VIRGINIA IN THE ACC SOCCER CHAMPIONSHIP

- Virginia has an all-time record of 37-13-7 at the ACC Men's Soccer Championship.
- UVa has won 10 tournament titles (1988, 1991-95, 1997, 2003-04, 2009).
- UVa owns a 12-5-3 record all-time in ACC tournament games played in Cary.

VIRGINIA-NORTH CAROLINA TOURNAMENT HISTORY

- Virginia sports a 5-2 record against North Carolina in ACC tournament play.
- Strangely enough, UVa and UNC have not met in the tournament in 11 years.
- The programs' last ACC tournament meeting came in the 2000 championship game, which the Tar Heels won 1-0 in overtime in Winston-Salem.

VIRGINIA-NORTH CAROLINA SERIES

- North Carolina owns a slim 36-34-7 advantage in the all-time series with Virginia, which dates to 1946.
- Prior to the Tar Heels' 3-0 win in September, the previous six meetings all came down to a single goal.
- UNC has won the last three meetings with Virginia.

CURRENT WAHOOS IN THE ACC TOURNAMENT

- Brian Ownby is the Cavaliers' leading active scorer in ACC tournament play, with three goals and two assists.
- Hunter Jumper has scored a pair of goals and chipped in with three assists in ACC tournament action.
- Both had big games Tuesday, with Ownby recording a goal, while Jumper scored a goal and assisted on two scores.

LAST TIME OUT: SPAN SCORES GOLDEN GOAL IN 4-3 2OT WIN OVER WAKE

- Brian Span scored the golden goal with 20 seconds remaining in double OT to propel fourth-seeded UVa to a 4-3 victory over fifth-seeded Wake Forest Tuesday.
- Span scored a pair of goals (both off corner kicks), while defender Hunter Jumper also had a big night with a goal and a pair of assists - all off long kicks. His corner kick in the waning seconds also led to Span's winning score.
- Virginia posted a 23-13 edge in shots, including 14-7 in the second half. UVa goalkeeper Spencer LaCivita made five saves.
- Wake scored in the third minute, only to watch UVa score three times in the first 30 minutes of the second half. Wake then stunned the Cavaliers with a pair of Luca Gimenez goals just 73 seconds apart to tie the game and send it to overtime.

THREE WAHOOS NAMED ALL-ACC

- Three Cavaliers were named to the 2011 All-ACC Team.
- Will Bates was a first-team honoree, while Brian Ownby and Brian Span each were named to the second team.
- Ryan Zinkhan was named to the 2011 ACC All-Freshman Team.
- Despite missing the last four games with a season-ending injury, Bates still ranks second in the ACC in scoring. Span is ninth in the conference in goals.
- Ownby was named to the All-ACC team for the second straight year; he was a first-team pick last year.

ODDS AND ENDS

- Virginia is in its 68th season of men's soccer, including its 58th in the ACC.
- UVa tied for third in the ACC, marking its best conference finish since taking second in 2005.
- UVa has reached the 10-win plateau for the 31st straight season; the Cavaliers made the NCAA tournament in each of the previous 30 years as well.
- UVa is 2-4 this year vs. ranked teams, with ACC wins over Duke and Maryland and losses to WVU, Charlotte, North Carolina and Boston College.
- UVa is 2-1-1 in true road games and 4-2-1 away from home this season.
- LaCivita and Brian Span are the only Cavaliers to start all 19 games this year; Felipe Libreros and Ryan Zinkhan are the only others to play in all 19.
- With seven shutouts this year, Spencer LaCivita has the second-most shutouts of any UVa freshman goalkeeper (Jeff Causey had 10 in 1990).
- LaCivita is the first UVa freshman goalkeeper to start an ACC tournament game since 1999, when David Comfort was in goal.

OWNBY NAMED ACC CO-PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Brian Ownby was named the ACC Co-Player of the Week following his big game vs. NC State on Nov. 3.
- He got UVA on the board quickly with a goal in the seventh minute, then assisted on back-to-back goals during a dominating UVA first half.
- Ownby is the second UVA player to earn the honor this year, joining Will Bates (10/11).
- Ownby also was named to the College Soccer News and Top Drawer Soccer National Teams of the Week.

OFFENSE RANKS AMONG TOP 20 NATIONALLY

- Virginia's offense stands 12th nationally in scoring at 2.0 goals per game (as of Tuesday report).
- The Cavaliers rank 12th in total goals with 36, as of the Tuesday report from the NCAA.
- UVA also ranks fourth in the ACC in scoring.

SCORING OUTBURST IN LAST TWO GAMES

- Virginia has scored four goals in each of its last two games against NC State and Wake Forest.
- This marked the first time since 1995 that UVA scored four goals in back-to-back games vs. ACC foes.
- The Cavaliers' 4-goal outburst vs. NC State marked the team's most against an ACC opponent since tallying four vs. Duke in the 2008 ACC Quarterfinals.

CAVALIERS PRESS ON AFTER BATES INJURY

- UVA has gone 3-1 since losing leading scorer Will Bates to a knee injury on Oct. 21 at Virginia Tech.
- Brian 'Cobi' Span has led the team with four goals and an assist in that time, while Brian Ownby owns three goals and two assists since Oct. 21.
- UVA has averaged 2.75 goals per game in the last four contests; the Cavaliers averaged 1.93 goals per game in their first 15 matches.
- Bates scored 14 of UVA's 29 goals in the first 15 games.

UVA RANKED 24TH IN LATEST RPI

- Virginia sits in 24th in the NCAA's latest RPI report for 2011. The numbers came out before the Cavaliers' win over Wake Forest.
- UVA has played a strong schedule, featuring four matches against the RPI top 10: No. 2 Maryland, No. 4 UNC, No. 7 Boston College and No. 9 Charlotte.
- UVA has played 10 games against the RPI top 40, including No. 22 Duke, No. 26 West Virginia, No. 32 Wake (two games), No. 37 Clemson and No. 38 Wisconsin.

DIMAS, SOMERVILLE RETURN TO LINEUP

- Ari Dimas and Chris Somerville returned to the Cavaliers' lineup the last week of October.
- Dimas missed a month (six matches) with an ankle injury, while Somerville sat out seven games because of mononucleosis.
- Somerville returned Oct. 25 and played the second half against American and Boston College (Oct. 29). He made his first start since his return on Tuesday vs. Wake Forest.
- Dimas played all 110 minutes in the double OT win against Wake.

BATES OUT FOR SEASON WITH INJURY

- UVA junior forward Will Bates suffered a knee injury Oct. 21 at Virginia Tech and is out for the rest of the season.
- This marks the third UVA player to go down with a torn ACL this season (Eric Bird vs. UNC, Bryan Lima during summer workout).

NEXT MAN UP

- Virginia has dealt with a mind-boggling assortment of injuries this season.
- Nine UVA players have combined to miss 74 matches this year because of injuries or illness.
- Eight of those players each have missed three games or more, while starters Eric Bird and Will Bates have gone down

with season-ending injuries during the season.

- Ahekel Rodney, who played in all 20 games last year, and Bryan Lima each have missed all 19 matches.

BATES RANKS SECOND IN ACC IN SCORING

- Will Bates finished with 14 goals this year, which currently ranks second in the ACC.
- He stands behind Duke's Andrew Wenger (17 goals).
- With four assists this year, Bates owns 32 total points, which is second to Wenger's 42 points.

BATES ALSO STANDS AMONG NATIONAL LEADERS

- Will Bates still ranks among the national leaders in scoring.
- As of the Monday rankings (Nov. 6), Bates was ninth nationally in total goals (14); Coastal Carolina's Ashton Bennett led the nation with 21 scores as of Monday.
- Bates also ranked 10th in total points (32) and seventh goals per game (0.93) and points per game (2.13).

MORE ON BATES

- With 14 goals this season, Will Bates scored the most goals by a UVA player since Yannick Reyerling tallied 14 in 2005.
- With 32 points this season, Bates has the most points by a Cavalier since Reyerling posted 32 in 2006.
- Bates was named ACC Player of the Week on Oct. 11, UVA's first such honoree since Diego Restrepo on Nov. 3, 2009.

LACIVITA GOES THE DISTANCE

- UVA freshman goalkeeper Spencer LaCivita has played all 1,746 minutes this season.
- He ranks seventh in UVA single-season history in saves with 68 (needs two to tie for sixth, three to tie for fifth).
- LaCivita also ranks ninth in the UVA single-season annals in minutes played in goal with 1,746 and is tied for ninth in shutouts with seven.
- LaCivita is tied with UNC goalkeeper Scott Goodwin for the conference lead in shutouts with seven.

FRESHMEN MAKE BIG IMPACT

- Eleven UVA true freshmen have earned playing time, while eight have started at least once this season – both the most of any ACC program this year.
- Spencer LaCivita, Chris Somerville, Ryan Zinkhan, Kyler Sullivan, Eric Bird, Grant Silvester, Calvin Rezende and Matt Brown all have started at least once.
- UVA's freshmen have tallied 7,305 minutes so far this season, 38.3 percent of the total minutes available.
- GK Spencer LaCivita has played all 1,746 minutes this year; Ryan Zinkhan is second among the freshmen with 1,415 minutes played (fourth on team).

VETERANS MAN LAST LINE OF DEFENSE

- Virginia is particularly experienced in the back of its defense, with seniors Hunter Jumper, Greg Monaco and Mike Volk manning three-fourths of the defender positions.
- The trio have combined to play in 201 games, with 196 starts, in their careers at Virginia.
- Jumper has started all 77 games in which he has played in his career.
- All three were starters on UVA's national title team in 2009.

SEPT. 23: UNC PULLS AWAY FOR 3-0 WIN OVER VIRGINIA

- UVA dropped a 3-0 decision to then-No. 4 North Carolina on Sept. 23 at Klöckner Stadium. UNC broke open a tightly-contested match with a pair of goals in the final 15 minutes.
- The Tar Heels out-shot UVA, 13-10. Virginia held a 5-2 edge in corner kicks. UNC committed 14 fouls, while UVA was assessed 12.
- UNC held a 10-5 advantage in shots in the first half and controlled play for much of the way. UVA had a great chance in the first minute when Will Bates broke loose on the left side of the box, but he was stuffed by GK Scott Goodwin.
- Carolina broke through in the 29th minute. Following a deflection just outside the box, Billy Schuler scooped up the ball and slotted a shot to the right corner just past LaCivita.
- UVA controlled play early in the second half and strung together several good scoring chances but had nothing to show for it. In the 76th minute, UVA was called for a foul in the box, and Enzo Martinez converted on the penalty kick to push the UNC lead to 2-0.
- The Tar Heels capped the scoring in the 81st minute when Carlos McCrary headed a Mikey Lopez cross just over an outstretched LaCivita to the right side of the goal.
- UVA's Hunter Jumper (red card suspension) and Chris Somerville (mononucleosis) did not play in the first game against UNC. Brian Ownby played just 19 minutes off the bench while coming back from an injury.
