### THE SERIES

- Oregon leads the all-time series 1-0 after winning 59-10 in Charlottesville, Va., on Sept. 7, 2013. Marcus Mariota passed for 199 yards and two touchdowns and rushed for another 122 yards and a TD in the win.
- Virginia will become the first ACC team to ever play at Autzen. The game is just the second regular-season matchup against an ACC team for the Ducks with the first coming at UVA in 2013. The Ducks have played two ACC teams in three bowl games. Oregon beat Florida State 59-20 in the Rose Bowl on Jan. 1, 2015, while losing to Wake Forest in both the 1992 Independence Bowl and the 2002 Seattle Bowl.

### QUICK HITS

- FR LB Troy Dye** earned Pac-12 Conference Defensive Player of the Week honors after his performance against UC Davis. Dye finished with 11 tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss and a sack. He also blocked a FG attempt.
- JR WR Devon Allen** was just the fourth active college football player to ever qualify for the Summer Olympics in track and field. Allen, who placed fifth in the 100m hurdles in Rio, joined Marquise Goodman (Texas; 2012 Olympics - long jump), James Jett (West Virginia; 1992 Olympics - sprinter) and Bob Hayes (Florida A&M; 1964 Olympics - sprinter).
- JR RB Royce Freeman** moved up three spots during the UC Davis game to 27th all-time in Pac-12 career rushing, while climbing one spot to 18th all-time on the conference career rushing touchdowns list. The Ducks' running back needs 729 yards to crack the top 10 in rushing, while needing 23 rushing TDs to become the Pac-12's all-time leader.
- Oregon has had a 1,000-yard rusher each of the last nine seasons, the longest active streak in the country. During that stretch, the Ducks have had 10 backs rush for over 1,000 yards.
- While **Freeman** needs 17 rushing touchdowns to pass Oregon record holder LaMichael James (2009-11) for the all-time lead, he needs just five TDs on the ground to pass **Kenjon Barner** (2009-12) and **Derek Loville** (1986-89) for second on the list.
- Freeman** needs 100 all-purpose yards against Virginia to move into the career top 10 at Oregon.
- JR WR Darren Carrington III** has 53 receptions for 1,117 yards and 10 TDs in last 10 games.
- JR K Aidan Schneider** is the most accurate kicker in Oregon history making 91.9 percent (34-of-37) of his field goal attempts.

**HEAD COACH MARK HELFRICH**

**Mark Helfrich's** first three seasons at the helm of the Oregon Ducks' football program have been as successful as nearly any coach at any school in the history of college football. To date, Helfrich has led Oregon to a 34-8 record, a Pac-12 championship, a Rose Bowl victory and a national championship runner-up finish. Helfrich guided Oregon to a 13-2 record (8-1 Pac-12) in 2014 which included a 51-13 blowout of Arizona in the Pac-12 Championship game and a 59-20 shellacking of defending national champion Florida State in the Rose Bowl, and culminated in the Ducks facing Ohio State in the first-ever College Football Playoff National Championship game. Helfrich was rewarded for his success by being named a finalist for a pair of national coaching awards, the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award and Maxwell Football Club Coach of the Year Award. Oregon's Rose Bowl win was just the fourth in the history of the school. In his first two seasons, he set school records for wins by a first-year coach (11) and single-season coaching wins (13). In his third season, Helfrich led Oregon to six straight wins to finish the regular season after an injury to starting quarterback Vernon Adams Jr. was partially responsible for a 3-3 start. The Ducks finished 9-4 after a triple overtime loss in the Alamo Bowl. The 42-year old Oregon native was appointed the school's 32nd head coach on Jan. 20, 2013, following four seasons as the Ducks' offensive coordinator. He wasted little time proving his worth leading Oregon to an 11-2 record and a win over Texas in the Alamo Bowl in his first season.

**NCAA RECORD STREAK CONTINUES**

Oregon has thrown at least one touchdown pass in 82 straight games dating back to September 4, 2010, when **Darron Thomas** threw two TD passes in a 72-0 win over New Mexico. The streak is the longest ever and broke the 69-consecutive game mark set by Texas Tech from Sept. 23, 2006 to Oct. 22, 2011. Oregon's streak also broke the old Pac-12 record of 36 set by Stanford from 1978 to 1981. Nine Ducks' quarterbacks (plus one running back and one wide receiver) have contributed to the streak, throwing a combined 217 touchdown passes. **Marcus Mariota** leads the way with 105 TD strikes, while Thomas is second with 63. **Vernon Adams Jr.** (26), **Bryan Bennett** (9), **Jeff Lockie** (6), **Dakota Prukop** (3), **Taylor Alie** (1), **Nate Costa** (1) and **Jake Rodrigues** (1) have also thrown for touchdowns during the streak. **RB Royce Freeman** connected on a TD pass to Mariota in the 2014 regular-season game against Arizona, while **WR Bralon Addison** tossed a 39-yard TD pass at Colorado in 2015.

**DEATH, TAXES AND A DUCK 1,000-YARD RUSHER:**

Oregon has an impressive streak of 1,000-yard rushers heading into the 2016 season. The Ducks have had at least one back gain 1,000 yards for nine straight seasons, with two reaching the milestone in 2008. The nine-year run is the longest current streak in the nation, besting both Auburn and Boise State by two seasons.

**DECADE OF GROUND DOMINANCE**

Oregon will look to make it 11 straight years of leading the Pac-12 Conference in rushing in 2016. The Ducks have been the league's best running team for 10 straight years. Oregon started the streak in 2006 when it averaged 182.2 yards per game, the only season during the stretch the Ducks didn't run for at least 200 yards per game. In 2012, Oregon rushed for over 315 yards to highlight the period. Last season's 279.9 yards per game was the fifth most in the run.

**GROUND AND POUND**

Oregon's reputation as a high scoring offense owes a lot to the team's ability to score touchdowns, not only through the air, but on the ground. The Ducks have racked up 507 touchdowns since the beginning of 2010 with a nation's best 254 of them coming on running plays.

**DUCKS HAVE SECOND MOST TD PASSES SINCE 2010 SEASON**

When it comes to finding the end zone through the air, almost nobody has been better than Oregon since 2010. The Ducks have tossed 217 TD passes during that time, which is the second most in the nation. UO's offense has thrown more than 30 TDs in each of the last six seasons with a high of 44 touchdown passes in 2014. In 2015, the Ducks had 33 TD passes.

**TOUCHDOWN OREGON**

Oregon is the only team in the nation to score at least 70 touchdowns in each of the last six seasons. The Ducks led the nation in TDs scored in 2014 (90), 2012 (89) and 2010 (81), while ranking second in 2011 (88), fourth in 2013 (81) and ninth in 2015 (71). Only Baylor has scored 70-plus TDs five times in the last six years, while Boise State, Oklahoma State and TCU are the only other teams to score 70-plus TDs at least three times.

**FREEMAN TOPS POWER FIVE BACKS IN RUSHING OVER LAST TWO SEASONS**

JR RB Royce Freeman is at the top of an impressive list of running backs in total rushing yards since the beginning of the 2015 season. Freeman has rushed for 3,288 yards during freshman, sophomore and junior seasons in Eugene, more than any other running back from a power five conference. In addition to being just one of three power five backs with over 3,000 yards rushing, Freeman is also just one of three backs with more than 30 rushing TDs.

**FREEMAN JUST FOURTH DUCK WITH 3,000 CAREER RUSHING YARDS**

RB Royce Freeman is one of just four Ducks to run for more than 3,000 career yards. The junior sits in fourth place in all-time rushing and needs just nine yards against Virginia to pass Derek Loville (1986-89) for third on the all-time list. In addition to Loville, Freeman trails LaMichael James (2009-11) and Kenjon Barner (2009-12) on the elite list. Freeman is also one of just 16 Oregon Ducks to surpass the 2,000-yard rushing plateau. He achieved that milestone in just his 21st career game.

**FREEMAN SETS SCHOOL RECORD FOR SINGLE-SEASON RUSHING**

**RB Royce Freeman** capped his sophomore season by passing **LaMichael James (2011)** for the single-season rushing record at Oregon finishing with 1,836 yards, 31 more than James rushed for in 2011. Freeman rushed for more than 100 yards 11 times last season, including each of the last nine games. Freeman is just the fourth player in Oregon history to rush for more than 1,000 yards in back-to-back seasons joining **Maurice Morris (2000, 2001)**, **Onterio Smith (2001, 2002)** and **James (2009, 2010, 2011)**. Freeman rushed for 1,365 yards as a freshman, the seventh most all-time at Oregon. He averaged 141.2 yards per game in 2015.

**FREEMAN GETS 17TH 100-YARD GAME**

**RB Royce Freeman** rushed for 130 yards on 26 carries vs. TCU in the Alamo Bowl to notch his 17th career 100-yard rushing game (and ninth straight). The Ducks' running back had 11 100-yard games as a sophomore after gaining more than 100 yards six times as a true freshman. Freeman's 17 100-yard games are the second most in school history. **LaMichael James (2009-11)** holds the school record with 26.

**JR WR Charles Nelson** added another tool to his toolbox in the Ducks opener. The do everything Nelson, who is on the Paul Hornung Award watch list honoring the country's most versatile player, served as the team's holder on a number of extra point attempts vs. UC Davis. Nelson scored a pair of two-point conversions to help Oregon roll up 53 points. Nelson, who started at safety on defense the last eight games of the 2015 season, also started the opener at wide receiver as well as handling kickoff and punt return duties. In addition to scoring four points on the PAT team, Nelson finished with 288 all-purpose yards (6 rushing/31 receiving/98 punt returns/153 kickoff returns).

**FLIP-FLOPPER**

**JR WR Charles Nelson** is back on offense full-time. The Ducks' most versatile player moved to safety midway through his sophomore season, starting the Ducks' last eight games at defensive back. During his tenure on the defensive side of the ball, Nelson continued to see spot duty on offense after starting three of the first five games at wide receiver. Nelson finished the season fifth on the team in receptions with 17 catches for 270 yards and three touchdowns. He also had six rushes for 115 yards and a TD on offense. Despite playing just eight games on D, Nelson finished ninth on the team in tackles with 47, while also picking off a pair of passes.

**NELSON EYEING CAREER KICKOFF RETURN RECORD**

**JR WR/KR Charles Nelson** could finish the 2016 season as Oregon's career leader in kickoff return yardage. The Ducks' return man moved into fifth on the all-time list at Oregon in the season opener when he passed **Kenjon Barner** (2009-12) on his way to 153 return yards against UC Davis. Nelson has a legitimate chance of breaking the school record. He sits just 438 yards behind all-time

leader **De'Anthony Thomas** (2011-13). Last season, Nelson had the third-most yards in a season by a Duck with 876. As a freshman he finished with 418 return yards.

**SR QB Dakota Prukop** tossed three touchdowns in his debut at Oregon to run his career TD pass total to 49. The Ducks signal caller, who played his first three seasons at Montana State, also rushed for a TD against UC Davis to give him 25 career rushing touchdowns.

**ALL IN THE FAMILY**

**SR QB Dakota Prukop's** move to Oregon from Montana State involved at least a little bit of familiarity. Prukop's backup, **FR QB Justin Herbert**, is the brother of one of Prukop's favorite targets at MSU. Herbert's brother, Mitchell, is a junior for the Bobcats and caught 70 passes for 901 yards and 12 TDs the last two seasons.

**TO DYE FOR**

**FR LB Troy Dye** had as impressive of a start to his career as any Duck defender in recent memory. The 215-pound true freshman finished with 11 tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss and a sack. Dye is the first Duck freshman to record double-digit tackles in his first career game since **RS FR Peter Sirmon** had 17 tackles (12 solo) in his Duck debut against Fresno State on August 31, 1996. Sirmon finished with two double-digit tackle games as a freshman. The last Duck freshman to finish with double-digit tackles in a game was **Walter Thurmond III** who had 14 tackles vs. Arizona on November 8, 2006. **Patrick Chung** had four double-digit tackle games during his redshirt freshman season in 2005. Dye also blocked a FG attempt.

**SCHNEIDER WINS 2015 VLADE AWARD**

**PK Aidan Schneider** was named the winner of the 2015 Vlade Award presented by The Touchdown Club of Columbus. The award is presented to college football's most accurate kicker by the Touchdown Club of Columbus. In 2015, Schneider was perfect on 67 PAT attempts and accurate on 91.7 percent of field goal tries. He was second in the nation in kick scoring with 133 points and missed only two kicks all season. The 2015 Vlade Award was presented during the 61st Touchdown Club of Columbus Awards on Saturday, February 6, 2016 at the Lifestyle Communities Pavilion in downtown Columbus, Ohio.

**SCHNEIDER MOVES INTO CAREER FG TOP FIVE**

**JR PK Aidan Schneider** moved into a tie with **Paul Martinez** (2003-06) for fifth on the career field goal list at Oregon when he connected on a 31-yard field goal in the second quarter against UC Davis. Schneider has 34 career FGs and needs two more to tie **Joshua Smith** (1995-97) for fourth and three to match **Tommy Thompson** (1990-93) for third. Schneider has converted on 34-of-37 career field goals (91.9 percent). He heads into the Virginia game 16 field goals shy of setting a new school record. **Jared Siegel** (2001-04) holds the record with 49 makes in 69 attempts. Schneider's field goal percentage is the best among the top 10.

**WHOA-GONE**

**SR K Matt Wogan** turned into a weapon on kickoffs for Oregon in 2015 and continued it in the 2016 season opener. The Ducks' kicker had touchbacks on six of his nine kickoffs (66.67 percent) against UC Davis. In 2015 Wogan finished with touchbacks on 63.27 percent of his kickoffs. Overall, Wogan ranked third in the nation in touchbacks (62), ninth in kickoff average (63.76 ypk) and 13th in touchback percentage after his junior season.

**LIGHTNING STRIKES**

Of Oregon's seven drives for touchdowns against UC Davis, five (71.4) lasted two minutes or less. One of the other two was less than three minutes, while the longest drive lasted 3 minutes and 11 seconds and covered 69 yards in seven plays. In 2015, of the Ducks' 66 scoring drives in regulation, 29 (43.9 percent) lasted two minutes or less. Twenty-one others lasted less than three minutes. Oregon's most time-consuming scoring drive that season covered 78 yards on 13 plays at Washington and took 5 minutes and 24 seconds.

**FAB FOUR**

Oregon opened the 2016 seasons with four redshirt freshman starting on the offensive line. **RS FR C Jake Hanson, RS FR LG Shane Lemieux** and **RS FR RT Calvin Throckmorton** all started after being listed as "ones" on the two-deep coming out of fall camp. **RS LT Brady Aiello**, who was listed as a backup on the two-deep, got the start in place of **JR LT Tyrell Crosby** who sat out.

**FRESHMANIA**

Youth could play a big part in Oregon's success in 2016. Six true freshmen (**Troy Dye, Justin Herbert, Brenden Schooler, Keith Simms, La'Mar Winston Jr.** and **Bryson Young**) saw action in the Ducks' season-opening win over UC Davis.

**RETURN MEN**

The 2016 Oregon roster had 48 letterwinners, including 11 starters - seven on offense and four on defense - from last season. By comparison, the 2015 squad had 47 returning lettermen and 14 starters.

**POMP AND CIRCUMSTANCE**

Ten players on Oregon's 2016 roster have already completed their degrees. Eight graduated from the University of Oregon, while one each graduated from Montana State and Dayton. **SR TE Evan Baylis, SR T.J. Daniel, JR Eddie Heard, SR RB Jarrett LaCoste, SR QB Jeff Lockie, SR RB Lane Roseberry** and **SR DB Michael Manns** all graduated from Oregon, while **SR QB Dakota Prukop** earned a degree from Montana State and **SR OL Zac Morgan** from Dayton before transferring to join the Ducks.

An often overlooked facet of Oregon's run of success has been the continuity of its coaching staff. Fourth-year head coach **Mark Helfrich** is in his seventh season on staff, but he is supported by several assistants who have served the last three UO head coaches. Running backs coach **Gary Campbell** is in his 34th year on the Oregon staff, which is the longest tenure of any Oregon assistant football coach in school history. In addition, offensive line coach and running game coordinator **Steve Greatwood** enters his 30th season at UO, while linebackers coach **Don Pellum** is in his 24th campaign.

**NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS**

Since 2000, Oregon is 40-7 in regular season, out-of-conference contests, earning notable victories against the likes of Oklahoma, Wisconsin, Michigan (x2) and Michigan State. During that stretch, the Ducks are 3-1 against the SEC, 6-3 vs. the Big Ten, 1-1 vs. the Big 12, 1-0 against the ACC, 5-0 against the Mountain West, 12-2 vs. the WAC, 2-0 against Conference USA and the Sun Belt, and 9-0 vs. FCS teams.

EUGENE, Ore. — After a jittery start to the 2016 season opener, No. 24 Oregon settled down in all three phases and went on to a comfortable if uneven 53-28 victory over UC Davis. The game marked the UO debut of graduate transfer quarterback Dakota Prukop, and the first for the Ducks under new defensive coordinator Brady Hoke.

**How It Happened:** The Ducks (1-0) trailed out of the gate after getting a stop on defense but then muffing a punt and allowing the Aggies to take a 7-0 lead. Order was restored late in the first quarter when Royce Freeman rushed for his first touchdown of the season, giving the Ducks an 8-7 lead after PAT holder Charles Nelson rushed for the two-point conversion.

That began a stretch of 33 unanswered points by Oregon. Aidan Schneider kicked off second-quarter scoring with a 31-yard field goal, and Prukop added touchdown passes to Johnny Mundt and Jalen Brown for a 25-7 halftime lead. The run extended into the third quarter, when Prukop ran in a touchdown from one yard out, following a 49-yard rush by Freeman on the previous play.

UC Davis (0-1) used a 50-yard pass play to set up a 20-yard rushing touchdown by Manusamoa Luuga to get within 33-14. But after Freeman fumbled on the next UO possession, he atoned for the mistake with his second rushing touchdown, set up by a Nelson punt return down to the 8-yard line. That made it 39-14, and the Aggies tacked on another touchdown late in the third quarter to pull within 39-21.

The Aggies were poised to score again early in the fourth quarter, when true freshman Troy Dye put the exclamation point on an amazing debut by blocking a field goal. Four plays later, Prukop connected on his third TD pass of the day, a 55-yard bomb to Darren Carrington II, and Oregon was back firmly in control.

**Who Stood Out:** Coming into the season, the offensive skill spots looked like positions of strength, and those Ducks didn't disappoint. Prukop completed 21-of-30 passes for 271 yards and three touchdowns, and also rushed for 36 yards and a TD. Freeman ran just 11 times, for 87 yards and two touchdowns, and Carrington caught seven balls for 117 yards. Nelson's numbers typified Oregon's day as a whole. He led all players with 288 all-purpose yards, including 251 as a returner. But he also muffed a punt to set up Davis' first touchdown, and later was stripped on a kickoff return while trying to fight for a couple of extra yards rather than step out of bounds. And the freshman linebacker Dye was a revelation, totaling game-highs of 11 tackles and 4.5 tackles for loss - one of those a sack.

**Notable:** Oregon's starting offensive line featured four redshirt freshmen, along with senior right guard Cameron Hunt. With Tyrell Crosby not in uniform, UO started Brady Aiello at left tackle, Shane Lemieux at left guard, Jake Hanson at center and Calvin Throckmorton at right tackle. ... Six true freshmen made their collegiate debuts, including Dye as starting SAM linebacker. Cornerback Brenden Schooler was a

starter on the kickoff unit, and linebackers Keith Simms and La'Mar Winston Jr. later subbed in with that group. Defensive end Bryson Young was employed in a six-lineman goal-line package late in the third quarter. The final snap of the game was received by QB Justin Herbert, the Eugene native who made his debut with the Ducks.
