Jackets And Cavs Set For Coastal Showdown

• Fresh off its largest margin of victory ever in an ACC game, Georgia Tech hits the road for the final time in conference play Saturday at Virginia at 12:30 p.m.
• The game can be seen on the ACC Network with Tim Brant, Dave Archer and Rachel Baribeau.
• On the radio, "Voice of the Yellow Jackets" Brandon Gaudin has the call on the Georgia Tech IMG Sports Network along with analyst Rick Strom and sideline reporter Randy Waters. The game can be heard on WYAY 106.7 FM in Atlanta and on the web at RamblinWreck.com.

Quick Hitters

• After two straight road games, the Yellow Jackets snapped a three-game skid last Saturday at Bobby Dodd Stadium with a 56-0 rout of Syracuse in the Orange's first-ever visit to Georgia Tech.
• Tech dominated in all phases in the 'Cuse win, out-gaining the Orange 482-208 in total yards, 394-75 on the ground, winning the turnover battle and playing its first-penalty free game since 1968.
• The Yellow Jackets have shut out two opponents in a season for the first time since 1985 -- that year current defensive coordinator Ted Roof was a Tech captain.
• In the last 50 seasons, Georgia Tech has scored 56 or more points 12 times, including eight times in the Paul Johnson era.
• Since 2005, Georgia Tech and Clemson have identical cumulative records of 45-24 in ACC play. Only Virginia Tech has won more conference games over that span.
• Georgia Tech ranks seventh nationally in third-down percentage (.540). Meanwhile, Virginia leads the nation in third-down defense (.266).
• The Yellow Jackets are back in the top five nationally in rushing offense, averaging 304.4 yards per game.
• Both Georgia Tech and Virginia rank in the top five nationally in time of possession. The Yellow Jackets rank second (35:28), while the Cavaliers are fifth (33:52).
• Georgia Tech is averaging more yards of total offense per game (430.0) than the 2009 Yellow Jacket team that played in a BCS bowl game (422.1). Three of the six highest total offense averages in Tech history have come in the last three seasons.
• The all-time series between the Yellow Jackets and the Cavaliers stands at 17-17-1 and is the most closely-contested current series among current ACC opponents.
• Tech's three losses this season are to teams that are a combined 17-3, with two of those teams currently ranked in the top 20 -- Miami (No. 6/7) and Virginia Tech (No. 16/19) -- and BYU receiving votes.
• Tech's defense has allowed just five running plays of 20 yards or more.
• Head coach Paul Johnson picked up his 150th career win on Sept. 21 versus UNC. Johnson is now 151-68 in 17 years as a head coach and only eight active FBS coaches own more career wins.
• The Yellow Jackets have rushed for more yards than any FBS team since 2008, and in 2012, Tech surpassed the 20,000-yard rushing mark for the five-year period under head coach Paul Johnson.
• Georgia Tech is celebrating the 100th anniversary of Historic Grant Field in 2013. It is the most tenured stadium in the FBS and listed by ESPN.com as a bucket-list item for college fans.

The Virginia Series

- The all-time series record is tied, 17-17-1 and the two teams have split the last six meetings.
- Georgia Tech has won three of the last four meetings, including a 56-20 win in Atlanta last season.
- Virginia has a 10-3-1 series advantage in Charlottesville, including a 24-21 win in 2011, which knocked Georgia Tech from the ranks of the unbeaten.
- Since 1992, Georgia Tech is just 1-9 in Charlottesville, with the only win coming in 2009.
- Tech holds a 14-7 series advantage in Atlanta.
- The two teams have met every season since 1982.
- One of Tech's greatest victories was a 41-38 win over Virginia in Charlottesville in 1990 when the Cavaliers were ranked No. 1 nationally. The Jackets went on to win a share of the national championship.
- The two teams first met on the gridiron in 1965. Georgia Tech won the first six meetings.
- Georgia Tech head coach Paul Johnson is 3-2 all-time vs. Virginia.
- Virginia coach Mike London is 1-2 against Georgia Tech.
- The Yellow Jackets are 35-26-1 all-time against teams from the Commonwealth of Virginia.

Tech-Virginia Player Connections

- Georgia Tech has just one player on its roster from the Commonwealth of Virginia -- Tim Seager (Blacksburg).
- Virginia has six players on its roster from Georgia -- C.J. Moore (Burlington), Greyson Lambert (Jesup), Miles Gooch (Decatur), D.J. Hill (Covington), George Adeosun (Alpharetta), Eric Smith (Decatur).
- Yellow Jacket LB Nick Menocal and Cavalier DB Pablo Alvarez were teammates at Belen Jesuit Prep in Florida.
- Tech's Louis Young and Roderick Rook-Chungong, and UVA's Andre Levrone, Brendan Marshall, Kirk Garner, Vincent Croce and E.J. Scott, all previously attended Good Counsel HS.
- Yellow Jacket DB Dominique Noble and Cavalier RB Kevin Parks both graduated from West Rowan (N.C.) High School.
- Georgia Tech's Kyle Stallard and UVA's George Adeosun both graduated from Alpharetta (Ga.) HS.

Tech-Virginia Staff Connections

- Georgia Tech offensive line coach Mike Sewak is a 1981 Virginia graduate and played three seasons for the Cavaliers. Sewak was a teammate of Virginia defensive coordinator Jon Tenuta, who graduated from UVA in 1982.
- Tenuta was Georgia Tech's defensive coordinator from 2002-07, and he was the Yellow Jackets' interim head coach when they lost to Fresno State in the '07 Humanitarian Bowl. Georgia Tech assistant coach Bryan Cook was a graduate assistant at Tech from 2001-03 while Tenuta was on the Flats.
- Virginia associate head coach Tom O'Brien went 1-1 against Georgia Tech as the head coach at NC State from 2007-12. Georgia Tech assistant coach Andy McCollum coached under O'Brien at NC State from 2007-09.
- O'Brien also went 1-1 against Tech while serving as the head coach at Boston College from 1997-06.
- Virginia assistant coach Larry Lewis was at Washington State for 10 years, and for four of those years (1994-97), Georgia Tech assistant coach Al "Buzz" Preston was also on the Cougars staff.
- Cavaliers LB coach Vincent Brown is an Atlanta native.
- Todd McCarthy (Tech director of video operations) was director of sports video at Richmond from 1995-96 at the same time Virginia coach Mike London was an assistant coach for the Spiders.
- Georgia Tech assistant sports information director Mike DeGeorge previously worked at Richmond (2007-11) where he worked closely with London and the Spider football program.

Squeezing Notes From the Orange Win

- Tech's margin of victory (56) was its largest ever in an ACC game and ranks as the eighth-largest by all teams in ACC conference games.
- Tech had more than 400 yards of total offense for the sixth time in seven games (only Virginia Tech held GT to less than 400).
- Tech rushed for more than 300 yards for the fifth time this season.
- Tech's seven rushing touchdowns tie for the 2nd-most in modern Georgia Tech history, second only to rushing for nine TDs vs. Samford in 2007 (Tech also rushed for seven TDs last season vs. North Carolina and Virginia).
- Tech won the time of possession battle for the sixth straight game.
- Synjyn Days became the 13th different Yellow Jacket to score a touchdown this season.
- Tech recorded its fourth-most points ever in an ACC game.

QB Inexperience

- Tech and Virginia were two of 10 FBS schools that entered the 2013 season with zero careers starts among quarterbacks on their rosters, joining Baylor, Cal, Central Michigan, Florida State, Iowa, Louisiana Tech, Syracuse and Texas Tech.
- In fact, Virginia was one of just four schools that had zero games played by quarterbacks in the previous season (Cal, FAU, Iowa).

Injuries Have Bugged The Jackets

Injuries prior to the start of the season and during the season have taken a toll on Georgia Tech's depth chart:

- Safety** – Isaiah Johnson, Jamal Golden and Fred Holton were at or near the top of the depth chart during the preseason. Johnson opted to redshirt because he was not totally comfortable with his injured knee. Golden had shoulder surgery. Holton left school.
- Offensive line** – A preseason injury to r-Fr. C Freddie Burden, coupled with the unexpected departure of Catlin Alford, cut into Tech's depth even before the season started. Ray Beno missed most of the Miami game and has not played since because of a foot injury.
- Wide receiver** – Sophomore Anthony Autry, who played significant snaps as a true freshman last season, re-injured his knee prior to the start of the season.
- Special teams** – Golden's injury was also significant in Tech's return game. Golden was the only player in the nation last season to rank in the top 10 nationally in kick returns and punt returns.

Tech Notebook

- Tech began the season 3-0, marking the second 3-0 start in the last three years, but just the third in the last 12 years. Tech started 2-0 in the ACC for the second time under Paul Johnson (2011), but just the third time in the last 15 years.
- Tech is one of only 16 teams in the FBS that have a winning record at this point this year, after having a losing record at this point last year (3-4 to 4-3).
- The Jackets have defeated Elon 70-0 and Syracuse 56-0 this season to move Paul Johnson to 19-0 at Tech when surpassing the 40-point plateau, and mark Tech's first shutouts since 2008.
- Tech's 38-14 win at Duke was the Jackets' 10th consecutive win in the series.
- Overcoming two different 13-point deficits, Tech defeated North Carolina, 28-20 -- its fifth straight win over the Tar Heels.
- Tech scored 136 points through its first three games in 2013 -- the second-most through three games over the program's last 50 seasons.
- In the 17-10 setback to Virginia Tech, the Yellow Jackets had two fourth-quarter possessions with a chance to tie the game.
- Tech led Miami 17-0 in the first quarter, and was within one (24-23) in the fourth quarter before three straight Hurricane touchdowns.

Running For Miles

- Since Paul Johnson arrived on Georgia Tech's campus prior to the 2008 season -- Tech has rushed for more yards than any FBS team in the nation.
- The Jackets have surpassed 22,000 yards rushing since 2008 and are the only team averaging more than 300 yards on the ground in that span.
- Since 2008, Tech's 22,493 yards equated to 12.8 miles (roughly the distance from Tech's campus to Hartsfield-Jackson International Airport).

Block Party

- Georgia Tech is the only team in the nation that has blocked three punts this season, and all three have been by redshirt sophomore Chris Milton, making him the nation's individual leader in blocked punts.
- Virginia has blocked two punts this season.
- The only team in the nation that has blocked more total kicks in 2013 is Minnesota, with four.

Efficient Offense

- Georgia Tech has reached the end zone on 42 percent of its drives this season (34 of 81), the eighth-highest percentage in the FBS of turning drives in touchdowns.
- Tech is also ranked ninth nationally in fewest offensive three-and-outs, averaging just 2.4 per game.
- Baylor is the national leader in both categories, scoring touchdowns on 58 percent of its drives and averaging less than one three-and-out per game (0.67).

Rarely Blanked

- Georgia Tech enters the Virginia game having played 205 consecutive games without being shut out. That's the ninth-longest active streak nationally. The last time the Yellow Jackets were blanked came on Oct. 18, 1997, a 38-0 loss at third-ranked Florida State.
- Tech's 205-game stretch is the second-longest streak in ACC history.
- Perhaps more impressive, Georgia Tech has not been shut out at home since Nov. 30, 1957, a 7-0 loss to Georgia. That's a streak of 350 consecutive games at Bobby Dodd Stadium without being held scoreless.
- The Jackets have had just two scoreless halves over the last four years combined -- vs. Miami in 2011 (2nd half) and vs. Air Force in 2010 (2nd half).

- One myth of Paul Johnson's spread option offense is that it can be shut down when teams have more than one week to prep for it.
- The Jackets helped bust that myth by rolling up wins and rushing yards last season over Duke, North Carolina and USC, and this season over Elon and UNC.
- Tech is 5-0 against its last five opponents that had more than a week of prep.
- Clemson has a bye week to prepare for its Thursday night tilt versus the Jackets on Nov. 14 at Clemson.

Thunder From Down Under

- Sophomore nose tackle Adam Gotsis had one of the best games of his young career at BYU. Gotsis, an Australian native, had career highs with 4.0 tackles for loss and 2.0 sacks against the Cougars.
- Gotsis' four tackles for loss were the most by a Yellow Jacket since Derrick Morgan had 4.0 against Clemson in 2009.
- His 4.0 tackles for loss were the most by a Tech player in a road game since 2005.
- Gotsis is just the third player in the Paul Johnson era to register 4.0 tackles for loss in a game. The other two -- Morgan and Michael Johnson -- are in the NFL.

Flipping The Field

- Georgia Tech recorded a pair of interceptions in the Miami game, and for the season five different players have the team's eight interceptions.
- The Yellow Jackets' have amassed 236 yards of interception returns, averaging 29.5 yards per return, and is fifth in the FBS in interception return yardage.
- The Georgia Tech record for interception return yards in a season is 437.
- Tech tied a school record by returning two interceptions for touchdowns in the Elon win, and in that game, set a school record with 173 INT return yards on three picks.
- Last season, Tech totaled 16 interceptions from 10 different players, with Jemea Thomas and Jamal Gold- en leading the team with four and three, respectively.
- Quayshawn Nealy and Louis Young had interceptions in the Syracuse win. It was the sixth career interception for Nealy -- a junior linebacker -- to move him within one of Jemea Thomas (seven) as the team's active career leader.

• Making the move from linebacker to defensive end this past off-season has not hindered the hype for senior Jeremiah Attaochu. One of the ACC's top pass-rushers over the last two seasons, Attaochu is 10.5 sacks shy of breaking Georgia Tech's career record.

• Attaochu is on the preseason watch lists for the four major defensive awards that defensive linemen qualify for -- the Bednarik, the Hendricks, the Lombardi and the Nagurski. He is one of only eight players nationally to appear on all four awards, joined by Morgan Breslin (USC), Jadeveon Clowney (South Carolina), Scott Crichton (Oregon State), Devonte Field (TCU), Jackson Jeffcoat (Texas), Chris Smith (Arkansas) and Stephon Tuitt (Notre Dame).

• He is coming off a career-best 10.0-sack campaign that led to honorable mention All-ACC accolades in 2012. He is a preseason first-team All-ACC pick this year by Phil Steele.

Lee Steps In To Starting Role

Sophomore QB Vad Lee was instrumental in Tech's 3-0 start:

• Versus Elon, Lee completed 7-of-11 passes for 189 yards and two touchdowns, and he rushed six times for 49 yards and a touchdown. Tech scored a touchdown on every drive Lee was under center.

• Lee's performance in the Duke win helped lock up his first career ACC weekly award as he was named the league's offensive back of the week. In his return to his hometown, Lee was responsible for all five touchdowns and he rolled up 201 yards of total offense.

• The sophomore passed for four touchdowns -- the most by a Yellow Jacket since Reggie Ball vs. NC State in 2006 -- and rushed for another. He rushed 22 times for 76 yards and completed 8-of-16 passes for 125 yards with one interception, helping the Yellow Jackets accumulate 469 yards of total offense.

• Said ESPN analyst and former NFL QB and first-round draft pick Kelly Stouffer: "Vad Lee's going to be a selling point for receivers now for the way he throws the ball. Receivers are going to want to play with him."

Vad Lee Climbing Career Charts

Although just a sophomore with 19 games (seven starts) under his belt, QB Vad Lee is steadily climbing the Georgia Tech career charts.

• Lee is ranked fifth all-time at Tech in career rushing touchdowns by a quarterback (15).

• He is ranked sixth in rushing yards by a Tech QB (898), and enters the Virginia game needing 24 yards to enter Tech's top five (Danny Myers, 1973-75, has 921 yards).

Backfield Leader

Senior B-back David Sims has put together back-to-back strong seasons and is on pace to finish his career with over 2,000 yards rushing. The St. Matthews, S.C., native rushed for 612 yards and four touchdowns last season, battling through a nagging injury.

• He is one of only two running backs nationally with no negative rushes this season (min. 60 attempts).

• In fact, Sims has gone 137 consecutive carries without a negative rush, dating to last November vs. Duke.

• Dating back to last season, Sims has reached the end zone at least once in eight of the last 12 games.

• He gained a team-high 104 all-purpose yards in the Elon win (49 rushing, 59 receiving) and scored both a rushing and receiving touchdown.

• He had arguably his best career game in the UNC win as he matched his career high of 99 yards rushing (also set versus USC in the 2012 Sun Bowl) and a pair of touchdowns.

• At Miami, Sims gained a team-best 77 yards on 16 carries and reached the end zone twice.

• Sims spent his summer as an assistant in Tech's Sports Information office.

Sims Career Milestone Watch

• David Sims (1,777 career rushing yards) ranks 17th in Tech history. He is 63 yards shy of overtaking former A-back Orwin Smith (2009-12) in 15th place.

• For his career, Sims averages 4.92 yards per carry, which ranks 14th in Tech history.

• His 18 career rushing touchdowns are tied for 15th in Tech history.

• Sims has 21 career touchdowns overall (including three TDs via receiving), which ranks tied for 16th in Tech history. Interestingly, the former player he is tied with is also named David Sims, who played at Tech from 1974-76.

Experienced O-Line Paves The Way

• Although an underclassman is under center for the Yellow Jackets, Vad Lee's protectors are a veteran bunch as Tech's offensive line boasts three red-shirt seniors (C Jay Finch, LT Will Jackson, LG Ray Beno), a junior (RG Shaquille Mason) and a sophomore (RT Bryan Chamberlain).

• Redshirt sophomore Trey Braun has started the last two games in place of the injured Ray Beno (foot).

• The crew has helped paved the way for Tech's impressive rushing offense, which is ranked fifth nationally at 304.4 ypg.

• Mason was named the ACC's O-Lineman of the Week twice (Sept. 16 and 23), and got high praise from ESPN's Brian Griese during the UNC game: "He's awesome to watch on film. He cleans guys up all over the field. You'll see Mason get down and block safeties and corners -- he's very agile and effective on that level."

Ironman iPod

• Senior CB Jemea Thomas, nicknamed "iPod" by his teammates, has played a team-leading 48 games in his college career. Thomas is six games shy of tying the school record of games, and would achieve it should he play the remaining six games and a possible bowl game.

• Thomas is Tech's most skilled and versatile DB (he leads the team with seven career interceptions) -- can play any position in the secondary and can return punts.

• After starting the first five games this season at corner, Thomas moved to safety for the BYU game -- a position he started the final nine games of last season.

• Said defensive coordinator Ted Roof of Thomas: "He's one of the best corners I've ever coached. When he finishes, he finishes with a purpose."

• Thomas had a team-high seven tackles in the 56-0 win over Syracuse and his strip sack of QB Terrel Hunt was a key play in the second quarter that gave Tech the ball and a short field.

Closing In On 700th Win

• Georgia Tech enters Saturday's game with an all-time record of 698-471-43 (.594) in 121 seasons of football on the Flats.

Captains Named

Permanent senior captains for the 2013 season were selected prior to the Miami game -- they are DE Jeremiah Attaochu, CB Jemea Thomas and BB David Sims.

Tech Adds To Strong Bowl Tradition

• With its 16th consecutive bowl appearance in 2012, Georgia Tech is tied for the fourth-longest active streak. The Jackets trail only Florida State (31), Florida (22) and Virginia Tech (20).

• The last time the Yellow Jackets failed to make a bowl game was 1996, when most members of this year's freshmen class were one-year old.

• Tech made its 41st bowl appearance overall this past season, tying for the 12th-most nationally.

• With a record of 23-18, Tech has the ninth-highest bowl winning percentage nationally and the 10th-most bowl wins.

• Georgia Tech was the first school to win each of the four traditional major bowls -- the Rose, Orange, Sugar and Cotton. It completed that feat in 1955.

• Following the 2009 season, Tech played in a BCS bowl game -- the Orange Bowl -- against Iowa.

• Tech's first bowl game was the 1929 Rose Bowl -- the famous "Wrong Way Riegels" game against Cal.

Paul Johnson: Impressive Numbers

- Johnson was the first coach in ACC history to be named Coach of the Year in each of his first two seasons.
- Only four coaches in ACC history won more games in their first four seasons than Johnson.
- Johnson is 6-2 at home against top 25 opponents.
- Johnson has at least eight wins in 13 of his 16 seasons as a head coach.
- Since head coach Johnson arrived at Georgia Tech, his Yellow Jacket teams have averaged 8.2 wins per season – the most of any Tech head coach. In second is Bobby Dodd, whose teams averaged 7.5 wins per year over 22 seasons.
- In 15 of the Jackets' 43 wins under Johnson, Tech trailed by seven points or more.
- A Yellow Jacket has earned Academic All-ACC honors 16 times in Paul Johnson's five seasons at Georgia Tech, and Tech's APR score has improved in each season under Johnson.
- Tech has scored 17 non-offensive touchdowns in Paul Johnson's five seasons as head coach (including two this season).
- Only four teams in Georgia Tech history rushed for 300 yards per game. Three of those teams have been under Johnson.
- In six seasons at Tech, Paul Johnson is 12-5 in games decided by five points or less. Since '04, when Johnson was at Navy, his teams are 25-11 in games decided by five points or less.

Johnson Exceeds Expectations

- No other team in the ACC has exceeded expectations like Georgia Tech, since Paul Johnson's arrival on the Flats in 2008.
- In the five seasons under Johnson, the Yellow Jackets' average pre-season predicted finish in the Coastal Division has been third place (3.0), with Tech's average actual finish checking in at 1.6 (a difference of +1.4).
- The Jackets were pegged fourth in the Coastal Division in this season's preseason media poll, behind Miami, Virginia Tech and North Carolina -- Tech plays those three games in succession between Sept. 21 and Oct. 5.
