CAVALIERS AND TRIBE MEET IN FIRST OF HOME-AND-HOME

- Virginia holds a 65-29-2 all-time series edge over William & Mary.
- Last year UVa scored an 11-1 win over the Tribe in Charlottesville (Feb. 24).
- UVa has not played in Williamsburg since April 6, 2004, an 11-9 UVa win.
- The teams will see each other again next Tuesday in Charlottesville.

VIRGINIA STRONG IN RECENT YEARS VS. IN-STATE FOES

- Virginia went 8-2 last year against teams from the Commonwealth of Virginia, including 7-0 against non-conference foes.
- Under the current coaching staff (since 2004), the Cavaliers have a 57-8 record against foes from Virginia.

GOSSSELIN HAS BIG SUCCESS AT TOP OF ORDER

- Phil Gosselin moved into the Cavaliers' leadoff slot this year and has been hot at the plate thus far, with a .451 batting average (23-for-51).
- He is currently on a career-best 10-game hitting streak.
- Gosselin has led off seven games, including each of the last five, with hits.

NO SLOUCHES IN THE NINE-HOLE

- Virginia has gotten big numbers out of its nine-hole hitters this season.
- The No. 9 hitters in the Virginia lineup have combined to go 19-for-38 (.500) this season with 11 RBI and 10 runs scored.
- Outside of Gosselin in the leadoff spot, UVa has gotten its most hits out of the ninth spot in the batting order.
- Keith Werman, out of the ninth spot in the order, has gone 10-for-17 with five runs scored and four RBI this year.
- John Barr, David Coleman and freshmen Chris Taylor, Reed Gagnani and Stephen Bruno also have gotten opportunities out of the nine-hole.

HITS COMING FROM TOP TO BOTTOM

- In seven of 11 games this season, at least eight of the nine Virginia starters have recorded at least one hit.
- On three occasions, all nine UVa starters posted at least one hit.
- The Cavaliers are hitting .381 as a team through 11 games.

- Phil Gosselin went 11-for-20 (.550) last weekend in four games.
- Gosselin ranks first in the ACC in hits (23), fourth in stolen bases (five) and 12th in batting (.451).
- Branden Kline is making his first college start today.
- Virginia ranks second in the ACC in batting (.381) and has scored 10 or more runs six times this year.
- Virginia's returning starters have combined for over 1,000 career starts.

HICKS KEEPS STREAK ALIVE

- John Hicks is the lone Cavalier to record hits in all 11 games this season.
- He has tied his career-long hitting streak, set from March 18-31 last year.
- Dating to last season (June 6), Hicks has a 15-game hit streak.

FRESHMEN PRODUCE WHILE WAITING TURN

- UVa's freshman infielders have made the most of their opportunities thus far. At the plate, Stephen Bruno, Reed Gragnani and Chris Taylor have combined to go 12-for-27 (.444).

- Bruno had a grand slam against Rhode Island and was 3-for-3 against Dartmouth last Sunday.
- Gragnani posted a pair of hits in each of his starts at DH last weekend and had the go-ahead two-run single in the Sunday win vs. Wright State.
- Taylor hit a big run-scoring triple in the ninth inning in UVa's win at East Carolina Feb. 21.

VIRGINIA RANKS 29TH NATIONALLY IN ATTENDANCE

- With a season average of 1,993 per game, Virginia ranks 29th nationally in attendance through the first three weeks of the season.

- Virginia's attendance is up nearly 900 fans per game from the same point last season.
- UVa ranks fourth in attendance this season among ACC schools, behind Florida State, Clemson and Miami.
- UVa averaged 1,513 fans per game last season. The UVa single-season attendance average record is 1,774, set in 2007.

CAVALIERS EARN FIRST-EVER NO. 1 NATIONAL RANKING

- Virginia has earned a No. 1 ranking by Baseball America and Rivals.com for the third straight week.
- It marks the first No. 1 ranking in school history for Virginia Baseball.
- The baseball team becomes the 10th athletics program at Virginia to garner a No. 1 national ranking, joining men's basketball, women's basketball, field hockey, football, men's lacrosse, women's lacrosse, men's soccer, women's soccer and men's tennis.
- Virginia currently has three teams ranked No. 1 – baseball, men's lacrosse and men's tennis.

DEFENSE OFF TO GOOD START

- Through 11 games, Virginia has committed just 10 errors – good for an impressive .977 fielding pct.
- The Cavaliers recorded a .972 fielding mark last year.
- The school record for fielding percentage is .975, set in 2005.

CANNON CLIMBS VIRGINIA CHARTS

- Tyler Cannon comes into the game with 722 career at bats, which is eighth in UVa history; he needs 12 ABs to match Ryan Zimmerman (2003-05) for seventh.
- Cannon, if he starts today, will move into sole possession of ninth place in career games played with 196.
- Cannon now has 48 doubles – tied for fourth at UVa. He needs one to tie for third.
- He also is tied for second in career triples (11) and 10th in HBP (19) and, with two more runs scored, will reach the top 10 in that category.
- He also is nearing the top 10 in hits (215) and stolen bases (39).

ARICO, PARKER MOVE UP IN UVA ANNALS

- With his save Sunday, Kevin Arico now has 15 career saves – good for fourth in Virginia history. He needs one to match Michael Schwimer (2005-08) for third.
- With his triple at ECU, Jarrett Parker has hit 11 triples in his career, which is tied for second in UVa history. He needs two more three-baggers to tie Brian Buchanan (1992-94) for the Virginia record.

VETERAN-LADEN CAVALIERS

- Virginia has one of its most experienced teams ever.
- The Cavaliers' returning position players have combined for 1,008 career starts, led by senior shortstop Tyler Cannon, who has started 189 games.

• Ten players have started at least 50 career games apiece for UVa. Cannon, Dan Grovatt (130), Jarrett Parker (121) and Phil Gosselin (114) each have more than 100 career starts.

STARTING LINEUP BACK IN TACT

• Virtually the entire offense returns from 2009, including everyone from the starting lineup.
• Almost all of the offensive production is back – 99 percent of the RBI-production returns, with 98.4 percent of the hit-producers (755 of 767) coming back.
• Virginia hit .327 last season – the Cavaliers' best mark since 1985 – and swatted 59 home runs – UVa's most since 2002.
• Dan Grovatt (.356), Jarrett Parker (.355) and Tyler Cannon (.351) led UVa in batting last year. UVa has nine regular starters back who hit at least .292 last year.

WHO'S GONE?

• Virginia will need to replace 229.0 innings lost from the 2009 squad.
• The top loss comes from starter Andrew Carraway, who tossed 91.0 innings last year.
• Matt Packer pitched 61 innings – second-most out of the bullpen.

UVa LEADS NATION IN ERA LAST FIVE YEARS

• Virginia led all NCAA Division I teams in ERA over the past five seasons, boasting a 3.13 team ERA.
• UVa ranked in the top 15 in the country in ERA each of the last six seasons, including No. 3 marks in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009.
• North Carolina is the only other team to rank among the top 15 nationally in ERA for the last six years.
• Virginia is the only team in Division I to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts and fewest hits and walks allowed each of the last two years.

STRONG CORE OF PITCHERS BACK, BUT HOLES REMAIN

• UVa has to fill the holes of six pitchers who logged 226.0 innings and made 30 starts last season. Nine pitchers return.
• Danny Hultzen (9-1, 2.17) and Robert Morey (3-0, 3.33) each had strong 2009 seasons and will anchor the rotation, but the third weekend rotation slot as well as several bullpen spots are still in limbo.
• UVa had a 3.23 ERA last year (third nationally) and has the best ERA in the nation (3.13) over the last five seasons.
