BALL STATE FOOTBALL QUICK HITS

⇒ Ball State improved to 4-1 overall and 2-0 in the Mid-American Conference with a 31-24 victory at home over Toledo . . . It marks the best record for a Ball State team through five games since starting the 2008 season with a 5-0 record . . . The 4-1 record after five games is just the fourth start of 4-1 or better for the Cardinals since 1978.

⇒ Ball State is the only Football Bowl Subdivision team in the country to have scored a touchdown on its opening drive in each of the first five games of 2013 . . . East Carolina has opened with a touchdown in all four of its games, while Baylor has done it in all three of its games in 2013.

⇒ The Cardinals' win vs. Toledo was their seventh straight MAC victory dating back to the 2012 season . . . The streak ties for the third longest in school history . . . Four of those seven consecutive MAC wins have been on the road . . . Ball State is now 10-1 in its past 11 regular season games.

⇒ The Cardinals have scored 200 points in their first five games this season -- Illinois State (51), Army (40), North Texas (27), Eastern Michigan (51) and Toledo (31) . . . The 200 points are the second most in school history in the first five games of a season . . . The 2008 team scored 207 points through its first five games and went on to finish the regular season with a 12-0 record.

⇒ Ball State scored 51 points vs. Illinois State and at Eastern Michigan, which marks only the second time in school history and the first time since 1965 the Cardinals have scored at least 50 points in two games in the same season.

⇒ Ball State ranks No. 1 in the Mid-American Conference in passing offense (335.8) and No. 2 in scoring offense (40.0) . . . The Cardinals rank No. 2 in the league in scoring defense (24.0) . . . The Cardinals are 10th in the nation in passing offense and turnovers gained (12) . . . Ball State has recovered seven fumbles from opponents this year to lead the MAC and rank third in the nation.

⇒ The Cardinals scored all four of their touchdowns vs. Toledo on the ground . . . Ball State has scored nine rushing touchdowns over the past two games.

⇒ Junior running back **Jahwan Edwards** ran for three touchdowns vs. Toledo, marking the second straight game he has accomplished the feat.

⇒ Senior **Keith Wenning** is one of only two Football Bowl Subdivision quarterbacks in the country with at least 300 passing yards in five games this year . . . Sean Mannion of Oregon State is the only other quarterback to accomplish the feat in 2013 . . . Wenning ranks second in the country in passing yards (1,650) and sixth in passing yards per game (330.0).

⇒ Junior **Willie Snead** tallied seven catches for 131 yards vs. Toledo for his seventh career 100-yard receiving game . . . **Jamill Smith** finished the Toledo game with a team-high 11 catches for 99 yards . . . The 11 catches were a single game high for a Ball State player this season.

⇒ Ball State head coach Pete Lembo is 62-26 (.705) vs. conference opponents in his career . . . He owns a 10-3 record in season openers as the head coach at Lehigh, Elon and Ball State . . . Seven current NCAA Division I head coaches have reached nine or more wins at three different schools -- Pete Lembo, Ball State alum Brady Hoke, Dennis Franchione, Paul Johnson, Brian Kelly, Urban Meyer and Nick Saban . . . Lembo was selected as one of five coaches you need to know in USA Today prior to the 2013 season . . . Ball State is 11-3 in games decided by a touchdown or less in his three seasons . . . Ball State has never lost back-to-back road games in the same season in Lembo's three years at the helm.

• Ball State will honor its Mid-American Conference Championship football teams from the 1978, 1993 and 2008 seasons . . . All three teams won MAC titles, while the 1993 team competed at the Las Vegas Bowl and the 2008 unit played in the GMAC Bowl after finishing the regular season with a 12-0 mark.

• Ball State will also honor the school's softball team at halftime for its record-setting 2013 season. The softball squad completed the year with a 37-17 overall mark and won the Mid-American Conference Regular Season Championship.

Ball State News and Notes

Captains: Nathan Ollie, Connor Ryan and Keith Wenning are serving as captains for the 2013 Ball State football team.

Ball State Graduates: Three members of the Ball State football team -- Zane Fakes, Joseph Fazio and Connor Ryan -- have each received their bachelor's degrees already from Ball State.

Defensive Takeaways: Ball State has generated 12 takeaways on the season and ranks third in the country in fumbles recovered (7), 10th in the latest NCAA statistics in turnovers gained (12) and 37th in the nation in pass interceptions (5).

Wenning Ways: Senior quarterback **Keith Wenning** has thrown for 1,650 yards -- the most ever by a Ball State quarterback through the first five games of a season . . . The 1,650 passing yards surpasses the mark in the first five games of 2008 when Nate Davis passed for 1,420 yards . . . The 1,650 passing yards leads the MAC and ranks second in the latest NCAA statistics behind only the 2,018 passing yards by Sean Mannion of Oregon State.

Wenning Ways Part II: Keith Wenning has thrown for 8,904 yards in his career and needs 330 passing yards to set the school's career passing yardage mark . . . Nate Davis (2006-08) currently holds the all-time Ball State record with 9,233 career passing yards.

Wenning Ways Part III: With 335 yards passing vs. Toledo, Wenning topped the 300-yard passing plateau for a school record 11th time in his career and the fifth time in five games in 2013.

Wenning Ways Part IV: Wenning has thrown for 8,904 career yards and ranks seventh among active Football Bowl Subdivision players . . . Among active FBS players he ranks third in career pass attempts (1,328), third in pass completions (834) and 16th in passing yards per game (217.2)

Touchdown Machine: **Jahwan Edwards** rushed for three touchdowns and 89 yards on 20 carries vs. Toledo . . . It marked his seventh career multiple touchdown game and his school record fifth career game with three rushing TDs . . . He missed the Army and North Texas games with an injury after starting the season opener vs. Illinois State.

Touchdown Machine Part II: Jahwan Edwards moved into second place on Ball State's career list with 32 rushing touchdowns . . . He needs two rushing TDs to tie Marcus Merriweather (1999-2002), who owns the school record with 34 career rushing touchdowns . . . He is also only five scores away from the school record for total touchdowns in a career, which is shared by Merriweather and Michael Blair (1993-96) with 37.

Take it to the Banks: Sophomore running back **Horactio Banks**, who rushed for 50 yards on 10 carries vs. Toledo, scored his fifth touchdown of the season on a 43-yard run at Eastern Michigan . . . He has three rushes of 40 or more yards in the last three games . . . He has nine career touchdowns . . . Banks rushed for a career high 141 yards on 11 carries at North Texas, marking the third 100-yard rushing game of his career and the first for a Ball State player this season.

Little Man Hits the Trifecta: Ball State senior **Jamill Smith**, who is listed at 5-8, 140 lbs., led the Cardinals with a game high 11 catches vs. Toledo plus tallied 99 receiving yards against the Rockets . . . Smith tallied the first rushing touchdown of his career on a reverse in the second quarter at Eastern Michigan . . . Smith has now scored TDs receiving, passing and rushing in his Ball State career.

Little Man is the Return King: Jamill Smith ranks No. 5 in the nation in kickoff returns with a 33.1 average in 2013 . . . Smith ranks second in Ball State history with 1,644 career kickoff return yards . . . He managed a team-high 115 receiving yards on four catches at North Texas, marking his third career 100-yard receiving game . . . He has 138 career receptions, which ranks in a tie for seventh all-time at Ball State.

Willie Snead IV: **Willie Snead** managed seven catches for 131 yards vs. Toledo . . . It marked his seventh career 100-yard receiving game, which ties for third on Ball State's chart for 100-yard receiving contests in a career . . . He has 15 career TD receptions to put him in a tie with Mike Andress (1974-77) for fifth on Ball State's all-time list . . . He ranks seventh at Ball State with 2,086 career receiving yards and needs 133 yards to move into fifth . . . Snead is fifth in career receptions at Ball State with 152.

Receiving Trio: Ball State had three receivers -- **Jamill Smith**, **Willie Snead** and **Jordan Williams** -- with at least 90 receiving yards vs. Toledo . . . Snead managed 131, Smith tallied 99 and Williams registered 92.

Kenneth Lee Honored as MAC West Division Defensive Player of the Week: **Kenneth Lee** recorded his first career interception and his second sack of the season vs. Toledo to earn the MAC's weekly honor.

UT Game Notes: **Brian Jones** led the Cardinals with a career high 13 tackles, including 1.5 tackles for loss . . . Redshirt freshman **Dae'Shaun Hurley** tallied a career high nine tackles . . . **Zack Ryan** managed his first career fumble recovery.

- 2011-12 APR was 966 -- the highest in Ball State history and tied for first in the Mid-American Conference among football programs.
- Coached Cardinals to back-to-back wins over teams from the Bowl Championship Subdivision Automatic Qualifying Conferences -- Indiana (Big Ten), 41-39, and South Florida (Big East), 31-27 in 2012.
- Coached Briggs Orsbon, who was named to the 2011 Capital One Academic All-America Team. Also has coached 18 Ball State student-athletes who have received Academic All-MAC honors in the last two seasons, including eight first-team selections.
- Led Ball State to back-to-back wins over Indiana -- 2011 (27-20 at Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis, Ind.) and 2012 (41-39 at Bloomington, Ind.)
- Coached the Cardinals to two wins over BCS Automatic Qualifying Conferences in the same year for the first time in school history in 2012.
- Led Ball State to a 34-27 win over nationally ranked Toledo in 2012, which marked the Cardinals' first win over a ranked opponent since 2001. Toledo entered the game ranked No. 23 by The Associated Press.
- Improved his career record to 10-3 in season openers after leading Ball State to a 51-28 victory over Illinois State in the first game of 2013. Won his first game as a head coach at all three schools he has coached and guided the Cardinals to wins in his first three season openers.
- Helped Ball State to six wins and bowl eligibility in his first season at the helm in 2011, and to bowl eligibility for a second straight season in 2012.
- Led Ball State to the fourth best come-from-behind victory in school history with a 31-27 win over Central Michigan in 2011 in a game the Cardinals fell behind 17-0 in the second quarter.
- Coached Ball State to his first Mid-American Conference win and first Scheumann Stadium win in his first home game vs. Buffalo Sept. 17, 2011. Led the Cardinals to their first-ever win over Army with a 48-21 victory at Scheumann Stadium Sept. 24, 2011, a second win over the Black Knights by a 30-22 margin in 2012 and a third straight win in 2013 by a 40-14 score.
