FOR OPENERS

- UVA meets Austin Peay for the first time.
- The game is part of the NIT Season Tip-Off.
- UVA improved 19-1 in its last 20 season-opening games.

GETTING DEFENSIVE

- UVA held its first 2017-18 opponent to fewer than 50 points with its 60-48 win over UNCG.
- The Cavaliers are 65-2 when limiting their opponents to fewer than 50 points under head coach Tony Bennett.
- In 2016-17, Virginia led the nation in scoring defense (56.4 ppg) for the third time under Bennett.
- Bennett-coached teams have led the nation in scoring defense four times (2008-09, 2013-14, 2014-15, 2016-17) and finished in the top-five nationally in eight of 11 seasons.
- Bennett-coached teams are 90-3 when holding opponents to fewer than 50 points during his 12-year coaching career.

LAST TIME OUT

- Virginia opened the season with a 60-48 win over UNCG on Nov. 10.
- Kyle Guy tallied a game-high 16 points, made a career-best eight free throws and added a career-high three steals.
- Devon Hall added 13 points and six rebounds, while Isaiah Wilkins chipped in nine points, eight rebounds, three blocks and two steals.
- UVA shot 42.9 percent from the floor and went 20-of-24 (83.3%) from the free throw line.
- The Cavaliers limited UNCG to 29.3% percent shooting (15-of-51) and 15.4 percent from 3-point range (4-of-26).
- UVA allowed 16 offensive rebounds and committed 13 turnovers.

ALL-TIME AGAINST THE OHIO VALLEY CONFERENCE

- Virginia is 4-1 all-time against current Ohio Valley Conference members (2-0 vs. Belmont, 1-0 vs. UT Martin, 1-0 vs. Tennessee State and 0-1 vs. Eastern Kentucky).
- UVA meets an Ohio Valley Conference for the first time since defeating Belmont 79-67 in the round 64 in the 2015 NCAA Tournament.
- Virginia has not played Austin Peay, Eastern Illinois, Jacksonville State, Morehead State, Murray State, SIUE, Southeast Missouri and Tennessee Tech.

THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME

- Virginia is 151-40 (.791), including a 1-0 mark in 2017-18, in 12 seasons at John Paul Jones Arena.
- West Virginia ended UVA's JPI-record, 24-game home winning streak on Dec. 3, 2016.
- The Cavaliers finished undefeated at home (15-0) in 2015-16.
- UVA is 113-24 (.825), including a 78-9 (.897) mark the past six seasons, at home under head coach Tony Bennett.
- Virginia is 41-4 in ACC home games over the past five seasons.
- UVA has won 11 or more home games for eight straight seasons.

VIRGINIA HEAD COACH TONY BENNETT

- Head coach Tony Bennett has a 189-83 (.695) mark in nine seasons at Virginia and 258-116 (.690) career mark in 12 seasons overall.
- Bennett has guided UVA to four straight NCAA Tournament appearances and has led UVA to a school-record five straight seasons with 23 or more wins.
- Bennett has led UVA to a school-record five straight seasons with 11 or more ACC wins.
- Bennett guided UVA to a school-record 89 wins over three seasons from 2014-16, eclipsing 88 wins from 1981-83.
- Bennett has led the Cavaliers to six consecutive postseason tournaments (NCAA in 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017 and NIT in 2013).
- In 2015-16, Bennett led UVA to its third consecutive NCAA Tournament and first NCAA Elite Eight appearance since 1995 with 29 wins.
- Bennett was named 2015 USBWA National Coach of the Year and ACC Coach of the Year after leading Virginia to a school-record tying 30 wins and its second consecutive ACC regular-season title.
- Bennett led the Cavaliers to 30 wins in back-to-back seasons (2014-2015) for the first time in school history.
- In 2013-14, Bennett guided UVA to its first ACC regular season and tournament championship (first since 1976) in the same season.
- Bennett is one of 28 current Division I head coaches who played in the NBA.
- UVA is 101-33 (.754) in non-conference action, 88-50 (.638) in ACC play and 113-24 (.825) at home under Tony Bennett.

BENNETT NAMES CAPTAINS FOR FIRST TIME

- Virginia head coach Tony Bennett named Devon Hall, Isaiah Wilkins and Jack Salt tri-captains for the 2017-18 season.
- The announcement of Hall, Wilkins and Salt marked the first time in Bennett's 11-year head coaching career where he officially named team captains.
- Hall, Wilkins and Salt have combined to play 251 career games and make 150 career starts.

UVA RECEIVING VOTES IN PRESEASON RANKINGS

- UVA received votes in the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches' preseason polls.
- The Cavaliers had been ranked in 64 consecutive AP polls since Feb. 3, 2014.
- UVA was ranked in the top 10 in the preseason rankings in each of the past three seasons (2014-16).
- Last season, the Cavaliers ranked No. 24 in the final AP poll and received votes in the USA Today Coaches' poll.

ABOUT THE 2017-18 SCHEDULE

- Seven of Virginia's opponents are ranked in the AP Top-25 preseason poll (Duke, North Carolina, West Virginia, Miami, Notre Dame, Louisville and Seton Hall), while three (Rhode Island, Virginia Tech and Wisconsin) received votes.
- The Cavaliers will play 17 games against 2017 NCAA Tournament teams: home games against North Carolina, Notre Dame, Louisville, Virginia Tech and Wisconsin; road contests at Duke, North Carolina, West Virginia, Louisville, Florida State, Wake Forest and VCU; and neutral-site tilts against Vanderbilt and either Seton Hall or Rhode Island in the NIT Season Tip-Off in Brooklyn, N.Y.
- Four opponents (Clemson, Georgia Tech, Monmouth, UNC Greensboro and Syracuse) participated in the 2017 National Invitation Tournament.

ZAY PAVES THE WAY

- Senior Isaiah Wilkins leads UVA in rebounding (8.9 rpg) and blocked shots (3.0 bpg).
- In 2016-17, the All-ACC Defensive team honoree led the team in rebounding (6.0 rpg), blocked shots (43) and steals (33), becoming the first Cavalier since Travis Watson in 2002-03 to lead the team in those three categories.
- Wilkins had a career-high 15 points vs. Virginia Tech (2/1/17) and four steals vs. Miami (2/20/17).
- He recorded two double-doubles (13 points, 11 rebounds and career-high tying five blocks vs. Louisville and 10 points, 10 rebounds and four steals vs. Miami).
- He had a career-high five blocked shots vs. Wake Forest (1/8/17) and matched a career best with 13 rebounds at Clemson (1/14/17).

HALL OF A PLAYER

- Redshirt senior Devon Hall is second on the team in scoring (13.0 ppg) and rebounding (6.0 rpg).
- In 2016-17, Hall averaged career highs in points (8.4), rebounds (4.4), 3-point percentage (37.2%), free throw percentage (77.6%) and minutes (27.4).
- Hall, who has started 55 consecutive games dating back to last season, has scored in double figures in 20 career games.
- He was named to the 2016-17 All-ACC Academic Team.

THIS GUY GETS BUCKETS

- Sophomore Kyle Guy leads Virginia in scoring at 16 points per game.
- Guy is shooting 50% (48-of-96) from 3-point range during his two-year career.
- Guy's 7.5 points per game average in his rookie season under head coach Tony Bennett ranked higher than former UVA standouts Malcolm Brogdon (6.7 ppg) and London Perrantes (5.5 ppg).
- Guy scored 10+ points in 12 games and scored a career-high 20 points against Pitt (3/8/17) and Grambling State (11/22/16), and 19 points at NC State (2/25/17).
- Guy shot a team-high 49.5 percent from 3-point range as a freshman.

'HOO ARE THE NEW GUY(S)?

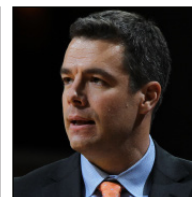
- Virginia welcomes freshmen Marco Anthony (San Antonio, Texas/Holmes), Francesco Badocchi (Milan, Italy/Bishop Miege, Kan.) and walk-on Austin Katstra (Charlottesville, Va./Albemarle) to this year's team.
- Anthony earned unanimous All-Conference first-team honors after averaging 25.5 points, 10.2 rebounds and 3.7 assists as a high school senior in 2016-17.
- Badocchi averaged 13.9 points, 5.9 rebounds and 2.7 blocks as Bishop Miege captured its second straight Kansas Class-4A Division I basketball championship in 2016-17.
- Badocchi earned state tournament MVP honors after tallying 21 points in the Stags' state final win over McPherson.
- Katstra was named 2016-17 Virginia 5A State Player of the Year after averaging 21 points and 10 rebounds for Albemarle High School.
- Katstra's father, Dirk (1988-91), and grandfather, Richard Katstra (1962-64), played basketball at UVA.
- Dirk Katstra is in his 22nd year as executive director of the Virginia Athletics Foundation.

VIRGINIA PICKED 6TH IN THE ACC

- Virginia was picked to finish sixth in the ACC preseason poll.
- The Cavaliers, who were picked third and finished tied for fifth last season, have finished at or higher than their predicted finish in eight seasons of the last nine seasons.
- Duke is the preseason favorite, followed by North Carolina, Notre Dame, Miami, Louisville, Virginia, Virginia Tech, Florida State, Georgia Tech, Syracuse, Wake Forest, NC State, Clemson, Boston College and Pittsburgh.

THE ELECTRIC 70s

- Virginia is 95-6 when scoring at least 70 points under Tony Bennett and 94-77 when scoring under 70 points.

2017-18 Opponents in Bold

HOLDING FOES UNDER 50

- Virginia is 65-2 when holding opponents under 50 points in the Tony Bennett era (1-0 in 2017-18).
- Bennett-coached teams are 90-3 when holding opponents to fewer than 50 points (25-1 in three years at Washington State).
- UVA held four opponents (St. Francis Brooklyn, Yale, Grambling State and Robert Morris) under 40 points in 2016-17 and is 18-0 under Bennett when limiting foes to 40 or fewer points.

CAVALIERS IN THE NBA

- Justin Anderson (Philadelphia), Malcolm Brogdon (Milwaukee), Joe Harris (Brooklyn) and Mike Scott (Washington) are former Cavaliers who are playing in the NBA this season.
- Brogdon earned NBA Rookie of the Year honors for Milwaukee last season.
- Scott is in his sixth season (first with Washington) and Harris is in his fourth NBA season (second with Brooklyn), while Anderson is in his third season (second with Philadelphia).
- In addition, Dallas head coach Rick Carlisle is a Virginia alum who helped the Cavaliers to their last NCAA Final Four in 1984.
- London Perrantes (2014-17) signed a two-way contract with Cleveland and is currently playing in the G-League for the Canton Charge.

2016-17 IN REVIEW

- No. 24 Virginia (23-11) advanced to its fourth consecutive NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1981-84.
- The Cavaliers advanced to the NCAA Tournament round of 32 for the fourth consecutive season.
- The senior class of 2017, which consisted of London Perrantes, tied a school record with 112 career wins.
- Virginia finished with 11 or more ACC wins for a school-record fifth straight season.
- UVA ranked first nationally in scoring defense (56.4 ppg), third in turnovers per game (9.5), 12th in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.46), 14th in field goal percentage defense (39.8%), 21st in turnover margin (3.1), 30th in scoring margin (+9.7) and 31st in personal fouls per game (16.4).
- UVA has 67 ACC wins from 2013-17, setting a school-record for most league wins during a five-year span.
- UVA secured its school-record sixth straight 20-win season.
- UVA recorded its school-record fifth straight season with 23 or more wins.
- Virginia captured the Emerald Coast Classic with wins over St. Francis Brooklyn, Grambling State, Iowa and Providence.

UVA VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

- In 2016-17, Virginia was 4-6 vs. ranked opponents, including wins against then-No. 6 Louisville, then-No. 14 Notre Dame, then-No. 4 Louisville and then-No. 5 North Carolina.
- In 2016-17, UVA defeated multiple top-5 opponents in a season for the first time since 2000-01 (No. 4 Tennessee, No. 3 Duke, No. 2 UNC).
- UVA's 61-53 road win at then-No. 6 Louisville marked the Cavaliers' first top-10 road win since 2002-03 (86-78 vs. No. 8 Maryland).
- UVA is 26-30 against ranked opponents in the Tony Bennett era.
- UVA is 141-326 vs. ranked opponents since 1953-54.
- UVA is 1-29 all-time vs. No. 1-ranked opponents (86-73 win vs. No. 1 North Carolina on Jan. 30, 1986).
- UVA tied a school mark with eight wins vs. ranked foes in 2015-16.

RECORDS WATCH

- Isaiah Wilkins ranks 11th on UVA's career blocked shots list with 95.
- Wilkins needs three blocks to pass Chris Williams (97 blocks, 1999-02) for 10th on the list.
