## TONIGHT'S GAME:

- The Cavaliers conclude a three-game homestand by hosting Notre Dame
- Virginia looks for its fourth ranked win of the year, third against the top 10
- It is just the second top-five matchup at Klöckner in the past 20 years
- UVa is looking to beat a top-five opponent for the fifth straight year

## **SERIES HISTORY:**

- UVa leads 1-0-0 overall (UVa leads 1-0-0 in Charlottesville)
- Only regular season meeting was a 2-0 Cavalier win in 1989 at Scott Stadium
- The teams met in the preseason every year from 2005-12

## LOOK HOOS NO. 1:

• Virginia remained at No. 1 in all four major polls for the fourth straight week

• The only previous time UVa was No. 1 was in 1990 (three weeks)

• Only one current Cavalier was alive the last time UVa was No. 1, Morgan Stith, who was born during the last week UVa was No. 1 (Oct. 15-21, 1990)

## **ON A WINNING STREAK:**

• Virginia is currently on a 12-game win streak, the second longest streak in school history

• The school record is a 16-game win streak, set at the start of the 1990 season

• The Cavaliers are the nation's only unbeaten and untied team this season

## **COMEBACK CAVALIERS:**

Virginia rallied from a deficit to win at BC, Pitt and Duke, the first time in school history with three consecutive come-from-behind wins
UVa has four come-from-behind wins this season, tied for the most in school history for an entire season (1997 and 1998)

• The win at Duke marked the sixth time in school history that UVa rallied to win when trailing by two goals (first time since at PSU in 2009 NCAA 2nd rd)

#### PACK THE HOUSE:

• Virginia had a record women's soccer crowd of 2,540 for the Maryland game on Sept. 19

The Cavaliers have had two of the nine largest women's crowds at Klöckner the past two games
UVa is one of nine schools this season to have a

crowd of over 2,500 for a game this season

## GOALS, GOALS, GOALS!!!:

• Virginia leads the nation in scoring at 3.33 goals per game and ranks third nationally with 40 total goals this season

• The Cavaliers scored at least three goals in each of the first seven games of the season, the longest streak of scoring 3+ goals in school history

Of the 40 goals scored, the Cavaliers have 11 different goal scorers

#### **SCORING STREAK:**

• Virginia is one of 12 schools nationally to have scored a goal in every game this season

• Dating back to last year, UVa has scored in 20 consecutive games, the longest active streak in the nation

## ACC SUCCESS:

• Dating back to last season, UVa has won 11 of its last 12 games against ACC opponents (only loss vs. Duke in NCAA Tournament)

• UVa has won its last five road games at ACC foes, the longest streak in school history

• The Cavaliers have won a school-record eight straight ACC regular season games, breaking the previous record of seven set in 2004-05

## LAST TIME OUT:

- The Cavaliers defeated Clemson 3-0 on Sunday
- It was Virginia's sixth consecutive home shutout
- Morgan Brian, Danielle Colaprico and Makenzy Doniak scored for UVa

## SWANSON REACHES PAIR OF MILESTONES:

• Virginia head coach Steve Swanson earned his 300th career win on Sept. 19 with the 2-1 victory at Boston College

- Swanson became the 16th Division I coach to join the 300 win club, and the 11th to accululate 300 wins at the Division I level
- He became the 31st NCAA coach (all divisions) to reach the milestone
- On Oct. 6, he posted his 200th win at Virginia with the 3-0 win over Clemson



## CAVALIERS SHINE IN NON-CONFERENCE SCHEDULE:

- The Cavaliers went undefeated (6-0-0) in non-conference play, outscoring opponents 25-3
- It marked Virginia's first undefeated non-conference slate since 2004 (9-0-0)

#### **BRIAN SCORES FOR USWNT:**

- Morgan Brian scored her first goal for the United States Women's National Team on Sept. 3 in the 7-0 victory over Mexico in Washington, D.C.
- She became the first active collegian to score for the USWNT since Alex Morgan in 2010 (as a senior at Cal)
- At age 20, Brian is the youngest USWNT goal-scorer since Christine Narin (at age 18) scored for the team in 2009

• She made her second USWNT appearance against Mexico and is one of three current collegians to have earned a cap (North Carolina's Crystal Dunn, Santa Clara's Julie Johnston)

• Brian has been called into camp for the Australia game on Oct. 20 in San Antonio, Texas and will miss the Cavaliers' game at North Carolina

#### **BRIAN HONORED:**

- Junior midfielder Morgan Brian was named ACC Co-Player of the Week on Aug. 27 after earning MVP honors at the Klöckner Classic
- Brian had one goal and three assists in the wins over VCU and Santa Clara
- It was her first career ACC Player of the Week honor
- She was also named to the TopDrawerSoccer.com Team of the Week

#### 20-20-20 VISION WITH BRIAN, DOUGLAS & DONIAK:

- Virginia has three players with at least 20 career goals in Morgan Brian (23), Gloria Douglas (20) and Makenzy Doniak (20)
- It is the first time UVa has had three active 20-goal scorers since 1991

## RATCLIFFE, THE SUPER SUB:

- Brittany Ratcliffe has seven goals this season, all coming off the bench
- Her seven goals off the bench is a school record for goals as a substitute for a season, breaking the previous record of six

## **STEARNS SHINES IN GOAL:**

- Morgan Stearns is the first true-freshman goalkeeper to start multiple games in a season for Virginia since Jodi Clugston made 11 starts in 2000
- Stearns leads the ACC in GAA (0.48) and third in save percentage (.818)

## MENCHEL STEPS UP WHEN IT COUNTS:

- Defender Molly Menchel has scored 11 career goals, the most career goals by a Cavalier defender
- Seven of her 11 career goals have been game-winning goals, including three this season (VCU, Richmond, BC)

## **UP NEXT:**

- UVa begins a three-match roadtrip Sunday at Wake Forest
- Cavaliers have lost the last two meetings against the Demon Deacons
- UVa hasn't won in Winston-Salem since a 2-0 win in the 2006 NCAA 2nd rd.
