TONIGHT'S GAME:

- The Cavaliers look to advance to their fifth ACC final as they meet Virginia Tech
- It is the fourth time in the past six games UVa has played a top-five opponent

SERIES HISTORY:

- UVa leads 17-2-1 overall (UVa leads 1-0-1 in Cary)
- Virginia has won the last five games in the series, by a combined score of 18-0
- 3rd meeting in ACC Tournament (UVa won 8-0 in 2004 QF, VT advanced in PKs in 2008 SF after a 1-1 tie)

THE FIRST MEETING:

- #1 Virginia defeated #5 Virginia Tech 2-0 on Oct. 31 in the regular season finale
- Amber Fry and Makenzy Doniak scored for the Cavaliers
- It was the first all-time top-five matchup between the schools in any sport

ACC TOURNAMENT HISTORY:

- Virginia has an all-time record of 16-17-8 in the ACC Tournament
- UVa is 11-6-7 at the tournament during the Steve Swanson era
- The Cavaliers won the ACC Tournament in 2004 and 2012
- Virginia is 7-5-3 in ACC Tournament games played in Cary

HOOS AIM FOR ACC CHAMPIONSHIP:

- UVa is looking to be the first team to repeat as ACC Champion since North Carolina won five straight titles (2005-09)
- UVa seeks to be the first No. 1 seed to win the ACC Tournament since 2008

PERFECTION IN THE REGULAR SEASON:

- Virginia completed a perfect regular season with a 19-0 record (13-0 ACC)
- First team to have a perfect regular season since Stanford in 2009 (20-0)
- First ACC team to have a perfect regular season since UNC in 2003 (18-0)
- First team to go unbeaten/untied in ACC play since UNC in 2006 (10-0)
- Virginia won its first ACC regular season championship

ON A WINNING STREAK:

- UVa is currently on a 20-game win streak, which is a school record
- The previous school record was a 16-game win streak set in 1990
- The Cavaliers are the nation's only unbeaten and untied team this season
- It's the 10th 20-game streak in ACC history, the first by a team other than UNC

LOOK HOOS NO. 1:

- Virginia remained at No. 1 in all four major polls for the eighth straight week
- The only previous time UVa was No. 1 was in 1990 (three weeks)
- Only one current Cavalier was alive the last time UVa was No. 1, Morgan Stith, who was born during the last week UVa was No. 1 (Oct. 15-21, 1990)

GOALS, GOALS, GOALS!!!:

- Virginia leads the nation in scoring at 3.25 goals per game, scoring a national-best 65 goals
- UVa also leads the nation in assists and points per game
- The Cavaliers scored at least three goals in each of the first seven games of the season, the longest streak of scoring 3+ goals in school history
- Of the 65 goals scored, the Cavaliers have 14 different goal scorers
- The Cavaliers are one shy of the school-record 66 goals they scored in 2012

SCORING STREAK:

- Virginia is one of four schools nationally to have scored a goal in every game this season
- Dating back to last year, UVa has scored in 28 consecutive games, the longest active streak in the nation (next longest, Iowa - 20)

WHILE YOU WERE DISTRACTED BY ALL THE GOALS:

- The Cavalier defense has posted shutouts in eight of the last 10 games
- Virginia leads the ACC with 13 shutouts this season (T-3rd nationally)
- UVa's 0.50 goals against average leads the ACC and ranks 10th nationally

DOMINATING PERFORMANCES:

- Virginia has more goals (65) this season than shots on goal allowed (48)
- That +17 ratio isn't just the highest in the nation, UVa is the only school in positive figures
- The Cavaliers have had more goals than shots on goal allowed in 14 of 20 games this season
- Virginia leads the nation with a +55 goal differential this season

CAVALIERS SHINE IN NON-CONFERENCE SCHEDULE:

- The Cavaliers went undefeated (6-0-0) in non-conference play, outscoring opponents 25-3
- It marked Virginia's first undefeated non-conference slate since 2004 (9-0-0)

ACC-OLADES:

- Virginia had six players named to All-ACC teams
- Morgan Brian, Makenzy Doniak and Emily Sonnett were on the first team
- Brian becomes UVa's seventh 3-time first-team All-ACC selection
- Danielle Colaprico was named to the second team
- Molly Menchel was named to the third team
- Steve Swanson was named ACC Coach of the Year

COMEBACK CAVALIERS:

- Virginia rallied from a deficit to win at BC, Pitt and Duke, the first time in school history with three consecutive come-from-behind wins
- UVa has five come-from-behind wins this season, the most in school history for an entire season, breaking the previous high of four (1997 and 1998)
- The win at Duke marked the sixth time in school history that UVa rallied to win when trailing by two goals (first time since at PSU in 2009 NCAA 2nd rd)

PACK THE HOUSE:

- Virginia had a record women's soccer crowd of 3,894 for the Florida State game on Oct. 27
- It broke the previous record of 2,838 set 17 days earlier during the win over Notre Dame
- This season has produced the five largest crowds in school history
- Virginia ranks fourth nationally in attendance, averaging 2,012 fans per game
- That season average is more than the previous single-game high (2,011)

SWANSON REACHES PAIR OF MILESTONES:

- Virginia head coach Steve Swanson earned his 300th career win on Sept. 19 with the 2-1 victory at Boston College
- Swanson became the 16th Division I coach to join the 300 win club, and the 11th to accululate 300 wins at the Division I level
- He became the 31st NCAA coach (all divisions) to reach the milestone
- On Oct. 6, he posted his 200th win at Virginia with the 3-0 win over Clemson

TRIO OF DOUBLE DIGIT SCORERS:

- With Makenzy Doniak (14 goals), Morgan Brian (12) and Brittany Ratcliffe (11), Virginia is the only team in the nation with three 11-goal scorers
- It is the first time in school history that UVa has had three 10-goal scorers
- UVa is the first ACC team with three double-digit goal scorers since UNC in 2006 (Yael Averbuch-16, Heather O'Reilly-12, Whitney Engen-12)

20-20-20 VISION WITH BRIAN, DOUGLAS & DONIAK:

- Virginia has three players with at least 20 career goals in Morgan Brian (25), Makenzy Doniak (24) and Gloria Douglas (22)
- It is the first time UVa has had three active 20-goal scorers since 1991

BRIAN SHINES IN ACC TOURNAMENT:

- Morgan Brian has five goals and four assists in six ACC Tournament games
- She is Virginia's all-time leading scorer in the tournament with 14 points
- She has the game-winning assist in each of UVa's last four ACCT games

BRIAN DOES DOUBLE DUTY WITH VIRGINIA & USWNT:

- Morgan Brian has earned three caps with the United States Women's National Team this year, as she has played for both UVa and the USWNT this fall
- She has made appearances against South Korea (June 15), Mexico (Sept. 3) and Australia (Oct. 20)
- She scored her first goal for the USWNT on Sept. 3 in the 7-0 victory over Mexico in Washington, D.C.
- She became the first active collegian to score for the USWNT since Alex Morgan in 2010 (as a senior at Cal)
- At age 20, Brian is the youngest USWNT goal-scorer since Christine Nairn (at age 18) scored for the team in 2009
- She is one of three current collegians to have earned a cap with the USWNT (North Carolina's Crystal Dunn, Santa Clara's Julie Johnston)

BRIAN SCORING & SETTING UP GOALS:

- Morgan Brian has double-figure goals (12) and assists (13) this season
- She is just the second Cavalier to reach double figures in both categories in the same season, joining Andrea Rubio (13 goals, 10 assists) in 1990

BRIAN PASSING WITH FLYING COLORS:

- Morgan Brian leads the ACC lead in assists (13)
- She is eighth nationally in assists/game (0.68)
- Brian's 28 career assists already rank fourth in school history
- She is one shy of the UVa single-season assist record of 14

RATCLIFFE, THE SUPER SUB:

- Brittany Ratcliffe has 11 goals this season, 10 of which have come off the bench
- Her 10 goals off the bench is a school record for goals as a substitute for a season, breaking the previous record of six

STEARNS SHINES IN GOAL:

- Morgan Stearns is the first true-freshman goalkeeper to start multiple games in a season for Virginia since Jodi Clugston made 11 starts in 2000
- She ranks among the ACC leaders in GAA (2nd) and save percentage (4th)

MENCHEL STEPS UP WHEN IT COUNTS:

- Defender Molly Menchel has scored 12 career goals, the most career goals by a Cavalier defender
- Seven of her 12 career goals have been game-winning goals, including three this season (VCU, Richmond, BC)

CAVALIERS ROLL PAST TERPS IN ACC QUARTERFINALS:

- Virginia topped Maryland 6-1 on Sunday in the ACC Quarterfinals
- The six goals tied the Cavaliers' season-high (Rutgers)
- It was the most goals in an ACC Tournament game since Virginia topped Virginia Tech 8-0 in a 2004 quarterfinal

UP NEXT:

- The Virginia-Virginia Tech winner will advance to the ACC final, held Saturday at the WakeMed Soccer Park
- Today's winner will play the winner of the Florida State-North Carolina game
- The championship game will kickoff at 4 p.m. and will air on ESPN
