ACC Has Four Nationally Ranked Teams (AP)

Syracuse Hosts 3rd-ranked Clemson in Inaugural ACC Football Game; 8th-ranked Florida State Hosts 25th-Ranked Maryland; GT Travels to #14 Miami

For the first time since Nov. 20, 2011, the Atlantic Coast Conference has four teams ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 in No. 3 Clemson, No. 8 Florida State, No. 14 Miami and No. 25 Maryland...Additionally, Virginia Tech is second among other teams receiving votes...For the first time in ACC history, four league teams are unbeaten through their first four games of the season...The previous high was three accomplished three times in 1994, 2000 and 2011...ACC action heats up this week with five league games on tap, highlighted by the inaugural ACC football game for Syracuse, as the Orange host 3rd-ranked Clemson this Saturday at the Carrier Dome (3:30 pm; ABC/ESPN2)...Syracuse, coached by **Scott Shafer**, looks to a balanced offensive attack which has received a boost from sophomore **QB Terrel Hunt**, whose pass efficiency rating of 221.89 would lead the ACC, but lacks enough pass attempts to qualify...Clemson, coached by **Dabo Swinney**, counters with a potent attack built around All-America **QB Tajh**

Boyd and WR Sammy Watkins...Boyd enters Saturday's game just 29 yards shy of 10,000 career yards of total offense...The Syracuse-Clemson contest is one of five interdivisional games on the slate... Two unbeaten Atlantic Division foes face each other in Tallahassee, Fla., as 8th-ranked Florida State, coached by **Jimbo Fisher**, and led by redshirt freshman **QB Jameis Winston**, hosts Maryland at Doak S. Campbell Stadium (Noon, ESPN)...The Terapins, 4-0 for the first time since 2001, are coached by **Randy Edsall** and led by **QB C.J. Brown**...Brown leads the ACC in total offense (331.5 yds/gm) and is the leader of an offense which is averaging 213.7 yard per game more than a year ago...A third important Atlantic Division contest takes place in Winston-Salem, N.C., where Wake Forest hosts NC State at BB&T Field (3:30 pm, Regional Sports Networks) in the 107th meeting between in the two schools in a rivalry which began in 1895... The Wolfpack, coached by **Dave Doeren** and

led by big-play **WR Bryan Underwood**, will face the Demon Deacons, coached by **Jim Grobe** and led by its own big-play WR in **Michael Campanaro**, who leads the ACC in pass receptions per game (8.0) and is second in pass receiving yards per game (107.2)... Two important Coastal Division matchups are also slated with Georgia Tech, coached by **Paul Johnson** and led by **QB Vad Lee**, traveling to face 14th-ranked Miami at Sun Life Stadium in Miami Gardens (3:30 p.m., ESPNU)...The Hurricanes, coached by **Al Golden**, will look to counter the Yellow Jackets' spread option offense with its own potent offensive unit led by **QB Stephen Morris** and **RB Duke Johnson** and an improving defensive unit which ranks 10th nationally in total defense...Defense has also been the name of the game in Blacksburg, Va., where Virginia Tech, coached by **Frank Beamer**, features one of

the nation's best collection of stop troops, led by **CB Kyle Fuller**... Tech ranks 4th nationally in total defense, allowing just 241 yards per game...The Hokies will face a stiff test from North Carolina this Saturday at Lane Stadium (12:30 pm; ACC Network)...The Tar Heels, coached by **Larry Fedora**, are led by **QB Bryn Renner** and are averaging 297 yards per game through the air...Renner leads the ACC in passing yards per game (279.2), while the Hokies are 3rd nationally in pass efficiency defense (80.78 rating) while allowing just 138.2 yards per game through the air...Virginia Tech **QB Logan Thomas** is coming off his best game of the season, accounting for 279 yards in the Hokies' win over Georgia Tech...ACC teams will also face a pair of non-conference foes this weekend... League teams have a combined, 31-8 record (.795) against non-league foes this fall...In Charlottesville, Virginia, coached by **Mike London**, and led by a defensive unit which ranks 16th nationally, hosts Ball State of the Mid-American Conference at Scott Stadium (Noon, Regional Sports Networks)...The Cavaliers, led by **S Anthony Harris** (8.5 tackles/game) and **DE Eli Harold** (3.5 sacks), will face a Cardinals team, coached by **Pete Lembo** and led by **QB Keith Wenning**, that ranks 6th nationally in passing yards per game (330)...In Chestnut Hill, Mass., Boston College, coached by **Steve Addazio** and led by **TB Andre Williams**, will host the Cadets of Army at Alumni Stadium (1 pm, ESPN3)...Williams leads the ACC in rushing and ranks 12th nationally averaging 128.8 yards per game...He has topped the 100-yard rushing mark three times in five games, including an 149-yard effort last week against Florida State...The Eagles also feature a productive pitch and catch combination of **QB Chase Rettig** and **WR Alex Amidon**....Amidon ranks 3rd in the ACC, averaging 6.8 receptions per game, while Rettig has completed 61.4 percent of his passes...Army, coached by **Rich Ellerson**, features the nation's 2nd-ranked rushing offense, averaging 325.4 yards per game on the ground...A pair of ACC Coastal Division teams, Pitt and Duke, have bye weeks.

ACC News & Notes

Four ACC Teams Ranked in AP

For the first time since Nov. 20 of 2011, four ACC teams are ranked in the weekly Associated Press college football poll. Clemson leads the way at No. 3, followed by Florida State (8th), Miami (14th) and Maryland (25th). Additionally, Virginia Tech is just out of the Top 25, receiving enough votes to place 27th.

Four ACC Teams 4-0

For the first time in ACC history, four of its teams have started the year 4-0. Clemson, Florida State, Miami and Maryland all have captured their first four games this season and enter the week unbeaten. The previous high was three teams, and that was accomplished on three occasions in 1994, 2000 and 2011.

ACC Leads All Leagues With Seven Starting NFL Quarterbacks

The ACC led all leagues Sunday in the number of starting quarterbacks in the NFL from its current league schools. A total of seven QBs from current ACC schools started Sunday, and it could have been eight, but **Christian Ponder** of Minnesota was forced to sit out the weekend with a rib injury. Starting in the NFL this weekend were Atlanta's **Matt Ryan** (Boston College), Buffalo's **EJ Manuel** (Florida State), Houston's **Matt Schaub** (Virginia), Philadelphia's **Michael Vick** (Virginia Tech), San Diego's **Philip Rivers** (NC State), Tampa Bay's **Michael Glennon** (NC State), and Seattle's **Russell Wilson** (NC State). All but Vick played actually played in the ACC.

Boyd Nears 10,000 Career Yards

With 380 yards of total offense in Clemson's 56-7 win over Wake Forest last Saturday, Clemson **QB Tajh Boyd** pulled near to becoming only the third player in ACC history to record 10,000 yards of total offense. Boyd, who has only been a full-time player in less than three seasons, has 9,971 yards and currently is in 4th place on the ACC's career list trailing only Duke's Thaddeus Lewis (9,987), Georgia Tech's Joe Hamilton (10,640) and NC State's Philip Rivers (13,582).

Terps' Offense Improves by 213 Yards

Maryland's offense, which finished the 2012 season dead last in the ACC in total offense averaging just 284 yards a game, has improved markedly this season and ranks 2nd in the ACC, averaging 498.5 yards per game, an improvement of 213.7 yards per game.

Boyd, Winston Tabbed Honorable Mention Manning Award Quarterbacks of the Week

Clemson senior **QB Tajh Boyd** (Hampton, Va.), who had 380 yards of total offense and 3 TD passes in the Tigers' win over Wake Forest, and Florida State freshman **QB Jameis Winston** (Hueytown, Ala.), who had 397 yards of total offense and 4 TD passes in the Seminoles' win over Boston College, were both named Honorable Mention quarterbacks of the Week by the Manning Award. Winston was also honored by the Davey O'Brien Award as one of its Honorable Mention choices for this week.

2013 ACC FB Game Summaries -- Sept. 26-28

Virginia Tech 17, Georgia Tech 10

QB Logan Thomas threw a touchdown pass and ran for a score, and CB Kendall Fuller's interception in the waning moments sealed a solid performance by Virginia Tech's defense, as the visiting Hokies (4-1, 1-0) knocked off Georgia Tech (3-1, 2-1) in the Thursday ESPN game at Bobby Dodd Stadium. Thomas found WR D.J. Coles with a 21-yard scoring strike less than three minutes into the game and capped a 91-yard drive with a 5-yard touchdown in the second quarter as the Hokies grabbed an early 14-0 lead. The win was the third in 12 days for Virginia Tech, which limited the Yellow Jackets' vaunted rushing attack to 129 yards. RB David Sims scored Georgia Tech's lone touchdown on a 2-yard run with 3:16 left in the third quarter that capped a 14-play, 82-yard drive that chewed more than eight minutes off the clock. That cut Virginia Tech's lead to 14-10, but the Hokie defense -- which allowed only 273 total yards -- shut the door from there, and Virginia Tech PK Cody Journell's 39-yard field goal early in the fourth quarter wound up being the final points by either team.

Pitt 14, Virginia 3

One week after giving up 55 points in an ACC win over Duke, the Panthers' defense rebounded with a first-rate performance in defeating Virginia. Pitt (3-1, 2-1) limited the Cavaliers (2-2, 0-1) to 188 total yards, and the Panthers' special teams came up with a pair of turnovers in the first quarter to set up both touchdowns. RB James Conner's 6-yard touchdown run put Pitt on the board at the 5:28 mark of the first quarter, and QB Tom Savage found wideout Devin Street with a 15-yard touchdown strike three minutes later for a 14-0 lead. That wound up being enough for the homestanding Panthers, as Virginia struggled to move the ball and scored only on PK Ian Frye's 32-yard field goal late in the third quarter. LB Anthony Gonzalez led Pitt in tackles with 10, and DT Aaron Donald recorded a pair of quarterback sacks.

Florida State 48, Boston College 34

Redshirt senior QB Jameis Winston passed for 335 yards and four touchdowns as the eighth-ranked Seminoles (4-0, 2-0) remained unbeaten with Saturday's road win. Winston threw touchdown passes of 10 and 56 yards to WR Rashad Greene and worked free from two potential sacks to find WR Kenny Shaw with a 55-yard touchdown heave on the final play of the first half. Winston also threw a 10-yard touchdown pass to FB Chad Abram and led FSU in rushing with 77 yards. The Seminoles' other scoring included a 20-yard touchdown interception return by DB P.J. Williams. ACC leading rusher Andre Williams led the ground attack for Boston College (2-2, 1-1) with 149 yards. QB Chase Rettig threw four touchdown passes, including two to TE C.J. Parsons.

Clemson 56, Wake Forest 7

The third-ranked Tigers (4-0, 2-0) scored 21 first-quarter points and never looked back as QB Tajh Boyd had 380 yards of total offense. Boyd threw for three touchdowns and ran for one more in the win over the visiting Demon Deacons (2-3, 0-2). Clemson WR Sammy Watkins made six catches for 113 yards, including a 64-yard touchdown 46 seconds into the game. Boyd also connected with RB D.J. Howard on a 75-yard scoring play and passed 14 yards to WR Mike Williams for another TD. Wake Forest's lone touchdown came on QB Tanner Price's 10-yard pass to WR Sherman Ragland, III late in the first quarter. Clemson S Bashaud Breeland had a quarterback sack and two total tackles for loss as the Tigers held Wake Forest to 222 total yards.

Miami 49, USF 21

The 15th-ranked Hurricanes (4-0) closed out the nonconference portion of their schedule unbeaten with a road win against the in-state rival Bulls (0-4). Miami, which has not trailed in a game this season, took control by scoring on its first three possessions. RB Dallas Crawford rushed for a pair of touchdowns, and RB Duke Johnson found the end zone for the eighth straight game with a 4-yard touchdown run. QB Stephen Morris threw a pair of touchdown passes, but left the game in the first half with an ankle injury. Backup QB Ryan Williams came on to throw for 153 yards and a TD and the Miami defense got into the act got into the scoring act on LB Jimmy Gaines' touchdown fumble recovery. RB Marcus Shaw led USF with 127 yards in 20 carries and scored the Bulls' lone touchdown.

NC State 48, Central Michigan 14

The Wolfpack (3-1) scored touchdowns on offense, defense and special teams in defeating the Central Michigan on Saturday at Carter-Finley Stadium. Junior QB Pete Thomas completed 14-of-20 passes for 244 yards and a touchdown while running for another score in leading a balanced Wolfpack offense to 483 yards on the day. Junior WR Bryan Underwood hauled in five catches for 148 yards and a touchdown, while senior WR Rashard Smith recorded a 67-yard punt return for a touchdown. On the Wolfpack's second defensive play of the game, NC State senior LB D.J. Green stepped in front of a Central Michigan pass and returned it 37 yards for a touchdown to put State up 7-0. RB Shadrach Thornton led the rushing attack with 71 yards, including a 29-yard run for a score.

Duke 38, Troy 31

Junior QB Brandon Connette accounted for five touchdowns, throwing for three and running for two others, to lead the Blue Devils (3-2). Connette finished 20-of-28 for a career-high 324 yards in the air and 55 yards on the ground on 17 carries. WR Jamison Crowder was the main beneficiary of Connette's passing with 149 yards receiving and one touchdown. The 100-yard game was the third of the 2013 campaign for Crowder and eighth of his career. RB Josh Snead anchored the Duke running game with 108 yards, including a career-best 53-yard run in a first quarter scoring drive. QB Corey Robinson finished 35-of-45 for 354 yards and two touchdowns for Troy (2-3) and RB Jordan Chunn rushed for a pair of TDs.

East Carolina 55, North Carolina 31

QB Shane Carden threw three touchdown passes and ran for three scores to lead the visiting Pirates (3-1) to Saturday's nonconference win at Kenan Stadium. The Tar Heels (1-3) were led by WR Quinshad Davis, who had five receptions for 111 yards and a touchdown and threw a 32-yard option pass to fellow WR T.J. Thorpe for another score. North Carolina QB Bryn Renner completed 28-of-46 passes for 366 yards and three touchdowns. ECU's Carden completed 32-of-47 passes for 346 yards, and RB Vintavious Cooper led all rushers with 186 yards and had a game-high eight receptions for 70 yards.

ACC Notes By The Numbers

.794 - The ACC's winning percentage in non-conference games through the first five weeks of the season. To date, the league has posted a 31-8 record (.794) against non-conference foes.

.905 - The combined field goal percentage for Maryland **PK Brad Craddock** (10-11) and NC State **PK Niklas Sade** (9-10), two of the most improved players in the FBS this fall. Last year the duo combined for a .589 field goal percentage (23-39) with Craddock making 10 of 16 attempts (.625) and Sade 13 of 23 (.565). Craddock leads the nation in field goals (2.5) per game.

.968 - Clemson **PK Chris Catanzaro** has made 30 of his last 31 field goal attempts, a .968 percentage. He had a school-record string of 20 field goal attempts without a miss in 2012 and now has a current streak of 10 without a miss.

2 - For the first time since 1972, **Virginia** has held back-to-back opponents to less than 200 total yards in each game. UVa held VMI to just 79 yards in a 49-0 win on Sept. 21 and Pitt to only 199 total yards in a 14-3 loss on Sept. 28.

4 - For the first time since Nov. 20, 2011, the **Atlantic Coast Conference** has four teams ranked in the Associated Press Top 25. Clemson is ranked 3rd, followed by Florida State (8th), Miami (14th) and Maryland (25th).

4-0 - For the first time in its history, the ACC has four teams that are undefeated after four games in the season. **Clemson, Florida State, Maryland** and **Miami** all enter the week with spotless 4-0 records. Two of them--Maryland and FSU--meet in Tallahassee this Saturday. The previous best number of 4-0 teams was three, accomplished in 1994, 2000 and 2011.

6.0 - The number of QB sacks for Pitt senior **NT Aaron Donald** and Clemson **DE Vic Beasley**. Donald and Beasley are tied for the ACC lead, averaging 1.50 per game and are tied for 2nd nationally behind Martin Ifedi of Memphis. Maryland's **Marcus Whitfield** (1.4/gm) ranks 4th.

7 - A total of seven **ACC teams** are ranked among the nation's Top 26 in total defense, with four league schools in the nation's Top 10. **Virginia Tech** leads all ACC schools and is ranked 4th, followed by **Maryland (6)**, **Georgia Tech (9)**, **Miami (10)**, **Florida State (14)**, **Virginia (16)** and **NC State (26)**. Future ACC school Louisville ranks 3rd nationally in total defense.

8 - When **Syracuse** hosts third-ranked Florida State in its inaugural ACC football game, aside

from the league's first season in 1953, it will mark the 8th time a school has entered ACC play in football. In the seven previous games, the new ACC school has posted a 3-4 record. Virginia (1954 at South Carolina), Georgia Tech (1983 at Clemson), Boston College (2005 vs. Florida State) and Pitt earlier this year against FSU, all dropped their inaugural games. Florida State (1992 vs. Duke), Miami (2004 vs. Florida State) and Virginia Tech (2004 vs. Duke), all won their first ACC contests.

10.5 - The average number of points per game for Syracuse **RB Jerome Smith**. Smith leads the ACC in touchdowns with seven, including six rushing. His scoring average is the best of any non-kicker in the league.

11 - The number of touchdowns that Duke junior **QB Brandon Connette** has been responsible for (7 passing, 4 rushing) in his last two games. Connette, staring due to the injury to Anthony Boone, had 6 TDR against Pitt in a 58-55 loss and five more TDR in the Blue's Devils 38-31 win over Troy.

11-0 - When they meet in Tallahassee this Saturday, 8th-ranked **Florida State** and 25th-ranked and unbeaten **Maryland** will be playing in Doak Campbell Stadium for the 12th time. Florida State has won each of the previous 11 meetings dating back to a 1966 game that was the initial meeting of the two teams in football. Saturday's game, however, marks only the second time that the Terrapins have been nationally ranked when they visited Tallahassee.

19.2 - Duke **WR Jamison Crowder** ranks 6th nationally in punt return average, averaging 19.2 yards per return with two touchdowns. Crowder also ranks 14th in receptions per game (7.4), 16th in receiving yards per game (106.0) and 9th in all-purpose yards per game (169.6).

106.3 - The average number of receiving yards this season for Pitt true freshman **WR Tyler Boyd**. He is the leading freshman receiver in the nation in receiving yards per game. His average of 175.25 all-purpose yards per game ranks him 6th nationally and he also leads all freshmen in that category.

107 - Saturday's meeting between **Wake Forest** and **NC State** will mark the 107th game in a series which began in 1895 in Raleigh, N.C. It has been played every year since 1910 and is the longest, continuous series in the ACC. North Carolina and Virginia, which is the ACC's oldest rivalry with 117 meetings dating back to 1892, has "only" been played continuously since 1919.

166 - Clemson **QB Tajh Boyd** set a school record by throwing his 166th consecutive pass without an interception in last Saturday's win over Wake Forest. Boyd's streak is now the 8th longest in ACC history.

209.9 - The pass efficiency rating for Florida State redshirt freshman **QB Jameis Winston**. Winston leads the ACC and ranks 2nd nationally in pass efficiency.

213.7 - The number of yards of improvement in **Maryland's offense** this year. The Terrapins averaged 284.8 yards in 2012 in finishing dead last in the ACC in total offense. This year, though 4 games, Maryland is averaging 498.5 yards per game and is ranked 2nd in the ACC, trailing only Florida State, its opponent this week in Tallahassee.

216.3 - The number of yards below Georgia Tech's season rushing average to which **Virginia Tech's defense** held the Jackets' in its 17-10 win last week. The Hokies limited the Jackets' potent running game, which came into the contest averaging 345.3 yards a contest, to just 129 yards on the ground.

221.89 - The pass efficiency rating for Syracuse sophomore **QB Terrell Hunt** after just one game as a starter. Hunt would lead the ACC, but has not had enough pass attempts to qualify.

262 - Virginia Tech head coach **Frank Beamer** has a total of 262 coaching victories in his career and leads all active NCAA FBS head coaches. Beamer is in 6th place on the NCAA FBS all-time wins list. The late Joe Paterno (298) is next on the list.

331.5 - The average number of yards per game of total offense for Maryland **QB C.J. Brown**. Brown leads the ACC in total offense and ranks 12th nationally. He also ranks 9th nationally in pass efficiency (176.5).

1895 - Although they have met just 35 times on the gridiron, the football rivalry between **Virginia Tech** and **North Carolina** dates from 1895. The two schools had a 51-year hiatus in the series from 1946 through 1997 and have played each year since the Hokies joined the ACC in 2004.

1.000 - Four ACC placekickers are perfect through four games of this season. Florida State freshman **Roberto Aguayo** leads the way having made all 7 of his attempts, but he is joined by Clemson's **Chandler Catanzaro**, North Carolina's **Thomas Moore** and Boston College's **Nate Freese** who are all 4-for-4 in three point attempts.

RB Andre Williams has eclipsed the 2,000-yard rushing mark for his career with 2,067 through 37 career games ... The Schnecksville, Pa., native vaulted into 13th place all-time in the BC rushing annals, eclipsing Brendan McCarthy's (1965-67) mark of 2,060 yards, with 149 yards vs. Florida State on Saturday ... Williams charted his third 100-yard performance in four games this season ... **QB Chase Rettig's** four touchdown passes on Saturday were a career high ... Rettig's 52-yard touchdown pass to **RB Myles Willis** was his longest this year for a completion and scoring pass play ... **PK Nate Freese** is now 4-for-4 on field goal tries the season and 54-for-65 for his career (.831) which is 5th best nationally among all active kickers... Junior **DB Dominique Williams** grabbed his first-career interception on Saturday ... Boston College has logged five interceptions this season ... **TE C.J. Parsons** caught his first two career touchdown passes in the Florida State game.



WR Martavis Bryant is now averaging 23.1 yards per catch... For his career, Bryant has 31 catches for 715 yards and eight TDs ... **QB Tajh Boyd** threw for 311 yards and rushed for 69 in Saturday's win over Wake Forest to give him 9,971 career yards of total offense ... Boyd became Clemson's all-time leader in total offense and moved into fourth place on the ACC's all-time chart ... Clemson's 49-point margin of victory vs. Wake Forest on Saturday was its fourth largest margin of victory against an ACC opponent ... The largest margin of victory over an ACC opponent came in 1981 when Clemson beat Wake Forest 82-24 (58 points)...Backup **QB Cole Stoudt** completed 10 of 11 passes for 90 yards against Wake Forest and has now completed 29 of 31 passes on the season, a 93.5% completion percentage.



WR Rashad Greene has caught at least one touchdown pass in all four games in 2013 and has a touchdown pass in his last five games dating back to FSU's Orange Bowl victory over Northern Illinois ... Greene ranks 12th all time on FSU's career receiving scores list with 18 and leads all active ACC receivers ... **QB Jameis Winston** has received three ACC weekly honors thus far ... Winston was named the ACC Offensive Back of the Week on Sept. 30 and was named ACC Rookie of the Week on Sept. 3 and Sept. 16 ... Winston was also an honorable mention selection for this week's Davey O'Brien and Manning Awards ... Winston's 209.9 passing efficiency rating leads the ACC and ranks second nationally ... **LB Telvin Smith** was named the ACC Freshman of the Week after registering a team-high 10 tackles and a key quarterback sack in last Saturday's 48-34 win at Boston College ... Smith led a Seminole defense that currently ranks 14th nationally.



Maryland has opened the season 4-0 for the first time since 2001 ... Maryland's 37-0 win over West Virginia on Sept. 21 marked its first shutout since a 26-0 win over Wake Forest on Oct. 18, 2008 ... It was Maryland's first shutout of the Mountaineers since a 33-0 win on Sept. 18, 1999 ... Maryland has totaled 30 or more points in all four games this season...The last time the Terps scored 30 or points in four or more consecutive games came in 2002 ... With a string of strong defensive performances to open the season, Maryland is the third-ranked scoring defense in the country, holding opponents to 10.3 points per game ... That mark is the lowest average for a Maryland defense through four games since the 1980 season, when the Terps held their first four opponents to an average of 9.3 points per game (Villanova, 3, Vanderbilt, 6; West Virginia, 11; North Carolina, 17).



LB D.J. Green came up with NC State's first pass interception of the season in Saturday's 48-14 win over Central Michigan and made it count ... Green returned it 37 yards for the Pack's first score of the game, on Central Michigan's first offensive play ... It was the second score of Green's career, as he fell on blocked punt against Boston College in 2010 ... **Ss Josh Stanley** and **Hakeem Jones** added interceptions in Saturday's win ... NC State's 182 rushing yards in the first half on Saturday were more than the Pack posted in all but two entire games last season and the most in the first half since 1997, when a Mike O'Cain-led team rushed for 189 yards in the first half in a 47-45 win at Duke ... A pair of wideouts had productive days gaining yards in the win over Central Michigan, as **WR Bryan Underwood** finished with 190 yards of total offense (148 receiving, 42 rushing), and **WR Rashad Smith** had 167 total yards (87 on punt returns, 41 rushing, and 39 receiving) ... **WR Travares Copeland**, a transfer from West Virginia, and **DE Drew Davis** saw their first action of the season on Saturday.



With the Sept. 21 win over visiting Tulane, Syracuse joined fellow ACC member Virginia Tech in becoming the 15th and 16th FBS programs to record 700 all-time wins ... The Orange, which plays host to third-ranked Clemson in its first-ever ACC game on Saturday, has recorded six straight wins in the Carrier Dome and has outscored visiting opponents by 150 points during the streak ... Syracuse has scored at least 50 points in two straight games for the first time since 1997 ... Syracuse recorded two blocked punts in a game vs. Tulane for the first time since Sept. 11, 2004 (against Buffalo) ... Syracuse also recorded a team blocked field goal in the second quarter. The block snapped Tulane PK Cairo Santos' streak of 26 consecutive field goals made ... **RB Jerome Smith** has rushed for at least one touchdown in each of his last four games ... Smith has six rushing TDs this season, three more than he had in 13 games in 2012 ... With seven total TDs and 42 points, Smith ranks first among non-kickers thus far in ACC scoring.



WR Michael Campanaro hauled-in seven passes for 75 yards in last Saturday's ACC game at Clemson to move into second place in school history and 10th on the ACC career receiving list with 194 career receptions ... Campanaro leads the ACC in receptions averaging eight per game ... Campanaro's 194 career catches are also the most among active ACC players ... Clemson's Sammy Watkins is next with 164 ... With his touchdown pass against the Tigers, **QB Tanner Price** now has 45 for his career and rank second on Wake Forest's all-time list in that category ... Sophomore **WR Sherman Ragland III**, playing in his first game this season, caught a 10-yard touchdown pass from Price in the first quarter for his only catch of the game ... On the defensive side, **NT Nikita Whitlock's** 40 career tackles for lost yardage are the most among active ACC players ... **Jim Grobe** is just two wins shy of equaling Peahead Walker's all-time school record for wins by a Wake Forest head coach (77) ... The Demon Deacons' game with NC State this Saturday will mark the 104th straight year in which the schools have met.

With Saturday's 38-31 win over visiting Troy, the Blue Devils scored at least 28 points for the 10th time in their past 12 home games ... Duke is averaging 38.0 points per game at home this season and 39.1 points per game at home since the 2012 season ... Duke posted a season-high 10.0 tackles for loss, including 2.5 from **S Jeremy Cash** ... seven Blue Devils recorded a TFL on the day ... **QB Brandon Connette** ran for his 22nd and 23rd career rushing scores on Saturday to set the school record for most rushing touchdowns by a quarterback, surpassing the previous mark of 22 set by Mike Dunn (1975-78) ... Connette now ranks third on Duke's all-time rushing touchdowns list, trailing Tom Davis (28 from 1941-44) and Jay Calabrese (24 from 1965-67) ... **WR Jamison Crowder** had a 60-yard touchdown reception from Connette for his school-record seventh career touchdown catch of 50-plus yards



Georgia Tech has played 202 consecutive games without being shut out (last shutout came vs. Florida State on Oct. 18, 1997) ... The Yellow Jackets have played 349 consecutive home games since being shut out (last shut out came vs. Georgia on Nov. 30, 1957) ... **DE Jeremiah Attaochu's** 29.5 career tackles for loss rank third among active ACC players and 20th all-time at Georgia Tech ... **PK Harrison Butker's** 49-yard field goal in last Thursday night's ACC game against Virginia Tech matched his career-high (also at Duke) ... With 759 career rushing yards, **QB Vad Lee** passed Donnie Davis for the seventh-most by a Georgia Tech quarterback ... Lee ranks 17th in rushing among all active ACC players, regardless of position ... **RB David Sims** is the 22nd Georgia Tech player to reach 1,600 career rushing yards ... Sims' 1,616 rushing yards rank 21st on Georgia Tech's all-time list and fourth among active ACC players ... The Yellow Jackets need three more wins to reach 700 all-time.



Miami is one of five schools nationally that has not trailed this season, joining Louisville, Ohio State, Texas Tech and Washington ... The Hurricanes actually have not trailed in the last 357 minutes, dating back to their 41-40 road loss at Virginia in 2012 ... Miami has registered 16 quarterback sacks in four games thus far – four more than it had in 12 games in 2012 ... The Hurricanes are tied for the ACC lead with 13 turnovers gained and rank fifth nationally ... **RB Duke Johnson** is the only player in Miami history with at least three kickoff returns of 95 yards or more in his career ... Eighteen of **TE Clive Walford's** last 20 touches have resulted in either a Miami first down or touchdown ... Walford has seven catches through the first four games of 2013 ... Six have resulted in a first down, one resulted in a touchdown and the other was an 8-yard gain ... The Hurricanes have scored 30 or more points in 15 of its first 28 games of the Al Golden coaching era, posting a 13-2 record in those contests.



QB Bryn Renner completed 28 of 46 passes for a career-high 366 yards and three touchdowns in last Saturday's nonconference game against East Carolina ... Renner has 61 career touchdown passes, passing T.J. Yates for second in school history. Renner is seven shy of UNC's all-time mark of 68 set by Darian Durant from 2001-04 ... Renner ranks 24th in ACC history in career passing yards with 7,573 ... **WR Quinshad Davis** caught five passes for 111 yards last Saturday, his fourth career 100-yard receiving game and his first such game this season ... Davis also threw a 32-yard option touchdown pass to fellow WR **T.J. Thorpe** ... Thorpe's touchdown was his first since returning a kickoff 100 yards for a score at Clemson in 2011. It was his first career touchdown reception ... **PK Thomas Moore** kicked four extra points against East Carolina and is now 61-for-61 in his career ... Including 126 consecutive made PATs by Casey Barth, North Carolina has made 187 consecutive extra points.



The Panthers have won three straight games for the first time since a four-game winning streak during the 2010 and 2011 seasons ... Pitt owns its first same-season three-game winning streak since the 2010 team defeated Syracuse, Rutgers and Louisville consecutively ... Pitt's point total in last weekend's 14-3 win over Virginia was its lowest in a victory since the Panthers defeated West Virginia 13-9 on Dec. 1, 2007 ... The win also marked Pitt's first ACC triumph at home ... **WR Tyler Boyd** recorded his third consecutive 100-yard receiving game, becoming the first Pitt freshman to achieve that feat since Antonio Bryant in 1999 ... Boyd finished with seven catches for 111 yards against Virginia ... Senior **DT Aaron Donald** tallied two of Pitt's three quarterback sacks in the Virginia game ... The pair of sacks pushed Donald's career total to 24.5, moving him into seventh place on the school's all-time list ahead of Brandon Lindsey (22.5), Dennis Atiyeh (23) and Bryan Knight (23.5).



Virginia's defense has held an opponent to under 200 yards of total offense in back-to-back games for the first time since 1972 ... The Cavaliers held VMI to 79 total yards on Sept. 21 and Pitt to 199 total yards on Saturday ... With seven quarterback sacks against Pitt, UVA's defense has collected at least three sacks in three of its four games (BYU, VMI, Pitt) ... The seven sacks are the most since by the Cavaliers since they recorded nine against Duke in 2006 ... Virginia also intercepted multiple passes last Saturday for the first time since they snagged three at NC State in 2012 ... **P Alec Vozenilek** booted a career-long 77-yard punt in the third quarter vs. Pitt ... The punt was the longest by a Virginia player since Will Brice's 78-yard punt against Georgia Tech in 1994 and the fourth-longest in school history ... **WR Dominique Terrell** has caught at least one pass in 18 consecutive games.



The Hokies have won their last eight games against ACC Coastal Division opponents ... **QB Logan Thomas** needs three yards passing to break the Virginia Tech school record for career passing yards (7,017 by Tyrod Taylor) ... Saturday's ACC game against North Carolina will be Virginia Tech's homecoming ... Virginia Tech's last loss in a Homecoming game was during the 1998 season when Temple handed the Hokies a 28-24 loss ... Virginia Tech has a 22-4 record in Homecoming games during **Frank Beamer's** tenure as head coach ... Virginia Tech has intercepted 10 passes during its last four games. ... The Hokies have had at least one quarterback sack and one interception in each of their last nine games ... The Hokies have lost just one fumble during their first five games ... Virginia Tech has held its first five opponents scoreless in the fourth quarter of play and has allowed a total of four passing touchdowns thus far.

Virginia Tech leads the way with three honorees; two named from FSU and Duke
GREENSBORO, N.C. – Three Virginia Tech student-athletes earned Atlantic Coast Conference weekly football honors following the Hokies' 17-10 road win at Georgia Tech on Thursday night, and two apiece were recognized from Florida State and Duke. Virginia Tech guard Andrew Miller was named the ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week after posting 11 knockdown blocks in Thursday night's win, while defensive tackle Derrick Hopkins, who led an effort that limited the Yellow Jackets to 129 rushing yards, was named ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week. Cornerback Brandon Facyson (a key fumble recovery and an interception) earned Co-Rookie of the Week accolades. Florida State redshirt freshman quarterback Jameis Winston, who threw for 330 yards and four touchdowns in the Seminoles' 48-34 win at Boston College, was named the ACC Offensive Back of the Week. Winston received his third weekly honor of the season after twice being named the ACC Rookie of the Week. The Seminoles' Telvin Smith was named the ACC Linebacker of the Week after making 10 tackles, including a quarterback sack, in the win over the Eagles. Duke's Jamison Crowder was named the ACC Receiver of the Week and joined Winston in earning conference weekly honors for the third time. Crowder, named ACC Specialist of the Week on two prior occasions, had seven catches for 149 yards and a touchdown in the Blue Devils' 38-31 win over Troy. Duke safety Jeremy Cash (14 tackles and a key interception) was voted the ACC Defensive Back of the Week. NC State's Rashard Smith was named the ACC Specialist of the Week after his 87-yard punt return for a touchdown in a 48-14 win over Central Michigan. Miami's Stacy Coley was named the ACC Co-Rookie of the Week after catching two touchdown passes in the Hurricanes' 49-21 win at South Florida.

OFFENSIVE BACK – Jameis Winston, Fr.-R, QB, Florida State, 6-4, 225, Hueytown, Ala.

Winston led the Seminoles to a come-from-behind 48-34 victory at Boston College by completing 17-of-27 passes for 330 yards and four touchdowns, while rushing for a team-high 67 yards on 14 carries. The Seminoles trailed 17-3 in the second quarter, but took a 24-17 lead into halftime after Winston evaded two defenders and threw a 55-yard "Hail Mary" touchdown pass to senior wide receiver Kenny Shaw as time expired at the end of the second quarter. Three of the four longest passes of his career were completed in the game, as the Alabama native also tossed a 56-yard touchdown and had a 41-yard completion. Winston finished with his second 300-yard passing game and set a new career-high in rushing yards.

OFFENSIVE LINEMAN – Andrew Miller, Virginia Tech, Sr., OG, 6-4, 304, Bassett, Va.

Miller had a solid game up front as the Hokies went on the road and defeated previously unbeaten Georgia Tech, 17-10, in ACC action. The senior played all 55 offensive snaps, grading out at 87 percent with 11 knockdowns in the win.

RECEIVER – Jamison Crowder, Duke, Jr., WR, 5-9, 175, Monroe, N.C.

Crowder averaged 21.3 yards per reception in Saturday's 38-31 win over visiting Troy, and six of his seven receptions produced Duke first downs. Crowder's big day included a touchdown reception of 60 yards, which extended his school record for touchdown receptions of 50 yards or more to seven. With 149 receiving yards, Crowder posted his third triple-digit yardage receiving game this season and the eighth of his career. Crowder also returned two punts for 31 yards to finish with 180 all-purpose yards.

DEFENSIVE LINEMAN – Derrick Hopkins, Virginia Tech, Sr. DT, 6-2, 312, Highland Springs, Va.

Hopkins was a force against Georgia Tech's potent option attack as the Hokies limited the Yellow Jackets to 129 rushing yards in last Thursday night's 17-10 ACC road win. The senior was credited with a team-high seven tackles (five solo) with three exceptional plays, including a key stop on fourth down late in the game to stop a Georgia Tech drive and turn the ball back over to Virginia Tech. Hopkins scored a career-high 54 points in the Hokies' coaching staff's grading system.

LINEBACKER – Telvin Smith, Florida State, Sr., OLB, 6-3, 218, Valdosta, Ga.

Smith led Florida State defensively in a 48-34 victory at Boston College by making a game-high 10 stops and matching his career-best with two tackles for loss. Smith also had a sack, and his 10-tackle performance was a season high.

DEFENSIVE BACK – Jeremy Cash, Duke, So., S, 6-2, 210, Plantation, Fla.

Cash helped Duke to a 38-31 win over Troy by registering 14 tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss and one interception. The interception – the first of Cash's career – came at the Blue Devils' 6-yard line following the game's final snap and preserved the win. Cash, who established career single-game bests for total tackles and tackles for loss, leads the ACC in both tackles (51) and tackles per game (10.2).

SPECIALIST – Rashard Smith, NC State, Sr., WR, 5-9, 175, Dublin, Ga.

Smith returned a punt 87 yards for a touchdown in the second quarter of the Wolfpack's 48-14 win over visiting Central Michigan on Saturday. The return tied as the third-longest in school history. Smith also rushed for 41 yards on five carries and had three catches for another 39 yards to tally 167 all-purpose yards for the game.

CO-ROOKIE – Stacy Coley, Miami, Fr., WR, 6-1, 173, Pompano Beach, Fla.

Coley hauled in career highs for receptions (4), receiving yards (96) and receiving touchdowns (2) in Miami's 49-21 road win at USF. Coley led the Hurricanes with 96 receiving yards, hauling in touchdowns of 34 and 11 yards. Coley ranks fourth on the team with 131 receiving yards and leads the team with three touchdown receptions. It marked the second straight game that Coley had multiple touchdowns, as he had one receiving touchdown and one kick return for a touchdown versus Savannah State on Sept. 23.

CO-ROOKIE – Brandon Facyson, Virginia Tech, Fr., CB, 6-2, 173, Newnan, Ga.

Playing in front of nearly 40 friends and family less than 30 miles from home in last Thursday night's 17-10 win at Georgia Tech, the true freshman recovered a fumble on the opening drive that set up a Hokies touchdown. Facyson then forced a fumble on the next drive that was recovered by Georgia Tech, but eventually ended that drive with his fourth interception of the season. For the game, he had three tackles, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery, an interception and two pass breakups.

Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer Is NCAA FBS Active Career Leader in Wins

Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer is now the leading active head coach in the NCAA's FBS in career victories with a total of 262 triumphs in his 33-year coaching career. With a win over Rutgers in last year's Russell Athletic Bowl, Beamer passed former BYU head coach LaVell Edwards for 6th place on the all-time NCAA FBS coaching victory list. Penn State's Joe Paterno, with an NCAA adjusted total of 298, is next on the list in 5th place. Georgia Tech head coach Paul Johnson ranks 13th on the active FBS list with 150 career wins. Former Florida State head coach Bobby Bowden, who retired after the 2009 season, is now the NCAA FBS all-time leader with 377 victories.

After five seasons at Georgia Tech, head coach **Paul Johnson** recorded excellent numbers as the Jackets' gridiron leader. Johnson had a 40-26 record as a head coach, and an impressive .606 winning percentage. Only 11 other ACC head coaches have had a higher winning percentage in their first five years in the ACC.

Johnson, Beamer, London Among Top 20 Active Coaches in Wins Per Season

The ACC has four coaches who rank among the Top 25 active football coaches in the NCAA in wins per season with five or more seasons as a head coach. Georgia Tech's **Paul Johnson** leads the way among ACC coaches, currently averaging 9.19 wins per full season. Johnson's record puts him in 8th place nationally among active head coaches with five or more years of experience. Virginia Tech's **Frank Beamer** (17th, 8.06), Virginia's **Mike London** (tied for 18th, 8.00) and Clemson's **Dabo Swinney** (tied for 18th, 8.00) join Johnson among the Top 25 coaches in the nation in the NCAA's FBS. Florida State's **Jimbo Fisher** is off to an impressive start in his career as well, averaging 10.33 wins a year in his first three seasons at the helm at Florida State. NC State's new head coach **Dave Doeren** is also off to a strong start, averaging 11.5 wins a year in his first two seasons at Northern Illinois.

Golden, London, Grobe Have Virginia Ties

Three current ACC head football coaches have ties to Virginia in Miami head coach Al Golden, UVa head coach Mike London and Wake Forest head coach Jim Grobe. Golden served as defensive coordinator under former UVa head coach Al Groh at Virginia for five seasons from 2001-2005. London, served two terms as an assistant coach at UVa under Groh. London was an assistant in Charlottesville from 2001 through 2004, then returned as defensive coordinator during the 2006 and 2007 seasons. Grobe is actually a Virginia graduate, a two-year starter for the Cavaliers under former head coach Sonny Randall, and a former member of the 1974 All-ACC Academic team.

Syracuse Leads All ACC Schools In Games Played

New ACC member Syracuse, now in its 124th season of college football, leads all ACC schools in number of college football games played. The Orange have played in 1,248 football games, three more than Virginia (1,245). Both schools are in their 124th season this fall, as is new member Pitt. North Carolina, in its 123rd season, is third with 1,231 games, follow by Pitt with 1,225. Overall, Syracuse and Virginia rank 5th and 6th among all NCAA Bowl Subdivision Teams and 12th overall among all schools in Division I. Ivy League member Penn (1,313) leads all schools in Division I.

After Just Three Seasons Florida State's Jimbo Fisher Joining Select Company



Having completed three seasons as head coach at Florida State, head coach **Jimbo Fisher** has already joined some select company among ACC football coaches. Fisher has compiled a 31-10 record (.756). His winning percentage has him in 5th place among all ACC head coaches after three seasons, ahead of such prominent figures as NC State's Lou Holtz, Clemson's Danny Ford, Maryland's Ralph Friedgen and Georgia Tech's Bobby Ross. The best mark recorded by an ACC head coach in his first three years in the league was by Fisher's predecessor at FSU, Bobby Bowden, who posted a 33-3-1 record. Maryland's Jim Tatum was 27-4-1 (.859) in his first three years with Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer third at 31-8-0 (.795).

Clemson's Memorial Stadium Is Home Sweet Home for Tiger's Dabo Swinney



Clemson head coach Dabo Swinney has enjoyed coaching in the cozy and imposing confines of the Tigers' home field, also known as Death Valley. Now in his sixth season as head coach of the Tigers, Swinney's teams won 17 of the first 19 home ACC games, a winning percentage of .895. That is the best among ACC coaches who have coached a minimum of four seasons. He is just ahead of former Tiger coach Ken Hatfield, who posted a 12-1-1 mark in four seasons (.893). Legendary Florida State coach Bobby Bowden won more ACC home games than any other coach, with 62 triumphs in his 18 years in the league. His winning percentage of .861, is third-best. Bowden's successor at Florida State, Jimbo Fisher is on a pretty good pace himself, having won 10 of his first 12 ACC home games. Four Clemson coaches rank in the Top 10 including Swinney (1st), Hatfield (2nd), Danny Ford (8th) and the legendary Frank Howard (tied for 9th).

North Carolina Sets Offensive Records In First Year Under Larry Fedora

North Carolina Head Coach **Larry Fedora's** fast-paced offense had his team scoring at a school-record pace in his first year in Chapel Hill. UNC ranked 8th nationally in scoring offense in 2012, averaging 40.6 points a game while also ranked 14th nationally in total offense,

■ In Fedora's first 15 games as head coach at UNC, North Carolina has topped the 40-point mark 7 times.

■ Also, in his first 16 games, UNC has topped the 30-point mark on 11 occasions.

■ In his first 16 games at UNC, the Tar Heels have gained 400 or more yards of total offense 14 times.

■ UNC set school records in 2012 for most points, highest scoring average and highest average of total offense (485.6).

■ UNC's 487 total points in 2012 were the 7th-highest single-season total in ACC history.



NC State's New Head Coach Dave Doeren Among Nation's Winningest Coaches in 2011-12

New NC State Head Coach, **Dave Doeren**, who led the Wolfpack to a 3-1 record in his three games as State's head coach and now is 26-5 overall, has not wasted time in winning games in his first two years as a head coach at the FBS level. In fact, only one other coach in the Football Bowl Subdivision--Alabama's Nick Saban--has won more games than has Doeren in the past two seasons. He guided Northern Illinois to a 23-4 mark in 2011 and 2012, including the school's first berth in the BCS bowl game, a slot in the 2013 Discover Orange Bowl this past January. Only Saban, among current FBS coaches, posted more wins in the past two years than Doeren's teams at Northern Illinois. In all, three current ACC Coaches rank among the Top 11 coaches nationally in wins among current college coaches th past two years. Both Florida State's Jimbo Fisher and Clemson's Dabo Swinney have 21 wins in 2011 and 2012, tying Kansas State's Bill Snyder for the 8th.



Duke Experiencing Success Under ACC Coach of the Year David Cutcliffe

With a 3-2 start to the 2013 season, David Cutcliffe, the ACC's 2012 Coach of the Year, has led the Blue Devils to 23 victories since coming to Durham in 2008. That may not sound like a great record, except when you consider that it is more wins than the Blue Devils totalled in the 12 seasons before Cutcliffe came to Durham. Cutcliffe led the Blue Devils to a 6-7 mark in 2012, their first appearance in a bowl game since 1994 and came within a few yards of claiming the Blue Devils' first winning season in 18 years and their first bowl triumph since 1961.

■ In the five-plus years that Cutcliffe has been in Durham, he has already mentored a pair of quarterbacks who finished their careers ranked in the ACC's top seven of career passing yardage. **Thaddeus Lewis** (2006-09) threw for 10,065 yards, the second-highest total in league history and **Sean Renfree** (2009-12), threw for 9,465 career yards, the 7th-best total by an ACC player.

■ Also, under his guidance, Duke **WR Conner Vernon** became the all-time leading pass receiver in ACC history setting conference career marks for pass receptions (283) and pass reception yardage (3,749).

Clemson's Tajh Boyd: One of the Most Productive Players in ACC History

Despite having been a starter at quarterback for only 31 games, Clemson's **Tajh Boyd** is one



of the most productive quarterbacks in ACC history and is within striking distance of most of the major career offensive records in the Conference, including TD passes, touchdown responsibility, total offense and passing yardage. With three TD passes against Wake Forest, Boyd now has 82 career TD passes, the 2nd-highest total in ACC history, trailing only

NC State's Philip Rivers (95). With 380 total yards against the Deacons, he moved from 9th to 4th place on the ACC's career total offense list with 9,971 yards.

Maryland's Stefon Diggs Going Long Distance

Maryland sophomore WR Stefon Diggs is one of the dangerous deep receiving threats in the ACC this year. Diggs, who has 18 catches after four games, has carried those passes a total of 400 yards, or an average of 22.2 yards per catch. ■ Watkins leads all ACC receivers with nine 100-yard receiving games, while Alex Amidon and Duke's Jamison Crowder have 8 each. Street has seven, Campanaro has five.

■ Watkins has averaged 84.5 yards per game in his 27 career starts, the best average of any active ACC player, and an average that would tie for 2nd-best all time. Watkins' career per-game average of 6.6 catches ranks 4th nationally.



■ Pitt's Street actually has more career receiving yards with 2,492 yards than any other current ACC player, but Street's first three years were spent in the Big East Conference.

■ Amidon is averaging 14.7 yards per catch and is 3rd in the conference in receptions per game (6.8) this year. Over his last 16 games, Amidon has averaged 6.6 receptions per contest with 105 catches in that span.

■ Campanaro tied the ACC single-game receiving record for the 2nd time in his career with 16 catches against ULM.

■ Watkins has 17 career TD catches, one behind Florida State's Rashad Greene (18)

■ Campanaro leads all ACC receivers in career receptions with 194 catches for 2,132 career yards. He currently is ranked 10th on the ACC career receptions list.

BC's Williams Fueling the Eagles Ground Game

Boston College senior RB **Andre Williams** (Schnecksville, Pa.) is off to a strong



start this fall. Williams has vaulted into leading the ACC among its active career rushers (2,067 yds) by topping the 100-yard mark three times in his first four games this fall. Williams ran for 149 yards on 28 carries in the Eagles' loss to Florida State last Saturday. Earlier this year, he ran for 111

yards against Villanova and a career-high 204 yards on 35 carries against Wake Forest. Williams leads the ACC and ranks 11th nationally in rushing this week, averaging 128.8 yards per game. He has now topped the 100-yard mark 8 times in his career, the most of any current ACC back.

2013 ACC Bowl Selection

Bowl Championship Series

The winner of the Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game will be selected to play in the Bowl Championship Series. Unless the winner of the Dr Pepper ACC



Football Championship Game is ranked No. 1 or No. 2 in the final BCS Standings and plays in the BCS National Championship Game, then the ACC Champion will serve as the host team of the Discover Orange Bowl in Miami, Fla. This year's Vizio BCS National Championship Game will be hosted by the Rose Bowl on Jan. 6 in Pasadena, Calif. The BCS may also select a second ACC team, if one is eligible for selection (Won at least nine regular season games and is ranked among the Top 14 in the final BCS

Standings), and there is an At-Large berth available and the team is selected by one of the four BCS Bowl Games—Discover Orange (only if the ACC Champion is in the BCS National Championship Game), Allstate Sugar, Tostitos Fiesta and the Rose Bowl Game presented by Vizio.

After the BCS selections, then the selection order is:

1. Chick-fil-A Bowl, Atlanta
2. Russell Athletic Bowl, Orlando
3. Hyundai Sun Bowl, El Paso, Tex.
4. Belk Bowl, Charlotte, N.C.
5. Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl, Nashville, Tenn.
6. Advocate V100 Bowl, Shreveport, La.
7. The Military Bowl Presented by Northrop Grumman, Washington, D.C. and Annapolis, Md.
8. Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl, San Francisco, Calif.

Conditional Agreement*

*If Pac-12 or BYU is unable to fill their obligations and ACC has an available team

Conditions:

1. The runner-up of the ACC Championship Game, provided, is guaranteed not to fall further than the Hyundai Sun Bowl. The Sun Bowl will select the ACC Championship Game runner-up in any year that team is available to them.

2. Otherwise, if the bowl does not select the team available with the best Conference record, then it must choose a team that is within one conference win of the team (The "One-Win Rule") with the best conference record (ie. 5-3 to 6-2). The bowl may take a team that has more than a one game difference, only if the team is ranked more than five spaces above the team with the best Conference record in the final BCS Standings.

3. If, after all bowl selections have been made, and the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl has an opening due to the inability of either the Pac-12 Conference or BYU to provide a team, and the ACC has an available, eligible team, then the ACC will send a team to the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl

Selection Time Frame

The Bowl Championship Series will announce its selections on the BCS ESPN Selection Show on Sunday, December 8. In conjunction with the BCS selections, each Atlantic Coast Conference affiliated bowl game will make their selections in the order specified above. The ACC, the Bowls and individual schools will announce the selections after all selections are completed on Sunday.

ACC Divisional Tiebreaker

If more than one team in the same division is tied for the best winning percentage in its Conference games then, in order to determine the divisional champion, the procedures listed below will be followed.

A. Two-Team Tie

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Winning percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall winning percentage (divisional and non-divisional), and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken from first to last using the league's tie-breaking procedures.
4. Overall winning percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined winning percentage versus all non-divisional opponents.
6. Winning percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based upon their order of finish (overall conference winning percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional opponents based upon their order of finish within the division.
7. The tied team with the higher ranking in the full Bowl Championship Series Standings following the conclusion of regular season games. If both tied teams are not ranked in the full Bowl Championship Series Standings, the computer ranking portion of the Standings will be used, eliminating the high and the low computer ranking, and averaging the remaining rankings.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw as administered by the Commissioner or Commissioner's designee.

B. Three (or More) Team Tie

(Three team (or more) tiebreaker procedure will be used to break all ties to identify the Championship game representative. Once a team is eliminated from the tie, the tie-breaking procedures restart for the remaining teams. If the three (or more) team tie can only be reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaking procedure will then be applied).

1. Combined head-to-head winning percentage among the tied teams.
2. Winning percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall (divisional and non-divisional) Conference winning percentage, and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken first to last, using the league's tie-breaking procedures.
4. Combined winning percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined winning percentage versus all non-divisional opponents.
6. Winning percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based upon their order of finish (overall conference winning percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional opponents based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking in the full Bowl Championship Series Standings following the conclusion of regular season games, unless the second of the tied teams is ranked within five-or-fewer places of the highest ranked tied team. In this case, the two-team tiebreaking procedure shall be applied between the top two ranked tied teams. If all tied teams are not ranked in the full Bowl Championship Series Standings, the computer ranking portion of the Standings will be used, eliminating the high and the low computer ranking, and averaging the remaining rankings.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw as administered by the Commissioner or Commissioner's designee.

Bowl Championship Series

Heading into its 16th and final year of determining the National Championship in college football, the **Bowl Championship Series (BCS)** is a five-game arrangement that is designed to match the two top-rated teams and to create competitive match ups among eight other highly regarded teams in four other games.

The bowl games participating are the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl, the Discover Orange Bowl, the Rose Bowl Game presented by Vizio and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. In addition, the BCS National Championship Game is played at one of the bowl sites, this year at Rose Bowl Stadium in Pasadena, Calif., on January 6, 2014.

The term "BCS conference" frequently is used incorrectly. Actually, all 10 NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) conferences are "BCS conferences" because the BCS arrangement is managed by the commissioners of the 10 NCAA FBS conferences and the director of athletics at the University of Notre Dame. The conferences are Atlantic Coast, The American Athletic Conference, Big Ten, Big 12, Conference USA, Mid-American, Mountain West, Sun Belt, Pacific-12, and the Southeastern.

Six conferences (ACC, American, Big 12, Big

Ten, SEC and Pac-12) have earned annual automatic qualification for the 2010-13 seasons by virtue of contracts to host the bowl games, and/or by having met a four-year metric based on competitive results (The ACC champion plays in the Discover Orange Bowl, the Big Ten and Pac-12 champs in the Rose Bowl presented by Vizio, Big 12 in the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl and SEC in the Allstate Sugar Bowl). Additionally, the highest-ranked champion of Conference USA, Mid-American, Mountain West, or Sun Belt conferences will be guaranteed a slot in a BCS game if that team is ranked 12th or higher in the final BCS standings, 16th or higher if its ranking is higher than that of a champion from one of the six conferences with automatic qualification. Other teams are eligible to be selected at large by a bowl game if they finish among the top 14.

The champions of the Big Ten and the Pac-12 will play in the Rose Bowl if they do not qualify for the National Championship Game. Other "regional consideration" tie-ins include the SEC champion in the Sugar Bowl, the ACC champion in the Orange Bowl and the Big 12 champion in the Fiesta Bowl if those teams are not ranked No. 1 or No. 2 in the final BCS Standings.

BCS Standings

The BCS Standings are composed of three elements that are weighted equally: the USA Today Coaches poll, 2) the Harris poll, and 3) the average of six computer poll rankings. The highest and lowest computer ranking is discarded each week with the computer average based on the remaining four rankings. The BCS Standings are compiled and released by the National Football Foundation eight times during the season, beginning this year on Sunday, October 20 and ending on BCS Selection Sunday, December 8. The first Harris Poll will be released on Sunday, Oct. 13.



COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

Beginning with the 2014-15 season, college football will enter a new era when a postseason playoff will begin. The format is simple: top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and a national championship game played in a different city each year. Each semifinal will be played during the New Year's holiday with the national championship game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later. It will be the best of all worlds, and the biggest innovation to the sport in decades.

A selection committee will choose the four teams for the playoff based on their performance during the regular season, including, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams will be seeded so that #1 will play #4 in one semifinal and #2 will meet #3 in the other, with the winners advancing to the national championship game.

The semifinals will rotate among six different bowls, extending the experience to more fans. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight other teams in four compelling matchups.

The ACC and the BCS

The Atlantic Coast Conference has been a member of the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) since its inception for the 1998 season. ACC Commissioner John Swofford, is the only Commissioner to twice serve as BCS Coordinator, having done so in the 2000 and 2001 seasons and again in the 2008 and 2009 campaigns, as the ACC successfully administered the BCS on two separate occasions. Swofford is also the last Commissioner to serve as BCS Coordinator. In 2009, the BCS group named longtime college administrator Bill Hancock to serve as the first Executive Director of the Bowl Championship Series. Hancock has since assumed the duties previously handled by the coordinator. Prior to being named Executive Director, Hancock served four years as the Administrator for the BCS.

Bill Hancock, Executive Director Bowl Championship Series; College Football Playoff

Longtime athletics administrator Bill Hancock achieved a unique triple accomplishment at the upper echelon of intercollegiate athletics when he was named the first Executive Director of the College Football Playoff, which begins after the 2014 season. Previously, Hancock was named the first full-time director of the NCAA Final Four and then was named the first executive director of the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) in 2009, a role he continues in this year until the completion of the BCS with this year's national championship game. Hancock served for 13 years as director of the NCAA's Division I Men's Basketball Championship--the three-week March Madness event that culminates at the Final Four. After a family tragedy, he retired in 2002 and for three years was the tournament's media coordinator on a consulting basis before being named BCS administrator in October of 2005. He is a 1972 journalism graduate of the University of Oklahoma and worked in sports information at his alma mater and also on the staff of the

ACC Overtime Games

The ACC & Overtime

When Virginia Tech and Marshall ended regulation tied at 21 in week four of the 2013 season, it marked the 63rd game featuring an ACC team that has had to go to extra sessions. Of the 63 overtime contests, a large portion of them--27--have been played in the month of September. Games have gone into overtime for ACC teams a total of 14 times in November, while 12 have been played in October, three in August, five in December and two in January (2006 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl). Of the 63 overtime contests, 31 have been ACC games while 32 nonconference games have gone into overtime. The home team has a 35-20 advantage in the 55 games played on campus. The team which wins the toss has a 32-31 record. Forty-nine of the games were decided in the first overtime with nine games in double overtime and five in triple overtime.

ACC Announces 2013 Football Championship Game Legends Class

National Football Foundation College Hall of Famers

Terry Kinard, Tom Scott, Floyd Little and Johnny Majors;

ACC 50th Anniversary Team Members Kinard and Boomer Esiason Headline 2013 Class

Led by four members of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame and two members of the Atlantic Coast Conference's prestigious 50th Anniversary team, the ACC has announced the 2013 Class of Legends for its 9th Annual Dr Pepper Football Championship Game, which will be played in Charlotte, N.C. on December 7.

Leading this year's class are former Maryland quarterback **Boomer Esiason (East Islip, N.Y.)**, Clemson safety **Terry Kinard (Sumter, S.C.)**, Virginia defensive end **Tom Scott (Baltimore, Md.)**, Syracuse running back **Floyd Little (New Haven, Conn.)** and former Pitt head coach **Johnny Majors (Lynchburg, Tenn.)**.

Esiason and Kinard were both chosen in 2003 to be members of the ACC's 50th Anniversary team, which honored the 50 best players of the league's first 50 years, while Kinard, Scott, Little and Majors are members of the National Football Foundation and College Football Hall of Fame.

The Legends will be honored during this year's Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game weekend. They will be honored at the ACC Night of Legends sponsored by the Belk Bowl on Friday, Dec. 6, and on Dec. 7, during ceremonies at Bank of America Stadium for the 9th Annual Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship, which will be nationally televised with either a 7:45 pm (ESPN) or 8 p.m. (ABC) kickoff.

The group of 15 former gridiron standouts from current ACC schools includes a former ACC Football Player of the Year; 10 former All-Americans, including six first-team All-America honorees; and 12 players who combined for 97 years in the National Football League. Twelve of the Legends were drafted into the NFL, including six first- or second-round draft choices.

In all, the collection of players combined for two national championships, five ACC Championships and one Super Bowl title.

Joining the aforementioned selections are Boston College running back **Mike Cloud (Portsmouth, R.I.)**, who ended his collegiate career in 1998 as the Eagles' all-time leading rusher with 3,597 yards; Duke halfback and end **Wes Chesson (Edenton, N.C.)**, who ended his career with nine 100-yard receiving games, at the time the most in ACC history; Florida State guard **Jamie**

Dukes (Orlando, Fla.), a consensus first-team All-America for the Seminoles in 1985; and Georgia Tech tailback **"Rambling" Robert Lavette (Cartersville, Ga.)**, who is still the leading career rusher in Yellow Jacket history with 4,066 yards.

Completing the ACC Football Legends Class of 2013 are Miami's **Edgerrin James (Immokalee, Fla.)**, one of the most successful running backs in Hurricane history; North Carolina's **Ken Willard (Richmond, Va.)**, a second-team All-America fullback for the Tar Heels; NC State's famed Buckeye twins, **Dave Buckey (Akron, Ohio)**, an All-ACC quarterback, and **Don Buckey (Akron)**, an All-ACC wide receiver, who keyed the Wolfpack's football resurgence in the 1970s under then head coach Lou Holtz; Virginia Tech wide receiver **Andre' Davis (Niskayuna, N.Y.)**, a first-team All-America and explosive performer who was one of the leaders of Tech's 2000 team which reached the BCS National Championship Game; and Wake Forest quarterback **Jay Venuto (Salem, N.J.)**, the 1979 ACC Player of the Year who led the Deacons to wins over three nationally-ranked foes that year.

Esiason (1981-83), one of the most successful quarterbacks in Maryland and ACC history, led the Terrapins to the 1983 ACC Championship and back-to-back bowl game appearances (1982-83) under then head coach Bobby Ross. Named a second-team All-America by The Sporting News in 1983, Esiason set 17 school records during his collegiate career, completing 461 of 850 passes for 6,259 yards and 42 touchdowns. He was the first quarterback selected in the 1984 NFL Draft, chosen in the 2nd round by the Cincinnati Bengals. He enjoyed a 14-year NFL career, the first nine with the Bengals, three seasons with the New York Jets and one year at Arizona. He led Cincinnati to Super Bowl XXIII and was named to the Pro Bowl four times, an All-Pro twice, and in 1988 was honored as MVP of the National Football League. He ended his career as perhaps the best left-handed quarterback in league history, completing 57 percent of his passes for 37,920 yards with 247 touchdowns. Following the conclusion of his professional career, Esiason has appeared in a variety of television programs, has hosted both the 1998 Miss America Pageant and

CBS' Thanksgiving Day parade coverage and served as the color commentator on ABC's Monday Night Football. He is currently a studio analyst for The NFL Today on CBS, is a color analyst for Westwood One's radio broadcasts of Monday Night Football and co-hosts a long-running and top-rated morning radio show, "Boomer and Carton," on WFAN the Fan in New York City. In 1993, after his son Gunnar was diagnosed with cystic fibrosis, Esiason created the Boomer Esiason Foundation, which has raised in excess of \$100 million to fund research to find a cure for the disease of the respiratory and digestive systems. In 1995, he was honored with the NFL's Walter Payton Man of the Year Award for his community service. Originally a native of East Islip, N.Y., he currently lives in Plandome, N.Y.

Kinard (1979-82), one of the leaders of Clemson's 1981 National Championship team, was a two-time first-team All-America safety who earned unanimous All-America honors in 1982. Named the CBS National Defensive Player of the Year in 1982, Kinard was also selected to the USA Today All-College Football team in the 1980s and to the Sports Illustrated All-Century team of College Football. He helped lead the Tigers, under coach Danny Ford, to a four-year record of 33-10-1 including a 21-1-1 mark in his final two seasons of play. His 17 career interceptions is still a Clemson record. He was named to the College Football Hall of Fame in 2001. That same year he was inducted into Clemson's Ring of Honor. The 10th overall pick on the first round in the 1983 NFL Draft by the New York Giants, he went on to have an eight-year NFL career. He started in 115 NFL games, making 31 interceptions and seven fumble recoveries, helped lead the Giants to Super Bowl XXI and completed his career with the Houston Oilers in 1990. Originally a native of Sumter, S.C., Kinard now lives in Hilton Head Island, S.C.

Scott (1950-52), one of many standout players for Virginia in the early 1950s, played in the era of single platoon football as a stand-out offensive and defensive end for the Cavaliers. Named a first-team All-America in 1952 by both the Associated Press and NEA, he helped lead Virginia to a three-year 24-5 record, including an 8-1 mark and a No. 13 national ranking in 1951. The first two-sport All-America for the Cavaliers, Scott was a member of UVa's 1952 National Champion lacrosse

team, earning All-America honors that season. The 60th overall pick in the 5th round of the 1953 NFL Draft by the Los Angeles Rams, he played 12 seasons in the NFL, six years each with the Philadelphia Eagles and New York Giants. He was twice named to the NFL Pro Bowl (1957-58), and played on New York Giant teams that played in NFL title games in 1961, 1962 and 1963. He was named to the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame in 1979. Originally a native of Baltimore, Md., Scott now lives in Charlottesville, Va.

Little (1964-66), a three-time All-America for Syracuse under coach Ben Schwartzwalder, still holds the school record for career touchdowns (46) and career punt returns for touchdowns (6). He helped lead the Orange to a three-year 22-10 record, including appearances in the 1965 Sugar Bowl and the 1966 Gator Bowl. Voted the 1966 ECAC Player of the Year, he finished his college career as Syracuse' all-time leading rusher with 2,704 yards and still ranks sixth on the school's career rushing list. The sixth overall selection in the 1967 NFL Draft by the Denver Broncos, Little enjoyed a spectacular 9-year NFL career, all with Denver. He rushed for 6,323 yards and 43 touchdowns and led all of American Professional Football in rushing in 1969 and 1971. He was named an American Football League All-Star in 1968 and to the first-team All-AFL team in 1969. He was named to the AFC-NFC Pro Bowl three times in 1970, 1971 and 1973. He was inducted into the National Foundation and College Football Hall of Fame in 1983 and was inducted into the Professional Football Hall of Fame in 2010. His jersey, the famed number "44" which was also worn by Jim Brown, Ernie Davis and several others, was retired by Syracuse in 2005. Originally a native of New Haven, Conn., he currently lives in Syracuse and serves as Special Assistant to Syracuse Athletics Director Dr. Daryl Gross.

Majors (1973-76; 1993-96) inherited a Pitt program which had won 23 games in nine years prior to his arrival, including a 1-10 season in 1972. He then guided the Panthers to a four-year record of 33-13-1, including three bowl trips and a perfect 12-0 National Championship campaign in 1976. In two of his four seasons at Pitt he was named National Coach of the Year in 1973 and 1976. He coached or recruited 23 All-Americans in his career including nine at Pitt. An All-America tailback at Tennessee as a player, he was twice named MVP in the SEC, leading the Vols to a perfect 10-0 re-

cord in 1956. After Pitt's national championship season, he returned to his alma mater as head coach in 1977, guiding the Vols to three SEC championships. In 29 years as a head coach at Iowa State, Pittsburgh and Tennessee, Majors posted a 185-137-10 (.572) record. He was inducted into the National Football Foundation and College Football Hall of Fame in 1987 as a player. Originally a native of Lynchburg, Tenn., he currently lives in Knoxville, Tenn.

Cloud (1995-98) is one of the top running backs in Boston College history. His total of 3,597 rushing yards still ranks third on the BC all-time rushing list. In his senior season of 1998, he set the Eagles single-season rushing record which still stands when he ran for 1,726 yards in just 11 games, an average of 156.9 yards per game, while scoring 14 touchdowns. That year he was named a consensus first-team All-America being selected by both the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) and by the Football Coaches. The 54th overall selection in the second round of the 1999 NFL draft, he went on to a seven-year career in the NFL with Kansas City, New England and the New York Giants. Born in Charleston, S.C., he grew up Portsmouth, R.I., and now lives in Rockwell, Texas.

Chesson (1968-70) is a record-setting receiver for the Duke teams of 1968, 1969 and 1970 for Coach Tom Harp. Chesson earned first-team All-Atlantic Coast Conference honors in 1970 after setting ACC single-season records with 74 pass receptions for 1,080 yards. His per-catch average of 6.73 per-game still ranks as the ninth-best single-season mark in ACC history. He ranks fifth on the Duke career receiving list with 2,399 career yards, averaging 14.6 yards per catch on his 164 career catches. His nine 100-yard receiving games were also an ACC record at the time. His 13 pass receptions against Clemson in 1970 is tied for the third-best single-game mark in Duke history. Selected in the seventh round of the 1971 NFL Draft, he played four seasons in the NFL, two each with the Atlanta Falcons and Philadelphia Eagles. He is the principal owner of the Chesson Company, an investment firm in Raleigh, N.C., and has served for over 30 years on the Duke Radio network as color analyst. He will be inducted into the Duke Athletics Hall of Fame on Oct. 11. A native of Edenton, N.C., he currently lives in Raleigh.

Dukes (1982-85), one of the important building blocks of Bobby Bowden's early Florida State programs in the 1980s,

earned consensus All-America honors as a senior offensive guard for Florida State in 1985. He started all 48 games during his four-year career at Florida State, helping lead the Seminoles to a record of 33-13-2 (.708) and appearances in four straight bowl games. Those bowl appearances were the beginning of Florida State's current 31-year consecutive bowl streak. A first-team Freshman All-America in 1982, Dukes earned Honorable Mention All-America honors in 1983 and second-team All-America accolades in 1984. Though not selected in the 1986 NFL Draft, Duke enjoyed a 10-year career in the National Football League, spending eight seasons with the Atlanta Falcons and one year each with Green Bay and Arizona. In all, he played in 124 professional games, starting 62. After retirement from football, Dukes has enjoyed a successful broadcasting career and joined the NFL Network in 2006 as an analyst on NFL Total Access and NFL GameDay Scoreboard. He is also a regular contributor to NFL.com. Born in Schenectady, N.Y., he played his high school football in Orlando, Fla., and currently lives in Atlanta.

Lavette (1981-84), perhaps the most productive running back in Georgia Tech history, is still the Institute's all-time rushing leader with 4,066 yards. He is one of only five ACC running backs to have topped the 4,000-yard mark and still ranks fourth on the league's all-time rushing list. While playing for the Bill Curry-coached Tech teams of the early 1980s, he topped the 1,000-yard mark in rushing twice, gaining 1,208 yards and scoring a then ACC-record 19 touchdowns in 1982. A versatile performer, Lavette ended his Tech career as the school's leading career rusher, pass receiver (114 catches) and scorer (276 points). At his best in the big games, Lavette contributed greatly to Tech's upsets over No. 1-ranked Alabama in 1981 and 13th-ranked Clemson in 1984. He earned third-team All-America honors in 1984 by the Football News and was a first-team All-ACC selection in 1982 and 1984. Selected in the fourth round of the 1985 NFL draft by the Dallas Cowboys, Lavette played three seasons for the Cowboys and Philadelphia Eagles. A native of Cartersville, Ga., he now resides in Austell, Ga.

James (1996-98), an explosive runner who averaged 6.2 yards per carry throughout his career, is one of the most successful running backs in Miami history. Though he played just three seasons in college, James totaled 2,960 yards and still has the top two

single-game rushing days in schools history. James ran for a school-record 299 yards against UCLA in 1998 and for 271 yards against Boston College in 1997. He is the only running back in school history to have multiple 1,000-yard seasons. James helped Miami compile a 23-12 mark and earn two bowl berths. The fourth overall selection in the 1999 NFL Draft by Indianapolis, he played 11 seasons in the NFL, including his first seven with the Colts. He was named to the NFL's Pro Bowl four times. He was named the 1999 NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year by the Associated Press and claimed the NFL rushing title in each of his first two seasons in the league. After leaving Indianapolis, he played three seasons with Arizona, helping the Cardinals to Super Bowl XLIII. He completed his professional career with Seattle in 2009 with 12,246 career rushing yards and 80 touchdowns. He was named to the NFL All-Decade team for the 2000s. Originally from Immokalee, Fla., James now resides in Miami.

Willard (1962-64), a hard-running fullback, was one of the mainstays of the North Carolina teams of Jim Hickey in the early 1960s. He was named to the All-ACC teams in 1963 and 1964 and helped the Tar Heels claim a share of the 1963 ACC Championship. That year, he helped lead UNC to a 9-2 record that included a 35-0 win over Air Force in the Gator Bowl. He led North Carolina in rushing in each of his three varsity seasons and still ranks 14th on UNC's career rushing list with 1,949 yards. A two-sport standout in college, he was a stand-out baseball player for the Tar Heels as well. He is also the first North Carolina player to be honored as an Academic All-America. Named a 2nd-team All-America in 1964, he was the second player chosen in the 1965 NFL Draft. He enjoyed a 10-year NFL career,

the first nine with the San Francisco 49ers before closing out his pro career with the then St. Louis Cardinals. He earned selection to the NFL's Pro Bowl four times and played on three 49er teams that won the NFC West title in 1970, 1971 and 1972, and the Cardinals team that won a division title in 1974. Originally from Richmond, Va., he resides in nearby Midlothian, Va.

Dave Buckey (1972-75) and Don Buckey (1972-75), the only identical twins to earn All-ACC football honors, were two of the key performers in the resurgence of NC State football in the early 1970s under Lou Holtz. The pair formed a potent passing combination that complemented the run-oriented split-back Veer offenses of Holtz as the Wolfpack earned four consecutive bowl bids. Dave Buckey was an accurate passer and skilled operator of the Veer offense, while Don was the sure-handed clutch receiver for the Wolfpack. Dave Buckey still holds the career mark for passing yards per attempt, averaging 8.18 yards a throw. Don Buckey had 102 career receptions, averaging 17 yards a catch. They combined to help the Wolfpack post a four-year record of 33-12-3 and claim the 1973 ACC Football title. During this span, State earned trips to two Peach Bowls, the Liberty Bowl and the Bluebonnet Bowl. Both Buckeys were named to the 1975 All-ACC team, with Don also earning first-team All-America honors from the FWAA. Both were selected by the New York Jets, and their former coach Holtz in the 1976 NFL Draft, and taken one right after another: Don at No. 327 and Dave at No. 328. Don played one season with the Jets. Originally natives of Akron, Ohio, they now live in Raleigh.

Davis (1998-2001) was one of the main offensive weapons for the Frank Beamer coached teams at the turn of this century. An explosive receiver and kick returner, he still

holds the Virginia Tech record for most yards per catch in a season, averaging 27.5 yards a reception in 1999 with 35 catches for 962 yards and nine touchdowns as the Hokies reached the 2000 BCS Championship Game in the Sugar Bowl before losing to Florida State. Dangerous in the return game as well, he averaged 15.9 yards on 55 career punt returns, including four for touchdowns. In 2000, he finished ranked 21nd nationally in punt return average. During his four seasons in Blacksburg, Davis helped lead the Hokies to a 39-5 record, including 11-1 campaigns in 1999 and 2000, and four consecutive bowl game appearances including the Music City Bowl (1998), the Sugar (1999) and back-to-back trips to the Gator Bowl (2000, 2001). He earned first-team All-America honors by the FWAA in 2000. The 47th overall selection on the second round of the 2001 NFL Draft, Davis went on to enjoy an eight-year NFL career with Cleveland, New England, Buffalo and Houston. Originally from Niskayuna, N.Y., he currently resides in Myrtle Beach, S.C.

Venuto (1979-80) quarterbacked Wake Forest to a dream season in 1979 as the Demon Deacons defeated 12th-ranked Georgia in Athens, 14th-ranked North Carolina in Chapel Hill and 13th-ranked Auburn at home en route to an 8-4 season and a berth in Tangerine Bowl for Coach John Mackovic. That year, Venuto led the ACC in total offense, broke six ACC records including total offense, pass attempts, pass completions, passing yards and total plays, and also set a single-game mark with 28 completions against East Carolina. For his efforts, he was named the ACC's Football Player of the Year. A first-team All-ACC selection in both 1979 and 1980, he led the league in total offense and passing efficiency as a senior. Originally from Salem, N.J., he now lives in Newfield, N.Y.
