## MIAMI-VIRGINIA SERIES

- Miami holds a 17-9 advantage in the all-time series with Virginia.
- The Hurricanes won two of three last year in Charlottesville.
- Overall, Miami has claimed seven of the last eight meetings.
- Virginia has won one series with Miami since UM entered the ACC, taking two of three in Coral Gables in 2006.

## 40 WINS IN RECORD TIME

- Virginia earned its 40th victory with its win May 4 vs. VCU, marking the earliest Virginia has reached the mark.
- It is the first time UVA has gotten to the 40-win mark before its exam break.
- Overall, this is the seventh time Virginia has won 40 games in a season; UVA has won at least 40 games in six of Brian O'Connor's seven seasons at Virginia.

## CAVALIERS SWEEP AGAIN

- With sweeps the last two ACC week-ends over Maryland and Duke, UVA has swept back-to-back ACC road series for the first time since doing so against Duke (April 2-4) and Maryland (April 16-18) in 2004.
- It is just the second time UVA has swept three straight ACC series; UVA also did so in 2004.
- UVA has never swept four straight ACC series.

## ODDS AND ENDS

- With 14 straight wins, Virginia is currently on its second-longest win streak ever (19 in 2009).
- The win streak is the longest current one in the country (Jackson State, 13).
- Opponents are 7-for-20 in stolen base attempts over the last 14 games.
- Virginia has hit 32 home runs in ACC games (fourth most in ACC).
- UVA has 15 wins this season against the RPI Top 50.

## QUICK NOTES FROM THE UNC SERIES

- UVa swept its first-ever series over UNC and its first series coming out of the exam break since 1997 vs. Maryland.
- UVa pitchers combined to limit UNC to six runs (five earned) and 16 hits (1.67 ERA). UNC hit just .167 in the series.
- John Hicks hit two homers and drove in five runs.
- Jarrett Parker was 6-for-10 in the series, with two hits in each game. He also scored four times.
- UVa hit five homers in the series, including three Sunday.

## WALKING OFF A WINNER

- Virginia scored a pair of walk-off wins in the North Carolina series.
- In the first game Saturday, John Barr sent UVa to the win with a two-out single in the ninth inning off Matt Harvey to score Jarrett Parker from second base.
- Sunday, John Hicks ripped a three-run home run off the left-field foul pole to send UVa to the 5-3 win.
- It was the first walk-off homer for UVa since David Adams hit a walk-off dinger vs. Georgia Tech on April 14, 2007.
- Virginia now has three walk-off wins this year (Clemson, 3/26).

## NOTING THE 14-GAME WIN STREAK

- Virginia is hitting .351, with 71 extra-base hits, including 44 doubles, in the current 14-game win streak.
- The team owns a 2.50 ERA during this stretch, walking just 32 while striking out 111. Opponents are batting just .216 in the last 14 games.
- UVa has stolen 17 bases in 21 attempts – opponents are just 7-for-20 in that same 14-game span.
- Steven Proscia and John Hicks each have 18 RBI during the streak, while Phil Gosselin and Jarrett Parker have a team-high 21 hits each.

## CAVALIERS FIND THEIR POWER STROKE

- Virginia has hit 21 home runs in the last 14 games.
- Four Cavaliers have done the majority of the damage – Jarrett Parker and John Hicks each have five homers during this time, while Phil Gosselin and Steven Proscia each have swatted four.
- UVa now has 49 home runs this season, including 32 in ACC games (fourth most in ACC games).

## HICKS SHOWS OFF THE ARM

- John Hicks has thrown out seven of the last 10 potential basestealers over the past 15 games.
- For the season, Hicks has thrown out 51 percent (16-of-31) of runners attempting to steal. That percentage ranks fourth nationally.
- As a team, UVa has thrown out 28-of-63 (ACC-best 44.4 percent) of potential basestealers.
- Opponents have stolen an ACC-low 35 bases vs. UVa.

## GOSSELIN HAS BIG SUCCESS AT TOP OF ORDER

- Phil Gosselin moved into the Cavaliers' leadoff slot this year and has been solid, with a .386 batting average, .462 on base percentage and 15 stolen bases.
- He is second in the ACC in batting and hits (81).
- He ranks fifth in the ACC in doubles (19), seventh in triples (4) and 10th in stolen bases.
- Gosselin has reached base to lead off 20 games.
- He had a streak of 122-consecutive starts snapped April 24 when he sat out because of food poisoning.

## MOREY NAMED ACC PITCHER OF THE WEEK

- Robert Morey was named the ACC Pitcher of the Week on Monday following his performance in a 5-1 win vs. UNC last Saturday.
- He pitched his second-consecutive complete game, a first at UVa since Andrew Dobies in 2004.
- He was the first opposing pitcher to go the distance against North Carolina this season and held UNC to a season-low three hits.
- Morey had a no-hitter until the sixth inning and retired 15 straight batters at one point. He also tied his season high with eight strikeouts.

### ROTATION PRODUCING FOR WAHOOS

- Virginia's starting rotation has produced 15 ACC wins this season – most of any ACC team.
- Robert Morey is tied for the league lead with six ACC wins, while Danny Hultzen owns five ACC victories, which is tied for fourth. Cody Winiarski has four ACC wins which is tied for sixth.
- Only eight other pitchers in the ACC have at least four wins in league games.

### CAVALIERS RANKED NO. 2 IN LATEST RPI

- Virginia is ranked No. 3 in the latest RPI report, which was released Tuesday by the NCAA. Arizona State tops the rankings.
- Virginia has 15 wins against the RPI top 50 this year, with a series against Miami (No. 9) remaining.

### WAHOOS RACK UP SERIES WINS OVER RANKED TEAMS

- Virginia has won all six of its series against ranked foes, including ACC series wins over Top-10 opponents Florida State, Clemson and Georgia Tech.
- The Cavaliers are 14-6 this year against ranked foes.
- Virginia has played the most ranked opponents this year among ACC teams.

### VIRGINIA RANKS 20TH NATIONALLY IN ATTENDANCE

- With a season average of 2,819 spectators per game, Virginia ranks 20th nationally in attendance.
- UVa has drawn 93,040 fans this year (33 dates).
- Both totals easily are school records; UVa has obliterated the single-season attendance average record of 1,774, set in 2007.
- On April 6 vs. James Madison, UVa had its largest mid-week attendance ever with 2,521 spectators.
- UVa ranks fourth in attendance this season among ACC schools, behind Florida State, Clemson and Miami.

### UVA SHATTERS ATTENDANCE RECORDS

- Virginia broke its three-game series attendance record again last weekend, as 13,294 fans came out for the UNC series.
- Over the final three home weekends, UVa drew 38,530 fans for series against Georgia Tech, Virginia Tech and North Carolina.
- UVa has had six sellouts this season, including a stadium-record crowd of 4,825 on Sunday.
- A record total of 93,040 fans have come out this year (33 dates) – the record was 65,661 in 2007 (37 dates).
- UVa already has played in front of six road crowds and 11 home crowds of more than 3,500.
- In midweek action, the Cavaliers have been played in front of sellout, school-record crowds at William and Mary, James Madison and VMI.

### IF YOU BUILD IT, THEY WILL COME

- Virginia has added 979 general admission bleacher seats down the right-field line this season.
- Nearly 600 new bleacher seats in right field were added last weekend, pushing the Davenport Field capacity to 4,825.
- Davenport Field started the season with a capacity of 3,600, and UVa has added seats on three occasions to push the capacity to 4,825.

### VIRGINIA PITCHING LIMITS HITS

- Virginia's pitchers had given up an average of 7.73 hits per nine innings – first in the ACC and fourth fewest in the nation (Miami ranks seventh nationally).
- UVa ranked third nationally last year in fewest hits allowed per nine innings (7.97).
- UVa has given up more than nine hits just 15 times this season and twice in the last 11 games.

### CANNON CLIMBS VIRGINIA CHARTS

- Tyler Cannon has now played in the most career games at UVa with 232. He passed David Stone (1999-2002) for first on the all-time UVa list April 30 at Duke.
- Cannon also comes into the week with 866 career at bats, which also is first in UVa history. He passed Ryan Gilleland (1995-98) for first on Sunday.
- Cannon has 59 career doubles and has broken the UVa career doubles record, previously set by Brandon Guyer (53, 2005-07). He needs two doubles to reach the ACC's career Top 25.
- He also is third in triples (12), fourth in hits (265), fifth in runs (174), sixth in total bases (366), eighth in stolen bases (48), ninth in walks (104) and 11th in HBP (19).

### LEGGING OUT THE EXTRA BAGGERS

- Virginia has sprayed the ball all over the field this year and ranks among the nation's leaders in triples and doubles (ACC leader in both).
- In the latest NCAA rankings, the Cavaliers were 13th in doubles with 137, which is one shy of the school record, set last year.
- UVa also was fourth nationally in triples behind Air Force (33) and Arizona State (32) and Maine (29). UVa currently has 28 triples, which has matched the school record, set in 2009.
- The extra-base hits are coming from everyone – Jarrett Parker is the only Cavalier ranks in the top 40 nationally in either category; he is 13th nationally in triples with six.

### GOLDEN EYES

- Virginia's offense ranks 21st nationally with 248 bases on balls.
- Interestingly, the Cavaliers are just sixth in walks in the ACC – six ACC teams rank among the NCAA's top 25 in walks.
- FSU (2), Clemson (3), NC State (4), Georgia Tech (7), and UNC (8) also rank among the top 25.

### NO SLOUCHES IN THE NINE-HOLE

- Virginia has gotten big production out of its nine-hole hitters this season.
- The No. 9 hitters in the Virginia lineup have combined to go 75-for-171 (.439) this season with 38 RBI and 61 runs scored.
- Against UNC, UVa's No. 9 hitters went 4-for-10.
- Outside of the top two spots in the lineup, UVa has gotten its most hits out of the ninth spot in the order.
- Keith Werman, out of the nine-hole, has gone 24-for-43 with 14 runs scored and eight RBI this year.
- Stephen Bruno is 23-for-57 (.404) with two homers, 17 RBI and 19 runs scored in the ninth spot.

### DEFENSE REMAINS AMONG NATION'S BEST

- Through 52 games, Virginia has committed 43 errors – good for a .978 fielding percentage.
- UVa leads the ACC in fielding and has a league-best .980 fielding mark in ACC games.
- In the latest NCAA rankings (through May 16), Virginia ranked sixth in the nation in fielding.
- The Cavaliers recorded a .972 fielding mark last year.
- The school record for fielding percentage is .975, set in 2005.

### ARICO TIED FOR NATIONAL LEAD IN SAVES

- Kevin Arico is tied with five others for No. 1 among all Division I pitchers in saves with 13 this season (in 16 attempts)
- He boasts 24 career saves – second in Virginia history and ninth in ACC history.
- Former Cavalier Casey Lambert (2004-07) is the ACC's all-time leader with 43 saves.
- Arico has been named to the midseason watch list for the NCBWA Stopper of the Year Award, presented to the top relief pitcher in NCAA Division I baseball.

### OFFENSE REVS UP IN SECOND

- Virginia has outscored its opponents 36-26 in the first inning this year, but the Cavaliers have exploded from there.
- UVa has outscored its opponents 57-17 in the second inning this year and 169-53 from the second through the fourth innings.
- Overall, Virginia is outscoring its opponents 441-200 this season.

### BALANCE THROUGHOUT LINEUP

- UVa has gotten production from its entire lineup, with 10 players boasting at least 35 hits and 25 runs each.
- In 23 games at least eight of the nine Virginia starters have recorded at least one hit.
- On six occasions all nine UVa starters posted at least one hit.
- The Cavaliers are hitting an .341 as a team through 52 games. Ten regular starters are batting .295 or better.

### **FRESHMEN PRODUCE WHILE WAITING TURN**

- UVa's freshman infielders (Stephen Bruno, Reed Gagnani and Chris Taylor) have combined to go 75-for-199 (.377).
- Bruno is batting .400 and had a 15-game hit streak at one point this season.
- Gagnani is 11-for-25 in his last nine games.
- Taylor scored nine runs the week ending April 24 and had a career-high three hits out of the leadoff spot April 24 at Maryland.

### **VETERAN-LADEN CAVALIERS**

- Virginia has one of its most experienced teams ever.
- The Cavaliers' returning position players have combined for 1,341 career starts, led by senior shortstop Tyler Cannon, who has started 226 games.
- Ten players have started at least 50 career games apiece for UVa. Cannon, Dan Grovatt (167), Jarrett Parker (162), Phil Gosselin (154), Steven Proscia (115) John Hicks (109) and Franco Valdes (108) each have made at least 100 career starts.

### **BRUNO STREAK COMES TO HALT AT 15**

- Stephen Bruno had his 15-game hit streak snapped April 16 vs. Virginia Tech.
- He batted .397 (23-for-58) during that stretch.
- It was the longest hit streak for a UVa freshman since Brandon Guyer recorded hits in 15 straight games in 2005.

### **MOST MARCH WINS EVER**

- Virginia recorded one of its best months of March in program history.
- UVa won a school-record 16 games in March (16-3).
- It also is the third-best winning percentage for a UVa team in March (.842), behind only the 1967 (5-0) and 1971 (6-0) teams.

### **WAHOOS NOTCH FIRST SERIES WIN VS. FLORIDA STATE**

- Virginia scored its first-ever series win against Florida State March 12-14, taking two of three games in Tallahassee.
- UVa was 0-for-14 in its previous three-game series with the Seminoles.
- It also marked the highest-ranked opponent that UVa has won a series against since March 17-18, 2007 at then-No. 1 North Carolina.

### **CAVALIERS EARN FIRST-EVER NO. 1 NATIONAL RANKING**

- Virginia earned a No. 1 ranking from Baseball America and Rivals.com for six-consecutive weeks this season and is back at No. 1 in the Baseball America rankings for the last four weeks.
- It marks the first No. 1 ranking in school history for Virginia Baseball.
- The baseball team becomes the 10th athletics program at Virginia to garner a No. 1 national ranking, joining men's basketball, women's basketball, field hockey, football, men's lacrosse, women's lacrosse, men's soccer, women's soccer and men's tennis.

- Virginia has had five teams ranked No. 1 this season – baseball, men's lacrosse, women's rowing, men's soccer and men's tennis.

### **UVA LEADS NATION IN ERA LAST FIVE YEARS**

- Virginia led all NCAA Division I teams in ERA over the past five seasons, boasting a 3.13 team ERA.
- UVa ranked in the top 15 in the country in ERA each of the last six seasons, including No. 3 marks in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009.
- North Carolina is the only other team to rank among the top 15 nationally in ERA for the last six years.
- Virginia is the only team in Division I to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts and fewest hits and walks allowed each of the last two years.

- Virginia ranks third nationally in stolen bases the last four years with 495 (123.7 per year).
- UVa trails only Prairie View and Jackson State over that span.
- The Cavaliers stole 119 bases in 145 attempts last year, as five players stole at least 13 bases apiece.

### **STRONG CORE OF PITCHERS BACK, BUT HOLES REMAIN**

- UVa has to fill the holes of six pitchers who logged 226.0 innings and made 30 starts last season. Nine pitchers return.
- Danny Hultzen (9-1, 2.17) and Robert Morey (3-0, 3.33) each had strong 2009 seasons and will anchor the rotation.
- UVa had a 3.23 ERA last year (third nationally) and has the best ERA in the nation (3.13) over the last five seasons.

### **VERSATILITY KEY FOR CAVALIERS**

- Much of the UVa's depth comes because of its versatility – several players could see action at a variety of positions.
- John Hicks and Kenny Swab each are athletic players who primarily are catchers but both will shift to first base and the outfield at times.
- Danny Hultzen will pitch and also is a strong first baseman and will DH as well, while Phil Gosselin could play at second or left field.
- Corey Hunt (INF) and Shane Halley (OF) each will pitch, but are great defensive players in the field as well.

### **STARTING LINEUP BACK IN TACT**

- Virtually the entire offense returns from 2009, including everyone from the starting lineup.
- Almost all of the offensive production is back – 99 percent of the RBI-production returns, with 98.4 percent of the hit-producers (755 of 767) coming back.
- Virginia hit .327 last season – the Cavaliers' best mark since 1985 – and swatted 59 home runs – UVa's most since 2002.
- Dan Grovatt (.356), Jarrett Parker (.355) and Tyler Cannon (.351) led UVa in batting last year. UVa has nine regular starters back who hit at least .292 last year.

### **WHO'S GONE?**

- Virginia will need to replace 229.0 innings lost from the 2009 squad.
- The top loss comes from starter Andrew Carraway, who tossed 91.0 innings last year.
- Matt Packer pitched 61 innings – second-most out of the bullpen.

### **SCHEDULE WILL CHALLENGE**

- Virginia's schedule is not for the faint of heart – 11 teams from the 2009 NCAA Tournament line the schedule.
- Thirty-six games will come against teams that won at least 30 games last year.
- UVa opened with a three-game set at East Carolina, a 2009 Super Regional qualifier.
- The ACC slate features six NCAA teams from last season – North Carolina (CWS), Clemson and Florida State (Super Regionals) and Boston College, Georgia Tech and Miami (Regionals).
- The Cavaliers also have non-conference matchups with 2009 NCAA Tournament foes Coastal Carolina, Dartmouth, George Mason and Wright State.
