# Unbeaten NC State Hosts No. 1-Ranked Florida State Syracuse Hosts No. 8 Notre Dame at MetLife Stadium in the Meadowlands Miami Hosts Duke, Wake Forest Travels to Louisville, Clemson Hosts UNC in ACC Tests

Week Five of the Road to Charlotte for the 10th I Annual Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game features four games matching conference opponents, headlined by No. 1-ranked Florida State heading to the site of its last loss to an ACC team...The Seminoles. coming off a dramatic, 23-17 overtime win against Clemson, have won 16 straight games against ACC foes and 19 straight games against all opponents...Coached by **Jimbo Fisher** and led by **WR Rashad Greene**. FSU travels to Carter-Finley Stadium in Raleigh, N.C., for a Saturday game (3:30 p.m., ABC/ESPN2) against the unbeaten Wolfpack of coach Dave **Doeren...**The 2012 Wolfpack downed FSU 17-16 behind the play of then-QB Mike Glennon, handing FSU its only ACC loss of the last two-plus seasons...Florida State hopes to get back its normal starting QB in consensus All-American QB Jameis Winston, who served a one-game suspension and missed

the Noles' dramatic win over the Tigers... NC State is led by junior QB Jacoby Bris**sett**, who transferred from FSU's instate arch-rival Florida...Brissett is second in the ACC in pass efficiency (166.7) and leads the ACC in total offense (280.8 yds/gm.) in leading the Wolfpack to four straight victories to start the 2014 season... The meeting of the Atlantic Division rivals is one of two on the weekend as Wake Forest, under new coach Dave Clawson and led by true freshman QB John Wolford, travels to Louisville, Ky., for a Saturday game at Papa John's Cardinal Stadium (3:30 p.m., ESPNU)...The Deacons and Cardinals are meeting for only the second time in their history in football and for the first time since Louisville claimed a 24-13 win in the 2007 Orange Bowl...Coached by Bobby Petrino, the Cardinals are led by QB Will Gardner and DE Lorenzo Mauldin, who had three TFLs in their win over FIU... both schools are trying to stay alive in the hunt for the Atlantic Division title and a trip to Charlotte as is Miami, which will host unbeaten Duke in a key Coastal Division clash at Sun Life Stadium in Miami Gardens (7:30 pm, (ESPN2)...The Blue Devils of coach David Cutcliffe are 4-0 and ranked 23rd in this week's Amway Coaches poll...Duke, the defending Coastal Division champion, is led by QB Anthony Boone, WR Jamison Crowder and LB David Helton...The Blue Devils have won 12 straight regular season games and have captured 12 of their last 14 overall...Miami, coached by Al Golden and led by RB Duke Johnson and true freshman QB Brad Kaaya, is looking to stay alive in the Coastal Division race, having already dropped an ACC game earlier this year at Louiscontinued, page 2

ville...Kaaya has topped the 300-yard passing mark in each of the past two weeks, including a career-best 359-yard 3-TD effort against the No. 22 Nebraska Cornhuskers last weekend... In Clemson, S.C., the Clemson Tigers of coach Dabo Swinney are looking to get back on the winning path, hosting North **Carolina** of the Coastal Division at Memorial Stadium (7 pm, ESPNU)...Clemson is led by true freshman QB DeShaun Watson and consensus All-America DE Vic Beasley...Watson is expected to make his first career start Saturday after throwing and running for 296 yards against Florida State...Beasley is the nation's leader among active players in career QB sacks with 25.0 after garnering a pair against the Seminoles...The Tar Heels of coach Larry Fedora will be playing in their first conference game of the year...UNC is led by WR Ryan Switzer, who is third in the ACC in receptions per game (5.3), and who also threw a TD pass in the Heels' loss to East Carolina... The UNC-Clemson battle will be in the fourth intradivisional game of the year with the Coastal Division capturing two of the first three contests...Since Divisional play began in the ACC in 2005, the Atlantic Division holds an 88-82 advantage (.518)....**Syracuse** takes on the non-conference opponent with the highest profile when it hosts 8th-ranked Notre Dame Saturday in a nationally-televised game at MetLife Stadium in East Rutherford, N.J. (8 pm, ABC)...The Orange is coached by **Scott Shafer** and is coming off a disappointing loss to Maryland last week, despite outgaining the Terps 589-369 in yardage... Syracuse junior **QB Terrel Hunt** accounted for 375 total yards and 2 TDs against the Terps ... The Irish, who are playing their first of four games against ACC foes this fall, are coached by Brian Kelly and led by QB Everett Golson...Saturday's game will be just the seventh meeting between the two schools in football, the first since 2008...In Blacksburg, Va., the Hokies of Virginia Tech are looking to rebound from close losses on each of the past two weekends...Coach Frank Beamer's club suffered last-second defeats to East Carolina (28-21) and Georgia Tech (27-24) ... Tech will be hosting Western Michigan of the Mid-American Conference at Lane Stadium (12:30 p.m., ACC Network)...Tech is led by junior QB Michael Brewer, who is second in the ACC in passing yardage and third in total offense...Western Michigan is coached by P.J. Fleck... At the same time in Chestnut Hill, Mass., Boston College, coached by **Steve Addazio**, will be hosting the Colorado State Rams of the Mountain West Conference at Alumni Stadium (12:30 pm, RSN)...The Eagles, led by QB Tyler Murphy and LB Josh Keyes, have adapted to Addazio's physical style of

football which has seen them rush for over 400 yards in each of the past two weekends in wins over 9th-ranked Southern Calfornia and Maine...Murphy has run for 500 yards in four games (125.0) and is on pace to break the ACC single-season mark for rushing yards by a QB...Colorado State is coached by Jim McElwain...In Pittsburgh, the Pitt Panthers, coached by **Paul Chryst**, will face their final non-conference test, hosting Akron of the Mid-American Conference at Heinz Field (1:30 pm; ESPN3)...The Panthers are led by RB James Conner, who leads the nation in rushing yards (699) and is fourth nationally in yards per game (174.8) and WR Tyler Boyd, who is fourth in receiving in the ACC (5.2/gm)....Akron is coached by Terry Bowden with former NC State head coach Chuck Amato serving as the Zips' defensive coordinator...In Charlottesville, Va., Virginia returns home to face its final non-conference contest of the year when the Cavaliers host the ACC's third MAC opponent of the weekend in Kent State at Scott Stadium (3:30 pm; ESPN3)...UVa is coached by Mike London and is led by QB Grayson Lambert and the DE tandem of Max Valles and Eli Harold...The Cavaliers two losses have been by eight points each to a pair of Top 25 teams...Kent State is coached by Paul Haynes.

Jackets' Thomas Again Honored By Manning Award After rushing and passing for over 100 yards each for the second straight week, Georgia Tech sophomore QB Justin Thomas was honored by the Manning Award as one of its eight Quarterback Stars of the Week. The honor marked the second straight for Thomas, who had a career-high 165 rushing yards against the Hokies.

### Virginia's Ian Frye Honored By Groza Award For Second Straight Week

After making all four of his field goal attempts against 21st-ranked BYU Saturday, Virginia **PK lan Frye** was named as one of the three Lou Groza Award Kicking Stars of the Week for the second straight week. Frye, who has made 10 of 11 field goals this year, was also honored for his performance in UVa's win over Louisville on Sept. 13.

### NC State's Wil Baumann Named Ray Guy National Player of the Week

NC State senior **P Wil Baumann** was named as the Ray Guy Award National Player of the Week after averaging 55.25 yards on four punts in the Wolfpack's 42-0 win over Presbyterian. Baumann had three punts marked inside of the Presbyterian 20-yard line and his net average was 50.2 yards per kick.



## The ACC By The Numbers

- .966 The career field goal percentage for Florida State's All-American sophomore placekicker Roberto Aguayo. Aguayo, who captured the 2013 Lou Groza Award as the nation's top kicker as a redshirt freshman, has made 28 of the first 29 field goal attempts of his career, including a 50-yarder against Clemson Saturday night.
- **2.5** North Carolina **CB Brian Walker** leads the nation in passes defended, averaging 2.5 a game followed by Virginia Tech **CB Kendall Fuller**, who is second nationally, averaging 2.35 a contest, but leads the nation with nine pass deflections.
- **3** Clemson has annunced that true freshman **Deshaun Watson** will be its starting quarterback this Saturday against North Carolina. When that happens, Watson will become the third true freshman QB to start for an ACC school this year. Miami's **Brad Kaaya** and Wake Forest's **John Wolford** have started each of their team's games this fall.
- **4** After a nine-catch, 135-yard day against 23rd-ranked Clemson, Florida State **WR Rashad Greene** ranks fourth nationally in receiving yards per game, 139.3 yards per game.
- **5** The **ACC** only has two teams ranked among the nation's Top 25 this week in the Amway Coaches Poll, but has five more teams ranked among those receiving votes. Florida State remains No. 1, with Duke making its first appearance in the poll at No. 23. Clemson is 28th, followed by Georgia Tech (33), Boston College and NC State at No. 38 and Louisville (40).
- **6** The number of ACC placekickers who are still perfect on their field goal attempts after four weeks of the season. **Roberto Aguayo** of Florida State (7 of 7), **Chris Blewitt** of Pitt, **Ross Martin** of Duke and **Mike Weaver** of Wake Forest (6-6), **John Wallace** of Louisville (4-4) and **Nick Weiler** of UNC (3-3) have yet to miss a field goal with Virginia's **Ian Frye**, who has made 10 of his 11 attempts, isn't far behind.
- **12 -** Duke has won its last 12 regular season games in a row. Overall, the Blue Devils have won 12 of their last 14, with the only losses coming to No. 1 FSU in the Dr Pepper ACC Championship Game and a last minute defeat to Texas A&M in the Chick-fil-A Bowl.

- **15** The number of non-conference games **ACC teams** will play against teams ranked this week in the Associated Top 25, the largest number by any of the Power Five Conference. ACC teams in the regular season will face No. 8 Notre Dame (4), No. 11 UCLA, No. 12 Georgia (2), No. 13 South Carolina, No. 18 Southern California, No. 20 Brigham Young, No. 21 Nebraska, No. 22 Ohio State, No. 23 East Carolina (2) and No. 24 Oklahoma State. Eight of the 15 non-conference games are road contests.
- **16** Florida State sophomore **PK Roberto Aguayo** has been successful on his last 16 field goal attempts, dating back to the Wake Forest game of last year. The ACC record is 27, set by NC State's Marc Primanti during the 1995-96 seasons. Aguayo's current streak already ties for 9th-best in league history.
- **16b** Florida State has won 16 consecutive ACC football games. This week the Seminoles travel to the site of their last ACC defeat, a 17-16 upset win by NC State at Carter-Finley Stadium in Raleigh. FSU is a ways away from the all-time ACC record, which they set when they joined the league and won their first 29 games from 1992 through 1995.
- **19-** Florida State has won 19 consecutive games, the nation's longest current winning streak. The streak is also the ACC's longest winning streak, breaking a mark set by the Seminoles during the 1999 and 2000 seasons.
- **25.0** The number of career sacks for Clemson All-American **DE Vic Beasley**. He leads the nation among all active FBS players in career QB sacks, after recording two against the No. 1-ranked Florida State Seminoles.
- **48** The number of victories to which Florida State head coach **Jimbo Fisher** has led the Seminoles in just over four seasons as head coach in Tallahassee. His winning percentage of .828 is the best of any ACC coach with three or more seasons.
- **125** Boston College **QB Tyler Murphy** has run for 500 yards in his first four games at the Heights. That's an average of 125 yards a contest, which, if maintained for an entire season, would be a single-season rushing mark for a quarterback. Clemson's Woodrow Dantzler holds the record with 1,061 yards in 2000. Murphy is averaging an impressive 9.1 yards per carry.

- **185.6** The average number of rushing yards for Pitt running back **James Conner** in his last five games. Conner ended the 2013 season with 229 yards rushing against Bowling Green in the Little Caesar's Pizza Bowl and added 153 yards against Delaware on Aug. 30 in Pitt's season opener, then rushed for 214 against Boston College, 177 vs. FIU and 155 against lowa. He has rushed for 928 yards in his last 135 carries—a 6.9 per carry average. This week Conner leads the nation with 699 rushing yards and is 4th nationally in yards per game (174.8)
- **220** The number of career receptions for Duke senior **WR Jamison Crowder**. Crowder moved into fifth on the ACC career receptions list with six catches against Tulane, and is nine behind Michael Campanaro, also of Wake Forest (229, 2010-13), for fourth place.
- **268** Virginia Tech head coach **Frank Beamer**, is the leader among active FBS coaches with 268 career victories and ranks 6th all-time. He is the NCAA's FBS active leader in career wins. He is 30 wins behind 5th-place Joe Paterno.
- **436** When **Boston College** ran for 436 yards against Maine, it marked the second straight game that the Eagles had topped the 400-yard mark in rushing yardage. Since 2000, BC and Georgia Tech are the only teams in the ACC to top 400 rushing yards in back-to-back games.
- **514** Four **ACC QBs** combined to rush for 514 yards on 63 carries and six TDs over the weekend, an 8.16 per-play average and an average 129 yards . Georgia Tech's **Justin Thomas** (165) topped the 100-yard mark in rushing and passing for the second straight week, while Syracuse's **Terrel Hunt** rushed for 156 yards, Boston College's **Tyler Murphy** had 99 and Duke's **Thomas Sirk** added 94 on just five carries.
- **1981 -** The last time **two unranked ACC teams** upset Top 10 teams in the same season. Thirty-four years ago unranked Georgia Tech defeated No. 1 Alabama and Clemson downed 4th-ranked Georgia. That matches the feat turned in this year as then unranked Virginia Tech defeated No. 8 Ohio State on Sept. 7 and Boston College downed No. 9 Southern California on Sept. 14.

## ACC 2014 Football Championship Game Legends Class

Legendary Virginia Coach George Welsh; National Football Foundation College Hall of Famers Derrick Brooks, Hugh Green and Art Monk Headline 2014 Class

Led by three members of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame, two members of the Pro Football Hall of Fame and one of the most successful coaches in Atlantic Coast Conference history, the ACC announced the 2014 Class of Legends for its 10th Annual Dr Pepper Football Championship Game, which will be played in Charlotte, N.C. on December 6. Leading this year's class are former Virginia and Navy head coach George Welsh (Coaldale Pa.), Florida State's two-time consensus All-American linebacker Derrick Brooks (Pensacola, Fla.), four-time Pitt All-American defensive end Hugh Green (Natchez, Miss.), and Syracuse All-American wide receiver Art Monk (White Plains, N.Y.).

Welsh finished his coaching career as the winningest coach in league history, compiling a 189-132-4 record which included reclamation projects at the U.S. Naval Academy and at Virginia. In his near two-decade stint in Charlottesville, Welsh, a 2004 industee into the College Hall of Fame, built the Cavaliers into one of the nation's premier football programs, winning seven or more games for 13 consecutive seasons. Brooks, a 2014 inductee into the Pro Football Hall of Fame, is considered one of the greatest players in college and professional football history. The 1993 ACC Defensive Player of the Year, he was named to the NFL's Pro Bowl an astounding 11 times and led FSU to a national championship and Tampa Bay to the NFL title. Green, a 1996 inductee into the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame, is also considered by many to be one of the greatest collegiate players in history. He was a three-time consensus All-American and earned All-America honors in all four of his collegiate seasons for the Panthers. Monk is one of the few players to earn selection to both the College Football Hall of Fame (2012) and the Pro Football Hall of Fame (2008). He ended his 15-year professional career as the first wide receiver in NFL history to top 900 receptions, finishing with 940 career catches.

The group of 14 former gridiron standouts from current ACC schools includes a former ACC Football Player of the Year, an ACC Defensive Player of the Year, 12 former All-Americans, including 10 first-team and six consensus All-American honorees, and 12 players who combined for 118 years in the National Football League.

Joining Welsh, Brooks, Green and Monk are Boston College offensive lineman Chris Snee (Montrose, Pa.), who earned second-team All-America honors (AP) as a senior at guard; Clemson cornerback Donnell Woolford (Fayetteville, N.C.), a consensus All-America and key defensive figure for the Danny Ford-coached Tiger teams in the late 1980s; Duke wide receiver Chris Castor (Cary, N.C.), the first wide receiver to earn Player of the Year honors in ACC history; Georgia Tech offensive lineman John Davis (Ellijay, Ga.), who earned first-team All-America honors as a tackle and as a center for the Yellow Jackets; and Louisville cornerback Frank Minnifield (Lexington, Ky.), who led the nation in kickoff returns and was an excellent cover cornerback for the Cardinals.

Completing the ACC Football Legends Class of 2014 are Miami's Darrin Smith (Miami, Fla.), one of one-third of the famed Hurricane linebacker trio dubbed the "Bermuda Triangle" that helped lead "the U" to a pair of national championships in 1989 and 1991; North Carolina defensive end Greg Ellis (Wendell, N.C.), a two-time All-American who earned consensus All-America honors in 1997 playing for the Mack Brown-coached Tar Heel teams of the mid-1990s; NC State safety Jesse Campbell (Vanceboro, N.C.), a three-time All-ACC and two-time All-America defensive back for Coach Dick Sheridan's teams of the 1980s and 90s; Virginia Tech center Jake Grove (Forest, Va.), a unanimous first-team All-America in 2003 who was the winner of the Rimington Trophy, given annually to the nation's top pivotman; and Wake Forest running back Alan White (Elm City, N.C.), the runner-up for 1961 ACC Player of the Year who led the conference in rushing that year and went on to an award-winning career in athletic administration as director of athletics at Elon University.

## 2014 ACC FB Game Summaries -- Sept. 20

### #1/1 Florida State 23, #22/24 Clemson 17 (OT)

RB Karlos Williams' 12-yard run on Florida State's first possession of overtime lifted the Seminoles to a 23-17 win in Saturday night's battle of ranked ACC Atlantic Division teams. FSU (3-0, 1-0) extended its ACC- and school-record winning streak to 19 games despite playing without 2013 Heisman Trophy winner Jameis Winston. Freshman Sean Maguire filled in for Winston at QB and completed 21-of-39 passes for 305 yards, including a 74-yard scoring strike to WR Rashad Greene that tied the score at 17-all with 6:04 remaining in regulation. DT Eddie Goldman made the key defensive play for the Seminoles, forcing a fumble with 1:36 remaining that was recovered by teammate Nate Andrews at the FSU 18 yardline to thwart a potential game-winning drive by the Tigers (1-2, 0-1). Clemson freshman QB Deshaun Watson cmpleted 19-of-28 passe for 266 yards and rushed for a touchdown. Tigers DE Vic Beasley sacked Maguire twice and now has 25 career sacks to tie for third in Clemson history with William Perry. Beasley needs just three more sacks to tie the school record.

### Georgia Tech 27, Virginia Tech 24

PK Harrison Butker hit a 24-yard field goal on the final play of the game to lift the visiting Yellow Jackets past Virginia Tech in the ACC opener for both teams. QB Justin Thomas accounted for the majority of the Yellow Jackets' offense. He rushed for 165 yards on 22 carries and scored a touchdown and he threw for 125 yards and a score. Georgia Tech WR De'Andre Smelter caught five passes for 101 yards, including a 31-yard touchdown, as the Jackets moved to 4-0 for the season, 1-0 in league play. The Hokies (2-2, 0-1) lost despite racking up 424 yards of offense, as three turnovers led to 17 Georgia Tech points. Virginia Tech QB Michael Brewer completed 28-of-39 passes for 297 yards with three interceptions, and scored a touchdown on a bizarre play in which he raced 21 yards with a recovered fumble. WR Isaiah Ford caught eight passes for 114 yards for the Hokies.

#### Duke 47, Tulane 13

Duke CB Byron Fields and reserve RB/DB Joseph Ajeigbe returned a pair of interceptions for touchdowns, and six different Blue Devils found the end zone to remain unbeaten with a 47-13 win over Tulane at Wallace Wade Stadium. Senior wide receiver Jamison Crowder headlined the offense with six catches for 119 yards. Duke (4-0) has scored 34-plus points in all four games this season and has allowed 13 or fewer in three of its four outings. The victory pushed Duke's regular season win streak to 12. PK Ross Martin, with eight points on the day, became Duke's career points leader with 242.

### Louisville 34, FIU 3

WR James Quick caught two touchdown passes from QB Will Gardner 45 seconds apart late in the first half, and S Gerod Holliman ran one of his two interceptions back for another score as Louisville (3-1) topped Florida International (1-3) by a 34-3 score on the road Saturday night. Quick finished with seven catches for 174 yards receiving, 111 of which came on his two touchdown receptions.

### Boston College 40, Maine 10

The Eagles started a season 3-1 for the first time since 2009 and recorded over 500 yards of offense for the third time in 2014 while defeating the visiting Black Bears (1-3). Graduate QB Tyler Murphy, who entered the day leading all quarterbacks in the nation with 401 yards rushing, carried 13 times for 99 yards before he was taken out midway into the final quarter. RB Marcus Outlow became the first BC true freshmen to rush for over 100 yards since 2008 with 107 yards, and Classmate Jon Hilliman upped his career highs, rushing 21 times for 98 yards and running in for two scores for the second straight game. The Eagles finished with 413 yards on the ground.

#### NC State 42. Presbyterian 0

Wolfpack QB Jacoby Brissett threw for three scores and rushed for another, as NC State pitched a shutout over visiting Presbyterian, 42-0. The Pack offense once again finished with over 200 yards rushing, and the Pack defense recorded its first shutout since 2011. LB Jerod Fernandez led the defensive effort with 12 tackles, including six solo stops. NC State has started a season 4-0 for the first time since 2010 and posted an unbeaten nonconference record in regular-season play for the first time since 2005.

#### Wake Forest 24. Army 21

WR E.J. Scott caught a 12-yard touchdown with 6:45 left in the game as Wake Forest rallied from a seven-point halftime deficit to defeat Army 24-21. QB John Wolford completed 25-of-35 passes for 238 yards and two touchdowns. TE Cam Serigne added a receiving touchdown, his first career score, in the second quarter while freshman tailback Isaiah Robinson rushed for his first career touchdown in the first quarter to put the Deacons (2-2) on the board. Wake Forest SS Ryan Janvion led the Demon Deacons with 12 tackles including 10 solo stops.

### #24/22 Nebraska 41. Miami 31

Freshman QB Brad Kaaya's 359 passing yards were not enough for the Hurricanes (2-2) on Saturday night, as they fell on the road to Nebraska 41-31. Miami RB Duke Johnson added 93 rushing yards and 84 receiving yards, a new career high. RB Ameer Abdullah led Nebraska (4-0) with 229 yards on 35 carries.

### #21/23 BYU 41, Virginia 33

Rolling up more than 500 yards of total offense and holding the ball for nearly 41 minutes wasn't enough for Virginia to upset BYU. The Cavaliers (2-2) led in nearly every key statistical category for four quarters, but Taysom Hill and the 21st-ranked Cougars (4-0) came from behind for a 41-33 victory. Virginia starting QB Greyson Lambert completed 21 of 35 passes for 188 yards for Virginia before leaving with a lower leg injury late in the third quarter. Matt Johns came in and threw for another 139 yards in the fourth quarter completing 14 of 23 passes with one TD.

### lowa 24, Pitt 20

RB James Conner rushed for 155 yards and a touchdown but was held in check during the second half as the Panthers (3-1) failed to improve to 4-0 for the first time since 2000. QB Chad Voytik passed for a career-high 250 yards but Pitt's last-gasp drive ended with an interception. Iowa (3-1) was led by RB Mark Weisman, who ran for 88 yards and two touchdowns, including a 1-yard plunge with 6:56 remaining.

### East Carolina 70, #-/25 North Carolina 41

QB Shane Carden threw for 438 yards and four touchdowns to lead the Pirates (3-1) past the visiting Tar Heels. UNC (2-1) led 20-14 early in the second quarter after a pair of unconventional touchdowns - WR Ryan Switzer passing to WR T.J. Thorpe for a 35-yard score and P Tommy Hibbard finding TE Eric Albright on a 29-yard fake field goal.

#### Maryland 34, Syracuse 20

The visiting Terps (3-1) used an interception return for touchdown, a 90-yard touchdown pass and a blocked punt to set up another score to open up an 18-point halftime lead that the Orange (2-1) couldn't overcome. The Orange out-gained the Terrapins in total yards, 589-369, led by 370 rushing yards. Quarterback Terrel Hunt led the way with 156 yards on 23 carries and two scores. It was the first time a SU quarterback went over 100 yards on the ground since Donovan McNabb against Miami in 1997.

## **ACC Players of the Week**

### Florida State, Georgia Tech Each Earn Two Players of the Week After Key Divisional Victories

Florida State and Georgia Tech each saw an offensive and defensive player earn an Atlantic Coast Conference weekly football honor for their play in key league division wins on Saturday. FSU's **Rashad Greene** was recognized as the ACC Receiver of the Week, and Seminole defensive tackle **Eddie Goldman** was named the ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week following Saturday night's 23-17 overtime Atlantic Division victory over visiting Clemson. Georgia Tech quarterback **Justin Thomas** was tabbed the ACC Offensive Back of the Week following the Yellow Jackets' 27-24 win at Coastal Division rival Virginia Tech, while teammate **Paul Davis** earned ACC Linebacker of the Week honors. Duke's **Takoby Cofield** was named the ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week, and Louisville safety **Gerod Holliman** earned the ACC Defensive Back of the Week honor. ACC Specialist of the Week accolades went to Virginia place-kicker **Ian Frye**, and Clemson freshman quarterback **Deshaun Watson** was named the ACC Rookie of the Week. FSU's Greene and Virginia's Frye were both honored for the second time this season, with Frye being recognized for the second week in a row.

### OFFENSIVE BACK Justin Thomas, Georgia Tech, So-r., QB, 5-11, 185, Prattville, Ala.

Thomas engineered Georgia Tech's second straight comeback on the game's final drive as the Yellow Jackets knocked off Virginia Tech 27-24 in Blacksburg. Thomas rushed for a career-high165 yards on 22 carries and scored one touchdown, becoming the first Georgia Tech quarterback since 2011 to post back-to-back 100-yard rushing games. He is averaging a team-leading 110.8 rushing yards per game (443 in four contests) and has rushed for 302 yards on 42 carries in the last two games. Thomas also completed 7-of-18 passes for 125 yards and a touchdown in the win over the Hokies.

### OFFENSIVE LINEMAN - Takoby Cofield, Duke, Sr.-r, OT, 6-4, 310, Tarboro, N.C.

Cofield helped lead the way for a Duke offense which totaled 437 yards on just 70 snaps – a 6.2 yards per play average – in Saturday's 47-13 win over visiting Tulane. The Blue Devils' balanced offensive day included 256 rushing yards and 181 passing yards. Takoby and his fellow offensive linemen opened holes for a rushing attack that averaged 6.1 yards per attempt and had four different players score a rushing touchdown.

### RECEIVER - Rashad Greene, Florida State, Sr., WR, 6-0, 180, Albany, Ga.

Greene totaled nine receptions for 135 yards and a 72-yard touchdown in top-ranked FSU's 23-17 overtime win over No. 22 Clemson on Saturday night. Greene's 74-yard score tied the game 17-17 with 6:04 left in regulation. Greene had eight receptions for 132 yards in the second half as the Seminoles battled back. He leads the ACC in receptions (24), receiving yards (418) and receiving yards per game (139.8).

### DEFENSIVE LINEMAN - Eddie Goldman, Florida State, Jr. DT, 6-4, 320, Washington, D.C.

Despite nursing an injured ankle that knocked him of the previous game, Goldman was dominant when the Seminoles needed him most in FSU's 23-17 overtime victory over Clemson. With the score tied 17-17 and under two minutes remaining, Goldman forced a fumble that the Seminoles recovered after Clemson had driven to the FSU 18-yard line. Goldman then sacked Clemson quarterback Deshaun Watson for a 4-yard loss on the first possession of overtime and, two plays later, led the way in making the stop on a fourth-and-1 play that went for no gain and turned the ball over to the Seminoles for the winning score.

### LINEBACKER - Paul Davis, Georgia Tech, So., LB, 5-11, 218, Cairo, Ga.

Davis recorded a career-high nine tackles and his career-first interception return for a touchdown to help Georgia Tech to a 27-24 road win at Virginia Tech. Davis finished second on the team with nine stops (his previous high was seven vs. Georgia Southern). With the Yellow Jackets trailing 16-10, Davis picked off a Virginia Tech pass, and returned it 41 yards for a touchdown. It marked the second interception return for a TD this season by the Georgia Tech defense, which has seen all seven of its takeaways through the first four games result in a score.

### DEFENSIVE BACK - Gerod Holliman, Louisville, So., S, 6-0, 206, Miami, Fla.

Holliman recorded a pair of interceptions for the second straight week to add to his national lead of five as Louisville posted a 34-3 road win at FIU. Holliman returned one of his interceptions 32 yards for a touchdown and led a Cardinals secondary that yielded only 117 yards through the air.

### SPECIALIST - Ian Frye, Virginia, Jr., PK, 6-6, 200, Bristol, Va.

Frye converted on all four of his field goal attempts and three PATs in the Cavaliers' 41-33 road loss at No. 21 BYU. Frye connected on field goal attempts of of 23, 41, 22 and 46 yards. He is now 10-of-11 on field goal attempts this season.

### ROOKIE - Deshaun Watson, Clemson, Fr., QB, 6-3, 200, Gainesville, Ga.

Watson came off the bench to complete 19 of 28 passes for 266 yards and ran for 30 yards on 12 carries to finish with 296 total yards versus top-ranked Florida State in Saturday night's 23-17 overtime loss. His 296 yards of total offense were the most ever by a Clemson true freshman, and his 266 passing yards ranked as the second highest.

With Louisville joining the ACC this fall, the league now has four coaches who rank among the Top 25 active football coaches in the NCAA in wins per season with five or more seasons as a head coach. Petrino leads the way (9.22) om 6th place, followed by Georgia Tech's



Paul Johnson, who is averaging 9.06 wins per full season. Johnson's record puts him in 11th place nationally. Clemson's Dabo Swinney (8.50) ranks 17th, with Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer

23rd. Florida State's **Jimbo Fisher** is off to an impressive start in his career as well, and could join the list next year as one of the leadres, averaging 11.25 wins a year in his first four seasons.

After just four seasons as head coach at Florida State, Jimbo Fisher joined some select company among ACC football coaches. Fisher compiled



a 45-10 record (.818) during that time. His winning percentage put him in 2nd place among all ACC head coaches after four seasons, ahead of such prominent figures as NC State's Lou Holtz, Clemson's Danny Ford, Maryland's Ralph Friedgen and Georgia Tech's Bobby Ross. The best mark recorded by an ACC head coach in his first four years

in the league was by Fisher's predecessor at FSU, Bobby Bowden, who posted a 43-5-1 record (.888). Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer has the 3rd-best record at 42-11-0 (.792).

### Clemson's Swinney, Georgia Tech's Johnson In Good Company As ACC Head Coaches After their first six seasons at Clemson

and Georgia Tech, head coaches Dabo

Swinny and Paul Johnson have recorded excellent numbers. Only five other coaches in league history have had a better winning percentage after six seasons than Swinney (.689) and only three have won more games. Only seven



other coaches in league history have won more games (47) than has Johnson after his first six seasons in the league and he ranks 14th in winning percentage.

Home Sweet Home for Tigers' Swinney, Noles' Fisher



Clemson head coach Dabo Swinney and Florida State head coach Jimbo Fisher have both enjoyed coaching in the cozy and imposing confines of the Tigers' home field, also known as Death Valley, and the Seminoles' home turf, Doak Campbell Sta-

dium. Now, beginning his seventh season as head coach of the Tigers, Swinney's teams won 19 of the first 22 home ACC games, a winning percentage of .864, third-best among ACC coaches who have coached a minimum of four seasons. He is only behind former Tiger coach Ken Hatfield, who posted a 12-1-1 mark in four seasons (.893) and Fisher, who is 15-2 (.875) against league foes. They are both just ahead of legndary FSU coach Bobby Bowden, who also won more ACC home games than any other coach, with 62 triumphs in his 18 years in the league.

Wake Forest new head coach Dave Clawson is in his first year as the Demon Deacons' head coach, but he is no rookie leading a program. Clawson, now in his 15th season as a head coach, has already re-built three football programs. He ranks fourth in years of experience among head coaches in the ACC, behind only Frank Beamer (34) and Paul Johnson (18). His overall, 92-82 (.529) record is more impressive when you take into account that he had to rebuild programs at Fordham, Richmond and Bowling Green, where his combined mark in his final three seasons



(nine years total) at each stop was 75-37, a .670 winning percentage.



## Duke Experiencing Success Under National and ACC Coach of the Year David Cutcliffe

David Cutcliffe, the ACC's 2012 and 2013 Coach of the Year, has led the Blue Devils to 35 victories since coming to Durham in 2008. That may not sound like a great record, except when you consider that it is more wins than the Blue Devils totalled in the 15 seasons before Cutcliffe came to Durham.

- ■Duke's 2013 team had 10 wins, the most in school history. Duke was Coastal Division champions for the first time since the ACC went to Divisional play in 2005 and the Blue Devils went to back-to-back bowl games for the first time ins school history, dropping a last-second contest (52-48) to Texas A&M in the Chick-fil-A Bowl.
- Duke made its first appearance in the BCS Standings on Nov. 25, getting ranked 24th.
- In the five-plus years that Cutcliffe has been in Durham, he has already mentored a pair of quarterbacks who finished their careers ranked in the ACC's top seven of career passing yardage. **Thaddeus Lewis** (2006-09) threw for 10,065 yards, the second-highest total in league bictory and Sean Particle (2000-12), throw for 0.465 career yards, the

Under Steve Addazio Boston College Becomes One of the Top Five Most Improved Teams in the FBS

Under head coach **Steve Addazio**, Boston College in 2013 became on the nation's most improved football teams. Inheriting a program which had posted a 6-18 record over the past two seasons, including a 2-10 mark in 2012, Addazio led the Eagles to a 7-6 record and into the Independence Bowl in his first season on The Heights.

Addazio's physical style of football and a veteran offensive line allowed TB Andre Williams to set ACC single-game, multi game and single-season rushing records and to win the Doak Walker Award as the nation's top running back. Williams became the first running back in ACC history to top 2,000 rushing yards in a season (2,177).

The four-and-a-half win improvement from 2012 was the fifthbest turnaround in the FBS last year, bettered only by Auburn (8), Missouri (6) and Michigan State and UNLV (5 each).

### UNC Has An Offensive and Special Teams Mindset Under Larry Fedora

North Carolina Head Coach Larry Fedora's fast-paced offense had his team scoring at a school-record pace in his first year in Chapel Hill. UNC ranked 8th nationally in scoring offense in 2012, averaging 40.6 points a game while also ranked 14th nationally in total offense.



- Now in his third season as head coach at UNC, North Carolina has topped the 40-point mark 11 times and bettered 30 points 19 times. His Tar Heel teams have averaged 37.1 points per game. In the previous 13 seasons before Fedora came to Chapel Hill, UNC had averaged just 23.3 points per game, a 14-point difference.
- Also, in his first two seasons, UNC has 454 yards per game of total offense. That compares with the previous 13 seasons when the Tar Heels averaged just 349.25 yards per game of offense.
- ■Fedora's first two Tar Heel teams both bettered the previous school mark for scoing. UNC scored a school-record 487 points in 2012 and tallied 425 points in 2013. Previously, the school had only topped 400 points once (1993) in its history when it scored 421 points.
- Fedora's 2013 team set a school record for most touchdowns by returns with eight, including five by punt return, two by kickoff return and one interception runback.
- Now in his third season in Chapel Hill, Fedora's teams have had 14 returns for touchdowns including eight by punt return and three by kickoff return.
- In 2012 and 2013 UNC returned 65 punts, averaging 16.0 per return. As a freshman in 2013, Ryan Switzer tied an NCAA FBS single-season record and set an ACC standard when he returned five punts for scores last year.
- Now in his third season at Chapel Hill, UNC has scored 60 or more points three times, including an 80-point outburst against Old Dominion.
- By posting records of 8-4 and 7-6 in his two years in Chapel Hill, he becomes the first UNC coach since Ray Wolf in 1936-37 to post winning records in each of his first two seasons.

of America (FWAA) as its national team of the week for its upset win over 9th-ranked Southern California. Additional, BC senior

LB Josh Keves was named the National Defensive Player of the Week by both the FWAA's Nagurski Award and the Maxwell Club's National De-





fensive Player of the Week.

Duke true freshman RB Shaun Wilson was named the National Freshman of the Week by Athlon Sports after rushing for 245 yards on only 12 carries against Kan-

sas. Virginia PK lan Frye was

named one of three Lou Groza Award placekickers of the Week for his three-field goal effort in UVa's win over Louisville.

Georgia Tech QB Justin Thomas was tabbed as one of eight Manning Award Quarterback Stars of the Week aft running and throwing for over 100 yards and accounting for 5 TDs in Tech's win over Georgia Southern.

Finally, Miami senior WR Phillip Dorsett was named by the Hornung Award as one of its Players of the Week after catching 4 passes fro 201 yards and 2 TDs and returning two punts for 27 yards.



### Georgia Tech's Hill Nominated For Orange Bowl-FWAA **Courage Award**

DALLAS (FWAA) - Georgia Tech's Deon Hill is the first weekly nominee for the 2014 Orange Bowl-FWAA Courage Award.

Hill, a 6-0, 194-pound redshirt senior A-back from Phenix City, Ala., reported severe stomach cramps during last season and was hospitalized. He was diagnosed with Crohn's Disease, a chronic inflammation of the gastrointestinal tract and missed four games in 2013.

"My family was more worried than I was, because I know it's not life-threatening or anything like that," Hill has told the Atlanta Journal-Constitution in the last few months. "So I just took it all in stride. I guess it's a blessing in disguise. I know God's got something for me, so it's all good."

Hill, who has been taking anti-inflammatory medication, was cleared to play this season after missing 2014 spring practice. Georgia Tech is 4-0 following a 27-24 victory over Virginia Tech. On Sept. 13 against Georgia Southern Hill caught a 13-yard touchdown pass with 23 seconds remaining in the game to spur the Yellow Jackets to that victory. On the season, Hill has carried the ball 10 times for 61 yards and has three receptions for 43 yards.

The Courage Award was first presented by the FWAA in 2002. A select group of writers from the FWAA vote on the winner each year. The requirements for nomination include displaying courage on or off the field, including overcoming an injury or physical handicap, preventing a disaster or living through hardship. The winner of the award will be included in festivities during Orange Bowl week and receive his trophy at an on-field presentation.

Previous winners of the FWAA's Courage Award are San José State defensive lineman Anthony Larceval (2013). Clemson wide receiver Daniel Rodriguez (2012), Michigan State offensive lineman Arthur Ray Jr. (2011), Rutgers defensive tackle Eric LeGrand (2010), the University of Connecticut football team (2009), Tulsa's Wilson Holloway (2008), Navy's Zerbin Singleton (2007), Clemson's Ray Ray McElrathbey (2006), the Tulane football team (2005), Memphis' Haracio Colen (2004), San José State's Neil Parry (2003) and Toledo's William Bratton (2002).

#### ACC Divisional Tiebreaker

If more than one team in the same division is tied for the best winning percentage in its Conference games, the procedures listed below will be followed to determine the division's representative in the ACC Championship Game:

### Two-Team Tie:

- 1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
- 2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
- 3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall win percentage. (Divisional and non-divisional) and proceding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken from first-to-last using the league's tiebreaking procedures.
- 4. Overall win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
- 5. Combined win percentage vs. all non-divisional opponents.
- 6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based on their order of finish (overall conference win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based upon their divisional order of finish.
- 7. The tied team with the higher ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee following the conclusion of regular season games. (If both tied teams are not ranked in the ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee, the higher ranked team in the Amway Coaches Poll (including others receiving votes). 8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw. (as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.)

### Three-Team (or More) Team Tie

(Once a team is eliminated from the tie, the tie-breaker procedures restart for the remaining teams. If the three (or more) team tie can be reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaker format will then be applied.)

- 1. Combined head-to-head win percentage among the tied teams.
- 2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
- 3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall (divisional and non-divisional) Conference win percentage, and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken first to last, using the league's tie-breaker policies.
- 4. Combined win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
- 5. Overall win percentage versus non-divisional opponents.
- 6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based upon their order of finish (overall win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional opponents based upon their divisional order of finish.
- 7. The tied team with the highest ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee following the conclusion of regular season games, unless the second of the tied teams is ranked within five or fewer places of the highest ranked tied team. In this case, the two-team tiebreaker procedure shall be applied between the top two ranked tied teams. If none of the tied teams are ranked in the rankings of the College Football Playoff Committee, the higher ranked team in the officially released Amway Coaches poll (including others receiving votes), following the conclusion of regular season games, unless the second of the tied teams is within five or fewer places of the highest ranked team. (For the sake of clarity, the team receiving the second-most votes but not ranked in the Top 25 would be ranked 27th.) In this case the two-team tiebreaker procedure shall be applied between the top ranked tied teams.
- 8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.



## The College Football Playoff; ACC Bowl Lineup



Beginning with the 2014-15 season, college football enters a new era when a postseason playoff will begin. The format includes the top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and a national championship game played in a different city each year. Each semifinal will be played during the New Year's holiday with the national championship game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later.

A selection committee will choose the four teams for the playoff based on their performance during the regular season, including, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams will be seeded so that #1 will play #4 in one semifinal and #2 will meet #3 in the other, with the winners advancing to the national championship game. The selection committee will announce its rankings each week on Tuesdays beginning on Oct. 28. The final rankings, though, will be announced on Sunday, Dec. 7.

The semifinals will rotate among six different bowls: the Chick-fil-A Peach, Cotton, Fiesta and Capital One Orange Bowls; the Rose Bowl presented by Northwestern Mutual and the Sugar Bowl. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight other teams in four compelling matchups.

### ACC Bowl Quick Selection Order

(The ACC is in the first year of six-year contracts with its current bowl partners. The current College Football Playoff format is a 12-year agreement)

College Football Playoff (four teams)

If the ACC Champion is not in one of the semifinal games it will appear in the Capital One Orange Bowl, or, if the Capital One Orange Bowl is a semifinal or national championship site, one of the Playoff "host" bowls, either the Fiesta of Chick-fil-A Peach. There is no limit on how many teams the College Football Playoff may choose from a particular conference.

Capital One Orange

Opponent will be a team from the SEC, Big Ten or Notre Dame. If ACC Champion is in the College Football Playoff, a second ACC team will take its place in the Orange Bowl.

#### Orlando

Only if the ACC opponent in the Orange Bowl, in a non-semifinal year, is a team from the Big Ten, which can occur a maximum of three times in six years.

### The One-Win Rule Applies Only to Notre Dame

The ACC's bowl selection will no longer be bound by the rigidity of a "one-win rule" but will have a general list of criteria to emphasize regionality and quality matchups on the field. A one-win rule does apply to Notre Dame's participation in the ACC Bowl structure. Notre Dame is now eligibile for ACC Bowl selection beginning with the Capital One Bowl and continuing through the league's bowl selections. However, Notre Dame must be within one win of the ACC available team which has the best overall record, in order to be chosen. In other words, if an ACC team was 9-3, a 7-5 Notre Dame team could not be chosen in its place. Notre Dame would have to be 8-4 to be chosen over a 9-3 league team.

**ACC Bowl Expenses And Revenue** 

The Atlantic Coast Conference shares all bowl revenues. Each school is provided an initial expense allotment. The Conference will share in the cost of unsold tickets for participating bowl institutions. After all bowl expense allotments and ticket reimbursements are subtracted from the total bowl revenue, the remaining revenue is distributed evenly among the ACC schools.

## The ACC In Overtime

### The ACC & Overtime

When Florida State and Clemson ended regulation tied at 17 in week 4 of the 2014 season, it marked the 67th game featuring an ACC team that has had to go to extra sessions. Of the 67 overtime contests, a large portion of them—29--have been played in the month of September. Games have gone into overtime for ACC teams a total of 16 times in November, while 12 have been played in October, three in August, five in December and two in January (2006 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl). Of the 67 overtime contests, 33 have been ACC games while 34 nonconference games have gone into overtime. The home team has a 37-22 advantage in the 59 games played on campus. The team which wins the toss has a 36-31 record. Fifty-one of the games were decided in the first overtime with 11 games in double overtime and five in triple overtime.
