FOR OPENERS

- UVA meets St. Francis Brooklyn for the first time and plays its first of two contests against a Northeast Conference opponent this season (Robert Morris).
- UVA owns the nation's seventh-longest current NCAA Division I home-winning streak at 20 games.
- Cavalier forwards Austin Nichols and Mamadi Diakite are expected to make their UVA debuts after missing the opener at UCG.

LAST TIME OUT

- No. 8/7 Virginia defeated UCG 76-51 in season-opening action at the Greensboro Coliseum on Friday, Nov. 11.
- Junior Marial Shayok led four Cavaliers in double figures with 15 points as the Cavaliers posted their fourth straight season-opening win.
- Virginia held UCG scoreless for 11:19 spanning halftime and used a 22-0 run to blow the game open.
- UVA shot 52 percent from the field and was 8-of-16 from 3-point range.
- Redshirt junior Darius Thompson added 12 points and a career-best three 3-pointers, tying the school record with eight consecutive 3-pointers dating back to last season.
- Junior Isaiah Wilkins added 10 points and a game-high nine rebounds and senior London Perrantes chipped in 10 points and three assists.
- Junior Jarred Reuter tallied eight points and six rebounds and Jack Salt contributed a career-best seven points and three assists.
- Freshmen Kyle Guy (7 points, 3 assists) and Ty Jerome (2 points) made their UVA debuts.

UVA RANKED NO. 8/7 IN LATEST RANKINGS

- UVA is ranked No. 8 in the latest Associated Press and No. 7 in the USA Today Coaches' polls.
- The Cavaliers were ranked in top 10 in the preseason rankings (No. 8/7) for the third straight season, matching a school-best from 1981-83.
- UVA has been ranked in the top 10 in 39 of the last 43 AP polls.
- UVA has been ranked in the top 10 in nine consecutive AP polls and 10 consecutive coaches' polls dating back to last season.
- UVA has finished in the top 10 (No. 3 in 2014 & No. 6 in 2015 and No. 4 in 2016) in the final AP rankings in three consecutive seasons for the first time since 1981-83.

HOW ARE THESE CAVALIERS?

- Virginia returns three starters - London Perrantes, Isaiah Wilkins and Devon Hall - and six other letterwinners including Darius Thompson, Marial Shayok, Jarred Reuter and Jack Salt from last year's 29-8 team that qualified for UVA's first NCAA Elite Eight since 1995.
- Perrantes, who is a Naismith Player of the Year and ACC Player of the Year candidate, is a four-year starter and two-time All-ACC honorable mention honoree.
- Redshirt junior Austin Nichols is eligible to play after transferring from Memphis, where he earned All-American Athletic Conference accolades in 2014-15.
- Redshirt freshman Mamadi Diakite and newcomers Kyle Guy and Ty Jerome are expected to be key contributors this season.
- Rookies Jay Huff and De'Andre Hunter are expected to redshirt the 2016-17 season.

VIRGINIA HEAD COACH TONY BENNETT

- Head coach Tony Bennett has a 166-72 mark in eight seasons at Virginia and 235-105 career mark in 10 seasons overall.
- Bennett guided UVA to a school-record 89 wins over three seasons from 2014-16, eclipsing 88 wins from 1981-83.
- Bennett-coached teams have led the nation in scoring defense three times (2008-09, 2013-14 & 2014-15), and finished in the top five nationally in seven of 10 seasons.
- Bennett has led the Cavaliers to five consecutive postseason tournaments (NCAA in 2012, 2014, 2015 and 2016, and NIT in 2013).
- In 2015-16, Bennett led Virginia to its third consecutive NCAA Tournament, first NCAA Elite Eight appearance since 1995 and 29 wins.
- Bennett was named 2015 USBWA National Coach of the Year and ACC Coach of the Year after leading Virginia to a school-record tying 30 wins and its second consecutive ACC regular-season title.
- Bennett led the Cavaliers to 30 wins in back-to-back seasons (2013-2014) for the first time in school history.
- In 2013-14, Bennett guided UVA to its first ACC regular season and tournament championship (first since 1976) in the same season for the first time in school history.
- Bennett-coached teams are 80-3 when holding opponents to fewer than 50 points during his 10-year coaching career.
- Bennett is one of 28 current Division I head coaches who played in the NBA.
- UVA is 100-20 (.833) in seven seasons at John Paul Jones Arena under Bennett.

- Virginia is 9-0 all-time vs. current Northeast Conference opponents (3-0 vs. LIU Brooklyn, 3-0 vs. Wagner, 1-0 vs. Fairleigh Dickinson, 1-0 vs. Mount St. Mary's and 1-0 vs. Robert Morris).
- Tony Bennett is 1-0 all-time vs. current Northeast Conference opponents as a head coach (1-0 vs. Fairleigh Dickinson at Washington State).

THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME

- Virginia is 138-36 (.793) in 10 seasons at John Paul Jones Arena.
- The Cavaliers finished undefeated at home (15-0) in 2015-16 for the first time since 1981-82 (12-0).
- UVA owns the nation's seventh longest current home-winning streak at 20 games.
- UVA is 100-20 (.833), including a 65-5 (.929) mark the past four seasons, at home under head coach Tony Bennett.
- Virginia is 35-1 in ACC home games over the past four seasons, the best mark in ACC history with one loss (Duke 33-1 from 1962-64).
- UVA has won 11 or more home games for seven straight seasons.
- UVA's 21-game home winning streak from Dec. 21, 2013-Jan. 22, 2015 set a JPJ record.

LONDON CALLING

- Preseason All-ACC first-team selection and ACC Player of the Year candidate London Perrantes leads UVA into action this season.
- Perrantes is averaging 10 points, 3.0 rebounds and 3.0 assists in 2016-17.
- He enjoyed a breakout season in 2015-16, averaging career highs in points (11), field goal percentage (43.9%) and ACC-leading 3-point field goal percentage (48.8%).
- Perrantes has led UVA in assists in each of the last three seasons and has a career 2.9 assist-to-turnover ratio (444 assists, 154 turnovers) in 105 games (101 starts).
- Perrantes needs 23 wins to become UVA's all-time winningest player (112 by Mike Tobey, Evan Nolte, Caid Kirven).
- He was named All-ACC Honorable Mention in each of the past two seasons and earned All-ACC Freshman Team honors in 2013-14.
- Perrantes ranks seventh all-time at UVA with 444 career assists.

'HOOS WATCHING ME?

- London Perrantes was one of 20 players named to the watch list for the 2017 Bob Cousy Point Guard of the Year Award.
- Perrantes was also one of 50 players named to the 2017 Naismith Men's College Player of the Year watch list.
- Perrantes led the ACC in 3-point shooting at a career-best 48.8 percent and averaged 11 points and 4.4 assists in 2015-16.
- Austin Nichols was one of 20 players named to the watch list for the 2017 Karl Malone Power Forward of the Year Award.
- Nichols, who sat out the 2015-16 season after transferring from Memphis, averaged 13.3 points and ranked third nationally with 3.4 blocked shots per game for the Tigers as a sophomore in 2014-15.

ABOUT THE 2016-17 SCHEDULE

- Seven of Virginia's opponents were ranked in the top 20 of the AP preseason poll (Duke, Villanova, North Carolina, Louisville, Syracuse, West Virginia and Cal) while seven (Florida State, Miami, NC State, Virginia Tech, Notre Dame, Clemson and Yale) received votes.
- The Cavaliers will play 13 games against 2016 NCAA Tournament teams: home games against Duke, North Carolina, West Virginia, Miami, Pitt and Yale; road contests at Villanova, North Carolina, Syracuse, California, Pitt and Notre Dame; and a neutral-site tilt against Iowa in the Emerald Coast Classic in Niceville, Fla.
- Four opponents (Florida State, Georgia Tech, Ohio State and Virginia Tech) participated in the 2016 National Invitation Tournament.

VIRGINIA PICKED 3RD IN THE ACC

- UVA was picked to finish third in the ACC preseason poll after finishing at or higher than their predicted finish in each of the last eight seasons.
- Duke is the preseason favorite, followed by North Carolina, Virginia, Louisville, Syracuse, NC State, Notre Dame, Florida State, Miami, Virginia Tech, Clemson, Pitt, Wake Forest, Georgia Tech and Boston College.

ZAY PAVES THE WAY

- Junior Isaiah Wilkins, who started 21 games last season, is UVA's top returning frontcourt player after leading the Cavaliers with 31 blocked shots and adding 28 steals in 2015-16.
- Wilkins averaged 4.6 points, 4.1 rebounds and 1.4 assists in 2015-16.
- He had a career-high 13 rebounds vs. NC State (2/15/16) and scored a career-high 14 points vs. Virginia Tech (2/9/16).
- Wilkins tallied 10 points and a game-high nine rebounds in the season opener at UNCG (11/11/16).

HALL OF A SPARK

- Redshirt junior guard Devon Hall returns to the Cavaliers after averaging 21.9 minutes and starting 20 games in 2015-16.
- In 2015-16, Hall scored an ACC-high 11 points vs. Clemson (1/19/16) and North Carolina (2/27/16), and netted a career-high 13 points vs. Morgan State (11/13/15) and drained a career-best four 3-pointers for 12 points vs. Long Beach State (11/20/15).
- Hall had five points and four rebounds in the season opener at UNCG (11/11/16).

'HOO ARE THE NEW GUY(S)?

- Virginia welcomes freshmen Kyle Guy (Indianapolis, Ind./Lawrence Central), Jay Huff (Durham, N.C./Voyager Academy), De'Andre Hunter (Philadelphia, Pa./Friends' Central) and Ty Jerome (New Rochelle, N.Y./Iona College Prep) to this year's team.
- Guy averaged 23.5 points, 5.6 rebounds and 3.7 assists en route to Mr. Basketball for Indiana and McDonald's All-America honors in 2015-16.
- Jerome tallied 24.7 points, 8 rebounds and 5 assists per game before season-ending hip surgery last season.
- Huff averaged 16.3 points, 10.1 rebounds and 5.5 assists in 2015-16, while Hunter recorded 23.5 points and 9.8 rebounds per game last season.
- UVA head coach Tony Bennett announced on Nov. 11 that the plan is to redshirt Huff and Hunter.

HOLDING FOES UNDER 50

- Virginia is 55-2 when holding opponents under 50 points in the Tony Bennett era.
- Bennett-coached teams are 80-3 when holding opponents to fewer than 50 points (25-1 in three years at Washington State).

THE ELECTRIC 70s

- Virginia is 81-4 when scoring at least 70 points under Tony Bennett and 85-68 when scoring under 70 points.

60 IS THE NEW 70

- UVA is 143-32 when scoring at least 60 points under Tony Bennett and 23-40 when scoring fewer than 60 points.

CAVALIERS IN THE NBA

- Justin Anderson (Dallas), Malcolm Brogdon (Milwaukee), Joe Harris (Brooklyn) and Mike Scott (Atlanta) are former Cavaliers who are playing in the NBA this season.
- Scott is in his fifth season and Harris is in his third NBA season (first with Brooklyn), while Anderson is in his second season and Brogdon is in his rookie season.
- In addition, Dallas head coach Rick Carlisle is a Virginia alum who helped the Cavaliers to their last NCAA Final Four in 1984.

- Anthony, a 6-6, 222-pound guard, averaged 20 points, 7.4 rebounds and 2.9 assists en route to unanimous first-team all-conference honors during his junior season.
- He earned unanimous first-team all-conference honors during his sophomore season in 2014-15 after averaging 19.3 points, 7.2 rebounds and 2.4 assists for Holmes High School. He garnered second-team all-academic accolades in 2014 and 2015.

VIRGINIA BASKETBALL WAS OFFENSIVE IN 2015-16

- UVA averaged 71.0 points, its most since 76.8 ppg in 2007-08, during the 2015-16 season.
- UVA ranked Nos. 3, 5 and 9 in the KenPom.com overall, adjusted defense and adjusted offense efficiency ratings, respectively.
- UVA shot 49.1 percent from the field (best since 49.6% in 1986-87), 40.3 percent from 3-point range (best in school history) and 75.2 percent from the free throw line (best since 76.2% in 1978-79).
- UVA scored 80 or more points in eight games, its most since 11 in 2007-08.

RECORD-SETTING THREE-YEAR RUN FOR THE CAVALIERS

- Virginia has posted a school-record 89 wins over the last three seasons (30-7 in 2013-14, 30-4 in 2014-15 and 29-8 in 2015-16).
- The Cavaliers captured two ACC regular-season championships and one ACC Tournament title from 2014-16.
- In 2015-16, UVA advanced to its first NCAA Elite Eight since 1995.
- UVA has earned a pair of No. 1 NCAA Tournament seeds (2014 & 2016) and a No. 2 NCAA Tournament seed (2015).
- UVA was 45-3 at John Paul Jones Arena from 2014-16, and owns the seventh-longest home-winning streak in Division I at 20 games entering the 2016-17 season.
- The Cavaliers led the nation in scoring defense in 2014 and 2015, and finished second in 2016.
- UVA ranked first in the ACC in league wins from 2014-16 with 45, followed by Duke (39), North Carolina (38), Syracuse (32) and Notre Dame (31).
