PITT MAKES FIRST TRIP TO UVA IN ACC PLAY

- Virginia owns a 12-3 edge in the series, including 7-2 in ACC play, after sweeping Pitt last year on the road.
- This marks Pitt's first trip to Charlottesville as a member of the ACC.
- Pitt last played in Charlottesville in on March 24, 1981, an 11-4 UVA win.
- Pitt's first scheduled trip to Charlottesville as a member of the ACC was in 2015, but the series was moved to Cary, N.C., because of inclement weather.

POWER PLAY

- Virginia has hit 34 home runs, its most homers through 31 games in the Brian O'Connor era.
- The Cavaliers hit 42 home runs in 2016 and did not record their 34th homer last year until May 20 (54th game).
- UVA is one home run shy of its total from the 68-game national championship season in 2015 and has surpassed its total from the NCAA runner-up season in 2014 (33 in 69 games).
- Ten Cavaliers have gone deep this year, and UVA is fourth in the ACC in home runs.
- Pavin Smith is tied for third in the league with 10 long balls, while Adam Haseley, with nine, is tied for sixth.

PAVIN SMITH: NOT YOUR TYPICAL POWER HITTER

- Pavin Smith has put up some big numbers in the first half of the season, hitting for power as well as contact.
- He ranks as the toughest to strike out of any player in Division I, with three strikeouts in 120 official at bats (141 plate appearances).
- He is tied for 13th nationally with 10 home runs.
- Only one other player among the top 40 nationally in home runs has fewer than 12 strikeouts – UVA's Adam Haseley with 11. He is tied for 24th nationally in homers.

TIME TO ... GO TO WORK!

- Pavin Smith and Adam Haseley are on pace to become the first UVA teammates to each record at least 10 homers in a season since Phil Gosselin (11), Jarrett Parker (10) and Steven Proscia (10) in 2010.
- Smith is tied for third in the ACC in home runs, while Haseley is sixth.
- With 25 career homers, Smith is one round-tripper from reaching the top 10 in program history. He also is three RBI shy of the top 10 at UVA (143).

THINGS TO KNOW

- Ernie Clement is 8-for-24 (.333) in six career games against Pitt (2 2B, 3B, 5 RBI).
- Virginia leads the ACC in batting in all games (.322) and ACC games (.296) and is seventh nationally.
- Pitt is fifth in the ACC in ERA (3.79); UVA has faced the ACC's top three teams in ERA (Louisville, UNC, Clemson).
- Adam Haseley leads the ACC in batting (.410).
- Haseley has hits in 13 straight games, while Caleb Knight owns an eight-game streak.
- With 15 RBI in his last four games, Pavin Smith has moved into the top 10 in career RBI at UVA with 146.

OFFENSE FACES ANOTHER STIFF TEST THIS WEEKEND

- Virginia tops the ACC in batting in all games (.322) as well as ACC games (.296), despite facing the conference's top three teams in ERA in the first four weeks of ACC play (Louisville, North Carolina, Clemson).
- Pitt ranks fifth in the ACC in ERA.
- In ranking 11th nationally in scoring at 8.0 runs per game, UVA is fourth among all Division I teams in hits (346) and seventh in batting.

WHATEVER IT TAKES

- A key part of Virginia's scoring numbers has come from execution.
- UVA is tied for No. 1 nationally in sacrifice flies with 22 and 12th in sacrifice bunts with 29.
- UVA also has been hit by 38 pitches, which is fourth most in the conference and 26th nationally.

HOOS IN THE PROS

- Virginia had seven alumni on MLB Opening Day rosters, most among ACC schools and tied for fifth most nationally.
- Thursday was Opening Day in the minors. The three 2015 UVA draftees all have moved up: Matt Thaiss (high-A Island Empire 66ers), Connor Jones (high-A Palm Beach Cardinals) and Danny Pinero (class-A West Michigan Whitecaps).
- Joe McCarthy opens 2017 with the double-A Montgomery Biscuits, while Stephen Bruno moved up to the triple-A Iowa Cubs.

NOTING THE LOUISVILLE SERIES

- Virginia dropped two of three games to No. 2 Louisville last weekend.
- Ernie Clement, Charlie Cody, Nate Eikhoff and Pavin Smith each had four hits in the series.

- The Cavaliers' 11 runs in Game 2 was a season high for a UofL opponent.
- UVA was tied or held a lead in the eighth inning in each of the games.
- The Cavaliers struck out 10 times in three games.
- UVA limited Louisville to 11 runs and 20 hits in the series (UofL was averaging 8.3 runs and 11.1 hits per game).

CAVALIERS WRAPPING UP HOME STRETCH

- Virginia is currently in the midst of a stretch in which it plays 14 of 15 games at home at Davenport Field.
- UVA is playing its final of three straight ACC series at home, the first time the Cavaliers have hosted three straight home ACC series since the 2001 season.
- The Cavaliers are 16-4 at home this season.
- Virginia is 393-99 (.799) at Davenport Field since 2004.

AGGRESSIVE CAVALIERS PUT BALL IN PLAY

- Virginia batters have struck out an ACC-low 110 times in 31 games (3.5 strikeouts per game).
- That total by far the fewest among ACC teams (Louisville, 157), and more than half the total of seven teams.
- UVA is the only ACC team to walk more than it has struck out (124 BB).
- The Cavaliers have struck out five or fewer times in 27 of 31 games.
- Pavin Smith (1st), Ernie Clement (3rd) and Robbie Coman (6th) all rank among the top 10 nationally in toughest to strike out and are the three toughest in the ACC.

CAVALIERS PUSH THE RUNNING GAME

- Virginia is 48-for-55 in stolen-base attempts this year (second in ACC to Louisville, 49).
- UVA ranks 22nd nationally in stolen bases.
- Four Cavaliers already have six or more stolen bases. UVA's leader in 2016 was Ernie Clement with six.
- Jake McCarthy has an ACC-best 19 steals in 20 tries.
- McCarthy is second nationally in stolen bases to Campbell's Drew Butler (23).
- It marks the most steals for a UVA player since Phil Goselin had 24 in 2009.
- UVA stole 27 bases in 60 games last year, its fewest stolen bases during the Brian O'Connor era.

BIG INNINGS PLAGUE CAVALIERS

- Virginia has given up 13 innings of four or more runs this year, including eight in ACC play.
- In each of UVA's five ACC defeats, the Cavaliers have given up at least one inning of four-plus runs.
- UVA allowed 12 innings of four or more runs in 2016 and 16 in 2015.

HASELEY CONTINUES STRONG 2017

- Adam Haseley is off to a strong start to the 2017 campaign, putting up team highs in batting (.410), extra-base hits (17) and on base percentage (.507) while hitting in the 3-hole.
- Haseley owns nine home runs – seven of which have gone to the opposite field.
- He leads the ACC in batting, is second in total bases, OBP and slugging, third in hits and runs, sixth in home runs and seventh in walks.
- Haseley also is 4-1 with a 3.43 ERA in 42 innings on the mound.

WEBER GIVES LINEUP BOOST AT SECOND BASE

- Andy Weber has started each of the last 18 games and 21 of the last 22 at second base, allowing Ernie Clement to shift to shortstop.
- He has hits in 15 of the 21 starts, with 24 RBI (second on the team) in that 21-game span.
- Weber is second on the team with 27 RBI despite having 84 at-bats, which is seventh on the team.

AGGRESSIVE CAVALIERS PUT BALL IN PLAY

- Virginia batters have struck out an ACC-low 110 times in 31 games (3.5 strikeouts per game).
- That total by far the fewest among ACC teams (Louisville, 157).
- The Cavaliers have struck out five or fewer times in 27 of 31 games.
- Pavin Smith has a team-low three strikeouts despite owning 141 plate appearances and ranks second nationally in the toughest to strike out category (1 K/40 AB).

O'CONNOR REACHES 600 WINS

- Brian O'Connor won his 600th career game on Feb. 21 against VMI. He was the 10th coach in ACC history to reach the 600-win plateau and, in 825 games, was the second-fastest in league history to reach 600 wins (Mike Martin, 802 games).
- Now with 619 career wins, O'Connor ranks ninth in league history.
- The winningest coach in program history, O'Connor also holds the UVA record for career ACC wins (249) and NCAA tournament wins (47).

IN THE POLLS

- Virginia is ranked as high as No. 18 in the latest polls (USA Today Coaches poll).
- UVA is 2-4 against ranked teams this year.
- UVA has 12 games scheduled against teams currently ranked in the USA Today poll: Louisville (2), Clemson (4), North Carolina (5), Florida State (19).
- The Cavaliers do not play Wake Forest (22) in league play this year.

RECORDS WATCH

- Currently with 72 games and 10 saves, RHP Alec Bettinger needs one appearance and two saves to reach the top 10 in UVA history.
- Adam Haseley is ninth in program history with 10 triples and will move into a fifth-place tie with his next triple.
- Haseley also needs 11 runs to reach UVA's top 10.
- Pavin Smith (25 HR) is one long ball shy of the top 10 at UVA and with 146 RBI is tied for 10th with John Hicks (2009-11) in program history (needs eight for 9th).
- Ernie Clement (8 triples) is one triple shy of the top 10 at UVA.
- Jake McCarthy (19 SB) needs two more stolen bases to reach ninth in the single-season UVA annals.

- Three Cavaliers were named to various All-America teams in the preseason: Ernie Clement (2B), Adam Haseley (UTL) and Pavin Smith (1B).
- Haseley and Smith also were named to the 55-man Golden Spikes Award Watch List.

O'CONNOR RANKS THIRD IN ACTIVE WIN PCT., 18TH ALL-TIME

- Virginia head coach Brian O'Connor is 619-231-2 (.728) in his 14th season as UVA's head coach.
- O'Connor surpassed Dennis Womack (594 wins, 1981-2003) as the winningest coach in program history on May 28, 2016, against Louisville.
- O'Connor's 72.7 percent winning percentage entering the season ranked No. 3 among active Division I head coaches.
- O'Connor also ranks 18th all-time in career winning percentage among all coaches with at least 10 years of head coaching experience.
- Virginia won at least 38 games in each of O'Connor's first 13 seasons, including 10 40-win seasons and four 50-win campaigns.

LONGEVITY, STABILITY IN COACHING STAFF

- Virginia's coaching trio of Brian O'Connor, Kevin McMullan and Karl Kuhn are in their 14th year together.
- No current coaching staff in Division I college baseball has been together longer.
- The staff has combined for 619 wins, an average of over 45 wins per season, and has reached the NCAA tournament in each of their first 13 seasons.

UVA SECOND NATIONALLY IN ERA SINCE 2005

- Entering the season, Virginia owned the second best ERA among all NCAA Division I teams over the past 12 seasons with a 3.17 team ERA since 2005.
- UVA finished second nationally in ERA (2.23) in 2014 and has ranked among the NCAA top 20 in nine of the 13 years under the current coaching staff.
- Virginia led the nation in ERA in 2011 (2.24) and posted No. 3 marks in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009.

CAVALIERS AT HOME AT DAVENPORT

- This marks the 129th season of Virginia Baseball, including the 16th at Davenport Field, which opened in 2002.
- Virginia is 393-99 (.799) at Davenport Field since 2004 under Brian O'Connor.
- UVA averaged 3,675 fans per game last year, including a program-record 3,638 per game for the regular season.
- The Cavaliers passed the 100,000 mark in attendance for the sixth time in seven years this season (120,082 total).

DEFENSE TOPS ACC UNDER CURRENT STAFF

- Virginia has posted the ACC's best fielding percentage since the current coaching staff arrived in 2004.
- UVA has accrued a .973 fielding percentage over the last 13 seasons.
- UVA owns a .973 fielding percentage this year (fifth in ACC).

CAVALIERS TOP ACC IN BATTING SINCE 2009

- Virginia owns the ACC's top offense over the past eight years with a combined .303 average and is tops this year (.322).
- The Cavaliers led the conference in batting in 2009, 2010 and 2013 and were second in 2011, 2012 and 2014.
- UVA was third in the ACC in batting last year at .304.

CHANGES COMING AT DAVENPORT

- Davenport Field is scheduled to undergo a \$12-18 million expansion following the 2017 season, with renovations slated to be complete in time for the start of the 2018 campaign.
