## THE GAME

- The No. 17/20-ranked University of Richmond Spiders football team will look to defeat an FBS opponent for the third time in the past six seasons when the team travels to Charlottesville to face Virginia on Saturday.
- At the helm of the Richmond program, head coach Danny Rocco has led the team to a share of the 2012 CAA Football conference title and five-straight wins dating back to the 2013 season.
- Saturday's game will mark the 32nd meeting between the University of Richmond and the University of Virginia. In a series dating back to the 1893 season, Virginia holds a record of 27-2-2 against the Spiders.

## QUICK SLANTS

- With its 55-10 season-opening win over Morehead State last Saturday, the Spiders extended their winning streak to five games dating back to last season.
- QB Michael Strauss (pictured) tossed three touchdowns passes in the victory last week, pushing his career total to 38 - ranking the senior third all-time in school history.
- WR Brian Brown had five receptions for a game-high 110 yards against the Eagles last week. Brown was one of 12 student-athletes to catch at least one pass for the Spiders against Morehead State.
- For the past two seasons, the Richmond defense has been amongst the national leaders in interceptions. In 2012, the Spiders led the country with 24 picks, while last year Richmond was ninth in the nation with 17 INTs.

## LAST TIME OUT

- The Spiders began the season with a 55-10 win over Morehead State at Robins Stadium. The win marked the ninth-straight home-opener win for the team.
- The Spiders racked up an impressive 643 yards of total offense in the victory, which ranks second all-time in school history.
- Quarterbacks Michael Strauss, Michael Rocco and David Broadus combined to go 28-for-41 for 408 yards, four touchdowns and one interception against the Eagles. The 408 passing yards are the fifth-most in school history.

**SPIDERS RACK UP YARDS AGAINST MOREHEAD STATE**

In its season-opening win over Morehead State on August 30, the Spiders racked up an impressive 643 yards of offense – second most in school history. The 55 points scored were the most for the team in a season-opening game and rank in a tie for eighth for any game in the program's 131 seasons.

**PASSING ATTACK POTENT IN OPENER**

Against Morehead State on August 30, the Richmond passing attack was again on display, as the team totaled 408 passing yards in the 55-10 victory. The 408 passing yards rank fifth all-time in school history for a single game. On the day, 12 student-athletes had at least one reception, led by sophomore WR Brian Brown who had five catches for a game-high 110 yards – his second career 100-yard receiving game.

**NON-LEAGUE BRILLIANCE**

Richmond has lost only one non-conference FCS game in the regular season since 2005, going 19-1 since then. The only setback during the stretch was a 12-10 loss at Gardner-Webb on September 14, 2013. Including the Spiders' annual game versus an FBS opponent, Richmond's non-conference regular-season record since 2007 is 17-6 (that includes wins at Duke in 2009 and 2011).

**STRAUSS, HAMLIN EARN CAA WEEKLY HONORS**

After helping lead the Richmond to a season-opening 55-10 win over Morehead State on August 30, QB Michael Strauss and RB Jeremiah Hamlin earned CAA Weekly honors. Strauss was named CAA Offensive Player of the Week after going 17-for-23 for 259 yards and three touchdowns. Hamlin was named CAA Rookie of the Week after netting 80 yards on just seven carries with a pair of scores.

**SPIDERS RANKED NO. 20/24 IN THE NATION**

With its impressive win over Morehead State, the Richmond Spiders moved up to No. 17 in the latest Sports Network Poll released on Monday – up three spots from the previous week. In the FCS Coaches Poll, the Spiders jumped four spots to No. 20 after being ranked No. 24 in the preseason poll.

**UVA. TIES FOR THE SPIDERS**

In total, six coaches and two players from Richmond have ties to the University of Virginia. Both QB Michael Strauss and QB Michael Rocco began their collegiate careers with the Cavaliers before transferring to Richmond, while UR head coach Danny Rocco spent five seasons as an assistant coach at Virginia. Assistant coaches Bob Trott (one season), Levern Belin (four seasons) and Bill Polin (two seasons) also spent time at UVA. Assistant coach Byron Thweatt graduated from Virginia in 2000 and was a two-time captain for the Cavaliers, while assistant coach Fontel Mines graduated from UVA. in 2007 after playing in 42 games for UVA.

**21 PLAYERS MAKE RICHMOND DEBUTS AGAINST MOREHEAD STATE**

In Richmond's 55-10 win over Morehead State on August 30, a remarkable 21 student-athletes made their first appearances for the Spiders. Of the 21 players who made their debut, nine of them were true freshman.

**STRAUSS NAMED TO PAYTON AWARD WATCH LIST**

QB Michael Strauss was one of 20 student-athletes named to the Walter Payton Award Watch List, which is awarded to the most outstanding player in the FCS. Strauss enters the 2014 season coming off the greatest season for any Richmond quarterback in program history. Last year, Strauss set or tied 14 school records, earning Third-Team All-CAA honors, ranking second in the nation in completions (333) and fifth in passing yards (3,808).

**BARNETTE SETS SCHOOL RECEIVING RECORD**

In 2013, WR Stephen Barnette became just the fourth Richmond receiver to surpass the 1,000-yard mark in a season. Barnette led the CAA, setting a Richmond single-season record with 1,189 yards, while ranking 10th in the nation.

**SPIDER PASSING OFFENSE ONE FOR THE BOOKS**

Last season, the Richmond offense set every game, season and career school record for passing. In total, six game, eight season and one career offensive record was broken. In the CAA rankings, the Spiders led the league in passing offense (328.2) and were second in total offense (441.4).

**ON THIS DATE IN SPIDER FOOTBALL HISTORY**

On September 6, 1980, the Richmond Spiders began the season with a 20-17 win over Bowling Green in Richmond. Under head coach Dan Shealy, the team won five games in 1980, more than they had won in any single season in four years.

**INTERCEPTIONS KEEP COMING FOR SPIDER DEFENSE**

For the past two seasons, the Richmond defense has been amongst the national leaders in interceptions. In 2012, the Spiders led the country with 24 picks, while last year Richmond was ninth in the nation with 17 INTs.

**THREE SPIDERS NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS**

Senior WR Stephen Barnette, senior OL Austin Gund and senior DL Evan Kelly were all named All-Americans leading up to the 2014 season. Barnette was named First-Team Preseason All-American by College Sports Madness, while Gund was named Third-Team by CSM. All three earned preseason recognition from both Beyond Sports Network and The Sports Network. The trio was also named preseason All-CAA by the league's coaches as well.

**SPIDERS EXTEND HOMER OPENER STREAK TO NINE**

With its 55-10 win over Morehead State on August 30, the Richmond Spiders extended their home-opener win streak to nine. At Robins Stadium, the Spiders are 5-0 in home openers, winning by an average margin of over 26 points.

**RICHMOND UNDEFEATED IN NIGHT GAMES AT ROBINS STADIUM**

In its seven night games at Robins Stadium, the Spiders have posted an undefeated mark of 7-0. Last season, the Spiders opened the 2013 campaign with a 34-0 victory over in-state rival VMI under the lights at Robins Stadium before a sell-out crowd and also took down in-state rival Liberty, 30-21. This year, UR began the season with a 55-10 win over Morehead State.

**SPIDERS PICKED TO FINISH THIRD IN THE CAA**

In the preseason poll released by the CAA, Richmond was tabbed to finish third in the conference, earning three first place-votes from the league's coaches and sports information directors. New Hampshire was tagged as the preseason favorite with 15 first-place votes. Villanova was picked second with two first-place votes, William & Mary was picked fourth followed by Towson, Delaware, Maine, James Madison, Stony Brook and Albany. Rhode Island and CAA newcomer Elon rounded out the preseason poll.

**RICHMOND ENDS 2013 WITH TWO IMPRESSIVE WINS**

After starting the season 2-6, the Richmond Spiders won their last four games, including a pair of impressive wins at No. 21 Delaware and versus No. 19 William & Mary. In fact, the back-to-back wins over ranked opponents were the first for the Spiders since the 2009 season.

**CHARLIE FISHER JOINS SPIDER COACHING STAFF**

In February, head coach Danny Rocco announced the hiring of former Penn State quarterbacks coach Charlie Fisher as Associate Head Coach, Director of Recruiting and wide receivers coach. At Penn State, Fisher coached freshman quarterback Christian Hackenberg to 2013 Big-10 Freshman of the Year honors and senior quarterback Matt McGloin to a Burlsworth Trophy in 2012.

**ROCCO LEADS RICHMOND TO SHARE OF 2012 CAA CHAMPIONSHIP**

In 2012, first-year head coach Danny Rocco led Richmond to a share of the CAA Football championship, posting an overall record of 8-3 and a conference mark of 6-2. The five-win turnaround is the second-best in the history of Richmond football, while the six-conference win improvement was the best in the CAA. The conference championship was the 11th in program history.

**THREE CAPTAINS NAMED FOR 2013 SEASON**

Senior OL Austin Gund was named a captain for the third-straight season, while seniors LB Aaron Roane and DB Reggie Barnette were also named captains for the 2014 season.

**THE TOTAL PACKAGE**

No other team in CAA Football has won more conference titles since 1998 than Richmond. The Spiders have six to their credit ('98, '00, '05, '07, '09, '12), two more than Massachusetts and Delaware. In 2008, Richmond became just the second-ever private school to win the FCS National Championship.

**FUTURE FBS OPPONENTS**

The Richmond Spiders announced their future FBS opponents, with Virginia playing a prominent role in the future schedule. The two teams will meet at least three more times in the near future – 2014, 2016 and 2018. The Spiders will play Maryland in 2015, Boston College in 2017, Pittsburgh in 2020 and Virginia Tech in 2021.

# DANNY ROCCO

## HEAD COACH

Third Season  
Wake Forest, 1984

After inheriting a Richmond Spiders football team that went 3-8 overall and 0-8 in CAA play in 2011, head coach Danny Rocco arrived in 2012 and immediately made good on the promise he made the day he was hired - return the Spider program back to its winning ways.

In 2012, Rocco led Richmond to a share of the CAA Football championship, posting an overall record of 8-3 and a conference mark of 6-2. The five-win turnaround is the second-best in the history of Richmond football, while the six-conference win improvement was the best in the CAA. The Spiders had numerous quality wins in 2012, defeating Villanova in Philadelphia, while also taking down then No. 2-ranked James Madison. Richmond also defeated perennial CAA power Delaware at Robins Stadium.

For his efforts, Rocco was named a finalist not only for the Eddie Robinson Award, but also the Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year Award. Both distinctions marked the fourth time that Rocco had been named a finalist for the two honors in his seven years as a head coach. Rocco was also named The Touchdown Club of Richmond's NCAA Division I Commonwealth of Virginia Coach of the Year.

Continuing the trend he set during his tenure at Liberty, the Spiders led the nation in turnover margin in 2012 (+22), while also leading the country in interceptions with 24. On the other side of the ball, Richmond's offensive line proved to be one of the finest in all of the FCS, leading the CAA and ranking in a tie for third nationally with just five sacks allowed all season.

In 2013, the Spiders entered the year ranked No. 14 in the country, rising to No. 12 after a season-opening win against VMI. At NC State, Richmond opened up a 21-10 lead in the second half against the Wolfpack, but a last-second field goal would propel NCSU past the Spiders.

Close losses and injuries cost Richmond early in the season, but the team responded under Rocco to win its final four games of the season in impressive fashion. After wins over CAA newcomers Albany and Stony Brook, the Spiders recorded an impressive, 46-43 win at No. 21 Delaware. Then in the final game of the season, Rocco led the team to its second-straight Capital Cup victory, 31-20, over No. 19-ranked William & Mary.

In two seasons under Rocco, Richmond players have earned 22 All-CAA honors, nine All-America accolades and one NFL Draft selection.

Prior to coming to Richmond, Rocco had one of the most successful coaching stints in the history of Liberty University. Rocco arrived at Liberty following the program's 1-10 finish in 2005 and transformed the program as the architect of six consecutive winning seasons with the Flames. During his first season in 2006, Liberty won five more games (6-5) than the previous year, an improvement that tied for the best FCS turnaround in the nation that season.

As a result of his immediate impact on the program, Rocco was named Big South Coach of the Year for the first time in school history in 2006, the first of three-straight years he would receive the honor. He would go on to be named a finalist for the national Eddie Robinson Award and Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year Award in each of the final three seasons in Lynchburg.

Since the team's stunning turnaround in 2006, Rocco's teams continued to dominate in the Big South Conference and beyond. The Flames rolled to a 47-20 overall record and an impressive 26-5 mark in Big South play under Rocco, winning no fewer than seven games in each of his final five seasons. Nationally, Liberty finished the last four years ranked inside the Top 25 in both major FCS polls.

During Rocco's six years at the helm in Lynchburg, the Flames captured their first-ever Big South Championship in 2007 - the first of three consecutive conference titles. During this four-year span, Rocco had the third-highest winning percentage among FCS coaches nationally with his 34-11 record (.756).

Liberty was able to achieve and sustain such success under Rocco by winning on both sides of the ball. From 2007-10, the Flames ranked first in the nation among FCS programs with

37.28 scoring average per game while ranking seventh by allowing just 19.17 points per game. The Flames were also the top-ranked team in FCS Football in turnover margin over the course of Rocco's first five seasons at Liberty.

Rocco's players undoubtedly excelled under his guidance at Liberty. He coached 97 Big South all-conference honorees and 19 players who garnered All-America honors, including a pair of consensus All-Americans in running back Rashad Jennings (2008) and kicker Matt Begins (2009, 2010).

Four of Rocco's student-athletes at Liberty, Vince Redd (New England), Stephen Sene (St. Louis), Trey Jacobs (Washington) and Rashad Jennings (Jacksonville) went on to play in the professional ranks in the National Football League. Jennings became Liberty's first NFL Draft selection in two decades when he was chosen in the seventh round by the Jaguars in 2009.

Prior to his arrival at Liberty, Rocco spent the previous five seasons at Virginia, beginning in 2001. Here, he helped guide the Cavaliers to four-consecutive bowl appearances, including back-to-back Continental Tire Bowl victories in 2002 and 2003, and 37 overall wins alongside Al Groh as an assistant head coach and linebacker coach.

Rocco would also serve as the Cavaliers' recruiting coordinator his first year in Charlottesville. His 2002 recruiting class was ranked in the top 10 in the nation by many of the major recruiting services, including a fifth-place ranking by ESPN. Rocco would quickly be promoted to associate head coach while continuing to serve as linebackers coach.

He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant coach at his alma mater, Wake Forest. He spent the 1984 and 1985 seasons with the Demon Deacons before being hired as the defensive line coach before the 1986 season.

Rocco was then hired by Colorado head coach Bill McCartney as an assistant linebackers coach for the 1987 season before heading to Tulsa to serve as the outside linebackers coach from 1998-2000.

He returned to the East Coast for the 1991-93 season to work for current New York Giants head coach Tom Coughlin as his defensive line coach at Boston College, helping Coughlin revitalize the Golden Eagle's return to the national stage as participants in the 1992 Hall of Fame Bowl and the 1993 Carquest Bowl.

Following his successful stint at Boston College, Rocco then served as the outside linebackers coach at the University of Texas at Austin, where the Longhorns captured three straight conference titles, including winning the inaugural Big 12 Championship in 1996 and earning bids to three consecutive bowl games (Sun Bowl, Sugar Bowl, Fiesta Bowl).

His career would then continue at Maryland, where he served as the linebackers coach during the 1998 and 1999 seasons before reuniting with his mentor, Groh, as an assistant linebacker and special teams coach with the New York Jets for the team's 2000 campaign. He would then follow Groh to Virginia for the 2001-2005 seasons.

Rocco began his college playing career at Penn State, where he earned two varsity letters and competed in the 1979 Liberty Bowl and the 1980 Fiesta Bowl before transferring to Wake Forest. While in Winston-Salem, he was a two-year starter and senior captain for Groh.

He was no stranger to coaching after growing up in a football family. His father, Frank Rocco, Sr., served as an assistant coach at Penn State under Hall of Fame coach Joe Paterno before joining the Liberty staff for a six-year stint in 2000. Frank Rocco, Jr., also joined the Flames staff in 2000 as a wide receivers and quarterbacks coach and received a promotion to offensive coordinator prior to his departure in 2003. Both he and brother, Dave, both currently coach at the high school level in Virginia.

A native of Huntingdon, Pa., Rocco is married to the former Julie Mills. They are the parents of two children, David and Amy.
