**Four ACC Teams Ranked In Nation's Top 16 Led By No. 3 Florida State; FSU Opens at No. 2 in BCS  
 Seminoles Host NC State; 9th-Ranked Clemson Travels to Maryland in Atlantic Games  
 Unbeaten and 7th-ranked Miami Hosts Wake Forest; No. 16 Virginia Tech Battles Duke in Key Coastal Clashes**

Four ACC teams are ranked in the nation's Top 16 and three once again are in the Top 10 led by No. 3 Florida State and including No. 7 Miami, No. 9 Clemson and No. 16 Virginia Tech...Buoyed by its 51-14 win over then 3rd-ranked Clemson, Florida State opens at No. 2 in the first BCS Standings followed by No. 7 Miami, No. 9 Clemson and No. 14 Virginia Tech...The Seminoles take, in effect, a two-game lead in the Atlantic Division, as they lead Clemson by a game with the tie-breaker advantage and with everyone else in the division having at least two losses... In the Coastal Division, Virginia Tech (3-0) and Miami (2-0) remain unbeaten in Conference play with everyone else in the Coastal having two or more ACC losses...Week nine of the season features six ACC contests and one non conference game with Syracuse receiving a bye week...The third-ranked Seminoles, coached by **Jimbo Fisher** and led by **QB Jameis Winston** and **CB-S Lamarcus Joyner** host Atlantic Division foe NC State

at Doak Campbell Stadium in Tallahassee, Fla. (3:30 pm, ABC/ESPN2)...Joyner was named the Walter Camp National Defensive Player of the Week for his play against Clemson, while Winston leads the ACC and is 2nd nationally in pass efficiency and was named the National Player and Freshman of the Week by Athlon Sports...The Wolfpack of NC State are coached by **Dave Doeren** and look to get injured starting **QB Brandon Mitchell** back in time to face the Seminoles...Mitchell suffered an injury in the first half of State's season-opener and is just now returning as junior **QB Pete Thomas** has led the Wolfpack in the first half of the season...In College Park, Md., the Terrapins of Coach **Randy Edsall** will be hosting the 9th-ranked Clemson Tigers of Coach **Dabo Swinney**, as both Atlantic Division foes seek to rebound from disappointing losses at Capital One Field at Byrd Stadium (3:30 pm; ESPN)...Maryland, at 5-2, needs another win to be bowl eligible...

The Terrapins are led by **QB C.J. Brown**, while Clemson counters with an offense built around **QB Tajh Boyd** and big-play **WR Sammy Watkins**... In Miami Gardens, Fla., the 7th-ranked Hurricanes of coach **Al Golden** are looking to stay atop the Coastal Division with Virginia Tech as they host Wake Forest at Sun Life Stadium (Noon, ESPNU)...Miami is led by **QB Stephen Morris** and explosive **RB Duke Johnson**, while Wake Forest, coached by **Jim Grobe**, is coming off impressive wins over NC State and Maryland after an early slow start...The Deacons are led by **QB Tanner Price** and **WR Michael Campanaro**...Campanaro leads the ACC and ranks 6th nationally with 9.2 catches per game...Looking to keep pace with the Hurricanes is Virginia Tech which hosts Coastal Division rival Duke Saturday at Lane Stadium in Blacksburg, Va. (3:30 pm, ESPNU)...The Hokies are coached

by **Frank Beamer** and led by **QB Logan Thomas** and **CB Kyle Fuller**...Fuller ranks 4th nationally in passes defended and is the leader of a Virginia Tech defense that ranks 2nd nationally in total defense, allowing just 256 total yards per game...The Blue Devils, coached by **David Cutcliffe** and led by the QB combination of **Anthony Boone** and **Brandon Connette** and **WR Jamison Crowder**, need one more victory to earn bowl eligibility for the 2nd straight year, a feat unprecedented in school history...In Charlottesville, Va., Georgia Tech, coached by **Paul Johnson** and led by **QB Vad Lee** and **CB Jemea Thomas**, face a Virginia squad, coached by **Mike London** and led by **QB David Watford** and **RB Kevin Parks** in Scott Stadium (12:30 pm, ACC Network)...Lee leads the nation's 5th-ranked rushing offense (304 yds/gm) while Thomas is one of the leaders of a defensive unit which is ranked 13th nationally in total defense and which has held four of its seven foes to 101 yards or less of rushing offense... The Cavaliers, in the midst of a three-game homestand, are looking to snap a three-game losing streak...In Chapel Hill, N.C., Boston College, coached by **Steve Addazio** and led by **RB Andre Williams** and **WR Alex Amidon**, travel to North Carolina in a cross divisional matchup at Kenan Stadium (3:30 p.m., Regional Sports Networks)... Williams leads the ACC and ranks 5th nationally in rushing yards per game (139.7), while Amidon needs just 144 receiving yards to become BC's all-time leading pass receiver... **North Carolina**, coached by **Larry Fedora**, features a potent offense led by **QB Bryn Renner** and **TE Eric Ebron**...In Annapolis, Md., Pitt faces its second straight non conference opponent when the Panthers, coached by **Paul Chryst**, travel to face the U.S. Naval Academy, coached by **Ken Niumatalolo**, at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium...The Panthers are led by **RB Isaac Bennett**, who rushed for 240 yards and 3 TDs in a win over Old Dominion last week, while the Midshipmen are led by **QB Keenan Reynolds**, who has passed and run for 1,015 yards and 13 TDs.

## ACC News & Notes

### FSU's Lamarcus Joyner Named

#### Walter Camp Defensive Player of the Week

Florida State senior defensive back **Lamarcus Joyner (Ft. Lauderdale, Fla.)**, who had 8 solo tackles, an interception, a quarterback sack and forced two fumbles in the Seminoles' 51-14 win over 3rd-ranked Clemson, was named the Walter Camp Defensive Player of the Week this week. Joyner becomes the fifth ACC player to be honored by the Walter Camp Foundation as either the National Offensive or Defensive Player of the Week.

### Athlon Sports Names FSU's Jameis Winston National Player, Freshman of the Week

For the second time this season, Florida State redshirt freshman **QB Jameis Winston (Bessemer, Ala.)** has been honored by Athlon Sports as its National Player of the Week. Winston, who threw for a career-best 444 yards against the 3rd-ranked Tigers was also named Athlon's National Freshman of the Week for the third time this season.

### FSU's Winston Has 3rd-Best Pass Efficiency Rating In This Century After Six Games

Florida State redshirt freshman **QB Jameis Winston (Bessemer, Ala.)** has a 210.7 pass efficiency rating after the first six games of his collegiate career. That is the third-best mark of any quarterback nationally in the first six games of a season since 1999, trailing only Baylor's Bryce Petty (221.6) this year and Russell Wilson (210.9) at Wisconsin in 2011.

### Florida State First With 48 in Five Straight Games

Florida State is the first team in ACC history to score 48 or more points in five consecutive games. The Seminoles, who are third nationally in scoring offense (53.2), began their streak with a 62-point outing against Nevada, then scored 48 or more against Bethune Cookman (54), Boston College (48), Maryland (63) and 51 last Saturday against 3rd-ranked Clemson.

### UNC's Ebron, FSU's O'Leary Record Big Days

North Carolina junior **TE Eric Ebron (Greensboro, N.C.)** and Florida State junior **TE Nick O'Leary (Palm Beach, Fla.)** each recorded one of the best receiving days by a tight end in ACC history this past week. Ebron had 8 catches for 199 yards and a 71-yard TD play against 10th-ranked Miami. The yards total was the second-most by an ACC TE in history, bettered only by John Henry Mills of Wake Forest, who had 230 yards in 1990 versus Duke. O'Leary had 5 catches for 161 yards, including a 94-yard non-scoring play. The 161 yards was the fourth best total by an ACC tight end.

### Miami, Florida State Both 6-0 For First Time Since 1991

For the first time in 22 years both Florida State and Miami have started the season 6-0. Not since the 1991 season, when Miami won all 12 of its games en route to a National Championship season and Florida State captured its first nine games before losing to the Hurricanes, have both schools began the year 6-0.

# National Football Foundation and Hall of Fame; ACC Digital Network

*NC State's Ted Brown, Miami's Vinny Testaverde:*

*Standout Players from ACC Schools Named to Prestigious College Hall of Fame*



A pair of standout players from Atlantic Coast Conference schools—NC State's Ted Brown and Miami's Vinny Testaverde will be inducted into the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame at its annual awards banquet on Tuesday, Dec. 10 at the Waldorf Astoria Hotel in New York City.

Since 2006, ACC schools have had 18 former players and coaches inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame and now total 95 inductees.

Brown and Testaverde will be inducted as part of the 2013 College Football Hall of Fame Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) Class at the 56th NFF Annual Awards Dinner on December 10, 2013, at the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel in New York City. They will be honored guests at the National Hall of Fame Salute at the Allstate Sugar Bowl in New Orleans on January 2, 2014 and officially enshrined in the summer of 2014.

Brown, a native of High Point, N.C., is one of the great running backs in Atlantic Coast Conference history. He is still the ACC's all-time record holder for career rushing yardage, having totaled 4,602 yards in a spectacular four-year (1975-78) career for the Wolfpack. Brown played in an era where bowl game statistics were not included among career totals, which would have added an additional 399 yards, giving him 5,001 yards for his career. A consensus All-American as a senior, Brown is the only football player in ACC history to be named first-team All-ACC four times. He still holds ACC career marks for most 100-yard games (27) and most rushing touchdowns (49) and he topped 1,000 rushing yards in three of his four seasons with the Wolfpack. He went on to an eight-year career in the National Football League with the Minnesota Vikings, rushing for over 4,500 yards and 53 touchdowns.

Brown becomes seventh former NC State player or coach to be inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame joining Dennis Byrd (2010), Lou Holtz (2009), Jim Ritcher (1998), Roman Gabriel (1989), Jack McDowall (1975) and Buck Shaw (1972).

One of the most celebrated players in a Miami program stocked with mythical talent, Vinny Testaverde claimed virtually every major award during his senior season in 1986. He becomes the ninth Hurricane to be inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame joining Jimmy Johnson (2012), Russell Maryland (2011), Gino Torretta (2009), Bennie Blades (2006), Don Bosseler (1990), Ted Hendricks (1987), Andy Gustafson (1985) and Jack Harding (1980).

As a senior, Testaverde (1982, 1984-86) earned unanimous First-Team All-American honors, and he won the Heisman Trophy, the Walter Camp Player of the Year, Maxwell, Davey O'Brien and UPI Player of the Year awards. He led the Canes to three consecutive bowls, including the 1987 Fiesta Bowl National Championship game. He finished his collegiate career with more than 6,000 passing yards and 48 touchdown passes, and he still ranks in the top five in virtually every passing category in school history. Testaverde, who was a redshirt on Miami's 1983 National Championship team, went 23-3 as a starter playing for legendary coaches Howard Schnellenberger and Hall of Famer Jimmy Johnson.

Tampa Bay selected Testaverde as the No. 1 overall selection in the 1987 NFL Draft, and his pro career spanned 21 seasons with seven different teams. The 1998 All-Pro and two-time Pro Bowl selection finished his NFL career seventh all-time in passing yards (46,233) and eighth in touchdowns (275). The Elmont, N.Y., native currently resides in Florida where he plays an active role with the Children's Cancer Center of Tampa. Testaverde remains among only four Hurricanes to have their jerseys retired at Miami.

# 2013 ACC FB Game Summaries -- Oct. 17-19

## Florida State 51, Clemson 14

Florida State redshirt freshman QB Jameis Winston threw for 444 yards and three touchdowns, and the Seminole defense forced four turnovers, including one a fumble that was returned 37 yards by DE Mario Edwards for a touchdown. Winston finished 22-of-34 in leading the fifth-ranked Seminoles (6-0, 4-0) past the third-ranked Tigers (6-1, 4-1) in the much-anticipated Saturday night ACC Atlantic Division showdown at Clemson's Death Valley. Winston connected with WR Kelvin Benjamin on a 22-yard strike for the Seminoles' first score and added touchdown passes of 72 and 17 yards to WR Rashad Greene. Winston and RB Devonta Freeman added rushing touchdowns as Florida State scored the most points ever by a Clemson opponent in Memorial Stadium. CB Lamarqus Joyner had a hand in creating three of the Tigers' turnovers, forcing two fumbles and intercepting a pass. Clemson's two touchdowns came on QB Tajh Boyd's 3-yard pass to WR Sammy Watkins late in the first quarter and reserve QB Cole Stoudt's 2-yard run with 13 seconds remaining in the game.

## Miami 27, North Carolina 23

RB Dallas Crawford rushed for 137 yards and scored a pair of 3-yard rushing touchdowns in the final 11:29 as the 10th-ranked Hurricanes (6-0, 2-0) overcame a 10-point fourth-quarter deficit and four turnovers to score an important ACC road win before a national ESPN audience on Thursday night. QBs Bryn Renner and Marquise Williams each threw a touchdown pass for the Tar Heels (1-5, 0-3). Williams' scoring toss was a 71-yard strike to TE Eric Ebron, whose 199 receiving yards were the most ever by a UNC tight end. Strong safety Dominique Green made two of UNC's four interceptions. Crawford, filling in for injured RB Duke Johnson, scored his winning touchdown with 16 seconds left, and the Hurricanes held on when Renner just missed connecting with WR Quinshad Davis on a 28-yard 'Hail Mary' as time expired. Miami remained unbeaten despite losing two of its major offensive threats in Johnson and WR Phillip Dorsett to injuries early in the game.

## Duke 35, Virginia 22

The visiting Blue Devils (5-2, 1-2) spotted the Cavaliers a 22-0 first-half lead before storming back with 35 unanswered points to claim their first ACC victory of the season. Starting QB Anthony Boone threw two touchdown passes and backup QB Brandon Connette ran for one touchdown and threw for another to lead the Blue Devils' comeback. Duke converted four fourth-down plays in the second half, and its defense held the Cavaliers (2-5, 0-3) to five straight three-and-outs. Duke TE Brandon Deavers was on the receiving end of 47- and 24-yard touchdown catches and ended up with a career-high 98 receiving yards. RB Kevin Parks scored all three Virginia touchdowns on a pair of 1-yard runs and a 13-yard pass from QB David Watford. DE Jordan DeWalt-Ondijo had a pair of QB sacks for the Blue Devils, who recorded 11 tackles for loss.

## Wake Forest 34, Maryland 10

WR Michael Campanaro set the Wake Forest career receptions record, and QB Tanner Price scored an unconventional hat trick with three touchdowns three different ways, as Wake Forest (4-3, 2-2) cruised past visiting Maryland on Saturday. Campanaro caught the 217th pass of his career in the waning minutes of the game, moving him past Desmond Clark for first place on Wake Forest's all-time chart. Campanaro also moved into fifth place on the Wake Forest receiving yards chart in the game with 2,407 career yards. The win was Jim Grobe's 77th as head coach of the Demon Deacons, moving him into a tie with legendary coach Peahead Walker as the winningest coach in program history. Price joined former Clemson star C.J. Spiller in becoming only the second ACC player since 2000 to record a passing, rushing and receiving touchdown in the same game. Defensively for Wake Forest, CB Merrill Noel and FS A.J. Marshall each had an interception, with Noel also forcing a fumble that was recovered by SS Ryan Janvion. NG Nikita Whitlock had two sacks, including one on the first play of the game, in addition to five tackles and three quarterback hurries. Maryland (5-2, 1-2) saw backup QB Caleb Rowe throw for 207 yards, including a 56-yard TD pass to WR Lavern Jacobs.

## Georgia Tech 56, Syracuse 0

QB Vad Lee threw for two touchdowns and ran for another, and RB Zach Laskey rushed for three touchdowns as the Yellow Jackets (4-3, 3-2) snapped a three-game losing streak in Saturday's ACC game against visiting Syracuse (3-4, 1-2). The Yellow Jackets rushed for 394 yards and finished with 482 yards total offense. Georgia Tech backup QB Justin Thomas was the game's leading rusher, tallying 95 yards on 10 carries, including a touchdown run. He led four Tech rushers that finished with better than 50 yards. Lee carried 14 times for 72 yards and two scores. RB David Sims recorded 56 yards on 12 carries. Senior DB Jemea Thomas had a team-high seven tackles, including a quarterback sack, and forced a fumble to key the defensive effort by Georgia Tech, which has recorded two shutouts in a season for the first time since 1985. The Yellow Jackets blanked Elon in their season opener.

## Pitt 35, Old Dominion 24

RB Isaac Bennett ran for a career-high 240 yards and three touchdowns to lead the Panthers (4-2), who overcame an early 10-point deficit to defeat the visiting Monarchs (4-3) on Saturday night. All three of Bennett's touchdowns came in a span of 12 minutes in the second quarter as he scored on runs of 25, 3 and 16 yards. QB Tom Savage threw a 21-yard touchdown pass to TE Manasseh Garner and in the third quarter and rushed 5 yards for Pitt's final touchdown with 13:19 remaining in the game. Old Dominion QB Taylor Heinicke threw for 312 yards and two touchdowns.



# ACC Notes By The Numbers

**1st** - Wake Forest **QB Tanner Price** became the first player in Wake Forest history and the first player in the ACC since 2009 to run for a score, throw for a score and catch a pass for a score in the Demon Deacons' 34-10 win over Maryland.

**1.30** - The average number of sacks per game by Pitt **NT Aaron Donald**. Donald leads the nation not only in sacks per game but also leads the nation in tackles for loss, averaging 2.10 tackles for loss per game.

**1.71** - Virginia Tech senior **CB Kyle Fuller** leads the ACC and ranks 4th nationally in passes defensed. Fuller has deflected 10 passes and intercepted 2 in 7 games, an average of 1.71 per game

**3** - After blocking a punt that set up Georgia Tech's first touchdown against Syracuse, Yellow Jacket sophomore **S Chris Milton** now leads the nation in blocked kicks with three on the season. Milton has blocked three punts for Tech.

**4** - The number of ACC tight ends who were named to the midseason watch list for the **John Mackey Award**, given annually to the nation's top tight end in the name of the former Syracuse All-America. Named to the list were **Nick O'Leary** of Florida State, **Clive Walford** of Miami, **Eric Ebron** of North Carolina and **Jake McGee** of Virginia.

**5** - The number of **ACC players** who have been honored as a National Offensive or Defensive Player of the Week by the Walter Camp Foundation this year after Florida State **CB Lamarcus Joyner** was named National Defensive Player of the Week for his play against 3rd-ranked Clemson. Previously, Virginia **S Anthony Harris** (Defensive), Florida State **QB Jameis Winston** (Offensive), Maryland **S A.J. Hendy** (Defensive) and Pitt **QB Tom Savage** (Offensive), have been honored by the Walter Camp Foundation.

**6.94** - The average career yards per carry for Miami sophomore **RB Duke Johnson**. Johnson, who had just 83 yards on just 8 carries (10.3) in Miami's win over North Carolina before he was injured. Johnson's per-carry average would be the 5th-best in ACC history.

**8** - The number of passing yards Clemson **QB Tajh Boyd** needs to become only the third player in ACC history to throw for 10,000 or more yards in his career. Boyd, who has thrown for 9,992 yards is

currently 3rd on the ACC career list trailing only NC State's Philip Rivers (13,484) and Duke Thaddeus Lewis (10,065).

**10** - The number of ACC players on the watch list for the **Biletnikoff Award** at midseason. Named for the former Florida State All-America, the Biletnikoff is given annually to the nation's top receiver. Named to the list were Alex Amidon, Boston College; Tyler Boyd, Pitt; Michael Campanaro, Wake Forest, Jamison Crowder, Duke; Quinshad Davis, UNC; Stefon Diggs, Md.; Phillip Dorsett, Miami; Rashad Greene, FSU; Devin Street, Pitt; and Sammy Watkins, Clemson.

**11** - Clemson junior **WR Sammy Watkins** recorded the 11th 100-yard performance in his career on Oct. 12 with a seven-catch, 101-yard, 1 TD performance against Boston College. Watkins has topped 100 receiving yards in four of Clemson's seven games this year, including efforts against 5th-ranked Georgia (127) and Wake Forest (113) and just missing against NC State (96).

**37** - The number of victories Florida State head coach **Jimbo Fisher** has led the Seminoles to in three and a half seasons as head coach in Tallahassee. That is more wins than any other ACC coach in their first four seasons of coaching. Fisher has compiled a 37-10 mark with a .787 winning percentage. Fisher's predecessor at FSU, Bobby Bowden, holds the mark for any coach in their first four years in the ACC, having compiled a 43-5-1 record from 1992 through 1995.

**56** - Georgia Tech's 56-point margin of victory against Syracuse was the 8th highest margin of victory in an Atlantic Coast Conference football game. Earlier this year, Tech tied the ACC record for margin of victory against any opponent in a 70-0 win over Elon.

**77** - Wake Forest head coach **Jim Grobe** posted his 77th win as the Deacons' head coach, tying him with D.C. "Peahead" Walker as the school's all-time winningest football coach.

**145** - The number of pass receiving yards that Boston College senior **WR Alex Amidon** needs to become the all-time leading receiver in Eagle history. Amidon, who had 121 receiving yards against 3rd-ranked Clemson on Oct. 12 for his 10th career 100-yard game, has 2,315 career receiving yards and trails only Kelvin Martin (2,337,

1983-86), Pete Mitchell (2,388/1991-94) and Rich Gunnell (2,459, 2006-09) on the BC career receiving yards list.

**153.10** - The pass efficiency rating for Boston College senior **QB Chase Rettig**, one of the most improved players in the Atlantic Coast Conference this year. Rettig entered the 2013 season with a career rating of just 111.86 and a pass completion percentage of just 53.4. This year, he is completing 63.8 percent of his passes. That's an increase of over 10 percentage points.

**199** - The number of pass receiving yards for North Carolina **TE Eric Ebron** in the Tar Heels' Oct. 17 against 10th-ranked Miami. Ebron's total was a UNC school record for tight ends and the 2nd-highest total by an ACC tight end in history behind the 230 yards by John Henry Mills of Wake Forest versus Duke in 1990.

**210.7** - The pass efficiency rating for Florida State redshirt freshman **QB Jameis Winston**. Winston has recorded the third-best pass efficiency rating this century for a quarterback in his team's first six games of a season (minimum 15 attempts per game). This season, Winston ranks 2nd nationally only to Baylor's Bryce Petty (221.6). Winston's rating also trails only that of Petty and Russell Wilson (210.9, Wisconsin, 2011).

**217** - The number of career receptions for Wake Forest senior **Michael Campanaro**, who had 11 catches in the Deacons' win over Maryland. Campanaro's total is a school record and currently has him in third place on the ACC's career receiving list.

**240** - The number of rushing yards for Pitt junior **RB Isaac Bennett** in the Panthers' 35-24 win over Old Dominion. Bennett's career-high was achieved on 30 carries (8.0) and included 3 TDs. It was the second-highest total in the ACC this year and tied for the 29th-best single-game total in ACC history.

**264** - Virginia Tech head coach **Frank Beamer** has a total of 264 coaching victories in his career and leads all active NCAA FBS head coaches. Beamer is in 6th place on the NCAA FBS all-time wins list. The late Joe Paterno (298) is next on the list.

**444** - The number of passing yards by Florida State redshirt freshman **Jameis Winston** in the Seminoles' 51-14 win over 3rd-ranked Clemson, the fourth time in six games Winston has topped the 300-yard passing mark in a game this year.

## Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer Is NCAA FBS Active Career Leader in Wins

Virginia Tech's **Frank Beamer** is now the leading active head coach in the NCAA's FBS in career victories with a total of 264 triumphs in his 33-year coaching career. With a win over Rutgers in last year's Russell Athletics Bowl, Beamer passed former BYU head coach LaVell Edwards for 6th place on the all-time NCAA FBS coaching victory list. Penn State's Joe Paterno, with an NCAA adjusted total of 298, is next on the list in 5th place. Georgia Tech head coach Paul Johnson ranks 12th on the active FBS list with 151 career wins. Former Florida State head coach Bobby Bowden, who retired after the 2009 season, is now the NCAA FBS all-time leader with 377 victories.

## Johnson, Beamer, London Among Top 20 Active Coaches in Wins Per Season

The ACC has four coaches who rank among the Top 25 active football coaches in the NCAA in wins per season with five or more seasons as a head coach. Georgia Tech's **Paul Johnson** leads the way among ACC coaches, currently averaging 9.19 wins per full season. Johnson's record puts him in 8th place nationally among active head coaches with five or more years of experience. Virginia Tech's **Frank Beamer** (17th, 8.06), Virginia's **Mike London** (tied for 18th, 8.00) and Clemson's **Dabo Swinney** (tied for 18th, 8.00) join Johnson among the Top 25 coaches in the nation in the NCAA's FBS. Florida State's **Jimbo Fisher** is off to an impressive start in his career as well, averaging 10.33 wins a year in his first three seasons at the helm at Florida State. NC State's new head coach **Dave Doeren** is also off to a strong start, averaging 11.5 wins a year in his first two seasons at Northern Illinois.

Now in his fourth season as head coach at Florida State, head coach **Jimbo Fisher** has already joined some select company among ACC football coaches. Fisher has compiled a 36-10

record (.787). His winning percentage has him in 3rd place among all ACC head coaches after four seasons, ahead of such prominent figures as NC State's Lou Holtz, Clemson's Danny Ford, Maryland's Ralph Friedgen and Georgia Tech's Bobby Ross. The best mark recorded by an ACC head coach in his first three years in the league was by Fisher's predecessor at FSU, Bobby Bowden, who posted a 45-5-1 record (.892). Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer has the 2nd-best record at 42-11-0 (.792), followed by Fisher and Clemson's Danny Ford (.772).

## Clemson's Memorial Stadium Is Home Sweet Home for Tiger's Dabo Swinney



Clemson head coach **Dabo Swinney** has enjoyed coaching in the cozy and imposing confines of the Tigers' home field, also known as Death Valley. Now in his sixth

season as head coach of the Tigers, Swinney's teams won 18 of the first 21 home ACC games, a winning percentage of .857. That is third-best among ACC coaches who have coached a minimum of four seasons. He is behind of former Tiger coach Ken Hatfield, who posted a 12-1-1 mark in four seasons (.893), and legendary Florida State coach Bobby Bowden, who also won more ACC home games than any other coach, with 62 triumphs in his 18 years in the league. Bowden's successor at Florida State, Jimbo Fisher is on a pretty good pace himself, having won 11 of his first 13 ACC home games. Four Clemson coaches rank in the Top 10 including Hatfield (1st), Swinney (3rd), Danny Ford (7th) and the legendary Frank Howard (tied for 9th).

## North Carolina Sets Offensive Records In First Year Under Larry Fedora

North Carolina Head Coach **Larry Fedora's** fast-paced offense had his team scoring at a school-record pace in his first year in Chapel Hill. UNC ranked 8th nationally in scoring offense in 2012, averaging 40.6 points a game while also ranked 14th nationally in total offense,



■ In Fedora's first 18 games as head coach at UNC, North Carolina has topped the 40-point mark 7 times.

■ Also, in his first 18 games, UNC has topped the 30-point mark on 11 occasions.

■ In his first 18 games at UNC, the Tar Heels have gained 400 or more yards of total offense 15 times.

■ UNC set school records in 2012 for most points, highest scoring average and highest average of total offense (485.6).

■ UNC's 487 total points in 2012 were the 7th-highest single-season total in ACC history.

## NC State's New Head Coach Dave Doeren Among Nation's Winningest Coaches in 2011-12

New NC State Head Coach, **Dave Doeren**, who led the Wolfpack to a 3-3 record in his six games as State's head coach and now is 26-7 overall, has not wasted time in winning games in his first two years as a head coach at the FBS level. In fact, only one other coach in the Football Bowl Subdivision--Alabama's Nick Saban--has won more games than has Doeren in the past two seasons. He guided Northern Illinois to a 23-4 mark in 2011 and 2012, including the school's first berth in the BCS bowl game, a slot in the 2013 Discover Orange Bowl this past January. Only Saban, among current FBS coaches, posted more wins in the past two years than Doeren's teams at Northern Illinois. In all, three current ACC Coaches rank among the Top 11 coaches nationally in wins among current college coaches th past two years. Both Florida State's Jimbo Fisher and Clemson's Dabo Swinney have 21 wins in 2011 and 2012, tying Kansas State's Bill Snyder for the 8th.



## Duke Experiencing Success Under ACC Coach of the Year David Cutcliffe

With a 5-2 start to the 2013 season, David Cutcliffe, the ACC's 2012 Coach of the Year, has led the Blue Devils to 26 victories since coming to Durham in 2008. That may not sound like a great record, except when you consider that it is more wins than the Blue Devils totalled in the 12 seasons before Cutcliffe came to Durham. Cutcliffe led the Blue Devils to a 6-7 mark in 2012, their first appearance in a bowl game since 1994 and came within a few yards of claiming the Blue Devils' first winning season in 18 years and their first bowl triumph since 1961.



■ In the five-plus years that Cutcliffe has been in Durham, he has already mentored a pair of quarterbacks who finished their careers ranked in the ACC's top seven of career passing yardage. **Thaddeus Lewis** (2006-09) threw for 10,065 yards, the second-highest total in league history and **Sean Renfree** (2009-12), threw for 9,465 career yards, the 7th-best total by an ACC player.

■ Also, under his guidance, Duke **WR Conner Vernon** became the all-time leading pass receiver in ACC history setting conference career marks for pass receptions (283) and pass reception yardage (3,749).

They will be honored at the ACC Night of Legends sponsored by the Belk Bowl on Friday, Dec. 6, and on Dec. 7, during ceremonies at Bank of America Stadium for the 9th Annual Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship, which will be nationally televised with either a 7:45 pm (ESPN) or 8 p.m. (ABC) kickoff.

The group of 15 former gridiron standouts from current ACC schools includes a former ACC Football Player of the Year; 10 former All-Americans, including six first-team All-America honorees; and 12 players who combined for 97 years in the National Football League. Twelve of the Legends were drafted into the NFL, including six first- or second-round draft choices.

In all, the collection of players combined for two national championships, five ACC Championships and one Super Bowl title.

Joining the aforementioned selections are Boston College running back **Mike Cloud (Portsmouth, R.I.)**, who ended his collegiate career in 1998 as the Eagles' all-time leading rusher with 3,597 yards; Duke halfback and end **Wes Chesson (Edenton, N.C.)**, who ended his career with nine 100-yard receiving games, at the time the most in ACC history; Florida State guard **Jamie Dukes (Orlando, Fla.)**, a consensus first-team All-America for the Seminoles in 1985; and Georgia Tech tailback "**Rambling**" **Robert Lavette (Cartersville, Ga.)**, who is still the leading career rusher in Yellow Jacket history with 4,066 yards.

Completing the ACC Football Legends Class of 2013 are Miami's **Edgerrin James (Immokalee, Fla.)**, one of the most successful running backs in Hurricane history; North Carolina's **Ken Willard (Richmond, Va.)**, a second-team All-America fullback for the Tar Heels; NC State's famed Buckey twins, **Dave Buckey (Akron, Ohio)**, an All-ACC quarterback, and **Don Buckey (Akron)**, an All-ACC wide receiver, who keyed the Wolfpack's football resurgence in the 1970s under then head coach Lou Holtz; Virginia Tech wide receiver **Andre` Davis (Niskayuna, N.Y.)**, a first-team All-America and explosive performer who was one of the leaders of Tech's 2000 team which reached the BCS National Championship Game; and Wake Forest quarterback **Jay Venuto (Salem, N.J.)**, the 1979 ACC Player of the Year who led the Deacons to wins over three nationally-ranked foes that year.

# ACC Overtime Games

## The ACC & Overtime

When Virginia Tech and Marshall ended regulation tied at 21 in week four of the 2013 season, it marked the 63rd game featuring an ACC team that has had to go to extra sessions. Of the 63 overtime contests, a large portion of them--27--have been played in the month of September. Games have gone into overtime for ACC teams a total of 14 times in November, while 12 have been played in October, three in August, five in December and two in January (2006 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl). Of the 63 overtime contests, 31 have been ACC games while 32 nonconference games have gone into overtime. The home team has a 35-20 advantage in the 55 games played on campus. The team which wins the toss has a 32-31 record. Forty-nine of the games were decided in the first overtime with nine games in double overtime and five in triple overtime.
