**3rd-Ranked FSU Travels To NC State In A Primetime Atlantic Division Battle
 No. 15 Clemson Hosts Georgia Tech; Virginia Tech-UNC, Duke-Virginia in key
 Coastal Clashes; Miami Faces 9th-Ranked Notre Dame in Chicago**

Unbeaten and 3rd-ranked Florida State faces its second straight road test and its third straight nationally-televised prime time battle (8 p.m., ESPN2), while Coastal Division leader Miami travels to Chicago, Ill., to face 9th-ranked Notre Dame in another prime time contest at Soldier Field (7:30 pm, NBC), highlighting Week Six of the 2012 Atlantic Coast Conference Football Schedule...The Seminoles of coach **Jimbo Fisher** are led by senior **QB EJ Manuel**, who leads the ACC in passing efficiency (176.7) and in pass completion percentage (.733)...NC State, coached by **Tom O'Brien**, and led by senior **QB Mike Glennon**, have won three of the last five meetings between the two teams at Carter-Finley Stadium in Raleigh...Miami, coached by Al Golden, is coming off its second-straight ACC win, as junior **QB Stephen Morris** shattered his own week-old career best by throwing for an ACC-record 566 yards in the Hurricanes' win over the Wolfpack...Morris has thrown for 1,002 yards in his last two games... They will be facing unbeaten Notre Dame, which is ranked 3rd nationally in scoring defense and 9th in pass efficiency defense...The Irish are coached by **Brian Kelly** and led by All-America **LB Manti Te'o**... Earlier this month, the Irish announced they would be

joining the Atlantic Coast Conference...15th-ranked Clemson and Georgia Tech meet for the 75th time in a series which began in 1898...The Tigers host the Jackets in a nationally-televised contest (3:30 pm, ESPN) at Memorial Stadium...**Coach Dabo Swinney's** Tigers are led by junior **QB Tajh Boyd**, who has completed 69 percent of his passes, 12 of them for touchdowns...Georgia Tech, coached by **Paul Johnson**, counters with a spread-option offense led by **QB Tevin Washington**, who leads the ACC with 11 TDs...A pair of key Coastal Division match-ups are also featured this week as Duke, North Carolina, Virginia and Virginia Tech all look to keep pace with Miami...The Blue Devils of coach **David Cutcliffe** are off to their best start since 1994 (4-1), and host Virginia (3 p.m., RSN) at Wallace Wade Stadium in Durham...Duke is led by senior **WR Conner Vernon**, who tied the ACC career mark for pass receptions (232), in the Blue Devils' win over Wake Forest last Saturday...UVa, coached by **Mike London** and led by versatile senior **RB Perry Jones** is looking to snap a three-game losing streak... In Chapel Hill, N.C., North Carolina, coached by **Larry Fedora** and led by **QB Bryn Renner**, hosts Virginia Tech (12:30

p.m., ACC Network)...UNC, in its 122nd year of collegiate football, is coming off a school-record 66 points in a 66-0 win over Idaho.. The Hokies of coach **Frank Beamer** are led by **QB Logan Thomas** and are looking to rebound from a last-minute loss to Cincinnati...In College Park, Md., the Maryland Terrapins of coach **Randy Edsall** are the final ACC team to begin Conference play, hosting Wake Forest at Capital One Field at Byrd Stadium (3:30 pm, ESPNU)...The Terps, who are 8th nationally in total defense, are led by All-America **DE Joe Vellano** and **LB Demetrius Hartsfield**, while the Deacons, coached by **Jim Grobe**, are led by junior **QB Tanner Price**... Boston College, coached by **Frank Spaziani**, travels to West Point, N.Y., to face Army at Michie Stadium (Noon, CBSCS)... The offensive-minded Eagles are led by their prolific junior passing combination in **QB Chase Rettig** and **WR Alex Amidon**...Rettig ranks 2nd in the ACC and 11th nationally in passing yards per game (323 avg.) while Amidon leads the conference in receiving yards per game (139.8 avg.) and ranks 4th nationally...The Cadets are ranked 2nd nationally in rushing offense (367.50).

National Football Hall of Fame To Induct Miami's Jimmy Johnson



Atlantic Coast Conference schools will have one inductee this year at the annual National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame annual banquet in New York City. Former Miami head coach **Jimmy Johnson**, who also coached at Arkansas and went on to professional fame as head of the Super Bowl champion Dallas Cowboys, will be inducted at the annual National Football Foundation banquet, which will be held Tuesday, December 4 at the Waldorf Astoria Hotel in New York City. Johnson's induction brings the total to 16 former players or coaches who have been tabbed for induction into the College Hall of Fame from current Atlantic Coast Conference schools over the last seven years.

Johnson coached five seasons at Miami, leading the Hurricanes to record of 52-9 and a winning percentage .852. His 1987 Miami team captured the school's second National Championship and his 1986 team played for the national title, but lost to Penn State. During his years with the Hurricanes, his teams defeated 19 nationally-ranked teams, 8 teams ranked in the top five and three teams ranked No. 1. His teams played in two Fiesta Bowls, two Orange Bowls and one Sugar Bowl game. During his five years in Miami, his teams were ranked nationally on 55 occasions, including 13 times being ranked No. 1 nationally. Prior to joining the Hurricanes, he served as head coach at Oklahoma State, rebuilding that program and posting a 29-26-2 record. His overall record in college is 81-35-2. Johnson played his collegiate football at Arkansas, where he was a starter on the Razorback's 1964 national championship team. After leaving Miami he enjoyed a successful career in the National Football League as head coach of the Dallas Cowboys and Miami Dolphins. He coached the Cowboys to two Super Bowl Championships. Johnson joins 15 other former players or coaches from current ACC schools who have been

selected for the Hall of Fame since 2006 including:

2012 ACC Football By The Numbers

0 - The number of periods in Florida State QB **EJ Manuel's** name. There are no periods after the E or the J for Manuel, whose whole name is short for Erick Rodriguez Manuel, Jr., but was shortened to "EJ Manuel", without the periods, long ago.

1-2 - A pair of true freshmen lead the ACC in all-purpose yardage this week. Miami's **Duke Johnson** leads the conference and is 5th nationally, averaging 184.0 yards per game. Maryland's **Stefon Diggs** is 2nd in the ACC and is 16th nationally, averaging 160.5 yards per contest.

2.70 - Between them, Florida State's starting **DEs Bjoern Werner** and **Cornellius Carradine** are averaging 2.7 sacks a game. Carradine has 7 sacks in five games (1.40) and ranks 6th in the NCAA's FBS, while Werner (1.30) ranks 8th nationally.

4 - Boston College junior **WR Alex Amidon** ranks 4th nationally this week in pass receiving yardage per game. Amidon is averaging 139.75 yards per game and has topped 100 receiving yards in three of his first four games, totalling 99 in the fourth contest.

5 - The number of ACC pass receivers ranked among the nation's Top 20 this week. Clemson's **DeAndre Hopkins** leads the ACC and ranks 8th nationally averaging 8.40 catches per game. He is quickly followed by Boston College's **Alex Amidon** (9th, 8.25), Wake Forest's **Michael Campanaro** (12th, 7.60) and Duke's **Conner Vernon** (18th, 6.80) and **Jamison Crowder** (18th, 6.80)

6 - Six of the ACC's 12 starting quarterbacks hail from Virginia and all six led their teams to bowl games in 2011 including Clemson's **Tajh Boyd** (Hampton, Discover Orange), Virginia Tech's **Logan Thomas** (Lynchburg, Allstate Sugar), Virginia's **Michael Rocco** (Lynchburg, Chick-fil-A), Florida State's **EJ Manuel** (Virginia Beach, Champs Sports), NC State's **Mike Glennon** (Centreville, Belk) and North Carolina's **Bryn Renner** (West Springfield, Advocare V100 Independence).

6-7 - North Carolina senior **PK Casey Barth** has made 58 of 71 career field goal attempts, a field goal percentage of .8169 while Boston College junior **PK Nate Freese** has made 40 of 49 field goal attempts in his career, a percentage of .8163. Barth and Freese rank 6th and 7th among all active FBS placekickers in field goal percentage.

8 - Maryland is ranked 8th nationally in defense, allowing an average of just 261.25 yards per game, an improvement of almost 200 yards per game from last year (457.2). The Terps are also ranked 11th nationally in rushing defense (83.5) and 18th in pass defense (177.75).

14 - The number of team categories in which Florida State ranks among the Top 10 nationally in the NCAA FBS statistics. FSU ranks 5th in rushing defense, 4th pass efficiency defense and pass defense, 3rd in total defense and 7th in scoring defense. The Seminoles also rank 8th in rushing offense, 6th in passing efficiency, 9th in total offense, and 6th in scoring offense. FSU also ranks 3rd in kickoff returns, 7th in fewest interceptions thrown, 2nd in first downs defense, 3rd in third down defensive percentage and 5th in kickoff return

yardage defense.

16 - Clemson **PK Chandler Catanzaro** has made 16 consecutive field goals, a streak which began in the 2011 season. He broke the Clemson school record of 14, set by Obed Arriri, in 1980, with a 50-yarder on Sept. 22 against Florida State. The ACC record is 27 straight set by NC State's Marc Primanti during the 1995-96 seasons. Catanzaro is now 44-57 over his career, a .772 percentage.

20.2 - The average number of catches for Duke's top three pass receivers are averaging this year. WR's Conner Vernon (6.80) and Jamison Crowder (6.80) are joined by senior WR Desmond Scott (6.60), a running back convert, to average more than 20 catches per game.

29 - The number of career rushing touchdowns for Georgia Tech senior **QB Tevin Washington**. Washington is now tied for 2nd on the ACC career list in career TDs for a QB with Larry Russell of Wake Forest with 29. Only former ACC standout Joshua Nesbitt of Georgia Tech (35) has scored more TDs than Washington.

49 - Florida State became the first team in ACC history to score 49 or more points in four consecutive games in a single season. The Seminoles opened the year with a 69-3 win over Murray State, then defeated Savannah State (55-0), Wake Forest (52-0) and Clemson (49-37). FSU is also the third team since 1920 to score 49 or more in its first four games at the start of the year joining Nebraska (1995) and Oklahoma (2007).

49 - Clemson junior **QB Tajh Boyd** threw 3 TD passes against Boston College Saturday, bringing his career total to 49 in little more than a year as the starting QB for the Tigers. Boyd's total ties a Clemson school record and already has him 19th on the ACC career list with the likes of Clemson's Charlie Whitehurst, Florida State's Charlie Ward, Maryland's Scott Milanovich and FSU's Christian Ponder.

50 - NC State sophomore **PK Niklas Sade** connected on a career-long 50-yard field goal in the Wolfpack's 44-37 loss to Miami. The kick tied the score at 37-all with 2:10 remaining in regulation.

66 - The number of points scored by North Carolina under new head coach Larry Fedora in its 66-0 win over Idaho last Saturday. It was the highest point total in the 122 years of North Carolina football and also marked the first time in school history the football team has topped 60 points in a game twice in one season. Earlier this year, UNC defeated Elon, 62-0.

67.5 - Florida State quarterback **EJ Manuel** is one of the most accurate passers in ACC history. Manuel, who only became a full-time starter in 2011, has completed 425 of 630 passes in his career, a completion percentage of .675. If maintained for the rest of this year, that would be the best in ACC history. Virginia's Matt Schaub (.670) and Wake Forest's Riley Skinner (.669) are currently 1-2 on the career list.

232 - The number of career pass receptions for Duke senior wide receiver **Conner Vernon**. Vernon moved into a tie with Aaron Kelly of Clemson (232) for the ACC career receptions record. His record-tying catch,

a five-yarder on Duke's final possession, gave the Blue Devils a key first down and set up Duke's game-winning TD in its 34-27 win over Wake Forest. His career total of 3,137 receiving yards puts him in 4th place on the ACC career list. He needs 438 receiving yards to set a new standard, currently held by FSU's Peter Warrick (3,517).

254 - Virginia Tech head coach **Frank Beamer** has a total of 254 coaching victories in his career and now leads all active NCAA FBS head coaches. Beamer is now 8th on the NCAA's career FBS list with 7th-place Tom Osborne (Nebraska) now one win away at 255.

377 - Florida State **PK Dustin Hopkins** has 377 career points, putting him in 2nd place on the ACC career scoring list. Hopkins now only trails Maryland's Nick Novak, who scored 393 points during the 2001-04 seasons. With 12 points against USF, Hopkins passed former Florida State standout Xavier Beitia who scored 375 points concurrently with Novak. Hopkins, though, had his consecutive PAT streak end at 145 straight PATs without a miss against Savannah State, which was the 6th longest in NCAA history.

271 - The number of passing yards for Miami junior **QB Stephen Morris** in just the first quarter of the Canes' 44-37 win over NC State. The yardage was the fourth-highest total for a quarter in the NCAA's FBS since 2004.

371 - The number of reception yardage for Miami sophomore receivers **Phillip Dorsett** and **Rayshawn Scott** in Miami's 44-37 win over NC State. Dorsett had 7 catches for 191 yards and 2 TDs, including a 62-yard bomb for the game-winner, while Scott had 6 catches for 180 yards and 2 more scores.

409 - The number of yards of total offense for Clemson junior **QB Tajh Boyd** last Saturday in the Tigers' 45-31 win over Boston College.

566 - The number of passing yards for Miami junior **QB Stephen Morris** in the Hurricanes' 44-37 win over NC State last Saturday. Morris set Miami and ACC records for most passing yards in a game and most yards total offense (568).

1,006 - The number of total passing yards for both teams in the **Miami-NC State** game. Also an ACC record, breaking the old mark of 928 set by Wake Forest (545) and NC State (383) in a 52-23 Wolfpack win in 1995.

1,315 - The number of yards of total offense for both teams in the **Miami-NC State** game last Saturday. This was an ACC record, breaking the old mark of 1,294 set by Florida State (858) and Maryland (436) in a 69-21 Seminole win in 1992.

1994 - Duke, with a 4-1 record, is off to its best start in football since the 1994 season when the Blue Devils won their first seven games and posted an 8-4 record. That year also marked the Blue Devils' last appearance in a post season bowl game.

2014 - The ACC and Notre Dame announced on Sept. 12, that the Irish will become the 15th ACC team when they are allowed to join the conference by the Big East By Laws. Notre Dame will start playing five football games annually against ACC foes in 2014 and will join in all other sports no later than by the 2015-16 school year.

2012 ACC FB Game Summaries -- Sept. 29

Miami 44, NC State 37

QB Stephen Morris' 62-yard touchdown strike to WR Phillip Dorsett with 19 seconds left lifted the Coastal Division leading Hurricanes (4-1 ACC, 3-0 overall) to their third straight ACC victory. Morris finished with an ACC- and school-record 566 yards passing. NC State (3-2, 0-1) rallied from a 37-27 fourth-quarter deficit before yielding the long score to the Hurricanes in the closing seconds. Dorsett caught seven passes for 191 yards and two touchdowns. WR Rashawn Scott had six catches for 180 yards and two more touchdowns for the Hurricanes. Morris out-dueled Wolfpack QB Mike Glennon, who completed 24 of 42 passes for a career-high 440 yards and four touchdowns.

#17/16 Clemson 45, Boston College 31

QB Tajh Boyd threw three touchdown passes to match the school's all-time record with 49 for his career, and WR DeAndre Hopkins had a school single-game record 197 receiving yards as the No. 17 Tigers (4-1, 1-1) pulled away for a 45-31 win at Atlantic Division foe Boston College (1-3, 0-2). Boyd finished with 367 yards passing. Boston College QB Chase Rettig, who entered the day as the leading passer in the ACC, completed 25 of 43 passes for 341 yards and three touchdowns. WR Alex Amdion caught eight passes for 193 yards and two touchdowns for the Boston College. Amidon's reception yardage total was the third highest in school history.

Duke 34, Wake Forest 27

Duke WR Conner Vernon matched the Atlantic Coast Conference record for career receptions with 232 as the Blue Devils (4-1, 1-0) scored their first win over the Demon Deacons (3-2, 1-2) since 1999. The Blue Devils rushed for 123 yards and scored four times on the ground with QBs Anthony Boone and Brandon Connette combining for three rushing scores. WR Desmond Scott added 11 catches for 134 yards for Duke, which scored twice in the fourth quarter to build a two-touchdown lead after the score was tied at 20-20 despite losing starting QB Sean Renfree to a right elbow injury. Wake Forest QB Tanner Price finished 19-of-38 for 230 yards with two touchdowns.

#4/4 Florida State 30, South Florida 17

The fourth-ranked Seminoles (5-0) remained unbeaten with a road win over the in-state rival Bulls (2-3) before a USF school-record crowd of 69,383. Florida State WR Rashad Greene had a 10-yard touchdown run, while LB Christian Jones scored on a 12-yard fumble return and TE Kevin Haplea had a 1-yard TD reception. DE Cornelius "Tank" Carradine had another solid game up front for the Seminoles with nine tackles, including a sack of South Florida QB Matt Floyd that forced the fumble which Jones returned for the touchdown on the final play of the third quarter, putting FSU in front 30-10.

North Carolina 66, Idaho 0

RB Gio Bernard scored twice, QB Bryn Renner threw three touchdown passes and North Carolina (3-2) set a school scoring record in a 66-0 win against visiting Idaho (0-5). Freshman WR Quinshad Davis added two TD catches for the Tar Heels, who finished with 575 total yards. The UNC defense intercepted four passes on the day, surpassing the previous season total of three. The Tar Heels also set a school record for margin of victory in addition to points scored.

Middle Tennessee 49, Georgia Tech 28

Georgia Tech QB Tevin Washington tied a school record with four rushing touchdowns, but the Yellow Jackets (2-3) saw the visiting Blue Raiders (3-1) counter with a banner day from RB Benny Cunningham, who rushed for 217 yards and five touchdowns. The Yellow Jackets lost consecutive home games for the first time since 1988.

Cincinnati 27, Virginia Tech 24

Cincinnati QB Munchie Legaux completed a 39-yard touchdown pass to WR Damon Julian with 13 seconds left to lift the Bearcats past the Hokies at FedEx Field in Landover, Md. Virginia Tech (3-2) appeared to be in great shape to pull out a win after a 93-yard drive ended with a touchdown with just 1:49 remaining. The Hokies needed only six plays on their go-ahead drive, scoring when QB Logan Thomas fired a strike over the middle to WR Corey Fuller, who went 56 yards for the touchdown. Cody Journell's extra point gave Tech a 24-20 lead. But the Bearcats (3-0) countered by going 85 yards in nine plays for their winning score.

Louisiana Tech 44, Virginia 38

The visiting Bulldogs (4-0) scored 34 unanswered points to rally past the Cavaliers (2-3). Virginia QBs Michael Rocco and Phillip Sims each threw a pair of touchdown passes, and RB Perry Jones threw another on a 36-yard halfback pass, but the Cavaliers were hurt by three turnovers that aided Louisiana Tech's comeback. Virginia lost despite piling up 480 yards passing. Cavalier WR Darius Jennings had six catches for 136 yards, and Jones had seven receptions for 100 yards.

Miami's Morris, Paul, and Johnson headline honorees for performances against NC State

GREENSBORO, N.C. – Miami quarterback Stephen Morris, linebacker Gianni Paul, and linebacker Eddie Johnson headline a list of eight players named as the Atlantic Coast Conference Football Players of the Week, announced by the conference on Monday. Morris set a new conference single-game record with 566 passing yards, Paul accumulated a team-high 11 tackles, and Johnson had seven tackles, one sack, two forced fumbles, and a pass breakup in the Hurricanes' 44-37 win over NC State.

Florida State's Bryan Stork, the Offensive Lineman of the Week, helped the Seminole offense tally 424 yards of total offense in the 30-17 win at South Florida. Teammates Cornelius Carradine, who registered a team-high nine tackles to earn Defensive Lineman of the Week for the second time this year, and Dustin Hopkins, who moved into second on the all-time ACC scoring list, also garnered weekly accolades.

Boston College's Alex Amidon is the Receiver of the Week after his 193-yard performance in a 45-31 loss to No. 17 Clemson. The Defensive Back of the Week, Jordan Byas of Duke, had a career-high 11 tackles in the Blue Devils' 34-27 win at Wake Forest.

OFFENSIVE BACK – Stephen Morris, Miami, Junior, QB, 6-2, 214, Miami, Fla.

Morris threw for a Miami and ACC record 566 yards to lead the Hurricanes to a 44-37 win over NC State. The junior quarterback completed 26 of 49 passes for a 21.8 yards-per-completion average, and recorded five TDs, tying five other Miami quarterbacks for the most in a single game and the first since Kyle Wright at Wake Forest in 2005. His fifth touchdown pass of the day was the eventual game-winner, a 62-yard pass to Phillip Dorsett with 19 seconds remaining, his second scoring throw of more than 60 yards on the day. Morris registered 271 passing yards in the first quarter, becoming the fourth FBS player to throw for that many in a quarter since 2004. In his last two games, he has thrown for 1,002 yards.

OFFENSIVE LINEMAN – Bryan Stork, Florida State, R-Junior, OL, 6-4, 312, Vero Beach, Fla.

Stork, the most experienced player on the Seminoles' offensive front, posted his second consecutive outstanding performance of the season in the 30-17 win at South Florida. The Vero Beach, Fla., native graded out at 77 percent and had just one missed assignment while triggering all 67 snaps for the Florida State offense. He was not penalized and did not yield a sack in a performance which came on the heels of a career-best 95-percent grade against Clemson. The Seminoles rolled up 424 yards of total offense (242 pass, 182 rush) in their road debut of the season.

RECEIVER – Alex Amidon, Boston College, Junior, WR, 5-11, 186, Greenfield, Mass.

Amidon caught eight passes for a career-high 193 yards and two touchdowns in Boston College's 45-31 loss to No. 17 Clemson, accounting for 52 percent of the team's receiving yardage (193 of 369) and 39 percent of its points. Additionally, the total marked the most receiving yards in a game for a Boston College player since Gerard Phelan had 226 receiving yards against Miami on Nov. 23, 1984. Saturday's Boston College-Clemson game featured the top two single-game ACC receiving performances so far this fall; Amidon's total was just four yards behind Clemson's DeAndre Hopkins' 197-yard effort. Amidon has eclipsed 100 receiving yards in three games this fall, and ranks fourth among all FBS players in receiving yards per game (139.8).

DEFENSIVE LINEMAN – Cornelius Carradine, Florida State, Senior, DE, 6-5, 265, Cincinnati, Ohio

Carradine registered a team-high nine tackles, including 1.5 quarterback sacks and a forced fumble, as he defeated South Florida. The Seminoles limited USF to 124 total yards after the first quarter en route to moving to 5-0 on the season, 30-17. Carradine's late third quarter sack of USF back-up quarterback Matt Floyd resulted in a fumble, which teammate Christian Jones scooped up and raced 12 yards into the end zone for the Seminoles' final score of the game. Through five games, Carradine leads the Seminoles with 28 tackles and 7 sacks, while his eight tackles for loss trail teammate Bjoern Werner by one. It is the second weekly honor of the season for Carradine.

LINEBACKER – Gianni Paul, Miami, Sophomore, LB, 6-0, 230, Lakeland, Fla.

Paul, making his career-first start at middle linebacker, tallied a forced fumble and career- and team-high 11 tackles, including eight solo stops, in Miami's 44-37 win over NC State. Paul's 11 tackles match his total in his first 11 career games (11 tackles entering NC State game).

DEFENSIVE BACK – Jordan Byas, Duke, R-Senior, S, 6-1, 220, Lynn Haven, Fla.

Byas led Duke to a 34-27 road win over Wake Forest by recording a team-best & career-high 11 tackles. He also added one interception and one-half quarterback sack – both firsts of his career. The redshirt senior spearheaded Duke's defensive effort that forced four Demon Deacon turnovers from a Wake Forest offense that entered the game having committed an ACC-low two total turnovers through the first four weeks of the year. Byas has helped Duke to a 4-1 start to the season, marking the best five-game opening to a season since the 1994 squad started 5-0 while matching the third-best five-game opening to a season since 1966 (5-0 in both 1988 & 1994; 4-1 in 1971, 1974 & 2012).

SPECIALIST – Dustin Hopkins, Florida State, Senior, K, 6-2, 190, Houston, Texas

Hopkins got off the deck after an early missed field goal from 48 yards to his final three attempts in the 30-17 win at South Florida. By converting from 26, 43 and 23 yards, Hopkins pushed his career field goal total to 69, which ranks second in Florida State and fourth in Atlantic Coast Conference history. With 12 points on the day, Hopkins also moved into sole possession of second place on the Florida State and ACC career scoring charts, with 377 points. He trails Florida State record holder Derek Schmidt and ACC record holder Nick Novak of Maryland by 16 points – they both finished with 393 – to become the all-time leader. Hopkins is also just eight points shy of moving into 10th place on the NCAA all-time scoring list.

ROOKIE – Eddie Johnson, Miami, R-Freshman, LB, 6-1, 238, Atlanta, Ga.

Tallied seven tackles (six solo stops), 1.0 sack, 1.0 tackles-for-loss, two forced fumbles and one pass breakup in Miami's 44-37 win over NC State. The reigning ACC Linebacker of the Week recorded one of Miami's two sacks and a tackle-for-loss. His six solo stops were second among Miami players and the seven tackles were third on the team.

Boston College

WR Alex Amidon's 193 yards in pass receptions vs. Clemson last Saturday were the third most on school history, ranking only behind two games quarterbacked by Heisman Trophy winner Doug Flutie ... **QB Chase Rettig** ranks second in the ACC and 11th nationally in passing yards per game (323 avg.) ... Amidon, one of eight receivers recently added to the watch list for the 2012 Biletnikoff Award, which is given to the nation's premier receiver, leads the conference in receiving yards per game (139.8 avg.) and ranks fourth nationally ... Rettig completed 25 of 43 passes for 341 yards and three touchdowns against Clemson ... **PK Nate Freese** has made 40 of 49 field goal attempts in his career, a percentage of .8163, a percentage that ranks seventh nationally among all active FBS placekickers ... After playing three of its first four games at home, the Eagles hit the road for the next three weekends ... Following this Saturday's trip to West Point to face Army, Boston College returns to ACC play at Florida State on Oct. 13 and visits Georgia Tech on Oct. 20.



Maryland

Maryland's defensive improvement has been one of the main story lines through the first month of the ACC season ... The Terrapins rank eighth nationally this week in total defense, allowing an average of just 261.25 yards per game ... Maryland ranks 11th nationally in rushing defense (83.5 yards per game) and 18th in pass defense (177.8 ypg) ... Freshman **QB Perry Hills** had the best game of his young career in the Sept. 22 road game at West Virginia, completing 20-of-29 passes for 305 yards and three touchdowns, all career highs ... Freshman **WR Stefon Diggs** had his second straight game with 200-plus all-purpose yards by finishing with 201 against West Virginia ... Diggs had a team-high 113 receiving yards and two touchdowns on three receptions en route to earning ACC Rookie of the Week honors for Sept. 24 ... Diggs' touchdowns came on 42 and 56-yard receptions, and he had 25 punt return yards and 63 kickoff return yards ... With 160.5 all-purpose yards per game, Diggs ranks 16th nationally ... Redshirt junior **DB Dexter McDougle** had a career-high eight tackles, all of them unassisted, against West Virginia.



Clemson

WR DeAndre Hopkins had 11 catches for 197 yards and a touchdown against Boston College ... Hopkins' 197 receiving yards set a school record for a single game, breaking the record of 182 yards by Rod Gardner against North Carolina in 2000 ... In just five games this year, Hopkins has established the Clemson single game receiving record (13 catches vs. Auburn in the opener), tied the record for touchdown catches in a single game (3 vs. Furman) and set the record for receiving yards in a game ... **QB Tajh Boyd** had 409 yards of total offense on Saturday, just the sixth 400-yard total offense game in school history ... Boyd now has two of the six, as he had 416 yards against Auburn last year ... **RB Andre Ellington**, the ACC's leading rusher, needs 130 more yards to reach 3,000 for his career ... Clemson has played seven of its last nine games away from home ... This marks the first time Clemson has played seven out of nine games away from home since a stretch covering the 1967-68 seasons ... The Tigers will now play five of their last seven at home, with road games at Wake Forest and Duke.



NC State

The Wolfpack set a school record with 674 yards of total offense in Saturday's ACC road game at Miami ... The previous mark was 653 yards against Kansas in the 2003 Mazda Tangerine Bowl ... **QB Mike Glennon** went over 300 yards passing for the first time this season, completed 24-of-42 for a career-best 440 yards against the Hurricanes ... Glennon posted the most passing yards for a Pack QB since Philip Rivers had 475 in his final game against Kansas in the 2003 Mazda Tangerine Bowl ... For the second straight week, NC State finished with over 200 yards rushing ... The Wolfpack had 282 yards against The Citadel on Sept. 22 and followed up with 233 yards against Miami ... It marks the first time since late in the 1998 season that NC State had over 200 yards rushing as a team in back-to-back games ... Redshirt sophomore **RB Tony Crecy** posted his first career 100-yard rushing game, as he finished with 19 carries for 120 yards and one touchdown ... Redshirt sophomore **WR Bryan Underwood** tied a school record against the Hurricanes by catching at touchdown pass for the fifth straight game.



Florida State

The Seminoles rank third nationally in total defense after holding South Florida to 268 total yards in last Saturday night's 30-17 road victory ... Leading the charge was **DE Cornellius "Tank" Carradine**, who now has seven sacks in five games (1.4) to rank sixth nationally ... Carradine delivered perhaps his biggest sack of the season against USF, forcing a fumble that was returned 12 yards by **LB Christian Jones** for a touchdown that put the Seminoles ahead 30-10 heading into the fourth quarter ... Carradine finished the game with a team-high nine tackles ... **WR Rashad Greene** became the first FSU player since Peter Warrick to score a touchdown three different ways in one season when he ran for a nine-yard score against USF ... **WR Rodney Smith** had three catches against the Bulls, extending his streak to 30 games with at least one reception ... **TE Kevin Haplea's** touchdown catch against USF marked the Penn State transfer's first score as a Seminole ... **PK Dustin Hopkins** now has 377 career points to rank second on the ACC's all-time list.



Wake Forest

Junior LBs **Mike Olson** and **Justin Jackson** both posted career-highs for tackles against Duke ... Olson finished with a game-high 13 tackles including one for a loss and a quarterback hurry ... Jackson had 12 tackles and his team-leading third sack of the season ... Olson is the team's leading tackler on the season with 44, while Jackson is right behind him with 42 ... **WR Michael Campanaro**, who entered Saturday's game as the ACC's leading receiver, suffered a hand injury in the first quarter and missed the rest of the game ... Campanaro finished with two catches for eight yards ... **WR Terence Davis** finished the Duke game with a six receptions for a career-high 100 yards ... **FB Tommy Bohanon** had a pair of touchdown grabs vs. Duke, marking the first multi-touchdown game of his career ... Wake's 98-yard touchdown drive in the third quarter against Duke tied for third longest in school history ... The Deacons had a school-record 99-yard touchdown drive vs Navy in 1995 and matched that against Western Carolina in 1991.

Duke has scored 185 points through the first five games of the season, marking the highest five-game total to open a season in school history ... The old mark was 175 points, set in 1945 ... The Cavaliers had 625 yards of total offense ... The last time the Cavaliers had over 600 yards in total offense was when they put up 643 against Duke in the 2010 game ... The Cavaliers are 13-of-16 in the red zone this year (11 touchdowns, two field goals) ... The 73-yard touchdown pass from **QB Michael Rocco** to **WR Khalek Shepherd** in Saturday's game was the longest offensive play of the season for Virginia ... Rocco moved into 10th place on the UVA career passing list with 3,930 yards ... Backup **QB Phillip Sims** threw for a career-high 166 yards ... **RB Perry Jones'** 36-yard pass to **WR Tim Smith** against Louisiana Tech was the second pass and the second touchdown pass of his career ... Jones threw a 37-yard TD pass to Smith last year at Miami ... Jones' 100 receiving yards vs. Louisiana Tech were a career high, topping his previous high of 90 against Auburn in 2011.

Junior **QB Stephen Morris** registered 271 first-quarter passing yards en route to a Miami- and ACC-record 566 passing yards in Saturday's 44-37 win over NC State, breaking the previous UM record held by Gino Torretta (485 vs. San Diego State, 1991) ... Only three FBS players have thrown for more yards in a quarter since 2004 ... Morris' 287 yards in the first half were more than his total in three of the first four games this season ... Sophomore **WR Phillip Dorsett** reeled in a career-high 191 yards and two TDs on seven catches against NC State following his 184 yards on nine catches at Georgia Tech for back-to-back 100-yard games ... Dorsett's 191 yards are the third-most single-game receiving yards in UM history ... In the last two weeks, Dorsett has racked up 375 receiving yards ... In the first 15 games of his career, Dorsett had recorded 236 total reception yards ... With 651 yards of total offense against NC State, the Canes have recorded more than 400 yards of offense in three straight games ... The 651 yards are third-most in UM history, trailing 689 vs. UCLA in 1998 and 655 vs. Boston College in 1984.

LB Jack Tyler's 53 tackles are tied with LB Nick Clancy of Boston College for first in the ACC ... Tyler's 10.6 tackles per game ranks third in the conference and 14th nationally ... The Hokies rank first among in ACC teams in red zone defense, allowing 11 scores (eight touchdowns, three field goals) in 17 chances for a percentage of 64.7 ... Buoyed by his 94-yard punt return earlier in the season, **DB Kyshoen Jarrett** continues to lead the conference and ranks third nationally in punt return average at 25.1 per game ... **QB Logan Thomas** enters this Saturday's ACC road game at North Carolina ranked eighth in the conference in total offense ... Thomas has thrown for 1,093 yards and rushed for 129 ... Virginia Tech has scored in a school-record 222 straight football games, beginning with a win over Miami on Sept. 23, 1995 ... The streak began after a 16-0 loss to Cincinnati ... The previous school record was 66 straight games (1970-76) ... During its current streak, Tech has scored 13 or more points in all but 10 games.

Miami's Stephen Morris Puts Up Historic Numbers in Miami Victory Over NC State

Miami junior QB Stephen Morris (Miami, Fla.) set ACC single-game records for most passing yards and most yards of total offense when he threw for 566 yards and totalled 568



yards in the Hurricane's 44-37 win over NC State.

Morris, who completed 26 of 49 passes for 566 yards and 5 touchdowns with only one interception, has now thrown for 1,002 yards and 7 TDs in his last two games. Former Wake Forest QB Rusty LaRue threw for

1,046 yards against Georgia Tech and NC State in 1995.

On Sept. 29 at Georgia Tech, the Miami junior threw for a then-career high 436 yards in the Hurricanes' 42-36 win.

■ In the first quarter of the NC State game, Morris threw for 271 yards, the fourth-most by a player in the NCAA's FBS since 2004.

■ The 271 passing yards in the first quarter are more yards than Morris had thrown in any of his first three games this year.

■ Morris' 21.77 yards to completion average for the day is the 4th best in the nation this year and the highest for an ACC quarterback since 2008.

■ Morris' total of 1,635 passing yards this year exceeded his career total of passing yards (1,523) entering this season.

■ Morris now ranks 10th nationally in the NCAA's FBS in passing yards per game (327.00); 4th nationally in total passing yards (1,635) and 13th nationally in total offense per game. (333.20)

Clemson's Rodriguez Nominated for Discover Orange Bowl-FWAA Courage Award



Clemson's Daniel Rodriguez is the first weekly nominee for the 2012 Discover Orange Bowl-FWAA Courage Award, to be announced at the end of the season. Rodriguez, a redshirt freshman receiver from Stafford, Va., is playing for the Tigers after earning a Purple Heart and Bronze Star in Afghanistan.

Rodriguez, 24, was wounded Oct. 3, 2009, during a battle near Kamdesh, Afghanistan, while serving in the U.S. Army. Combat Outpost Keating, in a mountainous region near the Pakistan border, was ambushed by nearly 300 Taliban insurgents. Eight Americans were killed; 22 were injured. Rodriguez was shot and wounded in the leg, neck and shoulder.



Once recovered and discharged from the military, Rodriguez kept a promise to his friend, Pfc. Kevin Thompson, who was killed during the initial moments of the attack. Rodriguez had told Thompson if he made it home from Afghanistan, he would find a way to play college football.

After enrolling at Germanna Community College, he began training for football. He sent a video of himself catching passes, spliced with video he'd shot during combat, to four-year schools. Clemson coach Dabo Swinney offered Rodriguez a spot on the team.

Rodriguez enlisted in the Army after high school shortly after the unexpected death his father, also an Army veteran. He served

from 2006-10, spending 18 months in Iraq and a year in Afghanistan. He is attending Clemson on the GI Bill.

The 5-8, 175-pounder has played on kickoff coverage in the Tigers' first four games, and saw action at receiver against Furman and Ball State.

"You always dream of that second chance to play football again," Rodriguez said. "I'm in that position. I have that second opportunity that so many people have said, 'I wish I could get one more shot.' Well, now it is my shot. I have that opportunity."

For the seventh straight year, the Football Writers Association of America and the Discover Orange Bowl will announce a weekly nominee each Wednesday during the season. A blue-ribbon panel will determine the winner from all of the nominees. The winner of the Discover Orange Bowl-FWAA Courage Award will be announced in December and be presented with the trophy during the week of the 2013 Discover BCS National Championship Game.

Former Clemson football player Ray Ray McElrathbey was presented the award in 2006.

Florida State's Dustin Hopkins Seeks ACC Scoring Marks, Groza Honors



With 12 points on three field goals and 3 PATs versus South Florida, Florida State senior PK Dustin Hopkins, a 2011 finalist for the Lou Groza Award and a 2010 Groza semifinalist, now has 377 career points and has moved into 2nd place on the ACC's career scoring list, passing former FSU standout Xavier Beitia (375). Hopkins has made 69 of 91 FG attempts (.758) and 170 of 175 PATs. His string of consecutive PATs without a miss ended against Savannah State at 145, the 6th longest such streak in NCAA history. His 69 career field goals place him 4th on the ACC career list. He needs 12 more three-pointers to break former Maryland standout Nick Novak's ACC career mark (80). Hopkins now needs just 17 points to break the ACC career scoring mark of 393 points, set during the 2001-04 seasons by Novak. Florida State's school record is also 393 points, set by Derek Schmidt during the 1984-87 seasons,

which predates the Seminoles' ACC membership.



Florida State's EJ Manuel Joins Heisman Winners With Game Against Clemson



Florida State senior QB EJ Manuel turned in one of the best quarterback performances in ACC history on Sept. 22 in the Seminoles' 49-37 win over 10th-ranked Clemson. Manuel completed 27 of 35 passes (77 percent) for a career-high 380 yards and 3 TDs and ran for another 102 yards on 12 carries against the Tigers. Manuel's performance fueled

a Seminole comeback that saw FSU overcome a 28-14 Clemson third-quarter lead. The effort marked:

- The first time an FSU player had rushed for 100 or more yards and thrown for 300 or more yards in the same game since Heisman Trophy winner Charlie Ward managed the feat against Maryland in 1992.

- The 482 total yards against 10th-ranked Clemson, were the third-most by an ACC player against a nationally-ranked opponent. FSU's other Heisman Trophy winner, Chris Weinke, totalled 509 yards in 2000 against then 10th-ranked Clemson in Tallahassee.

- Manuel now has completed 425 of 630 passes in his career, a completion percentage of .675, which if he maintains for the rest of the year, would be an ACC career mark.

Florida State's EJ Manuel Named Davey O'Brien National QB of the Week; Maxwell Award National Player of the Week

After guiding Florida State to a 49-37 come-from-behind victory over Clemson on Sept. 29, EJ Manuel was named the Davey O'Brien Quarterback of the Week and the Maxwell Award National Offensive Player of the Week.

The 6-5, 240-pound signal caller had a night to remember, successfully completing 27 of 35 passes for a career-high 380 yards while rushing for an additional 102 yards. Manuel was the first Seminole quarterback to surpass 300 passing yards and 100 rushing yards since 1993 Davey O'Brien Winner Charlie Ward did it in 1992.

"They were mixing up looks and bringing in blitzes from everywhere and he made plays when he had to," said Florida State head coach Jimbo Fisher. "But I thought he was extremely selfless and understood how to win. I was very proud of him."

Duke's Sean Renfree Piling Up 300-Yard Games

When Duke junior QB Sean Renfree (Scottsdale, Ariz.) threw for 314 yards in the Blue Devils' 38-14 win over Memphis on Sept. 22, he topped the 300-yard mark in passing yards for the 9th game of his 27-game career as a starter. Renfree leads all active ACC players in most 300-yard performances and is tied for the 9th-highest total in ACC history. NC State's Philip Rivers holds the ACC record with 18. In 34 total games, six of which he was in a reserve role, Renfree has averaged 224.5 yards per game passing.

Renfree has thrown for 7,634 yards in his career, currently good enough for 20th place on the ACC career list and 5th on Duke's career passing list.

His 722 career completions ranks him in 8th place in the ACC's career Top 10. Boston College's Matt Ryan currently sits in 9th place, having completed 772 passes during his three years in the ACC (2005-07).

Florida State's **EJ Manuel** has completed 67.5 percent of his passes and currently has the best career mark in league history. But North Carolina junior **Bryn Renner** is right behind, having completed 66.8 percent of his passes. In all, six ACC quarterbacks have completed better than 60 percent of their passes for their careers, while nine have completed 57 percent or better. Manuel ranks 5th in the NCAA among active players in career completion percentage with Renner 7th and Duke's Sean Renfree 12th.

Vernon also holds the longest current streak in the NCAA for catching a pass. Vernon has caught a pass in 40 straight games--every game of his college career.

ACC Biletnikoff Candidates Amidon, Dorsett, Hopkins All Top 190 Receiving Yards

For the first time in its history, the ACC had four wide receivers top the 180-yard mark in a game in receiving yardage on the same day, with three of them over 190 yards.

Boston College junior WR **Alex Amidon** (Greenfield, Mass.) had 193 yards (24.1 avg.) on 8 catches, including TD catches of 31 and 42 yards in the Eagles' 45-31 loss to Clemson. Clemson

junior WR **DeAndre "Nuk" Hopkins** (Central, S.C.) countered that for the Tigers, by piling up 197 yards on 11 catches and a 35-yard TD against the Eagles at Chestnut Hill. In Miami, sophomore WR **Phillip Dorsett** (Ft. Lauderdale, Fla.) also had a career day, carrying 7 receptions a total of 191 yards--an eye-popping average of 27.3 yards per catch, including the game-winning play, a 62-yard bomb with 19 seconds remaining in Miami's 44-47 victory. Dorsett's teammate, sophomore WR **Rashawn Scott** (Melbourne, Fla.) grabbed 6 passes for 180 yards (30.0 avg.) and TD catches of 13 and 76 yards to round out the quartet.



Tech's Tevin Washington Ranks 4th Nationally In Scoring

After scoring a total of 10 touchdowns against Virginia, Miami and Middle Tennessee, Georgia Tech QB **Tevin Washington** (Wetumpka, Ala.) ranks 4th nationally in scoring, averaging 13.6 points a game. Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer Becomes NCAA FBS Active Career Leader in Wins

Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer is now the leading active head coach in the NCAA's FBS in career victories with a total of 254 triumphs in his 32-year coaching career. Beamer is currently in 8th place on the all-time career wins list for the FBS, and trails former Nebraska head coach Tom Osborne (255) by one triumph and former BYU head coach LaVell Edwards (257) by three wins. Georgia Tech head coach Paul Johnson ranks 13th on the active FBS list with 142 career wins and NC State's Tom O'Brien is in 21st place (111). Former Florida State head coach Bobby Bowden, who retired after the 2009 season, finished his career in 2nd place on the all-time list with 389 victories, though the NCAA recognizes only 377 triumphs due to NCAA sanctions. With the NCAA sanctions levied against Penn State, Bowden is now the NCAA FBS all-time leader.

Five Current ACC Head Football Coaches Have UVa Ties

When **Al Golden** joined the ACC as Miami's head coach for the 2011 season, he became the fifth former UVa assistant or graduate assistant coach to be a current head football coach in the Atlantic Coast Conference. Golden joined Boston College's **Frank Spaziani**, NC State's **Tom O'Brien**, Virginia's **Mike London** and Wake Forest's **Jim Grobe** as current ACC head coaches who have spent time as assistants or graduate assistants for the Cavaliers. Golden spent four seasons (2001-04) at Virginia as defensive coordinator under Al Groh. The Eagles' Spaziani served as an assistant coach at Virginia under then head coach George Welsh for nine seasons (1982-90), the last five as defensive coordinator. O'Brien also served under Welsh at UVa, spending 15 seasons (1982-96) there including the last six as offensive coordinator. London served two terms at UVa under Groh, serving as defensive line coach in 2001-04 and again in 2006-07 as defensive coordinator and defensive line coach. London and Golden also served as assistants to Tom O'Brien at Boston College. Wake Forest head coach Jim Grobe, a 1975 Virginia graduate, who just completed his 11th season with the Deacons, lettered two seasons at UVa as a middle guard and linebacker and also spent one year as a graduate assistant coach (1975) under then Virginia head coach Sonny Randle.





Wake Forest's Jim Grobe Latest To Join 100-Win Club

Wake Forest head coach Jim Grobe is the fourth active ACC coach with 100 career wins. Grobe now has a record of 104-102-1 career mark for 18 seasons, the last 12 with the Deacons. NC State's Tom O'Brien has 111 wins, having accumulated 75 of them in a 10-year stay at Boston College. Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer (254), the nation's leading active coach in the FBS in wins, and Georgia Tech's Paul Johnson (142) are the other ACC coaches over the century mark in career triumphs.

North Carolina's Larry Fedora Makes UNC/ACC Coaching Debut

North Carolina made his debut as head coach a successful one, leading the Tar Heels to a 62-0 win over in-state foe Elon on Sept. 1. Fedora, who led Southern Mississippi to the 2011 Conference USA championship last year, is now the 35th head coach in UNC history and its 11th since joining the ACC in 1953. Fedora compiled a record of 34-19 in four years as head coach at Southern Miss.

NC State's Tom O'Brien Latest To Coach at Multiple ACC Schools

NC State's Tom O'Brien is the fifth coach in Atlantic Coast Conference history to have served as a head coach of two ACC schools. O'Brien coached at Boston College from 1997 through 2006, which included the school's first two seasons (2005-06) of ACC membership. Jim Tatum was the first ACC coach at two schools; he first coached at North Carolina in 1942, then at Maryland from 1947-55 before returning to UNC beginning in 1956 until his death in 1958. Others who have coached at two ACC schools include Bobby Ross (Md, GT), Al Groh (WF, UVa) and Bill Dooley (UNC, WF).



Dooley actually coached at three current ACC schools as he spent nine seasons at Virginia Tech before the Hokies joined the ACC, in between stints at UNC and Wake Forest, winning 162 games in his career. Dooley and Ross are the only coaches in ACC history to be named ACC Coach of the Year at more than one school. Others who have coached at more than one current ACC school, though not necessarily when they were in the ACC, include John Heisman, who coached at both Georgia Tech and Clemson.

In just his third season as head coach at Florida State, head coach **Jimbo Fisher** has joined some select company among ACC football coaches. Fisher has compiled a 24-8 record (.750) just four games into his third season. His winning percentage ranks him 6th among all ACC head coaches in their third season, ahead of such figures as Clemson's Danny Ford, Maryland's Ralph Friedgen and Georgia Tech's Bobby Ross. The best mark recorded by an ACC head coach in his first two years in the league was by Fisher's predecessor at FSU, Bobby Bowden, who posted a 33-3-1 record. Maryland's Jim Tatum was 27-4-1 (.859) in his first three years with Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer third at 31-8-0 (.859).

Clemson's Memorial Stadium Is Home Sweet Home for Tiger's Dabo Swinney



Clemson head coach Dabo Swinney has enjoyed coaching in the cozy and imposing confines of the Tigers' home field, also known as Death Valley. In his first four seasons as head coach of the Tigers, Swinney's teams have won 12 of the first 14 home ACC games, a winning percentage of .857. That stacks up pretty well with some of the great names in ACC coaching. Swinney's winning percentage ties him with Maryland's Jerry Claiborne for 3rd among ACC head coaches. Another former Tiger coach, Ken Hatfield, has the highest percentage, posting a 12-1-1 mark in four seasons (.893). Legendary Florida State coach Bobby Bowden won more ACC home games than any other coach, with 62 triumphs in his 18 years in the league. His winning percentage of .861, is second-best. Bowden's successor at Florida State, Jimbo Fisher is on a pretty good pace himself, having won six of his first eight ACC home games. Four Clemson coaches rank in the Top 10 including Hatfield (1st), Swinney (tie for 3rd), Danny Ford (7th) and the legendary Frank Howard (tied for 9th).

ACC Divisional Tiebreaker

If more than one team in the same division is tied for the best winning percentage in its Conference games, then, in order to determine the Divisional Champions, the procedures listed below will be followed:

Two-Team Tie:

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Records of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall record. (Divisional) Conference record and preceding through the division. Multiple ties within the division broken from first-to-last.
4. Overall record versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined record vs. all non-divisional teams.
6. Record versus common non-divisional teams based on their order of finish (divisional and non-divisional) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based on their order of finish within their division.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking in the Bowl Championship Series Standings following the end of regular season game shall be the divisional representative in the ACC Championship Game.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw.

Three-Team (or More) Team Tie

(Once tie has been reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaker format is used.)

1. Combined head-to-head record among teams.
2. Records of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall (divisional or conference) record, and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken first to last.
4. Overall record for non-divisional teams.
5. Combined record versus all common non-divisional teams.
6. Record versus common non-divisional with the best overall Conference (divisional and non-divisional record) and proceeding through the other common non-divisional teams based on their order of finish within the division.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking in the BCS Standings following the conclusion of regular season games shall be the divisional representative in the ACC Championship Game, unless the second of the tied teams is ranked within five-or-fewer places of the highest ranked tied team. In this case, the head-to-head results of the top two ranked tied teams shall determine the representative in the ACC Championship Game.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw.

2012 ACC Bowl Selection

Bowl Championship Series

The winner of the Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game will be selected to play in the Bowl Championship Series.



Unless the winner of the Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game is ranked No. 1 or No. 2 in the final BCS Standings and plays in the BCS National Championship Game, then the ACC Champion will serve as the host team of the Discover Orange Bowl in Miami, Fla. This year's Discover BCS National Championship Game will be hosted by the Discover Orange Bowl on Jan. 7 in Miami Gardens, Fla. The BCS may also select a second ACC team, if one is eligible for selection (Won at least nine regular season games and is ranked among

the Top 14 in the final BCS Standings), and there is an At-Large berth available and the team is selected by one of the four BCS Bowl Games—Discover Orange (only if the ACC Champion is in the BCS National Championship Game), Allstate Sugar, Tostitos Fiesta and the Rose Bowl Game presented by Vizio.

After the BCS selections, then the selection order is:

1. Chick-fil-A Bowl, Atlanta
2. Russell Athletic Bowl, Orlando
3. Hyundai Sun Bowl, El Paso, Tex.
4. Belk Bowl, Charlotte, N.C.
5. Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl, Nashville, Tenn.
6. Advocare V100 Independence Bowl, Shreveport, La.
7. The Military Bowl Presented by Northrop Grumman, Washington, D.C.
8. Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl, San Francisco, Calif.

*If Pac-12 or Navy is unable to fill obligation and ACC has an available team

Conditions:

1. The runner-up of the ACC Championship Game, provided, is guaranteed not to fall further than the Hyundai Sun Bowl. The Sun Bowl will select the ACC Championship Game runner-up in any year that team is available to them.

2. Otherwise, if the bowl does not select the team available with the best Conference record, then it must choose a team that is within one conference win of the team (The "One-Win Rule") with the best conference record (ie. 5-3 to 6-2), The bowl may take a team that has more than a one game difference, only if the team is ranked more than five spaces above the team with the best Conference record in the final BCS Standings.

3. If, after all bowl selections have been made, and the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl has an opening due to the inability of either the Pac-12 Conference or Army to provide a team, and the ACC has an available, eligible team, then the ACC will send a team to the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl

Selection Time Frame

The Bowl Championship Series will announce its selections on the BCS ESPN Selection Show on Sunday, December 2. In conjunction with the BCS selections, each Atlantic Coast Conference affiliated bowl game will make their selections in the order specified above. The ACC, the Bowls and individual schools will announce the selections after all selections are completed on Sunday.

The ACC and The Bowl Championship Series

The Atlantic Coast Conference and the BCS

The Atlantic Coast Conference has been a member of the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) since its inception for the 1998 season. ACC Commissioner John Swofford, is the only Commissioner to twice serve as BCS Coordinator, having done so in the 2000 and 2001 seasons and again in the 2008 and 2009 campaigns, as the ACC successfully administered the BCS on two separate occasions. Swofford is also the last Commissioner to serve as BCS Coordinator. In 2009, the BCS group named longtime college administrator Bill Hancock to serve as the first Executive Director of the Bowl Championship Series. Hancock has since assumed most of the duties previously handled by the coordinator. Prior to being named Executive Director, Hancock served four years as the Administrator for the BCS.

Heading into its 15th year of determining the National Championship in college football, the **Bowl Championship Series (BCS)** is a five-game arrangement that is designed to match the two top-rated teams and to create competitive match ups among eight other highly regarded teams in four other games.

The bowl games participating are the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl, the Discover Orange Bowl, the Rose Bowl Game presented by Vizio and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. In addition, the BCS National Championship Game is played at one of the bowl sites, this year at Sun Life Stadium in Miami Gardens Fla., on January 7, 2013.

The term "BCS conference" frequently is used incorrectly. Actually, all 11 NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) conferences are "BCS conferences" because the BCS arrangement is managed by the commissioners of the 11 NCAA FBS conferences and the director of athletics at the University of Notre Dame. The conferences are Atlantic Coast, Big East, Big Ten, Big 12, Conference USA, Mid-American, Mountain West, Sun Belt, Pacific-12, the Southeastern and the Western Athletic.

The conference commissioners and the Notre Dame athletics director make decisions regarding all BCS issues, in consultation with an athletics directors advisory group and subject to the approval of a presidential oversight committee whose members represent all 120 NCAA FBS programs.

The BCS games are operated by community-based organizations in each of the host cities. In addition, there are 30 other post-season bowls, which are managed independently by entities in 27 cities around the nation. All bowl games provide meaningful season-ending opportunities for student-athletes.

The BCS is remarkably successful. It maintains and enhances the importance of the regular season and preserves the unique bowl tradition to the benefit of the student-athletes. And it matches the top two teams. Before the creation of the BCS and its predecessors, the Bowl Coalition and Bowl Alliance, the top two teams had met in a bowl game only eight times in the previous 56 seasons. They have met in each of the last 14 seasons by BCS standards, and 11 of the last 14 seasons according to the Associated Press poll. The 2012 regular season

BCS Standings

The BCS Standings are composed of three elements that are weighted equally: the USA Today Coaches poll, 2) the Harris poll, and 3) the average of six computer poll rankings. The highest and lowest computer ranking is discarded each week with the computer average based on the remaining four rankings. The BCS Standings are compiled and released by the National Football Foundation eight times during the season, beginning this year on Sunday, October 16 and ending on BCS Selection Sunday, December 4.

(2013 bowl games) is the third year of the current four-year television agreement with ESPN, which will televise all five BCS games.

Six conferences (ACC, Big East, Big 12, Big Ten, SEC and Pac-12) have earned annual automatic qualification for the 2010-13 seasons by virtue of contracts to host the bowl games, and/or by having met a four-year metric based on competitive results (The ACC champion plays in the Discover Orange Bowl, the Big Ten and Pac-12 champs in the Rose Bowl presented by Vizio, Big 12 in the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl and SEC in the Allstate Sugar Bowl). Additionally, the highest-ranked champion of Conference USA, Mid-American, Mountain West, Sun Belt or Western Athletic conferences will be guaranteed a slot in a BCS game if that team is

Playoff Coming In 2014-15


On June 26, 2012, the BCS Presidential Oversight Committee agreed to launch a four-team playoff beginning with the 2014-15 season. The new format will continue at least 12 years, through the 2025-26 season. The semifinals will be rotated among six bowl games and will be played either New Year's Eve or New Year's Day. The championship game, to be managed by the 11 conferences and rotated among neutral sites every year, will be on a Monday at least six days after the last semifinal game. A selection committee will rank the teams for the playoff.

ranked 12th or higher in the final BCS standings, 16th or higher if its ranking is higher than that of a champion from one of the six conferences with automatic qualification. Other teams are eligible to be selected at large by a bowl game if they finish among the top 14.

The champions of the Big Ten and the Pac-12 will play in the Rose Bowl if they do not qualify for the National Championship Game. Other "regional consideration" tie-ins include the SEC champion in the Sugar Bowl, the ACC champion in the Orange Bowl and the Big 12 champion in the Fiesta Bowl if those teams are not ranked No. 1 or No. 2 in the final BCS Standings.

Bill Hancock, Executive Director

Longtime athletics administrator Bill Hancock was named the first Executive Director of the Bowl Championship Series on November 17, 2009 and, in doing so, achieved a unique double-double at the upper echelon of intercollegiate athletics. He was the first full-time director of the NCAA Final Four and is now the first executive director of the BCS. Hancock served for 13 years as director of the NCAA's Division I Men's Basketball Championship--the three-week March Madness event that culminates at the Final Four. After a family tragedy, he retired in 2002 and for three years was the tournament's media coordinator on a consulting basis before being named BCS administrator in October of 2005. He is a 1972 journalism graduate of the University of Oklahoma and worked in sports information at his alma mater and also on the staff of the Big Eight Conference before being named director of the Final Four in 1989.

The ACC & Overtime

When Georgia Tech and Miami ended regulation tied at 36-36, it marked the 60th game featuring an ACC team that has had to go to extra sessions. Of the 60 overtime contests, a large portion of them--26--have been played in the month of September. Games have gone into overtime for ACC teams a total of 13 times in November, while 12 have been played in October, three in August, four in December and two in January (2006 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl). Of the 60 overtime contests, 30 have been ACC games while 30 nonconference games have gone into overtime. The home team has a 34-19 advantage in the 53 games played on campus. The team which wins the toss has a 32-28 record. Forty-seven of the games were decided in the first overtime with nine games in double overtime and four in triple overtime.
