ACC Has Two Teams in

Amway Coaches' Poll Top Eight; Clemson, 6th, Florida State 8th Both undefeated **Clemson** (6th) and **Florida State** (8th) are in the Top 10 of the Amway Coaches poll this week. **Duke** and **North Carolina** were listed among others receiving votes.

ACC Now Has Six Wins over

Top 10 Non-Conference Foes

With **Clemson** defeating No. 6 Notre Dame, the ACC now has recorded six wins over non-conference Top 10 teams in the past two seasons, the most of any Conference nationally.

ACC Involved in Two of the Top 3 Rated CFB Games This Year.

ACC schools have been involved in two of the top three rated college football games televised across all networks. **Virginia Tech's** season-opener against **Ohio State** is still the top-rated game of the year for ABC (6.6 overnight), while last week's **Clemson-Notre Dame** contest ranked third (4.8).

Three of the Top Four Defenses Nationally Reside in the ACC

Three of the top four defenses in the nation are in the ACC this week, led by **Boston College**, which leads the nation, allowing just 140 yards per game. **NC State** (3rd, 225.8) and **Pitt** (4th, 243.8) are right behind with six ACC teams in the Top 20 with **Duke** (9), **Florida State** (13) and **Wake Forest** (20).

ACC Will Play 14

Non-Conference Games Against This Week's AP Top 25 Teams

The ACC has played or is scheduled to play a total of 14 games against non-conference teams that are ranked in this week's AP Top 25. That is the most of any Power Five conference by far. The next closest league plays six games against non-conference teams in this week's AP Top 25.

All Five ACC Games Decided by One Possession

All five conference matchups last Saturday were decided by one possession, tying for the most in one week in league history (2010 Week 10).

6th-Ranked Clemson Hosts Georgia Tech

Virginia Tech Hosts NC State on ESPN Friday Night

Atlantic Coast Conference Football heads into Week Six with two teams ranked among the nation's Top Eight in the Amway Coaches poll with **Clemson** ranked 6th nationally after its 24-22 win over Notre Dame, and **Florida State** ranked eighth after a 24-16 win at **Wake Forest**. The Tigers are also ranked sixth by the Associated Press, while the Seminoles are ranked 12th in AP...**Clemson's** win over the then sixth-ranked Irish, gives the ACC six wins over Top 10 non-conference foes the last two seasons, the most of any conference nationally...Overall, the ACC is 32-14 (.711) against non-conference foes... Defense predominates this year in the league as six ACC teams are ranked in the nation's Top 20 in total defense, led by **Boston College**, which is ranked first nationally, and followed by **NC State** (3rd) and **Pitt** (4th)...Week Six of the ACC schedule features two pairs of longtime rivals squaring off in interdivisional play...**Clemson** hosts **Georgia Tech** at Memorial Stadium in Clemson, S.C., in a game televised regionally by ABC and

to the rest of the nation on ESPN2...This will mark the 81st meeting between the cross-division rivals in a series which began in 1898 and has been played annually since 1983...**Florida State**, ranked 12th nationally in AP and eighth in the Coaches poll, hosts one of its Sunshine State arch-rivals in **Miami** Saturday at Doak S. Campbell Stadium in Tallahassee...The Seminoles bring a 26-game winning streak against ACC foes into the contest, which will mark the 60th meeting of the two schools...The weekend begins early with a Friday night contest as **Virginia Tech** hosts **NC State** in the third interdivisional game of the week...The Hokies have a question mark at quarterback with both **Michael Brewer** and **Brenden Motley** trying to overcome injuries they have suffered...The game will be nationally televised by ESPN as both teams are looking to get back on the winning track...In all, there will be five ACC games on the schedule, including a pair of Atlantic Division contests...

The ACC On Sirius/XM Satellite Radio

In addition to the ACC Football Championship Game, Sirius/XM also broadcasts the ACC Men's and Women's Basketball Tournaments and the ACC Baseball Tournament.

Additionally Syracuse travels to South Florida and Duke goes to Army in a pair of non-conference games, while Louisville and North Carolina will have open dates after five consecutive games.

NC State at Virginia Tech (Friday, 8 pm, ESPN)

The Wolfpack, coached by **Dave Doeren**, is making its first appearance in Lane Stadium in Blacksburg, Va., since 2009...Led by **QB Jacoby Brissett**, State is looking to rebound from its 20-13 loss to Louisville last weekend while the Hokies, coached by **Frank Beamer** and led by **LB Deon Clarke** and **DB Chuck Clark**, are looking to do the same after dropping a 17-13 decision to Pitt...Tech has won three straight in the series, which began in 1900...State has not won in Blacksburg since a 19-14 decision in 1951.

Duke at Army (Saturday, Noon, CBSSN)

Duke, coached by **David Cutcliffe**, is stepping out of conference to travel to West Point, N.Y., to play Army in its final non-conference test...The Blue Devils have had back-to-back ACC triumphs that has staked them to the early lead in the Coastal Division...The Blue Devils are led by **QB Thomas Sirk** offensively and feature a defensive unit that is ranked ninth nationally total defense, allowing just 269.8 yards per game and is led by All-America **S Jeremy Cash**...The Blue Devils are also ranked 5th nationally in scoring defense and 6th in pass efficiency defense...Army is coached by former Georgia Tech assistant **Jeff Monken**...Army is ranked 10th nationally in rushing, averaging 287.8 yards per game....Duke's last visit to West Point came in 2009, a 35-19 victory.

Virginia at Pitt (Saturday, 12:30 pm, ACC Network)

After an open date, Virginia, coached by **Mike London**, begins its conference season, travelling to face Coastal Division rival Pitt at Heinz Field in Pittsburgh...The Cavaliers are led by **QB Matt Johns**, who is third in the ACC in total offense, and **WR Canaan Severin**, who is tied for third in the league in pass receptions per game (5.8)...Pitt, coached by **Pat Narduzzi**, is coming off an impressive defensive performance against Virginia Tech in Blacksburg, holding the Hokies to 100 total yards in a 17-13 triumph...The Panthers feature an offense led by **QB Nate Peterman** and **WR Tyler Boyd**, who leads the ACC and ranks fifth nationally in receptions per game (8.7)...Defensively, the Panthers' defense has been salty, ranking fourth nationally in both total (243.8) and rushing defense (71.3) led by LBs

Matt Galambos and Nicolas Grigsby.

Wake Forest at Boston College (Saturday, 3 pm, RSN)

Boston College, coached by **Steve Addazi** and featuring the nation's No. 1 defense led by LBs **Steven Daniels** and **Connor Strachan**, host Atlantic Division rival Wake Forest at Alumni Stadium in Chestnut Hill...The Deacons are coached by **Dave Clawson** and led by freshman **QB Kendall Hinton**, who has played solidly in place of the injured **John Wolford**...Both teams are looking to get back on the winning path after close losses last week to league foes....BC has won two straight in the series.

Syracuse at South Florida (Saturday, 3:30 pm, CBSSN)

Syracuse, coached by **Scott Shafer**, wraps up its non-conference schedule with a trip to Tampa, Fla., to face the Bulls of USF at Raymond James Stadium...The Orange are coming off an open date just after an impressive performance in a loss to seventh-ranked LSU...Syracuse is led by **LB Zaire Franklin** and **WR-KR Brisley Estime**...USF, coached by Willie Taggart, will be meeting its second ACC foe, having dropped a 34-14 decision to Florida State on Sept. 12.

Georgia Tech at No. 6 Clemson (Saturday, 3:30 pm, ABC/ESPN2)

Georgia Tech, coached by **Paul Johnson**, will be looking to snap a three-game losing streak when it travels to Clemson to meet the sixth-ranked Tigers in Memorial Stadium...Tech is led by junior **QB Justin Thomas** and its spread option offense ranks 6th nationally, averaging 311.8 yards per game...The Tigers, coached by **Dabo Swinney**, and winners of four straight, are led by **QB Deshaun Watson** and the DE tandem of **Shaq Lawson** and **Kevin Dodd**.

Miami at No. 12 Florida State (Saturday, 8 pm, ABC)

For the second straight Saturday, the ACC occupies ABC's prime 8 p.m. telecast, as the Sunshine State rivalry between Miami and Florida State takes center stage...The Hurricanes, coached by **Al Golden** and led by **QB Brad Kaaya**, have not won in Tallahassee since 2009, the year before FSU head coach **Jimbo Fisher** took over the reins to the Seminole program...Fisher has coached FSU to five consecutive wins over Miami...**QB Everett Golson** and **CB Jalen Ramsey** lead the Seminoles, who rank sixth nationally in scoring defense and 13th in total defense.

ACC Football By The Numbers

1 - Boston College leads the nation in every major defensive category including total defense (140 yds/gm.), rushing defense (43.4 yds/gm.), passing yards allowed (96.6 yds/gm.), pass efficiency defense (76.09) and first downs allowed (51). The Eagles are also 3rd nationally in scoring defense (8.0) and third down percentage defense (.203).

2.1 - Clemson junior DE Shaq Lawson leads the ACC and is tied for third nationally in tackles for loss, averaging 2.1 per game. Lawson had 3.5 TFLs in the Tigers' win over 6th-ranked Notre Dame.

3 - Three ACC players rank among the top 11 kickoff returners in the country, led by Duke's **DeVon Edwards** (39.7), who ranks third, followed by **Kermit Whitfield** of Florida State (4th, 36.7) and **Traveon Samuel** of Louisville (11th, 33.0).

4 - In this century, only four players in college football have recorded at least 125 yards rushing and passing while also making a TD pass reception, and only one--North Carolina's **Marquise Williams**--has done it twice. Williams had 303 yards passing, 132 rushing and a 23-yard scoring pass against Notre Dame last year, and last week had 134 yards passing, 148 yards rushing and a 37-yard TD catch. Nevada's Colin Kaepernick, UAB's Joe Webb and Mississippi State's Zak Prescott are the only other FBS players to accomplish the feat in the last 10 years.

5 - Pitt junior **WR Tyler Boyd** was named to the watch list for the Biletnikoff Award last week and leads the ACC and is 5th nationally in receptions per game, averaging 8.7 catches a contest. The Biletnikoff is presented annually to the nation's top receiver in honor of the former Florida State standout.

7 - Clemson has now won seven straight games and that ties for the sixth-longest current winning streak in the nation.

21 - North Carolina's 38-31 comeback win over Georgia Tech was an historic one for the Tar Heels, who trailed 21-0 in the first quarter of play. It marked the biggest comeback in Carolina football history. The previous best comeback was originally 17 points, also against Georgia Tech, also on Grant Field, and that effort was tied in 1997 against Virginia.

23 - With seven regular-season games remaining, Duke head coach **David Cutcliffe** has already led Duke to 23 wins over the past three seasons. The school record is 25, set by the originally by 1936-38 teams of Wallace Wade which posted a 25-4-1 record and tied by Cutcliffe's 2012-14 teams (25-15).

26 - Florida State has won 26 consecutive games against Atlantic Coast Conference teams. The streak dates back to a 17-16 loss to NC State in 2012. The Noles' winning streak ties for the second-longest in league history, bettered only by the 29-game skein FSU achieved when it entered the ACC in 1992. That streak ended at Virginia in 1995. The streak is the longest by any team in any conference since USC won 27 straight Pac-10 (now Pac-12) games from October 2003 until October 2006. The current streak is tied for ninth all-time in NCAA FBS history. Oklahoma holds the record by winning 44 straight games in the Big 7 (later Big 8) from 1952-59. Boise State (WAC, 2001-05) and Oklahoma (Big 8, 1984-88) are tied for second at 31 consecutive wins in their respective conferences.

48.3 - The punting average for Miami junior **P Justin Vogel**. He is fourth nationally in punting average and is one of three ACC punters ranked in the top 11 nationally, joined by Virginia's **Nicholas Conte** (7th, 46.7) and Duke's **Will Monday** (11th, 46.3).

81st - Saturday will be the 81st meeting between Georgia Tech and Clemson in football. The Yellow Jackets hold a 50-27-2 advantage. Not included in that record, due to NCAA sanctions, is Tech's 2009 win over the Tigers in the ACC Championship Game.

94 - Dalvin Cook's 94-yard TD run for Florida State at Wake Forest was the Seminoles' longest run in their ACC membership (1992-present); the longest by any ACC player against Wake Forest (1953-present); and the longest by any player at BB&T Field (1968-present). Cook is averaging 8.64 yards per carry, the fifth-best average in the nation.

180 & 180 - Only four freshmen this century have each run and thrown for 180 or more yards in the same game. Louisville's **Lamar Jackson** accomplished that against Samford on Sept. 26, joining Johnny Manziel of Texas A&M (2012), J.T. Barrett of Ohio State (2014) and Dwight Dasher of Middle

Tennessee (2007). Only four ACC freshmen have topped 100 yards rushing and passing in the same game and Jackson has done it three times, joining Wake's Kendall Hinton (2015), and former Georgia Tech QBs Vad Lee and Reggie Ball, who each accomplished it once.

106.8 - Pitt redshirt freshman **RB Qadree Ollison** is averaging 106.8 rushing yards per game. Prior to getting injured in Pitt's season-opening game this year, 2014 ACC Player of the Year James Conner had averaged 102.6 yards per game for the first 26 games of his career.

207 - NC State **QB Jacoby Brissett** has now thrown 207 consecutive passes without an interception. That is the sixth-longest streak in ACC history. Brissett's streak of 187 passes without a pick last year is the eighth-longest streak in ACC history. The ACC record is still a long way away. It is held by former NC State standout Russell Wilson, who threw 379 passes without a pick during the 2008 and 2009 seasons.

275 - The number of career victories for Virginia Tech head coach **Frank Beamer**. That is the most of any active FBS head coach and ranks sixth on the NCAA's FBS all-time list. Beamer trails only the icons of the game in career wins in Joe Paterno (409), Bobby Bowden (377), Paul "Bear" Bryant (323), Glenn "Pop" Warner (319) and Amos Alonzo Stagg (314).

351 - The number of career points for Duke senior **PK Ross Martin**, who now ranks sixth on the ACC career scoring list, having passed Wake Forest's Sam Swank last weekend. Martin, who has made all nine of his FG attempts this year, has made 61 of his 72 career attempts, an .847 percentage, the fourth-best career percentage among active FBS placekickers. Martin needs eight more points to move past former UNC PK Casey Barth (358, 2008-12) for fifth place on the ACC career scoring list.

699 - The number of all-time wins for the **Pitt Panthers**, who will be going for No. 700 when they host Virginia this Saturday at Heinz Field. Pitt would become the fourth current ACC team to crack the 700-win mark, joining Virginia Tech (714), Georgia Tech (713) and Syracuse (700).

Virginia Tech's **Frank Beamer** is now the leading active head coach in the NCAA's FBS in career victories with a total of 275 triumphs in his 35-year coaching career. Georgia Tech head coach **Paul Johnson** ranks ninth on the active FBS list with 167 career wins. Beamer is sixth on the all-time list and Amos Alonzo Stagg is next on the list with 314 wins at Springfield, Chicago and Pacific. Former Florida State head coach **Bobby Bowden**, who retired after the 2009 season, is second in the NCAA's FBS with 377 career victories only to Penn State's Joe Paterno. Glenn "Pop" Warner, who ranks third on the all-time list with 336 wins, coached at seven different schools including a nine-year stint at Pitt (2015-23).

Clemson's Swinney, Georgia Tech's Johnson In Good Company As ACC Head Coaches

After their first seven seasons at Clemson and Georgia Tech, head coaches **Dabo Swinney** and **Paul Johnson** have recorded excellent numbers. Only four other coaches in league history have had a better winning percentage after seven years than Swinney (.701) and only two have won more games. Only four other coaches in league history have won more games (58) than has Johnson after his first seven seasons in the league and he ranks 10th in winning percentage.

Boston College's Steve Addazio Leads Eagles to Back-to-Back Bowl Bids

In his first two seasons as the head coach at Chestnut Hill, Steve Addazio led Boston College to back-to-back bowl appearances utilizing a physical ground game and a hard-hitting defensive unit. In each of his first two years, Addazio has had a player lead the nation in rushing. In 2013, tailback Andre Williams led the nation and set an ACC single-season record with 2,177 yards. On year later, QB Tyler Murphy led all quarterbacks nationally, rushing for 1,184 yards, while setting an ACC rushing mark for signal-callers. Last year, BC was one of just three schools (Oklahoma and Toledo were the others) that ranked in the nation's Top 15 in rushing defense (2nd) and rushing offense (14th).

North Carolina's Fedora Putting Points on the Board for the Tar Heels

Now, in its fourth season with Larry Fedora as head coach, North Carolina has topped the 40-point mark 18 times and bettered 30 points 29 times in 43 games. His Tar Heel teams have averaged 35.74 points per game. In the previous 13 seasons before Fedora came to Chapel Hill, UNC had averaged just 23.3 points per game, a 14-point difference. Also, in his first four seasons, UNC has averaged 448.9 yards per game of total offense. That compares with the previous 13 seasons when the Tar Heels averaged just 349.25 yards per game on offense. Fedora's first three Tar Heel teams bettered the previous school mark for scoring. UNC scored a school-record 487 points in 2012 and tallied 425 points in 2013 and 432 in 2014. Previously, the school had only topped 400 points once. The school put up 421 points in 1993.



NC State's Dave Doeren: Winning the Close Ones

Now in just his third season as head coach at NC State, Dave Doeren has already made a name for himself on the national stage. After winning 23 of his first 27 career games as a head coach at Northern Illinois, he had an 8-5 mark in 2014, winning his final three games, including a 34-27 win over Central Florida in the Bitcoin St. Petersburg Bowl. Doeren's teams are 7-2 (.778) in games decided by four or fewer points. That's the best winning percentage in such games by any Power 5 coach. Doeren guided State to three wins by a touchdown or less in 2014.

Home Sweet Home for Noles' Fisher, Tigers' Swinney

Florida State head coach **Jimbo Fisher** and Clemson head coach **Dabo Swinney** have both enjoyed coaching in the cozy and imposing confines of the Seminoles' Doak Campbell Stadium and the Tigers' Memorial Stadium, also known as Death Valley. Now, after five seasons as head coach of the Seminoles, Fisher's teams have won 18 of 20 ACC games at home, a winning percentage of .900, the best by any ACC coach with a minimum of five seasons on the job. Swinney is right behind as his teams have won 23 of his first 26 home ACC games, a winning percentage of .885. They are both just ahead of legendary FSU coach Bobby Bowden, who also won more ACC home games than any other coach, with 62 triumphs in his 18 years in the league.



Cutcliffe Leading Duke to Unprecedented Success

Duke's **David Cutcliffe** is leading the Blue Devils to success unprecedented in the school's history. Cutcliffe has led Duke to three consecutive bowl game appearances, a first in Blue Devil history. He has also led Duke to 19 wins in 2013 and 201, the most in a two-year span since Duke began playing football in 1888. Now in his 8th season, Cutcliffe has led Duke to more wins (44) as the program experienced in the 18 years (43) before he took over the reins in Durham





ACC 2015 Football Championship Game Legends Class

Quartet of National Champions Headline the 2015 ACC Legends Class in Pitt's Tony Dorsett, Georgia Tech's Bobby Ross, FSU's Warrick Dunn, Miami's Clinton Portis

One of the game's most renowned Heisman Trophy winners and a trio of other major contributors to national championship teams lead the 2015 Atlantic Coast Conference Class of Football Legends announced on Sept. 29.

Pitt running back Tony Dorsett, Florida State running back Warrick Dunn, Georgia Tech coach Bobby Ross and Miami running back Clinton Portis are among the 14 all-time greats who will be honored during the weekend of the 2015 Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game, which will be played in Charlotte, N.C., on the evening of Saturday, Dec. 5.

Boston College center Dan Koppen, Clemson linebacker Anthony Simmons, Duke running back Chris Douglas, Louisville quarterback Chris Redman, North Carolina offensive lineman Ken Huff, NC State defensive back and return specialist Fred Combs, Syracuse tight end Chris Gedney, Virginia defensive end Patrick Kerney, Virginia Tech defensive end Corey Moore and Wake Forest punter Chuck Ramsey also headline this year's Legends class.

Dorsett – a member of both the College and Pro Football Halls of Fame – earned the Heisman Trophy as a senior in 1976, when he led Pitt to the national title to conclude a stellar collegiate career in which he rushed for over 6,000 yards. Dunn cemented his lasting impact on Florida State football as a freshman in 1993, when he helped key the Seminoles and head coach Bobby Bowden to their first national championship.

Ross oversaw a return to football glory at Georgia Tech, highlighted by the 1990 national title and the Yellow Jackets' first ACC football crown. Portis helped Miami claim the national championship in 2001 by rushing for 1,200 yards and 10 touchdowns on 220 carries.

Koppen made his mark as the center on Boston College's strong offensive lines before moving on to start on four Super Bowl teams with the New England Patriots. Clemson's Simmons established himself in the 1990s as one of the leading tacklers ever to take the field for an ACC team. Duke's Douglas set school rushing marks that still stand, while Louisville's Redman displayed passing skills that led to national honors, including the trophy named for ultimate Cardinal great John Unitas.

North Carolina's Huff epitomized the "Tailback U" teams of head coach Bill Dooley in the early 1970s, opening holes for 1,000-yard rushers in the patented ground game. The multi-talented Combs proved a mainstay for head coach Earle Edwards' NC State teams of the mid-1960s, including a starring role on the 1967 squad that played its way to a No. 3 national ranking.

Gedney upheld the high standard for tight ends at Syracuse, set by the legendary John Mackey, establishing school receiving records for his position and leading the Orange to four bowl games. Virginia's Kerney emerged as one of the game's top pass rushers, earning All-America honors after ranking second in the nation in quarterback sacks as a senior.

Virginia Tech's Moore was another elite defensive end, garnering both the Nagurski and Lombardi awards in his final collegiate season and piling up 35 quarterback sacks over his three years in Blacksburg. Wake Forest's Ramsey proved a valuable weapon in the battle for field position, leading the nation in punting in 1973 and claiming consensus All-America honors.

Each of the ACC's 14 football schools selected its 2015 Legend. The group will be honored at the ACC Night of Legends on Friday, Dec. 4, and on Saturday Dec. 5, during the 11th annual Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game at Bank of America Stadium. The game will be nationally televised with either a 7:45 pm (ESPN) or 8 p.m. (ABC) kickoff.

ACC Divisional Tiebreaker

If more than one team in the same division is tied for the best winning percentage in its Conference games, the procedures listed below will be followed to determine the division's representative in the ACC Championship Game:

Two-Team Tie:

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall win percentage. (Divisional and non-divisional) and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken from first-to-last using the league's tiebreaking procedures.
4. Overall win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined win percentage vs. all non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based on their order of finish (overall conference win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the higher ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee following the conclusion of regular season games. (If both tied teams are not ranked in the ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee, the higher ranked team in the Amway Coaches Poll (including others receiving votes).
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw. (as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.)

Three-Team (or More) Team Tie:

(Once a team is eliminated from the tie, the tie-breaker procedures restart for the remaining teams. If the three (or more) team tie can be reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaker format will then be applied.)

1. Combined head-to-head win percentage among the tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall (divisional and non-divisional) Conference win percentage, and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken first to last, using the league's tie-breaker policies.
4. Combined win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Overall win percentage versus non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based upon their order of finish (overall win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional opponents based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee following the conclusion of regular season games, unless the second of the tied teams is ranked within five or fewer places of the highest ranked tied team. In this case, the two-team tiebreaker procedure shall be applied between the top two ranked tied teams. If none of the tied teams are ranked in the rankings of the College Football Playoff Committee, the higher ranked team in the officially released Amway Coaches poll (including others receiving votes), following the conclusion of regular season games, unless the second of the tied teams is within five or fewer places of the highest ranked team. (For the sake of clarity, the team receiving the second-most votes but not ranked in the Top 25 would be ranked 27th.) In this case the two-team tiebreaker procedure

COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

The College Football Playoff begins its second year of operation after a highly-acclaimed first season in 2014-15. The Playoff features the top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and a national championship game played in a different city each year. Each semifinal is played during the New Year's holiday with the National Championship Game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later.

The College Football Playoff selection committee chooses the four teams for the playoff based on their performance during the regular season, including, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams will be seeded so that #1 will play #4 in one semifinal and #2 will meet #3 in the other, with the winners advancing to the national championship game. The selection committee will announce its rankings each week on Tuesdays beginning this year on Nov. 3. The final rankings will be announced on Sunday, Dec. 6.

The semifinals will rotate among six different bowls: the Chick-fil-A Peach, Goodyear Cotton, Fiesta and Capital One Orange Bowls; the Rose Bowl presented by Northwestern Mutual and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight other teams in four compelling matchups.

ACC Bowl Quick Selection Order

(The ACC is in the second year of six-year contracts with its current bowl partners.
The current College Football Playoff format is a 12-year agreement)

College Football Playoff (four teams)

If the ACC Champion is not in one of the semifinal games this year, it will appear in one of the Playoff "host" bowls, either the Fiesta or Chick-fil-A Peach, since the Capital One Orange Bowl will serve as a semifinal site this year. There is no limit on how many teams the College Football Playoff may choose from a particular conference.

Capital One Orange Bowl

The ACC champion, if not in the College Football Playoff, would normally play in the Capital One Orange Bowl against the highest-ranked and available team from Notre Dame, the SEC or the Big Ten. With the Capital One Orange Bowl serving as a Playoff semifinal this year, the CFP Selection Committee will determine the game (Chick-fil-A or Fiesta) and opponent for the ACC champion if that team is not in the Playoff.

Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl

Only if the ACC opponent in the Capital One Orange Bowl in a non-semifinal year, is a team from the Big Ten. This will not occur in 2015 due to the fact that the Orange Bowl this year is a semifinal site for the College Football Playoff.

Russell Athletic Bowl

Has first pick of ACC teams in 2015 after the College Football Playoff and the Host Bowls.

The One-Win Rule Applies Only to Notre Dame

The ACC's bowl selection will no longer be bound by the rigidity of a "one-win rule" but will have a general list of criteria to emphasize regionality and quality matchups on the field. A one-win rule does apply to Notre Dame's participation in the ACC Bowl structure. Notre Dame is now eligible for ACC Bowl selection beginning with the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl and continuing through the league's bowl selections. However, Notre Dame must be within one win of the ACC available team which has the best overall record, in order to be chosen. In other words, if an ACC team was 9-3, a 7-5 Notre Dame team could not be chosen in its place. Notre Dame would have to be 8-4 to be chosen over a 9-3 league team.

ACC Bowl Expenses And Revenue

The Atlantic Coast Conference shares all bowl revenues. Each school is provided an initial expense allotment. The Conference will share in the cost of unsold tickets for participating bowl institutions. After all bowl expense allotments and ticket reimbursements are subtracted from the total bowl revenue, the remaining revenue is distributed evenly among ACC schools.

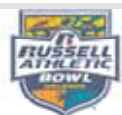

The ACC In Overtime

The ACC & Overtime

When Miami and Nebraska ended regulation tied at 33-33 and Syracuse and Central Michigan ended regulation tied at 24-24 on September 19, 2015, they played the 72nd and 73rd games featuring an ACC team that has had to go to extra sessions. Of the 73 overtime contests, a large portion of them--31--have been played in September. Games have gone into overtime for ACC teams a total of 19 times in November, while 12 have been played in October, three in August, six in December and two in January (2006 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl). Of the 73 overtime contests, 35 have been ACC games while 38 nonconference games have gone into overtime. The home team has a 40-24 advantage in the 64 games played on campus. The team which wins the toss has a 39-34 record. Fifty-four of the games were decided in the first overtime with 14 games in double overtime and five in triple overtime.
