NC STATE VERSUS VIRGINIA

Saturday's meeting will mark the 57th meeting between NC State and Virginia in the series that dates back to 1904. The Wolfpack holds a 34-21-1 advantage in the series and has won four of the last six - including the last three games played in Raleigh.

State and Virginia played every year from 1960 - 2003, but have met just three times since ACC expansion, with the 'Hoos winning in Charlottesville in 2006 (14-7), the Pack taking the victory against the No. 18 Cavaliers in Raleigh in 2007 (29-24) and then winning at Charlottesville in 2011, 28-14. The Pack's win on the road against UVa last season was its first in Charlottesville since 1994. Tom O'Brien was the offensive coordinator/quarterback coach for that Cavalier team that finished the season 9-3 and won the Independance Bowl.

PACK-CAVALIERS PLAY IT CLOSE

Half of the last 10 games between NC State and Virginia have been decided by a touchdown or less, including two of the last three (7-14 in 2006 and 29-24 in 2007). State won by two TDs a year ago, 28-14.

In 2003, NC State won by two touchdowns in Raleigh (51-37), but that game may have actually been the closest in recent history. In a battle of two quarterbacks who are now NFL starters, Philip Rivers and Matt Schaub, there were four ties and eight lead changes before the Pack went on to win, 51-37.

Close games between the two teams are nothing new, however. In 1944, in a game played in Norfolk, the Wolfpack gained a 13-0 victory in a driving rainstorm by recovering two UVa fumbles in the endzone for touchdowns. State failed to make a first down and had just 10 yards of total offense in that game, an NCAA record for fewest yards gained by a winning team and one of only two games in bowl subdivision history where the winning team failed to make a first down.

O'BRIEN FACES PROTEGE

Cavalier head coach Mike London is one of O'Brien's seven former assistant coaches who have gone on to become head coaches. London served on the Boston College staff as defensive coordinator from 1997-2000.

This will mark the eighth time that O'Brien has faced one of his former assistants on the gridiron, and the second of three times this season. The Wolfpack played former assistant Al Golden's Miami Hurricanes earlier this season and will face Frank Spaziani's Boston College squad in the last week of the regular season.

STAFFS ARE TIED UP

The Wolfpack coaching staff has some pretty strong ties to the University of Virginia, as well as to the Cavalier coaching staff.

On the Wolfpack side, head coach Tom O'Brien was on the Cavalier staff for 15 years (1982 - 1996), coaching guards and centers for nine years, then serving as offensive coordinator for six seasons (four with the QBs, two back with the OL) under George Welsh. He helped lead the Cavaliers to 12 winning seasons, four bowl appearances and an ACC Co-Championship.

Three other members of the current Wolfpack staff also coached at UVa during that time frame: Mike Archer (linebackers, 1991-92), Jim Bridge (GA, 1994-95) and Jerry Petercuskie (defensive tackles, 1995-96).

Linebackers coach Jon Tenuta lettered at defensive back at Virginia for three seasons, earning the team's John Acree Memorial Football Trophy and Kevin Bowie Award. He also served as a graduate assistant from 1981-82.

From the Virginia side, wide receivers coach Shawn Moore was a All-American signal caller for UVa during O'Brien's time on the staff (O'Brien was coaching the offensive line during Moore's

PACK FACTS

- $\,\,\,\sqrt{}\,$ Since the beginning of the 2010 season, State posts a 9-1 record following a loss.
- $\sqrt{}$ The Wolfpack, which is tied for the ACC lead and is tied for 12th nationally in sacks, has gotten to the opposing quarterback 12 times in the last three games.
- $\sqrt{}$ Bryan Underwood is the only player in the country to catch a TD pass in every games this season.
- $\sqrt{}$ The Wolfpack has given up 83 points in the first quarter in 2012, 101 points in the other three quarters combined.
- $\,\,\sqrt{}\,$ The Wolfpack posts a 11-2 record when cornerback David Amerson records an interception.
- $\sqrt{}$ State's Mike Glennon is the only quarterback in the ACC to have accounted for all of his team's passing yards this season. One of just five in the BCS.
- $\sqrt{}$ NC State set a school record with 674 yards of total offense in the loss to Miami. The Pack gave up 652 yards of offense the third-highest mark ever allowed by a Pack defense.
- $\sqrt{\rm Against}$ The Citadel and Miami, NC State rushed for over 200 yards in back to back games for the first time since 1998.
- $\sqrt{}\,$ The Wolfpack boasts the tallest pair of cornerbacks in the country. David Amerson and Dontae Johnson both stand at 6'3.
- $\sqrt{}$ The last two times a top-five team has played a game in Carter-Finley Stadium, they weren't in the top five any more once the game was over. In 1998 No. 2 Florida State fell to the Pack, 24-7, and this year, the third-ranked 'Noles lost 17-16.
- √ State has had first and goal on offense 16 times this season, scoring 12 TDs and three field goals. The opponent has had first and goal 16 times, scoring nine TDs, three field goals, turning it over three times and missing one field goals.
- $\sqrt{}$ State's 10 points in the win over UConn was the lowest point total in a victory since a 10-0 shutout of South Carolina in 1999 (Lou Holtz's first game with the Gamecocks) and the lowest in a road victory since a 10-6 win at Wake Forest in 1968.
- $\sqrt{}$ NC State's 282 rushing yards against The Citadel was the highest total for the Pack since 2005.
- $\sqrt{}$ The fullback has never rushed the ball in Tom O'Brien's 16 years as a head coach.
- $\sqrt{10}$ At 6'6, Mike Glennon is tied as the tallest quarterback in the ACC (with VT's Logan Thomas).

AMONG THE ELITE

NC State head coach Tom O'Brien is in some elite company, as he ranks 20th among the winningest active coaches in the BCS ranks. In his 16th campaign as a head coach, O'Brien posts a career record of 111-76. Eleven of his 15 teams have advanced to postseason bowls. Only 27 of the 120 coaches in the BCS have posted at least 100 career wins.

TOB VS. TOP

When the nation's top-ranked teams have faced a Wolfpack squad under Tom O'Brien, they usually aren't ranked as high the following week. NC State posts an 8-5 record against teams ranked in the top-25 under O'Brien.



The FSU game two weeks ago marked the second time that

the Wolfpack has hosted a top-10 foe at home during O'Brien's tenure. Seventh-ranked Clemson visited Carter-Finley last season and left with a 37-13 defeat at the hands of the Pack. Here's a look at the Pack versus ranked teams under O'Brien:

BOWLED OVER

In the history of college bowl games, no head coach has ever posted a winning percentage better than NC State head coach Tom O'Brien. During his 15 years as a head coach at Boston College and NC State, O'Brien has won .800 of his bowl games, posting an 8-2 postseason slate.

DEVELOPING LEADERS

During his 15 years as a head coach, Tom O'Brien has mentored 23 assistant coaches. Seven of those have gone on to become collegiate head coaches.

Three of his former protégés are now head coaches in the Atlantic Coast Conference: Al Golden at Miami, Mike London at Virginia and Frank Spaziani at Boston College. In other words, the Tom O'Brien coaching tree makes up a third of the entire league.

Virginia associate head coach/defensive coordinator Jim Reid was the defensive coordinator at BC in 2004, before O'Brien was head coach, but Wolfpack secondary coach Mike Reed's senior season.

Cavalier running back coach Anthony Poindexter was a safety at Virginia from 1994-98, crossing paths with O'Brien for his first three seasons with the program.

SWEET HOME CARTER-FINLEY

There is no doubt that the NC State football squad definitely feeds off the energy provided by its home fans. Since the beginning of the 2010 season, the Wolfpack has posted a 14-2 record at Carter-Finley Stadium, including wins over two top-10 teams.

In that same time frame, the Pack has posted a 6-9 mark in away games and a 2-1 mark at neutral sites.

EMBRACING OUR PAST

On Saturday, the 1967 Wolfpack football team will hold its 45th anniversary reunion. So far, 31 members of that squad, which posted a 9-2 overall mark, are scheduled to attend the game.

Earle Edwards' squad won the first eight games of the season in 1967, moving up to as high as No. 3 in the national polls. The team, which also posted a 5-1 mark in ACC place, finished second in the league and defeated Georgia in the Liberty Bowl. That was State's first bowl victory.

The list of returnees will be highlighted by All-Americans Freddie Combs (DB), Carey Metts (C) and Ron Carpenter (DT), plus Academic All-American Steve Warren (OT).

#GUNITLIKEGLENNON

Quarterback Mike Glennon has been on a tear since ACC play has started. The Pack's quarterback has completed 106-of-196 passes for 1,473 yards (a 368.3 yard avg.) and 13 touchdowns over the last four games, all in ACC play.

Glennon has twice set a career high in passing yardage since league play opened: first with 440 yards at Miami, and again with 467 yards at North Carolina.

Glennon's average in ACC games (and overall) leads the ACC by 50 yards, as Miami's Stephen Morris is second at 318.4 yards a game.

In the first four games of the season, all non-conference, Glennon averaged 245.5 yards with a high of 288 in the season opener against Tennessee.

Glennon had 3 games over 300 yards last season, and with his three this year so far, he ranks third all-time in the State record books for career games over that mark (Philip Rivers 19, Russell Wilson 12).

Glennon is also moving up the ranks in career 400 yard passing games, which he had not accomplished until this season. He is the first to throw for over 400 in a game since Philip Rivers did so five times in 2003, and is only one of four players ever to have thrown for over 400 (Rivers, Shane Montgomery, and Jamie Barnette).

UNDERWOOD FOR SIX

Redshirt sophomore wide receiver Bryan Underwood is the ONLY wide receiver in the NCAA that has a TD reception in every game this season. Underwood has set a new school record with a TD catch in eight consecutive games, one behind the ACC record (Herman Moore, UVA 1990).

Redshirt-freshman receiver Bryan Underwood caught two long touchdown passes, and NC State survived a second-half defensive battle to win in Charlottesville for the first time in 17 years, 28-14.

The Wolfpack spotted the Cavaliers a 7-0 lead early in the second quarter, then scored a pair of touchdowns before intermission to take a 14-7 lead at the half. The touchdowns were the first career TDs for Tony Creecy and Underwood.

The third quarter was dominated by the two defensive units. The first 10 possessions in the third quarter combined to feature nine punts and an interception. Eight of those 10 possessions were three-and-outs, and there was just one first down in that time, by the Wolfpack on a 10-yard Mike Glennon pass to Jay Smith. The two teams combined for 17 punts in the game, 13 of them in the second half, and 11 in the third quarter.

Underwood snapped the offensive drought when he got behind the UVa defense and hauled in a 79-yard touchdown pass from Glennon. That was the longest reception ever by an NC State freshman, and also was Glennon's third touchdown pass of the game, giving him 19 for the season.

The Glennon-to-Underwood bomb gave the Wolfpack a two-touchdown cushion that lasted all of seven seconds. Tim Smith made it a seven-point game again with a 60-yard touchdown catch from David Watford on the first play of Virginia's ensuing possession.

It was all defense after that. NC State held Virginia to three first downs and 54 total yards in the fourth quarter. Wolfpack cornerback David Amerson, the national leader in interceptions, put the game away with a 12-yard interception return for his first career TD with 6:08 left to play, his second pick of the game.

Amerson now has eight interceptions on the season, which ties the school record, set by Art Rooney in 1937 and matched by Rooney a year later. In addition to the two interceptions by Amerson, Brandon Bishop also had a pick for the Wolfpack, giving the team 15 for the season.

The victory by the Pack snapped a five-game losing streak at Scott Stadium, dating back to a 30-27 win on Nov. 25, 1994.

The most diminutive member of the NC State wide receiver corps at 5'11, 174, Underwood ranks second on the team with 28 catches this season, but he leads the team and is tied for third in the ACC in touchdown scoring.

Seven of his 12 scoring grabs have been for 33 or more yards. His most memorable, however, is the two-yard reception with 16 seconds left to play to give the Pack a victory over No. 3 Florida State.

Last season he scored on a 33- and a 79-yarder at Virginia and this season has caught TDs for 44, 46 and 55 yards.

AMERSON SETS SCHOOL RECORD

Junior cornerback David Amerson, the national leader in interceptions a year ago, stole his fourth of the season and the 17th of his career in the win at Maryland, breaking the NC State career record held by Eric Williams (1978-82) and Art Rooney (1936-38). NC State posts a 11-2 record when Amerson records an interception.

Amerson is now tied for fourth in ACC history in career interceptions. He set the State and ACC singleseason marks in 2011 with the second-best mark in FBS history - 13. He returned two picks for scores, also a BCS best, and led the national ranks in INT return yards with 205.

In 2011, Amerson was one of three finalists for the Thorpe Award, was a first-team Walter Camp All-American. He broke the record that had been set just a few years before he was born: Art Rooney (of the Pittsburgh Steeler Rooneys) held the record with eight in 1937 and again in 1938!

CALL ME, SADE

Wolfpack sophomore placekicker Niklas Sade was definitely a 'smooth operator' in the win at Maryland on Oct. 20. Sade hit the winning field goal, a 43-yarder, with just 32 seconds left on the clock. It was the first time a Wolfpack kicker had hit a game-winner in regulation since Steve Videtech against Maryland in 1994.

Sade, who ranks ninth in the ACC in kick scoring this week with 6.1 ppg, got off to a somewhat rocky start this season, but turned it around in the next four games. In the first three outings of 2012, Sade hit just 2-5 of his field goal attempts, missing from 39 against Tennessee, from 44 at Connecticut and from 39 against versus South Alabama.

In the next four games, however, he nailed all five of his attempts - including a career-high 50-varder to tie the game at Miami in the final minutes and the game-winner against the Terps (which incidentally would have been good from much further that 43 yards out).

At UNC on Saturday, Sade missed on his only attempt - from 38 yards. He is 4-4 when kicking from 20-29 yards this season and 3-4 from 40+ yards, but has missed all three of his attempts from 30-39 yards.

Sade has also connected on 28 of his 29 point-after attempts this season and had a streak of 60 consecutive going before an early snap at Miami caused him to miss. That streak was the third-longest in school history.

TO RUSH OR NOT TO RUSH

NC State's rushing attack has been a bit up-and-down this season. The reason behind the 'down' could be that the Wolfpack has faced four teams that ranked in the top 25 nationally in rushing defense at the time the games were played - Florida State, Maryland and Connecticut ranked in the top 10 and UNC ranked in the top 25. In those four games combined, the Pack rushed for a total of 227 yards - an average of 56.8 yards per game.

Rushing for less than 100 yards in a game hasn't had too negative of an impact, however, as State has won three of those four contests.

In the four games that the opponent was not ranked in the top-10 nationally, the Pack has rushed for an average of 188.0 yards an outing. (Tenn - 119, South Ala. - 127, The Citadel - 282, Miami - 224).

NOLE AND VOID

Heading into the Oct. 6th contest with the Wolfpack, the Florida State defense ranked fifth in the NCAA in rushing yards allowed (72.4), fourth in passing yards allowed (128.4), third in total yards allowed (200.8), and seventh in scoring defense (11.4).

Those numbers held true in terms of rushing yards, as the Pack was held in check with 66 rushing yards, but the NC State passing attack, led by quarterback Mike Glennon, rang up 259 yards - giving the Pack 325 yards of total offense for the game.

The NC State defense also held its own against a Florida State offense that was highly ranked in the NCAA stats entering the contest. The Seminoles ranked eighth nationally in rushing (261.2), 32nd in passing (283.2), ninth in total offense (544.4), and sixth in scoring offense (51.0). The Pack defense held the Seminoles to season-lows in passing (218), total offense (343), and scoring (16).

In addition to ruining FSU's season averages, the Pack also did a great job of protecting its QB and getting pressure on Florida State's QB. Coming into the contest, FSU had given up just six sacks in the first five games, but the Pack sacked E.J. Manuel a total of four times.

On the other side, FSU was averaging 3.0 sacks made per game (18th-best in the NCAA), but NC State's make-shift offensive line (playing without three starters) allowed just one sack on the day.

THIRD AND OUT

If the first eight games of the season are good indicators, when the opposition gets to third down, their punter better be warming up. NC State ranks second in the ACC and seventh nationally in third down conversion defense. The Wolfpack is allowing its opponents to convert at just a 27.59 clip this season.

And fourth down? Forget about it! The Pack leads the ACC and is tied for second nationally, allowing just one success in eight opponent fourth-down attempts in 2012.

In the last seven games, the Wolfpack defense has held the opponents to a .264 (23-87) percentage on third down conversions. From late in the UConn game, until the 3rd quarter against The

Citadel, opponents went 16 consecutive third downs without a conversion. Florida State was converting exactly half of the time on third down coming into the game against a fired-up Pack defense that allowed them to convert just three of 15 third down attempts.

On Sept. 15, Mike Archer's defensive unit held South Alabama without a third or fourth down conversion on the game as the Jaguars finished 0-for-11 on third down and 0-for-1 on fourth. The last time NC State had held a team without a third down conversion came in 1992, when the Pack forced Virginia Tech to an 0-for-12 mark, a span of 228 games.

In 117 drives this season, the Wolfpack has forced 37 three-and-outs.

CHANGING LINE

Heading into the 2012 campaign, the Wolfpack offensive line was one of the most solidly entrenched (no pun intended) units on the squad. All five starters on the OL had started games previously during their careers, while four plus a projected backup had been season-long starters.

Now, seven games into the season, NC State has started five different lineups on the offensive line due to injuries to three of the opening day starters. Only one position has not had a change in starter this season - as Camden Wentz has started all seven games at center.

In order to get the most experienced, most talented players on the field, the coaching staff did some shifting in the preseason. Senior R.J. Mattes moved to the fourth starting position of his career, left guard, so that talented junior Rob Crisp could man the left tackle spot. Andrew Wallace, a season-long starter at guard two years ago, moved over to right tackle. Center Cam Wentz and right guard Zach Allen stayed put. The unit entered fall camp in that alignment.

In the season opener, starting left tackle Rob Crisp suffered a lower back injury and missed the next five games. Backup RT Tyson Chandler started in Crisp's spot in the next three games.

Against The Citadel, starting right tackle Andrew Wallace suffered a foot injury, so Mattes moved back to left tackle, Chandler moved to right tackle and Duran Christophe, who started 12 games in 2011, got the nod at right guard. At Miami, right guard Zach Allen left the game with season-ending foot injury, giving Cameron Fordham his first career start at right guard against FSU.

The Pack has started five different combos on the OL in its eight games.

PROTECTING THE ROCK

NC State currently is tied for eighth in the conference standings in turnover margin mainly due to the six turnovers the Pack commited at Miami. State has been schizophrenic in terms of turnovers in 2012, losing the ball four times in the opener, then just three total times in the next three games, six times against Miami and then just once in the next two games, then four times at UNC.

In NC State's three losses this season, it has turned the ball over 14 total times, while forcing just fouropponent miscues. In its five wins, the Pack has lost the ball just four total times, while forcing 12.

HELLO YELLOW

NC State ranks an uncharacteristic ninth in the ACC in penalties, with 7.4 per contest. Since Tom O'Brien was named head coach, the highest previous penalty per game average was 6.6 in 2007.

To the great frustration of the head coach, more than half (32) of the Pack's 59 yellow flags have been for presnap penalties - including 15 false starts and 13 offsides/encroachment calls.

YOUR LOSS, OUR GAIN

The Wolfpack ranks eighth nationally in tackles for loss with an average of 7.88 per game. That mark ranks second in the ACC.

Fifteen different defenders have tallied stops behind the line of scrimmage for State this season, led by linebackers Rickey Dowdy with nine and Rodman Noel with seven.

NC State has tallied 24 sacks this season, an average of three per game

which ties as the best mark in the league and the 12th-best mark nationally. The Pack sacked Florida State's QB four times after FSU had given up just six sacks in the five previous games.

SACK RACE OVER

NC State still ranks second-to-last in the ACC in sacks allowed this season (24), but the trend of letting the opponent's defenders get their hands on Mike Glennon seems to be reversing.

In the first three games of 2012, State allowed 11 sacks - including six by Connecticut and four by South Alabama.

Florida State entered the Oct. 5th game averaging three sacks per contest, but managed just one on a slippery Mike Glennon.

GOOD BYE

Following NC State's upset of No. 3 Florida State on Oct. 6, Tom O'Brien and company had an open week prior to last week's game at Maryland. The Pack's history held true, as the Wolfpack has done well after a bye week under Tom O'Brien, now posting a 5-2 mark.

Here's a look at the Pack's results in bye weeks since O'Brien was named head coach prior to the 2007 campaign (including two Thursday night games that were played after an open Saturday). Although the record in those games following bye weeks have been favorable for the Wolfpack, the results have been close, with a margin of just 8.0/ppg.

STARTING NEW

Although the Wolfpack returned a record number of senior starters this season, NC State ranks among the national leaders in most players who have started for the first time in 2012. A whopping 13 players have started

CHAMPIONS IN THE CLASSROOM. CHAMPIONS IN THE COMMUNITY. CHAMPIONS ON THE FOOTBALL FIELD.

When Tom O'Brien was named Wolfpack head coach in December of 2006, he vowed to field a program whose goal was to become champions in three areas: the classroom, the community and the football field. He and his staff use this mantra in recruiting and each member of the Wolfpack squad knows that this is what they strive for - individually and as a team.

In the Classroom: 79 players have graduated in the last nine ceremonies, including a high of nine in the spring of 2012. Three players were named to the Academic All-ACC squad last year (Mike Glennon, Mikel Overgaard, McKay Frandsen) in 2011 and there are four post-graduates on the 2012 squad. The team's single-year APR for 2011-12 is going to be the highest in school history.

In the Community: The Wolfpack has raised over \$200,000 for the Marine Corps Toys for Tots program and more than \$100,000 for the Kay Yow Cancer Fund and scholarship endowment. O'Brien is on the Board of Directors for Toys for Tots and the team has embraced that charity, going on an annual shopping spree to buy toys with fan donations every December. The Pack has also worked with Habitat for Humanity, made numerous trips to visit the Wounded Warriors at Camp LeJeune, worked with tornado cleanup in downtown Raleigh and makes frequent appearances at schools and after-school programs.

<u>On the Football Field</u>: In 2010, the Wolfpack posted the second-highest win total in school history. Three of O'Brien's five squads have earned postseason bowl bids and NC State is one of just 12 teams nationally that have won bowl games the past two seasons. The Pack is ranked 25th in the preseason by *Sports Illustrated*.

FIRST QUARTER WOES

The first quarter has been a rough one in terms of scores allowed for the Wolfpack defense in 2012. NC State is allowing 10.4 points in the first quarter this season. Of the 83 total points allowed in the opening quarter, 70 were scored by Tennessee (22), Miami (23) and UNC (25).

The second quarter, however, has been a different story. No opponent had reached the endzone in that period this season prior to the Pack's allowing 13 points in the 2nd frame to Florida State - even though Tennessee and Miami each had a first and goal situation in the second quarter. FSU is the only team to score on the Pack in the second quarter this season.

In the last three quarters of its eight games combined, the Pack has given up 101 points.

SHADRACH JUMPS INTO THE FIRE

It had been a while since a freshman rushed for over 100 yards in his first career game - 31 years to be exact - before rookie Shadrach Thornton surprised Wolfpack nation against The Citadel by running for 145 yards on 21 carries in the win. Thornton, a true freshman who had not played a snap before that Sept. 22 contest, came out of the gates strong - gaining 35 yards on four carries on the Pack's first series, including a 19-yard touchdown run.

Thornton became the first freshman since Andre Brown in 2005 to rush for over 100 yards in a game. He became the first freshman to pass the century mark in his first collegiate game since Joe McIntosh had 131 against Richmond in 1981.

Thornton tallied 171 all-purpose yards in the contest, also catching four passes for another 26 yards. Against Miami, he came off the bench to rush for 87 yards.

Thornton was a very unlikely candidate to be starting in the fourth game of the season just a few short weeks prior. No one was listed ahead of him on the depth chart, because he wasn't even ON the depth chart.

Last year's leading rusher, James Washington, was returning for his senior season after gaining 897 yards in 2011 - most for a Pack player since 2002. Tony Creecy was returning for his red-shirt sophomore campaign after gaining great experience as the backup last season, as well as working hard in the Pack's off-season conditioning program.

Adding to the abundance of depth at halfback was Mustafa Greene, the leading rusher for NC State in 2010 who missed all of last season with an injury. And finally, red-shirt senior Brandon Barnes was on the roster as well - a player who had been hampered by injuries throughout his career.

Creecy started the season opener, but Greene came in and led the team in rushing. Greene started the next week at Connecticut in a defensive battle, but was suspended following that contest and has since been dismissed from the team.

Creecy started against versus South Alabama, and then the injury bug hit. At one point the week before The Citadel game, Creecy, Washington and Barnes were in injured jerseys.

Enter the true freshman, who was able to get the nod versus The Citadel and make the most of it, gaining the most yards for a back in his first game since 1981. He is the team's second-leading rusher with 55 carries for 282 yards and is averaging 5.1 yards per carry.

HARD TO SEE AROUND THE CORNER

When it comes to cornerbacks, NC State can definitely look down at other teams. Research has been unable to find another pair of starting cornerbacks in the country as tall as the Wolfpack's. Both David Amerson and Dontae Johnson are listed at 6'3.

In the ACC, only Virginia Tech has two starting cornerbacks listed over 6'0.

SPREADING IT OUT

Fourteen different players have caught passes for the Wolfpack in 2012, as five wide receivers, three tight ends, five halfbacks and a fullback have all been on the receiving end of a Mike Glennon throw.

The wide receiver spot was an area of concern heading into the 2012 campaign, as both starters from last season and another senior graduated.

Quintin Payton has been on the recieving end of the majority of Glennon's throws, catching 34 passes for 603 yards.

WOLFF'S PACK

It's fitting that the Grandpa of the Wolfpack defense should be named WOLFF. Senior safety Earl Wolff has played in 46 career games, more than any player on the 2012 NC State squad.

The veteran of 2,385 snaps from scrimmage and another 400+ on special teams, is also the team leader with 336 career tackles. He is now tied for third in school history with eight caused fumbles after a huge caused fumble against Maryland.

Wolff was instrumental in the Pack's win at UConn on Sept. 8, racking up seven tackles (including five first hits or solos) according to the coaches' game film, even though he played just three quarters and played just after leaving with an injury. He was in for just 47 snaps, his lowest total since midway through the 2010 season. He was named the ACC Player of the Week at defensive back.

In the first half, with Connecticut driving, Wolff pulled down the fifth interception of his career and returned it 16 yards. But his biggest play of the game was on the interception that he missed. In the third guarter, with State up 3-0, he barely missed a pick and the pass was completed behind him. Immediately after the catch, fellow safety Brandan Bishop forced a fumble and Wolff was there to fall on it. That gave the Pack the ball at the UConn 41 and three plays later, State scored its only touchdown of the afternoon.

That was the second fumble recovery of Wolff's career. He is tied for fifth in school history with seven caused fumbles.

SUPER SAFETIES

OFFENIOR

NC State's pair of super safeties are not only the team's leading tacklers, they are also two of the most experienced players on the 2012 Wolfpack squad. Brandan Bishop has 41 career starts, the highest mark on the team, while Earl Wolff has 38, which ties as the second-highest mark (with R.J. Mattes).

has been the leader by himself in three other games. The tandem tied for the team lead once, meaning that either Bishop or Wolff has been the leading tackler in six of the eight games this season.

Wolff has made 336 career tackles, the highest mark on the squad, while Bishop has 278 career stops to his credit. Those two totals constitute 41% (614 of 1,493) of the career tackles on the 2012 Wolfpack squad.

A STERLING COMEBACK

Senior middle linebacker Sterling Lucas has been somewhere that no other player on the squad has been: the coaches' box.

Lucas was forced to redshirt last season after suffering a knee injury in preseason camp. Although he was devastated to miss what was supposed to be his senior campaign, he decided that he wanted to be just as involved in the daily preparations as any of the players in uniform. When he wasn't in treatment, he was at practice. And on game days, instead of watching from the sidelines, he asked if he could sit in the coaches' box, so he could hear how the game progressed from that viewpoint.

Lucas, who led the team in tackles at Connecticut with eight, says that he learned a great deal during his 13 games in the coaches' box that he can translate into play on the field. He set a career-high in terms of stops with 11 at Marvland.

THE SECOND NOEL

Wolfpack sophomore linebacker Rodman Noel is a talented young player who moved into the starting slot at strong side linebacker for the South Alabama game. If pedigree is any indication, he will have a long and successful career on the gridiron.

The Pack's Noel is the second of the three sons of Haitian immigrants Yonel and Dorcina Noel. His older brother, Jim, is a senior at Boston College this season, where he is projected to start at strong safety for the third straight season. While Jim and Rodman have earned their stripes on the gridiron, their younger brother, Nerlens, has gained stardom on the hardwood. One of the most highly-recruited prep basketball players in the country last year, he is currently a freshman for reigning national champion Kentucky.

WE LIKE MIKE

Mike Glennon's entry into the job of starting collegiate quarterback was not a quiet one. A year ago, nobody mentioned his name without also mentioning his predecessor Russell Wilson, who had moved on to Wisconsin.

Despite the controversy and talk swirling around him, Glennon was un-Wolff has led the team in tackles outright twice this season, while Bishop | flappable in his first year starting under center. He silenced all critics

by throwing 31 touchdown passes, gaining over 3000 passing yards and completing .625 of his throws in 2011. In fact, only three quarterbacks in ACC history have thrown for more TDs in a season.

From the jump, Glennon seemed comfortable in his role as the starting quarterback. By year's end, he was clicking on all cylinders, completing 66% of his passes for 1,043 yards, throwing 11 TDs to only three interceptions, and posting a 141.35 efficiency rating in the last four games of 2011.

Prior to the 2012 campaign, The *Sporting News* ranked him as one of the top quarterbacks in the country for the upcoming season and with his ability, experience and knowledge of the State playbook, he should battle for all-conference honors in 2012. His stints at the Manning Passing Academy and at the Elite 11 Camp during the summer have put him solidly in the sights of the national media and NFL scouts.

PACK PICKS UP THE PICKS

The Wolfpack led the nation in interceptions last season, committing 27 acts of aerial thievery - the second-best mark in ACC history. In only one game last season did the defense fail to pick off a pass and that was versus Georgia Tech, a team that threw just 12 times, completing just four in the entire game. In the last three games of 2011, the Pack pulled down seven total interceptions.

So the season opener was a bit of a downer for the State defensive secondary, as they failed to get their hands on any passes. The team has gotten back on the plus side, however, in the last seven games, as the Pack now ranks second the ACC with 10 picks for the season.

Against UConn, State intercepted three passes. Safety Earl Wolff started the pick parade early in the second quarter, gathering in the fifth interception of his career and returning it 16 yards. Next, the Pickoff Artist, David Amerson, got into the action. And finally, at the beginning of the fourth quarter, Brandan Bishop pulled a pick, the 10th of his career.

Amerson had another against South Alabama, while backup safety Hakim Jones intercepted his first career pass. Against The Citadel, Amerson came down with another - the 16th of his career - while Sterling Lucas pulled one down at Miami. Amerson picked off his 17th in the win at Maryland.

Over the last two years, NC State is 6-0 when recording at least three interceptions in a game.

SENIOR STRENGTH

In 2012, Wolfpack head coach Tom O'Brien has a luxury that he hasn't been afforded in previous campaigns with the Wolfpack: senior starters. In first six games of the season, 11 spots on offense and defense have been manned by seniors who have had starting experience prior to 2012.

That number is almost double the most senior starting experience O'Brien has had during his first five years with the Wolfpack. The number is particularly high on offense, where seven of the 11 starting spots are slated to be filled by seniors with previous starting experience.

Three Pack players ranked among the most experienced returning players in the ACC in terms of career starts heading into the 2012 season: safety Brandan Bishop (5th), OG R.J. Mattes (t9th) and safety Earl Wolff (t9th).

For the 2008 season, there were only two projected starters who were seniors with starting experience. In 2009, there were seven. Here's a look at the senior starters in the season opener:

<u>T.O.B.-ing</u>

Nobody is doing it at weddings like the Macarena or the Electric Slide and it isn't quite the national phenomena that TEBOWing was a year ago, but the art of TOBing is something that those in Wolfpack nation know all about.

TOB is the nickname for Wolfpack head coach \underline{T} om $\underline{O'B}$ rien. The Marine major is known as having a somewhat stoic demeanor on the Wolfpack sideline, usually standing with his arms crossed. Wolfpack fans have nicknamed that stance TOBing. Google it!

MOVING MATTES

R.J. Mattes gets around. The senior offensive lineman started at left guard in first four games of 2012 - the fourth different OL position of his career. And his starts haven't been in a fill-in capacity due to injury or the like, but have been for multiple games.

Mattes started 12 games last season at left tackle. In 2010, he came back from injury to start 10 games at right tackle. As a redshirt freshman in 2009, he started eight games at right guard before suffering a season-ending injury.

Research has uncovered a couple of BCS players - Alabama's Barrett Jones (RG, LT, C) and Wake Forest's Garrick Williams (C, LG, RG) - who will be starting at their third position on the OL in 2012, but none that will be starting their fourth.

Mattes has been back at left guard in the last two games due to injuries to other players on the line.

RISING STOCK-ER

Obviously, the Wolfpack is set at the starting quarterback position. There is some concern in some quarters about what would happen if starting signal caller Mike Glennon were injured or had to miss snaps for any other reason.

Glennon's projected backup for 2012, Tyler Brosius, left school this summer, leaving true freshman Manny Stocker as the No. 2 at quarterback. Tom O'Brien calls Stocker a 'half-a-redshirt' freshman, since he decided to graduate from high school early and has been at State since January.

Stocker, who just attended his senior prom in June and is still in braces, went through spring practice with the team. He passed for almost 2,000 yards as a senior at Coatesville Area High School in Pennsylvania, throwing for 20 scores and running for 10 more.

STATE INDUCTS FIRST HALL OF FAME CLASS

NC State elected its inaugural Athletics Hall of Fame Class in June and the induction ceremonies were held on Friday, Oct. 5 in Reynolds Coliseum.

Three former football players were elected to the class of 10: QB Roman Gabriel, C Jim Ritcher and RB Ted Brown. Other inductees include Julie Shea (Track/Cross Country), Tab Ramos (soccer), Genia Beasley (women's basketball), David Thompson (men's basketball), Jim Valvano (coach), Kay Yow (coach) and Everett Case (coach)

WOLFPACK UNLIMITED

Just days after Deborah A. Yow was introduced as NC State's Director of

Athletics in June of 2010, the annual Directors' Cup standings were released. In that metric, which recognizes all-sports success in collegiate athletics, NC State was ranked 89th - an all-time low. Nine Pack teams scored points in the competition and only one was ranked in the top 25.

When the 2012 standings were announced in June of 2012, the Wolfpack stood at 37th - it's highest mark in six years and a jump of 52 spots in just two years. That two-year jump is the biggest by an ACC school in the history of the Director's Cup.

NC State 31, South Alabama 7 September 15, 2012 - 6 p.m. Carter-Finley Stadium - Raleigh, N.C. - 54,132

Redshirt juniors Quintin Payton and Rashard Smith scored their first career receivers touchdowns in the first half of the contest against South Alabama to held lead the Wolfpack to a 31-7 victory. Smith scored the first touchdown of the game on a 33-yard pass from quarterback Mike Glennon, while Payton scored the last touchdown of the half for the Pack on a 13-yard grab.

Glennon completed 24 of 34 pass attempts for a total of 257 yards and three touchdowns and did not throw an interception. Bryan Underwood reeled in the other touchdown pass, a 44-yarder in the first quarter.

Running back Tony Creecy rushed for 68 yards, including an 11-yard touchdown run in the second period of play.

NC State defense played stellar throughout the game and did not allow the Jaguars to convert on third down, as they finished the game 0 for 11 on third down conversions. South Alabama's quarterback was intercepted twice: by cornerback David Amerson and safety Hakim Jones.

Amerson recorded his second interception in as many games as he ripped the ball away from a South Alabama receiver in the first half.

Sophomore linebacker Brandon Pittman lead the Wolfpack on defense with eight solo tackles. The defense also forced two fumbles, one of which was recovered by linebacker Rickey Dowdy.

South Alabama reached the scoreboard late in the game as quarterback Ross Metheny connected with Jereme Jones for an eight-yard pass completion, resulting in the Jaguars' lone score.

State dominated the time possession column, holding the ball 35:51, while South Alabama was on offense for just 24:09. Third down conversions is one reason for the difference in time of possession as the Pack converted seven third downs and two fourth downs, while the Jaguars were not successful in converting on either.

Game Reviews

NC State 52, The Citadel 14 September 22, 2012 - 6:00 p.m. Carter-Finley Stadium - Raleigh, N.C. - 55,145

Freshman Shadrach Thornton had a career day playing in his first collegiate game, rushing for 145 yards on 21 carries, while also scoring two touchdowns. NC State scored touchdowns on five of its first six drives to take a 35-point lead into halftime.

Thornton's yardage total was the most for a Pack back in his first career game since Joe McIntosh in 1981 and the most for a freshman since 2005.

Quarterback Mike Glennon accounted for three scores on the day, passing for one and rushing for two. Glennon reached the goal line from the one yard line as time expired in the second quarter after electing to go for it on fourth down. The Wolfpack signal-caller completed 19 of 25 passes for 233 yards.

Punt returner Rashard Smith recorded his first career touchdown off a punt return as he was able to scamper 73 yards for a score in the second quarter. Bryan Underwood reached the endzone for the fourth consecutive game this season, one of the longest streaks in school history.

The NC State defense was able to limit The Citadel's option offense, while only allowing the Bulldogs to convert two of nine attempts on third down and did not allow a fourth down conversion on two attempts. Rodman Noel lead the defense with 8.5 tackles, including one tackle for loss.

The Citadel only passed the ball seven times, but All-American cornerback David Amerson was able to pick one off for his third interception of 2012.

The Wolfpack were without running backs Tony Creecy, Mustafa Greene and James Washington, but were still able to rush for a season-high 284 yards. Four different running backs saw action as Thornton was joined by Brandon Barnes, Jonathan Fisher, and Milton Hall who all rushed for an average of five yards per carry.

After trailing early in the first half, the Wolfpack roared back to tie the game in the fourth quarter, 37-37, before Miami was able to prevail for the win. Miami quarterback Stephen Morris completed a 62-yard pass to wide receiver Phillip Dorsett, with 0:19 left in the game to go ahead by a touchdown.

The NC State offense exploded in its first ACC contest of the season, compiling 664 yards of total offense, a new school record. Pack running backs Brandon Barnes, Tony Creecy, and Shadrach Thornton combined for 224 rushing yards, while quarterback Mike Glennon passed for 440 yards.

Creecy scored the games' first touchdown on a 1-yard run in the opening guarter, after breaking a 43-yard run the previous play. Creecy reached the endzone for the second time on a 7-yard pass from Glennon in the second quarter.

Glennon finished the day with 24 completions on 42 attempts for 440 yards and also threw four touchdowns. Wide Receiver Bryan Underwood was on the receiving end of two of those four touchdowns, reeling in a four-yard and a 28-yard score. Underwood continued his streak touchdown receptions, tying the school record with five in a row.

The Hurricanes scored 23 points in the opening frame, but were held scoreless in the second quarter as the Pack trailed 23-14 at halftime. The Pack has not allowed a score in the second quarter in 2012.

Niklas Sade connected on a career-long 50-yard field goal with 1:58 remaining in the fourth quarter to knot the score at 37 apiece.

With 16 seconds remaining in the game and the Pack facing fourth and goal and down six points to the No. 3 team in the nation, a calm, cool and collected Mike Glennon hit Bryan Underwood in the middle of the endzone to give NC State the victory.

The score capped off a second-half comeback for the Wolfpack, which went into the halftime break down 16-0a dn with 68 yards of total offense.

After the break, a staunch Pack defense forced a three-and-out and then Glennon and company mounted a 15-play, 78 yard drive which culminated with a 27-yard Niklas Sade field goal. The teams traded punts and then FSU moved into State territory before freshman Juston Burris picked off E.J. Manuel. The Pack drove 59 yards on seven plays, capped off by a 24-yard catch and run by Shadrach Thornton to put the score at 17-10 after the PAT.

The defense, which would force five punts in the second, came up big again, forcing FSU to punt with just 2:27 left on the clock. End Mike Rose, who was subbing for injured fullback Logan Winkles, slipped sideways between and blocked the pick, giving State the ball at the Seminole 43 yard line.

The following drive will go down as one of the greatest in Wolfpack history. State converted on three fourth downs during the drive, including the winning throw to Underwood - who has now caught a TD pass in six straight games.

It was the Pack's second win over a top 10 team in as many tries (No. 7 Clemson in 2011) and marked the highest ranked squad State has defeated since the No. 2 'Noles left Raleigh with a loss in 1998.

NC State kicker Niklas Sade drilled a 43-yard field goal with 32 seconds remaining in the game, but it almost wasn't the game-winner. Maryland drove 60 yards in five plays and lined up for a winning field goal of their own with two seconds left. That kick hit the left upright, giving the Pack its first victory at Byrd Stadium since 2004.

Sade's kick was set up by a 10-play drive gaining 54 yards, and highlighted by a 14yard completion from Mike Glennon to Rashard Smith. Smith made a tough catch near the sideline and was able to keep one foot in play, before his momentum carried him out of bounds. The play was reviewed by the officials, but the ruling of a complete catch was upheld.

Fullback Logan Winkles sparked the scoring offense for the Pack, reeling in a 25yard pass from Glennon early in the second quarter, after State was held scoreless in the opening frame. Glennon finished with day with 23 completions on 47 attempts for 307 yards and two touchdowns.

Sade added a 21-yard field goal midway through the second quarter as the Wolfpack led 10-3 at halftime.

Maryland starting quarterback Perry Hills left the game in the second quarter with an injury, and three other signal callers would come in over the course of the game. Backup QB Devin Burns, an option-style QB, threw for 47 yards and ran for another 50.

Wide receiver Bryan Underwood reached the endzone for the seventh consecutive game, breaking wide open and scoring on a 68-yard pass from Glennon. Underwood finished the game with six catches for 134 yards, career highs in both categories.

Senior safety Earl Wolff led the defensive charge with 17 tackles, including 10 solo tackles. Cornerback David Amerson picked off his fourth pass of the season and appeared to return it for a touchdown, but the touchdown was called back due to an illegal block in the back.

Mike Glennon threw for a career-high 467 yards and five TDs, but it wasn't enough as the Wolfpack fell to UNC, 43-35, after Gio Bernard returned a punt 74 yards for a touchdown with 13 seconds left in the contest. The loss ended a five year win streak and also served as the first loss for the Pack to UNC under head coach Tom O'Brien.

The Heels jumped out to an early 15-0 lead after scoring on their first two possessions, but the Pack responded with a nine play drive capped off by a 32-yard touchdown pass from Glennon to freshman Charlie Hedgedus for his first career score, to trim the lead to 15-7. Glennon later connected with Rashard Smith on a 30yard touchdown strike to make the score 25-14, before the end of the first quarter.

State would hold UNC scoreless during the second period and took a 28-25 lead into halftime. Senior Tobais Palmer scored for the first time this season, running past the defensive coverage and reeled in an 83 yard pass midway through the second quarter. Palmer finished the game with five receptions for 119 yards.

Sophomore Bryan Underwood extended his streak of consecutive games with a touchdown catch to eight, when he and Glennon hooked up on a 20 yard pass at the start of the second quarter. Underwood would reach the end zone for his second score of the day when he caught a 55 yard pass from Glennon with 39 seconds remaining in the third quarter, putting the Wolfpack in front 35-25.

Cornerback C.J. Wilson intercepted a Renner pass in the end zone for a touchback and also caused and recovered a fumble, returning it 14 yards. Safety Brandan Bishop led the defense in tackles with 14, eight of which were solo.

In the end it was Bernard who was the difference. In addition to his final return for a touchdown, he rushed for 135 yards and two TDs and gained another 95 yards on eight receptions.
