## OPENING DRAW

### GAME OVERVIEW

- Virginia opens ACC play on Sunday inside the Carrier Dome against the Syracuse Orange. Faceoff is set for noon.
- This week Virginia is ranked No. 11 in the USILA coaches poll and No. 9 in the Inside Lacrosse/Maverik media poll. Syracuse shares the No. 12 ranking with Loyola in the USILA coaches poll and is ranked No. 10 in the media poll.

### THE SERIES VS. THE ORANGE

- The Cavaliers and Orange are meeting for the 33rd time in series history, but are playing each other for only the fourth time as part of ACC play. Virginia has won nine of the last 14 regular-season meetings, but three of the last five losses have come at the Carrier Dome (2011, 2013, 2015).
- The series is tied, 16-16, and each team has scored 416 goals all-time against each other.
- UVA and Syracuse won four combined NCAA titles between 2006-11.

### WILLIAMS IS ACC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- For the third week in a row a Cavalier has been named ACC Offensive Player of the Week. Zed Williams earned the accolade after scoring seven goals and dishing out two assists over UVA's two games last week.
- Williams also picked up 10 ground balls from the attack position.
- On Feb. 13 Dox Aitken was named ACC Offensive Player of the Week and on Feb. 20 Mike D'Amario was named ACC Offensive Player of the Week.



Michael Kraus led UVA with seven points on two goals and five assists on Wednesday night against High Point. Kraus' career-high five assists was tied for a team high against the Panthers. Zed Williams also had five helpers.

## COVERING THE CAVALIERS

**UNIQUELY UVA**

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

**Grounds:** The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

**First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year:** Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

**Commonwealth:** Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

**UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES**

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

**THE CAVALIER MASCOT**

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

**UNIVERSITY COLORS**

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

**WAH-HOO-WAH**

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

Adequate space is available for the visiting team needs. Arrangement for broadcasts must be validated in advance through the UVA Athletics Media Relations Office.

**INTERVIEWS**

All requests for interviews with coaches and players should be made through Vincent Briedis in the Athletics Media Relations Office. Postgame interviews are conducted at field level following the postgame handshake. Locker rooms are closed.

When covering a game at Klöckner Stadium, please include the umlaut above the letter 'o' in Klöckner. Mac users can do this by clicking Alt-u or Option-u and then typing the letter o. PC users should make sure their number lock is off and then type Alt 0246.

**THE SERIES VS. SYRACUSE**

- The series is tied, 16-16, which mimics the back-and-forth scoring characteristic of the games between the two teams.
- Not only is the series tied, but each team has scored 416 goals against the other all-time.
- The two schools battled only three times between 1938-93, but have met at least once each season since 1994.
- The regular-season series began in 1995.
- The two schools have also met six times in the NCAA Tournament since 1995.
- Virginia has won nine of the last 14 meetings in the series, including six straight regular-season match-ups until a 2011 setback at the Carrier Dome.
- The Cavaliers' success lately closely mirrors that of the Orange who won eight of nine games from 1997-2002.
- The Orange won in overtime, 9-8, in the 2003 at the Dome. It was the first time in the series that neither team scored in the double figures.
- Another heartbreaking UVA loss saw the Orange pull out a dramatic come-from-behind 12-11 double overtime win in the semifinals of the 2008 NCAA Tournament on the way to capturing the national championship.
- The 2008 Syracuse NCAA win ended Virginia's five-game series winning streak, the longest by either team in the series.
- Both teams are known for their high-scoring offenses, but it is interesting to note that since 1999 Syracuse has scored at least 15 goals only five times (2002-03-04-06-15) and Virginia four (03-06-06-14) in the series.
- Virginia's loss in 2011 snapped a three game win streak in the "Dome" over Syracuse, a feat boasted by no other opponent of the Orange.
- The 2014 meeting at Klöckner Stadium between UVA and Syracuse, James Pannell scored a career-high seven goals in a 17-12 UVA triumph.
- The Orange came away with a 15-9 win the last time these teams got together in 2015 at the Carrier Dome.

**LARS TIFFANY AND THE CARRIER DOME**

- Lars Tiffany hails from LaFayette, N.Y., and attended LaFayette High School, which is roughly 10 miles from the Carrier Dome.
- Tiffany has not been on the sidelines of the Carrier Dome since his final game as a student-athlete at Brown in 1990, when the Bears fell to the Orange, 20-12, in the NCAA Quarterfinals. The 1990 season also served as the Gait brothers' final season with the Orange.

**TIGHT GAMES CHARACTERIZE SERIES**

- The potential for a high-scoring game such as the classic 1997 match-up won by Syracuse, 22-21, is one of the main reasons this game is so widely anticipated.
- However, since 1996 a three-goal win can be considered a "blow out"
- 17 of the last 25 games since then have been decided by just one or two goals.
- More than half the games between the two schools (19 of 32), have been decided by one or two goals, including both games in 2008, which went to overtime.
- In the history of the series, the biggest win by either team is a 13-4 Syracuse win in 1938 in the first meeting between the two squads.
- Virginia's biggest win is a 15-7 victory in the Carrier Dome in 1995.
- UVA's 14-10 win in 2012 was the largest winning-margin for the Cavaliers in the series since winning 17-10 in the 2006 Final Four.
- UVA's 2014 win was a five-goal margin, 17-12, at Klöckner Stadium.
- Syracuse's 2015 win was a six-goal margin, 15-9, at the Dome, its largest win in the series since winning 18-12 in Charlottesville in 2004.

**THIS IS DIFFERENT**

- Sunday's game is the first time since 2007 where UVA and Syracuse meet and each team has a loss.
- Virginia went eight years in row entering Syracuse week undefeated, but for the second year in a row the Cavaliers will face the Orange with at least one loss.
- Historically the meeting is between two defeated teams over the past 10 seasons.
- In 2007, 2013 and 2014 Syracuse entered the game with at least one loss.
- Since the USILA coaches poll came out in 1973, there have been 22 regular season meetings between UVA and Syracuse and 18 of them matched two Top-5 teams. This is only the fifth meeting since the USILA coaches poll came out where both teams are not ranked in the USILA coaches poll Top-5.

**NO WONDER THE SERIES IS NEARLY 50/50**

- Since 1994, the two teams have met 29 times—with Syracuse winning 15 times and Virginia 14.
- 18 of those games have been decided by one or two goals, including a string of five meetings - both games in 2008 went to overtime - until UVA's four-goal win in 2012 in Charlottesville snapped the streak.

**WILLIAMS ALREADY IN THE 20-20 CLUB**

- Attackman Zed Williams (10-15-25 G-A-P and 24 ground balls) is the only player in the nation with at least 20 points and 20 ground balls. Princeton's Zach Currier is the only other player remotely close to Williams and he only has 10 points to go with his 21 ground balls.
- Williams is the only player in the nation that leads his team in ground balls, assists and points. With eight goals, Currier of Princeton is the only other player in the nation that leads his team in ground balls and at least one other offensive category.

**AITKEN ONE OF THE NATION'S TOP FRESHMEN**

- Midfielder Dox Aitken leads the nation's freshmen midfielders with 11 goals and is tied for No. 3 in the nation among freshmen goal-scorers.
- No. 2 Ben French is the younger brother of current UVA senior Joe French.

**AITKEN SCORES UVA'S FIRST GOAL OF 2017**

- Dox Aitken scored the first goal of 2017 for the Cavaliers at then-No. 6 Loyola on Feb. 11.
- It is the second year in a row the first goal of the season for UVA was scored by a true freshman. Ryan Conrad scored the first goal of 2016 for UVA against Loyola at Klöckner Stadium. Conrad was the first true freshman to do so since Ryan Tucker in 2012 at Drexel.
- Since 2010 a UVA true freshman has scored the season's first goal five times. Connor English did so in 2010 and Rob Emery in 2011.

**TIFFANY'S STAFF IS CHAMPIONSHIP CALIBER**

- UVA head coach Lars Tiffany brought both of his full-time assistants with him from Brown, Sean Kirwan and Kip Turner. Both Kirwan and Turner own a championship pedigree.
- Turner is a 2007 Virginia graduate and was the starting goalie on the Cavaliers' historic 17-0 NCAA title team in 2006. Turner later went on to win three MLL championships as a player. He won his first in 2011 with Boston, followed by 2012 and 2013 with Chesapeake.
- Kirwan, an All-American attackman at Tufts, won the 2010 NCAA DIII title and helped guide the Jumbos to the 2014 NCAA DIII title as an assistant coach at his alma mater.

**VIRGINIA IS A GROUND BALL MACHINE**

- UVA has led the nation in ground balls three of the last eight years.
- Currently UVA ranks No. 1 in the nation in ground balls (48.80).
- UVA is the only school in the nation to finish in the Top-5 nationally in ground balls per game seven times over the last eight seasons.
- Duke is the closest team to UVA, finishing in the Top-5 four times during the same span.
- The only school in 2016 to finish with more ground balls per game was new UVA head coach Lars Tiffany's 2016 Brown team.

It was a wild finish at the Ridley Athletic Complex as 13 combined goals were scored in the fourth quarter, but No. 14 Virginia (1-0) outlasted No. 6 Loyola (0-1), 16-15, to open the Lars Tiffany era.

Virginia owned a 10-5 lead with 7:50 left in the third quarter when Zed Williams found Ryan Conrad for a Cavalier goal that capped a 6-0 UVA run. It took 45 seconds for Loyola to begin a 5-0 run of its own to tie the game, 10-10, with 12:57 left in the game.

Making his collegiate debut against Loyola, Dox Aitken went straight toward the cage and scored his third goal of the game with 12:19 left in the contest to halt the Greyhounds run, giving UVA the lead back, 11-10. Conrad scored unassisted at 11:27 to give UVA a 12-10 advantage. Aitken and Conrad's goals were the beginning of a 4-1 UVA, giving the Cavaliers a 14-11 lead. Aitken capped the run with his fourth goal of the game with 8:13 left to play.

The Greyhounds came roaring back with a 4-1 run of their own, tying the game at 15-15 after Graham Savio won a faceoff and sprinted toward the UVA cage with 2:59 left. Virginia wasted no time after winning the ensuing faceoff as Williams dodged and flipped a pass behind his back to Conrad and the sophomore deposited the game's final goal, lifting UVA to the 16-15 win.

A UVA turnover in the final seconds set up an opportunity for Loyola to tie the game. But Tanner Scales knocked down Zack Sirico's pass with three seconds left and Conrad picked up the ground ball as time expired.

Loyola started the game's scoring with a Mike Perkins goal via an assist by Zach Sirico at 12:08 in the first quarter. Virginia responded with a 4-1 run to take a two-goal lead, 4-2. Aitken and Joe French each scored goals for UVA, while Jason Murphy and Michael Kraus capped the run. Kraus' first collegiate goal came with 8:56 left in the first half.

The Greyhounds retaliated with a 3-0 run, taking a 5-4 lead. Loyola received goals from Brian Begley and one from Zirico. Savio capped the Loyola run with an unassisted goal with 6:14 left in the second quarter. Virginia held Loyola scoreless for the next 14:09, while the Cavaliers took a 10-5 lead, via a aforementioned 6-0 run.

Attackman Mike D'Amario scored seven goals to lead No. 7 Virginia (2-0) to an 18-14 triumph over the Drexel Dragons (0-1) inside Klöckner Stadium. The seven goals by D'Amario were the most by a Cavalier since Matt White scored seven in the championship game of the 2013 ACC Tournament against North Carolina.

The scoring was steady and often for both teams. UVA opened up the game with a comfortable 8-3 run. Ryan Lukacovic scored the first two goals for Virginia unassisted. D'Amario scored two of his seven goals during this run. Luke Brugel capped the run with 12:31 left in the second quarter on a helper from Dox Aitken.
