

VIRGINIA ONE OF 13 IN LAST EIGHT NCAA TOURNAMENTS

- Virginia is one of 13 Division I baseball programs to reach the NCAA tournament each of the last eight seasons (including 2011).
- The Cavaliers are one of four schools in the ACC to hold that distinction, joining Florida State, Miami and North Carolina.
- The other programs are Arizona State, Arkansas, Cal State Fullerton, Oral Roberts, Rice, South Carolina, Southern Miss, TCU and Texas.

WAHOOS ENTER TOURNEY WITH NINE LOSSES

- Virginia is one of eight teams since 2000 that have entered the NCAA tournament with fewer than 10 defeats.
- Two teams last year started the NCAA tournament with single-digit losses, but in the 10 prior seasons only five squads did so.
- The list of single-digit loss teams since 2000:
 - South Carolina (2000 - 8)
 - Southern (2002 - 8; 2003 - 5)
 - Tulane (2005 - 9)
 - Miami (2008 - 8)
 - Coastal Carolina (2010 - 7), Arizona State (2010 - 8)
 - Virginia (2011 - 9)

CAVALIERS AGAINST THE 2011 NCAA FIELD

- Virginia faced nine teams this year that advanced to the NCAA tournament (Clemson, Coastal Carolina, East Carolina, Florida State, Georgia Tech, James Madison, North Carolina, NC State, Miami).
- Twenty-six of Virginia's 58 games were against NCAA qualifiers. UVa went 18-8 against those teams.

EIGHT CAVALIERS SELECTED IN 2011 MLB DRAFT

- Virginia had eight players selected in the 2011 MLB First-Year Player Draft, one shy of the school's 2010 record.
- LHP Danny Hultzen was UVa's highest draft pick ever, going second overall to Seattle; the previous UVa high pick was Ryan Zimmerman, who went fourth overall to Washington in 2005.
- C John Hicks (4th round, SEA), RHP Will Roberts (5th round, CLE), INF Steven Proscia (7th round, SEA), RHP Tyler Wilson (10th round, BAL) and C Kenny Swab (20th round, KC) were drafted on day two.
- Cody Winiarski (36th round, CWS) and John Barr (39th round, CLE) went on day three.
- UVa was one of seven teams nationally with three pitchers taken in the first 10 rounds of the draft (Vandy - 6; Cal State Fullerton and Oregon - 4; Virginia, Florida, Kent State, Texas - 3).

RECAPPING THE REGIONAL

- Virginia won three straight games in the Charlottesville Regional to advance to the super regional.
- UVa thoroughly dominated, outscoring its foes 29-3. The Cavaliers did not trail in the regional and were tied for just one inning.
- UVa's pitching stole the show, as the Cavalier hurlers allowed just three runs and 18 hits (.189 BAA). They struck out 42 (14 in each game) and walked only four.
- The Cavaliers dominated in all facets of the game, with a .366 batting average, 1.00 ERA and .990 fielding percentage in the three games of the regional.
- Seven Cavaliers were named to the all-tournament team, highlighted by Danny Hultzen, who was a unanimous selection as the Most Outstanding Player.

CAVALIERS ALLOW THREE RUNS IN REGIONAL

- Virginia gave up only three runs in the regional.
- That is the second-fewest number of runs allowed in an NCAA regional since the tournament went to a 64-team format in 1999.
- The low is two, set by UVa in 2009 at the Irvine Regional.
- The three runs allowed in the regional matches the mark set by Arizona State in 2003.

MORE REGIONAL NUGGETS

- Will Roberts threw a shutout in the opener vs. Navy, marking UVa's first-ever complete-game shutout in the NCAA tournament (47 games).
- He also set a UVa tourney record with 14 strikeouts.
- UVa committed just one error in the regional.
- In addition to Hultzen (P), John Hicks (C), Chris Taylor (SS), Steven Proscia (3B), John Barr (OF), David Coleman (OF) and Will Roberts (P) also were named to the all-tournament team.

CHARLOTTESVILLE REGIONAL ATTENDANCE RANKS FOURTH AMONG HOST SITES

- The Charlottesville Regional ranked third in average attendance last week among the 16 regional host sites.
- The regional at Davenport Field drew an average of 4,467 fans per game (26,799 total), including sellouts of 5,050 for games 4 and 6.
- Columbia, S.C. (6,318) and Austin, Texas (5,632) were the only sites to average more.
- Clemson, S.C. (4,018) and College Station, Texas (3,911) followed Charlottesville.

UVA BREAKS SINGLE-SEASON WINS RECORD

- The 2011 Virginia team broke the UVa single-season wins record on Sunday with its 52nd triumph of the year.
- UVa topped the 2010 team's total of 51 (set in 65 games).
- UVa leads all Division I teams in wins this year and joins Vanderbilt as the lone teams with 50 wins entering the super regionals.

HOME COOKIN'

- Virginia has won 33 home games this season, which is fourth most nationally behind North Carolina, South Carolina and Texas (34 each).
- In going 33-4 at Davenport Field, UVa has the fourth-most home wins in Division I baseball this year.
- UVa is one win shy of its single-season record for home wins, set last season.
- The Cavaliers are 96-17 at home since 2009.

UVA SHATTERS PROGRAM STRIKEOUT RECORD

- Virginia has recorded 613 strikeouts this season, breaking the program record.
- The previous record of 593 was set in 2009 (65 games).
- For the first time, Virginia boasts two pitchers with 100 or more strikeouts in the same season, as Danny Hultzen has fanned 148 and Tyler Wilson 111.
- Will Roberts is not far behind with 90 strikeouts.
- Virginia averages 10.09 strikeouts per nine innings, which is second most in school history (10.88, 1949).

RECAPPING THE ACC BASEBALL CHAMPIONSHIP

- Virginia swept through the ACC Baseball Championship with four straight victories, with the final three all coming over top-20 foes.
- UVa run-ruled Wake Forest in the opener, then downed Miami, UNC and FSU to win the title.
- Steven Proscia was named the tournament's Most Valuable Player after going 7-for-16 with a pair of homers, five RBI and five extra-base hits.
- Chris Taylor (SS) and Kenny Swab (OF) joined Proscia (3B) on the all-tournament team.
- UVa pitchers surrendered just nine runs in the tournament, good for a 2.38 ERA.
- After hitting .190 in the previous six games, UVa's bats came alive to hit a tournament-best .328 with 18 extra-base hits.

CAVALIERS WIN NINE OF 10 ACC SERIES

- By winning all but one of its league series this season, Virginia joined elite company nationally.
- Among the five major baseball conferences (ACC, Big XII, C-USA, Pac-10, SEC), only four teams suffered just one series loss.
- Oregon State (Pac-10), South Carolina (SEC) and Texas (Big XII) each absorbed one conference series loss. No teams in the major conferences won every league series (UVa and Oregon State were the last to lose a series).

UVA JOINS SELECT FEW TO WIN NINE ACC SERIES

- Virginia won nine ACC series for the second time in program history and the second straight year.
- UVa is the first ACC team to win nine league series in back-to-back seasons.
- Since the ACC went to the 10-series format in 2005, only six teams have won nine or more ACC series in a year (UVa in 2010, Miami and UNC in 2008, FSU in 2007 and Clemson in 2006).
- UVa won four of its ACC series by sweeps.

RECORD-TYING SEVEN ALL-ACC HONOREES

- Seven Virginia players earned All-ACC honors, tying a program record set in 2010.
- First team: David Coleman (OF), John Hicks (C), Danny Hultzen (SP), Branden Kline (RP), Steven Proscia (3B).
- Second team: John Barr (OF) and Tyler Wilson (SP).
- Hultzen was named the ACC Pitcher of the Year for the second straight year; he is the only Cavalier to ever win the award and the first at any school to win it twice.
- Brian O'Connor was named the ACC Coach of the Year for the second year in a row and the third time in his career (2004, 2010, 2011).

2011 TEAM IS FASTEST TO 40 WINS IN SCHOOL HISTORY

- With its 40-3 start, the 2011 Virginia team reached 40 wins in the fewest number of games in program history and tied for fewest in ACC history (Clemson, 1995).
- Virginia hit the 40-win plateau in game 49 last year (May 4 vs. VCU).
- This also marks the first time Virginia has reached 40 wins prior to the month of May.
- UVa has won 40 or more games in seven of the last eight seasons.

CAVALIERS RANKED NO. 2 IN LATEST RPI

- UVa was ranked No. 2 in the latest RPI report, announced May 31 by the NCAA.
- UVa held the No. 2 spot for the first two weeks, then supplanted Florida for the No. 1 position for a week before sliding back to No. 2 behind the Gators. UNC took over the top slot last week.
- Virginia is 12-6 against the RPI top 25 and 18-8 against the top 50 this year.

OVERLOOKED OFFENSE?

- While Virginia's pitching has received much of the acclaim, its offense has been strong as well.
- Virginia stands ninth nationally in runs (443) and 10th in scoring (7.3 per game) this year.
- UVa ranks fourth nationally in doubles with 143 (second most in program history - 160 in 2010).
- The Cavaliers rank second in the ACC and 26th nationally in batting at .308.

SPREADING THE WEALTH ON OFFENSE

- Ten Virginia players have driven 20-plus runs each this season.
- This is just the fourth time this has occurred for a UVA baseball team, including the second straight year.
- UVa also had 10 players reach 20 RBI in 1988, 2007 and 2010.

VIRGINIA VS. RANKED TEAMS

- Virginia has played 20 games against six ranked teams this season (14-6 record).
- Ten of Virginia's last 13 games have come against ranked squads.
- UVa won two of three against then-No. 4 Florida State (March 18-20), then-No. 8 Georgia Tech (April 8-10) and then-No. 16 Miami (May 13-15).
- The Cavaliers swept then-No. 4 Clemson on the road (March 11-13) and won 13-2 at then-No. 23 Auburn (Feb. 19).
- UVa was swept at then-No. 13 UNC (May 18-20) but rebounded to beat Miami, UNC and FSU at the ACC Baseball Championship.
- The Cavaliers downed East Carolina last Sunday in the regional.
- Virginia is 45-24-1 against ranked foes since 2009.

CAVALIERS SUCCEED AT RUNNING GAME

- The Cavaliers have been extremely successful on the basepaths of late, going 42-for-52 (80.7 percent) in stolen base attempts since April 1 (34 games).
- In the first 27 games, UVa was 41-for-62 (66.1 percent) in its stolen base tries.

VIRGINIA RANKS IN TOP 20 IN ATTENDANCE

- Entering the tournament (through 32 dates), UVA ranked 22nd nationally in total attendance in 2011 at 95,356.
- This marks a regular season attendance record for Virginia Baseball.
- UVa also stood 20th in average attendance at 2,979 fans per game.
- UVa currently has played in front of 110,205 fans this year at home (3,148 average).
- UVa has played in front of 17 home crowds of 3,000-plus this season, including a midweek record of 3,128 on Wednesday, April 20 vs. Richmond.

O'CONNOR REACHES 350 WINS IN FEWEST GAMES IN ACC HISTORY

- In his eighth season as Virginia's head coach, Brian O'Connor stands at 368 wins entering the NCAA Super Regional (368-127-1); he reached 350 on April 15.
- He posted 350 wins in the fewest number of games in ACC history (472).
- Mike Martin of Florida State was the fastest in ACC history to reach 350 wins (while a member of the ACC). He needed 478 games (in seven seasons from 1992 to 1998) to reach the mark.
- Other current coaches of note in the ACC: Jack Leggett (Clemson) and Danny Hall (GT) each needed 487 games to reach 350 wins (350-137 each).

BIG APRIL LIFTS COLEMAN TO TOP OF ACC BATTING

- David Coleman enters the super regional second in the ACC with a .369 batting average; he trails Brad Miller of Clemson (.395).
- Coleman was named a First-Team All-ACC honoree and earned all-tournament team honors last week.
- After a solid freshman year (.288 average in 50 games), Coleman played sparingly as sophomore and junior (68 games) before breaking out this year.
- Coleman recorded a monster April, hitting .549 (28-for-51) with a team-best 21 RBI during the month.
- He had a career-long 11-game hitting streak snapped at VCU on May 3.
- Coleman posted a pair of four-hit games in April and notched hits in 16 of the 17 games in which he played in the month (only exception was the 5-inning rain-shortened game).

PITCHING HAS BEEN LINCHPIN TO SUCCESS

- Virginia is the lone team to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts per nine innings and fewest hits and walks allowed per nine innings.
- UVa stands in the top-5 in all of those categories as of the May 29 report: ERA (1st, 2.27), strikeouts/9 innings (1st, 10.1), fewest hits/9 inns (3rd, 6.76), fewest walks/9 inns (4th, 2.25).
- UVa has allowed more than four earned runs just seven times this year.

PITCHING, DEFENSE COMBINE FOR LETHAL COMBO

- Virginia boasts a strong tandem of pitching and defense this year.
- UVa has allowed just 2.7 runs per game, fewest in Division I baseball. Texas, UCLA and Vanderbilt are tied for second fewest at 2.8 per game.
- Virginia enters the week with a .980 fielding percentage which is fourth nationally.
- UVa has committed 44 errors in 61 games.
- The Cavaliers set a school record in 2010 with a .977 fielding percentage.

WAHOOS RACK UP ACC-RECORD 15 SHUTOUTS

- Virginia has recorded 15 shutouts among its 52 wins this season, breaking the ACC record.
- The conference record of 11 shutouts was held by the 1977 Clemson and 2005 Virginia teams.
- UVa leads all Division I teams with 15 shutouts this year (Texas ranks second with 13).
- The NCAA single-season shutout record is 24, set by the 1972 Arizona State team.
- UVa posted two shutouts in 2010 and five in 2009.

VIRGINIA CUTS DOWN ON BASES ON BALLS

- UVa pitchers have reduced their bases on balls by more than one per game this season, walking just 137 batters (2.25/9 innings). In 2010 UVa averaged 3.31 walks per nine innings.
- This has been key to UVa racking up an ACC-leading 2.27 team ERA.
- UVa walked just four batters in the regional.
- UVa leads the ACC and ranks fourth nationally in fewest walks per nine innings this year.

CAVALIERS STRIKE FOR BIG INNINGS

- Virginia has a tendency to score in bunches, with 67 innings of three runs or more this season.
- The Cavaliers' single-inning high is 10 runs vs. Maryland; UVa scored nine in an inning vs. Duke as well.
- UVa has scored three runs in 37 different innings.
- On the flip side, Virginia has allowed just 17 innings of three or more runs (nine 3-run innings, five 4-run innings, two 5-run innings, one 6-run inning).

PAIR OF 10-GAME WIN STREAKS

- For the first time, UVa has recorded a pair of win streaks of 10 games or more in the same season.
- Virginia had a 12-game win streak which started March 22 and ended April 10 at Georgia Tech.
- The Cavaliers took 13 straight from March 1-19.
- The loss to Georgia Tech also snapped a school-record 11-game game road win streak.

VIRGINIA 42ND PROGRAM TO 2,000 WINS

- Virginia became the 42nd Division I program to reach 2,000 all-time wins on March 29 with its win over George Washington.
- The Cavaliers have won 2,027 games all time (1,617 losses, 40 ties).

HULTZEN NAMED GOLDEN SPIKES FINALIST

- Golden Spikes Award finalist Danny Hultzen ranks second in the nation in strikeouts this year with 148, trailing Trevor Bauer of UCLA (203).
- Hultzen, Bauer and Taylor Jungmann (Texas) are finalists for the GSA.
- Hultzen has struck out at least nine batters in 11 of his 15 starts this season (12.89 per nine innings - second in nation to Bauer, 13.32).
- He has issued only 18 walks (8:1 strikeout to walk ratio).
- UVa is 12-3 in Hultzen's starts this year and 36-11 in his career, including 26-5 since 2010; UVa is 14-1 when Hultzen racks up 10 or more strikeouts.

• With 148 strikeouts this season, Hultzen ranks first in UVa single-season history; he passed Tim Burcham (146 in 1985) for the top spot last week.

HULTZEN OWNS UVA STRIKEOUTS RECORD, MOVES UP ACC CHART

- Hultzen broke the Virginia career strikeouts record earlier this season. With 378 career strikeouts Hultzen has passed Seth Greisinger (1994-96), who had 290.
 - By passing Greisinger, Hultzen also moved into the top 25 on the ACC's all-time strikeouts ledger. He currently is seventh in career strikeouts in ACC history.

HULTZEN CAN HIT TOO

- Danny Hultzen swings a good bat too, as he showed in the regional; he went 7-for-11 (.636) as he earned the regional's Most Outstanding Player honors.
- He drove in five runs in the regional.
- Hultzen is batting .336 this year, has driven in 34 runs and owns a stellar .423 on base percentage.

WILSON ALSO MOVING UP VIRGINIA CHARTS

- Tyler Wilson has joined Hultzen on the top 10 lists at Virginia.
- Wilson now owns 25 career wins, which is third in Virginia history (25-7, 2.93 ERA).
- He ranks fourth in career pitching appearances at UVa with 88 (17 starts).
- Wilson has racked up 254 career strikeouts, which ranks fourth in UVa history; with seven strikeouts he will match Brandon Creswell (1998-2001) for third.

WILSON SEAMLESSLY MOVES TO ROTATION

- After pitching out of the bullpen for most of his first three seasons, including 51 straight relief outings entering the season, Tyler Wilson has shifted to the week-end rotation in 2011.
- He is 8-0 with a 2.34 ERA in 14 starts (16 appearances) this year. In 88.1 innings he has allowed just 62 hits and 21 walks with 111 strikeouts (fifth most in ACC, sixth in UVa single-season history).
- Batters are hitting .197 against him this year. That is third lowest in the ACC.

WILSON A FINALIST FOR SENIOR CLASS AWARD

- Tyler Wilson has been named one of 10 finalists for the 2011 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award for baseball.
- The award will be announced June 24 at the College World Series.
- An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.
- A biology major, Wilson is planning to go into the medical field and become an orthopedic surgeon after his baseball career concludes.

ROBERTS CONTINUES STRONG PITCHING

- Will Roberts currently ranks among the ACC leaders in several categories.
- Roberts stands second in the ACC with a 1.61 ERA, is tied for third in the league in wins (11), tied for first in shutouts (3), second in complete games (3) and holds seventh in opponent batting average (.204).
- He is tied for 17th nationally in wins and 21st in ERA.
- Roberts has been a part of five shutouts in 2011—second to Kent State's Justin Gill (6) for most in the nation.
- He has walked 12 batters and hit two in 95.0 innings this year.

ROBERTS SCORELESS STREAK ENDS AT 26.2 INNS

- Will Roberts gave up a run-scoring single to Duke's David Perkins April 17 in the first inning, ending his scoreless innings streak at 26.2.
- That is the longest scoreless streak for a UVa pitcher since Sean Doolittle worked 29.0-consecutive scoreless innings from April 10-May 25, 2005.
- He had not allowed a run in his previous four starts (5.0 innings vs. Towson, 9.0 vs. George Washington, 7.0 vs. Radford, 5.0 vs. Georgetown).

- He last allowed a run in the sixth inning of the March 16 win over James Madison.

CAVALIERS GRIND OPPONENTS' RUNNING GAME TO A HALT

- Virginia has slowed its opponents on the basepaths, giving up just 22 stolen bases in 44 attempts.
- UVa has allowed the fewest stolen bases of any ACC team. FSU ranks second with 30 stolen bases allowed.
- In throwing out 50 percent of potential base stealers, UVa also tops the ACC. FSU is second at 42.4 percent (30-for-52).

KLING EMPHATICALLY SHUTS THE DOOR

- In his first season as the Virginia closer, sophomore righty Branden Kline has been brilliant with 17 saves.
- He is tied for fourth in the NCAA in saves, one behind Georgia's Tyler Maloof, East Tennessee State's Bo Reeder and Kent State's Kyle McMillen.
- The total also is the second most in a season in UVa history, behind Kevin Arico's 18 from 2010.
- Kline is one save shy of the ACC single-season record, which was matched by Arico last year.
- Kline has struck out 49 in 35.0 innings (team-high 28 games) with a 1.78 ERA.
- He pitched in 24 games (eight starts) as a freshman and was entrusted with big starts in the championship games of both the NCAA regional and super regional.

HICKS IN MIDST OF BIG OFFENSIVE YEAR

- John Hicks has posted a big year at the plate.
- He is batting .339, which ranks 11th in the ACC, and has 84 hits, which is fourth in the ACC.
- Hicks has reached base in all but four games this year.
- A semifinalist for the Johnny Bench Award, Hicks ranks in the ACC's top 10 in hits (4th, 84), doubles (T4th, 21), total bases (6th, 128), RBI (8th, 54).

HICKS MOVES UP UVA CAREER CHART

- John Hicks is third in Virginia history with 54 doubles, trailing only Tyler Cannon (62) and current teammate Steven Proscia (59).
- With 160 career runs scored, Hicks is ninth in career runs at Virginia, trailing Greg Miclat (2006-08) by a run.
- He currently has 237 career hits — 10th in UVa history.

PROSCIA LEADS TEAM IN ACC PLAY

- Steven Proscia notched Virginia's best batting average in ACC play, swinging it at a .341 clip (44-for-129). That ranked ninth in the conference.
- Proscia ranked second in the ACC with 44 hits in conference games. He tied for fourth in the ACC with 25 RBI in ACC games.
- Proscia racked up two or more hits in 14 of the 30 ACC games, with at least one hit in 21 of 30.

PROSCIA ETCHES NAME IN VIRGINIA CAREER RECORDS BOOK

- Steven Proscia stands out as one of Virginia's all-time top run producers, with a school-record 181 career RBI.
- He set the Virginia career RBI record April 30 at Boston College, moving past Sean Doolittle (2005-07, 167).
- Proscia now has 251 career hits, which ranks seventh in Virginia history. He passed Ryan Zimmerman (2003-05) for seventh on Sunday and needs four hits to tie Matt Street (2002-05) for sixth.
- Proscia also owns 59 career doubles, which is second in the Virginia career annals behind Tyler Cannon (2007-10) with 62.
- Proscia ranks seventh in career at bats with 762 and also owns 28 career homers, which is tied with Bill Narleski (1984-87) for sixth at UVa.

MOST MARCH WINS EVER ...

- UVa recorded its best month of March in program history.
- UVa won a school-record 19 games in March (19-1).
- It marks the third-best winning percentage for a UVa team in March (.950), behind only the 1967 (5-0) and 1971 (6-0) teams.

FOLLOWED BY SECOND-MOST WINS IN APRIL

- Virginia went 16-3 in April as it posted its second-most wins ever in the month.
- UVa went 18-4 in April 1996.
- It stands as UVa's second-best winning percentage ever in the month of April (.842), topped only by the 1959 team (7-1, .875).

SOUTHPAWS GIVE UVA MORE OPTIONS OUT OF 'PEN

- Virginia has added a quartet of left-handed options to its bullpen this year, with a healthy Scott Silverstein, sophomore Aaron Stull and freshmen Kyle Crockett and Ryan Ashooh.
- The lefties have combined to work 37.1 innings out of the bullpen and 44.1 innings total in 43 appearances.
- In 65 games last year, left-handers made just 25 appearances out of the bullpen for the Cavaliers.
- Silverstein did not pitch his first two seasons at UVa while recovering from shoulder surgery.

UVA BASEBALL PROGRAM HONORED FOR APR SCORES

- Virginia Baseball was one of three UVa programs to earn public recognition awards for its most recent multi-year Academic Progress Rate (APR) scores.
- The APR provides a real-time view of a team's academic success by tracking the progress of each student-athlete during the school year.
- By measuring eligibility and retention each semester or quarter, the APR provides a clear picture of the academic culture in each sport.

SEVEN CAVALIERS COMPLETE DEGREES

- Seven Virginia baseball players, including junior Will Roberts, graduated May 22 in ceremonies on the Lawn:
 - John Barr (foreign affairs)
 - Tyler Biddix (commerce)
 - David Coleman (foreign affairs)
 - Will Roberts (economics - graduated in three years)
 - Kenny Swab (foreign affairs)
 - Tyler Wilson (biology)
 - Cody Winiarski (chemistry)

ROBERTS RECORDS FIRST PERFECT GAME IN VIRGINIA HISTORY

- Will Roberts notched the first perfect game in Virginia baseball history on March 29 in a 2-0 win over George Washington at Davenport Field.
- Roberts is the second ACC pitcher to record a perfect game and just the eighth in Division I history to post a nine-inning perfect game.
- He needed only 98 pitches to finish off the perfect game.

ROBERTS NAMED NATIONAL PLAYER OF WEEK, ACC PITCHER OF WEEK

- After his perfect game-effort against George Washington, Will Roberts was named one of Collegiate Baseball's National Players of the Week, the publication announced April 4.
- He also was named the NCBWA National Pitcher of the Week
- In addition, Roberts earned ACC Pitcher of the Week honors for the first time.

BRANDON GUYER MAKES MLB DEBUT

- Former Cavalier Brandon Guyer made his Major League Baseball debut May 6 with the Tampa Bay Rays, starting in left field against the Baltimore Orioles.
- Guyer made quite a splash, hitting a 2-run home run on a 3-1 pitch off the Orioles' Zach Britton in his first at bat.
- He became just the 109th player in MLB history and the first in Rays' history to homer in his first career at bat.
- Guyer played at UVa from 2005-07 and became the 27th former Cavalier to reach the Major League level.
- He was optioned back to triple-A Durham on May 8 as the Rays needed another pitcher on the roster.

O'CONNOR RANKS FOURTH IN WIN PERCENTAGE ENTERING 2010

- UVa head coach Brian O'Connor entered 2011 with a career record of 316-118-1 (.728) and a 126-71-1 record in ACC play.
- O'Connor's 72.8 winning percentage ranked as the fourth best mark among active NCAA Division I coaches entering the 2011 season.
- The only coaches who own a higher winning percentage are Mike Martin (Florida State), Mike Fox (North Carolina) and Gene Stephenson (Wichita State).

VIRGINIA LEADS NATION IN ERA LAST SEVEN YEARS

- Virginia led all NCAA Division I teams in ERA over the past seven seasons (including 2011), boasting a 3.12 team ERA.
- UVa is the only school to rank in the top 20 in the country in ERA each of the last seven seasons, including No. 3 marks in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009.
- Virginia also is the only team in Division I to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts and fewest hits allowed each of the last three years.

- Virginia's defense has racked up the ACC's best fielding percentage since the current coaching staff arrived in 2004.
- Virginia has accumulated a .972 fielding percentage over the last seven years combined, including a school-record .977 mark last season (seventh nationally).
- Georgia Tech ranks second in the ACC over the same span with a .968 fielding mark.
