## Noting ACC Football Clemson Ranked No. 1 by the College Football Playoff

When Clemson was ranked No. 1 in the nation on Nov. 3 in the initial 2015 College Football Playoff rankings, it marked the first No. 1-ranking for the Tigers since the final AP poll of 1982 and only the third No. 1 ranking for Clemson in history.

## Clemson Ranked No. 1 by AP: Three ACC Teams in Top 25

Clemson is also No. 1 this week in AP. The Tigers earned their first No. 1 AP football ranking since the final poll of the 1982 season. Clemson was ranked third last week. Joining the Tigers in the poll from the ACC were North Carolina (17) and Florida State (19). ACC teams are 46-5 overall when ranked No. 1 by AP.

## ABC's Highest Overnight Rating at 3:30 Since 2012

The Clemson-FSU football game is ABC's best overnight rating for a 3:30 p.m. regular season college football game in nearly three years, or since November 24, 2012, when Florida at Florida State drew a 5.6 overnight).

## Five ACC Kickers Named Semifinalists for the Lou Groza Award

Five ACC placekickers have been named among the 20 semifinalists for the Lou Groza Award, which is given annually to the nation's top placekicker. Named to the list were 2013 Groza winner **Roberto Aguayo**, Florida State; **Ross Martin**, Duke; **Michael Badgley**, Miami; **Nick Weiler**, North Carolina and **Joey Slye**, Virginia Tech.

**ACC Teams Lead Nation in Nine NCAA Statistical Categories**  
ACC teams lead the nation this week in nine statistical categories. **Boston College** leads in total defense (236.5), rushing defense (71.7) and team tackles for loss (9.8). **Clemson** leads in 3rd-down conversion (.208) percentage defense and first downs defense (118). **NC State** leads in fourth-down conversion percentage defense (.167). **Virginia** leads in punt return average (26.0). **Georgia Tech** leads in fewest penalties per game (3.56) and **Florida State** is tied for the lead in fewest fumbles lost (2).

## No. 1 Clemson Claims Atlantic Berth in ACC Championship No. 21 North Carolina in Control of the Coastal And Hosting Miami Pitt and Duke Battle to Keep Coastal Hopes Alive

**Clemson**, tabbed as the nation's No 1-ranked team last week by the College Football Playoff Committee, clinched a share of the Atlantic Coast Conference's Atlantic Division title and berth in this year's 2015 Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game with its 23-13 win over 16th-ranked **Florida State**...The Tigers, coached by **Dabo Swinney** and led by **QB Deshaun Watson**, can become the sole Atlantic champion with a win over **Syracuse** this Saturday (3:30 p.m., ABC/ESPN2) at the Carrier Dome in Syracuse N.Y....**Clemson** has won 12 consecutive games, the nation's second-longest current winning streak and the longest for the Tigers since 1981-82...The Orange of coach **Scott Shafer** are led by freshman **QB Eric Dungey** and are looking to keep their bowl hopes alive...Clemson's op-

ponent in the 11th Annual Dr Pepper ACC Championship Game at Charlotte's Bank of America Stadium on Dec. 5 could be determined as early as this Saturday...**North Carolina**, ranked 21st in the Associated Press poll, is in the driver's seat with a 5-0 conference record and would clinch a trip to the Queen City with a win over **Miami** at Kenan Stadium in Chapel Hill, N.C. (3:30 p.m., ESPNU) and a **Pitt** loss to **Duke**...**North Carolina**, coached by **Larry Fedora** and led by senior **QB Marquise Williams**, has won eight straight games, which is tied for the sixth-longest current winning streak in the nation...Williams keys the Tar Heels' potent offense and is ranked 8th nationally in pass efficiency...**Miami** has won two straight ACC games under interim head coach

**Larry Scott** and the Hurricanes' sophomore **QB Brad Kaaya** was impressive in Miami's win over **Virginia** after missing a game with an injury a week ago...The Hurricanes are looking to keep their Coastal hopes alive as are Pitt and Duke, which are in Durham, N.C....The Blue Devils, coached by **David Cutcliffe** and led by **S Jeremy Cash**, will host the Panthers, coached by **Pat Narduzzi** and led by **WR Tyler Boyd** at Brooks Field at Wallace Wade Stadium (Noon, ESPNNews)...Both teams are looking to get back into the win column after two straight losses and both are still in the running for the Coastal crown, though both have lost to division leader UNC..Boyd is ranked fourth nationally in receptions per game, while Cash is third in the nation in tackles for loss.

### 19th-Ranked Florida State Hosts NC State

In Tallahassee, Fla., 19th-ranked Florida State, coached by **Jimbo Fisher** and led by **RB Dalvin Cook**, looks to claim a share of second place in the Atlantic Division in its final ACC game of the year hosting Atlantic Division rival **NC State** at Doak Campbell Stadium (12:30 p.m., ACC Network)...Cook, who had 194 yards rushing against a Clemson defense ranked 5th nationally, is second in the nation in rushing, averaging 153.8 yards a game...The Wolfpack, coached by **Dave Doeren** and led by **QB Jacoby Brissett**, a Florida native from West Palm Beach, are looking to improve their post-season resume...**NC State's** defense, keyed by **DE Mike Rose**, who leads the ACC in sacks and ranks fourth nationally, is ranked ninth nationally, allowing just 296.2 yards per game.

### Virginia Tech, ESPN Visit Georgia Tech on Thursday Night

The weekend begins early with **Georgia Tech** hosting **Virginia Tech** in a Thursday night nationally televised ESPN contest at Bobby Dodd Stadium in Atlanta (7:30 p.m., ESPN)...Both teams are seeking to keep long bowl game streaks alive...**Virginia Tech** has gone to 22 consecutive bowl games, the longest current streak recognized by the NCAA, while **Georgia Tech** has played in 18 straight bowl games, which ties for the second-longest skein...The Yellow Jackets, coached by **Paul Johnson** and led by **QB Justin Thomas**, cannot afford any more missteps and need to win their final three games to qualify for the postseason...**Virginia Tech**, coached by **Frank Beamer** and led by **QB Michael Brewer**, needs to win two of its final three games to reach bowl eligibility and extend the coaching career of their legendary head coach...Beamer, the nation's leading active coach in total victories with 277, announced his retirement after 35 years as a head coach on Nov. 1, effective at the end of the season...Beamer's win total ranks sixth on the all-time FBS list...He will be coaching in his 425 game, which ties him with another legend in Paul "Bear" Bryant for 5th on the FBS

games coached list...Georgia Tech's Johnson is the next ranking ACC coach on the active career wins list, placing eighth with 168 career victories...**Virginia Tech** has won more games (20) on ESPN's Thursday night package than any other ACC team, while this will also be the 20th time **Georgia Tech** has hosted an ESPN Thursday night affair.

### Wake Forest Travels to Notre Dame

Fresh off a bye week, **Wake Forest**, coached by **Dave Clawson** and led by **LB Brandon Chubb**, travel to South Bend, Ind., to face 5th-ranked **Notre Dame** at Notre Dame Stadium (3:30 p.m., NBC)...The game is the second of three straight contests against ACC teams for the Irish, who faced Pitt last weekend and will travel to Boston, Mass., next week for a rare away-from-home home game at Fenway Park...Chubb ranks fifth in the ACC in tackles per game...**Notre Dame**, coached by **Brian Kelly** and led by **QB DeShone Kizer**, is 3-1 against ACC foes this year, having lost to Clemson, but defeated Georgia Tech, Virginia and Pitt.

### Virginia, Louisville Clash in Interdivisional Contest

The only game between division teams this week has **Louisville** hosting **Virginia** at Papa John's Cardinal Stadium in Louisville (12:30 p.m., RSN)...Coastal Division teams hold a 7-3 advantage in the 10 games played to date this year, while the Atlantic holds an overall 98-94 lead since the start of divisional play in 2005...The Cardinals, coached by **Bobby Petrino**, are led by **QB Kyle Bolin** and a strong defensive unit ranked 15th nationally, led by **DE Trevon Young** and **LB Keith Kelsey**...Young ranks 8th nationally in sacks...Virginia, coached by **Mike London**, is led by sophomore **S Quin Blanding** and junior **QB Matt Johns**...Blanding is tied for second in the ACC in tackles, averaging 8.9 a game, while Johns is third in passing yards per game...Louisville would become bowl-eligible with a win, while UVA is seeking to keep its bowl hopes alive and needs to win its final three games to reach the postseason.

### Three ACC Teams Ranked in Coaches Top 25

Clemson moved up to No. 2 in the Amway Coaches poll released Sunday...The Tigers are followed by **North Carolina** (17th) and **Florida State** (tied for 18th).

### Seven ACC Teams Bowl Eligible

#### Louisville Can Gain Bowl Eligibility Saturday

Seven ACC football teams are bowl-eligible with **NC State** and **Miami** claiming their sixth wins this past weekend...**Clemson**, **Duke**, **Florida State**, **North Carolina** and **Pitt** had previously qualified...**Louisville**, which hosts **Virginia** this Saturday, would become eligible for the postseason with a win over the Cavaliers...At this point, only **Boston College**, which suffered its seventh loss of the year last Saturday, is ineligible...The ACC has nine guaranteed bowl berths with Notre Dame also eligible if the Irish are not selected for the College Football Playoff or the New Year's Six bowls.

# ACC Football By The Numbers

**First** - For the first time in its history, multiple ACC teams have active home winning streaks of 15 or more games (FSU 19, Clemson 15). Clemson has won 15 straight contests at Memorial Stadium, while Florida State has captured 19 consecutive games at Doak Campbell Stadium.

**1.06** - The number of sacks per game for NC State **DE Mike Rose**. Rose ranks fourth nationally with 9.5 sacks in nine games for the Wolfpack.

**2.38** - Miami **PK Michael Badgley** continues to lead the nation in field goals per game. Badgley has made 19 of 23 attempts.

**3** - Duke **S Jeremy Cash** is ranked third nationally in tackles for loss, averaging 1.83 per game with 16.5 in nine games. Cash is the only defensive back listed among the Top 50 players nationally in tackles for loss.

**4** - Four ACC teams remain in the Top 15 in the nation in total defense this week, led by **Boston College**, which leads the nation, allowing just 236.5 yards per game. BC is joined in the Top 15 by **Clemson** (5th), **NC State** (9th) and **Louisville** (15th).

**7** - The ACC has seven teams that have achieved **bowl eligibility** in **Clemson, Duke, Florida State, Miami, North Carolina, NC State** and **Pitt**. Louisville can become the eighth bowl-bound league team with a win this Saturday against Virginia.

**8** - **North Carolina** has now won eight consecutive games. That ties with Baylor and Stanford for the sixth-longest current winning streak in the FBS.

**8.32** - The average yards per carry for Florida State **RB Dalvin Cook**. No ACC player with more than 78 carries has ever averaged better than 8.0 yards an attempt. Cook's current game average of 153.75 is the fourth-best average in league history.

**10th** - North Carolina **QB Marquise Williams** threw for 494 yards in less than three quarters of play against Duke. The total was the most in school history and the 10th-best figure in ACC history and the most since Stephen Morris of Miami set the ACC standard with 566 yards in 2012. Williams' total of 524 yards of offense is the

sixth-highest total in league history.

**12** - **Clemson** has now won 12 straight games, and that is the second-longest current winning streak in the nation (only to Ohio State's 22 straight) and the longest for the Tigers since 1980-81 when the Tigers won 13 straight. It also ties for the seventh-longest winning streak in ACC history.

**20** - **Virginia Tech** has won 20 games when appearing on ESPN's Thursday night package, the most of any ACC team. The Hokies are 20-9 on Thursdays when nationally televised on ESPN.

**20 (b)** - When **Georgia Tech** hosts Virginia Tech this Thursday in Atlanta, it will mark the 20th ESPN Thursday night game Tech has hosted since 1991. The Jackets are 10-9 at home on Thursdays on ESPN.

**25** - With three regular-season games remaining, Duke head coach **David Cutcliffe** has already led Duke to 25 wins over the past three seasons, tying the school record. The school mark was set originally by the 1936-38 teams of Wallace Wade, which posted a 25-4-1 record, and tied by Cutcliffe's 2012-14 teams (25-15). Duke is now 25-11 since the start of the 2013 season.

**26.3** - UNC junior **WR Mack Hollins**, who had five catches for 165 (33.0) yards against Duke, is currently averaging 26.3 yards per reception for the season with 21 catches for 553 yards and seven TDs.

**48.72** - The percentage of conference games in the **ACC** that have been decided by seven or fewer points. That's the most of any conference nationally. The ACC's margin of victory in league games, of 12.282, is also the lowest of any league in the nation.

**54** - Virginia **RB Taquan Mizzell** has 54 receptions this year, the sixth-highest total for a running back in ACC history. Boston College's Andre Callender set the record in 2007, making 76 catches.

**70** - **Dabo Swinney** is now 70-26 in his career at Clemson. The 70 career wins ties former Maryland and Georgia Tech head coach **Bobby Ross** for 15th-place on the ACC career wins list. Coincidentally, both will be at this year's Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game, Swinney guiding his

Tigers and Ross as Georgia Tech's Legend.

**163** - The number of consecutive passes without an interception for Pitt **QB Nate Peterman** until Saturday's loss to Notre Dame. Peterman's streak is the 13th-longest in ACC history.

**171.52** - The pass efficiency rating for Clemson **QB Deshaun Watson** in his last four games. During that time Watson completed 93 of 132 passes (.704) for 1,243 yards and 10 TDs. In his last four games, he has totalled 1,534 yards, an average of 383.5 yards per game, and 13 TDR despite playing little more than a half in one of those games.

**229** - The number of career receptions for Pitt **WR Tyler Boyd** in less than three full seasons. Boyd is tied with former Wake Forest standout Michael Campanaro (229, 2010-13) for sixth place on the ACC career receptions list.. Boyd has been in double figures in catches in four of his eight games this year.

**277** - The number of career victories for Virginia Tech head coach **Frank Beamer**. That is the most of any active FBS head coach and ranks sixth on the NCAA's FBS all-time list. Beamer trails only the icons of the game in career wins in Joe Paterno (409), Bobby Bowden (377), Paul "Bear" Bryant (323), Glenn "Pop" Warner (319) and Amos Alonzo Stagg (314). To give perspective, Florida State's Jimbo Fisher has averaged 11.6 wins a year in his first five years as a head coach, the best mark in league history. Fisher would have to average 11.6 wins a year for the next 19 years, or until 2034, to pass Beamer on the all-time wins list.

**1,237** - The number of yards of total offense that **North Carolina** (704) and **Duke** (533) combined for in Saturday's 66-31 UNC victory, the most in any game in UNC football history. The combined total of 97 points is the most ever scored in a Duke-North Carolina football game.

# The ACC & ESPN Thursday Night



## The ACC & ESPN Thursday Night: A Great College and ACC Tradition

When Virginia Tech travels to Georgia Tech for this Thursday night's (7:30 p.m.) game at Bobby Dodd Stadium, the meeting will be the 98th contest involving an ACC team on ESPN on Thursday night. The game will also match the two teams in the league that have played on ESPN's Thursday night package more than any others, as Virginia Tech will be making its 30th appearance and Georgia Tech is 28th.

Georgia Tech and Virginia Tech will be meeting for the sixth time on ESPN's Thursday night package. The Hokies have won all of the previous five meetings, including games at Bobby Dodd Stadium in 2004, 2007, 2011 and 2013. Each of the last three meetings, though, have been decided by 11 or fewer points and in four of the five meetings Virginia Tech was ranked in the nation's Top 25.

Virginia Tech has won more games (20) on ESPN Thursday Night than any other ACC team. The Hokies of coach Frank Beamer are 20-9 overall on ESPN Thursday night.

Georgia Tech has hosted more Thursday night games than any other ACC school, a total of 20, including Thursday night's game. The Yellow Jackets actually began the Conference's Thursday night tradition, which, more often than not, has featured high drama. Tech hosted Virginia on Sept. 19, 1991, at Bobby Dodd Stadium in Atlanta, utilizing a 34-yard field goal by Scott Sisson on the game's final play to record a 24-21 victory. The Yellow Jackets are 11-16 overall, but are 10-9 at home, on Thursday night ESPN games.

In all, after this week's game, ACC teams will have made 171 appearances on ESPN's Thursday night package.

After the Hokies (29) and Yellow Jackets (27), Miami leads in total appearances with 22, followed by Pitt (21), Louisville (20), NC State (19), Clemson (15), North Carolina (15), Florida State (14), Boston College (12) and Virginia (12).

When Maryland was a member of the ACC, the Terrapins played in 13 Thursday ESPN games, 10 of them at home.

Miami has the best winning percentage of any ACC team on Thursdays on ESPN. The Hurricanes are 18-4 overall (.818), including an 11-1 mark at home in the old Orange Bowl (8-0) or Sun Life Stadium (3-1). The only UM loss at home came in 2011, when Virginia snapped the Canes' 10-game home win streak with a 28-21 verdict.

There have been many great moments in the Thursday night series, including the 2007 game when 2nd-ranked Boston College rallied to beat 8th-ranked Virginia Tech, 14-10, behind a pair of touchdown passes from QB Matt Ryan in the game's final two

minutes and 11 seconds. That game still stands as the only ESPN Thursday night meeting of ACC opponents that were both ranked in the Top 10 nationally.

The 2009 season featured a pair of thrillers, both involving North Carolina. The Tar Heels and Seminoles were involved in an offensive gut-wrencher, as FSU overcame a 24-6 third-quarter deficit to capture a 30-27 triumph. A week later, UNC upset 14th-ranked Virginia Tech, 20-17, on the game's final play, a 22-yard field goal by placekicker Casey Barth.

The 2010 match-up between Georgia Tech and Virginia Tech was a classic a see-saw battle decided when the Hokies' David Wilson returned a kickoff 90 yards for a touchdown with 2:23 remaining. Perhaps the most memorable Thursday night moment and biggest upset on the Thursday night ESPN package was 24th-ranked Virginia's win over second-ranked Florida State in 1995. That game snapped the Seminoles' 29-game Conference winning streak, which began when FSU joined the ACC in 1992.

Miami still has claim to the highest-rated game on Thursday night, when it met 10th-ranked Houston in an early season showdown in 1991. The Hurricanes and Cougars drew a 6.5 national rating as Miami took a lopsided 40-10 triumph.

The highest-rated Thursday ESPN battle between two ACC teams was the 1995 Virginia-Florida State telecast, which resulted in a 6.1 rating. Louisville recorded a pair of strong ratings while a member of the Big East in 2006, a 5.33 in downing West Virginia and a 5.03 in losing to Rutgers.

This week's game is the last of five ACC Thursday ESPN contests this year. North Carolina dropped a 17-13 decision to South Carolina in a game played in Charlotte's Bank of America Stadium on Sept. 3; Clemson won a cliffhanger at Louisville, 20-17, on Sept. 17; Miami dropped a 34-23 decision at Cincinnati on Oct. 1; and North Carolina claimed a 26-19 triumph at Pitt on Oct. 29.

## The ACC and ESPNU on Thursday Night

Two ACC games have been televised by ESPNU on Thursday night. Wake Forest hosted Vanderbilt in 2005 and Clemson and Temple met in Charlotte in 2006 and Louisville appeared on ESPNU as a member of the Big East in 2011.

# Noting the ACC--The Coaches

## Four ACC Coaches In Top 15 in Wins Per Season



Led by Florida State's **Jimbo Fisher**, who has averaged 11.6 wins during his first five seasons as a head coach, four ACC coaches rank among the nation's top 14 coaches in wins per season with a minimum of five seasons as a head coach.



Louisville's **Bobby Petrino** is ninth on the list averaging 9.2 wins per season with Georgia Tech's **Paul Johnson** right behind, averaging 9.17 wins a year. Clemson's **Dabo Swinney** is 15th, averaging 8.71 wins during his seven-year stay at Clemson, which includes a partial seven-game campaign in 2008. Virginia Tech's

## Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer Is NCAA FBS Active Career Leader in Wins

Virginia Tech's **Frank Beamer** is now the leading active head coach in the NCAA's FBS in career victories with a total of 277 triumphs in his 35-year coaching career. Georgia Tech head coach **Paul Johnson** ranks ninth on the active FBS list with 168 career wins. Beamer is sixth on the all-time list and Amos Alonzo Stagg is next on the list with 314 wins at Springfield, Chicago and Pacific. Former Florida State head coach Bobby Bowden, who retired after the 2009 season, is second in the NCAA's FBS with 377 career victories only to Penn State's Joe Paterno. Glenn "Pop" Warner, who ranks third on the all-time list with 336 wins, coached at seven different schools including a nine-year stint at Pitt (2015-23).

## Clemson's Swinney, Georgia Tech's Johnson In Good Company As ACC Head Coaches

After their first seven seasons at Clemson and Georgia Tech, head coaches **Dabo Swinney** and **Paul Johnson** have recorded excellent numbers. Only four other coaches in league history have had a better winning percentage after seven years than Swinney (.701) and only two have won more games. Only four other coaches in league history have won more games (58) than has Johnson after his first seven seasons in the league and he ranks 10th in winning percentage.

## Home Sweet Home for Noles' Fisher, Tigers' Swinney

Florida State head coach **Jimbo Fisher** and Clemson head coach **Dabo Swinney** have both enjoyed coaching in the cozy and imposing confines of the Seminoles' Doak Campbell Stadium and the Tigers' Memorial Stadium, also known as Death Valley. Now, after five seasons as head coach of the Seminoles, Fisher's teams have won 21 of 23 ACC games at home, a winning percentage of .913, the best by any ACC coach with a minimum of five seasons on the job. Swinney is right behind as his teams have won 26 of his first 29 home ACC games, a winning percentage of .897. They are both just ahead of legendary FSU coach Bobby Bowden, who also won more ACC home games than any other coach, with 62 triumphs in his 18 years in the league.



## Cutcliffe Leading Duke to Unprecedented Success

Duke's **David Cutcliffe** is leading the Blue Devils to success unprecedented in the school's history. Cutcliffe has led Duke to three consecutive bowl game appearances, a first in Blue Devil history. He has also led Duke to 19 wins in 2013 and 2014, the most in a two-year span since Duke began playing football in 1888. Now in his 8th season, Cutcliffe has led Duke to more wins (46) as the program experienced in the 18 years (43) before he took over the reins in Durham.

## Boston College's Steve Addazio Leads Eagles to Back-to-Back Bowl Bids

In his first two seasons as the head coach at Chestnut Hill, Steve Addazio led Boston College to back-to-back bowl appearances utilizing a physical ground game and a hard-hitting defensive unit. In each of his first two years, Addazio has had a player lead the nation in rushing. In 2013, tailback Andre Williams led the nation and set an ACC single-season record with 2,177 yards. On year later, QB Tyler Murphy led all quarterbacks nationally, rushing for 1,184 yards, while setting an ACC rushing mark for signal-callers. Last year, BC was one of just three schools (Oklahoma and Toledo were the others) that ranked in the nation's Top 15 in rushing defense (2nd) and rushing offense (14th).



## North Carolina's Fedora Putting Points on the Board for the Tar Heels

Now, in its fourth season with Larry Fedora as head coach, North Carolina has topped the 40-point mark 20 times and bettered 30 points 31 times in 47 games. His Tar Heel teams have averaged 36.3 points per game. In the previous 13 seasons before Fedora came to Chapel Hill, UNC had averaged just 23.3 points per game, a 14-point difference. Also, in his first four seasons, UNC has averaged 455.6 yards per game of total offense. That compares with the previous 13 seasons when the Tar Heels averaged just 349.25 yards per game on offense. Fedora's first three Tar Heel teams bettered the previous school mark for scoring. UNC scored a school-record 487 points in 2012 and tallied 425 points in 2013 and 432 in 2014. Previously, the school had only topped 400 points once. The school put up 421 points in 1993.



## NC State's Dave Doeren: Winning the Close Ones

Now in just his third season as head coach at NC State, Dave Doeren has already made a name for himself on the national stage. After winning 23 of his first 27 career games as a head coach at Northern Illinois, he had an 8-5 mark in 2014, winning his final three games, including a 34-27 win over Central Florida in the Bitcoin St. Petersburg Bowl. Doeren's teams are 7-2 (.778) in games decided by four or fewer points. That's the best winning percentage in such games by any Power 5 coach. Doeren guided State to three wins by a touchdown or less in 2014.

## VIRGINIA'S NICHOLSON NOMINATED FOR ORANGE BOWL-FWAA COURAGE AWARD

DALLAS (FWAA) – Virginia's Demetrius Nicholson is this week's nominee for the 2015 Orange Bowl-FWAA Courage Award. Nicholson is the second ACC player to be nominated for the Award, joining Boston College's Bobby Swigert, who was nominated on Sept. 16.

Nicholson, a 5-foot-11, 180-pound cornerback from Virginia Beach, Va., was born to Elizabeth Nicholson, who had Demetrius when she was 12. Nicholson also overcame the deaths of his younger sister, Shaquanda, and of his great-grandmother, Nita Suprales, who had taken the lead in raising him.

"Football was the outlet I realized I had at an early age," Nicholson told ESPN.com this year. "When I faced any type of adversity, I just kept going and didn't feel like anything could stop me. I think back to my mom having to raise me when she was 12 and then my great-grandmother getting sick. I have this anger type of fire inside me that motivates me and drives me in any situation I'm in, particularly on the football field."

Elizabeth Nicholson went to high school and nursing school, working while taking care of Demetrius and of her grandmother, Suprales, when she fell ill. With Suprales in a nursing home suffering from lupus and heart ailments, Elizabeth, then 20, lost her 4-month-old daughter to sudden infant death syndrome. Suprales died in 2009.

Demetrius Nicholson was diagnosed with turf toe after the fifth game of the 2013 season. After re-aggravating the injury in the spring, he played in just one game last season, before receiving a medical hardship waiver.

Now in his fifth season at Virginia, Nicholson has played in seven of eight games for the Cavaliers, starting in three. He has 22 tackles, including 1.5 for loss, to go with four pass breakups and one forced fumble. His 36 career passes defended ranks first in the ACC among active players and sixth nationally. Nicholson graduated in May and was the program's Allstate AFCA Good Works Team nominee.

The Courage Award was first presented by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) in 2002. A select group of writers from the FWAA vote on the winner each year. The requirements for nomination include displaying courage on or off the field, including overcoming an injury or physical handicap, preventing a disaster or living through hardship. The winner of the award will be included in festivities during Capital One Orange Bowl week and receive his trophy at an on-field presentation.

Previous winners of the Orange Bowl-FWAA Courage Award from the ACC are Duke offensive lineman Laken Tomlinson (2014), Clemson wide receiver Daniel Rodriguez (2012) and Clemson's Ray Ray McElrathbey (2006).

## ACC 2015 Football Championship Game Legends Class

*Quartet of National Champions Headline the 2015 ACC Legends Class in Pitt's Tony Dorsett, Georgia Tech's Bobby Ross, FSU's Warrick Dunn, Miami's Clinton Portis*

One of the game's most renowned Heisman Trophy winners and a trio of other major contributors to national championship teams lead the 2015 Atlantic Coast Conference Class of Football Legends announced on Sept. 29.

Pitt running back Tony Dorsett, Florida State running back Warrick Dunn, Georgia Tech coach Bobby Ross and Miami running back Clinton Portis are among the 14 all-time greats who will be honored during the weekend of the 2015 Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game, which will be played in Charlotte, N.C., on the evening of Saturday, Dec. 5.

Boston College center Dan Koppen, Clemson linebacker Anthony Simmons, Duke running back Chris Douglas, Louisville quarterback Chris Redman, North Carolina offensive lineman Ken Huff, NC State defensive back and return specialist Fred Combs, Syracuse tight end Chris Gedney, Virginia defensive end Patrick Kerney, Virginia Tech defensive end Corey Moore and Wake Forest punter Chuck Ramsey also headline this year's Legends class.

Dorsett – a member of both the College and Pro Football Halls of Fame – earned the Heisman Trophy as a senior in 1976, when he led Pitt to the national title to conclude a stellar collegiate career in which he rushed for over 6,000 yards. Dunn cemented his lasting impact on Florida State football as a freshman in 1993, when he helped key the Seminoles and head coach Bobby Bowden to their first national championship.

Ross oversaw a return to football glory at Georgia Tech, highlighted by the 1990 national title and the Yellow Jackets' first ACC football crown. Portis helped Miami claim the national championship in 2001 by rushing for 1,200 yards and 10 touchdowns on 220 carries.

Koppen made his mark as the center on Boston College's strong offensive lines before moving on to start on four Super Bowl teams with the New England Patriots. Clemson's Simmons established himself in the 1990s as one of the leading tacklers ever to take the field for an ACC team. Duke's Douglas set school rushing marks that still stand, while Louisville's Redman displayed passing skills that led to national honors, including the trophy named for ultimate Cardinal great John Unitas.

North Carolina's Huff epitomized the "Tailback U" teams of head coach Bill Dooley in the early 1970s, opening holes for 1,000-yard rushers in the patented ground game. The multi-talented Combs proved a mainstay for head coach Earle Edwards' NC State teams of the mid-1960s, including a starring role on the 1967 squad that played its way to a No. 3 national ranking.

Gedney upheld the high standard for tight ends at Syracuse, set by the legendary John Mackey, establishing school receiving records for his position and leading the Orange to four bowl games. Virginia's Kerney emerged as one of the game's top pass rushers, earning All-America honors after ranking second in the nation in quarterback sacks as a senior.

Virginia Tech's Moore was another elite defensive end, garnering both the Nagurski and Lombardi awards in his final collegiate season and piling up 35 quarterback sacks over his three years in Blacksburg. Wake Forest's Ramsey proved a valuable weapon in the battle for field position, leading the nation in punting in 1973 and claiming consensus All-America honors.

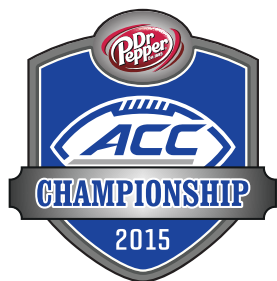

### ACC Divisional Tiebreaker

If more than one team in the same division is tied for the best winning percentage in its Conference games, the procedures listed below will be followed to determine the division's representative in the ACC Championship Game:

### Two-Team Tie:

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall win percentage. (Divisional and non-divisional) and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken from first-to-last using the league's tiebreaking procedures.
4. Overall win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined win percentage vs. all non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based on their order of finish (overall conference win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the higher ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee following the conclusion of regular season games. (If both tied teams are not ranked in the ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee, the higher ranked team in the Amway Coaches Poll (including others receiving votes).
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw. (as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.)

### Three-Team (or More) Team Tie:

(Once a team is eliminated from the tie, the tie-breaker procedures restart for the remaining teams. If the three (or more) team tie can be reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaker format will then be applied.)

1. Combined head-to-head win percentage among the tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall (divisional and non-divisional) Conference win percentage, and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken first to last, using the league's tie-breaker policies.
4. Combined win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Overall win percentage versus non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based upon their order of finish (overall win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional opponents based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee following the conclusion of regular season games, unless the second of the tied teams is ranked within five or fewer places of the highest ranked tied team. In this case, the two-team tiebreaker procedure shall be applied between the top two ranked tied teams. If none of the tied teams are ranked in the rankings of the College Football Playoff Committee, the higher ranked team in the officially released Amway Coaches poll (including others receiving votes), following the conclusion of regular season games, unless the second of the tied teams is within five or fewer places of the highest ranked team. (For the sake of clarity, the team receiving the second-most votes but not ranked in the Top 25 would be ranked 27th.) In this case the two-team tiebreaker procedure

## COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

The College Football Playoff begins its second year of operation after a highly-acclaimed first season in 2014-15. The Playoff features the top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and a national championship game played in a different city each year. Each semifinal is played during the New Year's holiday with the National Championship Game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later.

The College Football Playoff selection committee chooses the four teams for the playoff based on their performance during the regular season, including, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams will be seeded so that #1 will play #4 in one semifinal and #2 will meet #3 in the other, with the winners advancing to the national championship game. The selection committee will announce its rankings each week on Tuesdays beginning this year on Nov. 3. The final rankings will be announced on Sunday, Dec. 6.

The semifinals will rotate among six different bowls: the Chick-fil-A Peach, Goodyear Cotton, Fiesta and Capital One Orange Bowls; the Rose Bowl presented by Northwestern Mutual and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight other teams in four compelling matchups.

## ACC Bowl Quick Selection Order

(The ACC is in the second year of six-year contracts with its current bowl partners.  
The current College Football Playoff format is a 12-year agreement)

### College Football Playoff (four teams)

If the ACC Champion is not in one of the semifinal games this year, it will appear in one of the Playoff "host" bowls, either the Fiesta or Chick-fil-A Peach, since the Capital One Orange Bowl will serve as a semifinal site this year. There is no limit on how many teams the College Football Playoff may choose from a particular conference.

### Capital One Orange Bowl

The ACC champion, if not in the College Football Playoff, would normally play in the Capital One Orange Bowl against the highest-ranked and available team from Notre Dame, the SEC or the Big Ten. With the Capital One Orange Bowl serving as a Playoff semifinal this year, the CFP Selection Committee will determine the game (Chick-fil-A or Fiesta) and opponent for the ACC champion if that team is not in the Playoff.

### Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl

Only if the ACC opponent in the Capital One Orange Bowl in a non-semifinal year, is a team from the Big Ten. This will not occur in 2015 due to the fact that the Orange Bowl this year is a semifinal site for the College Football Playoff.

### Russell Athletic Bowl

Has first pick of ACC teams in 2015 after the College Football Playoff and the Host Bowls.

## The One-Win Rule Applies Only to Notre Dame

The ACC's bowl selection will no longer be bound by the rigidity of a "one-win rule" but will have a general list of criteria to emphasize regionality and quality matchups on the field. A one-win rule does apply to Notre Dame's participation in the ACC Bowl structure. Notre Dame is now eligible for ACC Bowl selection beginning with the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl and continuing through the league's bowl selections. However, Notre Dame must be within one win of the ACC available team which has the best overall record, in order to be chosen. In other words, if an ACC team was 9-3, a 7-5 Notre Dame team could not be chosen in its place. Notre Dame would have to be 8-4 to be chosen over a 9-3 league team.

## ACC Bowl Expenses And Revenue

The Atlantic Coast Conference shares all bowl revenues. Each school is provided an initial expense allotment. The Conference will share in the cost of unsold tickets for participating bowl institutions. After all bowl expense allotments and ticket reimbursements are subtracted from the total bowl revenue, the remaining revenue is distributed evenly among ACC schools.

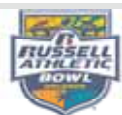

# The ACC In Overtime

## The ACC & Overtime

When Duke and Virginia Tech ended regulation tied at 24-24 on October 24, 2015, they played the 75th game featuring an ACC team that has had to go to extra sessions and the first in conference history to go into four overtimes. Of the 75 overtime contests, a large portion of them--31--have been played in September. Games have gone into overtime for ACC teams a total of 19 times in November, while 14 have been played in October, three in August, six in December and two in January (2006 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl). Of the 75 overtime contests, 37 have been ACC games while 38 nonconference games have gone into overtime. The home team has a 41-25 advantage in the 66 games played on campus. The team which wins the toss has a 40-35 record. Fifty-four of the games were decided in the first overtime with 14 games in double overtime, six in triple overtime and one in four overtimes.
