ACC Schools Ranked No. 1

In U.S. News & World Report

In last week's release of the "Best Colleges" rankings by U.S. News & World Report, the ACC member schools had an average rank of 55.8, marking the ninth straight year that the ACC has led all FBS conferences.

Florida State, Clemson Remain in Coaches Top 10

Both undefeated **Florida State** (7th) and **Clemson** (10th) remained in the Top 10 of the Amway Coaches poll this week. **Georgia Tech** joined them in the rankings at No. 20. **Miami**, **NC State**, **Virginia Tech** and **Boston College** were listed among others receiving votes.

Four ACC Games Determined on Final Play

Last Saturday saw four games involving ACC teams determined in walk-off fashion on the final play of the game, two in regulation and two in overtime. The ACC won three of the four as Wake Forest won in regulation with a 47-yard field goal while Syracuse (30-27) and Miami (36-33) both won in overtime. Pitt fell 27-24 when Iowa made a 57-yard field goal with no time on the clock.

ACC Wins 2 in OT

For the first time in its history, the ACC had two non-conference overtime victories on the same day as Syracuse and Miami both claimed extra-session triumphs. This marked the sixth time the league has had two OT games on the same day, but the first since 2008.

ACC Wins Three of Five Versus Big Ten Opponents

The ACC won three of its five games against Big Ten opponents this past weekend, as North Carolina defeated Illinois (48-14), Virginia Tech downed Purdue (51-24) and Miami stopped Nebraska (36-33) in overtime. Winning for the Big Ten were Iowa over Pitt (27-24) and Northwestern over Duke (19-10). The two leagues have split six meetings this year with a seventh game scheduled this Saturday when Wake Forest hosts Indiana.

Virginia Hosts Boise State on ESPN Friday Night

The Atlantic Coast Conference has three teams ranked in the Amway Coaches poll this week--including two in the Top 10 in seventh-ranked **Florida State** and 10th-ranked **Clemson**--and three in the AP...**Georgia Tech** is 20th in both polls with **Florida State** ranked 10th and **Clemson** 11th in AP...The ACC heads into Week Four of the season having posted a 27-9 (.750) non-conference record with six of the nine losses to teams that are ranked in this week's AP Top 10...Four ACC teams have bye weeks this week, including **Clemson**, **Florida State**, **Miami** and **Pitt**...Nine games are scheduled for this weekend, including a Friday night contest on ESPN when Virginia hosts **Boise State** of the Mountain West Conference at Scott Stadium in Charlottesville, Va. (8 pm, ESPN)...The Cavaliers, coached by **Mike London** and led by **QB Matt Johns**, will be facing the Broncos, who are coached by Bryan Harsin, for the first time...Johns

ranked second in the ACC in passing yards per game (263.3) and fourth in total offense (267.3), while completing 67 percent of his passes... Though they have never met in football, **Virginia** has played on Boise State's home blue turf, having played in the 2004 MPC Computers Bowl, held at Bronco Stadium in Boise...The first Coastal Division ACC game of the year will take place in Durham, N.C., where **Duke** hosts longtime rival **Georgia Tech** at Brooks Field at Wallace Wade Stadium (Noon, ESPN2)...The Blue Devils are coached by **David Cutcliffe** and led by **QB Thomas Sirk**, while **Georgia Tech** is coached by **Paul Johnson** and led by **QB Justin Thomas**...Both teams are coming off close losses to ranked opponents last weekend, Duke to No. 23 Northwestern and Tech to No. 8 Notre Dame...The game will mark the 83rd consecutive year in which the two teams will play in

football, the second-longest continuous series for both teams in a rivalry which began in 1933...**Duke's** defense is ranked fourth nationally in scoring defense and 8th in total defense, while Tech's spread option attack is second nationally in rushing offense, averaging 377.0 yards per game...The Blue Devils counter with Sirk, who leads the ACC in total offense (323.0/gm.)...In Syracuse, N.Y., it will be a battle of unbeatens as **Syracuse**, coached by Scott Shafer, will be hosting 8th-ranked LSU at the Carrier Dome (Noon, ESPN)...The Orange are led by true freshman **QB Eric Dungey**, who took over the starting job when junior QB Terrel Hunt was lost for the season to an injury in the season-opener...Dungey, though, has been impressive in the early going and has posted a pass efficiency rating of 204.0 which would lead the ACC if he had enough pass attempts....Saturday's game will mark the third meeting between the two schools in football but the first since the 1989 Hall of Fame Bowl after the 1988 season...In Chapel Hill, N.C., **North Carolina**, coming off an impressive win over Illinois, hosts Delaware Saturday at Kenan Stadium (12:30 p.m., Regional Sports Networks)...The Tar Heels, coached by **Larry Fedora**, are led by **QB Marquise Williams** and **WR-PR Ryan Switzer**...Williams topped 200 yards passing and 100 yards rushing for the fourth time in his career against the Illini, while Switzer returned his sixth career punt for a touchdown, tying an ACC record... The Blue Hens are coached by former Boston College and North Carolina assistant **Dave Brock**...In Winston-Salem, N.C., the **Wake Forest Demon Deacons** host unbeaten Indiana of the Big Ten in a game at BB&T Field (12:30 p.m., ACC Network)...Wake is coached by **Dave Clawson**...The Demon Deacons are coming off a walk-off win at Army as **PK Mike Weaver** converted on a 47-yard field goal as time expired...The winning field goal was the second walk-off kick for the sophomore, who defeated Virginia Tech last year with a 39-yard three-pointer in overtime...The Hoosiers are coached by Kevin Wilson, who earned his undergraduate degree from North Carolina...Indiana's defensive coordinator, Brian Knorr, held the same position at Wake Forest from 2008 through 2013...In Chestnut Hill, Mass., **Boston College**, coached by **Steve Addazio**, will host Northern Illinois of the Mid-American Conference at Alumni Stadium (1 p.m., ESPN3)...The Eagles will be playing their first game since looking starting **QB Darius Wade** to a season-ending injury...Led by **LB Steve Daniels** and **DL Harold Landry**, BC leads the nation in total defense (106.3 yds/gm.), rushing defense (37.3 yds/gm.) and pass efficiency defense (70.29)...The Huskies are coached by Rod

Carey and are coming off an impressive performance against No. 1-ranked Ohio State in a close, 20-13 loss...In Louisville, Ky., the Cardinals, coached by **Bobby Petrino**, will host the Bulldogs of Samford at Papa Johns Cardinal Stadium (6 p.m., ESPN3)...The Cardinals are led by **QB Kyle Bolin** and are still looking for their first win of the season after suffering three straight losses, two of them to nationally-ranked opponents in then 6th-ranked Auburn (31-24), Houston (34-31) and 12th-ranked Clemson (20-17), by a total of just 13 points...**Louisville** also features talented returner **Traveon Samuel**, who leads the ACC in kickoff returns (36.0) after returning one kickoff 100-yard for a score against Clemson...Samford is coached by Chris Hatcher...In Greenville, N.C., the **Virginia Tech Hokies**, winners of two straight, are looking to keep that momentum going facing the Pirates of East Carolina at Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium (3:30 pm, ABC/ESPN2)...The Hokies are coached by **Frank Beamer** and will be led by **QB Brenden Motley** and a defensive unit led by **CB Kendall Fuller**...Motley, who replaced injured starting **QB Michael Brewer**, was impressive in the Hokies' 51-24 win at Purdue...Motley threw for two TDs and ran for another and Tech scored on defense and on special teams with the return of "Beamerball"...East Carolina, coached by Ruffin McNeill, defeated Tech in Blacksburg last year...Unbeaten **NC State**, coached by **Dave Doeren**, completes the weekend when the Wolfpack travels to Mobile, Ala., to face the South Alabama Jaguars at Ladd-Peebles Stadium (8 p.m., ESPNNews)...The Wolfpack are led by **QB Jacoby Brissett** and **RB Matt Dayes**...Brissett ranks third nationally in completion percentage (.778) and he has thrown 156 consecutive passes without an interception, which ties for the 12th-longest streak in ACC history...Dayes recorded his third consecutive game of 100 or more rushing yards against Old Dominion and is second in the ACC in rushing (116.7) only to Florida State's **Dalvin Cook**...State also ranks second nationally in total defense, allowing just 188.3 yards per game and is fifth nationally in rushing defense, yielding only 51.0 yards per game...South Alabama is coached by Joey Jones...The Jaguars are coming off of an impressive win over San Diego State.

Syracuse Dixon Named Ray Guy Punter of the Week
Syracuse senior **P Riley Dixon** was honored as the Ray Guy National Punter of the Week after he averaged a net of 50.4 yards a kick on five punts in the 'Cuse home win against Central Michigan. He dropped three punts marked inside the 20-yard line with no touchbacks with a long of 60 yards and no return yardage.

ACC Football By The Numbers

3 - Three **ACC** football standouts were among the 11 FBS players named to the 2015 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team announced last week. Named to the team from the ACC were Duke **LB Kelby Brown**, Miami **DB Deon Bush** and Pitt **RB James Conner**. The ACC and SEC were the only conferences to have three players named to the prestigious team.

4.5 - The number of tackles for loss for Boston College **DE Harold Landry** in the Eagles' 14-0 loss to ninth-ranked Florida State. Landry, who had a game-high 11 tackles and 1.5 sacks, helped hold the Seminoles to just 98 rushing yards.

5 - The number of field goals for Miami sophomore **PK Michael Badgley** in the Hurricanes' 36-33 win over Nebraska, including a game-winning 28-yard three pointer in overtime. Badgley leads the nation this week in field goals per game, averaging 3.00 per contest. The five field goals were a Miami record.

6 - When North Carolina's **Ryan Switzer** returned a punt 85 yards for a touchdown against Illinois, it was the sixth punt return for a score in Switzer's career. That ties him for the ACC career record with former Maryland standout Steve Suter, who had six TD punt returns between 2003 and 2004. As a freshman in 2013, Switzer set the ACC single-season mark and tied the NCAA record with five punt return TDs.

16 - The number of total tackles for Pitt freshman **DB Jordan Whitehead** in the Panthers' 27-24 loss to Iowa. Whitehead helped a Pitt defensive unit that held Iowa to just 105 rushing yards.

21 - The number of pass receptions for Pitt **WR Tyler Boyd** in his two games for the Panthers after making 10 catches against Iowa for 131 yards and a TD. That total actually leads the ACC this week, but you will not find him in the ACC or NCAA rankings this week as he has not yet played in 75% of his team's games.

22 - North Carolina senior **WR Quinshad Davis** caught the 22nd touchdown pass of his career last Saturday against Illinois. Davis leads all active ACC receivers in TD catches.

25 - **Florida State** has won 25 consecutive games against Atlantic Coast Conference teams. The streak dates back to a 17-16 loss to NC State in 2012. The Noles' winning streak ties for the second-longest in league history, bettered only by the 29-game skein FSU achieved when it entered the ACC in 1992. That streak ended at Virginia in 1995. FSU also put together a 24-game winning streak which began in 1998 and ended in 2001.

33 - The number of total tackles for Louisville **LB Keith Kelsey** and **S Josh Harvey-Clemmons**, both of whom are tied for the ACC lead in tackles per game, averaging 11.0 a contest.

35 - **NC State** has scored 35 or more points in each of its first three games of the season for only the second time in its history, matching a similar start in 2000 behind a young true freshman QB named Philip Rivers.

36.0 - The kickoff return average for Louisville freshman **Traveon Samuel**, who leads the ACC this week and ranks sixth nationally. Samuel returned a kick 100 yards for a score against 12th-ranked Clemson last Thursday night.

49.9 - The punting average for Duke senior **P Will Monday** after three games this year. Monday ranks second nationally this week after averaging 55.0 yards on 11 punts against 23rd-ranked Northwestern, placing three inside the Duke 20-yard line.

61 - The number of victories to which Florida State head coach **Jimbo Fisher** has led the Seminoles just two games into his sixth season as head coach in Tallahassee. His winning percentage of .847 (61-11) is the best of any ACC coach after his first six seasons as a head coach.

83 - Saturday's meeting between Coastal Division rivals **Duke and Georgia Tech** dates back well before the ACC went to divisions (2005) or even before the Jackets joined the ACC (1978). This week's game marks the 83rd consecutive meeting between the two tradition-rich schools, a series that dates back to 1933. It is the second-oldest continuous series for both schools.

135 - When **LB Anthony Shegog** returned a punt blocked by Terrell Edmunds for a 15-yard TD at Purdue, It marked the 135th blocked kick under Beamer. Dating back

to 1996, only Kansas State (113+) has more combined defensive and special teams TDs than Tech(108).

156 - NC State **QB Jacoby Brissett** has now thrown 156 consecutive passes without an interception. That ties for the 12th longest streak in ACC history with Miami's Stephen Morris (2012-13). The ACC record is a long way away though, set by former NC State standout Russell Wilson, who threw 379 passes during the 2008-09 seasons without a pick.

204.0 - The pass efficiency rating for Syracuse true freshman **QB Eric Dungey**, which would lead the nation if he had enough attempts. Due to missing a large part of last Saturday's game, Dungey is shy of qualifying by nine pass attempts, but has completed 21 of 36 passes for 428 yards and 5 TDs.

275 - The number of career victories for Virginia Tech head coach **Frank Beamer**. That is the most of any active FBS head coach and ranks sixth on the NCAA's FBS all-time list. Beamer trails only the icons of the game in career wins in Joe Paterno (409), Bobby Bowden (377), Paul "Bear" Bryant (323), Glenn "Pop" Warner (319) and Amos Alonzo Stagg (314).

340 - The number of career points for Duke senior **PK Ross Martin**, who now ranks sixth on the ACC career scoring list, having passed Wake Forest's Sam Swank last weekend. Martin, who has made all six of his FG attempts this year, has made 58 of his 69 career attempts, an .841 percentage. Martin needs 19 more points to move past former UNC PK Casey Barth (358, 2008-12) for fifth place on the ACC career scoring list.

379 - Miami sophomore **QB Brad Kaaya** threw for a career-high 379 yards in the Hurricanes' 36-33 overtime win over Nebraska. Kaaya completed 25 of 42 passes for 379 yards, 2 TDs and only one interception. He threw for 226 yards in the first half alone, 141 in the opening quarter.

1991 - The last time that **Syracuse** started the season 3-0, some 24 years ago. The Orange, who host 8th-ranked LSU this Saturday at the Carrier Dome, began 3-0-1 in 1993.

Florida State's Terrance Smith was cited as the ACC Linebacker of the Week for his play in Friday night's 14-0 conference road win at Boston College, while the Seminoles' Jalen Ramsey earned ACC Defensive Back of the Week honors for the second week in a row. North Carolina's Landon Turner was named the ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week following the Tar Heels' 48-14 win over Illinois, while teammate Ryan Switzer was named the ACC Specialist of the Week for his record-setting effort on punt returns. Also recognized were Miami sophomore Brad Kaaya (Offensive Back of the Week), Pitt junior Tyler Boyd (Receiver of the Week), Boston College sophomore Harold Landry (Defensive Lineman of the Week) and Wake Forest freshman Kendall Hinton (Rookie of the Week).

OFFENSIVE BACK – Brad Kaaya, Miami, So., QB, 6-4, 209, Los Angeles, Calif.

Kaaya enjoyed a career day through the air as he guided the Hurricanes to a 36-33 overtime win over visiting Nebraska. Kaaya finished the day 25-of-42 for a career-high 379 yards and a pair of touchdowns. The California native has now thrown a touchdown pass in 16 consecutive games. His second-half interception against the Cornhuskers was his first in 110 attempts.

OFFENSIVE LINEMAN – Landon Turner, North Carolina, Sr., OG, 6-4, 325, Harrisonburg, Va.

Turner earned ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week accolades for the second time this season following his performance in the Tar Heels' 48-14 victory over visiting Illinois. The senior offensive guard graded out at 90 percent (his third straight game at 90 percent or better) and recorded 11 knockdown blocks. Turner led an offensive line that did not allow a sack and helped UNC post 471 total yards, including 254 on the ground. The Tar Heels averaged 6.9 yards per carry.

RECEIVER – Tyler Boyd, Pitt, Jr., WR, 6-2, 200, Clairton, Pa.

Boyd had 10 receptions for 131 yards, including the game-tying touchdown catch with 52 seconds left in the Panthers' 27-24 road loss at Iowa. Boyd had three catches for 32 yards on the game-tying drive, including one that converted a fourth down. With his second consecutive game with 10 or more catches, Boyd moved into second all-time at Pitt with 184 career receptions and is only 18 shy of the record held by Devin Street (202 receptions from 2010-13). Boyd, who posted the 12th 100-yard receiving game of his 28-game collegiate career, is the nation's active career leader in receptions per game (6.57), and ranks third in receiving yards per game (95.0) and all-purpose yards per game (140.89). He is the ACC leader in each of those categories.

DEFENSIVE LINEMAN – Harold Landry, Boston College, So., DT, 6-3, 245, Fayetteville, N.C.

Landry recorded a career-high 11 tackles, including seven solos stops, in the Eagles' 14-0 loss to No. 9 Florida State on Friday night, including a career-high 4.5 tackles for a loss of 27 yards. He also had 1.5 sacks for losses of 18 yards and helped the BC defense limit FSU's offensive unit to just one touchdown. After the Seminoles' 83-yard scoring drive on their opening possession, Landry and the BC defense allowed just 134 total yards the remainder of the game, including only 20 rushing yards in the second half. Landry and the Eagles limited FSU standout sophomore Dalvin Cook to just 54 rushing yards without a score after he entered the game averaging 211 yards per game with five touchdowns.

LINEBACKER – Terrance Smith, Florida State, Sr.-r, LB, 6-4, 230, Decatur, Ga.

Smith's dominant performance in Florida State's 14-0 victory at Boston College keyed the Seminoles to their first shutout on the road since 2003. Smith had six tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss and forced a fumble in the fourth quarter on the game's biggest play. Smith forced the ball free from BC's Jon Hilliman, and teammate Jalen Ramsey scooped up the ball and returned it for a touchdown to give the Seminoles breathing room in what had been a 7-0 game. Smith spearheaded a defensive effort that allowed Boston College just 195 yards of total offense, with the FSU 39-yard line the Eagles' deepest point of penetration. It marked the first time Boston College had been shut out since 2010.

DEFENSIVE BACK – Jalen Ramsey, Florida State, Jr., CB, 6-1, 222, Smyrna, Tenn.

Ramsey earned ACC Defensive Back of the Week honors for the second consecutive week. Ramsey continued to solidify himself as one of the nation's top defensive players, leading the charge in FSU's 14-0 victory at Boston College. Ramsey scored on a 36-yard fumble recovery in the fourth quarter with the Noles clinging to a 7-0 lead and had six tackles, including five solo stops. Ramsey led a pass defense that allowed only five completions on 15 attempts for 56 yards. Ramsey contributed to the Seminoles' lone interception on the night by blanketing his receiver and enabling safety Lamarcus Brutus to make the pick.

SPECIALIST – Ryan Switzer, North Carolina, Jr., WR, 5-10, 185, Charleston, W. Va.

Switzer returned five punts for a total of 168 yards in Saturday's 48-14 win over Illinois, breaking a 64-year-old UNC single-game record previously held by Bud Carson, who had 166 yards on eight returns against NC State in 1951. In addition to an 85-yard return for a touchdown, Switzer had a 71-yarder that set up a UNC field goal. With his sixth career punt return for a touchdown, Switzer tied the ACC record and extended his own UNC school record.

ROOKIE – Kendall Hinton, Wake Forest, Fr., QB, 6-0, 185, Durham, N.C.

Hinton was called on to replace injured starter John Wolford, who was injured on Wake Forest's third play from scrimmage in Saturday's 17-14 win at Army. Hinton finished 15-of-27 through the air for 159 yards and ran for both of Wake Forest's touchdowns. Hinton scored on a 15-yard run in the third quarter to tie the game at 7-7 and added a 7-yard run early in the fourth quarter to put the Demon Deacons ahead 14-7. Hinton closed the game by leading the Deacons on a 12-play, 64-yard drive to set up Mike Weaver's game-winning field goal. Hinton delivered several clutch plays in the final march, including running 13 yards on third-and-9 from the Wake 8-yard line to keep the drive alive.

ACC member Syracuse leads all ACC schools in number of games played. The Orange have played in 1,273 football games, five more than Virginia (1,268). Both schools are playing in their 127th seasons this fall, as is Pitt. North Carolina, in its 126th season, is third with 1,256 games, followed by Pitt with 1,250. Overall, Syracuse and Virginia rank fifth and sixth among all NCAA Bowl Subdivision Teams and 10th and 12th overall among all schools in Division I.

Virginia Tech's **Frank Beamer** is now the leading active head coach in the NCAA's FBS in career victories with a total of 275 triumphs in his 35-year coaching career. Georgia Tech head coach **Paul Johnson** ranks ninth on the active FBS list with 167 career wins. Beamer is sixth on the all-time list and Amos Alonzo Stagg is next on the list with 314 wins at Springfield, Chicago and Pacific. Former Florida State head coach **Bobby Bowden**, who retired after the 2009 season, is second in the NCAA's FBS with 377 career victories only to Penn State's Joe Paterno. After their first seven seasons at Clemson and Georgia Tech, head coaches **Dabo Swinney** and **Paul Johnson** have recorded excellent numbers. Only four other coaches in league history have had a better winning percentage after seven years than Swinney (.701) and only two have won more games. Only four other coaches in league history have won more games (58) than has Johnson after his first seven seasons in the league and he ranks 10th in winning percentage.

Boston College's Steve Addazio Leads Eagles to Back-to-Back Bowl Bids

In his first two seasons as the head coach at Chestnut Hill, Steve Addazio led Boston College to back-to-back bowl appearances utilizing a physical ground game and a hard-hitting defensive unit. In each of his first two years, Addazio has had a player lead the nation in rushing. In 2013, tailback Andre Williams led the nation and set an ACC single-season record with 2,177 yards. On year later, QB Tyler Murphy led all quarterbacks nationally, rushing for 1,184 yards, while setting an ACC rushing mark for signal-callers. Last year, BC was one of just three schools (Oklahoma and Toledo were the others) that ranked in the nation's Top 15 in rushing defense (2nd) and rushing offense (14th).

North Carolina's Fedora Putting Points on the Board for the Tar Heels

Now, in its fourth season with Larry Fedora as head coach, North Carolina has topped the 40-point mark 17 times and bettered 30 points 27 times in 41 games. His Tar Heel teams have averaged 35.6 points per game. In the previous 13 seasons before Fedora came to Chapel Hill, UNC had averaged just 23.3 points per game, a 14-point difference. Also, in his first three seasons, UNC has averaged 447 yards per game of total offense. That compares with the previous 13 seasons when the Tar Heels averaged just 349.25 yards per game on offense. Fedora's first three Tar Heel teams bettered the previous school mark for scoring. UNC scored a school-record 487 points in 2012 and tallied 425 points in 2013 and 432 in 2014. Previously, the school had only topped 400 points once. The school put up 421 points in 1993.



NC State's Dave Doeren: Winning the Close Ones

Now in just his third season as head coach at NC State, Dave Doeren has already made a name for himself on the national stage. After winning 23 of his first 27 career games as a head coach at Northern Illinois, he had an 8-5 mark in 2014, winning its final three games, including a 34-27 win over Central Florida in the Bitcoin St. Petersburg Bowl. Doeren's teams are 7-2 (.778) in games decided by four or fewer points That's the best winning percentage in such games by any Power 5 coach. Doeren guided State to three wins by a touchdown or less in 2014.

Home Sweet Home for Noles' Fisher, Tigers' Swinney

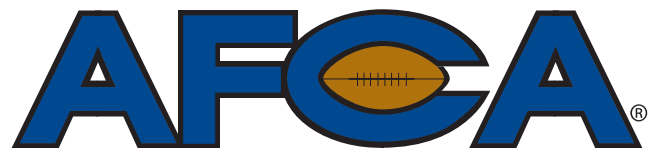
Florida State head coach **Jimbo Fisher** and Clemson head coach **Dabo Swinney** have both enjoyed coaching in the cozy and imposing confines of the Seminoles' Doak Campbell Stadium and the Tigers' Memorial Stadium, also known as Death Valley. Now, after five seasons as head coach of the Seminoles, Fisher's teams have won 18 of 20 ACC games at home, a winning percentage of .900, the best by any ACC coach with a minimum of five seasons on the job. Swinney is right behind as his teams have won 23 of his first 26 home ACC games, a winning percentage of .885. They are both just ahead of legendary FSU coach Bobby Bowden, who also won more ACC home games than any other coach, with 62 triumphs in his 18 years in the league.



Cutcliffe Leading Duke to Unprecedented Success

Duke's **David Cutcliffe** is leading the Blue Devils to success unprecedented in the school's history. Cutcliffe has led Duke to three consecutive bowl game appearances, a first in Blue Devil history. He has also led Duke to 19 wins over the past two seasons, the most in a two-year span since Duke began playing football in 1888. Now in his 8th season, Cutcliffe has led Duke to almost as many wins (42) as the program experienced in the 18 years (43) before he took over the reins in Durham

Pitt's Conner, Miami's Bush, Duke's Brown Named to 2015 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team

Three players from the Atlantic Coast Conference—Duke linebacker Kelby Brown, Pitt running back James Conner and Miami defensive back Deon Bush—were among the 11 players from the NCAA's Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) chosen to the 2015 Allstate AFCA Good Works team announced jointly by the Allstate Insurance Company and the American Football Coach Association (AFCA).

The team was selected from 77 FBS players nominated by their schools for the 2015 team, including 11 players who were nominated from the ACC.

In its 24th year, the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team® is comprised of athletes who have used their limited free time to perform inspirational acts of service. This summer, the program received an all-time record high 197 nominations from colleges and universities across the country in the NCAA's FBS, FCS, Divisions II and III and the NAIA.

Duke's Brown, a redshirt senior linebacker from Matthews, N.C., had his career cut short earlier this year, suffering a knee injury in preseason practice in August, and will miss the 2015 season. Conner, a junior from Erie, Pa., who was the 2014 ACC Football Player of the Year, also will miss most of the 2015 season as he suffered a season-ending injury in the Panthers' opener. Bush is a senior defensive back from Miami, Fla., who keys a defensive unit that ranks sixth nationally in pass efficiency defense and eighth in the nation in total defense.

BC's Swigert First Nominee for FWAA/Orange Bowl Courage Award

Boston College's Bobby Swigert is the first weekly nominee for the 2015 Orange Bowl-FWAA Courage Award.

Swigert, a 6-0, 199-pound sixth-year senior wide receiver from Louisville, Ky., underwent 11 knee surgeries after severely injuring his right knee in a Nov. 2012 game against Notre Dame. The resulting surgery led to staph infections, which led to more surgeries and rehab. Swigert lost close to 50 pounds and had bone in his knee removed.

"The biggest thing is that football gives me a feeling that nothing else really does," Swigert told ESPN.com's Andrea Adelson this past March. "It's a thrill type thing when you're on the field and when you score a touchdown in front of screaming fans. It's something I've been striving to get back."

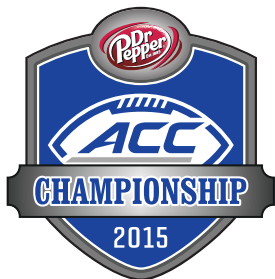
The Eagles hired Steve Addazio shortly after the injury, and the coach kept Swigert on scholarship. Swigert was cleared for practice this past spring, and he finally returned to game action for BC's Sept. 5 opener against Maine, catching the team's first touchdown of the season, an 11-yard reception just before halftime. Swigert caught two passes for 16 yards in the win.

The Courage Award was first presented by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) in 2002. A select group of writers from the FWAA vote on the winner each year. The requirements for nomination include displaying courage on or off the field, including overcoming an injury or physical handicap, preventing a disaster or living through hardship. The winner of the award will be included in festivities during Capital One Orange Bowl week and receive his trophy at an on-field presentation.

Three former ACC players are past winners of the award, including Duke offensive lineman Laken Tomlinson (2014), Clemson wide receiver Daniel Rodriguez (2012) and Clemson's Ray Ray McElrathbey (2006).

ACC Divisional Tiebreaker

If more than one team in the same division is tied for the best winning percentage in its Conference games, the procedures listed below will be followed to determine the division's representative in the ACC Championship Game:

Two-Team Tie:

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall win percentage. (Divisional and non-divisional) and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken from first-to-last using the league's tiebreaking procedures.
4. Overall win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined win percentage vs. all non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based on their order of finish (overall conference win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the higher ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee following the conclusion of regular season games. (If both tied teams are not ranked in the ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee, the higher ranked team in the Amway Coaches Poll (including others receiving votes).
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw. (as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.)

Three-Team (or More) Team Tie:

(Once a team is eliminated from the tie, the tie-breaker procedures restart for the remaining teams. If the three (or more) team tie can be reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaker format will then be applied.)

1. Combined head-to-head win percentage among the tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall (divisional and non-divisional) Conference win percentage, and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken first to last, using the league's tie-breaker policies.
4. Combined win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Overall win percentage versus non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based upon their order of finish (overall win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional opponents based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee following the conclusion of regular season games, unless the second of the tied teams is ranked within five or fewer places of the highest ranked tied team. In this case, the two-team tiebreaker procedure shall be applied between the top two ranked tied teams. If none of the tied teams are ranked in the rankings of the College Football Playoff Committee, the higher ranked team in the officially released Amway Coaches poll (including others receiving votes), following the conclusion of regular season games, unless the second of the tied teams is within five or fewer places of the highest ranked team. (For the sake of clarity, the team receiving the second-most votes but not ranked in the Top 25 would be ranked 27th.) In this case the two-team tiebreaker procedure

COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

The College Football Playoff begins its second year of operation after a highly-acclaimed first season in 2014-15. The Playoff features the top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and a national championship game played in a different city each year. Each semifinal is played during the New Year's holiday with the National Championship Game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later.

The College Football Playoff selection committee chooses the four teams for the playoff based on their performance during the regular season, including, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams will be seeded so that #1 will play #4 in one semifinal and #2 will meet #3 in the other, with the winners advancing to the national championship game. The selection committee will announce its rankings each week on Tuesdays beginning this year on Nov. 3. The final rankings will be announced on Sunday, Dec. 6.

The semifinals will rotate among six different bowls: the Chick-fil-A Peach, Goodyear Cotton, Fiesta and Capital One Orange Bowls; the Rose Bowl presented by Northwestern Mutual and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight other teams in four compelling matchups.

ACC Bowl Quick Selection Order

(The ACC is in the second year of six-year contracts with its current bowl partners.
The current College Football Playoff format is a 12-year agreement)

College Football Playoff (four teams)

If the ACC Champion is not in one of the semifinal games this year, it will appear in one of the Playoff "host" bowls, either the Fiesta or Chick-fil-A Peach, since the Capital One Orange Bowl will serve as a semifinal site this year. There is no limit on how many teams the College Football Playoff may choose from a particular conference.

Capital One Orange Bowl

The ACC champion, if not in the College Football Playoff, would normally play in the Capital One Orange Bowl against the highest-ranked and available team from Notre Dame, the SEC or the Big Ten. With the Capital One Orange Bowl serving as a Playoff semifinal this year, the CFP Selection Committee will determine the game (Chick-fil-A or Fiesta) and opponent for the ACC champion if that team is not in the Playoff.

Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl

Only if the ACC opponent in the Capital One Orange Bowl in a non-semifinal year, is a team from the Big Ten. This will not occur in 2015 due to the fact that the Orange Bowl this year is a semifinal site for the College Football Playoff.

Russell Athletic Bowl

Has first pick of ACC teams in 2015 after the College Football Playoff and the Host Bowls.

The One-Win Rule Applies Only to Notre Dame

The ACC's bowl selection will no longer be bound by the rigidity of a "one-win rule" but will have a general list of criteria to emphasize regionality and quality matchups on the field. A one-win rule does apply to Notre Dame's participation in the ACC Bowl structure. Notre Dame is now eligible for ACC Bowl selection beginning with the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl and continuing through the league's bowl selections. However, Notre Dame must be within one win of the ACC available team which has the best overall record, in order to be chosen. In other words, if an ACC team was 9-3, a 7-5 Notre Dame team could not be chosen in its place. Notre Dame would have to be 8-4 to be chosen over a 9-3 league team.

ACC Bowl Expenses And Revenue

The Atlantic Coast Conference shares all bowl revenues. Each school is provided an initial expense allotment. The Conference will share in the cost of unsold tickets for participating bowl institutions. After all bowl expense allotments and ticket reimbursements are subtracted from the total bowl revenue, the remaining revenue is distributed evenly among ACC schools.

The ACC & Overtime

When Miami and Nebraska ended regulation tied at 33-33 and Syracuse and Central Michigan ended regulation tied at 24-24 on September 19, 2015, they played the 72nd and 73rd games featuring an ACC team that has had to go to extra sessions. Of the 73 overtime contests, a large portion of them--31--have been played in September. Games have gone into overtime for ACC teams a total of 19 times in November, while 12 have been played in October, three in August, six in December and two in January (2006 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl). Of the 73 overtime contests, 35 have been ACC games while 38 nonconference games have gone into overtime. The home team has a 40-24 advantage in the 64 games played on campus. The team which wins the toss has a 39-34 record. Fifty-four of the games were decided in the first overtime with 14 games in double overtime and five in triple overtime.
