FOR OPENERS

- No. 1 seed Virginia plays No. 5 seed Pittsburgh (24-8) in the 61st Annual ACC Tournament semifinals on Saturday, March 15 at 1 p.m.
- The Cavaliers are playing in their first ACC Tournament semifinal since 1995 (Wake Forest).
- Virginia went 1-0 vs. No. 5 seed Pittsburgh in the regular season.
- The Cavaliers rank No. 1 nationally in scoring defense at 55.3 ppg.
- UVa's 26-6 record is its best through 32 games since 1982-83 (28-4).

A WIN VS. PITTSBURGH WOULD...

- Give UVa its first ACC Tournament final appearance since 1994 when the Cavaliers lost 73-66 to North Carolina.
- Give Virginia 27 wins for the first time since winning 29 in 1982-83.
- Give Virginia 12 combined road/neutral wins for the first time since 18 in 1982-83.

2013-14 TEAM ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Virginia won its sixth ACC regular-season title (second outright) and gained its second No. 1 seed for the ACC Tournament.
- Virginia's 16-2 ACC record is a program-best and ties the ACC record for most league wins in a season (1998-99 Duke).
- With 26 wins, Virginia is one of three teams (NC Central & Southeast Missouri State) in the nation to improve its win total in each of the past five seasons.
- Virginia secured its third consecutive ACC winning season (16-2, 11-7, 9-7) for the first time since 1981-83.
- Virginia secured its third straight 20-win season for the first time since 1991-93.
- UVa set a school record with 12 ACC wins by 10 or more points.
- With 16 ACC wins, Virginia became the second ACC school to improve its ACC record in five consecutive seasons (Georgia Tech under Bobby Cremins from 1982-86).
- UVa has won a school-record 18 straight ACC home games.
- UVa set a school record with 13 consecutive ACC wins.
- Virginia won a school-record seven ACC road contests.

ALL-TIME IN THE ACC TOURNAMENT

- Virginia is 32-59 all-time in the ACC Tournament.
- UVa snapped a four-game losing streak in the ACC Tournament with its win over Florida State.
- Virginia is 14-24 in ACC Tournament games in Greensboro.
- The Cavaliers are 6-14 all-time in the ACC Tournament semifinals.
- UVa captured the 1976 ACC Tournament title with a 67-62 win over North Carolina.

ALL-TIME AGAINST PITTSBURGH

- UVa will meet the Panthers for the first time in the ACC Tournament.
- UVa is 8-3 all-time vs. Pitt in the series that dates back to 1957-58.
- The Cavaliers have a four-game winning streak against Pittsburgh.
- The Cavaliers defeated the Panthers 48-45 in Pittsburgh in the lone meeting between the teams this season.
- Head coach Tony Bennett is 1-1 all-time against Pittsburgh, including a 1-0 mark at Virginia.

LAST TIME VS. PITTSBURGH

- Malcolm Brogdon came off a screen and drained a 3-pointer with 0.4 seconds remaining to lift the Cavaliers to a 48-45 victory over Pittsburgh on Super Bowl Sunday, Feb. 2 earlier this season.
- Brogdon tallied a game-high 16 points and Jamel Artis led Pitt with 11 points.
- Akil Mitchell had 10 points and 12 rebounds and Joe Harris added 11 points for the Cavaliers.
- Virginia held Pitt's leading scorer Lamar Patterson to 10 points on 3-of-14 shooting.

LAST TIME OUT

- Joe Harris tied a season high with 20 points and Anthony Gill added 16 points off the bench in Virginia's 64-51 win over Florida State in the ACC Tournament quarterfinals Friday.
- UVa shot 48 percent, forced 15 turnovers and earned their third double-digit victory over the Seminoles this season.
- Okaro White led Florida State with 17 points.

TEAM NOTES

- Virginia's 26 wins are its most since 29 in 1982-83.
- The Cavaliers' 11 road/neutral wins are its most since 11 in 1994-95.
- UVa has held 20 consecutive opponents under 50 percent shooting.

PLAYER NOTES

- Joe Harris moved into 13th place on Virginia's all-time scoring list with 20 points in the win over Florida State.
- Harris (1,627 points) needs 20 points to pass John Crotty (1988-91, 1,646 points) for 12th place on UVa's all-time scoring list.
- Anthony Gill's 16 points are a career high against an ACC opponent. Gill is averaging 15.5 points per game over the last two games.
- Malcolm Brogdon's 18-game double-figure scoring streak ended in the win over Florida State.
- Akil Mitchell (758 rebounds) needs four rebounds to pass Scott McCandlish (761 from 1970-72) for 10th place on UVa's all-time rebounding list.
