QUICK HITS - WEEK NINE

The ACC is the only conference with four teams ranked among the top 14 in this week's Associated Press Top 25 poll. Clemson leads the way at No. 7, followed by No. 8 Miami, No. 13 Virginia Tech and No. 14 NC State. The ACC has four of the top 15 in the Amway Coaches poll, including No. 7 Clemson, No. 8 Miami, No. 13 Virginia Tech and No. 15 NC State.

Week nine of the ACC schedule opens Friday, October 27, at 8 p.m. on ESPN with an Atlantic Division battle between Florida State and resurgent Boston College. The Eagles have won two ACC games in a row for the first time since 2014, and will look to end FSU's seven-game win streak in the series. Florida State has not lost to BC under current head coach Jimbo Fisher, and despite a 2-4 overall mark, the Seminoles are 2-0 on the road this year and have won six straight true road games.

Boston College's first-ever ACC football game was played on ESPN on a Thursday night in 2005 against FSU, a 28-17 Seminoles' victory when both teams were nationally-ranked.

One of just six Power 5 teams that remains unbeaten, No. 8/Miami (6-0 overall, 4-0 Coastal) travels to North Carolina for a noon kickoff

on Saturday, Oct. 28, on ESPN2. The Hurricanes continue to produce narrow victories, having won their last three by a total of 13 points, including a four-point win at Florida State, a one-point win over Georgia Tech and an eight-point win over Syracuse. Miami's average margin of victory in those three games is 4.3 points. The Tar Heels have won the last two games in the series, and twice have upset the Hurricanes in Kenan Stadium (2004, 2009) when Miami was ranked and UNC was not.

One of the most important games on the college football schedule this weekend is No. 14/15 NC State at No. 9/10 Notre Dame. The Wolfpack, led by midseason All-Americans Bradley Chubb on defense and Jaylen Samuels on offense, has won six in a row and is coming off a bye week. The Irish sport a similar 6-1 record and knocked off No. 11 USC last weekend, 49-14.

NC State is one of only three ACC schools to hold the advantage in its football series against the Irish (2-0). The Wolfpack won last year's game, 10-3, which was played in windy and rainy conditions caused by Hurricane Matthew. Saturday is NC State's first visit to South Bend, as the only previous game was a 28-6 Wolfpack triumph in the 2002 Gator Bowl.



QUICK HITS

ACC NC State is sixth nationally in defense against the run (91.3), while Notre Dame is sixth nationally in rushing offense (317.2).

ACC Virginia Tech, which boasts the nation's No. 5 overall defense, welcomes Duke to Blacksburg at 7:20 p.m. on the ACC Network. It is the first night game televised by the ACC Network/Raycom since the Raycom package began in 1984. Led by freshman signal caller Josh Jackson, the Hokies posted 59 points last week against North Carolina. Duke is coming off a 24-17 loss to Pitt.

ACC Duke has only won twice in Blacksburg in the history of the series, but both wins came on the Blue Devils' most recent trips to Lane Stadium in 2015 and 2013. The 2015 game was a four-overtime thriller, making it the longest game in ACC history. Virginia Tech holds an 11-2 advantage in ACC play, is 7-2 in Blacksburg and is 6-0 against Duke when the Hokies are nationally ranked. VT is fifth nationally in scoring defense (12.7), while the Blue Devils are averaging just 13.5 points a game in ACC play.

ACC Louisville heads to Winston-Salem for a 12:20 p.m. kickoff against Wake Forest on Saturday on the ACC Network. Louisville QB Lamar Jackson is one of just four players in ACC history with 11,000 career total yards of offense. Wake Forest is looking to halt a three-game skid after opening with four straight wins. This is only the fifth game between the two Atlantic Division rivals with Louisville having won the previous four.

ACC Louisville and Wake Forest first met in the 2007 FedEx Orange Bowl (after the 2006 season) when the Cardinals took a 24-13 decision. Louisville escaped with a 20-19 win in its only previous trip to Winston-Salem. Wake Forest leads the nation in tackles for loss, averaging 9.0 per game, while Louisville is 24th in fewest TFLs allowed at just 4.6 per game. The Deacons are tied for second in the nation in fewest turnovers lost (4), while the Cardinals are 95th (12).

ACC Virginia suffered its first conference loss last week to Boston College and looks to get back in the win column against Pitt at 12:30 p.m. on RSN. The Panthers earned their first ACC victory with a 24-17 win last Saturday over Duke.

ACC Pitt has won all four games against Virginia held in the Pitt Steel City, including both matchups in ACC play. Overall, the Panthers are 3-1 against the Cavaliers since Pitt joined the ACC in 2013.

ACC Georgia Tech's visit to No. 7/7 Clemson caps the weekend schedule at 8 p.m. and the game will be televised regionally on ABC and to the rest of the country on ESPN2 (reverse mirror). Clemson had an off week to prepare for the Yellow Jackets after suffering their only loss two weeks ago at Syracuse.

ACC Clemson holds 13-6 advantage in games against Georgia Tech played in Memorial Stadium and has won four of the last five meetings. The series began in 1898 in Augusta, but the two teams met 41 straight times in Atlanta between 1902 and 1973. The Tigers rank 13th nationally in run defense, allowing just 107.9 yards per game, while Tech is second nationally in rushing offense at 372.8 yards a contest.

ACC Led by Clemson's five, the ACC ranks first in wins (23) vs. teams with a .500-or-better record.

ACC Miami's No. 8 ranking in the AP poll is the highest for the Hurricanes since they were ranked seventh on Oct. 27 of 2013. NC State's No. 14 ranking is the highest for the Wolfpack since it was ranked 14th by

In The Rankings:

• Syracuse senior WR Steve Ishmael is second in the nation in total receptions (66), second in receptions per game (8.3), third in total receiving yards (843), and seventh in receiving yards per game (105.4). Ishmael is one of three ACC players in the top 10 in receptions per game. NC State's Jaylen Samuels is eighth (7.7) and Syracuse's Ervin Phillips is ninth (7.6).

• Boston College's Michael Walker leads the nation in combined return yardage. Walker, who is 10th nationally in punt return average (15.5), has 814 total return yards, including both punt (326) and kickoff (488) returns. North Carolina sophomore Anthony Ratliff-Williams is second with 664 yards, all on kickoff returns, while Pitt's Quadree Henderson is fifth with 609, and NC State's Nyheim Hines is 12th with 512.

• Miami's Braxton Berrios is sixth in the country in punt return average (16.5).

• NC State senior DE Bradley Chubb is second nationally in tackles for loss, averaging 2.0 per game. He is also seventh nationally in quarterback sacks, averaging 0.93 per game.

• Louisville QB Lamar Jackson leads the nation in total offense, averaging 418.3 yards per game. He is ahead of the ACC-record of 393.4 yards per game that he set last year. Syracuse junior QB Eric Dungey is currently eighth nationally in total offense, averaging 337.9 yards per game.

ACC Miami linebacker Michael Pinckney was named the Walter Camp National Defensive Player of the Week for his performance in the Hurricanes' 27-19 win over Syracuse. Pinckney had nine tackles, including 3.5 tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks. He is the third ACC player to be named national defensive player of the week by Walter Camp this season, joining Clemson DE Austin Bryant and Virginia LB Micah Kiser.

ACC When Virginia Tech returned a punt, a fumble and an interception for touchdown in its 59-7 win over North Carolina, it marked the first time this century that an ACC team has accomplished that feat. However, both Virginia Tech (2002) and Miami (2003) did it this century before joining the ACC. Hokie defensive tackle Ricky Walker returned a fumble 12 yards for a touchdown, safety Reggie Floyd returned an interception 61 yards for a score and safety Greg Stroman returned a punt 91 yards for a touchdown.

ACC Florida State's six opponents to date are 25-9 overall, a winning percentage of .727. That is the third-highest opponent winning percentage of any team in the nation. The Seminoles' schedule, including future opponents, ranks third nationally with a .656 winning percentage.

ACC Clemson has been ranked in the top 10 of the AP poll in each of the past 35 weeks. That ties Alabama for the longest current streak in the nation.

ACC Both Georgia Tech (Coastal Division) and Clemson (Atlantic Division) boast a .649 winning percentage in intra-divisional play. Both teams are 24-13 against their opponents in the opposite division. Tech and Clemson meet Saturday in the 11th intra-divisional game of the year. The Atlantic Division has a 6-4 advantage this year and holds a 115-107 lead since the beginning of divisional play in 2005. Since 2005, Tech and



Win Streaks:

- Miami's 11-game win streak is the second-longest in the country behind only USF (12 games). Miami won 10 in a row over the 2003-04 seasons, but has not won 11 consecutive since a 12-game streak in 2002.
- Florida State has won six straight true road games, which is the third-longest current streak in the FBS. The Seminoles are joined by Virginia Tech, which has won five straight road games and is tied for fourth, while both Miami and NC State have each won four consecutive road games and are each tied for 11th.
- Clemson has won eight straight over top 25 teams, the longest streak in Tiger history. The Tigers are 10-1 in matchups of top 15 teams over the last three years and 13-1 in its last 14 games against teams ranked in the top 25 of at least one poll.
- NC State's six-game win streak is eighth-best nationally.
- Georgia Tech has won seven straight at home, which is the seventh-longest in the country.

Clemson have split 12 regular season meetings.

Florida State head coach Jimbo Fisher (80-21, .792) and Clemson head coach Dabo Swinney (95-29, .766) are the two winningest coaches by percentage in ACC history.

Four ACC coaches are included on the Bobby Dodd Award Midseason Watch List, including Dave Doeren of NC State, Justin Fuente of Virginia Tech, Mark Richt of Miami and Dabo Swinney of Clemson. Swinney is a past winner of the Dodd Coach of the Year Award in 2011.

Louisville QB Lamar Jackson became the fastest player in league history to gain 10,000 yards of total offense, accomplishing the feat in just 31 games. He is only the second junior to top the 10,000-yard mark, joining Clemson's Deshaun Watson who did so in 33 games. Jackson's career total now stands at 11,260 through 33 games. He ranks fourth on the ACC career list, trailing only Watson (12,097), Tajh Boyd of Clemson (13,069) and Philip Rivers (13,582) of NC State.

ACC teams have performed well this season on third down with three teams ranking among the top five nationally in third down defensive percentage. Virginia Tech is second (.237), followed by No. 3 Syracuse (.238) and No. 5 Georgia Tech (.246). Duke is 15th (.297).

Wake Forest leads the nation in tackles for loss, averaging 9.0 hits behind the line of scrimmage per game. The Deacons are one of four ACC teams ranked in the top 10, and are followed by Miami (3rd, 8.7), Duke (7th, 8.3) and Clemson (10th, 8.0). Virginia Tech is close behind, ranking 13th with 7.9 TFLs per game.

Three ACC players have been named semifinalists for the Paycom Jim Thorpe Award, which is presented annually to the nation's top defensive back. Named from the ACC were Jeremy McDuffie of Duke, Derwin James of Florida State and Quin Blanding of Virginia.

Six ACC players were chosen as quarterfinalists for the Lott IMPACT Trophy, the most of any conference nationally. Named as members of the 20 quarterfinalists from the ACC were Quin Blanding, S, Virginia; Tremaine Edmunds, LB, Virginia Tech; Zaire Franklin, LB, Syracuse; Derwin James, DB, Florida State; Micah Kiser, LB, Virginia and Christian

Wilkins, DT, Clemson. Virginia was one of just two schools in the country to have two players chosen as quarterfinalists.

Eight ACC football players have been named semifinalists for the National Football Foundation's Campbell Trophy, which is given annually to the nation's top football scholar-athlete. The semifinalists are OT Gabe Brandner of Duke; OT Andrew Marshall of Georgia Tech; WR Braxton Berrios of Miami; TE Cole Cook of NC State; P Ryan Winslow of Pitt; DB Jordan Martin of Syracuse; LB Micah Kiser of Virginia and TE Cam Serigne of Wake Forest.

Twelve ACC football players have been nominated for the 2017 Allstate AFCA Good Works team. The list is led by Heisman Trophy winning QB Lamar Jackson of Louisville and includes DT Christian Wilkins of Clemson, T Gabe Brandner of Duke, TE Mavin Saunders of Florida State, QB Matthew Jordan of Georgia Tech, DL Demetrius Jackson of Miami, WR Austin Proehl of North Carolina, P A.J. Cole III of NC State, T Brian O'Neill of Pitt, QB Zack Mahoney of Syracuse, S Quin Blanding of Virginia and PK Joey Slye of Virginia Tech.

Eleven quarterbacks from ACC schools have started an NFL game this season. Four of those signal callers are from NC State, including Philip Rivers (Chargers), Russell Wilson (Seahawks), Jacoby Brissett (Colts) and Mike Glennon (Bears). They are joined by Clemson's Deshaun Watson (Texans), Boston College's Matt Ryan (Falcons), North Carolina's Mitch Trubisky (Bears), Pitt's Tom Savage (Texans), Virginia Tech's Tyrod Taylor (Bills) and Florida State's Jameis Winston (Buccaneers) and E.J. Manuel (Raiders). All 11 played in the ACC.

Seven ACC quarterbacks have made their first career starts this season. Boston College's Anthony Brown, Clemson's Kelly Bryant, Virginia Tech's Josh Jackson and Georgia Tech's TaQuon Marshall all made their first starts in week one. North Carolina's Chazz Surratt made his first career start in week two vs. Louisville. Florida State true freshman James Blackman and Pitt sophomore Ben DiNucci made their first starts on Sept. 23. In addition, Miami's Malik Rosier made just the second start of his career in the Hurricanes' season-opener against Bethune-Cookman.

COASTAL NOTES

Pitt junior running back Darrin Hall rushed for 254 yards on only 24 carries, including TD jaunts of 92 and 79 yards, in the Panthers' win over Duke. Hall's total is the second-highest single-game rushing effort in the ACC this season and the 24th-best effort of all time. Only BC's AJ Dillon (272 vs. Louisville) has rushed for more in the ACC this season.

Virginia Tech defensive back Greg Stroman has four career punt returns for touchdowns. Stroman got his fourth on a 91-yard return against North Carolina. The return put him over 1,000 punt return yards for his career. He now has 1,017 career yards, the ninth-best total in league history.

Virginia Tech freshman QB Josh Jackson leads all freshmen nationally in passing yards (1,832), TD passes (16) and total offense per game (286.0) and is tied for the highest completion percentage among first-year players (.642).

For the fourth time in just six games this season, Georgia Tech QB Taquon Marshall (163) and B-back Dirvonte Benson (136) each topped the 100-yard mark in rushing in the same game with their performances against Wake Forest. Marshall (117.3) and Benson (108.7) each rank first and second in rushing in the ACC.

ACC Miami PK Michael Badgley now has 71 career field goals, third-most among active players and tied for the fifth-best career total in league history. He also ranks third nationally among all active kickers in field goals per game (1.69). Badgley has made 11 of 12 field goals this year and is tied for fourth nationally in percentage (.917).

ACC Virginia LB Micah Kiser, who is one of the semifinalists for the prestigious National Football Foundation Campbell Trophy, the award also known as the academic Heisman, is ninth nationally in total tackles, averaging 10.3 per game.

ACC Virginia Tech WR Cam Phillips ranks second nationally among all active receivers with 212 career catches. That places him 11th on the ACC career list, just four behind Wake Forest's Desmond Clark for 10th.

ACC Virginia Tech PK Joey Slye is in sixth place on the ACC career scoring list with 386 points. Slye tallied 10 points in the Hokies' win over North Carolina, including one field goal and seven extra points. He now has 75 career field goals, which is the fourth-highest total in league history. Slye ranks second nationally among all active career players in field goals.

ACC Virginia safety Quin Blanding leads all active FBS players in career total tackles with 432. Blanding, currently in his fourth year as a starter, averages 10.05 tackles per game. He recorded his first career interception for a TD in UVA's win over Duke, returning a Blue Devil pass 58 yards for a score to give the Cavaliers a 7-0 lead.

ATLANTIC NOTES

ACC Louisville's Lamar Jackson has recorded seven of the top 10 single-game rushing performances by an ACC quarterback. Most recently, he rushed for 178 yards in a win at Florida State, which was the 10th-best single-game rushing effort in league history. Jackson is also one of two quarterbacks in the country to have rushed for 175 or more yards seven times this century. Michigan's Denard Robinson is the other.

ACC Jackson has been responsible for 102 career touchdowns, including 43 by rush and 59 by pass. He is fourth on the ACC career list, trailing only Clemson's Tajh Boyd (133) and Deshaun Watson (116) and NC State's Philip Rivers (112).

ACC Jackson is averaging 103.0 career rushing yards per game, which is the seventh best of any current FBS player, and just one yard per game behind Penn State's Saquon Barkley. In fact, Jackson is one of just two quarterbacks in the top 10. The other is Navy's Zach Abey with 127 yards per game in a run-first offense.

ACC Jackson has rushed for 43 touchdowns, an ACC career record for a quarterback. The conference career mark for rushing touchdowns regardless of position is 52, set by Pitt's James Conner. The 43 rushing scores ties North Carolina's Leon Johnson (1993-96) and Virginia's Wali Lundy (2002-05) for seventh on the ACC career list.

ACC Louisville PK Brandon Creque has made 26 of 30 three-pointers in his career (.867 percentage), including a game-winning 34-yard field goal in the Cardinals' win over the Seminoles in Tallahassee.

ACC Wake Forest TE Cam Serigne has 17 career touchdown receptions. That ties him with former Florida State All-America Nick O'Leary for third place on the all-time ACC list for tight ends. Serigne trails only Heath Miller and Bucky Hodges, who each had 20 career scoring catches.

ACC Boston College RB A.J. Dillon ran for 272 yards and four TDs in the Eagles' win over Louisville on Oct. 14 to earn Walter Camp National Offensive Player of the Week honors. His 272 yards are

FSU head coach Jimbo Fisher is just the eighth coach in ACC history to have won at least 80 games at an ACC school since the conference began in 1953. Fisher won his 80th game at Duke on Oct. 14 and is currently 80-21. He joins Dabo Swinney, Danny Ford and Frank Howard of Clemson; Bill Murray of Duke; Bobby Bowden of Florida State; George Welsh of Virginia and Frank Beamer of Virginia Tech with 80 wins at one ACC school.

the highest rushing total in the ACC since BC's Andre Williams set the league record with 339 yards against NC State in 2013. The 272 yards are the second-highest total by a freshman in league history and the fifth-highest single game total in the nation this year. It is also the 11th-best rushing effort by an ACC player in league history.

Syracuse' 27-24 upset of No. 2-ranked Clemson marked the highest-ranked opponent the Orange had defeated since downing No. 1 Nebraska (17-9) in Syracuse in 1984, a span of 33 years. It was the first top five foe defeated by the 'Cuse since a 22-14 win over fifth-ranked Virginia Tech in 2001. It was also the third time in the AP poll era Syracuse beat the defending national champion (1987 - Penn State, 1998 - Michigan) and the first time the Orange defeated a No. 2-ranked team.

NC State's Nyheim Hines had an 83-yard touchdown run and a 92-yard punt return for a touchdown in the win over Pitt. He is the first FBS player this century with touchdowns of 80-or-more yards on both a punt return and a rush in the same game. Hines was named to the Horning Award honor roll for the third time this season following the game.

NC State quarterback Ryan Finley has thrown 313 consecutive passes without an interception, which is the second-longest streak in ACC history. He trails only former NC State QB Russell Wilson, who set the NCAA mark of 379 passes without a pick during the 2008-09 seasons. Finley is the only remaining FBS quarterbacks who has not thrown an interception. Finley also ranks sixth nationally in completion percentage (.694).

Clemson has won 10 or more games in each of the last six years. The Tigers and Alabama are the only two teams that currently have active streaks of six or more years with double-figure victories. The Tigers are only the 11th team to have had 10 wins in six successive seasons.

ACC COACHING SUCCESS

Six ACC coaches – the most of any conference – rank in the top 18 of all active coaches in career winning percentage with a minimum of five years as a head coach. Florida State's Jimbo Fisher ranks third (.792), followed by Clemson's Dabo Swinney (sixth, .766), Miami's Mark Richt (seventh, .744), Louisville's Bobby Petrino (10th, .713), Georgia Tech's Paul Johnson (16th, .670) and Virginia's Bronco Mendenhall (18th, .658).

Georgia Tech head coach Paul Johnson ranks fourth among all active head coaches in career victories, having recorded 181 wins in his 20-year career. Miami's Mark Richt is eighth with 160 wins, followed by Louisville's Bobby Petrino, who is tied for 17th with 114 wins, Dave Clawson of Wake Forest (107) who is 22nd, Virginia's Bronco Mendenhall, who is 23rd with 106 wins, and Duke's David Cutcliffe, who is 24th with 100 wins.

NATIONAL TITLES & HEISMAN TROPHY WINNERS

Two of the last four national champions have come from the ACC (Clemson in 2016, Florida State in 2013), the only conference with multiple winners over that stretch. The ACC has had a team in the championship game in three of the four years.

The ACC is the first conference since 1994 to have a football national title winner (Clemson) and a Heisman Trophy winner (Lamar Jackson, Louisville) from two different schools in the same season.

In 2016, Louisville's Lamar Jackson became the second ACC player in the last four years to claim the Heisman Trophy. With Clemson's Deshaun Watson at No. 2 in the Heisman voting, it marked the seventh

time in the 82-year history of the award that the top two finishers have been from the same conference, and only the second time that the top two finishers have been quarterbacks from the same conference.

With junior QB Lamar Jackson returning to lead Louisville in 2017, the ACC has had reigning Heisman Trophy-winner return to compete in the league twice in the last four years. Florida State's Jameis Winston did so in 2014 after winning the 2013 Heisman Trophy. Jackson is the youngest athlete (19 years, 337 days) to win the Heisman Trophy, while Winston (19 years, 342 days) is the second youngest.

DR PEPPER ACC FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

This season, The Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game will be held at Charlotte's Bank of America Stadium for a seventh time, resuming an agreement between the ACC and the Queen City venue that runs through the 2020 season.

The 13th annual Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game is set for Saturday, Dec. 2. The game will again be shown in prime time on ESPN (at 7:45 p.m.) or ABC (at 8 p.m.)

The six Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Games held in Charlotte have been extremely successful from a fan experience and attendance standpoint. The games have averaged over 69,000 fans per contest, including sellout crowds in 2010, 2011, and 2015. An ACC Football Championship record crowd of 74,514 in 2015 set an attendance record at Bank of America Stadium. Over the last seven years, the ACC ranks second among all conferences in attendance at its football championship games.

Since 2011, the ACC Championship has been the most competitive of the four major conference championship games, as it has been decided by more than five fewer points per game than any other championship.

ACC Divisional Tiebreaker

If more than one team in the same division is tied for the best winning percentage in its Conference games, the procedures listed below will be followed to determine the division's representative in the ACC Championship Game:

Two-Team Tie:

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall win percentage. (Divisional and non-divisional) and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken from first-to-last using the league's tiebreaking procedures.
4. Overall win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined win percentage vs. all non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based on their order of finish (overall conference win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the higher ranking by the Team Rating Score metric provided by SportSource Analytics following the conclusion of regular season games.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw. (as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.)

Three-Team (or More) Team Tie:

(Once a team is eliminated from the tie, the tie-breaker procedures restart for the remaining teams. If the three (or more) team tie can be reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaker format will then be applied.)

1. Combined head-to-head win percentage among the tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall (divisional and non-divisional) Conference win percentage, and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken first to last, using the league's tie-breaker policies.
4. Combined win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Overall win percentage versus non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based upon their order of finish (overall win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional opponents based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking by the Team Rating Score metric provided by SportSource Analytics following the conclusion of regular season games.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.

Four current ACC head coaches rank among the Top 10 coaches nationally in active career winning percentage and six are ranked in the Top 20, led by Florida State's Jimbo Fisher, who ranks third overall with an .792 mark just behind Ohio State's Urban Meyer (.851) and Washington's Chris Peterson (.822). Joining Fisher in the Top 10 are Dabo Swinney of Clemson at 6th, Mark Richt of Miami at 7th and Bobby Petrino of Louisville 10th. Paul Johnson (16th) of Georgia Tech and Bronco Mendenhall (18th) are also ranked in the Top 17. After a 6-1 start this year, NC State's Dave Doeren is now in the Top 25 and is ranked 24th (.635)
