## Four ACC Teams in AP Top 25; ACC Posts 9-3 Non-Conference Record in Week One

### Boston College Hosts Pitt Friday on ESPN

### Virginia Tech Travels to 8th-Ranked Ohio State; No. 21 North Carolina Hosts San Diego State

After the ACC posted a 9-3 non-conference record in the opening weekend of the 2014 season, Week Two features 12 games with only Syracuse enjoying a bye weekend... Week Two begins with the second Atlantic Coast Conference game of the year when **Boston College** hosts **Pitt** Friday night at Alumni Stadium in a nationally-televised game on ESPN (7 pm)... Both teams were impressive in their first outings, with the Eagles, coached by **Steve Addazio**, downing in-state rival Massachusetts, 30-7, as **QB Tyler Murphy** ran and passed for 271 yards and 2 TDs...**Pitt**, coached by **Paul Chryst**, is coming off a 62-0 win over Delaware where the Panthers rushed for 409 yards, including 153 by **RB James Conner** ...Saturday, **Virginia Tech**, coached by **Frank Beamer** heads to 8th-ranked (AP) Ohio State, coached by Urban Meyer, in a nationally-televised game in Ohio Stadium in Columbus, Ohio (ESPN, 8 pm)...The

Hokies are led by junior **QB Michael Brewer**, who threw for 273 yards and 2 TDs in his first start in Blacksburg...The Buckeyes are led by freshman **QB J.T. Barrett** who guided Ohio State to a 34-17 win over Navy in his first collegiate start...Saturday's game is the first between the two programs in football and OSU's expected crowd of 104,944 is the largest to see a Virginia Tech team play... In Tallahassee, No. 1-ranked **Florida State**, coached by **Jimbo Fisher**, looks to keep its nation's best 17-game winning streak alive, hosting The Citadel at Doak Campbell Stadium (RSN, 7:30 pm)...The Seminoles are led by All-American **QB Jameis Winston**, who threw for 370 yards in the Noles' 37-31 win over Oklahoma State...The Citadel is coached by first-year coach Mike Houston...**Clemson**, ranked 23rd (AP) nationally and coached

by **Dabo Swinney**, will host South Carolina State in its home opener at Memorial Stadium in Clemson (12:30 pm; ACC Network)...The Tigers are led by All-American **DE Vic Beasley**, who is the active career leader nationally in sacks (22.0)...The Bulldogs are coached by Buddy Pough... **North Carolina**, ranked 21st nationally, hosts San Diego State Saturday night (ESPNNews, 8 pm) at Kenan Stadium in Chapel Hill...The Tar Heels topped the 40-point mark for the 10th time in Coach **Larry Fedora's** third season with a 56-29 win over Liberty...UNC is led by **QB Marquise Williams**...San Diego State is coached by Rocky Long, who has led the Aztecs to nine wins in their last 11 games...**Georgia Tech**, coached by **Paul Johnson**, travels to New

Orleans to face Tulane in the first game in Yulman Stadium (4 p.m., ESPNNews)...Tech is led by sophomore **QB Justin Thomas**, who leads the nation in pass efficiency rating (275.3) after throwing and running for 353 yards in Tech's season-opening 38-19 win over Wofford...Saturday's game marks the first meeting of the two schools in football in 32 years...There will be familiar faces on both sides of the field when **Virginia** hosts Richmond at Scott Stadium (3:30 pm, ESPN3)...Cavaliers head coach **Mike London**, a Richmond graduate, led the Spiders to the 2008 FCS National Championship in the first of two seasons as its head coach, while Richmond head coach Danny Rocco spent five seasons (2001-05) at UVa as an assistant coach...UVa received solid play from backup **QB Matt Johns** in its season-opening loss to 7th-ranked UCLA, while senior Mike Strauss, a transfer from Virginia, was named CAA Player of the Week for leading the Spiders to a win over Morehead State...**NC State**, coached by **Dave Doeren**, hosts Old Dominion at Carter-Finley Stadium in Raleigh (6 pm, ESPN3)...The Wolfpack are led by junior **QB Jacoby Brissett**, who threw for 29 yards in a thrilling, 24-23 overtime win over Georgia Southern in its season-opener...ODU is coached by Bobby Wilder and led by QB Taylor Heinicke, who is the active career leader nationally in passing yards with 11,764 yards...**Wake Forest** is looking to get its first victory of the **Dave Clawson** era when it hosts Gardner-Webb Saturday (ESPN3, 6:30 pm)...Deacons' junior **LB Brandon Chubb** is tied for the nation's lead in tackles, after making 18 in the Deacon's season-opening loss at Louisiana-Monroe...The Bulldogs are coached by Carroll McKay...**Duke** travels to Troy, Ala., to face the Trojans in at Veterans Memorial Stadium...The Blue Devils, coached by **David Cutcliffe**, are led by **QB Anthony Boone** and **WR Jamison Crowder**...Boone tossed 4 TD passes in Duke's season-opening, 52-13 win over Elon... Crowder caught two of those TD tosses and ranks third nationally among active players in career receiving yards (2,690)...The Trojans are coached by Larry Blakeney, now in his 24th season at Troy, who ranks seventh among active FBS coaches in total wins (174)...25th-ranked **Louisville**, coached by **Bobby Petrino**, hosts its second home game in six days, as the Cardinals, fresh off Monday night's impressive 31-13 win over Miami, host Murray State at Papa John's Cardinal Stadium (ESPN3, 7 pm)...Louisville broke into the AP Top 25 this week and is led by **QB Will Gardner**, **DE Lorenzo Mauldin** and **RB Dominique Brown**...The Racers, coached by Chris Hatcher, are led by senior QB C.J. Bennett, who threw five TD passes in their season opening, 73-26 win over Union College...**Miami** will have

its home opener at Sun Life Stadium in Miami Gardens, when the Hurricanes host Florida A&M (7 pm, ESPN 3) ...**Miami** is led by **RB Duke Johnson**, who is averaging 6.44 yards per carry for his career, the eighth best mark in ACC history, and **LB Denzel Perryman**, who keys an improved Hurricane defense... Florida A&M is coached by Earl Holmes.

## FSU's Aguayo Named Groza Kicker of the Week

Florida State's **Roberto Aguayo**, the 2013 Lou Groza Award-winner, picked up in 2014 where he left off. Aguayo made all three of his field goal attempts against Oklahoma State and was named one of the three Lou Groza Placekickers of the Week for the season's opening weekend.

## Role Reversal for Georgia Tech

The Yellow Jackets of Paul Johnson have run for more yards than any other program in the FBS over the last six seasons (24,253), but Tech leads the nation this week in pass efficiency (258.05) after first-time starter **Justin Thomas** completed 11 of 15 passes for 282 yards and 2 TDs against Wofford.

## Two True Freshmen Quarterback Starters

When Wake Forest and Miami both started true freshmen at quarterback in their opening games of the 2014 season, it marked the first time two true freshmen had started their teams season opener in ACC history. Wake Forest started **John Wolford** against Louisiana Monroe on Thursday Night and Miami opted for **Brad Kaaya** against Louisville on Labor Day Monday Night. As many as four true freshmen have started games in a single season (2010), but never two opening the season as starters.

## Crowder, Greene Among Nation's Leaders

Duke senior **WR Jamison Crowder** and Florida State senior **WR Rashad Greene** both rank among the top five nationally among active players in career pass receiving yardage. Crowder, who has 2,690 yards, is third among all FBS receivers while Greene is close behind in fifth place with 2,668 career yards.

## Ohio State-Virginia Tech A First

Not only will Virginia Tech be facing Ohio State for the first time in its history Saturday, the Hokies will also be playing a Big Ten team for the first time during the regular season. All of the other meetings between Tech and current Big Ten teams were either in bowl games or when the opponent was not yet a member of the Big Ten.





# The ACC By The Numbers

**.960** - The career field goal percentage for Florida State's All-American sophomore placekicker **Roberto Aguayo**. Aguayo, who captured the 2013 Lou Groza Award as the nation's top kicker as a redshirt freshman, has made 24 of the first 25 field goal attempts of his career, including his first three this season.

**1** - **Pitt** leads the nation in total defense this week after allowing just 64 yards in an impressive 62-0 season-opening win over Delaware. The Panthers yielded only 33 yards rushing and 31 yards through the air.

**2** - The ACC returns two of the only three returning consensus All-Americans from 2013. Florida State **QB Jameis Winston** and Clemson **DE Vic Beasley** both earned consensus All-American honors in 2013.

**4** - The number of touchdown passes for Duke senior **QB Anthony Boone** in the Blue Devils' 52-13 win over Elon.

**6.44** - Miami's **Duke Johnson** has averaged 6.44 yards per carry in his first two seasons, rushing for 1,957 yards on just 304 carries. If he maintains that for his career, it would be the 8th-best mark in ACC history.

**7th** - **Bobby Petrino**, who is in his second tour of duty as Louisville's head coach this year, ranks 7th among all active head coaches in the FBS in winning percentage with a minimum of five years as a head coach, posting a .737 mark (84-30-0) in a 10-year career that also includes Arkansas and Western Kentucky. He is one of four ACC coaches in the Top 20, including Clemson's Dabo Swinney (16, .689), Georgia Tech's Paul Johnson (17, .684), and Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer (20, .667).

**9.1** - The per-carry average for Syracuse **RB Prince-Tyson Gulley** in the Orange's season-opening win over Villanova. Gulley gained 100 yards on only 11 carries.

**10** - The number of teams in the **ACC** who started quarterbacks for the first time in the opening week of the season. Only **Duke (Anthony Boone)**, **Florida State (Jameis Winston)**, **North Carolina (Marquise Williams)** and **Syracuse (Terrel Hunt)** had returning starters.

**11** - The number of games **ACC teams** will play this year against teams ranked in the 2014 Associated Press preseason Top 25, the most of any Power Five Conference.

**11.0** - The number of tackles for loss for Virginia's defense in their 38-30 loss to UCLA. In all, the Cavalier "D" recorded five sacks and recorded 38 yards in losses against the 7th-ranked Bruins, while allowing only one offensive touchdown.

**12:43** - The amount of time it took for Pitt **RB James Conner** to score his four touchdowns against Delaware in the Panthers' 62-0 win. Conner tallied his first score, a seven-yard run at the 11:01 mark of the first quarter and his fourth TD, a 19-yard run with 6:16 remaining in the second quarter.

**14** - The number of tackles for Virginia senior **LB Henry Coley** in the Cavaliers' close loss to 7th-ranked UCLA. Coley also had two sacks, 2.5 tackles for loss and a forced fumble as UVA's much-improved defense allowed just one offensive touchdown in the 28-20 defeat to the heavily favored Bruins.

**17** - **Florida State** has won 17 consecutive games, the nation's longest current winning streak. The streak ties for the ACC's longest winning streak, set by the Seminoles during the 1999 and 2000 seasons.

**18** - The number of tackles for Wake Forest junior **LB Brandon Chubb** in the Deacons' 17-10 loss to Louisiana Monroe. Chubb's total included nine solo hits.

**22.0** - The number of career sacks for Clemson All-American **DE Vic Beasley**. He leads the nation among all active FBS players in career QB sacks.

**33** - The number of carries for Louisville senior **RB Dominique Brown** in the Cardinals' 31-13 win over Miami. Brown rushed for 143 yards and a TD. Brown carried the ball more times than any other running back in the nation in the season's first weekend.

**46** - The number of victories to which Florida State head coach **Jimbo Fisher** has led the Seminoles in just over four seasons as head coach in Tallahassee. His winning percentage of .821 is the best of any ACC coach with three or more seasons as a head coach.

**66** - When **Syracuse** defeated Villanova, 27-26, in overtime last Saturday, it marked the 66th football overtime game in ACC history. A high percentage of those games, 28 (42 percent) have been played in September.

**191.0** - The average number of rushing yards for Pitt running back **James Conner** in his last two games. Conner ended the 2013 season with 229 yards rushing against Bowling Green in the Little Caesar's Pizza Bowl and added 153 yards against Delaware Saturday in Pitt's season opener. He has rushed for 382 yards in his last 40 carries--a 9.6 per carry average.

**203** - The total of pass receiving yardage for Florida State senior **WR Rashad Greene** in the Noles' 37-31 win over Oklahoma State. Greene moved up seven spots on the ACC's career receiving yards list from 28th to 21st.

**267** - Virginia Tech head coach **Frank Beamer**, is the leader among active FBS coaches with 267 career victories and ranks 6th all-time. He is the NCAA's FBS active leader in career wins. He is 31 wins behind 5th-place Joe Paterno.

**275.25** - The pass efficiency rating for Georgia Tech **QB Justin Thomas** in his first game as a starter. Thomas completed 11 of 15 passes (.733) for 282 yards and 2 TDs and no interceptions. By comparison, in his first career start last year, FSU QB Jameis Winston posted a 252.2 rating.

**291** - The number of passing yards for NC State junior **QB Jacoby Brissett**, in leading the Wolfpack to a 24-23 win over Georgia Southern in his first start for the Wolfpack. His pass efficiency rating of 150.86 was the highest by Wolfpack quarterback in his first game since Philip Rivers in 2000.

**409** - The total of rushing yards for **Pitt** in its season-opening, 62-0, win over Delaware. It was the highest rushing yard total for the Panthers since the days of Heisman Trophy winner Tony Dorsett when they piled up 444 yards against Army in 1976.

# 2014 ACC FB Game Summaries -- Aug. 28-Sept. 1

## **Louisville 31, Miami 13**

The Cardinals made their ACC debut a memorable one by pulling away from visiting Miami in Monday night's nationally-televised game. RB Dominique Brown's 15-yard touchdown run in the third quarter and TE Gerald Christian's 10-yard TD catch late in the fourth quarter sparked Louisville, which also benefitted from RB Corvin Lamb's electrifying 97-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in the opening half. Brown finished with a career-high 143 yards rushing, and S James Sample led the Cardinals in tackles with eight and recorded an interception that stopped a potential Miami scoring drive. The Hurricanes' lone touchdown came early in the second quarter on QB Brad Kaaya's 2-yard pass to TE Clive Walford.

## **#1 Florida State 37, Oklahoma State 31**

Two fourth-quarter defensive stops and a back-breaking 50-yard touchdown pass from QB Jameis Winston to WR Rashad Greene delivered the defending national champion Seminoles a season-opening victory in the AdvoCare Cowboys Classic at Arlington, Texas. Winston completed 25 of 40 attempts for 370 yards, and Greene collected 11 receptions for a career-high 203 yards. The win gave the Seminoles 17 consecutive victories dating back to the end of the 2012 season. The 17 straight wins matches the ACC record first set by the Seminoles during the 1999 and 2000 seasons.

## **#23 North Carolina 56, Liberty 29**

The Tar Heels scored 28 consecutive points in three minutes and 49 seconds after falling behind 22-21 to the visiting Flames. UNC scored on a 33-yard touchdown pass from QB Marquise Williams to WR Mack Hollins, a 19-yard interception return by LB Jeff Schoettmer, a 15-yard run by Williams and a 4-yard pass from QB Mitch Trubisky to TE Jack Tabb to take a 49-22 lead. Williams started at quarterback and was 19-of-29 for 169 yards, two touchdowns and two interceptions. He also rushed six times for 52 yards and two scores.

## **Pitt 62, Delaware 0**

RB James Conner rushed for 153 yards and four first-half touchdowns to lead the Panthers, who opened their season with a win for the first time since 2011. Pitt limited to Blue Hens to 64 yards and enter Week 2 leading NCAA Division I teams in totla defense. QB Chad Voytik completed 12 of 15 passes for 92 yards and two touchdowns in his first start, including a 12-yard strike to sophomore WR Tyler Boyd that gave the Panthers a 14-0 first-quarter lead. The 62-point win was Pitt's largest margin of victory since 1977, when it defeated Temple by a score of 76-0. The 62 points were the most scored by a team in a Pitt game at Heinz field (the Panthers or an opponent).

## **Boston College 30, Massachusetts 7**

Graduate QB Tyler Murphy recorded rushing and passing touchdowns while throwing for 173 yards and rushing for a career-high 118 more to in his BC debut. The visiting Eagles amassed 511 total yards while yielding just 202. The Eagles held the ball for 42:11 and collected 27 first downs while limiting the Minutemen to nine. Josh Bordner made his first appearance as a wide receiver for BC after a three-year stint as backup QB. He caught his first career TD on a 43-yard pass from Murphy and recorded 81 yards on four catches.

## **Virginia Tech 34, William & Mary 9**

The Hokies won their home opener for the 25th time in head coach Frank Beamer's 28 seasons as QB Michael Brewer threw for 251 yards in his starting debut and freshman RB Shai McKenzie rushed for 106. Brewer, a transfer from Texas Tech who won the starting job just a week ago, completed 23 of 30 passes with two touchdowns. He completed passes to nine different receivers, including touchdown passes of 13 yards to freshman WR Isaiah Ford and 8 yards to freshman TE Bucky Hodges.

## **NC State 24, Georgia Southern 23**

QB Jacoby Brissett found RB Matt Dayes for a 35-yard touchdown with 1:37 left, as the Wolfpack overcame a 14-point halftime deficit with a pair of fourth-quarter touchdowns. The Pack's two TD drives in the fourth quarter covered 99 and 75 yards. Down by six with under four minutes to play, NC State took possession at its 25-yard line. The Pack marched down the field in just 1:58 to strike for the go-ahead TD on Brissett's third scoring pass of the game, and the defense held on to clinch the season-opening win.

## **Georgia Tech 38, Wofford 19**

QB Justin Thomas accounted for 353 yards of total offense in his first career start and threw a pair of touchdown passes to WR De'Andre Smelter to key the Yellow Jackets. Thomas led Georgia Tech's rushing attack with 71 yards on 13 carries, while RB Zach Laskey had 15 carries for 70 yards and two touchdowns. One of Wofford's scores came on a 92-yard touchdown run by Ray Smith. It marked the longest rushing attempt for an opponent in Georgia Tech's history. Previously, the longest rush allowed was 83 yards by Joel Arrington of Duke on Oct. 31, 1959.

## **Duke 52, Elon 13**

Redshirt senior QB Anthony Boone completed 22-of-33 passes for 247 yards and four touchdowns to lead the Blue Devils to a season-opening victory over Elon in front of 31,213 fans at Wallace Wade Stadium. The 52 points are the most scored by Duke in a season opener since 1954. Duke compiled 567 yards of offense with a balanced 292 through the air and 275 on the ground. WR Jamison Crowder led the receiving corps with seven catches for 93 yards, including two for touchdowns, to push his career catches total to 205. He is the third receiver in Duke history to amass 200-plus career catches. All have come in the David Cutcliffe coaching era, as Crowder joins Conner Vernon and Donovan Varner.

## **Syracuse 27, Villanova 26 (2 OT)**

Syracuse holder Riley Dixon found TE Kendall Moore in the end zone on a fourth-down fake field goal attempt in double overtime, and after a Villanova touchdown, DE Robert Welsh stopped QB John Robertson on the potential game-winning two-point conversion attempt to give the Orange a thrilling victory over the Wildcats in the opener at the Carrier Dome on Friday night. RB Prince-Tyson Gulley led the way on the ground for the Orange, piling up 100 yards on 11 carries, highlighted by a first-quarter 65-yard touchdown run for the game's first points.

## **#7 UCLA 28, Virginia 20**

Seventh-ranked UCLA scored three defensive touchdowns in the second quarter, and QB Brett Hundley added a key 6-yard touchdown run in the third period to lead the visiting Bruins. QB Matt Johns threw two touchdown passes for Virginia. MLB Henry Coley led Virginia with career-tying 14 tackles, career-high two sacks and second career forced fumble. All-America S Anthony Harris added 10 tackles for the Cavaliers, and ILB Daquan Romero had a career-high three tackles for loss and had his second career forced fumble (3rd quarter) and second career fumble recovery. In UVA game records dating back to the 1930 season, UCLA's three defensive touchdowns were a first for a Virginia opponent.

## **#12 Georgia 45, #16 Clemson 21**

The homestanding Bulldogs pulled away in the second half behind RB Todd Gurley, who finished with a Georgia school record 293 all-purpose yards and scored four touchdowns. Clemson QB Cole Stoudt completed 15 of 28 passes for 130 yards with one touchdown. Freshman QB Deshaun Watson also guided the Tigers to a touchdown with a 30-yard pass to WR Charone Peake. DE Vic Beasley recorded a sack in the first half and had two tackles for loss for the game. He now has 22 sacks for his career and moved into sixth place in Clemson history. He needs seven to become Clemson's career leader.

## **Louisiana-Monroe 17, Wake Forest 10**

Wake Forest jumped out to a 10-0 halftime lead, but Louisiana-Monroe scored 17 unanswered points to hand the visiting Demon Deacons a season-opening 17-10 loss in Thursday night's season opener. The Warhawks (1-0) limited Wake Forest to 93 yards of offense and scored the game-tying touchdown on a pass interception return in the second half. ILB Brandon Chubb's 18 tackles were the most for Wake Forest in a game since Brad White totaled 24 versus Navy in 2002.



# ACC Players of the Week

## Florida State's Greene Named ACC Receiver of Week

*After 11-catch, 203-yard effort in opener*

Florida State senior Rashad Greene leads the first Atlantic Coast Conference Football Player of the Week selections of the 2014 season. Greene was named the ACC Receiver of the Week following his performance in the top-ranked Seminoles' 37-31 win over Oklahoma State in Saturday night's season opener. Greene, who had 11 receptions for a career-high 203 yards and a touchdown, was one of two Seminoles to earn weekly honors, as FSU defensive end Mario Edwards Jr. was recognized as the ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week. Pitt and Louisville both joined the Seminoles in having two players recognized. Panthers running back James Conner was named the ACC Offensive Back of the Week, while senior guard Matt Rotheram earned ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week honors following a 62-0 win over Delaware. Louisville safety James Sample was named the ACC Co-Defensive Back of the Week, and kick returner Corvin Lamb shared the ACC Specialist of the Week honor after the Cardinals made their ACC debut with a 31-13 win over Miami on Monday night. North Carolina safety Dominique Green was named the ACC Co-Defensive Back of the Week. Virginia's Henry Coley earned Linebacker of the Week honors, while Virginia Tech running back Shai McKenzie was named the ACC Rookie of the Week, and Syracuse kicker Riley Dixon joined Louisville's Lamb as Co-Specialist of the Week.

### OFFENSIVE BACK – James Conner, Pitt, So., RB, 6-2, 250, Erie, Pa.

Conner was the catalyst in Pitt's 62-0 opening day win over Delaware. The sophomore tailback rushed for 153 yards on just 14 carries – an average of nearly 11 yards per attempt – and ran for four touchdowns. Conner, who was not tackled behind the line of scrimmage on any of his carries, is tied for the national scoring lead with an average of 24.0 points per game.

### OFFENSIVE LINEMAN – Matt Rotheram, Pitt, Sr., G, 6-6, 335, North Olmsted, Ohio

Rotheram was Pitt's top offensive grader in the season opener, helping the Panthers roll up 409 rushing yards (7.3 yards per attempt) and seven rushing TDs. Pitt's rushing total was its highest single-game effort since the Tony Dorsett era of the mid-1970s.

### RECEIVER – Rashad Greene, Florida State, Sr., WR, 6-0, 178, Albany, Ga.

Greene had 11 catches for a career-best 203 yards and a touchdown in the Seminoles' 37-31 victory over Oklahoma State. Greene's yardage total was the best by any "Power Five" conference player and the second-best overall in the country. His 50-yard catch-and-run TD with just under four minutes left in the fourth quarter gave FSU a 37-24 lead.

### DEFENSIVE LINEMAN – Mario Edwards Jr., Florida State, Jr., DE, 6-3, 294, Gautier, Miss.

Edwards had had four tackles, a sack and a pass breakup in the Seminoles' victory over Oklahoma State. Edwards' fourth-quarter sack was a vital play as it came with FSU holding a 27-24 lead. The sack resulted in a 14-yard loss and killed the Cowboys' momentum. Edwards' pressure on the quarterback helped limit OSU's potent passing attack (335 yards per game the last four years) to just 203 yards. He played every defensive snap for the Seminoles.

### LINEBACKER – Henry Coley, Virginia, Sr., MLB, 6-2, 230, Virginia Beach, Va.

Coley spearheaded a defensive effort that only allowed seven points by UCLA's offense in the Cavaliers' hard-fought 28-20 loss to the seventh-ranked Bruins. Coley led UVA with 14 tackles, two sacks, 2.5 tackles for loss, forced one fumble and broke up one pass. He had nine solo tackles. The signal caller for Virginia's defensive front, Coley made the formation calls that allowed the Cavaliers to sack UCLA quarterback Brett Hundley and force him out of the pocket numerous times.

### CO-DEFENSIVE BACK – James Sample, Louisville, Jr., S, 6-2, 191, Sacramento, Calif.

Sample led the team in tackles with eight and also recorded an interception that stopped a potential Miami scoring drive. The Louisville defense held the Hurricanes to 244 yards of total offense in the 31-13 win.

### CO-DEFENSIVE BACK – Dominique Green, North Carolina, So., S, 5-11, 190, Laurinburg, N.C.

Dixon, who also serves as the Orange holder, threw what proved to be the game-winning touchdown pass to Kendall Moore in the second overtime of SU's 27-26 victory against Villanova. On fourth-and-goal from the 1-yard line, Syracuse faked a field goal. Dixon rolled left and threw the first TD pass of his career to give the Orange a 27-20 advantage. In addition to the touchdown, Dixon punted five times for 217 yards (43.4 avg.) with a long of 51 yards. He placed two of his kicks inside the 20.

The best mark recorded by an ACC head coach in his first four years in the league was by Fisher's predecessor at FSU, Bobby Bowden, who posted a 43-5-1 record (.888). Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer has the 3rd-best record at 42-11-0 (.792).

Second-year ACC member Syracuse, leads all ACC schools in number of college football games played. The Orange have played in 1,259 football games, five more than Virginia (1,254). Both schools are playing in their 125th season this fall, as is Pitt. North Carolina, in its 124th season, is third with 1,241 games, follow by Pitt with 1,236. ## Clemson's Swinney, Georgia Tech's Johnson In Good Company As ACC Head Coaches

After their first six seasons at Clemson and Georgia Tech, head coaches Dabo Swinney and Paul Johnson have recorded excellent numbers. Only five other coaches in league history have had a better winning percentage after six seasons than Swinney (.689) and only three have won more games. Only seven other coaches in league history have won more games (47) than has Johnson after his first six seasons in the league and he ranks 14th in winning percentage.



## Home Sweet Home for Tigers' Swinney, Noles' Fisher



Clemson head coach Dabo Swinney and Florida State head coach Jimbo Fisher have both enjoyed coaching in the cozy and imposing confines of the Tigers' home field, also known as Death Valley, and the Seminoles' home turf, Doak Campbell Stadium. Now, beginning his seventh season as head coach of the Tigers, Swinney's teams won 19 of the first 22 home ACC games, a winning percentage of .864, third-best among ACC coaches who have coached a minimum of four seasons. He is only behind former Tiger coach Ken Hatfield, who posted a 12-1-1 mark in four seasons (.893) and Fisher, who is 14-2 (.875) in his four seasons against league foes. They are both just ahead of legendary FSU coach Bobby Bowden, who also won more ACC home games than any other coach, with 62 triumphs in his 18 years in the league.

## Program Builder Clawson Begins New Era at Wake Forest

Wake Forest new head coach Dave Clawson is in his first year as the Demon Deacons' head coach, but he is no rookie leading a program. Clawson, who begins his 15th season as a head coach, has already re-built three football programs. He ranks fourth in years of experience among head coaches in the ACC, behind only Frank Beamer (33) and Paul Johnson (17). His overall, 90-80 (.529) record is more impressive when you take into account that he had to rebuild programs at Fordham, Richmond and Bowling Green, where his combined mark in his final three seasons (nine years total) at each stop was 75-37, a .670 winning percentage.

# Noting the ACC--The Coaches

## Duke Experiencing Success Under National and ACC Coach of the Year David Cutcliffe

With a 10-4 record IN 2013, David Cutcliffe, the ACC's 2012 and 2013 Coach of the Year, has led the Blue Devils to 32 victories since coming to Durham in 2008. That may not sound like a great record, except when you consider that it is more wins than the Blue Devils totalled in the 14 seasons before Cutcliffe came to Durham.

■ The 10 wins are the most in school history. Duke was Coastal Division champions for the first time since the ACC went to Divisional play in 2005 and the Blue Devils went to back-to-back bowl games for the first time in school history, dropping a last-second contest (52-48) to Texas A&M in the Chick-fil-A Bowl.

■ Duke made its first appearance in the BCS Standings on Nov. 25, getting ranked 24th.

■ In the five-plus years that Cutcliffe has been in Durham, he has already mentored a pair of quarterbacks who finished their careers ranked in the ACC's top seven of career passing yardage. **Thaddeus Lewis** (2006-09) threw for 10,065 yards, the second-highest total in league history and **Sean Renfree** (2009-12), threw for 9,465 career yards, the 7th-best total by an ACC player.

■ Also, under his guidance, Duke **WR Conner Vernon** became the all-time leading pass receiver in ACC history setting conference career marks for pass receptions (283) and pass reception yardage (3,749) with senior **Jamison Crowder** set to challenge those marks.

■ Cutcliffe was honored in 2013 by being named National Coach of the Year by five different outlets--the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA), The Maxwell Football Club, The Bobby Dodd Foundation, the Walter Camp Foundation and The Sporting News (Co-Coach of the Year).

## Under Steve Addazio Boston College Becomes One of the Top Five Most Improved Teams in the FBS

Under head coach **Steve Addazio**, Boston College in 2013 became on the nation's most improved football teams. Inheriting a program which had posted a 6-18 record over the past two seasons, including a 2-10 mark in 2012, Addazio led the Eagles to a 7-6 record and into the Independence Bowl in his first season on The Heights.

Addazio's physical style of football and a veteran offensive line allowed TB Andre Williams to set ACC single-game, multi game and single-season rushing records and to win the Doak Walker Award as the nation's top running back. Williams became the first running back in ACC history to top 2,000 rushing yards in a season (2,177).

The four-and-a-half win improvement from 2012 was the fifth-best turnaround in the FBS last year, bettered only by Auburn (8), Missouri (6) and Michigan State and UNLV (5 each).

## UNC Has An Offensive and Special Teams Mindset Under Larry Fedora

North Carolina Head Coach **Larry Fedora's** fast-paced offense had his team scoring at a school-record pace in his first year in Chapel Hill. UNC ranked 8th nationally in scoring offense in 2012, averaging 40.6 points a game while also ranked 14th nationally in total offense.



■ Now in his third seasons as head coach at UNC, North Carolina has topped the 40-point mark times and bettered 30 points 17 times. His Tar Heel teams averaged 37.23 points per game. In the previous 13 seasons before Fedora came to Chapel Hill, UNC had averaged just 23.3 points per game, a 14-point difference.

■ Also, in his first two seasons, UNC has 454 yards per game of total offense. That compares with the previous 13 seasons when the Tar Heels averaged just 349.25 yards per game of offense.

■ Fedora's first two Tar Heel teams both bettered the previous school mark for scoring. UNC scored a school-record 487 points in 2012 and tallied 425 points in 2013. Previously, the school had only topped 400 points once (1993) in its history when it scored 421 points.

■ Fedora's 2013 team set a school record for most touchdowns by returns with eight, including five by punt return, two by kickoff return and one interception runback.

■ Now in his third season in Chapel Hill, Fedora's teams have had 14 returns for touchdowns including eight by punt return and three by kickoff return.

■ In 2012 and 2013 UNC returned 65 punts, averaging 16.0 per return. As a freshman in 2013, Ryan Switzer tied an NCAA FBS single-season record and set an ACC standard when he returned five punts for scores last year.

■ Now in his third season at Chapel Hill, UNC has scored 60 or more points three times, including an 80-point outburst against Old Dominion.

■ By posting records of 8-4 and 7-6 in his two years in Chapel Hill, he becomes the first UNC coach since Ray Wolf in 1936-37 to post winning records in each of his first

## Florida State Has Nation's Longest Current Win Streak

Florida State has the nation's longest current winning streak of 17 games which began in the 2012 ACC Championship. One more victory will give them sole possession of the ACC's all-time record, set also by Florida State during the 1999-2000 seasons. The Seminoles, though, have quite a ways to go to reach the NCAA all-time Top 20, which has five teams tied for 19th with 25 consecutive victories.

# Preseason Predictions; All-ACC

## ACC Football Kickoff Media Tabs Florida State Favorite To Capture Third Straight ACC Title

GREENSBORO, N.C. -- Defending national champion Florida State is the consensus choice to repeat as Atlantic Division champion and defeat Miami in the 10th annual Dr Pepper Atlantic Coast Conference Football Championship Game, according to a poll of media members in attendance at the 2014 ACC Football Kickoff at Grandover Resort.

Reigning Heisman Trophy winner and Walter Camp National Player of the Year Jameis Winston, who led the Seminoles to an unbeaten season and their third national title as a redshirt freshman in 2013, was chosen to repeat as ACC Player of the Year.

Florida State was picked as the likely overall ACC winner on 104 of 112 ballots cast. The Seminoles were picked to finish atop the Atlantic Division by 109 voters and amassed 780 total points. Clemson received the remaining three-first-place votes and placed second with 660. ACC newcomer Louisville placed third at 564, followed by Syracuse (368), NC State (326), Boston College (301) and Wake Forest (136).

Miami's 26 first-place votes placed third among Coastal Division teams, but the Hurricanes' 614 total points led overall. Defending division champion Duke received 33 first-place votes and finished with 597 points, followed by Virginia Tech with 571 points and 23 first-place votes. North Carolina was just behind in fourth place with 570 points and 27 first-place votes, followed by Georgia Tech (322 with one first place vote), Pitt (319 with two first-place votes) and Virginia (142).

Winston is one of 15 returning starters for Florida State, which seeks its third straight ACC title.

## Florida State Headlines 2014 All-ACC Preseason Football Team With Nine Players Selected

GREENSBORO, N.C.—Led by preseason MVP and returning Heisman Trophy winner Jameis Winston (Bessemer, Ala.), defending national champion Florida State placed nine players on the 26-man preseason All-ACC team announced Wednesday.

The team was selected by the media attending the 2014 ACC Football Kickoff held this past Sunday and Monday at Greensboro's Grandover Resort.

Winston, who became the youngest player and only the second freshman to win the Heisman Trophy, the nation's most coveted individual football honor, heads a team that includes nine players who earned first or second team All-America honors last fall, including six first team selections.

Winston and Clemson defensive end Vic Beasley (Adairsville, Ga.) are two of only three returning consensus All-Americans this year in college football. They are joined on the team by returning first-team All-Americans offensive tackle Cameron Erving (Moultrie, Ga.) and placekicker Roberto Aguayo (Mascotte, Fla.) of Florida State, strong safety Anthony Harris (Chesterfield, Va.) of Virginia and specialist Ryan Switzer of North Carolina (Charleston, W. Va.).

Aguayo, who set an NCAA single season mark for points by kicking (157), was the 2013 winner of the Lou Groza Award, given annually nation's best placekicker. North Carolina's Switzer tied an NCAA record with five punt returns for touchdowns, while UVA's Harris led the nation in pass interceptions with eight. Florida State's Erving was named the winner of the ACC's Jacobs Blocking Trophy last fall, given annually to the league's top blocker.

Joining them on the team are returning second-team All-Americans Duke wide receiver Jamison Crowder (Monroe, N.C.), who set an ACC single-season mark with 108 receptions in 2013; Blue Devil safety Jeremy Cash (Miami, Fla.) and Florida State offensive guard Tre' Jackson (Jesup, Ga.).

Jackson and Miami running back Duke Johnson

(Miami, Fla.) are the only returnees from last year's preseason All-ACC squad.

The 26 members of the preseason All-ACC have combined to be named this month on a total of 62 preseason watch lists for major national individual awards including the Outland Trophy (6), Nagurski Trophy (11), Bednarik Award (11), Maxwell Award (6), Lombardi Award (11) and Walter Camp Award (6). All three of the wide receivers and linebackers on the team were chosen for the Biletnikoff and Butkus Watch Lists, respectively, and all four defensive backs made the Jim Thorpe Award Watch List as well.

While the Seminoles led with nine selections on the team, Duke, picked to finish second in the Coastal Division this year by the media in its preseason order of finish, landed four players on the squad, followed by Clemson and Virginia Tech with three players each; Miami with two and Boston College, Louisville, North Carolina, Syracuse and Virginia with one honoree apiece.

Winston was named on 97 of the 99 ballots collected, the most of any of the honorees with Beasley (96) and Johnson (95) not far behind.

Wide receivers Crowder and Florida State's Rashad Greene (Albany, Ga.) are two of the 11 first-team All-ACC players who made this year's preseason team and are joined by Louisville's DeVante Parker (Louisville, Ky.). This trio of wideouts combined for 239 receptions for 3,373 yards and 29 touchdowns. They are joined by versatile Florida State tight end Nick O'Leary (Palm Beach, Fla.), who had 33 catches and seven TDs for the Seminoles.

In all, 21 of the 26 players selected to this year's preseason team earned first-, second- or third-team All-ACC honors last fall, and that doesn't include Louisville's Parker who earned first-team honors in the American Athletic Conference.

### ACC Divisional Tiebreaker

If more than one team in the same division is tied for the best winning percentage in its Conference games, the procedures listed below will be followed to determine the division's representative in the ACC Championship Game:

#### Two-Team Tie:

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall win percentage. (Divisional and non-divisional) and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken from first-to-last using the league's tiebreaking procedures.
4. Overall win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined win percentage vs. all non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based on their order of finish (overall conference win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the higher ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee following the conclusion of regular season games. (If both tied teams are not ranked in the ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee, the higher ranked team in the Amway Coaches Poll (including others receiving votes).
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw. (as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.)

#### Three-Team (or More) Team Tie

(Once a team is eliminated from the tie, the tie-breaker procedures restart for the remaining teams. If the three (or more) team tie can be reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaker format will then be applied.)

1. Combined head-to-head win percentage among the tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall (divisional and non-divisional) Conference win percentage, and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken first to last, using the league's tie-breaker policies.
4. Combined win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Overall win percentage versus non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based upon their order of finish (overall win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional opponents based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee following the conclusion of regular season games, unless the second of the tied teams is ranked within five or fewer places of the highest ranked tied team. In this case, the two-team tiebreaker procedure shall be applied between the top two ranked tied teams. If none of the tied teams are ranked in the rankings of the College Football Playoff Committee, the higher ranked team in the officially released Amway Coaches poll (including others receiving votes), following the conclusion of regular season games, unless the second of the tied teams is within five or fewer places of the highest ranked team. (For the sake of clarity, the team receiving the second-most votes but not ranked in the Top 25 would be ranked 27th.) In this case the two-team tiebreaker procedure shall be applied between the top ranked tied teams.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.

## COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

Beginning with the 2014-15 season, college football enters a new era when a postseason playoff will begin. The format includes the top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and a national championship game played in a different city each year. Each semifinal will be played during the New Year's holiday with the national championship game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later.

A selection committee will choose the four teams for the playoff based on their performance during the regular season, including, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams will be seeded so that #1 will play #4 in one semifinal and #2 will meet #3 in the other, with the winners advancing to the national championship game. The selection committee will announce its rankings each week on Tuesdays beginning on Oct. 28. The final rankings, though, will be announced on Sunday, Dec. 7.

The semifinals will rotate among six different bowls: the Chick-fil-A Peach, Cotton, Fiesta and Orange Bowls; the Rose Bowl presented by Northwestern Mutual and the Sugar Bowl. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight other teams in four compelling matchups.

## ACC Bowl Quick Selection Order

(The ACC is in the first year of six-year contracts with its current bowl partners. The current College Football Playoff format is a 12-year agreement)

### College Football Playoff (four teams)

If the ACC Champion is not in one of the semifinal games it will appear in the Orange Bowl, or, if the Orange Bowl is a semifinal or national championship site, one of the Playoff "host" bowls, either the Fiesta of Chick-fil-A Peach. There is no limit on how many teams the College Football Playoff may choose from a particular conference.

### Orange

Opponent will be a team from the SEC, Big Ten or Notre Dame. If ACC Champion is in the College Football Playoff, a second ACC team will take its place in the Orange Bowl.

### Capital One

Only if the ACC opponent in the Orange Bowl, in a non-semifinal year, is a team from the Big Ten, which can occur a maximum of three times in six years.

## The One-Win Rule Applies Only to Notre Dame

The ACC's bowl selection will no longer be bound by the rigidity of a "one-win rule" but will have a general list of criteria to emphasize regionality and quality matchups on the field. A one-win rule does apply to Notre Dame's participation in the ACC Bowl structure. Notre Dame is now eligible for ACC Bowl selection beginning with the Capital One Bowl and continuing through the league's bowl selections. However, Notre Dame must be within one win of the ACC available team which has the best overall record, in order to be chosen. In other words, if an ACC team was 9-3, a 7-5 Notre Dame team could not be chosen in its place. Notre Dame would have to be 8-4 to be chosen over a 9-3 league team.

## ACC Bowl Expenses And Revenue

The Atlantic Coast Conference shares all bowl revenues. Each school is provided an initial expense allotment. The Conference will share in the cost of unsold tickets for participating bowl institutions

After all bowl expense allotments and ticket reimbursements are subtracted from the total bowl revenue, the remaining revenue is distributed evenly among the ACC schools.

# The ACC In Overtime

## The ACC & Overtime

When Syracuse and Villanova ended regulation tied at 17 in week 1 of the 2014 season, it marked the 66th game featuring an ACC team that has had to go to extra sessions. Of the 66 overtime contests, a large portion of them—28—have been played in the month of September. Games have gone into overtime for ACC teams a total of 16 times in November, while 12 have been played in October, three in August, five in December and two in January (2006 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl). Of the 66 overtime contests, 32 have been ACC games while 34 nonconference games have gone into overtime. The home team has a 36-22 advantage in the 58 games played on campus. The team which wins the toss has a 35-31 record. Fifty of the games were decided in the first overtime with 11 games in double overtime and five in triple overtime.
