FOR OPENERS

- Virginia (13-0) is off to its best start since the 1980-81 season when that team led by legendary center Ralph Sampson started 23-0.
- The Cavaliers have scored 80 or more points in back-to-back games for the first time under Tony Bennett.
- UVA owns the nation's eighth-longest current home winning streak at 18 games and can tie a John Paul Jones Arena record of 19 straight wins (2012-13) with a win over NC State.
- UVA ranks second in the nation in scoring defense at 50.8 points per game.

SERIES HISTORY

- Virginia is 60-82 all-time vs. NC State in the series that dates back to 1912-13.
- The Cavaliers are 6-0 in their last six regular season games against NC State and 7-3 in their last 10 overall.
- UVA went 1-0 against NC State last season, winning 76-45 in Raleigh last season.
- The 31-point margin of victory was the second-highest on the road under Tony Bennett (32 at Georgia Tech, Jan. 19, 2012).
- Virginia has a five-game winning streak against the Wolfpack in Charlottesville.

UVA RANKED IN TOP 10 FOR 10 STRAIGHT WEEKS

- UVA is ranked No. 3 in the latest Associated Press and USA Today coaches polls for the second straight week.
- The Cavaliers have been ranked in the top 10 for the first nine weeks of the season for the first time since 1982-83.
- The No. 9 AP preseason ranking was UVA's best since a No. 1 ranking to start the 1982-83 season.

LAST TIME OUT

- London Perrantes had a career-high 26 points and eight assists to send Virginia to a thrilling 89-80 double-overtime win at Miami on Saturday, Jan. 3.
- Justin Anderson added 16 points, including the game-tying 3-pointer at the end of the first overtime, as UVA improved to 7-0 in its last seven ACC openers.

- Mike Tobey added 14 points and Marial Shayok added nine points.
- Darion Atkins continued his strong play off the bench with a career-high 12 rebounds, but UVA was outrebounded (43-39) for the first time this season.
- The Cavaliers led 38-20 at the half, but Miami stormed back behind Angel Rodriguez who finished with a team-high 25 points and seven assists.

LAST TIME VS. NC STATE

- The Cavaliers defeated NC State 76-45, marking their largest margin of victory (31 points) against the Wolfpack in Raleigh in series history.
- Mike Tobey and Joe Harris led UVA with 16 points each, while Malcolm Brogdon added 13 points and Akil Mitchell had a game-high 12 rebounds.
- London Perrantes added a game-high five assists and no turnovers.
- Virginia limited the nation's fifth-leading scorer T.J. Warren (23.4 ppg) to just four points.
- The Cavaliers shot 83.3 percent (15-of-18) from the charity stripe.
- UVA held NC State to 28.9 percent (13-of-45) from the floor and outrebounded the Wolfpack, 40-28.

THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME

- UVA is 115-35 (.767) in nine seasons, including a 7-0 mark in 2014-15, at John Paul Jones Arena.
- UVA owns the nation's eighth-longest home winning streak at 18 games and 17 of the 18 victories have been by double digits.
- UVA is 77-19 (.802) at home under head coach Tony Bennett.
- Virginia has sold out home contests vs. Harvard, Davidson, Duke (1/31), Louisville (2/7), Wake Forest (2/14), Florida State (2/22) and Virginia Tech (2/28) this season.
- UVA has won a school-best 18 consecutive ACC home games.
- Virginia's 18-game ACC home winning streak is tied with Duke for the longest current streak in the league.
- Virginia went 20-2 at JPJ in 2012-13, setting a school record for home wins in a season.
- UVA's 19-game home winning streak in 2012-13 marked a JPJ record.

• Virginia is 476-589 all-time against current ACC members (10-7 vs. Boston College, 70-52 vs. Clemson, 86-53 vs. Virginia Tech, 50-116 vs. Duke, 20-22 vs. Florida State, 37-39 vs. Georgia Tech, 5-3 vs. Louisville, 7-10 vs. Miami, 51-128 vs. UNC, 60-82 vs. NC State, 7-1 vs. Notre Dame, 9-3 vs. Pittsburgh, 3-3 vs. Syracuse and 61-70 vs. Wake Forest).

VIRGINIA HEAD COACH TONY BENNETT

- Sixth-year head coach Tony Bennett sports a 119-60 mark at Virginia and 188-93 mark in nine seasons overall.
- Bennett was named 2014 ACC Coach of the Year after guiding the Cavaliers to their first ACC Tournament championship since 1976.
- In 2013-14, he guided UVa to its first ACC regular season and tournament championship in the same season for the first time in school history.
- Bennett has guided the Cavaliers to three consecutive postseason tournaments (NCAA in 2012 and 2014 and NIT in 2013).
- Bennett has increased UVa's win total in each of the last five seasons (15 in 2009-10, 16 in 2010-11, 22 in 2011-12, 23 in 2013-13 and 30 in 2013-14).
- Bennett-coached teams are 66-3 when holding opponents to fewer than 50 points during his nine-year coaching career.
- Bennett-coached teams have finished in the top five nationally in scoring defense in five of eight seasons (first in 2008-09 and 2013-14, second in 2007-08 and 2011-12, and fifth in 2012-13).
- Bennett is one of 24 Division I head coaches who played in the NBA.

EMBRACE THE PACE

- Virginia is averaging 72 points and allowing 50.8 points (second in the nation), marking its best averages under head coach Tony Bennett.
- UVa has shot 48.9 percent from the field (20th nationally) and 39.7 percent from 3-point range, while limiting its opponents to 33.3 percent from the field (2nd nationally) and 29.5 percent from 3-point range.
- As of Jan. 5, the Cavaliers rank in the top five nationally in 11 defensive categories: rebounds per game (1st), field goal percentage (2nd), points per game (2nd), true shooting percentage (3rd), defensive rebounds per game (4th), effective shooting percentage (4th), points per possession (4th), assists per game (5th), rebound percentage (5th) and turnovers per game (5th).
- As of Jan. 5, the Cavaliers rank in the top 10 nationally in five offensive categories: rebound percentage (5th), defensive rebound percentage (7th), defensive rebounds per game (8th) and points per possession (9th).
- The Cavaliers have held 37 straight opponents and 38 straight ACC opponents under 50 percent shooting from the field.
- UVa has limited its opponents to 24 fast break points.

THE DEFENSE NEVER RESTS

- The Cavaliers have held their opponents scoreless for five or more minutes 11 times this season.
- Virginia held Tennessee State scoreless for 10:23 and Cleveland State scoreless for 10:03 during the non-conference season.
- Virginia has also limited its opponents without a field goal for eight or more minutes seven times, highlighted by Harvard for 19:53 on Dec. 21.

NON-CONFERENCE RECAP

- Virginia recorded its fourth undefeated non-conference regular season since joining the ACC in 1953-54 (1978, 1982 and 2001).
- The Cavaliers captured the Barclays Center Classic with wins over Rutgers, La Salle, Tennessee State and Norfolk State.
- Virginia posted road wins at then-No. 21 Maryland and VCU.
- The Cavaliers won 11 of their 12 non-conference games by 11 or more points.
- Virginia outrebounded each of its 12 opponents and limited each of its 12 foes to less than 50 percent field goal shooting.
- Virginia held five opponents to 42 points or less (George Washington, Norfolk State, Tennessee State, Harvard and Rutgers).
- The Cavaliers limited Harvard and Rutgers to 27 points and 26 points, respectively, marking the first and second fewest points allowed by the Cavaliers in the shot clock era.
- Virginia is the first NCAA Division I team to hold two Division I opponents under 30 points (Rutgers and Harvard) in a season since Bucknell in 2004.
- The Cavaliers limited Rutgers to eight points in the second half and Harvard to eight points in the first half.
- UVa set a school and ACC record by limiting Harvard to just 16 percent (8-50) field goal shooting.
- Harvard's one first-half field goal tied the NCAA record for fewest made field goals in a half in the shot clock era (Savannah State, one second-half field goal at Kansas State on Jan. 7, 2008).

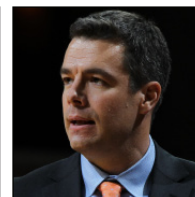

BROGDON LEADS CAVALIERS INTO ACTION

- Preseason All-ACC performer Malcolm Brogdon leads UVa into action this season.
- Brogdon ranks second on the team at 12.9 points per game and had a season-high 20 points against La Salle and added 18 at Maryland.
- He ranks third in the ACC in free throw percentage (82.5%) and 24th in scoring.
- Brogdon has 10 or more points in nine games.
- In 2013-14, Brogdon averaged a career-high 12.7 points and 5.4 rebounds en route to All-ACC honors.
- Brogdon scored a career-best 23 points in the 2014 ACC Tournament final win against Duke.

SIXTH MAN NO MORE

- 2014 ACC Sixth Man of the Year Justin Anderson has started and led the team in scoring in nine games this season.
- He was named the USBWA's Oscar Robertson National Player of the Week and ACC Co-Player of the Week on Dec. 9 after averaging 18.5 points and seven rebounds in wins at Maryland and VCU.
- Anderson tallied a season-high 21 points at VCU and had 20 against Tennessee State.
- He is averaging career highs in points (15.1), rebounds (4.5), field goal percentage (55.8%) and 3-point percentage (58.8%).
- He ranks first in the ACC in 3-point percentage, sixth in 3-pointers per game (2.31), ninth in field goal percentage and 10th in scoring.
- Anderson tied a career high with five 3-pointers on 5-5 shooting from distance against Tennessee State.
- Anderson was named 2014 ACC Sixth Man of the Year after averaging 7.8 points and 3.2 rebounds off the bench.
- In 2013-14, Anderson led the team in scoring in five games and had several game-changing defensive plays to ignite UVa.

HIGH POINT MAN IN THE PAINT

- Anthony Gill, a High Point, N.C., native, is averaging career highs in points (12.6) and rebounds (7.1) this season.
- He recorded career highs in points (25) and rebounds (13) against Davidson for his second career double-double.
- Gill tallied his first career double-double with 16 points and 10 rebounds en route to MVP honors at the Barclays Center Classic.
- Gill hit doubles figures in six straight games from Nov. 25-Dec. 18, averaging 14.5 points during that span.
- Gill leads the team in field goal percentage (59.6%) and has improved his free-throw shooting to 68.7 percent.

LONDON CALLING

- Sophomore point guard London Perrantes ranks third in the ACC in assist-to-turnover ratio (3.0) and sixth in assists (4.5 apg).
- He set career highs in points (26) and 3-pointers (5) at Miami.
- Perrantes is averaging 5.0 points, 1.7 rebounds and 4.5 assists in 12 games overall.
- Perrantes averaged 5.5 points and 3.8 assists and ranked sixth nationally in assist-to-turnover ratio (3.5) to earn All-ACC Freshman Team honors last season.

PAINT IT ORANGE AND BLUE

- Virginia is averaging 33.4 points in the paint, while limiting its opponents to 18.8 points per game in the paint.
- Frontcourt players Anthony Gill, Mike Tobey and Darion Atkins have combined to shoot 57.1 percent (141-247) from the field and are averaging 20.4 rebounds as a unit.
- UVa has outrebounded its opponent in 12 of 13 games, and has a +13.0 rebounding margin.
- Gill, Tobey, Atkins and Isaiah Wilkins have combined for 43 blocked shots.

- Redshirt freshman Devon Hall and true freshmen Isaiah Wilkins and Marial Shayok have made solid contributions in 2014-15.
- Shayok had nine points, five rebounds and four assists at Maryland, and nine points in a season-high 31 minutes at Miami.
- Hall had five points and five steals in a starting role in place of London Perrantes at James Madison.
- Wilkins chipped in eight points, five rebounds, three assists, two steals and two blocks at James Madison.
- Freshman B.J. Stith has seen limited action in eight games, scoring a season-high four points against Tennessee State.
- Wilkins averaged 18.2 points, 10.3 rebounds and 3.4 blocks en route to Georgia Gatorade Player of the Year honors for Greater Atlanta Christian last season, while Shayok averaged 15 points and 6 rebounds per game for Blair Academy.

ANDERSON NAMED USBWA NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Justin Anderson earned USBWA's Oscar Robertson National Player of the Week honors on Dec. 8.
- Anderson averaged 18.5 points and seven rebounds as Virginia posted road wins at then-No. 21 Maryland (76-65) and VCU (74-57).
- He tallied 16 points and six rebounds in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge win at Maryland on Dec. 3.
- Anderson added a season-high 21 points and eight rebounds in the 17-point win at VCU on Dec. 6.
- In the two wins, Anderson shot 68.8 percent (11-16) from the field and 84.6 percent (11-13) from the free-throw line.
- Anderson shared ACC Player of the Week honors with Notre Dame's Jerian Grant.

BARCLAYS CENTER CLASSIC RECAP

- The Cavaliers' Barclays Center title on Nov. 29 marked their third tournament championship in the Tony Bennett era (2014 ACC Tournament and Corpus Christi Challenge).

You must have a press pass to be admitted to the media area and the press room.

PHOTO CREDENTIALS

All photographers and camera operators must wear a visible credential issued by the Virginia athletics media relations office. Photographers work from the baselines at both ends of the court at John Paul Jones Arena. Live television is given top priority for courtside space.

PRESS PARKING

Press parking passes are provided upon request on a limited basis. If you need a parking pass, please be sure to inform the UVA athletics media relations office when making your press or photo credential request.

INTERVIEWS

All requests for interviews with Virginia basketball coaches and players should be made through Erich Bacher in the athletics media relations office. It is requested you allow the athletics media relations staff at least one day to arrange an interview.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Virginia head coach Tony Bennett and the visiting head coach will meet with media representatives in the press room after each game at John Paul Jones Arena. Coach Bennett will be available in the press room approximately 10 minutes after the conclusion of the game and the visiting coach will be in the press room approximately 20 minutes after the game. Virginia players will be available in the team meeting room adjacent to the men's basketball locker room after Coach Bennett is done with his postgame press conference.

RADIO

Each visiting school is allowed one free radio broadcast from John Paul Jones Arena. The Virginia athletics media relations office provides two ISDN lines and three business touchtone lines for use by the visiting broadcast crew. Radio network crews work from a courtside location at the scorer's table. Three seats are available at the table and one seat behind the visitor's broadcast location.

GAME SERVICES

Information packets are available before each game at John Paul Jones Arena, and a full statistical summary and play-by-play sheets are distributed at halftime and after the game. Quotes from both coaches and two or three players from each team will be available at the conclusion of the game. A pregame meal is served for working members of the media in the press room on the event level of John Paul Jones Arena.
