## Georgia Tech's Thomas Named Walter Camp Offensive National Player of the Week

Georgia Tech senior QB Justin Thomas, who became only the fourth player this century to rush for 195 yards and throw for 250 or more yards Saturday against Duke, was named the Walter Camp Offensive National Player of the Week this week. The honor marks the fifth time this year that an ACC QB has been so honored by the Walter Camp Foundation.

## ACC Has 5 in AP, Coaches Polls

Five ACC teams were selected for this week's Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls. **Clemson** (3rd), **Louisville** (5th) and **Florida State** (19) had the same rankings in each poll. The AP had **North Carolina** 18th and **Virginia Tech** 23rd, while the Coaches had **UNC** 17th and **Virginia Tech** 21st.

## Jackson Remains Firmly No. 1 in ESPN Heisman Watch

Louisville QB Lamar Jackson and remained firmly on top of ESPN's Heisman Watch for the fourth straight week, while Clemson's **Deshaun Watson** was third and Florida State's **Dalvin Cook** tied for 11th on Oct. 25. The Heisman Watch is a compilation of votes by ESPN.com's writers and editors.

## Clemson, Florida State Rank Third, Fourth in Schedule Strength

According to the NCAA, which uses winning percentage as its barometer, **Clemson** and **Florida State** have faced the nation's third and fourth toughest schedules heading into this week. Clemson's opponents have posted a .744 winning percentage, while Florida State's have been .705. When you combine past and future opposition, Clemson's schedule (.653) is second-toughest only to Tennessee, while FSU's (.639) is fourth.

## ACC's Most Competitive Weekend

With all seven of its games decided by eight or fewer points, and the average margin of decision just 4.857 points, the ACC set league records this past weekend for a minimum of six or more games in margin of decision.

## No. 23 Virginia Tech Travels to Duke; No. 18 UNC Hosts Georgia Tech In Key Coastal Clashes No. 3 Clemson Hosts Syracuse; No. 19 Florida State Heads to NC State

### Virginia Tech, North Carolina Lead Coastal Clemson Maintains Atlantic Advantage

Heading into the final month of the regular season, the Coastal Division race remains tight. No. 18 **North Carolina** is tied with No. 23 **Virginia Tech**, but the Hokies hold the tiebreaker advantage. Virginia Tech heads to **Duke** this Saturday, while **North Carolina** hosts **Georgia Tech** in a pair of Coastal Division contests...In the Atlantic, after a dramatic win over 19th-ranked **Florida State**, unbeaten and third-ranked **Clemson** holds the edge with a full-game lead and the tiebreaker advantage over fifth-ranked **Louisville**. The Tigers can clinch the Atlantic Division with home wins over **Syracuse** this week and **Pitt** on Nov. 12 ..Under head coach **Dabo Swinney**, the Tigers are 29-3 (.913) at home against ACC foes...**Louisville** looks to keep pace with the Tigers and keep its College Football Playoff and ACC title hopes alive, facing a second straight road test at **Boston College** this Saturday in Chestnut Hill.

### Seven ACC Games in Week Ten

Week 10 features seven ACC games: six intradivi-

sional battles and the interdivisional contest between **Virginia** at **Wake Forest**... Atlantic Division teams have a 6-3 advantage this year and are 106-100 since the ACC went to divisions in 2005...Four ACC teams--**Clemson**, **Louisville**, **North Carolina** and **Virginia Tech**--have achieved bowl eligibility, while **Florida State**, **Georgia Tech**, **Pitt** and **Wake Forest** can punch their tickets to the postseason this week with wins.

**Duke**, coached by **David Cutcliffe** and led by redshirt freshman **QB Daniel Jones**, hosts Coastal Division rival **Virginia Tech** (3:30 p.m.; ESPN2) Saturday at Brooks Field at Wallace Wade Stadium in Durham. The Hokies, coached by **Justin Fuente** and led by **QB Jerod Evans**, are looking to keep pace with **North Carolina** in the Coastal Division race. Duke, after losing 12 straight to the Hokies from 1982 through 2012, has captured two of the last three meetings with both wins coming in Blacksburg. Duke's last victory over Tech in Durham was in 1981. The Blue Devils are seeking to continue their school-record streak of four straight bowl games, while Tech, with its win over Pitt, just qualified for the post-season for the 24th consecutive time--the longest current national streak recognized by the NCAA. Evans ranks eighth nationally in passing efficiency (166.3) after a 405-yard outing against the Panthers.

### 18th-Ranked Tar Heels Host Jackets

**North Carolina**, ranked 18th nationally this week by AP, is looking to keep pace with **Virginia Tech** in the Coastal race this week when it hosts **Georgia Tech** at Kenan Stadium in Chapel Hill (12:30 p.m.; ACC Network). The Tar Heels, coached by **Larry Fedora** and led by **QB Mitch Trubisky**, have won two straight in the series with the Jackets, with five of the last six games between the two teams decided by eight or fewer points. Tech has won 14 of the last 18 meetings. Tech, coached by **Paul Johnson** and led by **QB Justin Thomas**, features a ground-oriented spread option attack that is 18th nationally in rushing offense (247.6/gm). Trubisky ranks third nationally in pass completion percentage (.712). North Carolina **WR Ryan Switzer** is tied for sixth nationally in receptions per game (8.3).

### Third-Ranked Clemson Faces Pass-Minded Syracuse

**Clemson**, coached by **Dabo Swinney** and led by **QB Deshaun Watson** will be facing perhaps the biggest test to its pass defense when it hosts **Syracuse** this Saturday at Memorial Stadium in Clemson (3:30 p.m.; ABC/ESPN2). **Syracuse** first-year head coach **Dino Babers** has transformed the Orange's offense behind the play of **QB Eric Dungey** and **WRs Amba Etta-Tawo, Ervin Phillips** and **Brisly Estime**. The Tigers are ranked fourth nationally in team pass efficiency defense (90.03) and 14th in total defense (317.4), but **Syracuse** is ranked fifth nationally in passing offense (357.1). Dungey has topped the 300-yard mark in passing in six of his eight games and is seventh nationally in passing yards per game (328.9) and fourth in total offense (365.0). Etta-Tawo is tied for sixth nationally in receptions per game and is third in receiving yards while Phillips is eighth in receptions (7.5). Estime leads the ACC and is second nationally in punt returns (19.8 avg.).

### No. 5 Louisville Faces Defensive Test in Boston College

The nation's best offense faces one of its toughest defensive tests of the year when fifth-ranked **Louisville**, coached by **Bobby Petrino** and led by Heisman Trophy contender **QB Lamar Jackson**, meets **Boston**

**College** at Alumni Stadium in Chestnut Hill (Noon; ESPN2). The host Eagles, coached by **Steve Addazio** and led by **DE Harold Landry**, feature a defensive unit ranked seventh nationally in total defense (298.5), fourth in rushing defense (93.6) and 14th in team sacks (3.13/gm.). **Louisville** leads the nation in scoring offense (52.6) and in total offense (603.3), while Jackson leads the nation in rushing TDs and points responsible for per game (28.8) and is second in total offense (439.8). Landry is tied for second nationally (1.13) in sacks per game.

### 19th-Ranked Florida State Travels to NC State

**NC State**, coached by **Dave Doeren** and led by **RB Matthew Dayes**, faces yet another test from a nationally-ranked opponent when the Wolfpack hosts 19th-ranked **Florida State** this Saturday at Carter-Finley Stadium in Raleigh, N.C. (7 p.m.; ESPN2). NC State is coming off a stretch where it faced third-ranked **Clemson** and seventh-ranked **Louisville** on the road, then hosted **Boston College**, which has the nation's No. 7-ranked defense, and now faces the Seminoles. **Florida State** is led by **RB Dalvin Cook** and **QB Deondre Francois** and a fast-improving defense led by **DE DeMarcus Walker**. Cook is sixth nationally in rushing yards per game (133.6), Francois has 2,259 yards of total offense, already the 12th-best total in league history for a freshman, and Walker is sixth nationally in sacks per game (1.06). State counters with Dayes, who has topped 100 yards rushing in five of his eight games.

### Pitt Travels to Miami in Coastal Division Contest

**Pitt**, coached by **Pat Narduzzi** and led by **DE Ejuan Price** and **RB James Conner**, heads to South Florida to face Miami, coached by **Mark Richt** and led by **QB Brad Kaaya** at Hard Rock Stadium in Miami Gardens, Fla. (12:30 p.m.; ACC Network). Both teams are seeking bowl eligibility. Price leads the nation in tackles for loss, averaging 2.0 per game, while Conner is coming off his best game of the year, an 141-yard rushing effort against Virginia Tech. Kaaya is sixth in the ACC in pass efficiency (144.8). Miami has won nine of the last 10 meetings between the schools, but Pitt took a 35-23 decision in its last visit to Miami Gardens in 2014.

### Wake Forest Hosts Virginia

**Wake Forest**, coached by **Dave Clawson** and led by the defensive tandem of **LB Marquel Lee** and **DE Duke Ejirofor**, hosts Virginia at BB&T Field in Winston-Salem, N.C. (3 p.m., Regional Sports Networks). Ejirofor is tied for ninth nationally in tackles for loss (1.6) and Lee is tied for 11th. They are the lynchpins of a defensive unit that is 14th nationally in scoring defense (18.3). **Virginia**, coached by **Bronco Mendenhall** and led by **QB Kurt Benkert**, features a passing attack that is averaging 264.5 yards per game. Benkert is sixth in the ACC in passing yards per game. **RB Taquan Mizzell** has 179 career receptions, more than any other ACC running back in history and 17th among all active players.



# The ACC By The Numbers

**.929** - Clemson's winning percentage with **Deshaun Watson** starting at quarterback. The Tigers are 26-2 with Watson as their starter.

**0.8** - Florida State **CB Tarvarus McFadden** leads the nation in pass interceptions per game, averaging 0.8. McFadden has six interceptions in eight games.

**1** - **Duke** continues to lead the nation in fourth-down percentage defense (.000). Nine times Duke's opponents have attempted a fourth-down conversion and nine times the Blue Devils have denied them.

**2.0** - Pitt senior **DE Ejuan Price** is tied for the nation's lead in sacks. Price is averaging 2.0 sacks per game.

**3-4** - According to the NCAA which uses winning percentage as its barometer, **Clemson** and **Florida State** have faced the nation's third and fourth toughest schedules heading into this week. Clemson's opponents have posted a .744 winning percentage, while Florida State's have been .705. When you combine past and future opposition, Clemson's schedule (.653) is second-toughest only to Tennessee, while FSU's (.639) is fourth.

**4.857** - The average margin of decision in the ACC's seven games this past weekend. Of the seven games, three were decided by three points, one by two, two by seven and the other by eight. The margin is the lowest in league history for six or more games on a single weekend. It's also the first time that six or more games were decided by eight or fewer points.

**4** - **Pitt** is just four points away from being undefeated in the ACC. The Panthers have also played four games this year decided by three or fewer points, posting a 2-2 mark in those games. All three of the Panthers' losses this year have been by seven or fewer points.

**5** - **Virginia Tech** became only the fifth team since the turn of the century to have three players with 100 or more receiving yards in its Thursday night game with Pitt, when **Bucky Hodges** (145), **Isaiah Ford** (143) and **Cam Phillips** (109) all topped the century mark. It's the first time that three ACC teammates have had 100-yard receiving performances in the same game since Nov. 17, 2012, when the triumvirate of Clive

Walford (135), Herb Waters (130) and Phillip Dorsett (104) did it for Miami against South Florida. It's the first time this has happened in ACC play since Florida State's Snoop Minnis (163), Atreus Bell (111) and Javon Walker (109) did it against Clemson on Nov. 4, 2000.

**6** - The number of field goals for Virginia Tech **PK Joey Slye** in the Hokies' win over Pitt. Slye tied an ACC single-game record held by five others, most recently by Florida State's Ricky Aguayo against Ole Miss on Sept. 5 if this year.

**7** - Florida State **RB Dalvin Cook** became only the seventh player in ACC history to top 1,000 rushing yards in three separate seasons when he ran for 169 yards against Clemson to give him 1,069 yards this season. He is the first to accomplish the feat since Wake Forest's Chris Barclay did it during the 2003-05 seasons. Cook is 12th on the ACC's career rushing list with 3,768 yards.

**9** - Counting only regular season play and only true road games, **North Carolina** and **Clemson** have each won nine straight road contests, the second-longest streak in the NCAA's FBS.

**14** - **Clemson's** win over Florida State was its 14th consecutive victory against ACC competition, a streak that dates back to the beginning of the 2015 season. That ties for the ninth longest winning streak of ACC games in league history with NC State's string of 14 during the 1972-74 seasons.

**15** - Miami **PK Michael Badgley** has made all 15 of his career field goal attempts from between 40 and 49 yards.

**24** - With its win over Pitt, **Virginia Tech** became bowl eligible for the 24th consecutive year. That is the longest current streak in the nation recognized by the NCAA.

**38** - In just eight games this year, Louisville sophomore **QB Lamar Jackson** has totalled 38 TDR. That ties for the fifth-best single season total in ACC history. Earlier, Jackson became the first ACC player in history to run for 15 touchdowns and throw for 15 in the same season.

**36** - With 36 points in its loss to Virginia Tech, **Pitt** becomes only the fourth team in ACC history to score 36 or more points in seven straight games. It joins FSU in 2013 (13 straight); Clemson in 2012 (10 games); and

FSU in 1995 (seven) on the list.

**48** - The number of career touchdowns for Pitt's **James Conner**. Conner has 46 rushing touchdowns, which has him third on the all-time ACC list. The total of 48 TDs puts him in eighth place on the ACC career list.

**50.0** - **Louisville** continues to lead the nation in scoring offense, averaging 50 points a game. The Cardinals also lead the nation in total offense, averaging 603.3 yards per game.

**93.6** - **Boston College** ranks fourth in the nation in rushing defense. The Eagles have allowed just 93.6 yards per game on the ground and held NC State to just 31 yards on the ground. Wolfpack RB Matthew Dayes had previously topped 100 rushing yards in five of State's previous seven games.

**179** - Virginia senior **RB Taquan Mizzell** has made 179 catches in his career. That's more than any other running back in ACC history. His total is currently 17th among all active players in the FBS.

**195** - The number of rushing yards for Georgia Tech **QB Justin Thomas** against Duke, the fourth largest single-game effort by an ACC quarterback in history. Thomas became only the fourth player nationally since 2000 to record 195 rushing yards and pass for more than 250 yards in a single game.

**214** - With eight receptions against Virginia on Oct. 22, North Carolina senior **WR Ryan Switzer** zoomed into the career Top 10 of the ACC's receptions list. Switzer now has 214 career catches, which places him ninth on the all-time list behind Wake Forest's Desmond Clark (216) and Michael Campanaro (229).

**276.97** - The pass efficiency rating for Georgia Tech **QB Justin Thomas** against Duke. The mark would be the second highest in the FBS and highest among power five players if Thomas had attempted the minimum number of passes (15) to qualify. He attempted 14. Just adding an incompleteness and his rating would be 258.51, which still would be the sixth-best day by an FBS QB, an impressive statistic that doesn't take into account his 195-yard rushing afternoon.

The events covered by ACC Network Extra will be immediately available to users who have access to WatchESPN and the ESPN app. More than 600 total Olympic sporting events – encompassing the Fall, Winter and Spring seasons – will be carried exclusively by ACC Network Extra during the 2016-17 academic year.

# Collaborative Instant Replay

NCAA Football Rules require that all instant replay equipment and personnel be located in the stadium. For the 2016 season, the Football Rules Committee has approved a one-year experimental exception which allows conferences to use a “collaborative” process for instant replay. Under this exception, personnel in a location away from the stadium may assist the replay official at the stadium in making replay decisions.

The ACC has approved the implementation and use of a collaborative replay system for the 2016 season. Under this system, replay officials located in the Conference’s Game Day Operations Center (GDOC) in Greensboro will have the ability to view exactly what the in-stadium replay officials are viewing in real time. The replay officials in the GDOC will also be able to participate in the communication between the referee and the in-stadium replay official.

In order to implement this process, technology enhancements and upgrades are taking place this summer, both at the ACC GDOC and at all of the ACC’s stadiums. This will allow the replay officials in the GDOC and the in-stadium replay officials to simultaneously view the same camera angles of a play under review, and to communicate with one another, and with the referee.

The expected benefits of this collaborative process are greater consistency and accuracy in replay decisions

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### **WHO WILL BE THE REPLAY OFFICIALS LOCATED IN THE GDOC?**

**ANSWER:** They will be experienced replay officials who have consistently performed at a high level as in-stadium replay officials.

### **Q: HOW MANY REPLAY OFFICIALS WILL BE IN THE GDOC ON GAME DAYS?**

**A:** There will be from one to three officials, depending on the number of games.

### **Q: WHAT WILL BE THEIR ROLE IN THE REPLAY PROCESS?**

**A:** Their role will be to assist the in-stadium replay officials in the replay decision-making process, to ensure that the decisions being made are in accordance with the replay rules and are consistent with the replay philosophies established nationwide.

### **Q: TO WHAT VIDEO WILL THE OFFICIALS IN THE GDOC HAVE ACCESS?**

**A:** They will have access to the same video that the in-stadium replay officials are provided, at the same time.

### **Q: WILL THE OFFICIALS IN THE GDOC BE ABLE TO COMMUNICATE WITH THE IN-STADIUM REPLAY OFFICIALS?**

**A:** Yes, they will be able to speak with the in-stadium replay officials, and they will also have the capability to be involved in the communication with the referee during the replay process.

### **Q: DO THE ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE IN-STADIUM REPLAY OFFICIALS CHANGE AS A RESULT OF THIS NEW PROCESS?**

**A:** No, the in-stadium replay officials will operate exactly as they have done in past seasons.

### **Q: DOES THIS NEW PROCESS CHANGE THE TYPES OF PLAYS THAT ARE REVIEWABLE?**

**A:** No, having this new system neither adds to nor deletes from the list of reviewable plays.

### **Q: DOES THIS NEW PROCESS CHANGE THE REPLAY STANDARD OF REVIEW?**

**A:** No, in order to reverse an on-field ruling, there still must be indisputable video evidence that the ruling on the field was incorrect.

### **Q: IN WHAT GAMES WILL THIS NEW SYSTEM BE USED?**

**A:** The collaborative replay system will be used in all games played at ACC stadiums and at Notre Dame.

# Noting the ACC--The Coaches

## Four ACC Coaches In Top 15 in Wins Per Season



With the addition of **Mark Richt** and **Bronco Mendenhall** to the ACC, the league now features five of the top 11 coaches nationally in wins per season. Led by Florida State's **Jimbo Fisher**, who has averaged 11.33 wins during his first six seasons as a head coach, four other ACC coaches rank among the nation's top 11 coaches in wins per season with a minimum of five seasons as a head coach.



Miami's **Richt** is fifth (9.67), followed by Clemson's **Dabo Swinney** (7th), Louisville's **Bobby Petrino** (10th) and Virginia's **Bronco Mendenhall** is 11th.

Georgia Tech's **Paul Johnson** is not far behind, averaging 8.84 wins a year, which puts him in 14th place. **Beamer**, the winningest active FBS head coach, retired after the 2015 Camping World Independence Bowl.

Georgia Tech's **Paul Johnson**, in his 20th year as a head coach, is ranked fifth in the NCAA's FBS in career victories with a total of 173 triumphs. Johnson is one of five current ACC coaches who rank among the FBS Top 25 in career wins. Johnson is joined by Miami's **Mark Richt**, who is 10th on the active FBS list with 149 career wins. Louisville's **Bobby Petrino** is tied for 19th with 107 wins, while **Bronco Mendenhall** of Virginia is tied for 22nd with **Dave Clawson** of Wake Forest (100).

Now in his seventh season as head coach at Florida State, **Jimbo Fisher** is in select company among ACC football coaches. Fisher has compiled a 70-15 record (.824) during that time. His winning percentage is the best of any first-time ACC head coach after six seasons and is second only to Fisher's predecessor at FSU, Bobby Bowden,

## ACC Divisional Tiebreaker

If more than one team in the same division is tied for the best winning percentage in its Conference games, the procedures listed below will be followed to determine the division's representative in the ACC Championship Game:

### Two-Team Tie:

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall win percentage. (Divisional and non-divisional) and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken from first-to-last using the league's tiebreaking procedures.
4. Overall win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined win percentage vs. all non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based on their order of finish (overall conference win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the higher ranking by the Team Rating Score metric provided by SportSource Analytics following the conclusion of regular season games.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw.(as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.)

### Three-Team (or More) Team Tie:

(Once a team is eliminated from the tie, the tie-breaker procedures restart for the remaining teams. If the three (or more) team tie can be reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaker format will then be applied.)

1. Combined head-to-head win percentage among the tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall (divisional and non-divisional) Conference win percentage, and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken first to last, using the league's tie-breaker policies.
4. Combined win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Overall win percentage versus non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based upon their order of finish (overall win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional opponents based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking by the Team Rating Score metric provided by SportSource Analytics following the conclusion of regular season games.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.

## COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

The College Football Playoff begins its third year of operation after two highly-acclaimed years of operation season. The Playoff features the top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and a national championship game played in a different city each year. Each semifinal is played during the New Year's holiday with the National Championship Game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later.

The College Football Playoff selection committee chooses the four teams for the playoff based on their performance during the regular season, including, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams are seeded so that #1 will play #4 in one semifinal and #2 will meet #3 in the other, with the winners advancing to the national championship game. The selection committee announces its rankings each week on Tuesdays beginning this year on Nov. 1. The final rankings will be announced on Sunday, Dec. 4.

The semifinals rotate among six different bowls: the Chick-fil-A Peach, Goodyear Cotton, Fiesta and Capital One Orange Bowls; the Rose Bowl presented by Northwestern Mutual and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight other teams in four compelling matchups.

## ACC Bowl Quick Selection Order

(The ACC is in the third year of six-year contracts with its current bowl partners. The current College Football Playoff format is a 12-year agreement)

### College Football Playoff (four teams)

If the ACC Champion is not in one of the semifinal games this year, it will appear the Capital One Orange Bowl. There is no limit on how many teams the College Football Playoff may choose from a particular conference. There is also a possibility an ACC team could be chosen for a berth in one of the New Year's Six Bowls if it is ranked high enough. This year only one at-large spot is open in a New Year's Six Bowl, that would be in the Goodyear Cotton Bowl.

### Capital One Orange Bowl

The ACC champion, if not in the College Football Playoff, will appear this year in the Capital One Orange Bowl. The opponent will be the highest-ranked available team from the SEC, Big Ten or Notre Dame. If the ACC champion is selected for the College Football Playoff, then the next highest ranked ACC team will serve as the host team in the Capital One Orange Bowl.

### Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl

In a year in which the Capital One Orange Bowl will not host the national semifinals, and the ACC opponent in the Orange Bowl is a team from the Big Ten, then the ACC will have a team selected to the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl prior to the selection for the Russell Athletic Bowl.

### Russell Athletic Bowl

Has first pick of ACC teams in 2016 after the College Football Playoff, the Capital One Orange Bowl, the Host Bowls (if applicable) and the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl (only should the ACC Orange Bowl opponent be a team from the Big Ten).

All have equal selection status

### The One-Win Rule Applies Only to Notre Dame

The ACC's bowl selection will no longer be bound by the rigidity of a "one-win rule" but will have a general list of criteria to emphasize regionality and quality matchups on the field. A one-win rule does apply to Notre Dame's participation in the ACC Bowl structure. Notre Dame is eligible for ACC Bowl selection beginning with the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl and continuing through the league's bowl selections. However, Notre Dame must be within one win of the ACC available team which has the best overall record, in order to be chosen. In other words, if an ACC team was 9-3, a 7-5 Notre Dame team could not be chosen in its place. Notre Dame would have to be 8-4 to be chosen over a 9-3 league team.

### ACC Bowl Expenses And Revenue

The Atlantic Coast Conference shares all bowl revenues. Each school is provided an initial expense allotment. The Conference will share in the cost of unsold tickets for participating bowl institutions. After all bowl expense allotments and ticket reimbursements are subtracted from the total bowl revenue, the remaining revenue is distributed evenly among ACC schools.

# The ACC In Overtime

## The ACC & Overtime

When NC State ended regulation tied with Clemson at 17-17 on October 14, 2016, they played the 78th game featuring an ACC team that has had to go to extra sessions. Of the 78 overtime contests, a large portion of them--31--have been played in September. Games have gone into overtime for ACC teams a total of 20 times in November, while 15 have been played in October, three in August, seven in December and two in January (2006 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl). Of the 78 overtime contests, 39 have been ACC games while 39 nonconference games have gone into overtime. The home team has a 42-26 advantage in the 68 games played on campus. The team which wins the toss has a 41-37 record. Fifty-seven of the games were decided in the first overtime with 14 games in double overtime, six in triple overtime and one in four overtimes.
