VIRGINIA-CLEMSON SERIES

- Clemson has dominated the all-time series and owns a 102-41 edge, including a 50-21 mark at home and 40-8 record at Doug Kingsmore Stadium.
- Virginia has been strong against Clemson since the current coaching staff started in 2004, winning 14 of 18 games versus the Tigers.
- Last year Virginia won two of three games in the series in Charlottesville.
- UVa will be making its first appearance at Clemson since 2007; no current member of the team has played in this park (Corey Hunt was on the '07 team but did not travel for the Clemson series).

VIRGINIA BASEBALL APPROACHING 2,000 WINS

- With 13 wins this season, the Virginia baseball program now owns 1,988 all-time wins (against 1,609 losses and 40 ties).
- Virginia currently is playing its 122nd baseball season.

PITCHING HAS BEEN LINCHPIN TO SUCCESS

- Virginia's pitching has been nothing short of sensational this season, as UVa leads the ACC with a 1.50 team ERA.
- UVa has recorded four shutouts this year (twice as many as 2010) and has allowed no more than four runs in any game this year.
- One huge key - UVa pitchers have cut their bases on balls in half, walking just 23 batters (1.64/9 innings). In 2010 UVa averaged 3.31 walks per nine innings.

UVA EARNS NATIONAL PITCHING STAFF OF THE WEEK AWARD

- Virginia's pitching staff was honored Monday by InsidePitching.com as the National Pitching Staff of the Week following a 6-0 week.
- UVa's pitchers combined for three shutouts and posted a miniscule 0.67 team ERA for the week. UVa struck out 60 and walked just 12 in 54 innings.

ROTATION SETS TONE FOR CAVALIERS

- Virginia's starting rotation of Danny Hultzen, Tyler Wilson and Cody Winiarski collectively has been strong over the first three weekends.
- The three have combined to go 8-1 with a 1.37 ERA in 59 innings. The trio has allowed just 36 hits and 10 walks while striking out 76.
- They have allowed more than one run in a start just two times this year.

ODDS AND ENDS

- Virginia owns 13 wins this season - tied for second among Division I schools (Oklahoma, 14).
- Virginia ranks 22nd nationally in total attendance (19,423) and 25th in average attendance (2,427) this year.
- UVa leads the ACC in ERA (1.50) and fielding percentage (.993).
- UVa opens ACC play with series against each of the league's 2010 CWS teams - Clemson and Florida State.
- Virginia leads the nation in runs allowed per game (1.6) and is sixth in scoring margin (+6.0).

VIRGINIA VS. RANKED TEAMS

- Virginia has played one ranked team this season, winning 13-2 at then-No. 23 Auburn on Feb. 19.
- UVa went 19-10 against ranked opponents last year, including a 6-4 mark on the road.
- Virginia is 32-18-1 against ranked foes since 2009.

HULTZEN, COLEMAN RETURN TO LINEUP WITH A BANG

- After seeing little action at the plate last year, Danny Hultzen and David Coleman each have started strong at the dish – Hultzen is batting .361 this season, while Coleman stands at .342.

- The two combined to get just 80 at-bats last season, but they already are approaching that in 2011 – Coleman with 38 and Hultzen with 36.

NOTING THE 2011 GAME TIME RULE CHANGES

- The NCAA is enforcing a 20-second clock between pitches (with no runners on base) as well as a 90-second clock between innings.
- Through 14 games Virginia is averaging 2 hours, 32 minutes per game.
- UVa's games averaged 3 hours, 5 minutes in 2010.
- UVa's longest game in 2011 was 2:54 in the opener vs. UAB – the Cavaliers played 37 longer games in 2010.

UVA TOPS MARSHALL, FIRST 1-0 WIN IN 10 YEARS

- Virginia ran its winning streak to seven games with a 1-0 victory over Marshall Tuesday afternoon. It marked UVa first 1-0 win since March 27, 2001, against Richmond.
- Pitching and defense obviously ruled the day, with the teams combining for 15 hits, including 14 singles.
- UVa starter Will Roberts (2-0) worked six stellar innings, allowing just four hits and no walks while tying a career high with eight strikeouts.
- Branden Kline recorded the final four outs to notch his ACC-best fifth save.
- The lone scoring came in the fourth inning when Virginia took advantage of a Marshall error. Kenny Swab led off the inning with a single and when Justin Maynard misplayed the ball, Swab advanced two bases. John Barr followed with a sacrifice fly.

LAST YEAR VS CLEMSON - UVA WINS SERIES, 2-1

- Virginia won two of three games last year in the teams' three-game series at Davenport Field.
- UVa won 4-3 in game one, winning on a Stephen Bruno ninth-inning walk-off single off David Haseldon.
- The teams played a doubleheader Saturday, with Clemson scoring six runs in the final three innings to take the first game, 8-5, before UVa rode a strong pitching outing from Cody Winiarski to a 3-1 win in the finale.

HULTZEN CONTINUES TO DAZZLE

- Danny Hultzen has dominated in his first three starts, going 3-0 with a 0.87 ERA. In 20.2 innings he has allowed just eight hits and one walk while striking out 36.
- He has struck out at least 10 in each start, including a career-high 15 vs. East Carolina (most at UVa since Seth Greisinger struck out 16 UNC batters in 1996).
- He has allowed no more than three hits in any start.
- In Hultzen's three outings only five baserunners have advanced past first base.

HULTZEN CLIMBS VIRGINIA CHARTS

- Danny Hultzen continues his march up the all-time Virginia pitching charts.
- He is now second in career wins at UVa with 23; the record is 27, set by Jacob Thompson (2005-08).
- Hultzen is first in career winning percentage (.920; 23-2), just ahead of Robert Poutier (.917; 11-1).
- His career ERA of 2.34 stands fifth in UVa history, while his 266 strikeouts ranks third (he needs six to tie Tim Burcham for second and 24 to match Seth Greisinger for the record).

WILSON SEAMLESSLY MOVES TO ROTATION

- After pitching out of the bullpen for most of his first three seasons, including 51 straight relief outings entering the season, Tyler Wilson has shifted to the week-end rotation in 2011.
- He is 3-0 with a 1.42 ERA this year. In 19 innings he has allowed just 14 hits and five walks with 23 strikeouts.
- Last week, despite not having his best control, Wilson worked a career-best 6.2 innings against Rider in earning his third straight win.
- Wilson now owns 20 career wins, which is tied for seventh in Virginia history (20-7, 3.07 ERA).
- He ranks fourth in career pitching appearances at UVa with 75 (six starts).

WILSON A CANDIDATE FOR SENIOR CLASS AWARD

- Tyler Wilson has been named one of 30 candidates for the 2011 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award.
- An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.
- A biology major, Wilson is planning to go into the medical field and become an orthopedic surgeon after his baseball career concludes.

SOUTHPAWS GIVE UVA MORE OPTIONS OUT OF 'PEN

- Virginia has added a trio of left-handed options to its bullpen this year, with a healthy Scott Silverstein as well as freshmen Kyle Crockett and Ryan Ashooh.
- The trio has combined to work 5.2 innings out of the bullpen and 9.2 innings total in 11 appearances.
- In 65 games last year, left-handers made 25 appearances out of the bullpen for the Cavaliers.
- Silverstein did not pitch his first two seasons at UVa while recovering from shoulder surgery.

LEVINE MAKES MOST OF OPPORTUNITY

- Ryan Levine played well last week when given the chance to DH; he did not play last year as a freshman.
- In five games (four starts), Levine hit .375 (6-for-16) with a pair of doubles and six RBI.
- In the Sunday contest vs. Cornell, Levine went 3-for-5 with three RBI.
- The switch-hitter twice hit out of the cleanup position and once each out of the five- and six-holes.

O'CONNOR RANKS FOURTH IN WIN PERCENTAGE ENTERING 2010

- UVa head coach Brian O'Connor entered 2011 with a career record of 316-118-1 (.728) and a 126-71-1 record in ACC play.
- O'Connor's 72.8 winning percentage ranked as the fourth best mark among active NCAA Division I coaches entering the 2011 season.
- The only coaches who own a higher winning percentage are Mike Martin (Florida State), Mike Fox (North Carolina) and Gene Stephenson (Wichita State).

IF YOU BUILD IT, THEY WILL COME

- Because of unprecedented ticket demand, Virginia added over 1,500 general admission seats to Davenport Field during the 2010 season to push the stadium's official capacity to 4,825.
- These seats were added in three increments as fans continued to fill the stadium and create even more demand.
- Davenport Field started the 2010 season with a capacity of 3,600.

DEMAND RESULTS IN RECORD ATTENDANCE

- A school-record 125,959 fans walked through the turnstiles at Davenport Field in 2010 (14th nationally). UVa averaged 3,148 fans per game.
- Virginia obliterated all of its previous attendance records. The previous season highs were 1,774 per game and 65,661 total in 2007.
- Virginia played in front of 11 home sellout crowds, including a school-record 4,825 for the May 16 contest with North Carolina.

HULTZEN A PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

- UVa junior southpaw Danny Hultzen was named a 2011 Preseason First-Team All-American by Baseball America, *Collegiate Baseball* and the NCBWA.
- The reigning ACC Pitcher of the Year, Hultzen posted an 11-1 record with a 2.78 ERA in 2010. In 106.2 innings he allowed 75 hits and 24 walks while striking out 123. Batters hit a league-low .193 against him.
- Hultzen led the ACC with 11 wins and 123 strikeouts. He ranked ninth nationally in fewest hits allowed per nine innings (6.33), 13th in strikeouts and 36th in ERA. He pitched at least six innings in 14 of his 16 starts.

HULTZEN CAN SWING IT TOO

- Hultzen will see plenty of time in the batter's box this year as well.
- With so many offensive weapons on the team last year, Hultzen received only 57 at bats and hit .281 with nine doubles and 10 RBI.
- As a freshman he hit .327 with three homers and 37 RBI in 199 at bats. He also posted a .410 on base percentage.

EXPERIENCED PITCHING STAFF RETURNS

- Virginia returns 10 pitchers who saw time on the mound in 2010. In all, the group represents 73 percent of the total innings tossed by UVa hurlers last season.
- The group has combined to appear in 237 career games and pitch over 650 innings.
- Weekend starters Danny Hultzen and Cody Winiarski are both back, as is Tyler Wilson, who primarily has been a reliever in his career. Branden Kline and Will Roberts, who each spent time as weekday starters in 2010, also are in the pitching mix.
- Bullpen stalwarts Chad O'Connor, Shane Halley, Justin Thompson, Corey Hunt and Mayberry all return with plenty of experience.

PLENTY OF BATS BACK TOO

- Virginia returns five position starters from the 2010 team which was the second straight UVa squad to top the ACC in batting average.
- UVa hit a league-high .331 last season after leading the conference with a .327 average in 2009.
- The five returning starters all hit at least .300 last year, led by Keith Werman, who hit .414 last year – the fifth-highest average in program history.
- John Barr (.373), Kenny Swab (.328), Steven Proscia (.314) and John Hicks (.307) all topped the .300 mark.

NINE WAHOOS SELECTED IN 2010 MLB DRAFT

- Virginia had a school-record nine players selected in the 2010 MLB First-Year Player Draft.
- Seven of the nine signed contracts:
 - OF Jarrett Parker (2nd round, SF), 2B Phil Gosselin (5th round, ATL), RHP Robert Morey (5th round, FLA), RHP Kevin Arico (10th round, CIN), OF Dan Grovatt (11th round, PIT), INF Tyler Cannon (12th round, CLE) and Neal Davis (36th round, PHI).
 - RHP Tyler Wilson (35th round, CIN) and C/1B/OF Kenny Swab each have returned for their senior seasons.
 - The previous UVa high for draft picks in a year was six.

SILVERSTEIN BACK ON THE MOUND

- After a year off the mound because of shoulder surgery, left-hander Scott Silverstein is back to toe the rubber this year.
- Now in his third year at UVa, Silverstein has not yet made a pitching appearance for the Cavaliers.
- He has not pitched since his high school because of injuries; as a UVa freshman he saw limited action at the plate and first base.
- He was a two-time high school All-American and was drafted by the Nationals in the 32nd round of the '08 draft.

VIRGINIA LEADS NATION IN ERA LAST SIX YEARS

- Virginia led all NCAA Division I teams in ERA over the past six seasons, boasting a 3.26 team ERA.
- UVa is the only school to rank in the top 20 in the country in ERA each of the last six seasons, including No. 3 marks in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009.
- Virginia also is the only team in Division I to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts and fewest hits allowed each of the last three years.

DEFENSE TOPS ACC UNDER CURRENT STAFF

- Virginia's defense has racked up the ACC's best fielding percentage since the current coaching staff arrived in 2004.
- Virginia has accumulated a .972 fielding percentage over the last seven years combined, including a school-record .977 mark last season (seventh nationally).
- Georgia Tech ranks second in the ACC over the same span with a .968 fielding mark.

VERSATILITY WILL BE KEY

- Much of the UVa's depth comes because of its versatility – several players could see action at a variety of positions.
- John Hicks and Kenny Swab each are athletic players who primarily are catchers but both will shift to first base and the outfield at times.
- Danny Hultzen will pitch and also is a strong defensive first baseman and will DH and play the outfield as well.
- Reed Gragnani and Chris Taylor each can play multiple infield positions as well as the outfield.
- Corey Hunt (INF) and Shane Halley (OF) each will pitch, but are great defensive players in the field as well.

WHO'S BACK?

- UVa returns five position starters who started at least 30 games each in 2010.
- Second-Team All-ACC honoree Keith Werman (2B) headlines the returning infield core; he hit a team-high .414 last season while committing just two errors at second base.
- Two-year starting 3B Steven Proscia also is back; he hit .314 last year and was second on the team with 10 homers while leading the team with 65 RBI.
- John Hicks (.307 BA, 8 HR, 48 RBI) played in 63 games at catcher and first base last season, while Kenny Swab saw time in 45 games (32 starts) and hit .328. John Barr played in 50 games, with 41 starts, in the outfield and hit .373 (third on team).

SOPHOMORE TRIO GETS ITS SHOT

- Virginia's infield trio of Stephen Bruno, Chris Taylor and Reed Gragnani waited in the wings for the most part in 2010, but they will be vital to the potential success for UVa this year.
- Bruno made 36 appearances last year (25 starts), primarily at DH, and is expected to share time at shortstop with Taylor this year.
- Bruno hit .388 with three homers and 30 RBI last year. Taylor hit .305 in 29 games in 2010, but the coaches have big expectations for him this season as he steps into a more prominent role.
- Gragnani hit .365 in 65 at bats as a rookie and could also see time in the infield or outfield.

WHO'S GONE

- Virginia lost several key cogs from the 2010 squad, including seven players who left after the MLB Draft.
- All-Americans Jarrett Parker (CF), Phil Gosselin (2B/OF) and Kevin Arico (RHP) all have departed, as have All-ACC performers Robert Morey, Dan Grovatt and Tyler Cannon.
- LHP Neal Davis also was drafted, while three-year starting catcher Franco Valdes also graduated.

OUTFIELD TAKES ON NEW LOOK

- UVa must replace outfielders Jarrett Parker, Dan Grovatt and Phil Gosselin, who saw the bulk of the starting time in the outfield last year.
- John Barr platooned with Gosselin in left field last year and is expected to take over in center field. David Coleman, who made 41 starts as a freshman in 2008, will see increased time in the starting outfield.
- Reed Gragnani and Chris Taylor also could see time in the outfield after spending most of their time as freshmen on the infield.
- Danny Hultzen, Kenny Swab and John Hicks all are versatile players who could also see some time in the outfield.
- Colin Harrington did not play as a freshman but is expected to play a role in 2011. Freshmen Mitchell Shifflett, Mark Podlas and Derek Justice also will vie for playing time.

NOTING THE SCHEDULE

- Virginia is scheduled to play 25 games against 2010 NCAA Tournament teams, including home series against ACC foes Florida State, Miami and NC State.
- UVa opened Feb. 18-20 at the Auburn Tournament in Auburn, Ala., where it faced UAB, Auburn and Arkansas State; Auburn played host to a 2010 NCAA Regional.
- Virginia's ACC schedule starts with a pair of tough challenges as the Cavaliers play each of the conference's 2010 College World Series participants – Clemson and Florida State.
- Four of Virginia's road ACC series will come against teams that played in the NCAA tournament last year. In addition to the series at Clemson, Virginia is scheduled to travel to Virginia Tech, Georgia Tech, Boston College and North Carolina. The Hokies, Yellow Jackets and Tar Heels all were NCAA qualifiers in 2010.
