FOR OPENERS

- UVA looks for its eighth consecutive win against George Washington.
- The Cavaliers face the Colonials in Washington, D.C., for the first time since 1983.
- UVA is 18-5 in true road games over the past two seasons.
- The Cavaliers seek their 15th consecutive non-conference win since losing 87-52 at Tennessee on Dec. 30, 2013.
- UVA improved to 17-1 in its last 18 season-opening games with the 86-48 win over Morgan State on Nov. 13.

VIRGINIA'S NO. 6 AP PRESEASON RANKING BEST SINCE 1982-83

- UVA is ranked No. 6 in the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches' preseason polls.
- The No. 6 preseason ranking is UVA's best since a No. 1 ranking to start the 1982-83 season.
- UVA has been ranked in the top 10 in 24 consecutive AP polls since March 3, 2014, its longest span since 49 consecutive polls from 1980-83.
- Virginia has been ranked in the preseason top-10 in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1981-82 and 1982-83.
- UVA has finished in the top 10 (No. 3 in 2014 & No. 6 in 2015) in the final AP rankings in back-to-back seasons for the first time since three straight seasons from 1981-83.

LAST TIME OUT

- Mike Tobey had a game-high 15 points as No. 6 Virginia rolled to an 86-48 win over Morgan State in season-opening action on Friday, Nov. 13.
- Devon Hall added a career-best 13 points and Darius Thompson chipped in 12 points, six rebounds, four assists and three steals for UVA.
- Virginia out-rebounded Morgan State 50-21 and limited the Bears to 34 percent (17-50) shooting from the field.
- The Cavaliers had 50 rebounds for the first time since Jan. 15, 2009 vs. North Carolina.
- The Cavaliers improved to 51-2 when limiting opponents to fewer than 50 points under head coach Tony Bennett.

SERIES HISTORY

- UVA is 26-23 all-time against George Washington in the series that dates back to the 1906-07 season.
- The Cavaliers, who meet the Colonials for the second consecutive season, own a seven-game winning streak in the series.
- George Washington holds a 12-10 advantage over Virginia in contests played in Washington, D.C.
- Virginia is 2-0 against the Colonials at the Charles E. Smith Center, including wins in 1982 and 1983.

LAST TIME VS. GEORGE WASHINGTON

- Justin Anderson had a game-high 18 points and Malcolm Brogdon added 15 to send UVA to a 59-42 win over GW on Nov. 21, 2014.
- Darion Atkins matched a then-career high with 11 rebounds and added three blocks.
- The Cavaliers out-rebounded the Colonials 41-28 and committed eight turnovers.
- UVA trailed at the half (26-22), but outscored the Colonials 37-16 in the second half.
- Virginia shot 11.1 percent from 3-point range, shooting 1-9 from long range.

ALL-TIME VS. ATLANTIC 10 CONFERENCE OPPONENTS

- Virginia is 116-79 all-time against current Atlantic 10 members (12-4 vs. Davidson, 2-0 vs. Dayton, 0-3 vs. Fordham, 7-1 vs. George Mason, 26-23 vs. George Washington, 1-2 vs. LaSalle, 2-0 vs. UMass, 1-1 vs. Rhode Island, 52-36 vs. Richmond, 2-6 vs. Saint Joseph's, 0-1 vs. Saint Louis and 11-2 vs. VCU).
- The Cavaliers went 4-0 against the A-10 last season, defeating George Washington (59-42), La Salle (64-56), VCU (74-57) and Davidson (83-72).
- Tony Bennett is 6-2 all-time vs. Atlantic 10 opponents as head coach at Virginia.

VIRGINIA HEAD COACH TONY BENNETT

- Head coach Tony Bennett sports a 137-64 mark in seven seasons at Virginia and 206-97 career mark in 10 seasons.
- Bennett was named 2015 USBWA National Coach of the Year after leading Virginia to a school-record tying 30 wins and its second consecutive ACC regular-season title.
- Bennett was also named ACC Coach of the Year, NABC District 2 Coach of the Year and USBWA District 3 Coach of the Year for the second consecutive year.
- Bennett has led the Cavaliers to 30 wins in back-to-back seasons for the first time in school history.
- In 2013-14, Bennett guided UVa to its first ACC regular season and tournament championship (first since 1976) in the same season for the first time in school history.
- Bennett has led the Cavaliers to four consecutive postseason tournaments (NCAA in 2012, 2014 and 2015, and NIT in 2013).
- Bennett-coached teams are 76-3 when holding opponents to fewer than 50 points during his 10-year coaching career.
- Bennett-coached teams have led the nation in scoring defense three times (2008-09, 2013-14 & 2014-15), and finished in the top five nationally in six of nine seasons.
- Bennett is one of 26 Division I head coaches who played in the NBA.

VIRGINIA PICKED 2ND IN THE ACC

- Virginia was picked to finish second in the ACC preseason poll.
- The second-place preseason selection is UVa's highest since being selected first in 1982-83.
- The Cavaliers, who were picked fourth and finished first in each of the last two seasons, have finished at or higher than their predicted finish in each of the last six seasons.
- North Carolina is the preseason favorite, followed by Virginia, Duke, Notre Dame, Miami, Florida State, Louisville, NC State, Syracuse, Pitt, Wake Forest, Clemson, Georgia Tech, Virginia Tech and Boston College.

EMBRACE THE PACE

- Virginia is averaging 86 points and yielding 48 points in 2015-16.
- The Cavaliers are shooting 49.2 percent from the field and 27.8 percent from 3-point range, while limiting its opponents to 34 percent from the field and 25.9 percent from 3-point range.
- In 2014-15, Virginia averaged 65.4 points and yielded a nation-leading and school-record (modern era) 51.5 points.
- UVA shot 45.7 percent from the field and 35.2 percent from 3-point range, while limiting its opponents to 36.7 percent from the field (3rd nationally) and 30.8 percent from 3-point range.
- The Cavaliers ranked in the top five nationally in eight defensive categories: points per game (1st), points per possession (2nd), true shooting percentage (2nd), field goal percentage (3rd), effective shooting percentage (4th), possessions per 40 minutes (4th), offensive rebounding percentage (5th) and rebounds per game (5th).
- UVA ranked in the top 20 nationally in three offensive categories: defensive rebound percentage (5th), rebound percentage (9th) and assist-to-turnover ratio (20th).
- Virginia limited its opponents to 106 fast break points (3.1 per game).

ALL-AMERICAN BROGDON LEADS CAVALIERS INTO ACTION

- Preseason co-ACC Player of the Year Malcolm Brogdon leads UVA into action this season.
- Brogdon was named a preseason All-American by The Sporting News (1st team), Blue Ribbon Yearbook (1st team), CBSSports.com (2nd team), NBCSports.com (2nd team), Bleacher Report (2nd team), USA Today (3rd team) and ColleagueInsider.com.
- In 2014-15, Brogdon averaged a career-high 14.0 points and 3.9 rebounds en route to All-America second-team and All-ACC first-team accolades.
- The two-time All-ACC performer, who was a John Wooden Award finalist last season, ranks 39th on UVA's all-time scoring list with 1,139 points in 100 career games (11.4 career ppg).
- Brogdon ranks second on UVA's career free-throw percentage list at 86.3% (283-for-328).
- Brogdon scored a career-best 25 points in UVA's ACC Tournament semifinal loss against North Carolina last season.
- Brogdon, who is a candidate for the 2016 Senior CLASS Award and Wooden Citizen Cup Award, was named to the 2014 Allstate NABC Good Works Team.
- Brogdon helped Team USA to a bronze medal at the 2015 Pan American Games in Toronto.
- The redshirt senior earned a degree in history and is pursuing a master's degree in public policy from the Frank Batten School of Leadership and Public Policy.

HIGH POINT MAN TO THE GILLS

- Preseason All-ACC second-team selection Anthony Gill, who had 12 points and seven rebounds in the season opener, is Virginia's best frontcourt player.
- Gill, a High Point, N.C., native, averaged career highs in points (11.6) and rebounds (6.5) en route to All-ACC third-team (media) honors in 2014-15.
- Gill's team-leading 29 steals helped earn him a spot on the coaches' All-ACC Defensive Team in 2014-15.
- Gill, who has led UVA in field goal percentage in each of the past two seasons, is shooting 58.3 percent during his UVA career.
- Gill earned MVP honors at the 2014 Barclays Center Classic and ranked 13th in the ACC in rebounding.
- Gill is 39 points shy of reaching 1,000 career points in three seasons at UVA and one at South Carolina.

LONDON CALLING THE SHOTS

- Junior point guard London Perrantes had six points (2-3 3-point FGs), three rebounds, one steal and one blocked shot vs. Morgan State.
- Perrantes averaged 6.4 points and 4.6 assists en route to honorable mention All-ACC honors last season.
- Perrantes ranked third in the ACC in assist-to-turnover ratio (3.0) and fourth in assists (4.6 apg).
- He set career highs in points (26) and 3-pointers (5) at Miami (1/3/15).
- Perrantes has a career 3.23 assist-to turnover ratio (288 assists, 89 turnovers) in 69 career games.
- Perrantes earned All-ACC Freshman Team honors in 2013-14.

NEWCOMERS ENJOY IMPRESSIVE UVA DEBUTS

- Darius Thompson, Jack Salt and Jarred Reuter made their UVA debuts against Morgan State.
- Thompson had 12 points, six rebounds, four assists and three steals in the 86-58 win, while Salt had five points and three rebounds in eight minutes and Reuter had eight points and six rebounds in 10 minutes.
- Thompson sat out last season after averaging 2.6 points and 2.4 assists in 37 games at Tennessee in 2013-14.
- Salt played at the same high school as former All-Big 10 player and current New Zealand pro basketball player Kirk Penney, whom Tony Bennett coached while an assistant at Wisconsin.
- Reuter helped Brewster Academy to back-to-back national prep titles.

ABOUT THE 2015-16 SCHEDULE

- Five of Virginia's opponents are ranked in the top 19 of the AP preseason poll (North Carolina, Duke, Villanova, California and Notre Dame), while five (West Virginia, Miami, Louisville, NC State and Florida State) received votes.
- The Cavaliers will play nine games against 2015 NCAA Tournament teams: home games against North Carolina, Louisville, Villanova, Notre Dame and NC State, road contests at Duke, Louisville and Ohio State, and a neutral-site tilt against West Virginia in the Jimmy V Men's Basketball Classic at Madison Square Garden.
- Four opponents (George Washington, Miami, Pitt, William & Mary) participated in the National Invitation Tournament.

BROGDON ON EARLY SEASON WEST WATCH LIST

- Malcolm Brogdon is one of 20 players on the preseason Jerry West Award Watch List, honoring the nation's top shooting guard.
- Brogdon was a candidate for the 2015 Jerry West Award after leading UVA in scoring at 14 points per game.
