boasts a streak of four seasons in a row of clearing the ball at a .900 percent clip - the current four-year streak for UVa are also the only four years in Dom Starsia's first 21 seasons at Virginia where the Cavaliers have had a season with a .900 percent or better clearing rate.
- The streak coincidentally started with the matriculation at Virginia of M Chris LaPierre. The senior has been a one-man clear for the Cavaliers and arguably the nation's top defensive midfielder over the 2010-12 seasons. Begs the question with UVa's current success clearing the ball - is it a coincidence, or is it the Chris LaPierre factor?
- The 2010, 2011 and 2012 seasons also happen to be the only seasons a UVa team has cleared the ball at .900 or better since lacrosse became an NCAA Championship sport in 1971
- The LaPierre Factor becomes a debate because of his limited play in 2013 due to injury that resulted in a medical hardship and yet the Cavaliers are clearing at a .918 rate through 15 games.
- LaPierre is back in 2014 for his final year, where will UVa finish in clears?

VIRGINIA IN OVERTIME UNDER DOM STARSIA

- UVa is 23-16 all-time in overtime under Dom Starsia. Seven of those losses came in NCAA Tournament action. UVa is 3-7 in OT games in the NCAA Tournament under Starsia.
- Since the start of the 2007 season, UVa is 13-4 in overtime games under Starsia.
- The four losses since 2007 came at Duke (2007), Syracuse in the NCAA semifinal in 2008, Johns Hopkins (2012) in a regular season matchup and last season at Syracuse (2013). The Hopkins game in 2012 was the only OT loss since 2007 at Klöckner Stadium.
- Virginia is 14-2 all-time in OT games at Klöckner Stadium, which doubles as the record under Starsia.
- The first loss was the 2000 meeting with Syracuse and the second was the 2012 Hopkins game.
- Starsia is 14-3 all-time at home in OT games while at UVa - the 1998 Syracuse game was played at the Field Hockey Turf Field, resulting in a loss.

CHRIS LAPIERRE RETURNS TO THE FIELD IN 2014

- On March 20, 2013 Chris LaPierre was shut down for the remainder of the season with a lower extremity injury.
- LaPierre earned a medical hardship after appearing in only three games.
- At the time of LaPierre being shut down on March 20, he was No. 6 in the nation among active players in career ground balls with 209.
- LaPierre currently ranks No. 14 at UVa in career ground balls - He averages 3.7 ground balls per game for his career and in a full 2014 can position himself to finish career in the Top-5 all-time at UVa (271+).
- LaPierre is No. 14 among active players in career ground balls and No. 1 among non-faceoff specialists.

MATT BARRETT MAKES COLLEGIATE DEBUT IN CAGE FOR CAVALIERS

- Against Loyola on Feb. 6 Matt Barrett became only the seventh first-year at UVa to start a season-opening game in the cage since lacrosse became an NCAA Championship sport in 1971.
- The other Cavalier rookies to start in goal at UVa are Scott Howe (1972), Brian Gregory (1979), Derek Kenney (1999), Tillman Johnson (2001), Adam Ghitelman (2008) and Dan Marino (2013).
- Rodney Rullman also as a first-year started games in 1972, including all three NCAA Tournament contests that led to UVa's first NCAA title. Barrett becomes the eighth first-year to start a game in goal for the Cavaliers.
- Howe, Rullman, Kenney, Johnson and Ghitelman all won NCAA titles during their careers at UVa. Rullman and Kenney did so as first-years, starting the NCAA title game.
- Gregory and Ghitelman lost NCAA semifinal games as first-years and Johnson lost in the first round. Gregory is the only one in the group to not win an NCAA title while on Grounds, while Marino is a sophomore on this current UVa team – which group will Barrett fall into during his UVa career?

VIRGINIA WELCOMES TWO TRANSFERS TO ROSTER

- Senior D Joseph Lisicky joined the Cavaliers in the fall after enrolling in graduate school at UVa.
- Lisicky was the the DIII Preseason Player of the Year in 2013 at Lynchburg College, but missed the year after suffering an injury.
- The two-time DIII USILA All-American was the ODAC Player of the Year in 2012 with 89 ground balls and 41 caused turnovers. He was selected 41st overall in the 2013 MLL Draft by the Ohio Machine, who still hold his rights.
- Sophomore D Nate Menninger joins UVa after spending one season with DIII Hamilton College.
- Menninger took 201 faceoffs with a long pole, winning 94 times.
- He picked up a team-best 75 ground balls and caused 12 turnovers.

DOM (INATION) OF THE USILA POLLS

- Since Dom Starsia took over as head coach of the Virginia program in 1993, there have been 237 USILA coaches polls, including this week's poll.
- Of those 238 polls, Virginia has been ranked No. 1 in 55 of them.
- Which means that over the past 21 seasons under Dom Starsia and entering 2014, Virginia has been ranked No. 1 in the nation 23.1 percent of the time.
- The two programs closest to UVa's dominance are Syracuse at 48 weeks and Johns Hopkins at 41 weeks.
- The USILA coaches poll is the oldest lacrosse poll and was established in 1973.

- Sophomore Thompson Brown received a football letter at UVa in 2011 as a first-year and he retired from football and joined the lacrosse program during the fall of 2012

DOUBLE DIGIT GOAL/ASSIST SCORING

- Since Dom Starsia started at UVa in 1993, the Cavaliers have had at least five different players every season, including 2014, to amass double digit goals in a season.
- Coming into 2014 - a Dom Starsia-led UVa team averages 7.65 different players a season with at least 10 goals.
- Already in 2014 UVa has seven players in double digits in goals scored and three in double digits in assists.
- 1994 and 2010 were the best seasons under Starsia as each team had 10 different players have at least 10 goals.
- 2001 and 2004 are tied for the lowest total in a year at 5 different players.
- UVa had seven different double digit goal scorers in 2012 .
- Under Starsia, UVa has averaged 4.05 different players a year with at least 10 assists.
- In 2012 UVa only had three players (Stanwick, Briggs, White) with at least 10 assists.
- There were four other Cavaliers with at least five assists.
- In 2013 six Cavaliers had double digits in goals and three did so in assists.

CAVALIERS IN MIDWEEK GAMES

- Virginia has a 34-game winning streak going back to 2001 in regular-season mid-week games .
- Virginia had three midweek games scheduled in 2014.
- The last time the Cavaliers lost a midweek contest was an 11-8 loss to Notre Dame on March 14, 2001 (a Wednesday).
- Under head coach Dom Starsia, Virginia is 52-2 (.963) in mid-week games since 1993.
- After losing his first mid-week game (9-6 to Princeton in 1993), the Cavaliers rattled off 22 wins in a row before that loss to Notre Dame 13 years ago.

The goal by Cockerton started UVa's 3-0 third quarter run and was part of a larger 6-0 UVa run that spanned from the second quarter to the fourth quarter, proving the difference in the game and giving the Cavaliers an 11-6 lead with 12:06 to play.

Bellarmine snapped its scoreless streak at 10:44 in the fourth quarter with a Daniel Zamora goal. Gardner capped Bellarmine's scoring at 5:27 on an unassisted goal. Ryan Lukacovic put UVa on the board one more time with his unassisted goal at 3:48, finishing the game's scoring.
