

TODAY'S GAME

- · Virginia hosts Maryland in the quarterfinals of the ACC Tournament
- It is the first ever ACC Women's Soccer Tournament game at Klöckner Stadium
- •The Cavaliers look to reach the ACC semifinals for the first time since 2008

SERIES HISTORY

- Virginia leads 25-4-4 (UVa leads 12-0-1 in Charlottesville)
- UVa has more wins over Maryland than any other opponent
- The Cavaliers won the regular season meeting 4-1 on Sept. 15 at Klöckner
- Virginia is 2-0-1 against the Terps in the ACC Tournament (last met in ACCT in 1994)

ACC TOURNAMENT HISTORY

- Virginia has an all-time record of 11-16-8 in the ACC Tournament
- UVa is 6-5-7 at the tournament during the Steve Swanson era
- The Cavaliers won the ACC Tournament in 2004
- Virginia is 1-1 at home in ACC Tournament games (UVa hosted the 1990 tourn.)

LAST TIME OUT

- Virginia ended the regular season with a 2-0 win over Miami on Thursday
- · Morgan Brian had both goals for her first career multi-goal game
- Chantel Jones posted her fourth consecutive shutout

ACCWIN STREAK

- Virginia ended the ACC regular season on a five-game winning streak
- It marked the longest ACC regular season win streak in school history
- The streak ties Virginia's longest win streak against ACC opponents (set in 2004, three regular season wins and two in the ACC Tournament)

SECOND PLACE 'HOOS

- Virginia tied its highest finish in the ACC by finishing in second place
- UVa also finished second in 1990, 1991, 1998, 2001, 2004 and 2005

CLEAN SHEETS

- Virginia posted six shutouts in ACC play, its most since having six in 2007
- The Cavaliers concluded the regular season with four straight shutouts

KLÖCK-WORK AT HOME

- Virginia went 5-0-0 at home in ACC play for just the third time in school history
- The Cavaliers also went 5-0-0 at home during the 2004 and 2005 ACC seasons
- UVa also had perfect ACC home records in 1998 (3-0-0) and 1990 (1-0-0)
- The Cavaliers are 11-1-1 overall at home this season
- With a win today, the Cavaliers would tie the school record for home wins in a season at 12 (set in 2005)

TAKING CARE OF BUSINESS ... WORKING OVERTIME

- Four of Virginia's 10 ACC games went to overtime (3-0-1 record)
- The Cavaliers' three overtime wins are their most since 2001
- UVa has two road OT wins in a season for the first time since 1998

TOP 10 WINS

- Virginia has three top-10 wins this season (Maryland, North Carolina, Florida St.)
- The last time UVa had three top-10 regular season wins was in 1999 (with four)

CHALLENGING SCHEDULE

- Eight of Virginia's opponents have been ranked at the time they played them
- 10 of 18 regular season opponents have been ranked this season
- · Virginia played a school-record seven consecutive games against ranked opponents this season
- UVa's opponents have a .649 winning percentage, second highest in the nation behind Florida State

ON THE AIR

- · Virginia appeared on television a school-record three times this season
- Games at North Carolina (ESPNU), at Duke (RSN) and vs. Virginia Tech (FSC) were on television
- The Cavaliers could have more broadcast opportunites in the postseason

MILLER HONORED BY ACC AGAIN

- Caroline Miller was named ACC Co-Player of the Week on Oct. 11
- She was honored for her two-goal performance against Florida State
- It was her second award of the season (third of her career)
- Miller was also honored on Sept. 25 after scoring the OT goal at North Carolina

ACC LEADERS

- Caroline Miller is tied for the ACC lead in goals (14)
- Erica Hollenberg is tied for the ACC lead in assists (8)
- Morgan Brian leads the ACC in shots (74)
- As a team, UVa leads the conference in goals (47) and assists (53)
