The Gam

After opening the season with a lopsided victory at Lafayette, the Tribe will return from its bye week when it plays at Virginia on Saturday at 3:30 p.m. W&M piled up nearly 500 yards of total offense in its season-opening win, while the Tribe's defense allowed just 332 total yards, forced two turnovers and blocked a field goal. Virginia is off to a 0-2 start after suffering losses to a pair of nationally ranked opponents — UCLA and Notre Dame.

The Series

Saturday's contest at Virginia will mark the 35th meeting between the two schools, as UVA holds a 27-6-1 advantage in the all-time series. The teams have split the last two matchups, as W&M opened the 2009 season with a 26-14 victory, while the Cavaliers earned a 40-3 triumph in 2011.

The Coaches

- William & Mary: Jimmye Laycock (W&M'70) owns a career record of 230-170-2 and is in his 36th season at the helm of the Tribe. His 230 wins ranks fourth nationally among all active FCS coaches, while his 100 conference victories rank second all-time in the CAA. Additionally, no active Division I head coach has been with his respective program longer than Laycock.
- Virginia: Mike London (Richmond '83) is in his sixth season at UVA and owns an 23-40 record with the Cavaliers.

The Program

- William & Mary's all-time record stands at 558-546-41 in 122 seasons.
- During Laycock's tenure, W&M has won four conference titles, advanced to the NCAA playoffs nine times and posted 23 winning seasons. W&M has advanced to the NCAA FCS semifinals twice since 2004.
- W&M has finished the season ranked among the top 10 nationally twice since 2009 and ranked as high as No. 1 during the 2010 campaign.
- Laycock has coached 41 All-Americans (115 total honors), while 35 W&M players have signed NFL contracts during his tenure.

► Game Notes

- W&M was unable to defeat UVA for a second consecutive time, as it earned a 26-14 victory in Charlottesville in 2009
- Following the win, UVA went on to post an 8-5 record, win road games at Florida State and Miami, and earn a bid to the Chick-fil-A Bowl. W&M, ranked No. 3/4 in the FCS at the time, finished the season with a 5-6 record.
- Current W&M RB coach D.J. Mangas totaled three catches for 32 yards, including a 24-yard grab.
- The Tribe trailed just 13-0 at halftime, but UVA finished the contest with a 496-169 advantage in total yards and controlled the time of possession, 37:24-22:36.
- LB Jabrel Mines equaled a career high with 16 tackles.
- DT George Beerhalter totaled a game-high 3.0 TFL with a sack and a forced fumble.
- Making his collegiate debut as a punter, Drake Kuhn averaged 45.2 yards per punt on his eight kicks.
- W&M converted just 2 of 14 on third-down situations.
- UVA posted a 97-yard TD drive on the first drive of the second half to build a 20-0 lead.
- UVA starting QB, Michael Rocco, completed 14-of-18 passes in the first half; Rocco went on to finish his collegiate career at W&M's longtime rival Richmond

No. 3/4 Tribe Falls at Virginia in Season Opener, 40-3

CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va. - The No. 3/4 William and Mary football team opened its 2011 season with a 40-3 loss at Virginia on Sept. 3, 2011.

Although the Tribe (0-1) kept the score close early and trailed just 13-0 at halftime, Virginia (1-0) pulled away in the second half. The Cavaliers finished the contest with a 496-169 advantage in total yards and controlled the time of possession, 37:24-22:36.

UVA redshirt freshman tailback Kevin Parks recorded three rushing touchdowns, while placekicker Robert Randolph converted all four of his field goal attempts to provide much of the Cavaliers' scoring production.

W&M sophomore quarterback Michael Graham engineered the Tribe's lone scoring drive in the fourth quarter, as he completed 3-of-5 passes for 62 yards before sophomore placekicker Drake Kuhn connected on a 34-yard field goal. Making his collegiate debut as a punter, Kuhn averaged 45.2 yards per punt on his eight liebs.

Defensively, junior linebacker Jabrel Mines equaled a career high with 16 tackles, while sophomore defensive tackle George Beerhalter totaled a game-high 3.0 tackles for a loss with a sack and a forced fumble.

The Cavaliers took an early 3-0 lead when Randolph's 32-yard field goal capped off a 13-play, 70-yard drive to open the contest.

Virginia extended its lead to 10-0 on a 19-yard touchdown run by Parks with 7:57 remaining in the second quarter. The play punctuated a 7-play, 60-yard drive that lasted 3:29.

After taking over on W&M's 49-yard line following a fumble with 2:19 remaining the half, UVA capitalized off the turnover with a 48-yard field goal from the right hash by Randolph as the clock expired to give the Cavaliers a 13-0 advantage at halftime.

Virginia outgained the College, 212-52, in the opening half and controlled the time of possession, 21:18-8-42

Although UVA began its opening drive of the second half at its own 3-yard line following a 51-yard punt by Kuhn, the Cavaliers marched 97 yards in just 3:43 and pushed the margin to 20-0 with a 1-yard touchdown run by Parks. The score was set up on the previous play when quarterback Michael Rocco connected on a 40-yard pass to wideout Tim Smith along the W&M sideline.

A 26-yard touchdown run by Parks, his third score of the night, increased Virginia's lead to 27-0 with 4:25 showing in the third quarter.

After an interception by Demetrious Nicholson gave UVA starting field position at W&M's 13-yard line, Randolph converted a 26-yard field goal to give the Cavaliers a 30-0 lead with 2:17 left in the third quarter.

Randolph's fourth field goal of the evening, a 42-yard kick with 12:33 remaining, increased UVA's lead to 33-0

After a 5-yard touchdown run by Clifton Richardson with 9:35 remaining pushed the margin to 40-0, Graham led the Tribe on an 11-play, 63-yard scoring drive that culminated with a 34-yard field goal by Kuhn.

- Improve W&M's all-time record vs. UVA in Charlottesville to 5-21
- Give W&M its first 2-0 start since 2009; the Tribe won 11 games that season and advanced to the NCAA Semifinals
- Improve head coach Jimmye Laycock's record to 16-11 following bye weeks
- Be head coach Jimmye Laycock's 231st career win his all-time record is 230-170-2
- Be the 559th win the College's history the program's alltime record stands at 558-546-41 and is in its 122nd season of football

Series History

Saturday's contest at Virginia will mark the 35th meeting between the two schools, as UVA holds a 27-6-1 advantage in the all-time series

While the teams first met in 1908, this season's game will mark just the third matchup between the two programs in the last 20 years.

A Look Back at the Win in 2009

One of W&M's most memorable victories in recent years was the 2009 season-opening victory at Virginia (26-14), which helped propel the Tribe to an outstanding season that eventually ended in the NCAA Semifinals.

W&M's defensive effort was outstanding all night long, as it caused seven turnovers and held the Cavaliers scoreless in the second half. Additionally, the Tribe limited Virginia to just 269 yards of total offense and 12 first downs, with just 79 yards and four first downs coming in the second half. W&M also dominated the time of possession, winning the battle by more than 11 minutes (35:36-24:24).

Redshirt-freshman cornerback B.W. Webb intercepted three passes, including a 50-yard pick-six late in the fourth quarter to help punctuate the win.

Six Tribe players who participated in the win went on to earn roster spots with NFL teams - Sean Lissemore (DT), Jonathan Grimes (RB), B.W. Webb (CB), Adrian Tracy (DE), R.J. Archer (QB) and David Caldwell (S).

Recent Success Versus the FBS

W&M has performed well in most of its recent contests against FBS opponents, as its last six matchups versus the top-level competition include a win and three narrow losses. In those six FBS matchups, W&M has owned second half leads in four of those games.

W&M opened the 2009 season with a 26-14 victory at Virginia, while it led North Carolina by 10 points with less than 10 minutes remaining in 2010 before two late touchdowns helped the Tar Heels earn a narrow 21-17 win.

In 2012, the Tribe held Maryland scoreless until midway through the fourth quarter when a late go-ahead touchdown proved to be the difference in the 7-6 decision.

Two years ago, W&M led West Virginia by 10 points midway through the third quarter before eventually falling,

W&M vs. The Atlantic Coast Conference

Since the league was formed in 1953, W&M has gone 11-38 (.224) against opponents from the ACC.

The Tribe has been very competitive in its recent matchups versus ACC teams during the past few seasons. After defeating Virginia, 26-14, in 2009, the College led at North Carolina, 17-7, with less than 10 minutes remaining before the Tar Heels rallied back with two late touchdowns to earn a 21-17 win in 2010. In 2012, the Tribe held Maryland scoreless until midway through the fourth quarter until a late go-ahead touchdown proved to be the difference in the 7-6 decision.

Saturday's game will mark the 10th time in the last 12 seasons that W&M has faced an ACC team. The results of the previous nine contests are listed below.

2004 - at North Carolina (L, 49-38)

2006 - at Maryland (L, 27-14)

2007 - at Virginia Tech (L, 44-3)

2008 - at N.C. State (L, 34-24)

If games against current ACC members Florida State, Louisville, Miami, Pitt, Syracuse and Virginia Tech before they joined the league are taken into account, the Tribe's all-time record against current ACC teams is 19-79-1 (.197).

The Tribe's last two wins versus ACC opposition have come in Charlottesville, as prior the 2009 effort, the Tribe also downed UVA in 1986, when the College handed the Cavaliers a 41-37 setback.

W&M-UVA Connection

After beginning his coaching career at Richmond as an assistant for two seasons, Virginia head coach Mike London served as W&M's defensive line coach from 1991-94.

Playing Well on a Big Stage

Although W&M plays just one FBS opponent per season, senior linebacker Luke Rhodes has made the most of those opportunities during the past three seasons at Maryland (2012), West Virginia (2013) and Virginia Tech (2014).

In those contests, Rhodes averaged 10.0 tackles per game and totaled 1.5 TFL, a forced fumble and a PBU.

Part of a Big Upset

While no current members of the Tribe were on the roster when W&M last defeated an FBS opponent (Virginia, 2009), W&M tight ends/fullbacks coach Mario Acitelli was part of one of college football greatest upsets in 2007 when Appalachian State defeated No. 5 Michigan. Acitelli played all 72 snaps for the Mountaineers in that memorable victory and later went on to win the 2009 Jacobs Blocking Trophy, which is awarded annually to the Southern Conference's top offensive lineman.

Did You Know?

The last time the College hosted an ACC opponent in Williamsburg was in 1980, when the Demon Deacons of Wake Forest made a visit to Zable Stadium and defeated the Tribe, 27-7.



Defensive Line Coach Mike London

After beginning his coaching career at Richmond as an assistant for two seasons, Virginia head coach Mike London served as W&M's defensive line coach from 1991-94.

Following a Bye Week

William and Mary has traditionally done very well coming off a bye week during head coach Jimmye Laycock's tenure, as the squad has posted a 15-11 all-time mark since 1980.

However, W&M has struggled coming off the open week recently and has won just two of its last nine contests.

Saturday's game will mark the first time W&M has squared off against Virginia following its bye week during Laycock's tenure.

Additionally, W&M's Week 2 bye marks the program's earliest open date since 2006 when it had an off week following a season-opening loss at Maryland.

Traditionally a Tough Opponent

Although Saturday's game at Virginia will mark the first time W&M has played a FBS opponent following its bye week during Laycock's tenure, the Tribe has traditionally faced tough competition after its open date. During the previous 12 seasons, nine of W&M's opponents have owned a national ranking. The Tribe owns a 4-5 record in those contests.

On This Date in Tribe Football History

In its 122-year history of competing in football, William & Mary has played eight times on Sept. 19 and owns a 6-2 record. Among those wins is a 37-0 victory at Virginia in 1959.

Television Broadcast Information

Saturday's game will be broadcast live by ESPN3. Shawn Kenney will work play-by-play, while Stan Lewter will be the analyst. It will be the second of nine Tribe games broadcast this season. W&M's two non-televised games will be available on TribeAthletics.TV and streamed in HD for free via TribeAthletics. com.



Team Notes

Zable Stadium Enhancement Project

On Aug. 26, 2014, William and Mary announced that is had raised \$22 million in private funds to renovate Walter J. Zable Stadium. Two \$6 million gifts, one from Hunter J. Smith '51 and the other from James W. '62, J.D. '64, LL.D. '00 and Frances G. McGlothlin '66, will enable the university to move forward with the project to enhance the 80-year-old football facility.

The renovation project, which is expected to cost a total of \$27 million when completed, also benefited from an initial \$10 million gift in 2012 from the estate of the late Walter J. Zable '37, LL.D. '78.

The plans include a new upper deck, suites and a press box on the west side of the stadium. The overall design features Flemish bond brickwork, slate roofs and gables creating aesthetic continuity with the west and north ends of campus. The renovation got underway in early 2015 and is expected to be complete in time for the 2016 football season.

Tribe in the NFL

The Tribe was well represented in NFL training camps this summer, as 10 former players were on active rosters - R.J. Archer (Seahawks); Jasper Coleman (Houston Texans); Jerome Couplin III (Eagles); Derek Cox (Patriots); Jonathan Grimes (Texans), Mike Leach (Cardinals); Sean Lissemore (Chargers); Tre McBride (Titans); Mike Reilly (Browns); B.W. Webb (Cowboys). Six of those players were on rosters during Week 1 - Couplin, Grimes, Leach, Lissemore, McBride (practice squad) and Webb (practice squad).

Additionally, a pair of former Tribe players are currently serving as a head coach and coordinator in the NFL - Mike Tomlin '95 (Pittsburgh Steelers, head coach) and Sean McDermott '98 (Carolina Panthers, defensive coordinator). Atlanta Falcons head coach Dan Quinn also has W&M ties, as he was an assistant on the Tribe's staff in 1994.

Also noteworthy is a pair of former W&M head coaches who went on to have extraordinary careers - Marv Levy and Lou

Holtz. Levy served as W&M's head coach from 1964-68 and was followed by Holtz from 1969-71.

Tribe NFL Draft Picks

When All-American wide receiver Tre McBride was selected by the Tennessee Titans in the seventh round of the 2015 NFL Draft, he became the fifth Tribe player drafted since 2000

Below are a few notes about W&M's four NFL Draft picks since 2009.

- Leads the CAA and ranks second in the FCS, behind only Montana (6)
- Ranks third in the state of Virginia (behind only Virginia Tech and Virginia)
 - Would rank tied for first in the MAC and fifth in C-USA
 - Is more than ACC member Duke (4)

Getting Off to a Good Start

W&M's victory at Lafayette marked just the second season-opening win for the Tribe in the last 14 years. The only other victory during that span came at Virginia (26-14) in 2009.

The Tribe is 9-3 in weeks following a season-opening victory during the Laycock Era.

First Starts

Three Tribe players earned their first career starts in the season-opening win at Lafayette - WR Daniel Kuzjak, DE Xavier Roscoe and DE Peyton Gryder.

Additionally, LB Zach Fetters earned his start as a defensive player, as the former TE and WR garnered a start on the offensive side as a sophomore.

Limiting Penalties

After ranking among the nation's least-penalized teams during the past four seasons, W&M is off to another impressive start this fall and was penalized just three times for 25 yards in the opener at Lafayette.

Blocking Kicks

After leading the nation in blocks last season (10), W&M picked up right where it left off when senior defensive tackle Tyler Claytor blocked a field goal in the season-opening win at Lafayette.

Last season's total of 10 blocks (six punts, three field goals, one extra point) shattered the previous single-season school record of seven that was set in 1996 (school records for blocks are only available through 1991).

Dating back to the 2013 season, W&M has totaled 12 blocks in the past 15 games.

Turnover Margin

After ranking sixth nationally in turnover margin average per game (+0.92) in 2014, W&M has a +1.0 average this season.

En route to posting the impressive margin last fall, the Tribe did not commit a turnover in the four games prior to the season finale (W&M committed three turnovers in the season finale vs. Richmond) and posted a +8 turnover margin during the stretch.

It equaled the program's longest stretch without a turnover since closing out the 2010 season.

Holding on to Leads

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M owns a 14-2 record when leading after three quarters.

The only losses came at JMU in 2014 and at No. 20 Villanova in 2013.

Importance of Getting Ahead

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M is 11-5 in games in which it scores first. Conversely, it is 4-6 when the opponent scores first.

Staying in the Game

Dating back to the start of the 2009 season, W&M has rarely gotten blown out and has suffered just 12 double-digit margin losses against FCS opponents - a stretch that covers 67 games.

Wide Margins

W&M's lopsided season-opening victory at Lafayette continued a trend that began last season, as the Tribe posted an average winning margin of 15.7 and all but one of its seven victories came by at least 10 points.

Conversely, just one of its five losses in 2014 came by less than a touchdown.

Success in September

W&M has played well during the month of September in recent years and has posted a 20-6 mark since 2009. During the past three seasons, the Tribe has registered an 8-0 mark during

Capitalizing on Turnovers

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M has generated 44 turnovers and turned them into 156 points.

Back-to-Back 7-Win Seasons

After posting consecutive seven-win seasons, W&M will look to match - or eclipse - the impressive total for a third straight year this fall.

The Tribe has recorded just three such stretches of at least seven wins during the program's history - 1946-48; 1992-98;

Looking to End a Playoff Drought

Although W&M earned four NCAA Playoff bids from 2001-10, the program's last trip to the postseason came in 2010. With seven wins in each of the past two seasons, the Tribe has come up just one victory shy of earning a spot in the playoffs during each of the past two campaigns - both of which concluded with season-closing losses to Richmond.

W&M a Special Place for Special Teams

A Tribe standout has earned the CAA Special Teams Player of the Year honor during each of the past five seasons -Jonathan Grimes (2010, 2011), B.W. Webb (2012), Tre McBride (2013) and John Carpenter (2014).

National Preseason Honors

Senior linebacker Luke Rhodes highlighted the Tribe's list of players who earned preseason accolades, as he was the lone FCS player selected to the Butkus Award Watch List, which honors the nation's top linebackers. A STATS FCS Preseason All-America First Team honoree, Rhodes was also chosen to the STATS FCS Defensive Player of the Year Watch List, which includes the nation's top 22 defensive players at the FCS level.

In addition to Rhodes, senior defensive back DeAndre Houston-Carson (second team) and center Andrew Jones (third team) also earned STATS preseason All-America honors.

Preseason All-CAA

W&M was well represented on the preseason All-CAA team as four standouts earned honors. The Tribe's total of four

all-conference selections tied for the most of any team in the league (with Richmond). Representing W&M on the preseason All-CAA team were all four of the Tribe's senior captains — running back Mikal Abdul-Saboor, defensive back DeAndre Houston-Carson, center Andrew Jones and linebacker Luke Rhodes.

New Faces

After the departure of two assistant coaches who left for new positions during the offseason - Tom Clark (VMI) and Joe Brady (Penn State) - the Tribe's staff includes two first-year assistants - Marvin Clecidor (DB) and Bo Revell (TE). Clecidor, a former standout DB at Lafayette College, comes to W&M after stints at Monmouth, Rutgers, Wagner and Wilkes. Revell was a team captain and tight end on the Tribe's roster last season.

Strength of the CAA

With four teams ranked in both of the preseason national polls, the Colonial Athletic Association continues to build its reputation as the country's premier conference at the FCS level. Below are just a few notes to substantiate that claim.

- Eight CAA teams have reached the FCS national title game since $2003\,$
- CAA teams have combined to earn 90 total playoff berths, while at least three league teams have earned a spot every year since 2006
- Eleven CAA teams have reached the national semifinals during the last seven seasons
- Nine of the CAA's 12 schools were nationally ranked at one point during the 2014 season
- -The CAA posted a 24-10 (.706) record vs non-conference FCS opponents in 2014
 - The CAA has produced five national championships
- During the last 11 years, 31 players from the CAA have been drafted $\,$

Tough Schedule

In addition to squaring off at FBS foe Virginia, the Tribe's challenging 2015 slate includes four games against teams that are currently ranked in the STATS and Coaches top 25 polls.

On the Road

In addition to squaring off against a number of tough opponents this fall, W&M plays four of its first five games on the road. Additionally, the Tribe will play just one game at Zable Stadium through mid-October.

The challenging opening stretch marks the first time W&M has faced such a road test since it played four consecutive games on the road to open the 2003 season.

Captains

The Tribe is led by a quartet of captains this season - senior linebacker Luke Rhodes, senior running back Mikal Abdul-Saboor, senior center Andrew Jones and senior defensive back DeAndre Houston-Carson.

Rhodes is a two-time team captain, which makes him just the 11th player to earn the honor multiple times in the program's 122-year history.

Preseason CAA Rankings

The Tribe was selected to finish fourth the CAA preseason poll, which was voted on by the league's coaches and sports information directors.

Villanova was tabbed to win the league and was followed by James Madison and New Hampshire.

The Tribe on TV

Tribe football fans unable to make it to games this season have multiple opportunities to follow the team on television, as nine of the Tribe's contests will be broadcast live. Additionally, W&M's two non-televised games will be streamed online live in HD at TribeAthletics.com.

Highlighting the Tribe's slate of broadcast games is a pair of nationally televised matchups on NBC Sports Network — at Delaware (Oct. 3) and vs. James Madison (Oct. 31).

W&M's regionally televised games on NBC Sports Regional Networks (Comcast SportsNet) include home games against Stony Brook (Sept. 26) and New Hampshire (Oct. 17), as well as road games at Villanova (Oct. 10), Elon (Nov. 7) and Richmond (Nov. 21). However, the UR broadcast is still tentative, as CSN will decide between the long-standing rivalry



It's A Winner

In his 35 full seasons at W&M, head coach Jimmye Laycock has secured 23 winning seasons.

The achievement is remarkable when considering the program had just seven winning seasons in the previous 30 years (1950 – 1979) prior to his taking control of the program for the 1980 season.

Against the Best

Since 2004, W&M is 19-33 in games against nationally ranked foes.

After going 4-1 versus ranked foes in 2010, which included victories against No. 1 Villanova, No. 2 Delaware, No. 8 New Hampshire and No. 18 Richmond, W&M has posted a 4-16 record against ranked teams during the past four seasons.

Historical Success in Close Games

Since taking the W&M football program in 1980, head coach Jimmye Laycock's squads have played in 65 games decided by three or fewer points. W&M has experienced tremendous success in those contests, totaling an impressive 35-28-2 record. Additionally, W&M owns an 11-10 mark in close games on the road since 2000.

Additionally, the Tribe has posted a 7-4 record in overtime games.

Nearing 20K Points

Currently in its 122nd season, and having played 1,145 games, W&M is closing in on 20,000 points scored (19,814).

Success at Home

W&M has posted a 9-3 record at home since the start of the 2013 season, which represents a 75.0 winning percentage. All three of the losses have come against ranked teams.

Team Offensive Notes

Strong Start

W&M opened the 2015 campaign with a strong start offensively in the win at Lafayette by registering 483 yards of total offense. Just once since the start of the 2012 season has the Tribe recorded more total yards (Villanova, 2014 - 518 yds).

Balanced Passing Attack

W&M utilized a balanced passing attack in the seasonopening win at Lafayette, as seven different players totaled at least two receptions.

It marked the first time at least seven players recorded multiple catches since the 2009 season-opening win at Virginia - a span of 71 games.

Big Plays

W&M posted three plays of at least 40 yards in the season-opening win Lafayette, which included touchdown passes of 58 and 52 yards.

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M has posted 25 plays of at least 40 yards.



Dating back through the 2005 season, W&M has recorded at least 10 plays of 40 yards in a season four times - 2013 (11); 2014 (11), 2009 (10) and 2007 (10).

During the recent stretch, the record for most "big" passing plays is 10 (2007, 2013) and the mark for most "big" rushing plays is three (2008, 2009, 2011, 2014).

Third Down Success

W&M converted 9-of-14 third down situations in the season opener at Lafayette. The Tribe was especially effective in the opening half when it converted 8-of-9 opportunities on third down.

Additionally, W&M converted its only fourth-down attempt in the win.

Red Zone Success

W&M made the most of its trips into the red zone in the season-opening win at Lafayette, as it scored on all three of its opportunities.

Protecting the Ball

After ranking second nationally in fewest turnovers last season (11), W&M continued that success in the season-opening win at Lafayette by committing just one turnover (an interception).

En route to posting the impressive numbers in 2014, the Tribe did not commit a turnover in four of the final five games.

Quarterback Steve Cluley was a big part of that success, as he posted a stretch of 138 passing attempts without throwing an interception and threw just four all season.

Dating back to the start of the 2013 campaign (25 games), W&M signal callers have combined to throw just 11 interceptions in 619 attempts (one INT per every 56.3 passes).

Ground Game Success

After averaging 174.0 rushing yards per game during the final six games last season, W&M continued that trend of success in the season-opening win at Lafayette when it totaled 194 yards on the ground.

The Tribe's best effort during the six-game closing stretch last fall came against Elon when it totaled a season-high 246 rushing yards. The impressive performance came just two weeks after W&M registered 245 yards on the ground against Delaware.

Ground Game Production is Key

Since 2011, W&M's ability to run the ball well has been indicative of its overall success. The Tribe has averaged 189.5 rushing yards per game in its 22 wins (4,170) rushing yards), while it has averaged just 131.0 yards per game on the ground in its 24 losses (3,145 rushing yards).

Since joining the league in 1993, W&M has rushed for at least 200 yards 67 times and posted a 63-4 record in those contests

Productivity on the Ground

Senior running back Mikal Abdul-Saboor has posted 100yard rushing efforts in 14 of his 21 career starts. The 14 100yard rushing games ranks fourth in school history.

Dating back to last season, he has posted a school-record six consecutive 100-yard performances (equals the mark set by Derek Fitzgerald in 1993).



W&M totaled 483 yards of total offense in the season-opening win at Lafayette. Just once since the start of the 2012 season has the Tribe posted a better offensive effort.

Rushing Touchdowns

After totaling 20 rushing touchdowns last season, W&M is off to another strong start this year and rushed for a pair of scores in the season-opening win at Lafayette.

W&M's 20 rushing touchdowns last fall marked just the fifth time since 2000 that the Tribe found the end zone at least 20 times on the ground. The other seasons include: 2004 (28); 2001, 2009 (23); 2005 (22).

A Stat to Watch

Dating back through the 2011 season, W&M has struggled to win games in which it has thrown at least 30 passes and owns a 2-11 mark in such contests.

W&M's only two wins came in the 2015 season opener at Lafayette and in the overtime victory at Stony Brook last season

Team Defensive Notes

Strong Start

W&M posted an impressive effort defensively in the season-opening win at Lafayette. In addition to limiting LC to just 332 yards - just 89 yards on the ground - it held the Leopards scoreless in the second half and forced two turnovers.

Additionally, the seven points allowed represented W&M's best defensive effort in a season opener since 2012 when it was edged at Maryland, 7-6. It also marks just the second time in the last 18 years that W&M has allowed as few as seven points in a lidlifter.

Red Zone Defense

Although Lafayette totaled four trips into the red zone in the season opener, W&M allowed the Leopards to score on just one of those trips. The Tribe halted two of those drives with interceptions in the end zone, while its stopped another with a blocked field goal.

Rare Occurrence

While W&M posted a strong defensive effort in the season-opening win at Lafayette, it did not record a sack. It marked just the third time since the start of the 2013 season that W&M has failed to register a sack.

W&M ranked 14th nationally in sacks per game (2.8) in 2014, while its 34 sacks ranks as the sixth most in school history (see top-10 list below).

Tough to Score Against

W&M has established itself as one of the nation's top defensive teams during the past few seasons. In addition to ranking second nationally in scoring defense in 2013 (14.0), the Tribe also ranked second in 2009 (12.1) and sixth in 2010 (16.7).

Dating back to 2009, W&M is allowing just 18.2 ppg during the last 67 contests (1,222 total points). During that stretch, the Tribe has posted five shutouts and allowed fewer than half its opponents score more than 20 points (28 total).

Additionally, W&M has held 11 opponents without a touchdown since the start of the 2009 season.

Especially Tough at Home

The Tribe defense has been outstanding in home games since the start of the 2009 season and is allowing just 15.5 points per game at Zable Stadium during the stretch.

During the stretch of 33 games (512 points), W&M has posted five shutouts.

The Tribe has posted an 23-10 record at home during that span.

Less Than 40

W&M has not allowed an opponent to score more than 40 points since late in the 2012 season - a stretch that spans 26 games.

First Half Defense

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M has held seven of its opponents scoreless during the opening half. Additionally, just eight of the Tribe's 25 opponents during that span have scored more than a touchdown during the opening 30 minutes.

Creating Turnovers

Since the start of the 2013 season, W&M has generated 44 turnovers and has posted a +17 turnover margin. En route to earning a +11 turnover margin last season, the Tribe ranked sixth nationally with a +0.92 turnover margin average per game. W&M is off to another strong start this season (+1).

Defending the Pass

The opposition has found it difficult to score through the air against W&M during the past few seasons, as the Tribe has allowed just 59 touchdown passes in the last 59 games (1.0 per contest) dating back to the start of the 2010 campaign.

Shutting Down the Pass

Dating back to the 2011 season, only three opponents have passed for more than 300 yards against the Tribe - New Hampshire (2011), Hampton and James Madison (2014).

Established Defense

Since the start of the 2007 season, a span of 95 games, the Tribe has allowed more than 300 passing yards just five times - New Hampshire (2008, 2011), Delaware (2009), Hampton (2014) and James Madison (2014).

Additionally, since the start of the 2009 season, a span of 73 games, W&M has allowed more than 150 yards on the ground just 23 times.

Limiting Big Plays

Since the start of the 2011 season (47 games), W&M has allowed just 18 plays 40 yards or longer.



In addition to limiting Lafayette to just seven points, W&M held the Leopards to 332 total yards, recorded two interceptions and blocked a field goal.



During that same 47-game stretch, W&M has allowed just nine rushes of 30 yards or longer.

Impressive Efforts

Since the start of the 2011 season, W&M has allowed less than 300 yards of total offense in nearly a third of its games (14 times in 47 games). The Tribe has posted an 12-2 record in those contests, with its lone losses coming at Maryland (2012) and at Rhode Island (2011).

Defensive/Special Teams Scores

W&M's defense and special teams accounted for 25 points last season, which continues a recent trend. Dating back to the 2007 season, the Tribe's defense and special teams have generated 188 points (26 touchdowns / two safeties / one extra point return).

During the last 23 games, W&M has scored eight defensive / special teams touchdowns as well as a safety and an extra point return.

Opening Drives

Tribe opponents have had a difficult time reaching the end zone on their opening drives during the past few seasons, as just 11 of W&M's last 68 opponents have scored a touchdown.

Shutout History

Although W&M did not post a shutout last season, it blanked a pair of opponents in 2013 (New Hampshire and Rhode Island). The efforts marked the third time W&M has posted two shutouts in the same season during the Jimmye Laycock era. W&M also accomplished the feat twice in 1995 and 2009.

The Tribe has posted 14 shutouts during the Laycock era, with more than a third of them (five) having come since 2009.

The Tribe last blanked three opponents during the same season in 1976.

Joining Elite Company

With Luke Rhodes' selection to the 2014 STATS FCS Defensive Player of the Year Award Watch List, he becomes the fifth Tribe player in the last seven years to earn a spot on the prestigious award's watch list (formerly called the Buchanan Award Watch List). The previous Tribe honorees include Adrian Tracy (2009), B.W. Webb (2012), Jerome Couplin III (2013) and Mike Reilly. Tracy was a sixth round draft pick by the New York Giants in 2010, while Webb was a fourth round pick by the Dallas Cowboys in 2013. Couplin (Detroit Lions) and Mike Reilly (Cleveland Browns) both signed free agent contracts.

Ouarterback Notes

Steve Cluley

- Completed 20-of-30 passes for 289 yards with two touchdowns in the season-opening win at Lafayette; yardage total marked the second-best effort of his career; completed three passes longer than 40 yards, including touchdown throws of 58 yds and 52 yds
- Has completed 11 passes for more than 40 yards dating back to the start of last season (2015 3; 2014 8).

#88 Christian Reeves Senior • Wide Receiver McDonough, Ga. **Eagles Landing Christian Academy/Virginia Tech**

Where are you from originally? McDonough, Georgia

How far away from Atlanta is it?

It's about 25 minutes south.

Does it have its own history?

We've got a statue of Patrick Henry in our square and it's in Henry County. I don't know the significance of that.

Were you ever a part of any non-athletic activities growing up?

I was a part of Boy Scouts briefly, for maybe a year or so. I've always done a lot of hunting and fishing growing up, so I spent a lot of time outdoors.

What was your best fishing trip?

Me and my best friend, in ninth grade, had a day on a little river. We probably caught seven or eight bass over four and a half pounds. In dead winter, too. It was just a freak

Any good hunting stories?

Nothing too crazy. We do a lot of bird hunting with my dad and we have some bird dogs: pointers, German short hairs. When I go home during the Christmas break, I go out there. Quail, dove, usually bird hunting. That's one of my favorite things to do.

Where did you start your college career?

At Virginia Tech. I ended up taking a visit there and it kind of fit my criteria. I wanted to get away from home, but not so far away that I was outside the Southeast. I visited some schools up north. I visited Michigan and Northwestern and I hadn't been outside of the Southeast before that, so it kind of bugged me out a little bit. That culture, it was kind of a shock to me, so I decided I wanted to stay somewhat close to home, but I definitely wanted to venture out a little bit. So it was a good place, and then obviously football-wise, I loved Coach Beamer and my recruiting coach there. I had a good relationship with him.

What didn't work out at Tech for you?

I committed there just kind of purely based on the football aspect of it. I didn't think too much about the school part and whether that school fit me well. From that standpoint, it just wasn't quite the best fit.

Why was William & Mary such a good opportunity?

The flip side of that is that they had the full package. The football was there and the relationship with the coaches and everything, but then also the school and the community. It was somewhere where I felt like I fit in well and somewhere I enjoy being.

Was William & Mary a part of your high school recruiting process?

Just very briefly. When I went up to Virginia Tech's camp actually, Coach (David) Corley

talked to me a little bit up there.

What is the biggest difference between Virginia Tech and William & Mary in regards to football?

I would say, as far as the time that we put in and the practices and the way we approach games and everything, there's little to no difference. I mean obviously, at Tech, you have 85 scholarship guys and here we have 56, but we're preparing the same way, same type of practices, same intensity. The off-season schedule is structured the same way.

What is the biggest difference overall about being at William & Mary?

You're surrounded by a lot of smart people, that's for sure. It's a good thing. You learn a lot from your peers and you have a lot of people around you that are opening your eyes to new things every day.

What is your major?

I'm an economics major.

What do you hope to do with your major?


In a perfect world, I'd get into management consulting, probably down the road. It's kind of more generalist business where you get to learn a lot in different environments, different settings. Learning different businesses, instead of being stuck on one thing. You might be in the retail industry for two months and then you might be in oil for the next two months, so you're getting exposure into a lot of different business processes.

What made you choose that career path?

It's something I just came upon. I like change and I like learning as much as possible. I enjoy being exposed to new stuff.

Are you in the business school?

Yeah, I have an accounting minor also.

Are there any classes that have really stood out to you?

I took a class with Professor Till Schreiber, two summers ago now. International Finance and Open Economics. That was probably my favorite class I've ever taken at William & Mary.

Did that class inspire you to take the path you're trying to travel now?

Yeah, I guess you could say that. I would say a combination of a lot of classes I've taken here have brought me there.

Are you a fifth-year senior?

I am a fifth-year. The plan is, actually, Andrew Jones (starting All-CAA center) and I are trying to study abroad in the spring — the Vienna School of Business and Economics in Austria. It's a program through our business school, so we're working on trying to get that done right now.

What is the program?

It's just a semester-long program that our business school offers. It's a partnership with the Vienna School of Business over there. I could take the same type of business classes that I would take if I stayed here. Several of the guys, like Ryan Smith, he did it last spring. I've known a couple fifth-year guys that have gotten done early where they had that extra semester and were able to do so.

Coming into this year, how do you feel about your first two years in this program?

I would say, coming in this year, patience was key. I think it's something that I learned through this process, and persistence and resiliency. I've dealt through several injuries: tore my MCL my first season here, had two or three hamstring tears last year in season. That was just kind of a recurring nagging injury I was dealing with all year. I've played pretty much every position now at receiver: H, X, and then this year, I'm playing Z. Through the process, it helped me to learn the offense, because I know what everybody's doing. I know the concept and can kind of see the big picture. I've definitely had to push through and push through, but I think everything is coming together.

Did you ever get frustrated at times?

I was absolutely frustrated at certain times, yeah.

Is there a different feel for you now coming into the year?

I would say so. Coming out of the spring, just because I am the only fifth-year senior guy, I was kind of the leader in the spring. I had a good spring and felt like I was finally getting really healthy. I felt better physically then I have since I've been in college. Knowing the offense and everything, from that standpoint, it just all kind of clicked.

And on top of that, the quarterback coming back?

Yes, he (returning starter Steve Cluley) has a full year under his belt, so it's a good situation to be in.

As a receiver in our offense, how different is this fall compared to last fall?

I would say there's less uncertainty. People are playing confidently. I know, for myself at least, there's less thinking involved, there's more playing. I can tell that in [Steve Cluley] too. He's confident back there. He's throwing the ball and playing football. Making good decisions and being assertive.

What would you say is your best non-athletic skill?

I'm really good at ping-pong, but that's kind of athletic. I'm pretty good at poker, too.

What are your interests outside of football?

I like to read a lot. I spend a lot of time reading. The last book I read was Meditations by Marcus Aurelius, the emperor of Rome. It's his personal journal, him writing to him-

self every day and just kind of his thoughts. It's non-fiction. It's not very long, just 150 pages. It's interesting because it's just him, at the time the most powerful guy alive, sorting through the same things that we are today. It's just him kind of working through it and writing it out loud.

Do you have a favorite book?

That might be one of them. It's one of the best books I've ever read. Also, I like psychology stuff, so I would say Malcom Gladwell's books and a book called Drive by Daniel Pink about human motivation. It was cool because it helps you to understand how your mind works and then when you're not feeling naturally motivated, how to get yourself in that mode.

How hard is it, as a William & Mary athlete, to balance football and academics?

During the week, if you've got a full class schedule and you're going to training room and lifting and practice from 7:30-8 am until 7:00, you're booked all day. You can't do any outside schoolwork, so if you want to get in bed at a reasonable hour, which as athletes you kind of need to because we need that recovery time, you only have maybe two hours at best at night to get into the books. Not having so much extra time makes you figure out how to be efficient, what do I really need to know, and what's important, because you don't have all day. You're going all day and you're kind of drained by that time, so it's not usually a time where you're thinking "I'm ready to study right now and I'm feeling sharp," because usually you're not feeling like that.

Do you have anything in your room that you've had since you were a kid?

The one thing I would say is my baseball glove that I've had since I was in fifth grade. I haven't played baseball since eighth grade, but I just have always kept it with me. I pull it out every now and then. Sean Ballard (former W&M wide receiver) and I pulled it out on draft day when we were waiting for Tre McBride to get picked (in the NFL Draft). Head Coach Jimmye Laycock





William and Mary Head Coach Jimmye Laycock 36th Season Career Record: 230-170-2 (.575)

Few schools feature a better match at the helm of its program than the College of William & Mary has with Jimmye Laycock. In a tenure that now stretches into its fourth decade, Laycock has worked hand-in-hand with the College's world-class academic tradition to fashion a program that is a point of pride for the campus, alumni and community.

On June 21, 2008, the College dedicated the \$11 million Jimmye Laycock Football Center with a ceremony that featured more than 500 friends and alumni of the program. While the building carries his name and stands as a strong symbol of what Laycock has meant to the Tribe, it makes a stronger statement about the school's commitment to football and the program's proud tradition. The state-of-the-art center provides the College with one of the finest facilities in the Football Championship Subdivision and, paired with Laycock's steady leadership, gives the Tribe the necessary resources to compete at the highest level.

As the architect of what is easily the most extended run of success in William and Mary's 122-year football history, Laycock has never compromised academic standards for athletic success, as his program earned recognition from the NCAA in each of the first seven seasons the organization has awarded outstanding academic achievement. When Laycock, a 1970 grad, returned to coach his alma mater prior to the 1980 season, he inherited a program that had won six or more games in a season just four times in the previous 25 years. Few could have predicted that the College would produce more than four times that amount of seven-win seasons over the next 35 seasons.

The accumulated successes, both on and off the field, have led to an era of unprecedented interest and support for his program. In addition to the consistent growth in attendance, evidence of this is illustrated by the \$27 Zable Stadium renovation project that began during the offseason. The rejuvenated stadium will provide an enhanced game day experience for both student-athletes as well as Tribe alumni and supporters.

During Laycock's tenure, the fans at Zable have consistently been treated to a winner on the field, as the program's mentor entered the 2015 season ranked fourth in wins among all active FCS coaches and fifth among all active D-I (FCS and FBS) coaches. Laycock also ranks second all-time among conference head coaches in league wins with 100.

Individual accomplishments under Laycock have been plentiful, as he has also tutored 41 players to 115 All-America honors from the William & Mary ranks and has coached 11 Academic All-Americans. Former quarterback Lang Campbell is one of the most honored, as the 2004 season saw him earn the prestigious Payton Award, given annually to the nation's top offensive player in the FCS ranks, consensus first team All-America honors, as well as the A-10's Offensive Player of the Year and Scholar-Athlete of the Year. With 12 all-league recognitions in 2014, the Tribe has produced an astounding 220 all-conference selections since 1993.

However, none of these achievements spoke more succinctly to Laycock's approach than the program's 100 percent official NCAA graduationrate report for all student-athletes receiving athletics aid in 2004. This showed W&M graduated all of its scholarship football players who entered the program as freshmen during the 1997-98 school year. The Tribe not only carried the highest graduation rate in the conference, but also was far and away the top figure of any team ranked in the final national top 25 for that season. To prove this lofty number was no fluke, the team repeated the feat just two years later, as the 1999-2001 cohort also graduated at 100 percent.

The Tribe is well represented in the pro ranks, as 10 former Tribe players were on NFL rosters in the summer of 2015: R.J. Archer (Seattle Seahawks), Jasper Coleman (Houston Texans), Jerome Couplin III (Philadelphia Eagles), Derek Cox (New England Patriots), Jonathan Grimes (Houston Texans), Mike Leach (Arizona Cardinals), Sean Lissemore (San Diego Chargers), Tre McBride (Tennessee Titans), Mike Reilly (Cleveland Browns) and B.W. Webb (Pittsburgh Steelers).

Since 2009, W&M has produced five NFL Draft picks - a figure that leads the CAA and ranks second nationally in the FCS. Additionally, the impressive total ranks third in the state of Virginia (behind only Virginia and Virginia Tech). McBride became the most recent selection last spring when he was drafted by the Tennessee Titans in the seventh round. Webb was a fourth round selection by the Dallas Cowboys in 2013, while Tracy (sixth round, New York Giants) and Lissemore (seventh round, Dallas Cowboys) were both drafted in 2010. One-year earlier, 2008 team captain Derek Cox was selected in the third round of the 2009 NFL Draft by the Jacksonville Jaguars.

In addition to the draft picks, 17 Tribe players have signed free agent contracts after their senior season since the conclusion of the 2004: Lang Campbell (2005, Cleveland Browns), Dominique Thomspon (2005, St. Louis Rams), Adam O'Connor (2007, Carolina Panthers), Drew Atchison (2008, Dallas Cowboys), Mike Potts (2008, Pittsburgh Steelers), Jonathan Grimes (2011, Houston Texans), Alex Gottlieb (2011, Detroit Lions) and Marcus Hyde (2011, Washington Redskins) Jerome Couplin III (2014, Detroit Lions), Jasper Coleman (2015, Houston Texans) and Mike Reilly (2015, Cleveland Browns).

In addition to producing a number of professional standouts, a number of Laycock's former players have gone on to accomplish tremendous success as NFL coaches. The most prominent of those is Mike Tomlin ('95), who became the youngest head coach to win a Super Bowl in NFL history when he guided the Pittsburgh Steelers to the title in 2009. Sean McDermott ('98) currently serves as the Carolina Panthers Defensive Coordinator, while Alan Williams ('92) is the Detroit Lions defensive backs coach and recently held the title of defensive coordinator for the Minnesota Vikings.

As a 1970 graduate of the College, Laycock played football under two gurus of the game. For three years, he learned the details under the watchful eyes of Marv Levy, the legendary former head coach of the Buffalo Bills. In his last season, Hall of Fame coach Lou Holtz schooled Laycock in the finer aspects of psyche and motivation. As a sophomore, Laycock was a starter in the defensive secondary, but he was soon switched to quarterback where he completed 96 of 218 career passes for 1,366 yards.

Laycock's first full-time coaching position came at The Citadel as the offensive backfield coach under Bobby Ross, who went on to coach the NFL's San Diego Chargers and Detroit Lions. In 1975, Memphis State tabbed Laycock as its quarterback's coach and he helped the Tigers to consecutive 7-4 records.

In 1977, Laycock traveled to Clemson to serve as offensive coordinator for three years. During his tenure, he helped the Tigers fashion records of 8-3-1, 11-1 and 8-4. Clemson played bowl games in each year, defeating Ohio State 17-15 in the 1978 Gator Bowl. At that time, Laycock coached two-time All-ACC performer Steve Fuller, the Tiger quarterback who later played in the NFL, and Dwight Clark, an All-Pro receiver for the San Francisco Aders

A native Virginian, Laycock played football, basketball, baseball and golf at Loudoun Valley High School, where he won 12 letters and has since had his number retired and been inducted into the school's Athletics Hall of Fame. Laycock was also inducted into the Hampton Roads Sports Hall of Fame in the fall of 2010.

Laycock is married to Deidre Connelly, a sports psychology consultant at the College. They have three children: Michael, a 1st Lt. in the U.S. Army; Mimi, a 2014 graduate of W&M, teaches for Teach for America in the Baltimore, Md., school system; and James, a senior at Longwood University.

Laycock's daughter Melanie is married to Doug Johnson and is a school administrator in Atlanta, Ga. The couple has two daughters, Grail (5) and Nolan, who was born last winter.

W&M Opens Season with Win at Lafayette, 34-7

Easton, Pa. - The William & Mary football team opened the 2015 season with a lopsided 34-7 victory at Lafayette on Saturday evening.

Although W&M led by just a touchdown at halftime, it outscored the Leopards, 20-0, during the final 30 minutes

The Tribe (1-0) made big plays in all three phases of the game en route to securing important nonconference win.

Junior quarterback Steve Cluley's stat line included 289 passing yards (20 of 30) with two touchdowns and was highlighted by a 58-yard scoring strike to junior wideout Kevin Hart and a 52-yard touchdown pass to senior wide receiver Christian Reeves.

Senior running back Mikal Abdul-Saboor also provided tremendous production and rushed for 103 yards on 17 carries with two touchdowns. In doing so, he posted his sixth-consecutive 100-yard rushing effort (dating back to last season), which ties the school record set by Derek Fitzgerald in 1993. Additionally, the Alpharetta, Ga., native moved into the Tribe's all-time top-10 lists for career rushing yards (2,438) and rushing touchdowns (20).

In addition to holding the Leopards (0-1) scoreless in the second half, the Tribe's defense posted a pair of interceptions (Aaron Swinton and Raeshawn Smith). Senior defensive tackle Tyler Claytor also recorded a blocked field goal that was returned 55 yards by sophomore cornerback Denzel Dykes.

The Tribe outgained LC, 486-332, and allowed the Leopards to score on just one of their four trips into the red zone

W&M got on the scoreboard first with a 2-yard touchdown run by Abdul-Saboor with 2:55 left in the opening quarter. The run capped off a 10-play, 80-yard drive that began after Swinton intercepted Lafayette quarterback Blake Searfoss in the end zone.

A 52-yard touchdown strike from Cluley to Reeves on a third-and-17 increased W&M's lead to 14-0 with 9:58 remaining in the second quarter. The Tribe converted four third-down opportunities during the march en route to finding the end zone.

Shortly after Dennis Bencsko intercepted Cluley at Lafayette's 39-yard line, LC cut the deficit in half with a 10-yard touchdown pass from Searfoss to tight end Bobby DePietro with 0:26 remaining in the second quarter.

W&M opened the second half with a 14-play, 72-yard scoring drive that ended with a 20-yard field goal by sophomore placekicker Nick Dorka, Jr. The march, which lasted 6:10, was keyed by a 19-yard run by Reeves and a 17-yard scamper by Abdul-Saboor on a fourth-and-one from the LC 24-yard line.

A 58-yard touchdown strike down the middle of the field from Cluley to Hart extended W&M's lead to 24-7 with 4:33 remaining.

A blocked field goal by Claytor and 55-yard return by Dykes set up the Tribe's next touchdown, as Abdul-Saboor followed up the big special teams play with a 32-yard touchdown run two plays later to put W&M ahead, 31-7, with 14:03 left in the fourth quarter.

W&M pushed the margin to 34-7 with a 32-yard field goal by Dorka with 7:19 remaining.
